## MEDIA POLTCTES

## COVERING THE HURRICANES

Interview requests for women's basketball student-athletes and coaches must be submitted to assistant director of athletics communications Alex Schwartz (alexschwartz@miami.edu) in all instances. Schwartz and the Miami communications staff will make every effort to schedule a time to accommodate those requests, based on time constraints and academic/meeting obligations.

## LIVE BROADCASTS

It is not permissible for any non-rights holder to broadcast over the air, stream over the internet (audio or video), or transmit in any other way, any live event without the consent of the University of Miami athletics department. Live events include varsity contests, press conferences (including but not limited to weekly scheduled and postgame press conferences) and any other group media availability. Exceptions may be made for any major news-breaking event. Failure to follow this policy will result in having credentials revoked.

## ARCHIVING OF EVENT AUDIO/VIDEO

It is not permissible for any non-rights holder to post, place, broadcast, or make available in any other way, audio or video event content that exceeds three (3) minutes in length. Events are defined as varsity contests, press conferences and any other group media availability. Archiving may not begin until the conclusion of the entire event. It is not permissible to reuse or post any video produced and/or owned by the University of Miami athletics department without the consent of the university.

## PHOTOGRAPHY

Miami follows NCAA and ACC rules regarding media representatives photographing games. Only properly credentialed photographers will be allowed in the designated photo areas of the Watsco Center as specified by the NCAA and ACC.

NO photographers will be permitted to shoot from the sidelines. All photographers must remain in the Watsco Center's designated photo areas along the baselines. Photo credentials are subject to revocation by the Miami athletics communications office at any time.

## MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Requests for working media and photo credentials should be submitted to Alex Schwartz at alexschwartz@miami.edu by sports editors or sports directors of accredited media outlets. Requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working media only. Requests made within two days of the game may not be considered

## UNAUTHORIZED CREDENTIAL USE

Credentials will be issued to working media only. Media credentials are not transferable and use by anyone other than members of the working media is unauthorized. Media credentials used in an unauthorized manner will be revoked immediately. News organizations allowing unauthorized individuals to use credentials will have their credentials revoked for the remainder of the year.

## Watsco Center

The Watsco Center is the 200,000-square foot, 7,972-seat arena that is home to the University of Miami men's and women's basketball teams. The Hurricanes played their first game in the arena Jan. 15, 2003 against Boston College. Since then, Miami has defeated three top-five teams in the building and hosted postseason WNIT games. The arena was called the BankUnited Center until October 2016.

Watsco, Inc., based in Miami, is traded on the New York Stock Exchange and is the largest distributor of air conditioning, heating and refrigeration products with annual sales of more than $\$ 4$ billion, 5,000 employees and 563 locations throughout North America. Watsco has provided funding to the University since the 1990s through its "Watsco's Kids" program, providing children in the community free access to performance arts, sports and other events at the University.

Since its opening, the Watsco Center has hosted a number of memorable events and sold-out shows, including Green Day, Coldplay, John Mayer, Drake, The Fray and Barry Manilow, as well as being the setting for televised events and award shows such as the 2004 Presidential Debates, Unplugged featuring Ricky Martin and Thalia, Premio Lo Nuestro, Premios Juventud, Billboard's Latin Music Awards and, most recently, The X Factor. The venue has also welcomed world-renowned figures and politicians, including His Holiness the Dalai Lama, former President Bill Clinton, current President Barack Obama, former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and Senator John McCain.


## Fieldhouse

The 29,000-square foot on-campus practice facility that is conveniently located adjacent to the Watsco Center opened in March of 2009. The facility houses a pair of full-sized basketball courts with 14 baskets, as well as a multi-purpose room to host a variety of events. Miami basketball players have access to the secure facility 24 hours per day, allowing the Hurricanes court time at any time all year around.

The Hurricanes use the facility for both conditioning and practice sessions, as well as for individual workouts and pick-up games. The Fieldhouse was also honored for its sustainability components, earning the LEED Gold designation, established by the U.S. Green Building Council \& verified by the Green Building Certification Institute.

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT UNIVERSIDAD NACIONAL AUTÓNOMA DE MÉXICO, 1979

Dr. Julio Frenk, a noted leader in global public health and a renowned scholar and academic, was named the sixth president of the University of Miami in April 2015. He assumed his leadership post on August 16, 2015.

Prior to joining the University of Miami, Dr. Frenk was Dean of the Faculty at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health since January 2009. While at Harvard, he was also the T \& G Angelopoulos Professor of Public Health and International Development, a joint appointment with the Harvard Kennedy School of Government.

Dr. Frenk served as the Minister of Health of Mexico from 2000 to 2006. He pursued an ambitious agenda to reform the nation's health system and introduced a program of comprehensive universal health insurance, known as Seguro Popular, which expanded access to health care for tens of millions of uninsured Mexicans.

Dr. Frenk was the founding director-general of the National Institute of Public Health in Mexico, one of the leading institutions of health education and research in the developing world. In 1998 Dr. Frenk joined the World Health Organization (WHO) as executive director in charge of Evidence and Information for Policy, WHO's first-ever unit explicitly charged with developing a scientific foundation for health policy to achieve better outcomes.

He also served as a senior fellow in the global health program of the Bill \& Melinda Gates Foundation and as president of the Carso Health Institute in Mexico City. He is the founding chair of the board of the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation at the University of Washington. He also co-chaired the Commission on the Education of Health Professionals for the 21st Century, which published its influential report in the leading journal The Lancet in 2010, triggering a large number of followup initiatives throughout the world.

Dr. Frenk holds a medical degree from the National Autonomous University of Mexico, as well as a master of public health and a joint doctorate in Medical Care Organization and in Sociology from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. He has been awarded honorary doctorates from several institutions of higher learning. In September of 2008, Dr. Frenk received the Clinton Global Citizen Award for changing "the way practitioners and policy makers across the world think about health."

He is a member of the U.S. Institute of Medicine, American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and National Academy of Medicine of Mexico.

In addition to his scholarly works, which include more than 140 articles in academic journals, as well as many books and book chapters, he has written two best-selling novels for youngsters explaining the functions of the human body.


DR. MARUIN DAWKINS
FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE
EDWARD WATERS COLLEGE, 1970

Dr. Marvin Dawkins, a distinguished professor in the Department of Sociology at the University of Miami, is in his fifth year as the Faculty Athletics Representative. He was named to the post in April 2012, replacing Clyde McCoy after his 17 years of service in that role.

In his FAR post, Dawkins is responsible for ensuring the academic integrity of students participating in University athletic programs and helping to oversee institutional control of the Department of Athletics. The Faculty Athletics Representative serves as a liaison between the University and the athletic department. This individual is the University's voting delegate to the ACC and represents UM with the NCAA and $A C C$.

Dawkins received his doctorate from Florida State and completed his postdoctoral research fellowships at Howard University and The Johns Hopkins University. He previously served on the faculties of the University of Maryland, Old Dominion University and the University of Wisconsin-Parkside.

