### Canes Going Back to Golden Coast...

This weekend, the University of Miami travels to Malibu, Calif. for its first-ever trip to Pepperdine University to take part in the Pepperdine/Asics Classic.

With four California natives on the roster, not including head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch, the Hurricanes should have a nice home crowd on hand.

The Canes' last trip to California was a successful one as they won the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco on Sept. 12-13, 2008. En route to the title, Miami defeated Villanova, Sacramento State and host San Francisco.

That same year, UM opened the year with a 13-0 record.

### What's at Stake This Weekend...

The Hurricanes are facing three quality opponents this weekend and look to gain national respect against teams like Georgia and Pepperdine on the road. The Pepperdine Waves received votes in both the AVCA and Volleyball Magazine/Asics polls.

### Scouting Pepperdine...

The host Pepperdine Waves enter the weekend with an even 1-1 record and are receiving votes in the AVCA Top 25 Coaches Poll.

The Waves were predicted to win the West Coast Conference, while returning all seven starters from a season ago and 12 letterwinners altogether.

The Waves are led by Kim Hill with 30 kills (4.29 k/s) and Lilla Frederick is second on the team with 20 kills (2.86 k/s). Four Waves performers average above 2.0 digs per set, led by Frederick with 28 (4.00 d/s). Libero Mic Christiaansen is second on the team in digs with 26 (3.71 d/s).

### Pepperdine Asics Classic...

Since 2006, host Pepperdine University holds a record of 11-4 at the Pepperdine Asics Classic.

### Series Against the Waves...

This will be the first-ever meeting between Miami and Pepperdine.

### Scouting Georgia...

The Bulldogs enter this weekend with a 2-1 record after defeating Liberty and Florida A&M, before falling to Kansas at the Bulldog

Invitational. Sophomore outside hitter Kathleen Luft currently leads Georgia with 3.33 kills/set and 2.00 digs/set. In the back court, Allison Summers has opened the year with a 4.44 digs/set average.

### Series Against the Bulldogs...

Miami leads the all-time series against Georgia, 3-2. UM has won the last two meetings, including a 3-1 decision over the Bulldogs in the last meeting back on August 30, 2002.

### Scouting UC Santa Barbara...

The Gauchos opened the season at the BYU Invitational last weekend, and edged Saint Mary's, 3-2, before losing to BYU and Illinois, 3-1. Chelsey Lowe had a stellar weekend defensively, and currently leads her team and the Big West Conference with 5.69 digs/set. Stacey Schmidt and Leah Sully are UCSB's top offensive threats, as the duo collectively averages more than 6.60 kills/set.

### Series Against the Gauchos...

This will be the first-ever meeting between Miami and Pepperdine.

### Canes Take Tiger Classic Title...

UMiami took down LSU in the title match of the Tiger Classic last weekend inside the Maravich Center in Baton Rouge, La.

For the Canes, it marked the fourth consecutive year they have won a regular season tournament on the road.

### Miami Picking Up Votes...

The Hurricanes continued to earn votes in the latest AVCA Coaches Poll Top 25 this week. The Canes would technically be ranked No. 30 this week and trail LSU by 17 votes despite beating the Tigers head-to-head last weekend in Baton Rouge, La.

### A.J. Is MVP...

After recording a career-best 17 kills against Louisiana-Lafayette, sophomore right side hitter Alex Johnson went on to earn MVP honors of the Tiger Classic as UMiami defeated LSU in the title match.

On the week, Johnson amassed a team-high 39 kills (3.55 k/s) and a team second-best 43 digs (3.91 d/s). She was also second on the team in blocks (11).

# Nicole Lantagne Welch

**Head Coach**  
**11th Year at Miami**  
**Maryland, 1994**  
**Record at Miami: 195-109**

Nicole Lantagne Welch is in her 11th season as head coach of the University of Miami volleyball program. Under her guidance since 2001, the team has posted winning records in eight of the last 10 seasons,

including ending the 2010 campaign ranked No. 26 in the RPI polls and No. 28 in the Pabo rankings.

