#### **NEWS & NOTES**

#### **TOP-FIVE FINISH**

Miami was picked fourth by league coaches (fifth by the Blue Ribbon Panel), sitting only behind Louisville, NC State and Florida State. The Canes went 2-2 against the top three teams in the ACC in 2018-19. This marks the fourth straight year that Miami has been selected in the top five.

#### **HOME SWEET HOME**

The Hurricanes have always succeeded when playing in front of the home crowd. Miami is just 10 wins away from the 500-home win mark, sitting at 490-185 (.715) all-time at home. Under Katie Meier, the Canes have historically dominated teams in Coral Gables, boasting a .732 win percentage (183-67). Over the past five years, Miami has lost just 16 games when playing at home.

The 2019-20 roster has an international flavor to it with the addition of freshman Kenza Salgues and Moulayna Johnson Sidi Baba. Salgues is the first Frenchwoman to play under Katie Meier while Sidi Baba is the second Swedish player to sign with Miami during Meier's tenure. By adding Salgues to the team, players from 10 different countries have played at Miami since Meier took over in 2005.

#### **PRESEASON HONORS**

Beatrice Mompremier has already picked up some preseason accolades, not only earning ACC Preseason Player but she was also tabbed an Associated Press All-American. As a team, Miami was picked 18th in espnW's Preseason Top-25.

#### YOUNG BLOOD

The Hurricanes are prepared to put five freshmen on the court on Sunday depending on the ebb and flow of the game. Should all five freshmen play, it would be the first time since 2009 that five freshmen Hurricanes played in a game. The last occurrence came on Dec. 31, 2009 when then-freshmen Lee Anna Osei, Hannah Shaw, Morgan Stroman, Shanel Williams and Stefanie Yderstrom took the court in an 80-36 defeat of UNF.

- Miami hosts the Jackson State Tigers in the season opener at the Watsco Center on Sunday, November 10. The game is set to tip off at 3 p.m. and will air on ACC Network Extra with Joe Zagacki and Megan Perry on the broadcast call. Fans can also listen to the game on WVUM 90.5 FM.
- The Hurricanes and the Tigers have met twice before in program history, splitting the series 1-1. The last contest between the two teams came on December 1, 2006, when Miami defeated Jackson State 77-50 in Coral Gables, Fla. The Tigers emerged victorious in the only other meeting in 1981, besting the Hurricanes 71-45.

#### last time out

- The Hurricanes had their final preseason tune-up on Tuesday when they took on Nova Southeastern in an exhibition game. Miami came out firing in the first guarter, pouring in 28 points in the first 10 minutes, before cruising to a 90-46 victory over the Sharks.
- The win was a team effort as all 12 Canes scored in the game. As a team, Miami shot a resounding 54.3 percent (38-of-70) from the field and outrebounded Nova Southeastern, 55-25. The Hurricanes were dominant on the offensive glass, hauling in 22 offensive boards and putting up 25 second-chance points.
- · Four Hurricanes recorded double-digit outings, led by redshirt senior Beatrice Mompremier, who poured in 16 points. Mompremier added 11 rebounds to her stat line, posting a double-double in just 15 minutes of action. Fellow forward Brianna Jackson also shined in her collegiate debut, totaling 11 points and 11 rebounds for a double-double of her own.

#### scouting the tigers

- The Tigers enter Sunday's contest looking to rebound after a loss in their season opener. Jackson State came up short, 82-46, at Tulane on Tuesday. Senior Marneisha Hamer paced the Tigers in scoring pouring in 17 points in the game to go along with five rebounds and two steals.
- Jackson State is coming off an 18-14 record in 2018-19 with a 12-4 mark in SWAC action. The Tigers return two of their three leading scorers in Hamer (16.2 ppg) and Kaisah Lucky (8.4 ppg) with Hamer returning as the leading rebounder as well.

#### #QueenBea

- · Beatrice Mompremier returns for her redshirt senior season in 2019-20. Ahead of the season, Mompremier was named not only the 2019 ACC Preseason Player of the Year, but also an Associated Press All-American. She is just the second Hurricane in program history to earn both honors, following in the footsteps of Miami great Shenise Johnson, who received the honor as a senior in 2011-12.