His research focuses on issues of race and social equity in such areas as education, career aspirations and mobility, substance abuse prevention, and sports. He has published widely in these areas, including his most recent article titled "Race and Pathways to Power in the National Football League" (with Jomills H. Braddock and Erica Smith), which appears in American Behavioral Scientist (2012). His research on golf includes book chapters, scholarly articles, and the book African American Golfers During the Jim Crow Era (Praeger 2000), coauthored with Graham C. Kinloch. Dawkins was recently appointed to the United States Golf Association Museum Committee and is currently completing a study on the media treatment of black golfers from the Jim Crow era to the present.


BLAKE JAMES
DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS MINNESOTA STATE-MANKATO, 1992

Since taking over as the University of Miami's Director of Athletics in 2013, Blake James has transformed Miami Athletics, spearheading improvement in all aspects of the department, including postseason appearances, student-athlete support, facility upgrades, ticket sales and academic achievement.

Miami's recent success has garnered James and UM national recognition. In March 2017, James was selected as one of four Division I recipients of the 2016-17 Under Armour Athletic Director of the Year award, an honor given by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). In June 2017, James began a two-year term as Chair of the NCAA Division I Council, the group responsible for the day-to-day decision-making for all of Division I.

James has placed a strong emphasis on academics during his four-plus years at Miami. In the most recent Graduation Success Rate figures released by the NCAA, Miami student-athletes posted a GSR mark of $90 \%$. Ten Hurricane teams posted perfect 2015-16 scores on the latest Academic Progress Report (APR). In addition, Miami's football program received the 2016 AFCA Academic Achievement Award. In 2016, Hurricane studentathletes also ranked among the nation's best in time committed towards community service.

In the department's continuing efforts to better support student-athletes and coaches, the Hurricane Club -- the fundraising arm of Miami Athletics -- completed a record-setting year in 2016-17. The Hurricane Club raised $\$ 49$ million, an alltime record and an increase of more than 80 percent from the previous record of $\$ 26.5$ million, set in 2010-11. The Hurricane Club's membership of more than 11,000 members represents an over 100-percent jump from its membership of 5,140 in 2010.

Prior to the 2016 football season, James led the university's football coaching search which resulted in the hiring of Hurricane alum Mark Richt as the football program's new head coach. Richt paid immediate dividends in 2016 as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record, won their first bowl game in 10 years and finished ranked \#20 in the final Associated Press poll, their first season-ending ranking since 2009.

During the 2015-16 academic year, Miami was the only school in NCAA Division I to have its football team play in a bowl game, its men's and women's basketball teams advance to the NCAA Tournament and its baseball team advance to the College World Series. Overall, Miami had 10 sports programs advance to postseason competition to secure its highest finish in the Learfield Directors' Cup standings in 13 years, an indication of broad-based athletic department success.

During James' tenure, Miami has completed several facility enhancements, including the opening of the Schwartz Center for Athletic Excellence; the completion of the student-athlete training table, fueling station and dining hall; new artificial and natural playing surfaces and lights on the Greentree Practice Fields' and a center-hung scoreboard inside the Watsco Center.

James has also led multiple, multi-million dollar capital renovation projects, including renovations of the Hecht Center and the men's and women's basketball offices. Over the past year, Miami Athletics has secured six leadership gifts of seven figures-or-more, including the largest donation in department
history - a $\$ 14$ million gift from the Soffer Family, which will serve as the lead gift for the Hurricanes' \$34 million Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility, which broke ground this year.

Ticket sales are also at an all-time high. In 2016, Miami sold a school-record 42,000 football season tickets and ranked first among Power 5 programs in attendance percentage increase (23 percent) over 2015 attendance. The Hurricanes have also sold out their men's basketball season tickets in back-to-back seasons for the first time ever.

In addition, Miami has transformed its broadcast, communications and marketing departments into one of the nation's leaders in digital media and video production. In 2016, Miami aired more live events on ESPN3 than any other ACC institution. James was also instrumental in helping Miami strike one of the largest apparel deals in the country with adidas.

Prior to being named AD, James served Miami Athletics in the roles of Interim AD and Senior Associate AD for Development and Ticket Operations, where he oversaw the day-to-day operations of development, ticket sales and ticket operations. He also was a member of the Hurricanes' senior staff and provided sport supervision.

James came to UM after spending seven years at the University of Maine, where he first served as Senior Associate Athletic Director before serving as Director of Athletics from 2005 to 2010. During his tenure at Maine, athletics experienced tremendous success, including three trips to the Frozen Four for the men's ice hockey program and NCAA playoff berths for football, baseball (two), women's basketball and softball. James implemented a comprehensive $\$ 17$ million facility improvement plan at Maine, which included an indoor practice facility and numerous other facility upgrades and renovations. Academically, the program flourished, earning the conference academic cup twice and student-athletes maintaining a 3.0 GPA or above.

Prior to his stint at Maine, James worked in athletic development at Providence College, where he established the "Friars Forever" campaign and the Friar Athletic Fund.

James is no stranger to South Florida, beginning his athletic career with the University of Miami, working in ticket sales, corporate sales and athletic development. In 1995, he was hired as Miami's Director of Ticket Sales, serving in that capacity until 1997, when he was named an athletic development officer at the University of Nebraska. He returned to Miami in 1998 as the Director of Major Gifts and Corporate Sales and was promoted to the Director of Athletic Development at Miami in 2000 before moving on to Providence in 2002.

James graduated from Minnesota State University - Mankato with a Bachelor's degree in Marketing in 1992 and later received his Master's degree in Sports Administration from St. Thomas University in 1994. He and his wife, Kelly, have two children: daughter, Haley, and son, Ryan.

## JENNIFER STRAWLEY

DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER SENIOR WOMAN ADMINistrator PENNSYLVANIA, 1998

Jennifer Strawley joined the University of Miami on June 18, 2012 and currently serves as Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Operating Officer. She also serves as the departments Senior Woman Administrator.

Serving as the second-in-command, Strawley provides strategic direction for the department and assists the Director of Athletics with the day-to-day operations. She is the sport administrator for football, women's basketball and women's tennis. Strawley leads the department's strategic planning initiatives, policy development and implementation, coordination of department and coaches meetings and gender equity and inclusion initiatives. She oversees the areas of human resources, sports medicine, academic services, equipment / Adidas, video services and student-athlete development, as well as serves as a liaison to various campus groups, the ACC and the NCAA.

Strawley played a key role in the hiring of head football coach Mark Richt, serving on the selection committee. In addition, she was instrumental in the development of Miami's annual Celebration of Women's Athletics recognizing the achievements of Miami's female student-athletes while raising money to support women's athletics.

Actively engaged in intercollegiate athletics nationally, Strawley has served on various committees within the NCAA and the ACC. She currently serves on the ACC Television Committee, the ACC Women's Basketball foresight committee, the ACC Equity Committee, the ACC Infractions and Sportsmanship Review Committee, the ACC Football Schedulers Group, and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Oversight Committee. She also serves on the board of directors for Women's Leaders in College Sports and the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Prior to UM, Strawley concluded her second tour with the NCAA as the Director of Academic and Membership Affairs. In this role, Strawley was instrumental in providing leadership in the areas of academic governance and development of academic policy. Strawley served on the senior management team and was involved in a variety of other internal operations.