Last season, Lantagne Welch helped guide the Canes to their second 20-win season in the last three years, and the second consecutive year in which UMiami advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Miami ended the season with a 23-9 overall mark (13-7 Atlantic Coast Conference) and finished third in the conference regular season standings. Along the way, the Hurricanes defeated NCAA Tournament participants Florida State, Middle Tennessee State, Georgia Southern, Wichita State and North Carolina.

At the end of the year, Lantagne Welch saw her first-ever AVCA All-American honored in the form of Lane Carico, collecting third team accolades following a record-breaking year. Carico became the first player in school history with 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career, as well as leading the ACC in double-doubles – and later being the only player in the league to amass at least 400 kills and 400 digs on the campaign.

Carico and teammate Katie Gallagher each claimed AVCA All-East Region Team honors, while freshman libero Ryan Shaffer set a new school record for digs by a freshman (539 / 4.53 per set). As for Carico, she would also earn her



third consecutive All-ACC Team nod and All-East Region honor.

In 2009, Lantagne Welch helped the Hurricanes to their second NCAA Tournament appearance, competing in the Gainesville [Fla.] Regional. UM earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament after holding the 33rd toughest schedule in the nation according to the end-of-year RPI rankings. Earlier in the season, Lantagne Welch guided the Hurricanes to the Hampton Inn & Suites Northern Colorado Classic championship.

She would add to her growing list of All-Atlantic Coast Conference student-athletes, as well as All-America honorable mention performers, seeing senior libero Cassie Loessberg and sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico named to both lists. Carico and Loessberg each collected AVCA All-America Honorable Mention selections, while both were tabbed to the AVCA All-East Region Team.

During the 2008 campaign, Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to a tie for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) standings, and the team's best regular season record since 2002. During the year, Lantagne Welch collected her 150th career victory when the Canes defeated NC State, 3-0, on November 21, 2008. It was just two seasons ago that she posted her 100th career victory in the 2006 season-opener for UM with a 3-2 win over Alabama.

The 2008 season was special for UM as the team posted a record of 26-6 overall (14-6 ACC), finishing just one match shy of tying for an ACC Championship. Not to be overlooked was Lantagne Welch leading the Canes to three in-season tournament titles, including a tournament title at NCAA Tournament participant University of San Francisco as part of the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco, Calif.

For those achievements and more, Lantagne Welch was tabbed ACC Coach of the Year, as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) East Region Coach of the Year. It was her first ACC coaching honor, while being the second AVCA Regional honor, collecting the award in 2002 during Miami's historic run to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.

Under her guidance, Lantagne Welch would later see freshman Lane Carico named ACC Freshman of the Year, as well as AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico would go on to be named to the All-ACC Second Team, as well as teammates Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. Carico would represent the first-ever ACC Freshman of the Year coached by Lantagne Welch, while Ellis and Mayhew would become the seventh and eighth players in school history to be named to the All-ACC Volleyball Team.

Overall, her career at UM is highlighted in part by four seasons with at least 20 wins (2003-04, '08, '10) and a trip to the "Sweet 16" in the Hurricanes' first-ever appearance at the NCAA Tournament in 2002. In her 10 years at the helm in Coral Gables, Lantagne Welch has averaged 19.2 wins per seasons with a career record of 192-109.

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Lantagne Welch grew up in a family where volleyball had been a

major part of their livelihood. Her parents, Joe and JoAnn, owned and operated a highly regarded volleyball scouting service that evaluated high school players, covering the regions of California, Nevada and Arizona. Lantagne Welch's sister, Jenelle Duvall, was an All-American at the University of Pittsburgh and served as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona and Northern Illinois. She also served as head coach at Metro State College of Denver.

