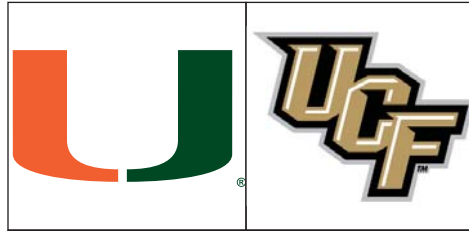

'Canes Bring Seven-Game Win Streak Into Pair of Midweek Games...

The 29th-ranked Miami Hurricanes step out of conference play putting their seven-game win streak on the line in a pair of midweek games against UCF (March 22) and Florida Gulf Coast (March 23) in the first two of a five-game week at Alex Rodriguez Park, beginning Tuesday, March 23. Both games will begin at 6 p.m.

Miami (12-8, 6-0 Atlantic Coast Conference) has won a season-long seven games entering the week, and is a winner in eight of their last nine overall. The Hurricanes swept ACC opponent Wake Forest over the weekend in Winston-Salem, N.C., giving them their first trio of road wins on the year.

UMiami jumped back into the national polls this week after a two-week absence, debuting at No. 29 in the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper Top 30. UM was not present in the other three polls while receiving votes in all of them.

Junior first baseman Harold Martinez has moved up in the batting order, increasing his average 108 points – now sitting at .277 on the year. Over the weekend, Martinez batted in the game-winning runs twice, including a clutch RBI single through the right side scoring Nathan Melendres in UM's ninth inning rally to defeat the Deacs, 4-3.

Sophomore outfielder Zeke DeVoss leads the 'Canes in several areas offensively, including average (.296), hits (21), runs scored (21), walks (16) and stolen bases (10). DeVoss was 3-for-4 in the series finale against Wake Forest, while beginning the series 2-for-3 with a walk.

Rony Rodriguez is third on the team in batting average, carrying a .276 average into the week – while leading the team in home runs with three. His .500 slugging percentage is tops on the team, and he has stolen two bases in three attempts from his designated hitter position.

The Miami pitching staff has been solid the past two weeks, especially the bullpen. The combination of Adam Sargent, Sam Robinson and Daniel Miranda has surrendered just a single earned run during the current win streak. Robinson, a junior left-hander, has yet to allow a run this season in 12 appearances and 14 innings tossed. He has two saves on the year, while Miranda leads the team in that category with five. Miranda earned three consecutive at Wake Forest over the weekend.

Starting pitchers Steven Ewing and AJ Salcines will toe the rubber for the 'Canes during the week. Ewing picked up his first win of the year a week ago against Florida Atlantic, now staking a 2.91 ERA and an even 1-1 record. He will get the start against UCF in a lefty versus lefty meeting – with UCF using Ewing's old high school teammate from Orlando's University High School, Brian Adkins. Adkins carries a perfect 3-0 record into Tuesday's game and an ERA of just 1.59.

On Wednesday, UMiami freshman AJ Salcines takes the ball in his second collegiate start after going three innings and allowing a single earned run on one hit and striking out three in his first against Illinois State on March 8. Salcines failed to factor into the decision in that game, as closer Daniel Miranda earned the win out of the bullpen in a Miami walk-off win off a Rony Rodriguez solo homer to left in the 11th inning.

Florida Gulf Coast has yet to name a starter for the game.

Scouting UCF...

The UCF Knights coming into Tuesday's game streaking at the right time. They have claimed victory in seven of their last eight games, including a three-game win streak in a series sweep of Columbia over the weekend. UCF prepares for a tough week at No. 29 Miami and No. 25 Rice. The Knights are second in Conference USA with a .321 team batting average, as well as first in runs (164), RBI (143), doubles (57) and stolen bases (40). On the mound, UCF ranks third with a 2.54 ERA, second with 180 strikeouts and first for fewest walks allowed (39). The Knights have one of the nation's toughest schedules, holding an RPI in the Top 30. The UCF pitching staff is highlighted by Ben Lively (4-0, 1.00 ERA) and closer Nick Cicio and a 0.60 ERA with a team-leading three saves.

Miami Against UCF...

Miami owns a 14-3 record lifetime against UCF. The two teams split a pair of games last year, with the road team winning each time. UCF took the last contest by a 6-3 count – and has won two of the last three overall. From 1995 until last year's contests, the Knights and Hurricanes failed to play each other, with UM winning 13 consecutive from 1985 until 1995.