Strawley rejoined the NCAA after serving as the Associate Athletics Director for Intercollegiate Sport Programs and Senior Woman Administrator at Columbia University from 200710. While at Columbia, she oversaw numerous varsity sport programs including football and was the athletics program liaison for gender equity and diversity initiatives. Strawley was a member of the department's Executive Management Team.

Prior to her tenure at Columbia, Strawley was the Director of Membership Services and Student-Athlete Reinstatement at the NCAA. In this role, she provided oversight of the studentathlete reinstatement process and was instrumental in the implementation of the student first philosophy. Strawley served as a liaison to numerous NCAA committees and task forces, including the NCAA Divisions I, II and III Student-Athlete Reinstatement Committees, the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee, and the working group appointed to review trends in initial eligibility.

Strawley first joined the NCAA in 1998 as an enforcement services intern. She is a 1998 graduate of the University of Pennsylvania where she earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in history. During her time at Pennsylvania, she was a two-year captain for the Quakers' softball team. Strawley was inducted into the William Tennent High School Athletics Hall of Fame in January of 2014.


JASON LAYTON
DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS Chief financial officer SAINT LEO, 1999

Jason Layton serves as the University of Miami Deputy Director of Athletics and Chief Financial Officer, a position he took over in August 2017. He initially joined Miami in December 2014 as the Senior Associate Athletics Director for Communications and Sales.

In his current position, Layton is responsible for managing the department's business office, marketing, digital strategies, communications, ticket sales, ticket operations, client experience, video production and broadcast departments.

Additionally, Layton has oversight of all departmental licensing matters, Hurricane Sports Properties, serves as the department ACC Network liaison and is the sport administrator for men's basketball.

Since his arrival, Miami has seen exceptional growth in ticket sales and video production services in both content and broadcast with ESPN and the newly formed ACC Network.

Under his watch, Miami has seen an increased level of season ticket sales in football and men's basketball. Under Layton's guidance, Miami saw an unprecedented growth in football attendance during the 2016 season, as the Hurricanes totaled 42,000 season ticket holders and averaged 58,572 fans per game - the 27th-highest total in the nation and leader among all Power Five schools in percentage increase on a year-to-year basis ( 23 percent).

In addition, Miami sold out its entire 2015-16 and 2016-17 men's basketball season ticket allotment, marking the first time in Hurricane Athletics history that a team has sold out its entire season ticket allotment in back-to-back seasons.

Layton also serves as the primary contact for ESPN with the recent launch of the ACC Network, first in digital format in August 2016 and building to the linear network in fall of 2019. Since 2015, Miami has produced over 200 live events on ESPN3/ ACC Network Extra - a figure that ranks near the top of all ACC schools.

Layton, a Florida native, arrived in Miami after spending the 2013 and 2014 seasons at Colorado State University where he served as the department's Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sales and Marketing. During his time in Fort Collins, Colo., Layton's ticket sales plans drove double-digit increases in football, volleyball, men's basketball and women's basketball revenue and tickets sold.

Before his arrival at Colorado State, Layton spent 13 years with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. In his 13 years with the club, he handled a variety of responsibilities from sales, marketing, ticketing and luxury suite operations to advertising, accounting, finance and purchasing. Layton began his career with the Buccaneers as a customer service representative in 1999 before elevating to the role of Senior Director of Business Administration in 2011. Layton received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Saint Leo University in Saint Leo, Fla.


DAVID WYMAN
SENIOR ASSOCIATE AD academic services FLORIDA A\&M, 1994
"When you do the right things, the right things happen."

David Wyman has empowered over 2,000 student-athletes with his signature creed. Now in his 23rd year, Wyman has advised and mentored a diverse population of student-athletes to become skilled professionals in many different careers.

Wyman is the Senior Associate Athletic Director for Academic Services at the University of Miami, a position he was promoted to in August 2017. Wyman is also the sport administrator for Miami's volleyball program.

He began his own career as an intern, and was quickly promoted to the full-time staff after working just two months in the academic services division. Wyman became the assistant director two years later, supervising the tutorial program and advising both the football and men's basketball teams. He was then promoted to associate director, taking on the responsibility of coordinating the NCAA eligibility certification for all 400 student-athletes.

Since 2004, Wyman has managed the Division of Athletic Academic Services, currently leading a staff of eight full-time professionals. Under his leadership, the department and sport programs have gained national recognition and honors for continued growth in both academic progress rates (APR) and graduation success.

A 2016 inductee to the Iron Arrow Society, Wyman has helped guide the football team to a pair AFCA Academic Achievement Awards for graduating 100 percent of student-athletes in the freshman classes of 2002 and 2009.

Wyman is a 1994 graduate of Florida A\&M with a bachelor's degree in accounting. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from St. Thomas University in 1995 . Born in Staten Island, N.Y., he is married to Jewyll, and the couple has three daughters: Rebecca, Dominique and Sarah. Wyman has been a Big Brother in the Miami-Dade Big Brother/Big Sister Organization and is also a member of Omicron Delta Kappa, The National Leadership Honor Society and the National Association of Academic Advisors for Athletics.

SENIOR ASSOCIATE AD BUSINESS OPERATIONS ELON, 1995

After a pair of promotions, Joshua Boone now serves as the Senior Associate Athletic Director for Business Operations at the University of Miami. Boone was hired in July 2012 as the Assistant AD for Business Operations, was elevated to Associate AD in March 2014 and took on his new title in August 2017.

In addition to his role within the business office, Boone is also the sport administrator for Miami's swimming and diving programs.

Boone, who spent the previous nine years working for the University of North Carolina, was promoted to associate director of business operations with the Tar Heels in November 2011. In his time in Chapel Hill, Boone supervised the day-to-day operations of a $\$ 72$ million operating budget, served as the department liaison with accounting, development, disbursement, facility services and outside travel vendors, and also assisted in the athletic department's annual budget preparations. Jesse Marks was promoted to Senior Associate Athletic Director for Development in August 2016. He was previously promoted to associate AD for development in November 2012 following two years as assistant athletics director for major gifts.

Under the guidance of Director of Athletics Blake James, Marks is responsible for all development operations for the department of athletics, including campaign oversight, major giving, annual fund, donor stewardship, event hospitality and coordination with central advancement efforts. Marks is also the sport administrator for Miami's men's tennis program.

Since Marks' arrival in 2010, the Hurricane Club has seen significant growth in major giving and annual giving participation. Following the department's restructure in 2010, the Hurricane Club's development results have increased significantly across the board. Major Giving is up more than 70 percent since 2010, increasing from $\$ 14$ million in 2010 to $\$ 26.6$ million in 2011 and to an all-time high of $\$ 49$ million in 2016-17.

