MIDWEEK STORYLINES & NOTABLES

- After winning its **second straight ACC series** at Wake Forest, Miami returns home for its final game vs. FGCU at 6 PM.
- UM has a **13-1 all-time series lead** vs. FGCU, including a 2-0 mark in 2015. **UM** will go for the **season sweep** Wednesday.
- Miami saw its **five-game ACC winning streak** snapped in the finale vs. Wake. UM sits **atop the Coastal Division** at **6-3**.
- **Miami is ranked in the top 25 of every college baseball poll.** The Hurricanes check in at #10 in *Perfect Game's* top 25, #13 by *Baseball America*, #15 by NCBWA, #16 in the Coaches' Poll, #18 by *Collegiate Baseball* & #21 by *D1Baseball.com*.
- Junior **David Thompson** was named **ACC Co-Player of the Week** Monday, earning the honor for the second straight week. Thompson batted **.389** over Miami's four games, with two multi-HR games, **four total homers** (two grand slams) & **13 RBI**.
- Miami's **team on-base percentage (.422)** is the **second-highest mark in the ACC** and the **third-best mark nationwide**.
- **George Iskenderian** is the only Cane to have reached base in all **25** games; **Zack Collins** has reached in all **24** he has played.
- Jim Morris became just the **eighth coach in Division I baseball history** to accumulate **1,400** wins last year. With a 25-4 win over Rutgers in early February, Morris moved into **eighth in all-time wins (1,439)** for any coach at a four-year college.
- A number of Hurricanes earned **2015 Preseason All-America accolades**, including Zack Collins, Bryan Garcia, Andrew Suarez & David Thompson. **Collins was a unanimous first-team selection** on all major Preseason All-America lists.
- Miami captured the **2014 ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship**, finishing atop the ACC with a **24-6 record**.
- Miami's streak of **42 consecutive NCAA postseason appearances** is the longest active streak in Division I athletics.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

Entering his 22nd season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 42 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 21 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 949-371-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,453-638-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,584-678-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 30th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2014 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host spots in the tournament. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 21 seasons (1994-2014), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (1994-2006) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2014 Hurricanes to their 42nd-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top-five recruiting class by national publications, with Zack Collins named *Baseball America* National Freshman of the Year under his direction in 2014.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2015 as the fourth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth-place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers. Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 victory on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including time at DeKalb College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001.



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

SHORT-TERM LAYOVER

- After winning a weekend series in Winston-Salem, N.C., Miami **returns home for its midweek finale** against FGCU before traveling to Chapel Hill, N.C. for **another ACC road series vs. North Carolina**
- Miami has a commanding **13-1 all-time series lead** against the Eagles, and has won **five straight matchups** dating to 2014. The Canes are looking for their second straight **season sweep** of FGCU.
- The Hurricanes topped the Eagles **7-3** in the first meeting of 2015 (**March 4**) at Mark Light Field and, in their **Swanson Stadium debut**, mashed their way to a **15-4 win** in Fort Myers on **March 10**.

SIMPLY THE BEST...AGAIN

- **David Thompson** was named **ACC Co-Player of the Week** on March 23 after **hitting .389 (7-for-18)** and powering Miami to a 3-1 mark. It was the **second straight weekly honor** for Thompson, who was also named ACC Player of the Week on **March 16**.
- Thompson recorded **two multi-home run games, two grand slams, four total home runs and 13 RBI** in the prolific stretch, and led all Miami hitters with a **1.278 slugging percentage** over the week.
- The junior third baseman recorded a **career-best seven RBI** in a 15-2 win over Wake Forest (March 20), and ended the week **leading the nation with 39 RBI**.
- Thompson carries a career-long **14-game hitting streak** into Tuesday's game vs. FGCU. He is hitting **.433 with eight homers and 33 RBI** in 16 games playing third base.

ONE-TWO PUNCH

- Despite the graduation of No. 1 & No. 2 hitters **Dale Carey** and **Tyler Palmer**, who combined in those roles in **62 of 63 games in 2014**, freshman **Carl Chester** and junior **Ricky Eusebio** have delivered.
- Chester is batting **.293 in 24 starts in leftfield**, ranks second with **four homers**, and has the third-most hits with **29**. He has hit **lead off** in every game he has played, and has a **.386 on-base percentage**.
- Eusebio is **reaching base at a .team-best 518 clip**, and leads the team in **runs (30)** and **steals (10)**. His **22 walks** are second-most, while his **11 HBPs** are the most on the team and **fifth-most nationwide**.
- The speedy duo has **combined for 17-for-21 (80.9%) on steals**.

HEATING UP

- Among Miami's top performers in the series victory over Wake Forest: senior **Garrett Kennedy** (.462, two home runs, five RBI), freshman **Carl Chester** (.455, five hits, four runs), junior **David Thompson** (two home runs, eight RBI), junior **George Iskenderian** (five RBI, two steals) and junior **Ricky Eusebio** (five runs, two steals).
- Junior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** has tossed **at least 6.0 innings in all five of his starts** - he has allowed **two earned runs or less in four of his five starts** on the mound.
- Over the last five games, sophomore slugger **Zack Collins** is hitting **.375 (6-for-16)** and is reaching base at a **.500 clip**.
- Over the last 10 games, the red-hot **David Thompson** is hitting **.452 (19-for-42)** with **five doubles, one triple, seven home runs and 28 RBI**. He is slugging **1.119** over that stretch with **10 runs scored**.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

MILESTONES FOR MORRIS

- After leading his team to a 44-19 record in 2014, **head coach Jim Morris moved into ninth place** all-time in college baseball history (regardless of Division, four-year colleges) with 1,435 wins.
- Morris **wasted little time in moving up** that list in 2015, taking over **sole possession of eighth place** when Miami topped Rutgers 25-4 on Feb. 15, 2015 - his 1,439th win as head coach.
- Morris ranks as the **fourth-winningest** among active **Division I coaches by career victories (1,453)** and **fifth** in winning percentage (.694). He is also the **second-winningest coach in ACC history**.
- Morris became just the **eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball** to accumulate **1,400 wins** when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on **March 8, 2014**.