Scouting Florida Gulf Coast...

Florida Gulf Coast enters the week with an 11-9 overall record after sweeping conference opponent Campbell over the weekend. They are led offensively by two players batting above .340, using the bat of Zach Maxfield for a majority of the hitting, leading the team in average (.354), hits

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 788-306-3 (.718) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,292-550-4 (.700) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,423-591-4 (.705) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,292-550-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,423-583-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

One Whale of a Game...

Sophomore pitcher **Eric Whaley** picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech on Sunday, March 13, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

Position Change...

In the second game of the series against Virginia Tech, Miami head coach **Jim Morris** elected to move All-American third baseman **Harold Martinez** to first, in a straight switch with freshman **Brad Fieger**. Since the move, Martinez has a .964 fielding percentage and has a .550 batting average. Fieger has also embraced the change well, committing just a single error in six games at the hot corner.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

Sophomore starting pitcher **E.J. Encinosa** went a career-long seven innings against top-ranked Florida (March 5). In a 1-0 loss to the Gators, Encinosa allowed just the one run on five hits and struckout three in a pitchers' duel with UF's Hudson Randall. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

(29), doubles (8), home runs (4) and RBI (22). Behind him is Javi Sujo, toting a .345 average at the dish, adding four doubles. However, the Eagles bat just .263 as a team. The pitching staff has an ERA of 4.34 with opponents batting .272 against them.

Miami Against Florida Gulf Coast...

Miami owns a 4-0 record against Florida Gulf Coast in a short series that dates back to 2008. FGCU moved to the Division I ranks and the Atlantic Sun Conference in 2006, while being a Division II power in baseball for years on the NCAA Division II level. Miami took both games against the Eagles last year; including the Hurricanes first-ever trip to Fort Myers on April 14 — claiming a 9-0 victory.

Hurricanes Streaking Into the Season...

After starting the season slow at 4-7, the Hurricanes have completed turned things around over the course of the last two weeks. Not only are they back in a national poll, but they are receiving votes in two of the other three major polls.

For Miami, this is the first time the Hurricanes have started an ACC season 6-0 since 2006 — and their first six-game conference winning streak since 2008. The 2006 team began the ACC slate 7-0, before advancing to the College World Series in Omaha, Neb. The 2008 team, ranked atop almost every major poll for two-thirds of the season, rolled off 11 consecutive ACC wins (including four two-game series sweeps) from March 21 through April 18.

Welcome Back, Welcome Back...

Carrying a team-best six-game hitting streak into the week, junior Preseason All-American **Harold Martinez** has come back to life after head coach **Jim Morris** decided to move the third baseman to first—in a clean switch with freshman **Brad Fieger** making the transition to the hot corner. Martinez has raised his batting average by more than 100 points over the last six games, previously batting below .175 for the first time in his career just 13 games into the campaign.

Now the Miami native is batting .277 on the year — including a whopping .600 over the last six games. Against Wake Forest, he has the game-winning RBI in games two and three, respectively, while finishing the series 5-for-

Recapping the Virginia Tech Series...

* The 'Canes opened up ACC play last Friday night with a win against the Virginia Tech Hokies. Miami has dominated Virginia Tech in Coral Gables, winning six of the seven match-ups on its home field. The 'Canes are now 5-3 all-time in ACC-opening games.

* **Nathan Melendres** returned to the lineup as well, playing center field after a four-game absence due to a hand injury.

* **Playing Small Ball** — Miami looked to manufacture runs against the Hokies, bunting six different times throughout the game — with four resulting in bunt singles and one in a sacrifice. UM also had three steal attempts on the night, with two successful tries by sophomore **Stephen Perez**. As a team, Miami improved to 17-22 with stolen bases on the season.

* **Funk Continues** — Runners left on base plagued the Hurricanes once again in the opening game of the series, as they left 11 men on the base paths in tonight's game. The 'Canes left the bases loaded in three different innings, and two on in another, with each four of the innings ending in a strikeout.

* **Pitching Dominates Again** — Freshman starter **Bryan Radziewski** pitched another gem in the series-opener, going seven shutouts innings to earn his second career victory. It was the longest start of his career; the second time he has gone 5-plus innings without giving up a run; and his third quality start of the season. Junior **Sam Robinson** pitched a perfect eighth, and has yet to give up a run on the season. Closer **Daniel Miranda** came in and pitched a bumpy ninth, allowing his first run of the season, before closing the door on the Hokies.

