QUICK HITS

- Miami earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for the fifth time in program history, including in each of the last four seasons
- The Canes are 18-12 all-time playing against from the state of South Carolina
- UM has only played one match in program history in Gainesville (2009 vs. FIU)
- The 25 wins this season currently rank fifth-most in program history, while the 17 ACC victories were the most since joining the league in 2004
- Of the three other teams in Gainesville bracket, Miami has only taken on one since the program re-started in 2001 (Tulsa, 2001)
- Miami defeated two other SoCon teams this season and is 8-1 all-time in matches against teams currently in the league
- UM ended the regular season winning 15 of its last 17
- Miami has won its last 14 neutral site matches dating back to 2010
- Most recently, the Canes lost to Florida State on the road, 3-1, in what amounted to an ACC title match - Savannah Leaf had a match-high 18 kills
- Tying an ACC record, six UM players were named All-ACC: Taylor Hollins, Alex Johnson, Alexis Mourning, Ryan Shaffer, Emani Sims, Nrithya Sundararaman - Nicole Lantagne Welch won Coach of the Year for the second time
- Five different Canes won ACC Player of the Week on six occasions during the year
- The weekend will be a homecoming for Gainesville native Eryn Croft
- UM has used the same starting lineup for 24 of 30 matches
- The Hurricanes won 10-straight ACC contests earlier this season, the most consecutive in school history
- Miami finished a perfect 13-0 at home this season, winning the last 13 sets
- The team has been ranked in the AVCA Poll five different weeks this season and finished the regular season No. 22 in the NCAA RPI
- The Canes lead the ACC in opponent hitting percentage (.167), assists (13.32/set), kills (14.35/set) and blocks (2.91/set)
- The Hurricanes won the first set in 22 of 30 matches and went 8-5 on the road
- Miami was predicted to finish fifth by the ACC coaches in a preseason poll
- UM last faced a non-conference opponent Sept. 15, going 8-2 outside the ACC

LAST TIME OUT

NOV. 23, 2012: FSU 3, UM 1

TALLHASSEE, Fla. - Sophomore Savanah Leaf collected a match-high 18 kills, but No. 23 Miami volleyball fell at No. 12 Florida State Friday, 3-1, in the Atlantic Coast Conference title match at Tully Gym. The Hurricanes and Seminoles split the season series for the third-straight year.

UM wraps up the regular season 25-5 overall and 17-3 for a second-place finish in the ACC. The 17 conference wins set a new program record. FSU improved to 27-3 and 18-2 to complete the regular season undefeated at home, winning the ACC for the fourth time.

Leaf, who transferred to Miami after a season at San Jose State, had a season-high 18 kills to go with 11 digs for her third double-double of the season. Classmate Emani Sims hit .348 in the match on 12 kills, adding nine blocks for the Canes.

Junior Taylor Hollins and sophomore Alexis Mourning each had 11 kills. Senior setter Nrithya Sundararaman recorded 47 assists to go with nine digs and four kills.

Defensively, four players had double-digit digs for UM, with Hollins and juniors Alex Johnson and Ryan Shaffer all having 12 in the match. Hollins now has a team-high 17 double-doubles on the year.

After Florida State took the opening set, Miami responded in the second by going up 16-9. The Seminoles fought to within two several times, in-

cluding at 24-22, but Sims put down a kill in the middle of the court to tie the match at one. It was the first time since Sept. 30 that a visiting team won a set at Tully Gym.

FSU reversed the momentum in the third set to win convincingly, 25-14, going up 2-1 in the match. Once again, the Canes battled back in the following set to take a 10-6 advantage on a kill by Hollins. The teams then went back-and-forth with the Seminoles eventually evening it out at 20. Following an exchange of points to make it 21-21, UM took the next three to make it 24-21. However, the Seminoles rallied to tie it at 24 and avoided two more set points to win, 29-27.

Nicole Lantagne Welch is in her 12th season as head coach of the University of Miami volleyball program. Under her guidance since 2001, the team has posted winning records in 10 of the 12 seasons, including ending the 2011 campaign ranked No. 15 in the Pablo rankings.