Lantagne Welch played at the University of Maryland from 1990-1993. In her role as a four-year starting setter, she guided the Terrapins to their first-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship (ACC) title and an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament in 1990. As a top collegiate setter, Lantagne Welch garnered First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1992 and '93, and earned Second Team All-ACC accolades in 1991. She would also be named AVCA National Player of the Week (Oct. 12, 1993) following an upset victory over Florida State.

Serving as a team captain through her final two seasons, Lantagne Welch finished her outstanding collegiate career as Maryland's all-time assists, digs and matches played leader. Throughout her career in College Park, Lantagne Welch accumulated various academic honors including ACC Honor Roll and district academic All-America as a senior. She graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Marketing. For her accomplishments as a student-athlete, Lantagne Welch was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary Volleyball Team along with five other Terrapins from teams of the 1990s.

Lantagne Welch began her coaching career in 1994 as an assistant coach on the Maryland staff before becoming a graduate assistant coach at Ohio University in 1995. At Ohio, she developed training sessions for setters and assisted in the scouting of opponents and in the development of game plans.

Lantagne Welch arrived at Miami after serving as an assistant coach at Texas A&M. During her three seasons there, the Aggies finished ranked in the top 20 and qualified for the NCAA Tournament each season (1997-99). In 1999, Texas A&M advanced to the elite eight of the NCAA Tournament, compiling a 28-6 record and a No. 9 final ranking.

In 2002, she married Wesley Paul Welch of Denver City, Texas, in her hometown of Encinitas, Calif. On Dec. 7, 2004, the couple celebrated the birth of their daughter, Riley Jaye and on April 8, 2007, son Ayden Fletcher was born. Lantagne Welch and her family reside in Coral Gables.

## Hurricanes VB Media Policy

### KNIGHT SPORTS COMPLEX

Press row for University of Miami volleyball matches is located on the north side of the court at the James L. Knight Sports Complex, in-between the team benches. The media entrance to the arena is from the southwest corner of the Complex, and the southwest entrance is also used for Will Call pick-up of credentials. Parking is located in either the lot for Alex Rodriguez Park, or Cobb Stadium directly adjacent to the Knight Sports Complex.

### MEDIA & PHOTO PASSES

Credentials for Hurricanes home matches are issued for working media only and must be requested through the sports media relations office at least 24 hours prior to the selected home event you wish to attend. Credentials are issued on a match-by-match basis and a formal request must be issued to the Miami Sports Media Relations Office. Only photographers on assignment from an accredited media agency will be issued credentials. Photographers are required to abide by the guidelines set forth by the NCAA on shooting limitations from the sidelines. Those not complying with the guidelines may be removed.

### MEDIA SERVICES

Pregame media supplements including notes, statistics, media guides and gameday programs will be available prior to the start of the first set. Between-set and final statistics, plus a running play-by-play and post match notes will be provided. Final statistics will be emailed and/or faxed via Miami's broadcast system following the conclusion of the match. In-game questions or concerns can be addressed on press row by Assistant Sports Media Relations Director Bryan J. Harvey.

### WEBSITES

As a general rule, fan-based web sites containing at least one or more of the following: chat rooms, message boards, recruiting information, scouting reports and links to news sites, as well as other fan-based features shall not be issued credentials to Miami volleyball matches. Local and national organizations that maintain a news-based web site in connection with their regular newspaper or magazine, as well as radio or television broadcast, shall be issued credentials on a match-by-match basis. Live, real-time updates will not be permitted. Fan-based web sites wishing to discuss coverage and credential options should contact the Office of Sports Media Relations at (305) 284-3244.

### INTERVIEWS

Following home games, Miami head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch will return to the court to handle any media questions, and players will also be available after a brief cooling-off period following the match's conclusion. Miami's locker will be closed at all times.

### TELEPHONES

Telephone lines at the Knight Sports Complex are limited to home radio and the visiting teams' "official" sports administrator/media relations contact. All media wishing to file stories should contact Bryan J. Harvey prior to the conclusion of the match in order to make arrangements to be escorted back to the Office of Sports Media Relations in order to work in a work-friendly environment. Any and all questions will be addressed in this designated area.

