STORY LINES

- After being picked to finish fifth in the preseason, the Miami Hurricanes (6-5, 4-3 ACC) have the chance to secure a share of the ACC Coastal Division crown Saturday at Duke (6-5, 3-4 ACC). It would be Miami's first conference title (division or overall) since joining the ACC.
- In an unprecedented move, the University of Miami decided to withhold the football team from bowl consideration for the second consecutive season. The decision was made in response to the ongoing NCAA inquiry and also means that should the Miami football team qualify for the ACC Championship Game, it will not be eligible to participate.
- Saturday will be the 10th series meeting between the schools – and eighth as ACC rivals – with Miami owning a commanding 8-1 series advantage. Miami has won eight straight meetings, including all four previous trips to Durham.
- Through 11 games, the Miami Hurricanes are converting 87 percent of their red zone opportunities (40 of 46), which ranks as the fourth-best percentage in the ACC.
- 22 of Miami's last 23 red zone trips have resulted in a score, including 12 touchdowns. Dating back to the third quarter of its 44-37 win Sept. 29 vs. NC State, Miami has converted 18 consecutive red zone trips in ACC play, including 13 TDs.
- Johnson is tied for the national lead with 10 all-purpose plays of 50+ yards and is one of only 12 FBS players with at least two plays of 90+ yards.
- Junior QB **Stephen Morris** is tied for third nationally with 14 passes of 40+ yards and 8 passes of 50+ yards
- Freshman KR **Duke Johnson** leads the nation with 5 kickoff returns of 50+ yards and is also tied for the nationally lead with 4 returns of 60+ yards, 4 returns of 70+ yards and 3 returns of 80+ yards.
- Senior PK **Jake Wieclaw** is 18-of-23 on field goals this season and has made 10 consecutive tries.
- Through 11 games, Miami has forced 22 turnovers (11 INT, 11 fumbles), seven more than the Hurricanes forced during the 2011 season (15 turnovers).

ACC TELECONFERENCE

Miami head coach **Al Golden** and the league's other 11 coaches will be featured on a weekly teleconference each Wednesday during the 2012 football season from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., beginning Aug. 29, and concluding Nov. 21.

Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an audiofile available of each teleconference on the Conference's official website (theACC.com) each Wednesday afternoon as well as a written transcript of the call.

Golden's schedule time is 12:20 p.m. to 12:30 p.m. ET each Wednesday. Media representatives wishing to participate in the teleconference should contact the ACC Communications Office.

HURRICANE HOTLINE

Hurricane Hotline is a weekly two-hour show hosted by **Joe Zagacki** and **Don Bailey Jr.** and airs Tuesday or Wednesday nights from 7-9 p.m. during the season at The Grove Spot (3324 Virginia Street, Coconut Grove).

Hurricane Hotline features interviews with UM head coach **Al Golden**, players, coaches and other Miami personnel as well as other featured guests. Fans are encouraged to listen on 560 WQAM or view the show in-person at The Grove Spot.

QUICK HITS

- A 'U' of firsts: In September 1955, the first college football game to be televised in color was Miami vs. Georgia Tech, a 14-6 Hurricanes loss. In November 1968, the first college football game to be televised on primetime television was Miami at Alabama, also a 14-6 UM loss.
- Freshman RB **Duke Johnson** NCAA rankings: 2nd in kickoff returns (34.91), 11th in all-purpose yards (162.09) and 87th in rushing (70.09).
- Duke Johnson** ACC rankings: 1st in kickoff returns, 3rd in all-purpose yards, 4th in rushing.
- Senior PK **Jake Wieclaw** NCAA rankings: 19th in field goals (1.64), 146th in scoring (8.09).
- Junior QB **Stephen Morris** NCAA rankings: 36th in total offense (277.55), 58th in passing efficiency (132.67).
- Stephen Morris** ranks 4th in the ACC in passing yards (270.5), 5th in total offense, 6th in pass efficiency.
- Freshman S **Deon Bush** and redshirt freshman LB **Eddie Johnson** are tied for second in the ACC with 3 forced fumbles.
- Notable Miami NCAA statistical rankings: 6th in kickoff returns (27.95), 126th in turnover margin (0.64), 30th in passing offense (286.09), 36th in sacks allowed (1.45), 49th in total offense (421.45), 50th in pass efficiency defense (129.05), 56th in scoring offense (29.55).
- Notable Miami ACC rankings: 1st in kickoff returns, 1st in turnover margin, 3rd in sacks allowed, 4th in pass offense, 5th in pass efficiency, 5th in pass efficiency defense, 6th in scoring offense, 6th in total offense.
- Junior QB **Stephen Morris** is one of only two quarterbacks in Miami Hurricanes history with three 400-yard passing games. The other? **Gino Torretta**, who had three over the course of three seasons. Morris has thrown for 400+ yards three times in 2012.
- Redshirt sophomore TE **Clive Walford's** career-high 135 receiving yards Saturday vs. USF are the second-most receiving yards by a Miami Hurricanes TE in program history (**Greg Olsen** had 137 vs. Florida State in 2005).
- Making his career-first start vs. USF, freshman WR **Herb Waters** hauled in a career-best 130 yards on four catches. His 130 receiving yards are the most by a UM freshman since **Reggie Wayne** had 137 at Pittsburgh in Sept. 18, 1997.
- Miami has 16 different players that have at least one reception in 11 games.
- 21 freshmen have seen action for the Miami Hurricanes, including 16 true freshmen.
- 9 freshmen have started at least one game for the Miami Hurricanes — true freshman RT **Ereck Flowers**, true freshman RB **Duke Johnson**, true freshman WR **Malcolm Lewis**, true freshman S **Deon Bush**, redshirt freshman LB **Eddie Johnson**, redshirt freshman DL **Corey King**, true freshman DL **Earl Moore**, true freshman WR **Herb Waters** and true freshman DB **Rayshawn Jenkins**.
- In the first 23 games of the **Al Golden** era, Miami has used 21 different defensive starting lineups, including a different lineup in all 11 games this season.

