THE 2016-17 HURRICANES

Miami has nine scholarship players eligible for competition, led by a trio of captains in seniors Davon Reed and Kamari Murphy, along with junior Ja'Quan Newton. Sophomores Anthony Lawrence and Ebuka Izundu also returned for the Hurricanes.

This season a group of four newcomers comprising Miami's top recruiting class in program history donned a UM jersey for the first time. The Canes' coaching staff reeled in four freshmen in McDonald's All-American Dewan Huell, Jordan Brand Classic All-American Bruce Brown, Australian standout Dejan "DJ" Vasiljevic and Rodney Miller from national powerhouse Oak Hill Academy (Va.). The four-man group was named one of the top 2016 classes in the country, with a No. 9 ranking from 247Sports, No. 10 from Scout, No. 13 from ESPN and No. 13 from Rivals.

CANES SIGN A TRIO OF TOP-100 PLAYERS

Jim Larrañaga has signed three ESPN Top 100 players for the 2017 class in guard Lonnie Walker (No. 19), guard Chris Lykes (52) and forward Deng Gak (93). New Zealander Sam Waardenburg also joins the class, and is practicing with the team this spring. This marks the second straight Miami recruiting class with at least two ESPN Top 100 players, following last year's signing of Bruce Brown (26) and Dewan Huell (28).

Walker is a 6-foot-5-inch shooting guard from Reading, Pa., with great ball handling skills and is Miami's highest-ranked recruit in program history. Lykes is a 5-foot-6-inch explosive do-it-all point guard from Bowie, Md., who plays at Gonzaga College (D.C.) High School. Gak is a 6-foot-11-inch forward playing his prep ball at Blair Academy in New Jersey.

HEAD COACH JIM LARRAÑAGA

Coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to a pair of NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and won the 2013 ACC regular season and ACC Tournament titles. He has been named the AP, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year (2013, 2016), and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

5 - Coach Jim Larrañaga is one of five ACC coaches with a Final Four appearance to his credit. In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

7 - In 33 years of coaching, Jim Larrañaga has a winning record in the NCAA Tournament, a 9-7 mark in seven appearances.

7 - Larrañaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the top five of the rankings.

16 - Larrañaga has made 16 postseason appearances in the past 27 years, including reaching seven NCAA Tournaments.

33 - Larrañaga is in his 33rd year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned three institutions into winning programs: Miami, Bowling Green and George Mason.

500 - Coach L is one of five ACC coaches with 500 or more wins.

COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West, Fla., before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also owns a house in Sarasota, Fla., and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post at least three 20-win seasons.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane standout James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree. UM is in its 13th season in the ACC.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, North Carolina and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent of NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR.

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 11 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 953 of 961 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 812 of its last 813 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM, 105-64, on Jan. 31, 2007.

THE MATCHUP BETWEEN MIAMI AND PITTSBURGH

Miami is 18-18 all-time against Pittsburgh, and 2-1 against the Panthers with Coach L at the helm.

Last year's game with Pittsburgh was certainly one to remember. Point guard Angel Rodriguez, the shortest player on the court, tipped one in with 1.4 seconds left and the Canes came away with a 65-63 victory.

Since they began tracking assists in 1985, Miami's program record for assists in one game belongs to Michael Gardner who had 14 against Pitt in 1993.

This will be the first matchup between Coach L and Pittsburgh's new head coach Kevin Stallings.

In Miami's first matchup with Pittsburgh on December 26, 1947 the Canes narrowly edged the Panthers, 43-40.

MIAMI HITS THE ROAD FOR THREE STRAIGHT GAMES

The Hurricanes will play three straight games on the road, beginning with Pittsburgh on Jan. 14, followed by Jan. 18 at Wake Forest and Jan. 21 against Duke, which will be on ESPN's College GameDay.

CANES IN NATIONAL STATS

Miami is ranked in the top 100 in 13 NCAA statistical categories as of Jan. 9. The Canes are fourth in fewest fouls, eighth in scoring defense (59.7) and No. 16 in field goal percentage defense (38.4%). UM is also No. 22 in rebound margin and No. 42 in 3-point field goal defense. A complete list of national stats is on page eight of the notes.