Annual giving has also seen unprecedented growth through extensive marketing, philanthropic re-branding and digital strategy. Since 2010, annual Hurricane Club Membership has increased by more than 100 percent to an all-time record of 11,500 active members and over \$14 million raised for studentathlete excellence. The Hurricane Club is consistently recognized nationwide for their use of cutting edge technology and unique campaigns to drive annual support.

Marks has been a part of two major capital campaigns at the University of Miami: The Momentum Campaign, (2000-2008) which raised over $\$ 1$ billion for the University, and Momentum2. Under Marks' leadership, athletics exceeded its goal of \$68 million and raised more than $\$ 85$ million dollars towards the Momentum campaign and raised over $\$ 118$ million towards the university wide $\$ 1.6$ billion Momemtum2 Campaign.

Prior to his return to UM Athletics, Marks served as assistant director of development at Wake Forest University, where he managed relationships for over 150 athletic donors in the southeast, including South Carolina, Georgia, North Carolina and Florida. Prior to Wake Forest, Marks was as assistant athletics director for development at Florida International University, where he managed all fundraising operations related to the opening of their new football stadium in 2008.

Marks is an active member of the National Association of Athletic Development Directors (NAADD) and is an adjunct professor in the School of Education Sports Administration Program teaching Sport Promotions and Sales.

A two-time Miami graduate, Marks earned his bachelor's degree in 2005 and his master's degree in 2008.


TIM WISE
SENIOR ASSOCIATE AD FaCilities \& Event OPERAtions SOUTH CAROLINA, 1996

Tim Wise is in his sixth year as the Senior Associate Athletic Director for Facilities and Event Operations at the University of Miami. Wise joined the UM staff in June 2012.

Wise has oversight of numerous areas within the department: facilities and maintenance services, capital projects/construction, facilities master planning, event management and guest services, camps/clinics, risk management, information technology, strength \& conditioning and nutrition. He is also the liaison to the Watsco Center and Hard Rock Stadium, as well as serves as the sport administrator for Miami's soccer and rowing teams.

Wise, who has more than 20 years of experience in college athletics as an event manager, facilities director and administrator, was hired by the University of Wisconsin Athletic Department as assistant athletic director for events and facilities in August, 2008. In January 2012, he was named interim associate athletic director and elevated to the senior management team with additional oversight of the University Ridge Golf Course and $\$ 125$ million in capital projects.

Wise also had supervisory oversight of the UW Athletics event management, facilities, food and beverage and guest services units and oversaw an annual budget of approximately $\$ 15$ million. He also served in a lead role in administrative coordination of UW Athletics concerts, summer camps and event parking.

Wise served as the director of facility maintenance at the University of Connecticut from August 2005 to August 2008. He oversaw daily operations of athletic facilities, projects and event operations as the assistant athletics director for facilities and operations at Eastern Michigan University from November 2003 to June 2005.

Wise was hired as the athletics event manager at the University of Denver in August 2000 and promoted to the director of athletics events in August 2001 and served in that role until October 2003. Prior to his time at Denver, Wise was the event services manager at The Ohio State University's Schottenstein Center.

Wise was an event operations manager intern at Michigan State University from August 1998 to May 1999. His first position upon graduation from college was as a conference coordinator at the University of South Carolina from December 1996 to January 1998.

Wise has extensive experience working at NCAA and conference championship events. At Wisconsin, he served on the departments Diversity Integration Group and was the representative to the City of Madison and UW Campus Joint Southeast Campus Area Committee. In the past, he served on Connecticut's Environmental Compliance Team as well as the schools Environmental Policy Advisory Council. He also served on the NCAA Woman of the Year Selection Committee and the NCAA Minority Opportunities and Interests Committee, three years as the Vice Chair. Wise earned the University of Denver Center for Multicultural Excellence Outstanding Staff Award in 2002-03.

Wise is a member of Alpha Phi Alpha, Fraternity, Inc. and served as the President of the local Mu Eta Lambda alumni chapter. He is a member of the Collegiate Event and Facility Management Association and was named to the Board of Directors in September 2011 and the 3rd Vice President in June 2012, 2nd Vice President in June 2013, 1st Vice President in June 2014 and served as The President for 2015-16. Wise also has membership in the Minority Opportunities Athletic Association and the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

In February 2017, Wise was named to the MOAA Board of Directors. He has participated in the NCAA Leadership Institute Continuing Education Series, the NCAA Leadership Institute for Ethnic Minority Males, the NACDA Mentoring Institute and NCAA Diversity Education Training. Brent Crank was promoted to Senior Associate Athletic Director for Ticket Sales and Marketing at the University of Miami in August 2017. He previously served as the associate AD for ticket sales and operations for three years after initially being hired as the assistant AD for ticket operations in July 2012.

Along with his duties in ticket sales and marketing, Crank is also the sport administrator for the Hurricanes' golf team.

Prior to Miami, Crank spent the previous year as director of ticketing at University of Alabama, and possesses extensive experience across the college athletics landscape.

While a member of the Alabama administrative staff, Crank managed the daily operations of the athletics tickets office, oversaw gameday operations of the home football and basketball schedules, and coordinated season ticket renewals for Alabama teams.

Prior to his time in Tuscaloosa, Ala., Crank spent three years as the assistant athletic director for ticket operations at Marquette University. While with the Golden Eagles, Crank managed the entire ticket operation (consisting of season tickets, single games, mini-packs, student tickets and postseason tickets), implemented a variable pricing structure for men's basketball that resulted in $\$ 5.3$ million dollars in ticket revenue for the 2010-11 season, and helped increase overall ticket sales by 10 percent.

The University of Wisconsin - Eau Claire graduate (2005) has also worked in ticket operations for Tulane University and the University of Oregon. While at UWEau Claire, Crank majored in Kinesiology and minored in business.


SENIOR ASSOCIATE AD STUDENT-ATHLETE DEVELOPMENT BOWLING GREEN, 1994

Shirelle Jackson is the Senior Associate Athletic Director of Student-Athlete Development at the University of Miami. Jackson initially joined Miami as the director of student-athlete development in March 2014 and was promoted to assistant AD in July 2016.

Elevated to her current title in August 2017, Jackson also oversees the Hurricanes' track and field programs.

Prior to joining the athletics department, Jackson spent the previous five years in various capacities in the College of Arts and Sciences at UM. Her initial position was a new role intended to enhance the athletic department's efforts to develop programming that will enhance the total development of our student-athletes.

Prior to arriving at UM, Shirelle was the director of athletic academic support services from 2005-08 at FIU, where she oversaw the management and operation of the school's academic support program for its 400 student-athletes. She also coordinated the academic and personal advising, class registration, tutors, study hall and study skills workshops. During her tenure at FIU, she saw her full-time staff increase to six and the student-athlete graduation rate improved by 16 percent.

She was the assistant director for student-athlete services for 11 months at Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio. Her first athletics position was as assistant AD for student development from August 2002-July 2004 at Eastern Connecticut State.

