- 1 After its first three games, Miami leads the ACC in turnover margin (+8) and is ranked second nationally.
- 2 Miami is one of only five teams in FBS to have not trailed a game at any point in 2015.
- 3 Miami is 3-0 for the 17th time in the last 60 years, and only the sixth time since 2000.
- 4 Sophomore QB Brad Kaaya's streak of 16 straight games with at least one touchdown pass is the fourth-longest in FBS.
- 5 Sophomore RB Joe Yearby's 7.59 yards per rush average is the ninth-highest mark in FBS.

MIAMI, CINCINNATI MEET AT NIPPERT STADIUM

- Miami's matchup with Cincinnati marks the 13th all-time meeting between the two programs.
- The Hurricanes topped the Bearcats 55-34 in Miami Gardens in October 2014, and have not played in Cincinnati since 1998. UM leads the all-time series 11-1, including a 5-1 mark in Cincinnati.
- Miami has an 11-game winning streak in the series, and has not lost since falling 20-7 in 1947 in the first-ever meeting between the two programs.
- QB Brad Kaaya threw for 286 yards, three TDs and no interceptions in the 2014 win over UC, including a career-long 79-yard TD pass to WR Phillip Dorsett, who finished with 143 yards.

THREE UP, THREE DOWN

- Miami is 3-0 for the 17th time in the last 60 seasons, and the second time in head coach Al Golden's tenure; the Hurricanes started 7-0 in the 2013 season.
- Miami has started 3-0 only six times since 2000: 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2013, 2015.
- Only 19 of the other 127 FBS teams have longer winning streaks than Miami's current streak.
- Heading into the fifth week of the college football season, the Hurricanes are one of just 29 undefeated teams in FBS football.
- The Canes are also one of just four unbeaten teams in the ACC and are the only unbeaten team in the Coastal Division.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS

- Heading into the fifth week of the college football season, the Hurricanes rank among the Top 10 in seven NCAA categories. The Canes also lead the NCAA in three categories, including fourth down conversion percentage (tied), tackles for loss allowed and winning percentage (tied).

YIPPEE KAAYA

- Sophomore QB Brad Kaaya has a touchdown pass in 16 consecutive games, a streak that spans his entire career and ranks as the fourth-longest nationwide. The only Miami quarterback in the last 20 years with a longer such streak is Ken Dorsey, who had separate streaks of 23 and 17 games.
- In his last start against Nebraska, Kaaya threw for a career-high 379 yards, two TDs and one INT. The performance earned Kaaya ACC Offensive Back of the Week honors.
- Kaaya has thrown just four interceptions in his last 303 attempts. He has thrown for more than 200 yards in 11 of his 16 career games and has four 300-yard performances.
- Kaaya leads the ACC in passing yards per game entering the fifth week of the season.
- Kaaya's career numbers at home stand out: 2,381 passing yards, 22 touchdowns, 5 interceptions.
- The California native was one of only 15 quarterbacks in the country to throw for more than 3,000 yards, 26-or-more touchdowns and 12-or-fewer interceptions in 2014; he was the only true freshman quarterback in the country to accomplish this feat.
- As a freshman in 2014, Kaaya was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Offensive and ACC Overall Rookie of the Year after a stellar first campaign with the Hurricanes.
- Kaaya ranked second in the Atlantic Coast Conference in passing yards (3,198), and led the ACC in passing touchdowns (26), passing efficiency (145.9) and passing yards per completion (14.5) during his freshman year.

THE SOUTH FLORIDA DUO

- South Florida products Joe Yearby (426) and Mark Walton (218) have combined for 644 all purpose yards and eight touchdowns through the first three games of the season.
- Of their 644 all purpose yards, Yearby (316) and Walton (150) have combined for 466 rushing yards for an average of 6.21 yards per carry; Yearby's 7.59 yards-per-carry average ranks as the ninth-highest mark in FBS.
- Yearby and Walton also have combined for 75 carries and only one of those attempts has resulted in lost yardage - for a total of one yard (Walton vs. Nebraska).

