MIDWEEK STORY LINES & NEWS

- Miami travels to FAU for its first road contest of the 2020 season. The Hurricanes went 2-1 against the Owls a year ago.
- The Canes were 10-3 in midweek games in 2019 after struggling in those games the prior two years (3-8 in '18, 8-6 in '17).
- Freshman RHP Alex McFarlane will make his third career start Wednesday, opposite FAU sophomore LHP Hunter Cooley.
- McFarlane earned his first career victory on Feb. 19, striking out three over two scoreless innings against Kent State.
- Hurricanes starting pitchers have allowed just 13 earned runs and struck out 92 batters over 58 innings pitched.
- The Canes, who finished 41-20 a season ago, added a recruiting class ranked first in the ACC by Baseball America to a group of 22 returning players from a 2019 team that returned to the NCAA tournament for the 46th time.
- Sophomore captain Adrian Del Castillo leads all returning hitters in hits (.303), doubles (22) and runs batted in (72).
- Del Castillo is one of five Hurricanes that were named Preseason All-America in 2020. The catcher was joined by fellow team captain and RHP Brian Van Belle, 1B Alex Toral, 3B Raymond Gil and RHP Slade Ceccconi as preseason honorees.
- Miami returns nine hitters who made at least 26 starts a year ago, while four returning hitters started all 61 games.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series 25 times - the second-most of any program nationwide, trailing only Texas (36). The Hurricanes' four national championships (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) are tied for fifth-most all-time.

Gino DiMare became the ninth head baseball coach in University of Miami history prior to the 2019 season.

DiMare previously served as associate head coach in charge of hitting, as well as the baseball program's recruiting coordinator. Overall, 2018 marked DiMare's 19th year as a member of the Hurricanes baseball staff. DiMare rejoined the University of Miami baseball program after three years away from the program in 2011. Prior to his exit in 2008, DiMare served as the Canes recruiting coordinator and hitting coach over his final nine seasons. He held the title of assistant head coach during the 2008 season - a year the Canes won the Atlantic Coast Conference championship before advancing to the College World Series.

Miami had an impressive first season under his tutelage, winning 41 games and returning to the NCAA postseason for the first time since 2016. The Canes earned the 46th postseason berth in program history and reached the Starkville Regional final before falling to No. 6 Mississippi State. The Hurricanes went 18-12 in ACC play in 2019, winning seven conference series and turning in their best conference record since 2016.

Four Canes were named All-ACC, as redshirt sophomore Michael Amditis, freshman Adrian Del Castillo and redshirt junior Brian Van Belle were selected to the All-ACC Second Team, while sophomore Raymond Gil was named to the All-ACC Third Team. Del Castillo was also one of 12 players picked for the 2019 ACC All-Freshman Team and earned Freshman All-America honors from Baseball America, D1 Baseball, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and Perfect Game.

The 2019 Canes hit an ACC-best 85 home runs on the season, the most since Miami hit 106 in 2010. First baseman Alex Toral smashed a conference-leading 24 home runs on the season that ranked third in Division I and moved him into a tie with Yonder Alonso for the second-most home runs by a Hurricane in a single season.

Twelve different Hurricanes hit at least one home run in 2019, sparking an explosion of power from the Miami bats that matched the 2018 season home run total of 23 after just 15 games in 2019. The Canes' 85 homers were more than the combined team home run total of 58 from the previous two seasons (35 in 2017 and 23 in 2018).

The Hurricanes qualified for their second straight College World Series berth and 25th in program history in 2016. Under DiMare's guidance as hitting coach, five field players (Zack Collins - first round, Willie Abreu - sixth round, Brandon Lopez - 10th round, Jacob Heyward - 18th round, Johnny Ruiz - 28th round) were selected in the 2016 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Collins was named a first-team All-American by several publications, and became Miami's first first-round draft pick since Yasmani Grandal in 2010 when he was selected by the Chicago White Sox with the No. 10 overall pick.

In 2015, DiMare guided the Hurricanes to the No. 1 national ranking in offense. Miami scored 547 runs over the season, which ranked first nationally at an average of 8.16 runs per game. Miami's offense, which ranked No. 7 nationally in batting average (.307) and No. 2 in on-base percentage (.417), led the way to the team's 24th College World Series appearance in program history and second straight ACC Coastal Division title.

DiMare's impact on the program was felt immediately upon his return in 2012, as the first recruiting class under his watch was ranked among the top 10 by two national publications. Miami's incoming 2012 freshman class was ranked No. 10 by Baseball America, its first top-10 ranking from BA since 2006, and No. 9 by Collegiate Baseball. One of those newcomers, third baseman David Thompson, earned Freshman All-America honors from Perfect Game following the conclusion of the 2013 season.