* **Game-Saving Catch** — **Dale Carey** made a diving catch in the top of the ninth inning to rob shortstop Tim Smalling of a potential extra-base hit. The hit would have brought the tying run to the plate with nobody out. Carey was inserted into the game in the bottom of the eighth as a pinch-runner and later on **Stephen Perez's** RBI double. He stayed in the game as the right fielder, where he proceeded to make his clutch play.

* **The Long Haul** — Sophomore right-hander **E.J. Encinosa** threw 96 pitches in eight and two-thirds innings of work. Encinosa earned his first win of the season and now stands at 1-2.

* **Saturday's Starters** — **Harold Martinez** and **Brad Fieger** swapped positions at the corners Friday night and were back at the positions tonight. It is Fieger's second career start at third and Martinez' second start of the season at first. Martinez played 10 games at first base during the 2009 season.

* **Hits Parade** — **Harold Martinez** recorded two singles in tonight for his second multi-hit game this season.

* **A one, a two...** — Southpaw hurler **Sam Robinson** earned his second save of the season, throwing only two pitches to seal Miami's 2-1 win over Virginia Tech.

* **Making a Cameo** — **Sam Robinson** made his 10 appearances to date, including a string of the last six of eight contests this month.

Runs Come Across

Sunday's 11 runs scored was the highest runs production for the Hurricanes all season. The previous high was 10 against Appalachian State in the series finale on February 26.

* **Sunday's Starters** — Six of today's starters collected hits, while all nine starters reached base safely. **Harold Martinez** posted multiple hits for the second time in as many games (third time this year), knocking in a season-high four RBI. **Nathan Melendres** registered a season-high three hits, adding a RBI and scoring twice. **Rony Rodriguez** and **Stephen Perez** both tallied multiple RBI.

* **Start Your Engines** — Sophomore right-hander **Eric Whaley** had another solid production in his fourth start of the year. The Pompano Beach native went seven innings on the hill, spreading out three hits with no runs, no walks and striking out eight batters. Whaley has a team second-best 23 strikeouts on the year.

* **Playing Miami Baseball** — Scoring 11 runs on nine hits meant Miami scored runs with guys on base, moving them over with bunts and driving them in with timely hits. Miami began the game with three consecutive bunt singles. UM has tallied five-plus hits in each of the last six games, including 14 against Illinois State (March 8).

* **Walking the Line** — Miami showed great plate awareness on Sunday, drawing 10 walks from six Virginia Tech pitchers. The 10 walks taken was a season-high for the 'Canes.

Catch Me If "U" Can...

This year's UMiami team is full of speed from all areas of the lineup, and through the first 20 games it's quite prevalent. Head coach **Jim Morris** has preached aggressive base running throughout his illustrious career, with the 'Canes swiping 34-of-41 bases this season. **Zeke DeVoss** leads the way with 10 steals, followed by **Nathan Melendres (7)** and **Stephen Perez (6)**.

In the last series against Wake Forest, Miami swiped eight bases over the course of the weekend, including steals of third base and home in the opening game of the three-game road trip.

The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

The 40-40 Club in Miami...

Once again, the Hurricanes achieved a 40-win season, finishing 43-20 and a spot in the NCAA Super Regional. All-time at UMiami, the 'Canes have achieved at least 40 wins 32 seasons – including 13 times under **Jim Morris**. In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

To Be the Best, Play the Best...

According to Boyd's World RPI [strength of schedule], the UMiami Hurricanes have the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation. The 'Canes not only play the top-ranked University of Florida Gators on the road in the third series of the year, but there is the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) schedule. The ACC has been ranked as one of the top three toughest leagues in the nation the past five years by multiple collegiate baseball publications.

Miami in the ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

Last Meeting With UCF: UCF Upsets No. 12 Miami Tuesday Night, 6-3...

The 12th-ranked University of Miami baseball team lost for the second time in its last three mid-week games with a 6-3 defeat at the hands of UCF Tuesday night at Alex Rodriguez Park.

Miami (14-6) held a 2-1 lead after four innings but UCF (14-8) scored three in the fifth and two more in the eighth to pull away for the three-run win. UM pitchers allowed double-digit hits for just the second time in the Hurricanes' last 11 games and Miami's offense missed several key opportunities with runners in scoring position.

