## STORY LINES

- After a midweek win over Bethune-Cookman, the Miami Hurricanes will continue on their five-game homestand Friday when visiting Clemson arrives for the first of a three-game set at The Light. First pitch for Friday's opener is set for 7 p.m.
- Despite their 8-10 record in Atlantic Coast Conference play, the Hurricanes are ranked No. 14 in the newest *WarrenNolan.com* Rating Percentage Index (RPI), while the team's 2013 schedule is currently ranked the third-toughest in the nation.
- In addition to its own impressive RPI rank, the Hurricanes have six wins against teams rated in the top 20 RPI and 12 wins against teams ranked in the top 50 RPI - both important factors in postseason projections and consideration.
- The Hurricanes will once again look to their weekend rotation of **Chris Diaz**, **Bryan Radziewski** and **Andrew Suarez** to lead the way against the Tigers. All three starters rank in the top 20 in the Atlantic Coast Conference in ERA during conference play.
- Miami is 4-1 in its past five games, paced offensively over the span by **David Thompson** (five hits, one homerun, five RBI's) and captain **Chantz Mack** (seven hits, two runs, five walks, three steals). Mack is riding a season-best five-game hitting streak.
- Two coaching legends will meet once again at The Light, as Miami head coach **Jim Morris** and Clemson skipper **Jack Leggett** will manage from opposite dugouts. The two have combined for over 2,500 wins in their history as Division I managers.

### 3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 875-336-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,379-603-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,510-644-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

#### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

#### MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,379-603-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,510-644-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



#### JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

## TAKE A STAND...

- The Miami Hurricanes will continue on their five-game homestand when the Clemson Tigers arrive in Coral Gables for an Atlantic Coast Conference weekend series beginning Fri, April 19.
- After capturing its midweek game with a 6-1 win over Bethune-Cookman, Miami now has an impressive 19-8 (.704) mark at home in 2013, including a 9-3 (.750) record in midweek games.
- The series between the Tigers and the Hurricanes will be the first played at The Light since 2008, when then-No. 2 Miami captured a three-game sweep.

## BUILDING MOMENTUM...

- In the latest Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) calculations from *WarrenNolan.com* (April 18), Miami is ranked No. 14 in the nation. Additionally, the projection site ranks Miami with the third-toughest schedule of any team in Division I.
- The Hurricanes have six wins against teams ranked in *WarrenNolan's* Top 20 RPI, and have 12 wins against Top 50 RPI teams.
- Miami's upcoming series with No. 20/24 Clemson will mark the team's fourth three-game series against a ranked foe in the past five weeks of the regular season.

## STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering a team-best seven quality starts in nine chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks sixth in the ACC with an ERA of 1.78, and third in the conference with 60.2 innings pitched.
- Having surrendered just five runs all season, junior Bryan Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 1.11, good for third-best mark in the ACC. He has also recorded an eye-popping 55:10 strikeout-to-walk ratio through seven starts, while his 55 punchouts are the fifth-most in the conference. He has held opponents to a measly .158 batting average, the best mark of any pitcher in the ACC.
- Radziewski (1.29, No. 2), Diaz (2.38, No. 8) and sophomore Andrew Suarez (3.71, No. 17) all rank in the top 20 in ERA among ACC starters in conference competition this season.

## CLOSING IT OUT...

- Senior Eric Nedeljkovic has been Miami's most reliable reliever out of the bullpen, and has allowed just two runs in 19.2 innings of work this season.
- Nedeljkovic recorded back-to-back saves in Miami's two wins against Maryland, setting the Terrapins offensive down in order to close out both games.
- The Folsom, Calif., native, who is tied for the most saves of any reliever in the conference (eight), has allowed only 12 hits in 18 appearances, and has a dominant 22:2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

## SCOUTING THE TIGERS...

- Clemson enters this weekend's series at The Light riding a 10-game winning streak, which has helped bolster the Tigers to their current 26-11 overall mark, including a 12-6 record in ACC play.
- The Tigers' weekend rotation, which has guided the team to the fourth-best team ERA in the ACC (3.15), is comprised of lefty Daniel Gossett (5-2, 2.88 ERA) and righthanders Matthew Crownover (5-0, 2.54) and Clate Schmidt (3-1, 4.07).
- Offensively, Clemson is powered by sophomore Tyler Slaton (.344 average, nine RBI's), junior Shane Kennedy (.328, 21 RBI's) and sophomore slugger Garrett Boulware (.316, seven homers, 31 RBI's).