In 2012, Lantagne Welch earned ACC Coach of the Year, guiding the program to its most conference wins since joining the ACC. Tying an ACC record, six players on the team earned All-ACC honors.

Last season, Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to a 26-5 overall record and a 16-4 league mark to finish second in the Atlantic Coast Conference. The Canes spent several weeks in the AVCA Top 25. UM qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third-straight year, defeating Northern Illinois to advance to the Second Round of the Ames [Iowa] Regional. At the end of the campaign, numerous players earned recognition, including Lane Carico becoming the first Hurricane to win ACC Player of the Year. The senior also earned AVCA All-America honors to cap one of the best careers in Miami history.

This past summer, Lantagne Welch traveled to Ohio to work with the A2 program as part of development for Team USA. In addition, two players associated with the program - Ciara Michel and Savannah Leaf - both competed in the Olympic Games for Team GB.

In 2010, Lantagne Welch helped guide the Canes to their second 20-win season in the last three years, and the second consecutive year in which UMiami advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Miami ended the season with a 23-9 overall mark (13-7 Atlantic Coast Conference) and finished third in the conference regular season standings. Along the way, the Hurricanes defeated NCAA Tournament participants Florida State, Middle Tennessee State, Georgia Southern, Wichita State and North Carolina. At the end of the year, Lantagne Welch saw her first-ever AVCA All-American honored in the form of Carico, collecting third team accolades following a record-breaking year. Carico became the first player in school history with 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career, as well as leading the ACC in double-doubles - and later being the only player in the league to amass at least 400 kills and 400 digs on the campaign. Carico and teammate Katie Gallagher each claimed AVCA All-East Region Team honors, while freshman libero Ryan Shaffer set a new school record for digs by a freshman (539 / 4.53 per set). As for Carico, she would also earn her third consecutive All-ACC Team nod and All-East Region honor.

In 2009, Lantagne Welch helped the Hurricanes to their second NCAA Tournament appearance, competing in the Gainesville [Fla.] Regional. UM earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament after holding the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation according to the end-of-year RPI rankings. Earlier in the season, Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to the Hampton Inn & Suites Northern Colorado Classic championship. She would add to her growing list of All-Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes, as well as

All-America honorable mention performers, seeing senior libero Cassie Loessberg and sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico named to both lists. Carico and Loessberg each collected AVCA All-America Honorable Mention selections, while both were tabbed to the AVCA All-East Region Team. During the 2008 campaign, Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to a tie

for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) standings, and the team's best regular season record since 2002.

During the year, Lantagne Welch collected her 150th career victory when the `Canes defeated NC State, 3-0, on November 21, 2008. It was just two seasons ago that she posted her 100th career victory in the 2006 season-opener for UM with a 3-2 win over Alabama. The 2008 season was special for UM as the team posted a record of 26-6 overall (14-6 ACC), finishing just one match shy of tying for an ACC Championship. Not to be overlooked was Lantagne Welch leading the `Canes to three in-season tournament titles, including a tournament title at NCAA Tournament participant University of San Francisco as part of the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco, Calif. For those achievements and more, Lantagne Welch was tabbed ACC Coach of the Year, as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) East Region Coach of the Year. It was her first ACC coaching honor, while being the second AVCA Regional honor, collecting the award in 2002 during Miami's historic run to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

PIONEERING THE FIRST SEASON

On Feb. 28, 2000, then University of Miami Athletic Director Paul Dee proclaimed the return of women's volleyball as the Hurricanes newest fully funded varsity sport at UM. On Sept. 12, 2000, Dee took the next major step in the evolution of the program by announcing the hiring of Lantagne Welch as head coach of the Hurricanes.

A WINNING HISTORY

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Lantagne Welch grew up in a family where volleyball had been a major part of their livelihood. Her parents, Joe and JoAnn, owned and operated a highly regarded volleyball scouting service that evaluated high school players, covering the regions of California, Nevada and Arizona. Lantagne Welch's sister, Jenelle Duvall, was an All-American at the University of Pittsburgh and served as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona and Northern Illinois. She also served as head coach at Metro State College of Denver.