LARRAÑAGA APPROACHING 600 CAREER VICTORIES

Coach Jim Larrañaga is just one win shy of 600 career victories, posting a 599-394 mark in 33 seasons as a head coach. With 600 wins, he will be one of five ACC coaches with 600 victories, and the other four men are in the Basketball Hall of Fame.

Coach L has won 27 games at American International, 170 at Bowling Green, 273 at George Mason and 129 at Miami.

BLOCK PARTY AGAINST NOTRE DAME

As a team, the Hurricanes swatted 12 Notre Dame shot attempts on Jan. 12, the most ever in an ACC game for the Canes, and the most this season by UM. The previous ACC high was nine twice, the last time against Wake Forest in 2009, and this season's high was eight, twice, with the last occurrence against Rutgers on Nov. 30.

Three players - starters Davon Reed and Bruce Brown, and reserve Ebuka Izundu - each set career game highs with three blocks apiece. Kamari Murphy added a pair, and Anthony Lawrence, Jr., added one.

CANES OUTREBOUND FIGHTING IRISH

Three Hurricanes pulled down nine-plus boards against the Irish, led by 12 from Kamari Murphy, added to nine apiece from Bruce Brown and Anthony Lawrence, Jr., who had seven offensive boards. As a team, Miami outrebounded Notre Dame 47-38.

REED POSTS CAREER BESTS AGAINST ND

Against Notre Dame, senior guard Davon Reed tied his career bests of 21 points and three blocks, and set career marks with nine field goals made and 17 field goals attempted.

R33D FROM LONG RANGE

Senior guard Davon Reed has knocked down 21 shots from long range in the past seven games. He hit five against FAU, three against SC State, George Washington, Columbia and NC State, and a pair at Syracuse and vs. Notre Dame. For the year, he is 34-90 (40.3%) from downtown, hitting multiple 3-pointers in 11 outings, including three-or-more six times.

MIAMI PICKED NINTH IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

Miami was predicted to finish ninth out of 15 teams in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season, as announced by the league at the 55th annual Operation Basketball. The UM locker room is closed at all times. For home games, Coach L and at least one Hurricane player will report to the media room for interviews following the opposing team's press conference.

WHAT'S TRENDING, INDIVIDUALLY

Freshman guard Bruce Brown has grabbed at least four rebounds in each of the first 15 games, has eight-or-more in seven outings and pulled down double-digit boards in two contests. He has at least two assists in 11 contests, with five-plus in six outings.

Sophomore Ebuka Izundu has a block in seven of the last nine outings and has scored in eight of his last nine games.

Sophomore guard Anthony Lawrence, Jr., has swiped at least one steal in each game but three, and had three-or-more in four outings. He has five-plus rebounds in six of the last eight outings.

Redshirt senior forward Kamari Murphy has reorded a pair of double-doubles (vs. Wofford, vs. NC State). He has pulled down double-digit boards in six outings.

Junior point guard Ja'Quan Newton has recorded four 20-point games this season. He has scored 11-plus points in every game but two (FAU-8, Syracuse-8). Newton has three steals in a trio of games and has dished out three-or-more assists in 10 outings. He has made a free throw in every game but one (GW).

Senior guard Davon Reed has scored in double digits 12 times this season, including 10 of the last 11 games. He has scored 20-plus in three outings this season. He has grabbed five-plus rebounds in seven outings. Reed has hit at least one shot from long range in every game, with multiple threes in 11 contests, led by five against FAU. He has multiple threes in seven straight games.

Freshman DJ Vasiljevic has drained three-or-more shots from 3-point range in five games and has hit a three in all but three outings (Florida, Rutgers, FAU).

MILESTONES FOR THE CANES

600 Victories - Coach Larrañaga is just one win shy of 600 career victories. With 600 wins, he will be one of five ACC coaches with 600 victories, and the other four men are in the Basketball Hall of Fame.

1,000 Games - Coach Larrañaga opened the 2016-17 season just 21 shy of 1,000 career games coached. Miami's 21st game of the season is vs. Florida State on Feb. 1. He has coached 53 games at American International, 314 at Bowling Green, 437 at George Mason and now 190 at Miami.