## GETTING DEFENSIVE...

- When healthy, Miami's infield defense has been one of the brightest spots on the season.
- The Hurricanes' 2013 infield features four newcomers: freshmen David Thompson & Christopher Barr on the corners, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior Brad Fieger completes the cast of regulars.
- The play of the Hurricanes infield has been the catalyst for a majority of the team's 36 double plays - the second-most of any team in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Miami has allowed just 21 stolen bases this season - the second-fewest of any team in the conference.

## QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff have received 19 quality starts from their pitchers this season - including two in the team's most weekend recent weekend series at Maryland.
- Chris Diaz set a new personal record by going eight innings against Virginia Tech on March 22, and matched the total last time out in a no decision against the Terrapins (April 12).
- Bryan Radziewski has dominated since being inserted into the weekend rotation. He has registered six straight quality starts and has a miniscule 1.29 ERA in conference play.
- Andrew Suarez delivered three straight quality starts against Duke (March 10), UNC (March 17) and Va Tech (March 24), and ranks 17th in the ACC with a 3.71 in conference play.
- In his last two starts, Javi Salas has recorded a 2-0 record with an 0.56 ERA (one earned run) in 16.0 innings of work - including his first career complete game against Stetson (April 10).

## FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...

- A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications - including *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball*.
- Despite starting just 22 games, Christopher Barr is reaching base at a .387 clip - the fourth-best mark among regular starters. He ranks third on the team with 19 walks.
- RHP Frank Grandinette ranks third on the team in appearances (14), just a handful shy of fellow bullpen regulars AJ Salcines (20) and Eric Nedeljkovic (18).
- Junior Alex Hernandez is one of just two Hurricanes to start all 40 games this season, and ranks fourth on the team with a .277 batting average. He leads the offense in several categories, including runs scored (30), doubles (10) and walks (22).
- Freshman David Thompson, who has started the past five games at third base after spending the majority of the first half of 2013 across the diamond, leads the team with 28 RBI's, three homeruns and a .442 slugging percentage.

## HEATING UP...

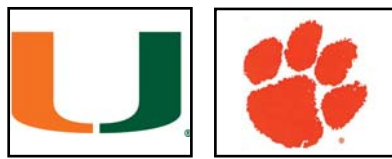
- Miami is 4-1 over its past five games thanks in large part to the offensive contributions of senior Chantz Mack - hitting at a team-best .467 clip over that stretch (7-for-15, three RBI's).
- Junior Tyler Palmer hit first in the batting order in the team's win over Bethune-Cookman (April 17), and has five hits in his last 12 at bats. He also has three steals and three runs.
- Junior reliever AJ Salcines, who battled early season struggles, has not allowed a run since a March 30 outing at Virginia - a stretch spanning 6.0 innings over five appearances.
- Senior Eric Whaley has been a key factor out of the bullpen, and has not allowed a run since March 29 at Virginia - a stretch spanning 8.0 innings over four relief appearances.

## Remembering "The Wizard of College Baseball"

The Hurricanes have dedicated the 2013 season in memory of former head coach Ron Fraser, who passed away before the season after a battle with Alzheimer's Disease.

Miami has taken special steps to remember "The Wizard of College Baseball," who helped guide the Hurricanes to over 1,200 wins and two national championships in his storied 30-year tenure as head coach.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb. 23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion," a trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

A commemorative home plate painted on the field with the number 1, Fraser's retired jersey number, will remain all season. Fraser is one of 11 former Hurricanes players and coaches to have had their numbers immortalized.