DEFENSIVE MENTALITY

- Miami's defense this season has recorded seven interceptions on 90 pass attempts.
- The Hurricanes are ranked No. 27 in total defense (310.0 yards allowed per game), despite facing the No. 19 offense Nebraska (519.5 yards per game). UM held the Huskers under their season average in total yards gained.
- Miami's +8 turnover margin ranks second in the NCAA.
- Miami's defensive unit held Bethune-Cookman to just 79 yards in its 2015 season opener and tallied its first shutout since 2010; BCU's 79 yards of total offense was the first time in the Al Golden era that an opponent was held to fewer than 100 yards.
- Miami ranked **No. 14 nationally in total defense in 2014**, allowing an average of just 329.6 yards per game - the fourth-best mark in the ACC.
- Of the 12 FBS teams on Miami's 2014 schedule, the Hurricanes defense held **11 of them under their season average on offense**. Miami's defense held teams to an average of **81.0 yards** under their respective season averages, all while facing the **ninth-toughest schedule** in the country.
- Miami's defensive yards allowed (compared to respective offense averages): 341 vs. Louisville (**53.7** yards under season average), 329 vs. Arkansas State (-**147.5**), 264 vs. Duke (-**134.3**), 371



vs. Georgia Tech (-105.5), 422 vs. Cincinnati (-38.2), 262 vs. Virginia Tech (-103.3), 258 vs. North Carolina (-171.8), 418 vs. Florida State (-23.4), 341 vs. Virginia (-33.3), 360 vs. Pittsburgh (-75.4), 354 vs. South Carolina (-89.4)

- The only offense that Miami's defense did NOT hold under its season average was Nebraska, who totaled 456 yards – just 3.7 yards over its season average of 452.3.

PAVING THE WAY

- Miami entered the season with 23 starts among its returning offensive lineman - one of the youngest in the ACC.
- Through three games this season, Miami's youthful offensive line, which consists of three sophomores and two juniors, has allowed the Hurricanes to average 472.0 yards per game in total offense (third in the ACC).
- Miami's offensive line also has allowed just three sacks, which ranks second in the ACC.
- In addition, the Hurricanes lead the nation in fewest tackles for loss allowed.

BADG-A-MATIC

- Sophomore kicker Michael Badgley is 9-of-10 this year in field goal attempts. His last field goal made against Nebraska served as the game-winner.
- In the win over the Cornhuskers, Badgley drilled a career-high and tied a school record with five field goals made (41, 27, 23, 28 and 28).
- Badgley is 7-for-7 for his career in field goals between 40-49 yards.

GREAT SCOTT

- After missing the entire 2014 campaign with an injury, redshirt senior wide receiver Rashawn Scott has made a strong return to Miami's wide receiver corps in 2015.
- Scott leads the ACC in receiving, heading into the fifth week of the season, averaging 91.0 yards per game.
- Scott has started all three games at wide receiver in 2015 and leads the team in receptions (18) and yards (278). He is on pace to catch 72 passes for a total of 1,112 yards.
- The Melbourne, Fla., native set a career mark with a nine-catch performance in his start vs. Nebraska, totaling 151 yards - the second-highest of his career and most since 2012.
- Scott tied a then-career high with six receptions in Miami's opener vs. Bethune-Cookman, reaching the 100-yard mark for just the second time in his career and adding a 16-yard TD catch.

ARTIE ISLAND

- Junior cornerback Artie Burns leads the Hurricanes with three interceptions. He has tallied a pick in each of Miami's first three games.
- Heading into the fifth week of the college football season, Burns leads the ACC in interceptions with three.
- He is the first Hurricane player with an interception in three consecutive games since Sean Taylor in 2003 (via AP).
- In addition, Burns became the sixth Cane in the last 20 years with three interceptions over a three-game span joining Sean Taylor, Ed Reed, Phillip Buchanon, Kenny Phillips and Kelly Jennings (via AP).
- Burns also is an accomplished track and field athlete. He finished second in the 110m hurdles with a time of 13.70 seconds at the ACC Championships. He also competed in the NCAA Championships.