DUKE SERIES HISTORY

- Saturday will be the 10th series meeting between the schools – and eighth as ACC rivals – with Miami owning a commanding 8-1 series advantage.
- Since suffering a 20-7 loss in the first meeting in 1976, the Miami Hurricanes have won eight straight meetings, including all four previous trips to Durham.
- In last season's meeting, RB **Lamar Miller** ran for two touchdowns and became Miami's first 1,000-yard rusher since 2002, while QB **Jacory Harris** threw three first-half touchdowns as the Hurricanes scored on each of their first five possessions to roll past Duke 49-14 on Homecoming.
- Miami's last trip to Durham resulted in a 28-13 victory in 2010. In that game, the Hurricanes forced seven Blue Devils turnovers and Harris threw for one TD and ran for another. S **Vaughn Telemaque** picked off two Duke passes and DT **Micanor Regis** returned an interception 22 yards for a score; the Hurricanes intercepted five passes and forced two fumbles.
- Each of Miami's last five wins over Duke has been decided by double digits, including last seasons' 35-point margin. In 2005, the ninth-ranked Canes upended the Blue Devils by 45 points – the first meeting as ACC foes.

MIAMI TO FORGO BOWL GAME FOR SECOND STRAIGHT SEASON

- The University of Miami has made the decision to withhold the football team from bowl consideration for the 2012 postseason. The decision was made in response to the ongoing NCAA inquiry and the University has informed both the NCAA and the Atlantic Coast Conference of its decision. The decision also means that should the Miami football team qualify for the ACC Championship Game, it will not be eligible to participate.
- Interim Director of Athletics Blake James informed the team of the decision Monday, two days after the Hurricanes became bowl eligible with their sixth victory of the season.
- The unprecedented decision to voluntarily withhold the football team from a second consecutive postseason was made by University leadership, including President Shalala, the Office of the General Counsel and Department of Athletics leaders. Considerable deliberation and discussion based on the status of the NCAA inquiry went into the decision-making process and, while acknowledging the impact that the decision will have on current student-athletes, coaches, alumni and fans, a determination was made that voluntarily withholding the football team from a second postseason was not only a prudent step for the University to take but will also allow for the football program and University to move forward in the most expedited manner possible.
- The University and President Shalala have been clear from the start of the inquiry that Miami will cooperate fully and will seek the truth, no matter where the path might lead and that the institution will be stronger because of it. The University has already taken proactive measures to ensure more strict compliance with NCAA rules and continues to evaluate further steps.

MAKING MOST OF RED ZONE CHANCES

- Through 11 games, the Miami Hurricanes are converting 87 percent of their red zone opportunities (40 of 46), which ranks as the fourth-best percentage in the ACC.
- 22 of Miami's last 23 red zone trips have resulted in a score, including 12 touchdowns.
- Dating back to the third quarter of its 44-37 win Sept. 29 vs. NC State, Miami has converted 18 consecutive red zone trips in ACC play, including 13 TDs.

A WIN BY MIAMI WOULD...

- Give the Hurricanes a share of the ACC Coastal Division title, its first title (division or conference) since joining the ACC prior to the 2004 season.
- Be its seventh of the season, tying for its second-most wins in the ACC era.
- Improve **AI Golden's** Miami record to 13-11 overall and 8-8 in ACC play.