Previously, DiMare helped recruit and coach players such as Yonder Alonso, Ryan Braun, Jon Jay, Gaby Sanchez, Danny Valencia and Jemile Weeks - all of whom have reached the big leagues in recent years. DiMare's accomplishments on the recruiting scene during his nine years in the capacity of recruiting coordinator are as impressive as the Hurricanes' annual postseason results. His 2001 class was rated among the top five nationally and his 2003 class was ranked among the top 15 nationally.



UM's 2008 recruiting class, which was targeted primarily by DiMare, was ranked second by Collegiate Baseball and fifth by Baseball America prior to the 2007 season. That includes Braun, the 2005 ACC Player of the Year and Cesar Carrillo, the ACC's Pitcher of the Year that same season. Braun and Carrillo were also Miami's two first-round draft picks in 2005. DiMare has also kept Florida's top talent home, including 2006 first-round pick Chris Perez (Holmes Beach) and second-round pick Jay (Miami).

DiMare's offensive teams also proved to be some of the best in the history of the Hurricanes program. UMiami's offense ranked among the top 10 in school history in eight of DiMare's nine seasons as the club's hitting instructor. The 2005 team hit .321, the seventh-best team batting average in school history and the 2004 squad finished the season with a .330 batting average, which ranks fourth in school history. UM's .310 average in 2006 was only bested by five teams that were not under the guidance of DiMare, dating back 62 years.

The 1999 Hurricanes posted the third-best batting average in school history with a .333 mark, while the 2000 team finished with a .323 batting average that ranks sixth all time. Miami batted .315 in 2003 and .314 in 2002 (10th). The 2008 team that advanced to the College World Series and spent much of the season atop the national collegiate baseball polls finished the year hitting at a school eighth-best .320 average, while also ranking tied for second in home runs (106), fourth in slugging percentage (.541), eighth in total bases (1,202) and RBI (517), tied for ninth in doubles (135) and 10th in hits (711).

DiMare has long been associated with the Miami baseball program. First, he was a fan as a kid growing up in South Florida. Then, DiMare was a player for the Hurricanes following a stellar career at Miami Westminster Christian. He was a standout outfielder for the Canes from 1989-92, with a career batting average of .290. He currently ranks among UM's leaders in career games played (243), career stolen bases (93) and total sacrifices (36). In 1991, DiMare led the Hurricanes with a .353 batting average.

Following his career in Coral Gables, he was signed as a free agent by the Boston Red Sox. He played the 1992-93 seasons in the Red Sox minor league system in Winter Haven and Ft. Lauderdale. Upon returning to Miami, DiMare spent the 1996 season as an assistant coach at Westminster - the 1996 High School National Champions. DiMare then returned to UM in 1997 and was a volunteer coach for three seasons, in charge of outfielders and base running.

DiMare currently resides in Miami with his wife Denise and four daughters: Nicolette, Gianna, Giselle and Gina.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

CANES HEAD TO FAU FOR MIDWEEK MEETING

- The Hurricanes hit the road for the first time in 2020, traveling to Boca Raton, Fla., for a midweek matchup at **FAU**.
- **Miami** was 10-3 in midweek games in 2019 after struggling in those games the prior two years (3-8 in '18, 8-6 in '17').
- FAU is 7-4 on the season, starting 7-0 before dropping four consecutive games to ranked opponents. Most recently, the Owls fell to No. 1 Florida, 7-3, on Tuesday night..
- Freshman right-hander **Alex McFarlane** (1-1, 7.11 ERA, 6.1 IP) will make his third start of the season, opposite FAU sophomore left hander **Hunter Cooley** (0-0, 4.15 ERA, 4.1 IP).
- Miami took two of three games from FAU a year ago, including a 16-6 victory at FAU on March 27, 2019.

CANES REMAIN RANKED IN TOP 15

- Miami remained in the top 15 in every major collegiate baseball poll released after the third weekend of the 2020 season.
- The Hurricanes are ranked highest by Baseball America, holding steady at No. 6 in their top 25. Miami also held its position at No. 7 in the D1 Baseball top 25 and at No. 11 in the Perfect Game poll.
- Miami made its biggest move of the week in *Collegiate Baseball's* poll, climbing up four spots to No. 9. The Hurricanes also checked in at No. 8 in the NCBWA poll and No. 9 in the USA TODAY Coaches Poll.
- The Hurricanes began the 2020 season as a consensus top 10 team, ranked as high as No. 3 by D1 Baseball.
- The Canes entered the 2020 season with multiple top-5 preseason rankings for the first time since 2007.

VAN BELLE DEALING LIKE AN ACE

- Friday night starter **Brian Van Belle** has been one of the top pitchers in the ACC over the first three weeks of the season.
- Van Belle has allowed just one unearned run on 11 hits over 20 innings pitched, striking out 33 batters while walking just two over his three starts. Opponents are batting a paltry .157 (11-for-70).
- The redshirt senior struck out a career-high with 14 Towson hitters on Feb. 28. Van Belle posted the most strikeouts by a Hurricane since Bryan Radziewski fanned 16 batters against Virginia Tech on March 23, 2013.
- Van Belle is tied for second in the ACC with 33 strikeouts and ranks second in the league with 20 innings pitched.