CAN OF CORN

- Junior cornerback Corn Elder has emerged among Miami's top playmakers in 2015.
- Elder had a dominant outing last time out vs. Nebraska, recording a career-best four pass breakups and a crucial interception on the Cornhuskers' first drive in OT to help clinch a victory for Miami.
- Elder is the only player at the FBS level with an interception and a punt return TD this season.
- Elder leads the ACC and is ranked third nationally in passes defended, averaging 2.33 per game. He

- also is tied for second in the league in fumbles recovered (0.33).
- Elder ranks second in the ACC in punt return average (20.3).
- Elder totaled one tackle, one fumble recovery and one PBU at FAU; he leads the team with six PBUs.
- The Nashville native opened the 2015 campaign on a high note as he tallied three tackles, one sack, two tackles for loss and one pass breakup in a win over Bethune-Cookman.
- In addition, Elder also recorded his first career punt return for a touchdown on an electric run against the Wildcats. He nearly had a second punt return for a TD, but the play was called back.

TOOLBOX TRENT™

- Sophomore outside linebacker Trent Harris, nicknamed “Toolbox Trent” by the Miami defensive coaches for his consistency and mental error-free play, has started all three games at OLB in 2015.
- Harris has already matched his 2014 freshman season tackle total of 15, and has added 3.0 TFLs (22 yards) and 1.5 sacks (24) - both of which surpass freshman year totals (1.0 TFLs, 0 sacks).
- Harris was the No. 133 overall player & a four-star prospect in the ESPN300 for Class of 2014.

STAYING AHEAD

- When Miami takes the field against Cincinnati, it does so as one of just five teams in the nation who have not trailed at any point in 2015.
- Miami joins Florida State, West Virginia, Georgia and LSU as teams who have yet to trail in any game at any point through the first three weeks.
- In addition, the Hurricanes have scored on their first offensive series of the game in each of the last five weeks dating back to last season.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

- Miami improved to 21-8 at home in four+ seasons under head coach Al Golden, and an impressive 12-1 against non-conference competition at Sun Life Stadium.
- In its last 18 home games dating back to 2013, Miami is 15-3 at Sun Life Stadium.
- QB Brad Kaaya has a career 7-2 record at home with 22 touchdowns and just five interceptions.

YOUTHFUL CANES

- Miami’s 2015 roster is one of the youngest rosters in the country. The Hurricanes’ 12 seniors rank ninth among all FBS schools nationally, while the three seniors on offense are tied for 11th nationally.

TAKE THREE

- The Hurricanes are 15-1 in the Golden era when forcing three or more turnovers, plus the Canes have won 60 of their last 65 games when recording at least three takeaways.

The list of three-takeaway games in the Golden era:

- Miami's offense of the past two seasons, both under the direction of offensive coordinator James Coley, have ranked among the **most explosive in program history**.
- Miami's **5,594 yards of total offense** in 2014 were the **second-most in program history**, trailing only the 6,074 yards gained in 2002.
- UM compiled **5,536 total yards in 2013**, which ranks as the third-best total in history.
- Miami's 2012 total of **5,282 ranks as the seventh-best**, meaning three of the top seven marks in program history have been achieved during Al Golden's tenure as head coach.

SHUTTING THEM DOWN

- Miami's defense held Bethune-Cookman scoreless and logged its first shutout since Sept. 2, 2010.
- Miami's shutout against Bethune-Cookman was the Hurricanes' first since head coach Al Golden took over in 2011. Since 2000, Miami has shut out eight opponents.