SHUT THEM DOWN

- Miami's bullpen has recorded a **2.42 ERA in 100.1 combined innings this season**, and has been a key reason for UM's success.
- Among the Hurricanes' top arms out of the bullpen: sophomore All-American closer **Bryan Garcia** (1.15 ERA, four saves), freshman lefthander **Michael Mediavilla** (2.92 ERA, 14 appearances, 16 Ks, just four BBs), senior walk-on **Daniel Briggli** (1.98 ERA, 13 Ks) and righthanded sidewinder **Cooper Hammond** (3.38 ERA, 13 appearances).
- In Miami's **sweep of NC State**, relievers combined to toss **15.0 innings**, surrendering just seven hits and **two runs** (1.20 ERA). In ACC play (**27.1 innings**), Miami's bullpen has combined to allow just **three earned runs** for a miniscule **0.99 ERA**.
- Miami's staff ERA of **3.22 is the fifth-best mark in the ACC**, while its **0.234 batting average against** is also the **fifth-best total**.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Miami is off to a **13-1 start at home** through its first 14 games.
- UM finished the 2014 season with a **11-4 home record in ACC play**, and a **23-10 overall home record**. UM has won **seven straight home series** dating back to 2014, including all three series in 2015: Rutgers, Wright State and NC State.
- Miami is batting **.326 at home** compared to **.290 on the road**, and has a robust **.449 team on-base percentage** (.393 road).
- Junior **David Thompson** is batting **.383 in 13 starts at home**, and leads the team with **18 hits, 15 runs and 15 RBI**. Ricky Eusebio is batting **.375 at home** with **14 walks and five steals**.
- Miami's **staff ERA** is over a **full run better at home (2.52)** than on the road (**4.31**)
- Junior **George Iskenderian** (.381) and sophomore **Zack Collins** (.302) are among the few players hitting **better on the road** than at home through 24 games

RON FRASER STATUE DEDICATION DATE SET

- The **Ron Fraser Statue Dedication & Unveiling** is set for **Friday, April 24 at 4 p.m.** on the DiMare Champions Plaza outside of Mark Light Field.
- The statue dedication is **open to the public**, and **admission is free**. Tickets to the **7 p.m. game** that night against **Florida State** are **expected to sell out**.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Then-freshman **Bryan Garcia** was named the team's closer just prior to the 2014 season opener and rewarded the coaching staff with an **All-American** campaign (NCBWA, third team).
- Garcia has **four saves in 12 appearances**, and has allowed just **two earned runs in 15.2 innings**. He has 12 strikeouts so far, and now has **19 career saves** - tied for **ninth-most in UM history**.
- An **All-ACC Second Team** selection as a reliever, **Garcia set the Miami freshman saves record** and tied for **11th-most saves nationally** with 15 in 2014. He was a consensus Freshman All American first-team selection at reliever.

#CARDIACCANES

- David Thompson's solo homer vs. **NC State** in the **10th inning (March 13)** gave Miami its **third walk-off win** of the season.
- Miami picked up its **first two walk-off wins** of the 2015 season against **Wright State**, earning thrilling wins on **back-to-back nights**.
- Senior **Garrett Kennedy** connected on a two-run, two-out home run on Feb. 27, while **Willie Abreu** won the game on a bases-loaded single on Feb. 28.
- Miami has played **six one-run games in 2015**, and is 3-3 in those contests. The opening stretch continues a trend from last season for the Hurricanes, who were **16-3 in one-run games in 2014**.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- After capturing the **2014 ACC Regular Season Championship**, the Hurricanes entered 2015 ranked in the **top 15 of every major college baseball preseason poll**.
- Miami was also ranked No. 10 by *Perfect Game*, No. 14 by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, No. 14 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll and No. 14 by *D1Baseball.com*.
- The Hurricanes feature a number of **Preseason All-Americans**, including reigning **2014 ACC Freshman of the Year** Zack Collins (consensus), **All-ACC closer** Bryan Garcia and **Washington Nationals' second-rounder** & staff ace Andrew Suarez.
- Miami's recruiting class was **ranked No. 2 nationwide** by *Perfect Game*, and includes MLB Draft picks: **George Iskenderian** (34th round), OF **Carl Chester** (38th) and LHP **Michael Mediavilla** (40th).

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes **extended their own college baseball record** with their **42nd consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason** in 2014. Miami **has not missed the postseason since 1973**.
- The Hurricanes' 42 straight trips to the NCAA postseason **are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide**.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the **NCAA postseason in 30 straight years** - all 21 years at Miami and his final **nine years** at Georgia Tech. Miami **has not missed the postseason since 1972**.
- Miami is the **only school in the state of Florida** to have won a national championship; the Hurricanes won titles in **1982, 1985, 1999 and 2001**.

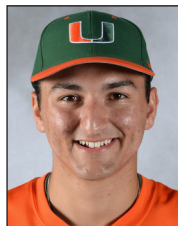

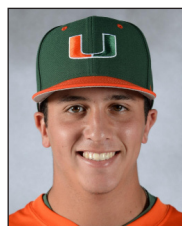