Jackson was a four-year letter winner for the women's track and field team at Bowling Green. She received her bachelor's degree from Bowling Green in 1994 and her master's degree in counseling from Central Connecticut State in 1998. She is currently a doctoral candidate in higher education leadership at Nova Southeastern in Davie.

She is married to Jason Jackson, who is the television host and courtside reporter for Miami HEAT telecasts on Sun Sports. The couple has two children - Justin and Jordan.

## PERSONAL

Hometown: Wheaton, III.

Katie Meier completed her 12th season at the helm of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2016-17. A well-known and respected figure in women's basketball with 16 years of head coaching experience, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided her team to an eighth consecutive postseason, a sixth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last seven years, and a seventh 20-plus win season in the last eight years, all extending program records. The Hurricanes finished with a 24-9 record, tied for the fifth-most wins in a single campaign in program history, and made the ACC Tournament semifinals for the second straight year.

Following the season, Meier was indcuted into the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame, becoming the fourth basketball coach, male or female, to garner the prestigious honor.

In January 2014, Meier was named a co-recipient of the 2013 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award after leading the USA U19 team to a gold medal and perfect 9-0 record at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship.

All of her hard work was rewarded after the 201011 season when she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

That season, Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2004 and their win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for Miami since 1993. The Canes entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll after a season in which they were the No. 12 seed in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and, at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Meier continued that success into the 2011-12 season, a year in which the Canes accomplished many firsts for the program.

Miami defeated Maryland - the eventual ACC Tournament champ - twice during the regular season, the first when the Terrapins were ranked fifth in the nation. It was the first time in program history that the Hurricanes had defeated a top-five team. Later in the year, UM ascended to its highest ranking ever, also at No. 5.

The Hurricanes have proved to be formidable on the court in the BankUnited Center, as the 2011-12 season saw Miami go undefeated at home for the second consecutive season. Their 16-0 mark on the year pushed the Canes record home win streak to 40 straight games. Only Stanford ended the season with a longer active streak.

For her dedication to the University of Miami and the athletic department, Meier was signed to a two-year contract extension, securing the Wheaton, III., native through the 2017-18 season. Prior to the 2014-15 season, Meier received another extension, through the 2020-

21 campaign, and donated $\$ 75,000$ back to the school to go towards women's athletics as well as challenged to community to contribute as well.

Meier earned another well-deserved extension after a 2016-17 season that included the Hurricanes hosting NCAA Tournament play for the first time since 1993. The new deal added three years to her contract, which now runs through the 2023-24 season.

Five people who have been assistants for Meier during her head coaching career have gone on to earn Division I head coaching positions: Lynn Bria (Stetson), Amanda Butler (Florida), Darrick Gibbs (North Florida), Carolyn Kieger (Marquette) and Stephanie McCormick (Western Carolina). Additionally, 20 of Meier's players at Miami have signed professional contracts after their college careers.

Through the 2016-17 campaign, Meier has a career record of 307-197, including a 231-152 mark at Miami.

## A New Era

Hired April 19, 2005, Meier was appointed by then-Miami AD Paul Dee in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal was to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

## Creating a Winning Program

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. They fought through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

During the season, Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as No. 25 Mississippi, No. 21 Boston College and No. 25 Virginia Tech, and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under Meier's direction, in 2005-06, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player, becoming the Miami's all-time leading scorer.

James was selected with the eighth overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games--including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50.

Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer, upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The All-ACC Second Team selection a set school records in single-game scoring with 42 points at Houston. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more 3-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points ( 15.3 ppg ) and rebounding ( 5.6 rpg ) and was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team.

With the No. 21-ranked incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson of Henrietta, N.Y., and Riquna Williams from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype, as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time in history.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named first team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history, with both earning alltournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, then-Miami AD Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

Miami's success proved to be immediate, as it earned a conference regular season title in 2010-11 and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons.

Johnson and Williams turned out to be the AllAmerica candidates that they were expected to become. In fact, Johnson was named to four different All-America squads and became the second player in program history to be named the conference player of the year (Frances Savage - BIG EAST - 1992). Johnson also garnered AllACC Defensive Team honors for the second straight season and was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team. Williams, along with Johnson, was named First Team AllACC and was the conference scoring leader, posting 21.7 points per game.

The duo combined for seven ACC Player of the Week accolades on the season as Williams took home the award on four occasions. No other team in the league was recognized more than twice for the weekly honor.

## HEAD COAGH KATIE METER

Miami's success continued into the 2011-12 season. The Canes finished second in the conference standings with a record of 14-2 and were 26-6 overall. UM also defeated the eventual conference tournament champion, Maryland, both times they played in the regular season.

Seniors Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams continued to live up to the hype of being the nation's top backcourt duo as they were second and third in the league in scoring and each were again named First Team All-ACC. The accolade was the third straight honor for Johnson and the second for Williams. Johnson was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the third consecutive season. Johnson earned a place on five different All-America teams, including the WBCA squad for the second straight year. Williams eanred AP All-America third team recognition in her final collegiate campaign as well.

Unfortunately, junior forward Morgan Stroman, a former McDonald's All-American who was a Third Team All-ACC pick in 2010-11 after posting a team-best 11 double-doubles, suffered a season-ending injury midway through the conference schedule. However, junior guard Stefanie Yderstrom stepped up and ended the season with more 3-pointers than any other player in the league and was rewarded with a Third Team All-ACC nod.

Miami once again advanced to the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed. The Canes traveled to Spokane, Wash., and defeated the No. 14 seed, Idaho State in the first round, but fell to host Gonzaga in the second.

The Hurricanes went to a school record third straight NCAA Tournament in 2012-13, earning a No. 8 seed. Miami dropped its first round contest to ninth-seeded lowa, the host school, but picked up two top-10 wins during the season. Meier's Hurricanes defeated No. 6/7 Penn State and knocked off No. 5/4 Duke on senior day, marking the first win over a team in the top four of either poll in program history and the school's first win over the Blue Devils, who went 20-1 against ACC opponents that season, including winning the ACC Tournament. Stroman averaged 12.9 points and 8.8 rebounds, while Yderstrom posted 11.7 points per game, and both received First Team All-ACC honors.

After reaching the WNIT in 2014, Meier guided the Hurricanes back to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 and the 11th-seeded Hurricanes defeated No. 6 seed Washington in the first round, before dropping their second round matchup against thirdseeded lowa, the host school. The victory over the Huskies made Meier the first coach in program history to win an NCAA Tournament game in three different years.

Earlier in the 2014-15 season, Meier also led the Hurricanes to the program's first win over a team in the top four of the AP Poll. They defeated No. 4/4 Notre Dame, 78-63, the Fighting Irish's only loss in their first two years in the ACC. Sophomore guard Adrienne Motley went on to be named a consensus First Team All-ACC pick after averaging 16.9 points on 49.2 percent shooting. Meier also earned her 250th career win during the season.

In 2015-16, Meier led Miami to a 24-9 record to tie for the fifth-most wins in a season in program history. The Hurricanes defeated No. 14/10 Florida State, 74-56, to reach the ACC Tournament semifinals for the second time. Miami received a No. 5 seed the NCAA Tournament and made its fifth appearance in the field in the past six years.