ALMOST PERFECT 10

- Teams don't beat Miami when scoring only 10 points.
- The Hurricanes are now 158-2 in their last 160 games when holding opponents to 10 points or less, after winning 45-0 in its 2015 season-opener against Bethune-Cookman. That run goes back to Oct. 1, 1977, ironically, a season that began with Miami holding its first two opponents to exactly 10 points apiece and still losing both of those games.
- The only 10 points allowed-or-less losses since: Nov. 8, 2003 to Tennessee (10-6) and Sept. 5, 2005 to Florida State (10-7).

CANE DEBUTS

- Miami had 26 players make their Hurricane debuts against Bethune-Cookman. Among those 26 players, 12 were true freshmen.
- Gage Batten, Joe Brown, **Jordan Butler**, **Lawrence Cager**, Quincy Casimir, Joel Evans, **Tyler Gauthier**, Demetrius Jackson, **Michael Jackson**, **Jaquan Johnson**, Josh Johnson, **James King**, Hunter Knighton, Darrell Langham, **RJ McIntosh**, Terry McCray, David Njoku, **Kendrick Norton**, **Charles Perry**, **Sheldrick Redwine**, Mike Smith, Malik Rosier, Jon Semerene, **Tyree St. Louis**, **Mark Walton**, Jerome Washington all made their respective debuts (true freshman in **BOLD**).

THE CAPTAINS

- Three Miami Hurricanes were chosen as team captains prior to the start of the 2015 season: sophomore quarterback **Brad Kaaya**, senior linebacker **Raphael Kirby** and senior defensive back **Dallas Crawford**. A fourth team captain will rotate weekly during the 2015 season.

SUNSHINE STATE DOMINANCE

- In the 90 seasons of Miami football, the Hurricanes have made a habit of winning against their in-state rivals. Miami holds a 112-70-6 all-time record against teams from the state of Florida.
- Miami will face one more opponent from the state of Florida this year as it takes on Florida State. Last week the Hurricanes defeated FAU 44-20.
- In addition, Miami holds a winning record against every FBS school in the state of Florida.

AL GOLDEN

Head Coach, Fifth Season
Penn State, 1991

Al Golden, the University of Miami's 22nd head football coach, is in his fourth season at the helm of the Hurricanes' program. Under his leadership, the 44-year old Golden laid a foundation and process to return the storied program to prominence. Golden led the Hurricanes to a 9-4 record in 2013 and a berth in the Russell Athletic Bowl in Orlando - Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

The 2013 season began with a 7-0 start, including a win over No. 12 Florida as the Hurricanes jumped as high as No. 7 in the BCS rankings. Miami was led by nine All-ACC selections, including first-team LB Denzel Perryman and P Pat O'Donnell, who set the school single-season record for punting average. Miami is 11-4 in its last 15 games under Golden after the Hurricanes started 11-11 through the first 22 games.

Prior to Miami's bowl game in Orlando, Golden was the recipient of the 2013 Lombardi Award for Excellence in Coaching at the 44th Rotary Lombardi Award Ceremony.

In his second season at the helm, Golden led the Hurricanes, which were picked to finish fifth in the ACC Coastal Division, to a 7-5 record and a 5-3 league mark, earning a share of the 2012 ACC Coastal Division title. The 2012 season was highlighted by the rise of junior QB Stephen Morris, who threw for a career-best 3,345 passing yards and racked up a school-record 3,415 yards of total offense. Freshman Duke Johnson became Miami's first All-American since 2005 when he earned second-team All-America honors as a kick returner by the Walter Camp Football Foundation and FWAA Freshman All-America honors. Johnson rushed for a UM freshman-record 947 yards and amassed 2,060 all-purpose yards in his rookie season.

The Golden Era. Golden's brand of football--tough, smart and disciplined--was accepted and strides were made in that direction. From 2010 to 2011, the Canes improved 19-plus spots among the nation's FBS schools in turnover margin (+19), fewest penalties per game (+63) and fewest yards penalized per game (+85).