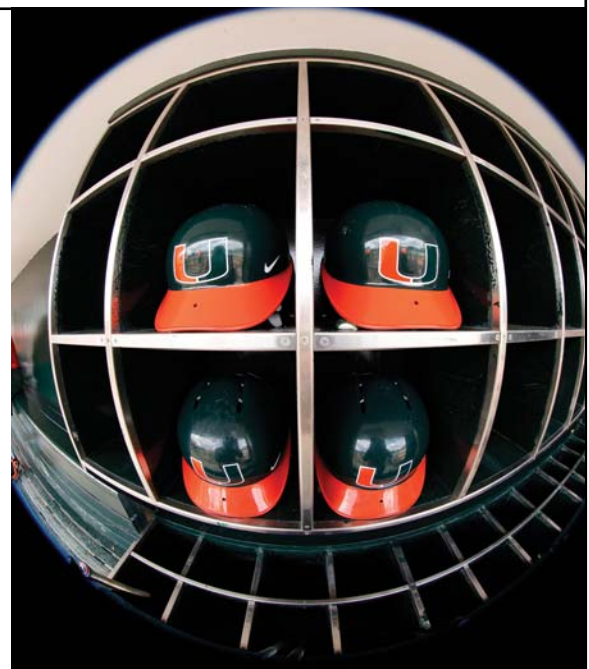

## LAST YEAR'S SERIES...

### March 30, 2012 HURRICANES FALTER IN SERIES OPENER

**CLEMSON, S.C.**- The eighth-ranked Miami Hurricanes resumed their conference schedule on Friday in South Carolina, dropping their series opener to Clemson University by a disappointing final score of 3-1.

It was the Tigers who struck first on Friday night, as Clemson opened the game's scoring in the very first inning. After Steve Wilkerson led off the action with a single to centerfield, Erickson was charged with a balk that moved Wilkerson to second base. Just when it looked like Erickson might get out of the inning unscathed, Phil Pohl ripped a ball up the middle that ricocheted off the pitcher and plated Wilkerson to give the Tigers a 1-0 advantage.

The Hurricanes struck back in the next frame, however, as Perez got the team going with a single to rightfield. After freshman Esteban Tresgallo walked, the second balk of the game was called on Tigers' righthander Kyle Brady, moving both runners up a base. On a weakly hit groundball to the second baseman, Jarred Mederos plated Perez and effectively tied the game at 1-1.

Miami hitters battled out some lengthy at-bats against Brady, who threw his 95th and final pitch with only one out in the fourth inning. The Hurricanes drew five walks in the junior's brief stint, including an 11-pitch battle with Rodriguez in the third and a 10-pitch at-bat from Mederos.

While Brady struggled with his control, his counterpart on the mound managed the series opener in better fashion. Though he ended the game with a loss, the Sarasota, Fla. native utilized a strong combination of offspeed pitches against Tigers hitters, striking out six batters in his six innings of work. He allowed seven hits and three runs in his seventh start of the year.

It looked like Clemson would regain the lead in the bottom of the fifth, but Erickson pitched his way out of a jam caused by two infield errors. After an errant throw from Mederos gave the Tigers a runner on second to lead off the inning, Shaffer was intentionally walked by Erickson to bring up Pohl. The senior weakly hit a routine groundball to Perez that was bobbed by the second baseman, loading the bases for the Tigers.

Erickson couldn't get out of the next inning unharmed though, as the Tigers once again found themselves with a runner on second base thanks to a fielding error by the Canes, this one by sophomore centerfielder Dale Carey on a slip in the outfield. After Jon McGibbon advanced to third on a groundout, Erickson uncharacteristically hit a batter to give the Tigers runners on the corners. A sacrifice fly from Thomas Brittle was enough to plate McGibbon, giving Clemson its first lead since the game's first inning. A double from Wilkerson down the left-field line then plated Attansio, giving the Tigers a 3-1 lead.

Campbell effectively shut down the Hurricanes offense during his four-inning relief stint, allowing only one hit and walking none while striking out seven batters. The Miami offense struggled to get anything going for nearly five full innings, as a single from Rony Rodriguez in the top of the eighth gave the Hurricanes their first hit since the third inning. Though Adam Sargent and Chris Diaz pitched well in relief of Erickson, Miami's inability to drive in runners (nine men left on base) cost the team its series opener at Doug Kingsmore Stadium.

### March 31, 2012 HURRICANES DROP GAME TWO TO CLEMSON 3-1

**CLEMSON, S.C.** -- In another pitching battle at Doug Kingsmore Stadium, the eighth-ranked Miami Hurricanes dropped game two of their weekend series with the Clemson Tigers by a final score of 3-1.

For the second straight day, it was the Tigers who opened the game's scoring early in the contest. Junior righthander Eric Whaley (3-2), entering the game with an 0.44 ERA in three conference starts, nearly got out of a dicey jam unharmed before a bloop double to leftfield bounced out of the glove of a diving Rony Rodriguez. The basehit from Tyler Slaton plated catcher Spencer Kieboom, who had reached on a single earlier in the inning, to give Clemson an early 1-0 advantage.