100 Blocks - With one swat against Syracuse, redshirt senior Kamari Murphy recorded his 100th career block. He had 61 at Oklahoma State before coming to Miami as a junior.

1,000 Points - In his 109th game at The U, senior guard Davon Reed scored 17 points against George Washington, solidifying his name in Miami's 1,000-point club. He is the 37th Hurricane to score 1,000 points.

100 Games - Seniors Kamari Murphy and Davon Reed each played in their 100th career game at North Florida on Nov. 16, 2016. Murphy, a redshirt senior, played in 66 games at Oklahoma State before coming to Miami as a junior. All of Reed's games are at UM.

1,000 Program Wins - With a 78-67 win over Columbia on Dec. 28, 2016, the University of Miami men's basketball program earned its 1,000th program victory. Current Coach Jim Larrañaga has helped UM to both its 900th victory, a 73-58 win over Hawaii on Dec. 22, 2012, and the 1,000th win, over Columbia.

FRESHMAN GUARD SECOND IN REBOUNDS

Freshman guard Bruce Brown is second on the team with 7.4 rebounds per game, trailing senior forward Kamari Murphy's 7.9 rpg. Brown has grabbed four-plus boards in every game, including seven-plus nine times.

LUCKY SEVENS FROM LONG RANGE

Miami has made at least seven shots from long range in 112 of Larrañaga's 190 games at UM. The Canes are 88-24 when making at least seven from 3-point range. This season, Miami is 6-1 when hitting seven from deep. 2015-16: 17-3; 2014-15: 18-5; 2013-14: 9-6; 2012-13: 19-3; 2011-12: 19-6.

ROOKIE McCLELLAN SIGNS WITH WIZARDS

In June, former Canes Sheldon McClellan signed a partially guaranteed contract with the Washington Wizards, and on the NBA's opening day, the NBA rookie played in his first professional game. The contract of McClellan became fully guaranteed for the Wizards in January, locking in the undrafted rookie for the rest of the season.

McClellan made his first NBA start on Nov. 12 vs. Chicago, in just his fifth professional game played. Against the Bulls, he scored 15 points in 35 minutes played. "Mac" is averaging 4.4 points per game and hitting 41.7 percent from the field in his 12.9 minutes per game.

CANES HOOPS PLAYERS IN THE NFL

Two former Hurricane basketball student-athletes made moves in the NFL this season. Jimmy Graham played his second season with the Seattle Seahawks and Erik Swoope played his first season with the Indianapolis Colts after being on the practice squad for two years. Graham, who played one season of football

at Miami, recorded 923 yards and six touchdowns on 65 receptions for the Seahawks this season. Swoope, who never played organized football prior to his NFL career, tallied 297 yards and one touchdown from 15 receptions in his first season on an active roster in the pros.

SELLING OUT THE WATSCO CENTER

In just his fifth season in Coral Gables, Jim Larrañaga and Miami SOLD OUT the season ticket allotment for all home games last year at the Watsco Center. It was the first time in Miami athletics history a team sold out their season. And now, the arena is sold out in back-to-back seasons.

For two straight years, fans have bought over 5,500 season tickets, more than doubling the total number of season tickets sold in Larrañaga's first season in Coral Gables. When Coach L began his reign in Miami, fans bought 2,251 season tickets for the 2011-12 campaign. After a record-breaking season on the court in 2012-13, season tickets peaked at 3,674 for 2013-14, prior to this year's 5,750 mark.

SEBASTIAN THE IBIS



In 1926, the University of Miami adopted the Ibis as the official mascot for the University's athletic teams. Representing the leadership, courage, knowledge, strength and speed characteristics that our student-athletes portray. As the clouds become dark and a hurricane approaches, folklore maintains that other birds look to the Ibis for leadership. The Ibis uses its instinct to detect danger. It is the last sign of wildlife to take shelter before a hurricane hits, giving warning that danger is imminent. As the storm passes the Ibis is the first to reappear, a sign that clear skies are approaching.

REED NAMED A SENIOR CLASS AWARD CANDIDATE

Senior guard Davon Reed was one of 60 NCAA men's and women's basketball student-athletes who were selected as candidates for the 2016-17 Senior CLASS Award, honoring those players who excel both on and off the court. To be eligible for the Senior CLASS Award, a student-athlete must have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: Community, classroom, character and competition.