Golden oversaw an offense that was one of the most efficient in the country and produced lauded 2011 seasons for quarterback Jacory Harris, wide receiver Tommy Streeter and running back Lamar Miller. His persuasion on the defense was evident, as the Canes held several top-rated offenses to 20-plus points below their season averages. The Miami defense finished the season ranked No. 21 in the nation in scoring defense and tied for ninth in red zone defense.

With a commitment to community service, Golden instituted the Be the Match-Bone Marrow drive at Miami. Members of the football staff and team took an active part in registering members of the UM and South Florida communities for the national organization.

Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending five seasons (2006-2010) as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years.

In 2010, Golden led the Owls to an 8-4 overall record, 5-3 in Mid-American Conference (MAC) games and saw eight players named to the All-MAC first team. The 2009 season saw the Owls reach unparalleled success. Golden guided the Owls to new heights, finishing the season at 9-4 overall and tying for first place in the MAC East Division with a 7-1 mark. Temple recorded its first winning season since 1990 and made its first bowl appearance in 30 years. The Owls' bowl game was just the third in 111 years of Temple football. The MAC East championship was the Owls' best conference finish since joining the league in 2003. TU won a single-season record nine consecutive games.

The Colts Neck, N.J., native was named the Owls' 24th head football coach on December 6, 2005, after spending the prior five seasons as defensive coordinator at the University of Virginia.

Named the 2009 MAC Coach of the Year and the Maxwell Club's Tri-State Coach of the Year, Golden also saw an unprecedented 15 Owls earn

All-MAC honors, including a school record eight first-team All-MAC honorees. All-American Bernard Pierce was named the MAC Freshman of the Year, while sophomore Adrian Robinson garnered MAC Defensive Player of the Year accolades.

The Owls also received recognition for their community service efforts. In 2009, the Temple team was awarded the Robert P. Levy Community Service Award, presented by the Philadelphia Sports Congress, and the Athletic Department's inaugural T.E.A.M. [Temple's Exceptional Acts for Mankind] Award for community service.

Off the field, Golden has mentored the Owls through the greatest academic turnaround in the NCAA APR Reform Era. In his third season, Golden guided the Owls to a 5-7 mark, the team's most wins most since 1990, and a second-place finish in the MAC East. Facing five opponents that went on to postseason play, the Owls persevered to new heights, despite losing three games on the very last play of the game.

In 2008, Golden saw five Owls earn All-MAC honors, including senior DT Terrance Knighton, Temple's then-only first-team selection. Temple showed significant improvement on special teams, leading the nation in kickoff returns. The Owls out-scored their opponents for the season for the first time since 1990. During his second season in 2007, Golden once again played the nation's most true freshmen (20) and started the nation's most true freshmen (12). He led the Owls to a 4-8 overall record and a 4-4 mark during their inaugural season in the Mid-American Conference.

Along the way, TU won three consecutive games. The fourth win tied Temple's mark for the most conference wins since 1967. Led by All-MAC players DT Andre Neblett and DB Dominique Harris, the Cherry & White defense led the MAC in total defense, red zone defense, and pass defense. The Owls' red zone defense ranked first nationally.

In his first campaign in Owl Country, Golden played 22 true freshmen, the most in the nation, against the third most difficult schedule in the country. Only national champion Florida (10) and Stanford (9) played more bowl participants during the regular season than the Owls, who competed against eight teams that earned postseason berths. Thirty-eight players saw their first major college football action under Golden in 2006, including 27 freshmen.

Golden captured his first victory at the helm when the Owls defeated Bowling Green, 28-14, at Lincoln Financial Field on Oct. 28, 2006. The win was the largest accomplishment for the Owls on the field, but a multitude of goals were achieved off the field during Golden's initial campaign. Temple unveiled the most comprehensive academic support team in the Mid-American Conference and teamed with Adidas as the team's official outfitter. The program was also successful in assembling a regional, nonconference schedule for years to come.