Lantagne Welch played at the University of Maryland from 1990-1993. In her role as a four-year starting setter, she guided the Terrapins to their first-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship (ACC) title and an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament in 1990. As a top collegiate setter, Lantagne Welch garnered First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1992 and '93, and earned Second Team All-ACC accolades in 1991. She would also be named AVCA National Player of the Week (Oct. 12, 1993) following an upset victory over Florida State.

Serving as a team captain through her final two seasons, Lantagne Welch finished her outstanding collegiate career as Maryland's all-time assists, digs and matches played leader. Throughout her career in College Park, Lantagne Welch accumulated various academic honors including ACC Honor Roll and district

academic All-America as a senior. She graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Marketing. For her accomplishments as a student-athlete, Lantagne Welch was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary Volleyball Team along with five other Terrapins from teams of the 1990s.

Lantagne Welch began her coaching career in 1994 as an assistant coach on the Maryland staff before becoming a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University in 1995. At Ohio, she developed training sessions for setters and assisted in the scouting of opponents and in the development of game plans. Lantagne Welch arrived at Miami after serving as an assistant coach at Texas A&M. During her three seasons there, the Aggies finished ranked in the top 20 and qualified for the NCAA Tournament each season (1997-99). In 1999, Texas A&M advanced to the elite eight of the NCAA Tournament, compiling a 28-6 record and a No. 9 final ranking. Under Lantagne Welch's training, Aggie setter Jenna Moscovic was named the 1999 Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Year and named to the All-American Freshman Team by Volleyball Magazine. As a sophomore, Moscovic was selected to the 2000 All-Big 12 Team and All-District 5 Team. Lantagne Welch also played a major role in bringing the Aggies back-to-back Top 10 recruiting classes. The 1999 class was ranked in the Top 10 by Student Sports Magazine and the 1998 class was ranked sixth by Volleyball Magazine.

CANES HEADED TO GAINESVILLE

INDIANAPOLIS - No. 23 Miami volleyball earned a bid to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth straight season and will travel to Gainesville, Fla., to take on College of Charleston in the first round Friday at 5 p.m. The Gainesville bracket will be hosted by the University of Florida at the O'Connell Center and will also include Tulsa.

The bracket is in the Austin Region that contains national seeds No. 3 Texas, No. 6 Southern California, No. 11 Kansas and No. 14 Florida.

"I actually thought it was a pretty good probability that we would be sent to Gainesville," ACC Coach of the Year Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "We look forward to preparing to play College of Charleston, knowing historically that [CofC head coach Jason Kepner] has done a great job with that program. Anyone can beat anyone in the NCAA Tournament, so we will have to play at our best in order to win this weekend."

The Canes, who hold a 3-4 all-time record in the NCAA Tournament, also traveled to Gainesville in 2009. Last season, the team advanced to the second round after defeating Northern Illinois in the Ames bracket before falling to host Iowa State. The best postseason run came in 2002 when Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to the Sweet 16.

This year, Miami (25-5, 17-3 ACC) recorded its most conference wins since joining the ACC in 2004 to finish in second place. Boasting six All-ACC selections, the Canes led the conference in opponent hitting percentage (.167), assists (13.32/set), kills (14.35/set) and blocks (2.91/set). The team went 4-0 in neutral site matches and 8-5 on the road in the regular season.

College of Charleston (26-7, 14-2 SoCon) earned the automatic bid out of the Southern Conference by defeating Furman in five sets in the championship match Monday. The Cougars will be making their seventh trip to the NCAA Tournament, with the last appearance coming in 2009. Miami leads the all-time series against CofC, 3-0, but the two teams have not met on the volleyball court since 1979.

Host Florida (25-4, 19-1 SEC) won the Southeastern Conference for the 20th time under head coach Mary Wise this season. The Gators have been ranked as high No. 11 in the AVCA Poll and are fifth in the nation with a .301 team hitting percentage. UF and UM have only met eight times in history, with the last meeting coming in 1978.