"MATCH MARCUS" CAMPAIGN

Miami Athletics, in partnership with Miami native and the star of CNBC show "The Profit", Marcus Lemonis, have announced the 'Match Marcus' fundraising campaign for student-athlete excellence. The 'Match Marcus' campaign challenges the University of Miami community and Canes fans to raise a total of \$2 million to support UM student-athletes in their pursuit of excellence. For every donation to the campaign, Lemonis will match half of the total - resulting in up to a \$1 million gift from Lemonis.

WAARDENBURG ADDED TO CANES SQUAD

New Zealand native Sam Waardenburg has signed a grant-in-aid agreement with the University of Miami men's basketball team. Waardenburg, a forward from Henderson, New Zealand, has joined and is practicing with the team, but is expected to begin competition with the Hurricanes for the 2017-18 season.

REED SERVING AS MARKETING INTERN

Senior Davon Reed will graduate in May with a degree in sports administration with a minor in marketing and communications. Since June of 2016, Reed has been an intern in the athletics marketing department, assisting the execution of strategic marketing planning for athletics programs with a focus on increasing attendance, game atmosphere and fan experience at Hurricane athletics events.

BROWN RECORDS PROGRAM'S SECOND TRIPLE-DOUBLE

Freshman guard Bruce Brown recorded a triple-double with 11 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists against South

Carolina State on Dec. 6. It was the second triple-double in program history at Miami, the 11th in the NCAA this season, fourth by a Power 6 player, second by a freshman (De'Aaron Fox, Kentucky) and the 23rd in ACC history.

In 2004, Miami's Anthony King recorded the school's first triple-double with 11 points, a school-record 13 blocks and 10 rebounds against FAU.

COACHING COORDINATORS FOR MIAMI

Miami's assistant coaching staff is set up in a coordinator system, with Jamal Brunt as the offensive coordinator, Chris Caputo manning the defense and Adam Fisher handling the scout for every opponent. James Johnson is the dean of discipline.

BASKETBALL FACILITY UNDERGOING \$1.7 MILLION RENOVATION

In addition to the arena being renamed the Watson Center, the University of Miami basketball facility is undergoing a \$1.7 million renovation. The project, which includes work on areas used by both the men's and women's programs, will feature upgrades to the locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, office spaces, weight room and practice facility hallways. The project is being split into two phases, with the second set to begin following the 2016-17 season.

The coaches' offices and hallways of the facility will feature highlights from great moments in Miami basketball history, as well as photos of select stars from both the men's and women's teams. Also on display will be large-scale images of UM's ProCanes, as well as the newest Miami adidas gear. The players' lounge will feature a gaming center complete with couches and televisions. The walls of the practice facility will showcase photos of celebrity Canes fans throwing up the U. Student-athletes will have custom lockers and the sound system in the locker room, lounges and coaches' offices will be upgraded.

MIAMI ANNOUNCES THE WATSCO CENTER

In October, the University of Miami announced the naming of its multi-purpose entertainment facility as the Watsco Center. Watsco, Inc., based in Miami, is traded on the New York Stock Exchange and is the largest distributor of air conditioning, heating and refrigeration products with annual sales of more than \$4 billion, 5,000 employees and 563 locations throughout North America. Watsco has provided funding to the University since the 1990s through its "Watsco's Kids" program, providing children in the community free access to performance arts, sports and other events at the University.

LARRAÑAGA CONTRACT EXTENDED THROUGH 2022

The University of Miami extended Coach Jim Larrañaga's contract through May 31, 2022, Director of Athletics Blake James announced in September 2014. Larrañaga first signed a five-year contract in April 2011, then was granted a three-year extension in 2012.

HURRICANES MAKE DIVISION I ATHLETICS HISTORY

Miami was the only school in NCAA Division I athletics to have its football team play in a bowl game, men's and women's basketball teams reach the NCAA tournament and baseball team advance to the College World Series during the 2015-16 academic year.