The 2015-16 campaign also saw the Hurricanes beat both Duke and North Carolina in the same year for the first time. The victory at North Carolina was good for the 200th of Meier's tenure at Miami. Adrienne Motley was also tabbed as a consensus First Team All-ACC honoree for the second straight year, in addition to garnering WBCA All-America Team Honorable Mention recognition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided the Hurricanes to a second straight 24-9 record. In the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament, Miami again defeated a Florida State team ranked in the top 10, downing the No. 8/12 Seminoles, 56-54, to earn back-to-back semifinal appearances for the first time. The Hurricanes beat four top- 25 teams, defeating three ranked teams - two of which were in the top 10 - away from home for the first time in the ACC era. Miami earned a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first two rounds of play, and reached the second round for the fourth time in seven years.

Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas were both consensus Second Team All-ACC picks in 2016-17, with Motley becoming Miami's fifth WNBA Draft pick. In addition, Motley, Thomas and Keyona Hayes formed the second Miami teammate trio to all reach 1,000 points and each signed a WNBA contract, the first time three Hurricanes in the same class did so.

## Establishing Her Legacy as a Player

Meier's success as a coach is a direct reflection of her playing career as a standout at Duke University. A four-year letter winner for the Blue Devils under head coach Debbie Leonard from 1986-90, Meier's name is scattered throughout the Duke record books.

She currently ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in scoring average (16.2 points per game), steals (232), free throws made (447) and free throws attempted (624). She is also listed among Duke's leaders in career points ( 1,761 ), field goals made (653), field goals attempted ( 1,283 ), assists (409) and rebounding average ( 6.1 rebounds per game).

Meier wasted no time making her mark at Duke, earning ACC Rookie of the Year and Basketball Yearbook Freshman AllAmerica honors in 1986. Meier injured her knee in 1988 during her junior season and ultimately missed the entire 1988-89 campaign while recovering.

Meier returned to Duke for her senior season in 1990 without missing a beat, earning Kodak/WBCA District 2 All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while being named the Blue Devils' most valuable player.

In 2002, Meier was honored by Duke for her efforts as a player when she was named to the inaugural induction class in the Blue Devils' Hall of Honor. That same year, Meier was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team. In 2006, she was once again honored by the conference when she was named an ACC Legend at the 2006 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament.

Meier's success on the court was only outdone by her accomplishments in the classroom. She was named to the Dean's List from 1986-88. In 1988 she also earned GTE Academic All-America Second Team honors.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in English literature with cum laude honors in 1989, Meier went on to earn a master's degree in teaching English from Duke in 1990.

Following her career at Duke, Meier moved overseas to play three seasons with BBC Mini-Flat Waregem in Belgium from 1990-93. There, she helped lead her team to three First Division regular season titles and one Belgian Cup Championship. While in Belgium, Meier also spent time teaching classes of conversational English while coaching teams of 15-to 17-year-olds.

A native of Wheaton, III., Meier graduated from Wheaton Central High School in 1985 and in October 2009 was inducted into her high school's athletic hall of fame.

The University of Miami welcomed back one of its own when women's basketball head coach Katie Meier named Octavia Blue a Hurricanes assistant coach May 2, 2012.

A Miami player from 1994-98, Blue now begins season six on staff and year 10 as a college coach. She is the Hurricanes' recruiting coordinator and is responsible for the development of Miami's post players.

Blue has coached a quartet AllACC players in her five seasons at Miami: guard Adrienne Motley, forward Morgan Stroman, guard Jessica Thomas and guard Stefanie Yderstrom. Motley earned AllACC recognition in three of her four seasons as a Hurricane and also received WBCA All-American Honorable Mention in 2015-16.

During her five-year stint at Miami, four players have signed WNBA contracts, including Motley, who became the fifth Hurricane selected in the WNBA Draft. In total, 11 Hurricanes who have benefited from Blue's tutelage have gone on to play professionally.

In addition to Blue's presence on the recruiting trail and her development of post players, she has also coached the Hurricanes to a quintet of postseason berthsthe NCAA Tournament in 2013, 2015, 2016 and 27, as well as the WNIT in 2014.

Prior to her return to Miami, Blue spent three seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Georgia Tech. During her time in Atlanta, the Yellow Jackets posted three 20 -plus win seasons, made three NCAA tournament appearances and reeled in two top-25 recruiting classes (No. 24 in 2011 and No. 13 in 2012).

All-ACC players and three WNBA Draft picks. Brigitte Ardossi was drafted by the Atlanta Dream in the second round in 2010, Alex Montgomery was taken in the first round by the New York Liberty in 2011 and Sasha Goodlett was picked in the first round in 2012 by the Indiana Fever.

Blue's first season as an assistant coach was in 2008-09 at St. John's, where she helped the Red Storm advance to the WNIT. Under the guidance of Blue, post player Dashena Stevens was named the 2008-09 BIG EAST Rookie of the Year.

From 1994-98, Blue amassed 1,724 points as a Hurricane, then placing her fourth in program history and still good for eighth. She shot a school record 45.3 percent from 3 -point range as a senior in 199798 before going on to play a nineyear professional basketball career.

After her decorated collegiate career, Blue was selected No. 15 overall in 1998 by the Los Angeles Sparks, becoming Miami's first WNBA Draft pick.

She had a lengthy professional career that lasted from 1998-2006, which included playing for two WNBA teams (Sparks and Houston Comets) and international clubs in Greece, Israel, France, Turkey and Poland.

Blue returned to Miami to complete her degree in sociology/ sport management in 2007 and, in 2008, was inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame and named an ACC Women's Basketball Legend.

On Feb. 21, 2016, Blue's No. 10 jersey became the fourth in program history raised to the rafters in Coral Gables, Fla.

Also developing post players at Georgia Tech, Blue coached three

Tia Jackson was hired as an assistant coach for the University of Miami women's basketball program on May 7, 2015.

A 21-year coaching veteran with four years of head coaching experience, Jackson came to Miami after spending four seasons as an assistant under Hall of Fame coach C. Vivian Stringer at Rutgers University.

Miami has finished 24-9 in both of Jackson's seasons with the team, tying for the fifth-most wins in program history. It reached the NCAA Tournament both years, advancing to the second round on its home court in 2017.

The Hurricanes also made the semifinals of the ACC Tournament both years, marking the first time they have done so in back-to-back campaigns. In addition, Jackson has aided two Hurricanes, Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas, to three All-ACC accolades.

Jackson, who has both played and coached in the Final Four, was the head coach at Washington from 2007-11. While there, she signed a number of talented recruiting classes, and her 2008 recruiting haul was ranked No. 11 in the nation.

Following the 2010-11 season, Jackson joined the Rutgers coaching staff and helped guide the Scarlet Knights to a trio of postseason appearances, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament. In 2014-15, her last year at Rutgers, the team advanced to the second round for the first time since 2011.
In each of Jackson's first two years at Rutgers, the Scarlet Knights signed the nation's third-ranked recruiting class.