Tulsa (26-9, 14-2 C-USA) won the Conference USA Tournament to earn an automatic bid, qualifying for the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season. The Golden Hurricane will play Florida Friday at 7:30 p.m. in the first round. Miami defeated Tulsa, 3-0, in the only meeting between the programs in 2001.

In addition to Miami, Florida State, North Carolina and NC State will represent the ACC in the postseason. The Big Ten and Pac-12 led all conferences with seven teams each, as Penn St. and Stanford are the top two national seeds.

FIELD OF 64 ANNOUNCED BY NCAA

INDIANAPOLIS - The NCAA Division I Women's Volleyball Committee announced Sunday the 64-team field for the 2012 championship. Thirty-one conferences were awarded automatic qualification, and the remaining 33 slots were filled with at-large selections to complete the bracket.

The top 16 teams were seeded nationally and placed within four regions. The teams tabbed as the top four seeds were No. 1 Penn State, No. 2 Stanford, No. 3 Texas and No. 4 Nebraska.

Per the established bracketing principles the top 16 seeds were provided the opportunity to host. In addition, first- and second-round conference matchups were avoided and team pairings were determined by geographical proximity.

The Big Ten and Pac-12 led all conferences with seven teams each. The West Coast Conference was next with six teams in the tournament. Two teams, Penn State and Stanford, have earned bids to all 32 championships. Two teams are making their initial appearances in the tourna-

ment: Central Arkansas and East Tennessee State.

In the 31-year history of the championship, 10 schools have been crowned champion, eight of which are in this year's bracket, including defending champion UCLA.

Past winners making the field are Stanford (1992, 94, 96, 97, 2001, 04), Hawaii (1982, 83, 87), UCLA (1984, 90, 91, 2011), Nebraska (1995, 2000, and 06), USC (1981, 2002, 03), Penn State (1999, 2007, 08, 09 and 10), Texas (1988) and Washington (2005).

First- and second-round matches will be played at 16 campus sites.

Teams winning both matches will move on to regional play Dec. 7 and 8. The pre-determined regional sites are Berkeley, Calif.; West Lafayette, Ind.; Omaha, Neb.; and Austin, Texas. All regional semifinal games will be shown on ESPN3. Regional final games will air on ESPNU.

The regional winners will advance to the semifinals and final hosted by Louisville and the Louisville Sports Commission at the KFC Yum! Center in Louisville, Ky., on Dec. 13 and 15. Both national semifinal games as well as the championship game will be broadcast by ESPN2.

FOUR ACC TEAMS EARN NCAA TOURNAMENT BIDS

GREENSBORO, N.C. - Four Atlantic Coast Conference volleyball teams earned bids to the 2012 Division I NCAA Women's Volleyball Championship, the NCAA Volleyball Selection Committee announced today. Florida State was named as the No. 9 overall seed and will host first and second round action, while North Carolina, Miami, and NC State will begin tournament play on the road. The first and second rounds will take place Thursday-Saturday, Nov. 29-Dec. 1.

Florida State (27-3, 18-2 ACC), the two-time defending ACC champion, will begin postseason play by hosting Hofstra at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 30. The Seminoles, led by ACC Player of the Year Ashley Neff, are making their 15th tournament appearance, where they are 9-14. With a victory on Friday, Florida State would advance to the second round and face either Colorado State or Purdue. This is the fourth consecutive tournament bid and third overall national seed for the Seminoles, who reached the national semifinals last year.

Miami (25-5, 17-3) will be making its fourth straight postseason trip when it takes on the College of Charleston in the first round on Friday at 5 p.m. in Gainesville, Fla. The Hurricanes, led by ACC Coach of the Year Nicole Lantagne Welch and a conference-record six All-ACC players, are ranked No. 23 in the AVCA Poll and would face the winner of Tulsa and No. 14 Florida if they defeat the Cougars. Miami is 3-4 in the NCAA Championship and advanced to the second round in 2011.