LARRAÑAGA AND CAPUTO TOGETHER 15 YEARS

This season head coach Jim Larrañaga and associate head coach Chris Caputo begin their 15th season on sidelines together, dating back to their time at George Mason University. Caputo started on Coach L's staff as the video coordinator for the 2002-03 season, and along the way, the native of Elmhurst, N.Y., was an assistant coach and is now the associate head coach for the Hurricanes. Caputo helped the 2006 GMU team to the NCAA Final Four and has made five total NCAA Tournament appearances with Larrañaga. Both Caputo and Larrañaga attended Archbishop Molloy High School (N.Y.) and played for legendary head coach Jack Curran.

LARRAÑAGA ONE OF THE BEST

All stats below are prior to the 2016-17 season.

Among active coaches, Jim Larrañaga is the 11th-winningest coach in the country at major schools with 588 victories, and is ranked No. 42 on the list of all-time winningest coaches at major schools. Among the seven ACC coaches with five-plus years in the league, in their first five years at their current school, Coach L is second in overall wins (118), overall winning percentage (.674), ACC victories (54), winning percentage in ACC games only (.614). Among all-time ACC coaches (includes only seasons coaching at ACC schools during years as ACC member), Coach L is ranked No. 25 all-time in ACC wins and No. 29 all-time in overall wins, in just five years in the league. He is ninth all-time in winning percentage in ACC games only (.614).

MIAMI BASKETBALL - THE EARLY YEARS

The University of Miami basketball program was dormant for 14 years from 1971-1985. In 1983 Director of Athletics Sam Jankovich announced the resurrection of men's basketball at Miami, with the reinstatement vote by the UM Board of Trustees on Oct. 12, 1983. Head coach Bill Foster was hired March 21, 1984, adding assistants Clint Bryant, Seth Greenberg and Cesar Odio by July 1. On Oct. 15, 1984 the first men's basketball practice in 12 years was held on the patio in the center of campus, viewed by more than 200 students. Miami defeated The Citadel, 85-77, on Nov. 22, 1985, in the first game of the new era of UM basketball. Tim Harvey was the staff's first recruit, a 6-10, 240-pound center from Plainfield, N.J., who transferred from Georgia Tech.

STEVE EDWARDS TO BE INDUCTED INTO UMSHOF

University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame has announced its class of 2017 inductees, which includes Steve Edwards, who played basketball at Miami from 1992-96. One of the most prolific long-range shooters in Miami history, Edwards still ranks second in the record books with 265 career 3-point field goals, a mark that is still the BIG EAST Conference record. Edwards, a two-time honoree as "Mr. Basketball" in the state of Florida, was named to the conference all-freshman team in his first year for UMSHoF member Coach Leonard Hamilton.

2015-16 IN REVIEW

2015-16 TEAM HIGHLIGHTS

- First team in Miami history to sell out its home arena for the entire season.
- Third squad in Miami history to play in the Sweet 16.
- 24 regular season wins tied with the 2012-13 season for the most in Miami history.
- 13 wins in ACC play were the second-most in school history, behind 15 in 2012-13.
- Perfect 9-0 at home in ACC play, 15-1 at home overall.
- Defeated five ranked teams: No. 3 Virginia, No. 11 Louisville, No. 16 Utah, No. 22/20 Butler and No. 24/20 Duke, with back-to-back wins over Virginia and Louisville.
- Ranked in the polls a school record 17 straight weeks. Ranked top-15 for a school record 14 weeks.
- Won the Puerto Rico Tip Off, defeating No. 16 Utah, No. 22/20 Butler and Mississippi State by 20.0 points per game. Puerto Rico native Angel Rodriguez was named MVP.
- Won ACC/Big Ten Challenge game at Nebraska, 77-72, in overtime.
- Defeated in-state rival Florida, which was receiving votes at the time.
- Posted 11-1 non-conference regular season record with only loss on a buzzer-beater vs. Northeastern. The Canes were 6-1 at home, 2-0 on the road and 3-0 at neutral sites.
- Coach L named ACC Coach of the Year for second time in four seasons.
- Sheldon McClellan named to the USBWA All-District Team and Coach Larrañaga recognized as District IV Coach of the Year.
- Three players - Sheldon McClellan, Tonye Jekiri and Angel Rodriguez - named All-ACC, while Jekiri was on the ACC Defensive Team. Davon Reed was on the All-ACC Academic Team.
- Sheldon McClellan named to the 2016 ACC All-Tournament Second Team.