Jackson began her coaching career as an assistant at Virginia Commonwealth University just one year after graduating from college. She worked for the Rams from 1996-1999.

After her three seasons at VCU, Jackson spent one year as an assistant coach at Stanford University, working under another Hall of Fame coach, Tara VanDerveer, at one of the nation's most tradition-rich programs.

The Cardinal made the second round of the NCAA Tournament in Jackson's lone season in Palo Alto, Calif. Jackson then moved south in the Golden State and joined the staff at UCLA, where she was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator.

In five years with the Bruins, Jackson helped the program sign a pair of top-10 recruiting classes and ink four McDonald's and/or WBCA All-Americans. UCLA made the NCAA Tournament in 2004, its first appearance in four years.

After five seasons at UCLA, Jackson went to Duke University, where she worked as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator from 2005-07. In both of her years in Durham, N.C., Jackson helped the Blue Devils sign top-five recruiting classes featuring a quartet of McDonald's All-Americans.

Duke made the NCAA Championship for the second time in program history in Jackson's first year on staff and reached the Sweet 16 the following season. Jackson then returned to the ACC eight years later when she joined Miami's staff.

Originally from Salisbury, Md., Jackson scored 3,108 points in her career at Mardela Springs High School, before moving on to play for Stringer at the University of lowa.
The Hawkeyes finished in the top 25 four times during Jackson's career and advanced to the Final Four in 1993, ending the season with a 27-4 record. She was named to the Mideast Regional AllTournament team that year.
Jackson averaged 10.2 points, 4.4 rebounds and 1.5 steals per game as a Hawkeye and graduated from lowa in 1995. A two-time All-Big Ten Honorable Mention, Jackson still ranked in the top- 25 all-time at lowa in scoring, as well as No. 12 steals, when hired at Miami.

 Draft by the Phoenix Mercury, Jackson helped the team finish first in the Western Conference during the league's inaugural season.

Fitzroy Anthony was named an assistant coach for the University of Miami women's basketball program on May 18, 2015.

In his opening season with the Hurricanes, Anthony helped lead the team to a 24-9 record, good enough to tie for the fifth-most wins in program history. Miami also reached the semifinals of the ACC Tournament and appeared in the NCAA Tournament.

A five-year veteran of college coaching, Anthony helped Miami repeat its 24-9 mark in 2016-17. The Hurricanes also reached the ACC Tournament semifinals again, marking the first time they have done so in consecutive seasons, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament Round of 32 .

Anthony has worked with a pair of All-ACC performers, Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas. Motley, a 2015-16 WBCA AllAmerica Honorable Mention, became the fifth WNBA Draft pick in program history in 2017.

Prior to joining the Hurricanes, Anthony was an assistant coach at Florida Atlantic University for three seasons and helped the Owls make the move from the Sun Belt to Conference USA in his second year with the program.

During his three years at FAU, Anthony primarily worked with the team's guards, and did so with great success. In his final season there, the Owls had one backcourt player named First Team All-Conference USA and another selected to the league's all-freshman team.

Anthony played a key part in the Owls' scouting, defensive game planning and academic mentoring,
while also handling all of the team's scheduling.

A stellar recruiter, Anthony helped FAU sign the second-ranked recruiting class in the conference in 2014, according to Collegiate Girls Basketball Report.

In Anthony's second season in Boca Raton, Fla., he aided in guiding the Owls to their second winning season since 2005-06 and their second-most wins during that stretch.

Well-connected in South Florida, Anthony was the head coach at Coral Springs Charter School for two years, prior to making the move to FAU in August 2012. He led the Panthers to 20 -wins seasons both years and was named the Broward County Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2012.

Anthony directed the Panthers to their first regional and district championships in 2012, as well as their first berth in the Final Four of the state tournament. Four players he coached at Coral Springs Charter School went on to play Division I basketball.

Additionally, Anthony has experience coaching AAU basketball in South Florida and won over 80 percent of his games on the sidelines. Seven of his players proceeded to play collegiately in the ACC, SEC or Big 12.

Born in Antigua, Anthony moved to Boca Raton at age 12. He played basketball at Olympic Heights High School and then at Palm Beach Atlantic University, where he graduated in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in education.

From day one at the University of Miami, Tamara James made her mark as one of the top basketball players in program history. One of the country's most prolific players in her four collegiate seasons, James averaged 20.4 points per game and finished her career as Miami's all-time leading scorer with 2,406 points.

A standout guard at South Broward High School, James was ranked No. 14 in the nation by All-Star Girls Report in her senior season, during which she averaged 21.0 points and 11.0 rebounds per game. She was named the Florida State Player of the Year in 2002.

James was a McDonald's All-American, Fourth Team Parade All-American and Nike All-American in high school before choosing to attend the University of Miami, where she helped turn the program into one of the nation's best. She recorded one of the best freshman seasons in UM history, becoming the first freshman to lead the BIG EAST in scoring, with an average of 21.0 points per game. This total ranked her No. 12 nationally and was fourth-best in Miami history at the time. She scored double figures in 30 of 31 games played in the 2002-03 season.

Selected to the All-BIG EAST Preseason First Team, James' sophomore season continued in much the same fashion. She became the 17th Hurricane to reach 1,000 points, finishing the season ranked No. 14 in program history with 1,114. She scored a career-high 37 points in a win against Eastern Kentucky, and 22 points in 25 minutes in a win against Seton Hall. She earned All-BIG EAST First Team honors and was named BIG EAST Player of the Week twice on the season.

With Miami's move to the ACC in time for the 2004-2005 season, James became the second player in NCAA history to lead two major conferences in scoring. She led the Hurricanes in nearly every statistical category during her junior season, including field goals made (242), 3-point percentage (.328), rebounding ( 6.9 rpg ) and minutes played (36.1 mpg ), helping the Hurricanes to an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her senior season, James led the ACC in scoring with an average of 21.5 points per game and helped earn Miami a place in the 2006 WNIT. She passed UM Hall of Famer Maria Rivera's all-time scoring record when she netted 32 points against FIU. During James' career, the Hurricanes posted a 70-47 record.

James not only left UM with the most points in program history, but also as the leader in free throws made and free throws attempted, in addition to ranking in the top three all-time in nine different categories. She was the first-round draft pick of the WNBA's Washington Mystics in 2006 and has since played overseas for teams in Israel, Turkey and Spain. She was chosen as a member of the ACC Women's Basketball Legends Class of 2012.

The first player in University of Miami program history to be drafted by a WNBA team, Octavia Blue had an illustrious career as a Hurricane. She ended her tenure at UM ranking in the top six of numerous career statistical categories, including fourth in scoring with 1,724 points, a
 number that still ranks eighth all-time.