Scott Lawson provided most of UM's offense, going 3-for-4 with a two-run homer. The multi-hit game was Lawson third in UM's last four contests and the senior first baseman is now nine for his last 16 going back to the start of this past weekend's series against Duke.

Harold Martinez hit safely for the 11th time in UM's last 12 games, going 2-for-4.

Brennan Dobbins (2-0) earned the win for the Knights while UM's Steven Ewing (2-2) suffered the loss in his first career relief appearance. Both starting pitchers went just three innings as UCF's Johnny Sedlock allowed just two hits while striking out three and UM's E.J. Encinosa - making his first career start - allowed one run on three hits while striking out seven of the 14 batters he faced.

Ewing struggled in relief of Encinosa, allowing three runs on three hits in 1 2/3 innings before Daniel Miranda, Taylor Wulf, Eric Whaley, Sam Robinson and Travis Miller went the rest of the way for UM. For Miller, it was his first appearance of the season.

Dobbins tossed a scoreless fifth to earn the win. Chase Bradford, who tossed two hitless to close out the game, earned his first save of the season.

Shane Brown, Chris Taladay and Chris Duffy all had two hits for UCF.

Darnell Sweeney gave the Knights an early 1-0 lead with a RBI single to center in the second that scored Austin Johnston from second.

Lawson gave the 'Canes a 2-1 lead in the bottom of the fourth, smacking a two-run blast to right after Stephen Perez drew a walk to lead off the inning.

UCF scored three runs in the top of the fifth to regain the lead at 4-2. An infield single by Duffy with runners on second and third with one out in the fifth brought home Ryan Breen to even the game at 2-2. After a walk loaded the bases for the Knights, a fielder's choice grounder scored Taladay to put UCF back ahead by one before a wild pitch scored the third run of the frame.

Michael Broad led off the bottom of the seventh with a triple to right and after back-to-back strikeouts, DeVoss hit a two-out single up the middle to pull the 'Canes to within one but UCF put two more on the board in the eighth to secure the win.

UCF Knights Quick Hit...

The Knights have hit 15 home runs this year, and nine of them have come from D.J. Hicks (five) and Jonathan Griffin (four). Hicks currently leads the Knights with a .677 slugging

percentage and is second with a .468 OBP (Ronnie Richardson sits at .474). Hicks also has 12 walks compared to just nine strikeouts.

No Ordinary Joe...

When the 'Canes visited Gainesville in early March, UMiami assistant coach **Joe Mercadante** returned to his old stomping grounds where he earned varsity letters in baseball for the University of Florida during the 2002 and '03 seasons. The former Gators catcher and Gainesville native appeared in 37 games for UF, holding a .312 (10-for-32) batting average and 19 runs batted in. Mercadante is in his seventh year with the Hurricanes program, coaching at P.K. Yonge High School (also his alma mater) prior to his arrival in Coral Gables.

Recapping Miami's Last Game - Wake Forest (3/20)...

Rony Rodriguez had a home run and Harold Martinez drove in two with a single – all in the fifth inning – to help the University of Miami complete a series sweep of Wake Forest University with a 5-3 win on Sunday in ACC baseball action at Wake Forest Baseball Park.

Wake Forest (7-12, 2-4 Atlantic Coast Conference) went ahead in the home-half of the fourth inning, as sophomore catcher Brett Armour registered his first home run as a Demon Deacon – smashing a deep three-run shot to left to advance the Deacs in front, 3-1.

Miami (12-8, 6-0 ACC) designated hitter Rony Rodriguez chipped into the Wake Forest lead to leadoff the fifth, tallying his team-leading third home run of the year with a solo shot to left field. The Hurricanes would reclaim the lead, 4-3, as Harold Martinez came through with a two-out, two-run scoring single shot back up the middle to drive across Zeke DeVoss and Stephen Perez for the go-ahead runs.

Holding a tight grip on a 4-3 advantage in the top of the seventh inning, Stephen Perez scored on a Michael Broad RBI double to straightaway center that gave the Hurricanes the final 5-3 advantage.

With the lead in hand, UMiami went to the bullpen in the bottom of the frame, using left-hander Sam Robinson to keep the Demon Deacons off the board and set things up for fellow reliever Adam Sargent and closer Daniel Miranda.

Once again stellar, the Hurricanes bullpen combined to hold the Demon Deacons off the board through the final three innings of the game.