24th-ranked North Carolina (25-5, 16-4) will face a familiar opponent in the first round as it will travel to Ames, Iowa, to take on California on Thursday, Nov. 29, at 6 p.m., with the winner advancing to face either No. 15 Iowa State or IPFW. The two teams have met in the tournament the previous two years with California taking a 3-0 decision in the second round in 2010 and North Carolina getting revenge last year, 3-2, in the first round. The Tar Heels are led by All-ACC honorees Chaniel Nelson and Emily McGee and the ACC Freshman of the Year, Paige Neuenfeldt. This is the 14th overall tournament appearance and third straight for North Carolina, which is 8-13 in previous trips.

NC State (22-9, 12-8) set a program record for ACC wins this season and will be making the second tournament appearance in school history. The Wolfpack will travel to Austin, Texas, to face Texas A&M on Thursday, Nov. 29, at 5 p.m., with the winner advancing to play either No. 3 Texas or Colgate. NC State, led by senior setter Megan Cyr, is making its first postseason appearance since 1987.

The four regional sites will be held at West Lafayette, Ind., Omaha, Neb., Austin, Texas, and Berkeley, Calif., on Dec. 7-8. All of the regional semifinals will be streamed live on ESPN3, and the finals will be carried by ESPNU. The national semifinals on Dec. 13 and final on Dec. 15 will be televised by ESPN2 and held in Louisville, Ky., at the KFC Yum! Center.

ACC RECORD SIX CANES NAMED TO ALL-ACC TEAM

GREENSBORO, N.C. - Tying an Atlantic Coast Conference record, six University of Miami volleyball student-athletes have been selected to the All-ACC Team, as announced Wednesday by the league. The 18-member team was decided based on a vote of the league's 12 head coaches.

Miami was represented by six first-time All-ACC performers: junior outside hitter Taylor Hollins, junior right side Alex Johnson, sophomore middle blocker Alexis Mourning, junior libero Ryan Shaffer, sophomore middle blocker Emani Sims and senior setter Nrithya Sundararaman.

"We have had a tremendous season and to see so many players recognized is a great honor," head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch said. "It shows the incredible balance and how so many people have contributed so much to our team. This has been a special year and even the players who are not being recognized have meant so much to our success."

Hollins leads the Canes with 337 kills (3.18/set) this season after moving from the back row to outside hitter. Posting a team-leading 16 double-doubles, she earned ACC Co-Player of the Week on Oct. 29 following efficient performances against Virginia Tech and Virginia, where she hit at a .548 clip. Hollins set a career high with 20 kills against Oregon State and is currently second on the team with 320 digs (3.02/set). At Duke, she notched 19 kills and 20 digs, including three slammers in the final four points when the Canes trailed 14-12 in the fifth set.

"Taylor is a great all-around player and does so many great things on the court," Lantagne Welch said. "She has displayed her excellent ball-handling skills and the ability to score all season."

Johnson, who was also named Preseason All-ACC, has started every match in her career for the Hurricanes. She was selected ACC Player of the Week on Sept. 10 after recording 16 kills and 16 digs in the four-set win over No. 6 Florida State at home. Ranking second in the league with an average of 0.40 services aces per set (42), Johnson has eight double-doubles this season and was named Hurricane Invitational MVP at the season-opening tournament.

"Alex is a great offensive player for us on the right side and she is very effective and smart on the court," Lantagne Welch said. "She has made a big step this year as far as improving her blocking and is very strong all-around player. In addition, Alex has one of the best serves on our team to put the pressure on the opponent."

Playing in just 11 matches as a freshman, Mourning emerged this season as a force in the middle of the net for the Canes. She ranks second on the team with 292 kills (2.78/set) and 136 blocks (1.30/set). Also being third in the ACC in blocks, Mourning had 10 total blocks in a win over North Carolina to earn ACC Co-Player of the Week on Oct. 8. The middle blocker has tallied double-digit kills in 15 matches, with a minimum of five total blocks in 16 contests.

"Alexis has had a breakout season and has been a very consistent player for us," Lantagne Welch said. "She is strong not only attacking effectively in the middle, but also as a blocker. Alexis has done a very nice job of closing blocks and impacting our defense throughout the season."