MIAMI POSTS THIRD 25-WIN SEASON

Coach Jim Larrañaga posted his third 25-win season and fourth 20-win season in five years at The U. This was also his fifth-career 25-win season and 10th-career 20-win campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with four 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67), and is the only Miami coach with a 25-win year.

This was Miami's third 25-win campaign (all under Coach L) and seventh 20-win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign.

13+ ACC WINS FOR THE SECOND TIME UNDER COACH L

Miami won 13 games in ACC play for just the second time in school history, along with 15 wins in 2012-13. In five seasons under Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven-or-more ACC games each season. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

TIED FOR MOST REGULAR-SEASON WINS

Miami was 24-5 in the regular season, tied with the 24-6 record in 2012-13 for the most regular-season wins in Hurricanes history. In Larrañaga's five seasons, the Canes have the following records in the regular season: 2015-16: 24-5; 2014-15: 20-11; 2013-14: 16-15; 2012-13: 24-6; 2011-12: 18-11.

BEST FG SHOOTING PERCENTAGE IN 27 YEARS

The Canes made 47.9 percent (907-1895) from the field, the best in Miami's history since the 1988-89 season when UM hit 49.2 percent (1024-2083) of its shots.

Miami's 74.9 percent clip (578-772) at the line was the best since 77.1 percent (523-678) in 2001-02.

THE HURRICANES IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

The Canes were a No. 3 seed for the first time in UM history. Miami's highest seed was No. 2, in 2013 and 1999.

The Canes played in the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time.

Miami is 8-8 in NCAA Tournament play.

Miami played in its third Sweet 16, has played in the second round five times and played just one game three times.

Under head coach Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 4-2 in the NCAA Tournament in just four seasons. The Hurricanes were 4-6 in their first six appearances.

UM has won at least one game in the NCAA Tournament in five of eight appearances, including three straight and in five of the last six.

UM has won five of its last eight games in the NCAA Tournament after going 2-1 in 2013 and 1-1 in 2008.

Five different coaches have led Miami to its eight NCAA appearances. Leonard Hamilton (3: 1998-00) and Jim Larrañaga (2: 2013, 2016) are the only coaches to lead the Canes to multiple NCAA berths.

Miami and Texas A&M were the only two schools among top-three seeds who did not play in the NCAA Tournament in 2014-15.

MIAMI CONTINUES TO EXCEED EXPECTATIONS

Miami was a 3-seed in the 2016 NCAA Tournament, one of five teams among the 12 top three-seeds that was not ranked in the AP preseason poll.

ALL-ACC AWARDS FOR THE HURRICANES

Coach Jim Larrañaga was named the ACC Coach of the Year for the second time in four seasons, while three players earned postseason honors. Coach Jim Larrañaga - Coach of the Year (ACSMA/Coaches); Tonye Jekiri - All-Defensive Team (ACSMA/Coaches); Sheldon McClellan - Second Team All-ACC (ACSMA/Coaches); Angel Rodriguez - Third Team All-ACC (ACSMA); Tonye Jekiri - Honorable Mention (ACSMA/Coaches). Since joining the league in 2004-05, Miami has had 34 honorees on ACC postseason award lists, 21 of whom have come under Coach L's watch, including five of Miami's six All-Defensive Team players. Jekiri is the only Hurricane to be named to that team twice.

JEKIRI EARNS MOST WINS IN PROGRAM HISTORY

In four seasons at Miami, Tonye Jekiri won 96 games, the most of any Hurricane in school history. Jekiri was the only remaining player from the 2012-13 ACC Championship and NCAA Sweet 16 team. That season, Jekiri did not play in a pair of games, playing in just 27 wins individually. He played in every victory since, with 17 as a sophomore, 25 as a junior and 27 as a senior.