TO THE FRESHMEN GO THE AWARDS

- Through the first 11 weeks of the 2012 season, the Miami Hurricanes earned 11 ACC Player of the Week awards. Seven of those 11 honors went to Miami freshmen – **Duke Johnson**, **Eddie Johnson** and **Gabe Terry**.
- Sophomore LB **Gionni Paul** was named ACC Co-Linebacker of the Week, while Johnson was named Rookie of the Week for an ACC-leading fourth time this season.
- Playing in place of the injured Denzel Perryman, Paul tallied a career-high 14 tackles (seven solo) in Miami's 41-40 loss at Virginia. It was his second double-digit tackle game of the season, and his 14 stops are the most by a Hurricane in a game this season.
- Johnson rushed for a career-high 150 yards on 16 carries and also threw for a 9-yard touchdown – his career-first pass – at Virginia. He now has three 100-yard rushing games this season, including 100+ yards in back-to-back games. Johnson amassed a Miami-record 368 all-purpose yards which ranks as the fourth-most in ACC history.

THE DUKE OF ALL TRADES

- With each play, freshman RB **Duke Johnson** is becoming one of the best freshmen in Miami Hurricanes football history. Johnson accumulated a school-record 368 all-purpose yards – fourth-most in ACC history – in Miami’s 41-40 road loss Nov. 10 at Virginia. Included in his 368 all-purpose yards were a 95-yard kickoff return for a TD and a career-high 150 rushing yards.
- The four-time ACC Rookie of the Week also threw his career-first TD pass – an 8-yard halfback pass to **Allen Hurns** for Miami’s first points of the game. On his very next touch, he raced 95 yards for a touchdown on the ensuing Virginia kickoff.
- Johnson is only the third FBS player since 2000 with a TD pass and kickoff return for a TD in the same game, joining Charles Pauley (San Jose State) in 2002 and Eric Page (Toledo) in 2010.
- With his all-purpose total of 1,793 this season, Johnson ranks second on Miami’s single-season all-purpose yards list. He trails **Willis McGahee** (2,108) by 315 yards.

JAMES NAMED POP WARNER AWARD FINALIST

- Senior RB **Mike James** is one of four finalists for the third annual Pop Warner National College Football Award. James is joined by Duke quarterback Sean Renfree, Michigan offensive guard Patrick Omameh and UConn wide receiver Nick Williams.
- The award, established in 2010, recognizes a Pop Warner alumnus who has made a difference on the field, in the classroom and in his community. It is presented to a student-athlete who has taken the ideals of Pop Warner to the next level and serves as a role model to Pop Warner’s young scholar athletes.
- In September, James, a Haines City, Fla., native, was one of 11 FBS players named to the 2012 AFCA Allstate Good Works Team.
- The Pop Warner National College Football Award will be announced Dec. 5 during the 56th annual Pop Warner Super Bowl at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex at Walt Disney World in Orlando, Fla. The inaugural award was presented to former Nebraska and current New York Giants defensive back Prince Amukamara. In 2011, the award was presented to former Virginia and current Washington Redskins cornerback Chase Minnifield.

ON THE RIGHT PATH

- Senior PK **Jake Wieclaw** is 18-of-23 on field goals this season and has made 10 consecutive tries. Wieclaw, who started the season 7-of-7, missed five of his next six tries before his current streak.
- Wieclaw has made every PAT on his UM career, a perfect 76-of-76 on point-after attempts.
- The senior is 29-of-37 on field goal attempts as a Miami Hurricane.

HEALTHY GREEN PAYING DIVIDENDS

- After his first three injury-plagued seasons in Coral Gables, redshirt junior DE **Shayon Green** is finally healthy and making huge contributions along the defensive line.
- In 11 starts at defense end, Green leads all Hurricanes defenders with 65 total tackles, including 37 solo stops.
- Prior to this season, the Tifton, Ga., native and 2011 Training Room Comeback Player of the Year had 7 total tackles in six career games.

MAKING TURNOVERS HAPPEN

- Miami’s defense forced three turnovers in its 40-9 rout Nov. 17 vs. USF, the fourth time this season forcing 3+ turnovers (UM 4-0 in those contests).
- Through 11 games, Miami has forced 22 turnovers (11 INT, 11 fumbles), seven more than the Hurricanes forced during the 2011 season (15 turnovers).