In the back row as the libero, Shaffer is second in the conference with an average of 4.77 digs per set (506) this season. She has led the team in digs in 23 matches this

year, picking up a season-high 30 against both NC State and Boston College. Shaffer ranks fourth in program history with 1,529 digs and is 479 shy of the school record with another season of eligibility remaining.

"Ryan might actually be the most consistent player on our team," Lantagne Welch said. "She has had a great season in a position that often receives less recognition. Ryan has been a steadying force in the back row for us with her solid passing and defense. Ryan is a competitive kid that gives a winning effort every night."

Sims, who was also named Preseason All-ACC, is second in the league with 1.35 blocks per set (143). She has been named ACC Player of the Week on two occasions this season, first posting 32 kills on a .500 hitting percentage in home wins over Duke and Wake Forest. At Clemson, Sims broke a school record with 16 blocks to go with 16 kills in a thrilling five-set victory to win the league honor in addition to Collegiate Volleyball Update National Player of the Week. Having at least five blocks in 14 matches on the season, Sims leads the team with a .327 hitting percentage.

"Emani has had a very dynamic season out of the middle for us," Lantagne Welch said. "Her blocking has come on this season and her quickness on the court makes her a feared attacker and also a strong blocker."

The lone senior on the roster, Sundararaman has been very effective distributing the ball around the court for UM. She leads the ACC with 10.68 assists per set (1,100) and recently earned ACC Player of the Week Monday. The setter had 69 combined assists in sweeps over Boston College and Maryland, while also putting down five kills and seven digs against the Eagles. Sundararaman has had at least 33 assists in all but two matches, being third in school history with 2,257 assists in her career. The neurobiology major was also named to the Capital One Academic All-District, maintaining a 3.90 GPA.

"Nrithya is having the best year of her career and she has found a way to use all of our weapons and keep a balanced attack," Lantagne Welch said. "Her unpredictability as a setter this season has made us hard to defend."

Led by the six selections from Miami, nine different teams are represented on the All-ACC Team. The Hurricanes tie Clemson's 2007 team with the six award winners. UM had a five different players earn ACC Player of the Week six times this season.

LANTAGNE WELCH EARNS ACC COACH OF THE YEAR

GREENSBORO, N.C. - University of Miami head volleyball coach Nicole Lantagne Welch has been named the Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, the league office announced Wednesday. It is the second time the veteran mentor has earned the honor (2008).

"As a team and a program we knew that we were a little bit underestimated this season," Lantagne Welch said. "We had a lot to prove and were not picked high since we lost a lot of people. However, what a lot of people didn't know was how ready we were to step out to the court and compete. It is a credit to all of the players in our program and the coaches on the staff to how hard we have worked this year to put ourselves in this position."

In her 12th season at the helm of the program she created, Lantagne Welch defied expectations this season to put the Hurricanes in contention to win their first ACC title. The team lost four starters from last year's roster, including three All-ACC selections. Miami was picked to finish in fifth place in a preseason poll of the league

coaches.

"I am very happy for Nicole and the program," interim Director of Athletics Blake James said. "This award is a tremendous recognition of the job that she has done not only this year, but during her time at the University of Miami."

With All-ACC selections also announced, Lantagne Welch put six players on the team, tying an ACC record. Miami is in the top four in the conference in all statistical categories, including leading in opponent hitting percentage (.148), assists (13.31/set), kills (14.33/set) and blocks (2.92/set).

UM has been ranked as high as No. 23 this season and has won its most league matches (17) since joining the conference in 2004. Five different Hurricanes have earned ACC Player of the Week honors on six occasions this season.

Lantagne Welch is the only head coach of the program since it re-started for the 2001 season. One win away from its first ACC title, Miami will also be looking to qualify for the NCAA Tournament for the fourth consecutive season. She is 243-188 (.673) overall and 110-71 (.607) in ACC play in 12 seasons after earning All-ACC status as a setter during her playing days at Maryland.

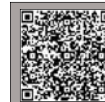