The win went to starter Eric Whaley, improving his record to a team-best 4-1 mark, and the save went to Miranda – picking up his third save of the weekend – collecting his fifth save of the year. The loss was tacked to WFU starter Zach White, lowering his record to 0-2 for the season.

Whaley finished the game with six innings tossed, allowing three runs on four hits and striking out a career-high tying nine batters. Meanwhile, Miranda and Robinson combined for three strikeouts in closing out the contest.

Miami put the first run of the game on the board in the top-half of the first inning with a RBI fielder's choice by Nathan Melendres that scored a streaking Zeke DeVoss from third. DeVoss' slide into home against Wake Forest catcher Brett Armour forced the ball loose from the glove.

For Miami, the win was its seventh consecutive, and the first time the 'Canes have started a season 6-0 in league play since 2006. Likewise, the six-game ACC winning streak is the first for UM since 2008.

After defeating nationally ranked North Carolina in two-of-three games last weekend at home, the Deacons are now riding a three-game losing skid for the first time all year.

Miami was led at the plate by DeVoss with a 3-for-4 showing at the plate, scoring twice and drawing a walk. In the process, DeVoss becomes the third Hurricane in as many days to register a three-hit outing. Behind him was Martinez with two hits and two RBI, as well as Broad with two hits and driving in one.

Wake Forest was led offensively by Armour's three-run homer, with four different Demon Deacon batters solidifying hits on the day.

The Wake Forest bullpen allowed just a single run and three hits over the course of the final 4 2/3, using four different pitchers in that span. Michael Dimock – who also saw action yesterday – closed the game for the Deacs, pitching two innings and striking out two with two walks.

Free Baseball...

The Hurricanes are 2-1 in extra-inning games this year. UMiami began the year accomplishing a task that has never been achieved in school history – back-to-back games to open a season. The 'Canes went 1-1 in the opening two days against Rutgers.

Morris Has Surgery to Remove Gall Bladder...

On Friday, March 25, 18th-year head coach **Jim Morris** received surgery to remove his gall bladder at the University of Miami Hospital. He stayed in the hospital a few extra days due to an infection stemming from the surgery. The skipper returned faster than expected to the 'Canes dugout, coaching against Illinois State (March 8) after missing a total of seven games - six consecutive.

Morris Signs Contract Extension...

On Sept. 20, 2009, former University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that head baseball coach **Jim Morris** signed a contract extension through 2015. Morris, who

is in his 17th season at the helm of the Miami baseball program, has led the Hurricanes to the College World Series in 11 of his 17 seasons in Coral Gables – including National Championship runs in 1999 and 2001.

Miami Gets Them Drafted...

Over the last three years, Miami has produced four first round MLB draft picks, more than any other school in the nation. Last year, Yasmani Grandal was selected in the first round by the Cincinnati Reds, with four other players—David Gutierrez (Minnesota Twins), Chris Hernandez (Boston Red Sox), Scott Lawson (Houston Astros) and Iden Nazario (Washington Nationals) all taken on the second day of the Draft.

Two of a Kind...

University of Miami head coach **Jim Morris** entered the season with 776 career wins with the Hurricanes and registered 504 wins at Georgia Tech prior to his arrival in Coral Gables. Morris is one of only two head coaches to ever amass 500 or more wins at two separate Division I schools. Augie Garrido at the University of Texas entered the year with 602 wins with the Longhorns program. Garrido logged 928 wins as head coach at Cal State Fullerton before his current stint in Austin.

Closing In On the Luck "8"...

Jim Morris is enjoying his 18th year at the helm in Coral Gables,

and the skipper is closing in on his 800th career win. Morris sits at 788 wins at UMiami entering the weekend against the Demon Deacons.

New Era Behind the Plate...

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen **Corey Janson** and **Shane Rowland**. After the fall season, Villasuso will probably make the start to begin the season, but don't be surprised if and when Rowland takes the spot behind the dish with improved confidence and skill.

Athletics Gets a Changing of the Guard...

On March 3, the University of Miami Department of Athletics and UMiami President Dr. Donna E. Shalala announced that Tony Hernandez would succeed Kirby Hocutt as Interim Director of Athletics. Hocutt resigned a week prior to take a similar position at Texas Tech University. Hernandez has served in a variety of areas within the Department of Athletics at UM in his 13 years of service, including the last year and a half as Deputy Athletic Director.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