Recruiting has also been a tremendous success under Golden's leadership. His initial signing class in 2006 was rated best in the MAC by CollegeFootballNews.com, while the 2007 and 2008 classes earned top honors in the league from Scout.com.

With a commitment to community service and academics at the core of Golden's program, a multitude of individual honors were bestowed upon the Owls in 2006. Seven student-athletes were named to the 2006 Philadelphia Inquirer Academic All-Area Football team, providing Temple the most honorees of the 10 Delaware Valley institutions that sponsor football. Three players were named to the 2006 Eastern College Athletic Conference Division I-A Football All-Star Team, marking the most for the Owls on the ECAC squad since a trio also earned recognition in 1997.

In addition, three football student-athletes were named honorable mention freshman All-Americans by The Sporting News. It signaled the largest number of rookies to receive national recognition in program history.

Golden was named the youngest defensive coordinator in Division I-A by Virginia head coach Al Groh in January 2001, after spending the previous season at his alma mater, serving as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator under Joe Paterno. From 2001 to 2004, the Cavaliers' defense improved under his tutelage, ranking 108th in total defense in his first year to ranking 18th in total defense in 2004. In the same time period, Virginia's scoring defense went from 74th in the nation (27.6 ppg) to 17th (17.7 ppg) utilizing Golden's 3-4 scheme.

In addition to his responsibilities as defensive coordinator, Golden directed the inside linebackers from 2001-04 before shifting to the secondary in 2005. In 2004, he oversaw a defense that featured the nation's

best group of linebackers, according to Athlon, The Sporting News, and ESPN The Magazine. Under his guidance, Ahmad Brooks blossomed into a finalist for the Butkus Award. In 2003, Brooks and Kai Parham earned Freshman All-America honors. Golden was responsible for recruiting Brooks, the USA Today National Defensive Player of the Year--the highest ranked recruit to ever attend U.Va. Golden signed the Virginia High School Player of the Year in both 2002 (Brooks) and 2004 (Olu Hall).

During his first two seasons at Virginia, Golden helped develop two-time All-ACC linebacker Angelo Crowell, who currently plays with the Buffalo Bills, and 2003 Hula Bowl participant Merrill Robertson. Following the 2001 season, Golden was an assistant coach for the Gray team in the 64th Annual Blue-Gray All-Star Football Classic.

Golden began his coaching career in 1993 as offensive coordinator at Red Bank (N.J.) Catholic High School. He then served as a graduate assistant under George Welsh at Virginia from 1994 to 1996, where he worked primarily with the linebackers and the kickoff and punting teams. He helped develop All-ACC linebackers James Farrior and Jamie Sharper, both of whom were chosen in the 1997 NFL draft. Farrior was a first-round pick (#8) by the New York Jets, while Sharper was a second-round selection (#34) by the Baltimore Ravens. Golden then coached the linebackers at Boston College from 1997 to 1999 under Tom O'Brien. While at BC, Golden coached All-Big East and NFL linebackers Frank Chamberlin (Tennessee Titans) and Erik Storz (Jacksonville Jaguars). The Eagles finished the 1999 regular season with an 8-3 record and a top-25 national ranking, while making their first postseason bowl appearance since 1994.

Golden was a three-year (1989-91) letterwinner and two-year starter at tight end for Penn State, where he received the 1991 Ridge Riley Award, given annually to a player who displays excellence in scholarship, sportsmanship, friendship and leadership. As a junior in 1990, Golden played a key role in Penn State's nationally televised 24-21 upset of No. 1-ranked Notre Dame at South Bend.

His touchdown reception late in the fourth quarter tied the score at 21 as Penn State rallied from a 21-7 deficit. Golden captained the Nittany Lions his senior year and helped lead them to a 42-17 win over Tennessee in the 1992 Fiesta Bowl. Following that victory, Penn State finished with an 11-2 record and ranked third in the nation in the final 1991 AP poll.