STRIKING OUT THE COMPETITION

- Thru March 1, Miami's pitchers are tied with Virginia for the ACC lead with 143 strikeouts.
- Miami's weekend rotation of **Brian Van Belle**, **Chris McMahon** and **Slade Cecconi** have combined to strike out 86 batters and walked just 12 opponents over 54 innings pitched.
- The Hurricanes had starting pitchers post 12+ strikeouts in consecutive games for the first time this century, as Van Belle (16 Ks on Feb. 28) and McMahon (12 Ks on Feb. 29) accomplished the feat vs. Towson.
- Miami pitchers have struck out at least 10 batters in 10 of 11 games in 2020, including a season-high 17 vs. Towson on Feb. 28.

PITCHERS POISED FOR PRODUCTIVE 2020

- All-ACC right-hander **Brian Van Belle** leads a deep and talented pitching staff for the Hurricanes in 2020.
- A second team All-ACC pick as a redshirt junior in 2019, Van Belle led all starters with a 3.30 ERA and posted a team-high 10 wins, becoming the first Hurricane since Michael Mediavilla in 2016 to earn double-digit victories in a season.
- RHP **Chris McMahon** looks for a big junior year after leading the U.S. Collegiate National Team with 15 strikeouts in 12 innings with a 2.25 ERA and .154 batting average against over the summer.
- Sophomore RHP **Slade Cecconi** was named a Freshman All American in 2019 after he struck out 89 batters with 18 walks over 80 innings and posted a 5-4 record and 4.16 ERA in his debut season with the Hurricanes.
- Junior **Daniel Federman** led all Miami pitchers with 35 appearances in 2019 and tallied seven saves with a 3.51 ERA and 60 strikeouts over 48.2 innings pitched.

DEL CASTILLO BEHIND THE DISH

- Sophomore catcher **Adrian Del Castillo** enters the 2020 season as Miami's primary catcher after starting double-digit games at catcher (12), right field (31) and designated hitter (16) and making two starts at third base in 2019.
- A second team All-ACC pick as a freshman in 2019, Del Castillo led the Canes in hits (78), doubles (22) and runs batted in (72).
- Del Castillo finished 2019 batting .331 and also scored 58 runs and clubbed 12 homers, while striking out just 24 times.
- The Miami native's 72 RBI were the second-most by a UM freshman in program history, finishing just four shy of Ryan Braun's record 76, set in 2003. The 72 runs batted in were also the most by a Miami freshman since Yonder Alonso drove in 69 runs as a freshman in 2006.
- Del Castillo finished tied for 13th in the nation and second in the ACC in RBI (72) and also ranked second in the ACC in doubles (22).
- A Freshman All-American, Del Castillo earned a host of awards after his collegiate debut season, including Second Team All-ACC, ACC All-Freshman Team, ABCA All-Region and All-Starkville Regional Team honors.

EXPERIENCE ON THE MOUND AT THE U

- The Hurricanes starting rotation returns three starters who all made at least 12 starts a year ago: **Brian Van Belle**, **Chris McMahon** and **Slade Cecconi**.

NEW FACES IN NEW PLACES

• Miami has 10 newcomers on the 2020 roster, with eight freshmen and two JUCO transfers joining the 22 letterwinners from a year ago.

• Freshmen **Alex McFarlane**, **Jared Thomas** and **Carson Palmquist** figure to play major roles early, while JUCO transfer IF **Josh Lauck** and LHP **Spencer Bodanza** are expected to contribute from the start of the season.

THE DESTINATION IS THE SAME: OMAHA

• Miami made its second straight trip to the **College World Series in 2016**, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.

• Miami's **25** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's **four national championships** rank **fifth-most**.

• Since the NCAA began awarding national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight seven seasons: 1999** (#1), **2001** (#2), **2003** (#8), **2004** (#3), **2008** (#1), **2015** (#5) and **2016** (#3).

CANES PICKED TO WIN THE COASTAL

• The Miami Hurricanes were picked as the preseason favorite to win the ACC Coastal Division in a poll of the league's 14 head coaches.

• Miami, which was picked by 12 of 14 coaches as the likely division winner, is looking for its first Coastal title since 2016. The Hurricanes have won the division four times since joining the ACC in 2005. Miami won its first division crown in 2008 and won three consecutive Coastal titles from 2014-16.

• The Canes finished second in the Coastal a year ago with an 18-12 ACC record.

MIAMI IS #MLBU

• No school in the ACC has had **more players drafted than Miami**, which has seen **293** players picked into the professional ranks - including five in 2019. Since 1991, UM has produced **190 draft picks** - 22 more than the next-highest ACC total (168, Clemson).

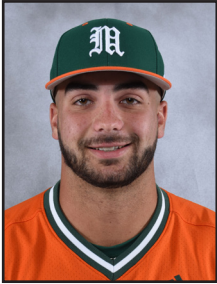
