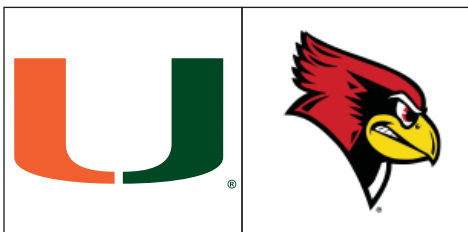

UM Hosts Illinois State in a Pair of Midweek Games...

The University of Miami baseball team looks to snap a four-game losing skid Tuesday, hosting Illinois State in a pair of non-conference midweek contests at Alex Rodriguez Park in Coral Gables, Fla. Both games will begin at 6 p.m., with radio broadcasts provided by WVUM 90.5 FM.

After dropping three games in a series to top-ranked Florida over the weekend, Miami (4-7) has now lost four consecutive regular season games for the first time since 2005. During that span, the 'Canes have been without the services of 18th-year head coach Jim Morris, who has been at home recovery from surgery to remove his gall bladder – and an infection stemming from the surgery, since Feb. 24.

The Hurricanes got quality starting pitcher over the weekend against the Gators, including a career-long outing from sophomore E.J. Encinosa. He went seven innings on the bump, allowing just one run – which turned out to be the game-winning score – on five hits and striking out three batters in the second game of the series.

Scouting Illinois State...

Illinois State (7-3) comes into Tuesday's game winners of their last three games against Xavier (Ohio), Minnesota State and Bowling Green over the weekend. Overall, the Redbirds have won five consecutive contests entering the series.

The Redbirds are led at the plate by three players batting above the .350 plateau, including leading hitter Ryan Court with a .389 average. Court leads all players with 14 hits and five doubles, in addition to a team-high tying 11 runs. Ty Wiesemeyer carries a .360 average into the series with nine hits and two steals. The other Redbirds player above .300 batting is Matt Mirabal with a .342 clip, and a team-high tying 11 RBI.

Miami Ties with Illinois State...

The University of Miami has ties with Illinois State - that being the head coaches. Mark Kingston served as an assistant coach for the Hurricanes in 2001 during its NCAA Championship season. Kingston, now in his second year with the Illinois State program, spent two seasons in Coral Gables under UMiami head coach Jim Morris.

Morris Surgery Update...

According to the 18th-year skipper for the 'Canes, Morris is not supposed to do anything with the team and remain recovering at his home for two weeks. He is progressing better each day, but no official date for his return to the Miami dugout has been given at this time.

Still recovering from gall bladder surgery a week ago, University of Miami head baseball coach Jim Morris will not travel with the 24th-ranked Hurricanes this weekend to Gainesville, Fla., for a three-game series with the top-ranked Florida Gators.

After an infection spread from the removal of his gall bladder on Friday, Feb. 25, Morris was released from University of Miami Hospital (UMH) on Thursday morning, and is resting comfortably at his home in Coconut Grove.

Miami Against Illinois State...

UM leads the all-time series against ISU with a 3-0 advantage. The last time the two teams met, the 'Canes took a 17-3 decision at Mark Light Field on March 12, 1997.

UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI HEAD COACH JIM MORRIS - 18TH SEASON

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 776-298-3 (.721) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,280-542-4 (.701) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,411-583-4 (.706) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,279-540-4 (.703) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,410-581-4 (.708) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Mets. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Pitching Matchup — Miami vs. Illinois State...

The pitching matchup this week features a pair of right-handers for Illinois State, taking on a duo of lefties for Miami. The Hurricanes will throw freshman AJ Salcines on Tuesday, while sophomore Steven Ewing will toe the rubber on Wednesday.

Salcines, a Florida Christian School alum, is making his first start with this set to be his third appearance of the young season. Salcines carries a 4.15 ERA through 4 1/3 innings worked. Ewing will be making his third consecutive weekday start Wednesday, looking for his first win of the year after suffering a loss in his first start of the year at FAU. Ewing owns a 5.06 ERA with eight strikeouts.

Illinois State will use right-handers JD Learnard (Tuesday) and Dan Savas (Wednesday) in the series. Learnard holds a 6.48 ERA in three outings and 8 1/3 innings tossed. He is 0-1 on the year in a single start. Savas totes an ERA of 4.82 with a 1-0 record in three appearances (two starts). He owns seven strikeouts in 9 1/3 frames.

From Manager to Starter...

Sophomore infielder Joey Porro made his first collegiate start and played in his first-ever game at the "U" over the weekend in the series finale against Appalachian State. In that game, Porro went 2-for-4 with three RBI. Last season, Porro was a student manager for the 'Canes, and is now living a dream and getting playing time.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

Sophomore pitcher E.J. Encinosa went a career-long seven innings in Gainesville on Saturday in the second game of a three-game set against the top-ranked Gators. In a 1-0 loss to Florida, Encinosa allowed just the one game-winning earned run on five hits and three strikeouts. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

Catch Me If "U" Can...

The UMiami team is full of speed this year, and through the first seven games it is prevalent. Jim Morris has preached stealing bases throughout the year, and the 'Canes swiped 14-of-17 bases on the campaign. Nathan Melendres is 4-for-4 on the path, and Chantz Mack is 2-for-2 to lead the way for UMiami.

The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher Shane Rowland has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

To Be the Best, Play the Best...

According to Boyd's World RPI [strength of schedule], the UMiami Hurricanes have the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation. The 'Canes not only play the top-ranked University of Florida Gators on the road in the third series of the year, but there is the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schedule. The ACC has been ranked as one of the top three toughest leagues in the nation the past five years by multiple collegiate baseball publications.

MIAMI IN THE ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

On Sept. 20, 2009, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach Jim Morris signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 16 seasons in Coral Gables - including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins), Chris Hernandez (Boston Red Sox), Scott Lawson (Houston Astros) and Iden Nazario (Washington Nationals) all taken on the second day of the Draft.

Canes In the Classroom...

During the fall semester of 2010, the University of Miami baseball team recorded its highest team GPA ever. Freshman catcher Corey Janson collected a 4.0 GPA last semester, giving him one of the highest GPAs in the entire UMiami Athletic Department.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