Miami would strike back to tie the game in the fourth inning on a wild sequence that resulted in a Hurricanes' run. After Stephen Perez walked and stole second, a single from Brad Fieger to leftfield had Perez rounding third. Though the junior infielder slowed down a few steps after hitting the base, Fieger attempted to take second on the outfielder's throw to homeplate. Kieboom's toss from home sailed over the heads of the Tigers infielders, however, giving Perez an easy path home to tie the game at 1-1.

Though the Hurricanes (20-7) were charged with three fielding errors, Whaley did an impressive job managing the game to give his team a chance to pull out the victory. The Pompano Beach, Fla. native needed 86 pitches to get through six and two-thirds, allowing eight hits while striking out three.

The game remained tied at 1-1 until the decisive seventh inning, when Tigers' slugger Richie Shaffer hit a two-RBI double down the leftfield line to give his team the lead for good. Shaffer's double, his eleventh of the season, combined with a follow-up walk to Phil Pohl, meant the end to another effective outing from Whaley.

A bright spot for the Hurricanes has been the recent play of the team's bullpen, and Saturday's game was another chapter in the story. With a scoreless 1.1-inning performance from AJ Salcines, the Hurricanes' bullpen has allowed only three earned runs in the past six games combined. Through their afternoon battle with Clemson, Salcines has allowed only three earned runs in his 15.1 innings of work in 2012.

Though Head Coach Jim Morris shook up the line-up in hopes of building steam, the Hurricanes struggled to produce much offense for the second straight night, collecting only seven hits and none for extra bases. The team was powered by two-hit games from Rodriguez, centerfielder Dale Carey and third baseman Brad Fieger.

### April 1, 2012 No. 8 MIAMI TAKES SERIES FINALE 4-2

**CLEMSON, S.C.** - There was not much offense to be found early on Sunday at Doug Kingsmore Stadium, but the eighth-ranked Miami Hurricanes battled their way to a series finale victory over the Clemson Tigers by a final score of 4-2.

For the first time all weekend, the Hurricanes used timely hitting deep into the game to give themselves a late advantage. After falling behind in the sixth inning, Miami led off the seventh with back-to-back singles from Chantz Mack and Michael Broad, while a game-winning two-RBI single from sophomore centerfielder Dale Carey gave Miami a decisive 3-2 advantage.

The first inning provided an all-too-familiar sight for Head Coach Jim Morris and his staff, as the Canes fell behind early for the third times in as many games.

The Hurricanes continued their offensive struggles from the first two games of the series, as they failed to connect for a hit off pitcher Kevin Pohle until the third inning. Freshman Esteban Tresgallo's single gave Miami its first baserunner of the day, and the Canes looked to have something going when freshman catcher Garrett Kennedy blooped a single into left-center.

Miami would finally crack the scoreboard in the next inning, and for the second straight game it was an unusual sequence that resulted in a run.

After Perez flew out to left field to open the fourth, senior catcher Peter O'Brien blasted a single through the left side of the infield. On an attempted hit and run, O'Brien was thrown out at second base and Brad Fieger was called for batter interference, which temporarily cleared the Clemson defense off the field in preparation for the next half-inning. But after gathering to discuss the play, the umpires ruled that Fieger would stay at-bat due to the out that occurred at second. Making the most of his extra pitches, Fieger promptly connected on a single to centerfield. He was driven in on the next play by a double laced to the wall in right field by Rony Rodriguez, tying the game at 1-1.

After a tough first inning, Ewing settled down well in his second conference start of the season. Clemson began the inning with back-to-back singles from Jay Baum and Richie Shaffer, giving the Tigers runners on the corners and no outs. After allowing an RBI single up the middle to Pohl, Ewing made a heads-up throw to third, picking off Shaffer for a big out. Kennedy then caught Pohl in a pickle between first and second, which looked to end a potential disastrous inning for the Canes, at that point only down 2-1.

After pitchers limited the damage, the Hurricanes offense showed signs of life with timely hits in the seventh inning. With Mike Kent coming on in relief of Pohle, Miami led off the frame with back-to-back singles from Mack and Broad. Reliever Jonathan Meyer was called upon next, and got Tresgallo and pinch-hitter Julian Santos with two big outs, setting the stage for Carey.

The sophomore centerfielder, who entered the game hitting 3-for-7 on the weekend, connected on a rip up the middle that plated both Mack and Broad, giving the Canes their first lead of the weekend. A follow-up triple by Perez gave the Canes a 4-2 advantage, which would turn out to be the final margin of victory.