McCLELLAN 11TH-MOST EFFICIENT PLAYER IN THE NATION, 180 PLAYER

Sheldon McClellan was the 11th-most efficient offensive player in the nation among players with 20 percent-or-more possessions used, according to KenPom.com. He was also the third most efficient player in the ACC overall, and No. 30 in the nation. McClellan was 17th in the ACC (league games only) in 2-point field goal percentage (54.6), ninth in true shooting percentage (60.7) and 10th in free throw percentage (83.5). He was fourth in the ACC in turnover rate (9.6).

McClellan also hit 56.7 percent from two, 38.9 percent from three and 83.8 percent at the line, adding up to 179.4, nearly the mark of an 180 player.

NEWTON BEST SIXTH MAN IN THE COUNTRY

Dick Vitale lauded Miami sophomore Ja'Quan Newton as the "best sixth man in the country." Newton immensely improved his stats from his freshman year, and scored in double digits 21 times last season.

In the 10 ACC victories Newton played in (not vs. VT twice, Louisville and Notre Dame), he averaged 11.4 points and 2.3 assists per game, hitting 50.6 percent from the field. In the Canes' four losses he played in, he put up 6.8 points and 1.3 assists per outing, knocking down 26.5 percent of his shots.

REED NAMED TO ALL-ACC ACADEMIC TEAM

Davon Reed was named to the 2015-16 All-Atlantic Coast Conference Academic Men's Basketball team. The junior from Ewing, N.J., is majoring in sports administration.

HOOPS TEAMS COMBINE FOR HISTORIC SEASON

The 2015-16 season was the top combined year ever between Miami's men's and women's basketball programs. Together, they went 51-17, setting a school record for combined victories and winning percentage (.750). Additionally, it was the third time, joining 1997-98 and 2012-13, both teams reached the NCAA Tournament in the same season. Miami was one of 10 schools in the nation to have its men's team and women's team conclude the 2015-16 season ranked in the *USA TODAY* Coaches Poll, as they checked in at No. 8 and No. 24, respectively.

A YEAR TO REMEMBER

The 2015-16 season was the top combined season ever between Miami's men's and women's basketball programs. Together, they went 51-17, setting a school record for combined victories and winning percentage (.750). He has been named the AP, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga has posted three 25-win seasons at UM – the only Miami coach to do so – and five in his career. He also has recorded four 20-win campaigns at The U and 10 in his career. In conference action, the Canes have won nine-or-more league games in four-of-five seasons, while prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won more than eight ACC games in a season. Larrañaga has helped the Canes to 16 postseason victories, including four in the NCAA Tournament (two appearances), seven in the ACC Tournament (five) and five in the NIT (two).

Miami's 35 road wins in the past five seasons are the most among league teams, and in that time, the Canes are fourth in the conference in wins (54), and in both ACC home (31) and road (23) victories. In the five years prior to Coach L's arrival, when the ACC had only 12 teams, Miami was tied for 10th in ACC victories (29), and won just seven ACC road games.

In 2012-13, the Bronx, N.Y., native helped Miami to a No. 2 national ranking by both the AP and USA TODAY, and a No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament. He is the 10th coach in the last 10 years to lead two top-10 programs, as Miami was No. 2 on Feb. 18, 2013, and George Mason was No. 8 in the final top 25 poll in 2006.

Larrañaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided that program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999) - including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and UConn along the way. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee National Coach of the Year.

Larrañaga built the GMU Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (2008, 2001, 1999).

In 2006, Larrañaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the school's first-ever national ranking, George Mason's first-ever appearance in the top 10 and the school's first wins over top 10 teams.

Larrañaga previously served as the head coach at Bowling Green for 11 seasons (1986-1997) and at Division II American International for two seasons (1977-79). His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland, then reunited with Holland as an assistant at Virginia from 1979-86. In 1976, he spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium.

A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Larrañaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the NBA Draft by the Detroit Pistons. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991.

Larrañaga, 67, and his wife, Liz, have two sons, Jay and John, and four grandchildren, Tia, James, Jon Temple and Henry. Jay played for his father at Bowling Green, was the head coach of the NBDL's Erie Bayhawks and his now an assistant coach with the Boston Celtics. Jon was a member of his father's George Mason teams from 1999-2003, earning First Team Academic All-American honors for NCAA Division I-AAA schools.