A native of Deerfield Beach, Fla., Blue matriculated to Miami after a stellar prep career at nearby Nova High School, where she was a two-time team captain. She averaged double figures all four seasons, including posting 28.2 points and 15.0 rebounds per game during a dominant senior season. That year, she received first team all-state and player of the year recognition from both the Miami Herald and the Sun Sentinel. Both papers named Blue, who notched 46 points in one high school game, second team all-state after a junior season in which she logged 26.4 points and 13.0 rebounds per game.

Blue made an impact right away at Miami, leading the Hurricanes in scoring ( 14.5 ppg ), rebounding ( 7.2 rpg ), minutes ( 29.8 mpg ) and blocks ( 20 ) during her freshman campaign in 1994-95. In the first game of her career, Blue notched 24 points and nine rebounds against Fairfield. She followed that with a 28 -point outing versus Florida Atlantic in her second-career contest. Following the season, Blue was selected to the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team.

In 1995-96, as a sophomore, Blue garnered the first of three straight All-BIG EAST honors. Starting all 27 contests, Blue scored in double figures 24 times and led Miami in scoring $(16.0 \mathrm{ppg})$ for the second straight year. She also tallied a team-best five double-doubles and paced UM in field goal percentage (.488). Blue earned the first of four career BIG EAST Player of the Week honors during a season in which Miami tied for first in the BIG EAST 7 Division.

Blue was named a Third Team All-BIG EAST selection for the second season in a row as a junior in 1996-97. The skilled forward posted 13.4 points and 5.6 rebounds per contest and totaled a career-best 37 steals during the campaign.

Saving her best for last, Blue was dominant during her senior season in 1997-98. She became the second player in program history to garner first, second or third team All-America honors, earning WBNS Third Team All-America status. A Second Team All-BIG EAST pick and a Kodak/WBCA Honorable Mention All-American, Blue led Miami in scoring for the third time ( 19.2 ppg ) and helped the Hurricanes to their fourth NCAA Tournament appearance. Her 40 points and 16 made field goals against Florida Atlantic were then the third-highest single-game marks by a UM player and it still stands tied for fourth. After attempting just three 3-pointers in her first three seasons, Blue posted the best single-season mark in program history (.453) in her last year.

Blue started 107 of 112 games during her career and three of contests she did not start were games she missed with an ankle injury as a freshman. Entering 2017-18, she has still has six career records in the top 10 on Miami's all-time list. In 2008, Blue was both inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame and tabbed as an ACC Women's Basketball Legend.

As one of the most electric scorers ever to step on the court and play at the University of Miami, Maria Rivera left her mark as a four-year standout with the Hurricanes. During her playing career from 1984-88, Rivera reached a level never before achieved at Miami and departed as the Hurricanes' record holder in several categories, including career points with 2,358.

Rivera came to Miami by way of Canovana, Puerto Rico, where, at just the age of 14 , she was named the 1978 Player of the Year by the Puerto
 Rican Olympic Committee before going on to star on the Puerto Rican 1979 and 1983 Pan American Teams.

From day one she showed an unprecedented desire to achieve at UM. Speaking only Spanish, Rivera borrowed $\$ 2,000$ dollars from a bank to enroll in an intense fast-paced English program to pass an English equivalency exam required to enroll at Miami, and just three months later she was on campus and playing for the Hurricanes.

Rivera averaged 18.7 points and 5.3 assists, leading the Hurricanes in scoring in 13-of-28 games in 1984-85, her first season at Miami. That season she showed what lay ahead on several occasions, including a school-record-setting performance against Lamar during which she hit 10-of-11 shots from the field and a 33-point outing against Florida. Following the conclusion of the regular season, she was named to the Women's Basketball Yearbook Freshman All-America Team.

The following season she stepped up her game, averaging 21.4 points, 4.4 rebounds and 3.3 assists. Her 21.4 points per game was the second-highest single-season average in UM history and her 579 points was the third-highest ever at Miami.

Rivera's junior season was highlighted by yet another impressive scoring output, averaging 20.9 points, which ranked third all-time at UM just behind her previous season's mark. That year was full of memorable achievements, including a then-career-high 38-point game in UM's opener against Monmouth, but none were more exciting than when she surpassed former Hurricane Sylvia Wilson to become Miami's all-time leading scorer.

In her senior campaign at Miami, Rivera turned in another memorable season. Needing 29 points to break former men's basketball legend Rick Barry's UM basketball record of 2,298 points, Rivera scored 30 points in the first half of a Feb. 25 contest with UCF en route to a then-school-record 41 points to become Miami's all-time leading scorer in both men's and women's basketball.

Upon finishing her career with the Hurricanes, Rivera left as the school record-holder in 16 separate categoriesincluding points (2,358), scoring average (21.1 ppg), steals (382) and field goals made (891) and attempted (1,931) to firmly ensure her place as one of the greatest basketball players to ever play at Miami.

Frances Savage is one of the best players to ever don a uniform at the University of Miami. During her four-year career from 1988-91 Savage
 etched her name throughout the UM record books. She left as the school's second all-time leading scorer with 2,184 points and still ranks first all-time with a career 23.2 scoring average-despite missing all but two games of the 1990-91 season.

The 12th child of a household of 13 children, the Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native averaged greater than 30 points per game during her senior season at Sunrise Piper High School and was named the Miami Herald's Broward Player of the Year in 1985 and 1987.

After drawing All-America honors as a high school standout, Savage chose to attend the University of Miami, but was forced to sit out her freshman season in 1987 while fulfilling academic requirements. Once her opportunity arose in 1988 , Savage burst onto the scene, scoring 32 points in her collegiate debut versus Southwest Missouri State-the most points scored by a Miami player in her opening game. She would go on to start and score double figures in all 29 games of the 1988 season, averaging 22.4 points and 9.2 rebounds per game.

As a preseason All-America candidate, Savage's junior season picked up where the 1988 season left off, scoring double figures in all 31 games that season while leading the team in scoring ( 23.6 ppg ), rebounding ( 9.5 rpg ), steals (71), free throw percentage (.786) and field goal percentage (.540). In 1990, Savage opened her senior season with back-to-back 30-point outings, but was lost for the year with a torn ACL suffered in just the second game of the season.

Granted a fifth year of eligibility, in 1991, Savage returned to score 31 points in her first start against in-state rival Florida. She tied the then-school record with 41 points in Miami's win over Providence during the course of the Hurricanes' 30 -game win streak.

Averaging 23.3 points and 10.6 rebounds per game, Savage helped lead the Hurricanes to the BIG EAST Championship title in only their first season in the conference and was named both the BIG EAST and Sports IIlustrated Player of the Year, in addition to garnering Kodak/WBCA All-America honors.

At the end of her illustrious career, Savage ranked No. 10 in Division I history in scoring average (minimum 1,500 points) and her 23.2 mark stands at No. 20 all-time entering 2016-17.

Savage left Miami as one of the most decorated athletes in school history, holding nine Hurricane records, as well as finishing as the school's second all-time leading scorer. She has since been inducted into the UM Sports Hall of Fame and to UM's Iron Arrow Society-the highest honor bestowed on an individual by the university. Savage was Miami's inaugural ACC Women's Basketball Legend, earning the distinction in 2005.