30-SOMETHING

- In all 6 wins this season, Miami has scored at least 30 points, including 4 wins when scoring 40+ points.
- Miami’s 41-40 road loss Nov. 10 at Virginia snapped the Hurricanes’ 7-game winning streak when scoring 30+ points; Miami is now 16-2 in its last 18 games when scoring 30 or more.
- The loss also snapped Miami’s impressive 95-game winning streak when scoring 40+ points in a game. Prior to falling at UVA, Miami’s last loss when scoring 40+ points was Nov. 23, 1984 – otherwise known as the “Hair Flutie” game, a 47-45 loss to Boston College.

TIME OF POSSESSION BATTLE

- Before leading in time of possession in its 18-14 loss Oct. 13 against North Carolina (30:18-29:42), Miami had trailed in time of possession in seven consecutive games. That streak dated back to the 2011 season finale against Boston College. Miami has trailed the time of possession battle in 9 of 10 games this season and is averaging 25:26 (12th in ACC).
- Miami, which also won the possession battle Nov. 17 vs. USF (30:33/29:27) has led in time of possession in only 12 of 44 quarters this season.

MIAMI'S THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

- Senior RB **Mike James** and freshman RB **Duke Johnson** have combined for 1,335 of Miami's 1,499 rushing yards on 253 carries. The lightning-quick Johnson, who has already collected four ACC Rookie of the Week honors this season, has amassed 781 yards and 7 rushing TDs on 123 carries, while the bruising James has 554 yards and 5 touchdowns on 130 carries.
- Johnson (10) and James (7) have accounted for almost half of Miami's 38 total touchdowns this season.

JAMES SELECTED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Senior RB **Mike James** is one of 22 student-athletes selected to the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, announced by Allstate Insurance Company and the American Football Coaches Association.
- James is the sixth Miami Hurricane to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, joining Robert Bass (1993), Tony Coley (1996), Ryan Clement (1997), Nate Books (1998) and Joaquin Gonzalez (2001).
- During his career at the University of Miami, James has contributed countless hours to supporting community service organizations in the Miami community, including volunteering for Empowered Youth, an organization providing mentoring to at-risk youth, serving as a project manager for the 2012 University of Miami Bone Marrow Drive and serving meals to the homeless with the Miami Rescue Mission. James has also been involved with The Ronald McDonald House, Rushing the Community and Canes on Patrol.

HURRICANE STUDENT-ATHLETES SET GSR SCHOOL RECORD

- The University of Miami recorded a department-wide school-record Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 93 percent, according to the rates released Oct. 25 by the NCAA.
- As a department, Miami's 93 percent GSR ranks fourth among ACC schools and is eighth overall among FBS schools. Overall, the University of Miami athletic department has improved from 77 to 93 percent from 2005 to 2012, a year after UM student-athletes posted a then-record 89 percent GSR in 2011. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last eight years.
- Six UM teams compiled GSR marks of 100 percent; men's diving and golf posted its eighth consecutive perfect GSR mark, while women's tennis recorded its fifth straight GSR score of 100 percent. Also adding perfect GSR scorers were women's rowing, women's golf, women's swimming and volleyball.
- Volleyball posted a perfect score for the second consecutive year, while both rowing and women's swimming set program-record highs for GSR.
- Football jumped six points from 88 to 94 in 2012, tying for the third-highest GSR score among FBS schools and improving by 27 points (67 to 94) from 2010. Baseball had the largest jump of any UM program, improving by 20 points (60 to 80).
- The most recent Division I Graduation Success Rates are based on the four entering classes from 2002-2003 through 2005-06.

- Freshman **Duke Johnson** amassed a school-record 373 all-purpose yards at Virginia. His 373 yards are the fourth-most in ACC history.
- Johnson also set a personal-best with 155 rushing yards.
- Johnson tossed a touchdown on his career-first pass, an 8-yard score to WR **Allen Hurns**, who finished with two TD catches.
- On Johnson's next touch after his TD pass, he raced 95 yards down the right sideline for a touchdown – his second kick return for a score this season. His two kick returns tie him for the most in school history with Tim Morgan (1973-76), Ottis Anderson (1975-78) and Devin Hester (2003-05).
- Johnson became only the third FBS player since 2000 with a TD pass and a kickoff return for a TD in a game – Charles Pauley (San Jose State) in 2002 and Eric Page (Toledo) in 2010.
- Miami defense picked up its third safety of the season in the fourth quarter.
- WR **Phillip Dorsett** recorded his third game with at least 100 yards receiving (103). He averaged 17.2 yards on six catches.
- LB **Gionni Paul** led Miami with a career-high 14 tackles, while LB **Jimmy Gaines** also set a career-high with 12 stops.

- Herb Waters** reeled in an 87-yard TD catch in the third quarter, the sixth-longest reception in UM history.
- Waters' 130 receiving yards is the most by a Miami freshman since Reggie Wayne had 137 on 9/18/97.