### What a Difference a Year Makes...

Carico has been named to the All-ACC Team the last two years and the All-ACC Freshman Team in 2008.

### Veteran Squad Back for NCAA Run...

Returning to the starting line-up for the Canes is 2010 AVCA All-America selection Lane Carico (Manhattan Beach, Calif.), who was also named Tuesday to the Preseason All-ACC Team. Carico, an outside hitter, enters the year needing just 139 more kills to break Karla Johnson's school record of 1,484 set from 2002-05.

Also back in the starting six is redshirt senior setter Katie Gallagher (Winter Park, Fla.). Gallagher looks to become the school's all-time leader in assists after being named an AVCA All-America Honorable Mention performer a season ago. Gallagher is also a member of the 2011 Preseason All-ACC Team.

More offense is expected to be supplied by redshirt senior outside hitter Christine Williamson (Tampa, Fla.). Hindered by injury for most of her career, Williamson enjoyed a breakout season in 2010, amassing a personal-best and team second-best 338 kills and hitting at a .266 clip.

Defensively, the Hurricanes return sophomore libero Ryan Shaffer (San Jose, Calif.) who set the UM record for digs by a freshman last year with a team-best 539. Joining her is senior middle blocker Ali Becker (Katy, Texas), who led the Canes in blocks last year with 96 (88 assisted). Becker ranks 10th all-time at UM for career blocks with 217.

17 kills and tournament MVP Alex Johnson added 14 of her own to lead the University of Miami to the Tiger Classic title by defeating LSU, 3-2.

The Hurricanes won the championship match on scores of 27-25, 13-25, 16-25, 25-22, 15-8.

Tampa native and redshirt senior Williamson claimed a season-high kills total and grabbed 11 digs for her first career double-double. She also collected two assisted blocks in the win. Overall, the Hurricanes had three players tally double-double performances on the evening.

Miami (3-0) hit just .146 in the match, and the Tigers weren't much better at .184. However, the Canes took advantage of timely mistakes by LSU (3-1) and capitalized when necessary. UM held the edge in blocking, while LSU was also hurt in committing 10 service errors.

Alex Johnson, a right side sophomore from Tallahassee, continued her strong play on the weekend with 14 kills, two assists, two service aces and 17 digs. Johnson, who had just three double-doubles all of last season, collected two on Saturday in matches against LSU and Louisiana-Lafayette.

After UM won the opening set, 27-25, LSU picked up the tempo behind their strong middles and outside hitters, namely Michele Williams and Helen Boyle. Williams amassed a team-high eight blocks (seven assisted), while Boyle put down 16 kills.

The Hurricanes weathered the storm and home crowd of the Tigers to collect the all-important win in the fourth set behind timely kills from Williamson and blocks from Johnson and redshirt freshman middle blocker Emani Sims. Sims finished the night with a match-high nine blocks (six assisted).

In the fifth set, the Canes surged out to a quick lead and the Tigers were unable to recover.

LSU was led by Boyle's 16-kill night, as well as collecting a team-high 20 digs for a double-double effort. Behind her was all-tournament team member Desiree Elliott with 15 kills, while tournament Defensive MVP Meghan Mannari collected a match-high 36 digs.

In addition to double-doubles by Johnson and Williamson, senior All-America outside hitter Lane Carico finished with double-digit kills (11) to go along with 17 digs.

Sophomore libero Ryan Shaffer (team-high 30 digs) and redshirt senior setter Katie Gallagher (40 assists, six digs and three block assists) were also named to the all-tournament team.

**Up Next...**

The Hurricanes host their first home matches of the 2011 campaign after they return from California. Miami welcomes Florida A&M, Auburn and Oklahoma to the Hurricane Invitational at the James L. Knight Sports Complex. The event takes place Thurs., Sept. 8 and runs through Sept. 10.