After his tenure as a player in State College, Golden spent one season in the NFL with the New England Patriots.

Golden earned his undergraduate degree in pre-law from Penn State in 1991 before receiving his master's in sports psychology from Virginia in December, 1996.

A 2004 inductee of the Jersey Shore Sports Hall of Fame, he is married to the former Kelly Hanna of Lock Haven, Pa. The couple has three children--son A.J. (7), and daughters Addison (6) and Grace (3).

Mark D'Onofrio is in his fifth season as Miami's defensive coordinator. In 2014, D'Onofrio guided Miami to a No. 14 overall ranking in total defense. Under D'Onofrio's leadership, the Hurricanes held opponents to just 329.6 yards per game in 2014, which was nearly 100 yards fewer than the 2013 campaign.

In his first season at Miami, D'Onofrio's defense finished the season ranked ninth in the nation in red zone defense and 21st in scoring defense, holding opponents to an average of 20.08 points per game. The defense, under D'Onofrio's guidance, finished strong and proved stingy, giving up an average of only 13.5 points in the last five games of the season.

Prior to the 2011 season, D'Onofrio saw two of his Temple standouts drafted, now are active on NFL rosters. Defensive end Muhammad Wilkerson was taken in the first round by the New York Jets and free safety Jaiqwaun Jarrett went in the second round to the Philadelphia Eagles. In all, three Owls were drafted during D'Onofrio's tenure and five former players are active in the NFL.

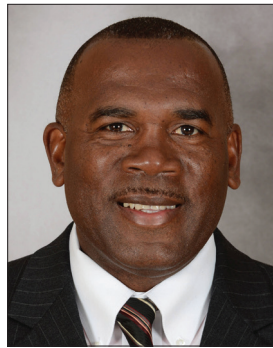

In addition, Miami's offensive line cleared lanes for three Hurricane running backs to rush for over 5.0 yards per carry. As a team, Miami averaged 180.4 rushing yards per game.

Kehoe's tenure of 28 years at Miami, a span during which he has either played or coached for six head football coaches, ranks among the longest of any UM athletics figure.

Paul Williams, who has 19 seasons of collegiate coaching experience, is in his fifth year as the University of Miami's defensive backs coach.

During the 2014 campaign, Miami's secondary was one the ACC's best units as it held opponents to under 200 yards per game (191.4) and ranked third in the league and 17th in the nation.

Williams' unit helped the Canes to a No. 21 ranking in the nation in scoring defense in 2011, holding opponents to an average of 20.08 points per game.

Prior to arriving in Coral Gables, Williams spent five seasons as defensive backs coach at Temple University under Al Golden.

Williams' defensive backs helped lead Temple to a successful 2010 campaign, finishing 8-4 and 5-3 in the Mid-American Conference. Standout defensive back Jaiquawn Jarrett garnered All-MAC first-team honors for the second year in a row, headlining a group of four defensive players earning all-conference accolades. Jarrett was a second-round NFL draft pick by the Philadelphia Eagles.

Hurlie Brown is in his third season on the Miami Hurricanes' and is in his second year coaching the linebackers.

Brown originally joined the staff as the running backs coach, ascending to the post on Feb. 10, 2013.

During the 2014 campaign, Brown coached the linebackers and guided a unit that helped the Hurricanes post the nation's 14th-best defensive attack, limiting opponents to just 329.6 yards per game.

Under Brown's guidance, linebacker Denzel Perryman posted an impressive season as he was selected as a Dick Butkus Award semifinalist for the second-consecutive season. He also earned All-ACC honors first team honors for the second-consecutive season after he finished the 2014 campaign with a team-best 110 total tackles (79 solo). Perryman then became the first Hurricane player since 2007 to be awarded with *Associated Press* All-America honors.

Perryman would go on to be selected Second Round of the 2015 NFL Draft by the San Diego Chargers.