#### ciao dall'italia

- The Canes spent 10 days abroad this summer, visiting cities all across Italy. Miami played a trio of games while in Italy, posting a 2-1 record against foreign opponents.
- The Hurricanes began their trip in Rome before venturing north to Florence and then over to Venice. The trip was a mix of basketball and sightseeing as several of the Canes were abroad for the first time in their lives.
- One of the highlights of the trip was the opportunity to play against recent Miami graduates Emese
   Hof and Laura Cornelius, as the duo were playing for the Netherlands national team.

#### canes in openers

- Season Openers: In 47 years of basketball, the Hurricanes are 38-9 overall in season openers. When opening the season at home, Miami boasts a 26-2 record and has won 26 consecutive home season openers. The Hurricanes last loss at home to open the season came in 1975 when they fell to Marymack (MO) 63-53.
- Home Openers: In home openers (both at the start of season and not) the Hurricanes hold a 43-3 record, with the last loss coming in 1990.
- Under Katie Meier: Under current head coach Katie Meier, Miami has thrived in season openers, posting a 13-1 record overall. The only loss occurred on the road at No. 19/19 Kentucky, a 68-62 defeat in Lexington.

#### cane veterans

- The Hurricanes are honoring all veterans, past and current, on Sunday as part of Military Appreciation Day ahead of Veteran's Day on Nov. 11. Two current UM women's basketball staff members are military veterans: Lonnette Hall and Josh Wathen.
- Lonnette Hall: Hall, the current director of basketball operations, served in the U.S. Navy from 1986-88. She spent stints in Florida, Ireland and Virginia among other places.
- Josh Wathen: Wathen, who works as an operations assistant for the Canes, served in the U.S. Army Reserves from 2001-12. Wathen was deployed on three different occasions in his career. During his deployment in Iraq, Wathen was wounded when his humvee was struck by an IED. For his service that day, Wathen was awarded a Purple Heart.

#### fab five

- The Hurricanes welcome five new freshman to the team for the 2019-20 campaign. All five freshman hail from different states/countries, including two international players in Moulayna Johnson Sidi Baba and Kenza Salgues.
- The freshman class is a diverse player group featuring two guards (Salgues, Chang), a guard/forward (Johnson Sidi Baba) and a pair of forwards (Jackson, Roby).
- The talent is evident in the class as Jackson and Roby are both Top-100 recruits according to espnW HoopGurlz, while Johnson Sidi Baba and Salgues are four-star international prospects.

#### acc ranking

- Miami was picked to finish fourth in the ACC this year by the league coaches and fifth by the Blue Ribbon Panel.
- This marks the fourth straight year that the Hurricanes were picked in the top-five by at least one of the two groups. Miami has appeared in the top six on both lists in four of the last five years.

#### **USA** basketball

- USA Basketball was full of the Canes this summer as Beatrice Mompremier represented Miami at the Pan American Games in Lima, Peru. Mompremier was one of 12 players on the U.S. team and the only ACC representative.
- The U.S. took home the silver medal from Lima after posting a 4-1 record during the competition, falling to Brazil in the gold medal game, 79-73. Mompremier started all five games, averaging 12.2 points and 7.6 rebounds across the five outings.
- Mompremier and junior Mykea Gray also had the opportunity to train with USA Basketball during their training camp in Coral Gables ahead of the AmeriCup in Puerto Rico. Training camp attendees included Sue Bird, Diana Taurasi and Tina Charles.

#### meier's miami

- In 14 seasons at Miami, Katie Meier has led the team to a 277-172 mark, including a 205-88 mark since 2010-11. She is one of only two coaches in Hurricane program history with over 250 career wins.
- On June 14, 2019, UM Director of Athletics Blake James announced a one-year contract extension for Katie Meier through the 2024-25 season.

#### where we work

- After 13-plus years as the BankUnited Center, Miami's on-campus arena was renamed the Watsco Center prior to the 2016-17 season.
   Watsco has provided funding to Miami since the 1990s through its "Watsco's Kids" program, giving children in the community free access to performance arts, sports and other events at UM.
- The Miami basketball facility has undergone a multimillion-dollar renovation over the past two-plus years. The project featured upgrades to the locker rooms, student-athlete lounges, office spaces, weight room, practice facility hallways and concourse.
- Also on display are large-scale images of UM's ProCanes, as well as the newest Miami adidas gear. The players' lounge has a gaming center with couches and televisions. The walls of the practice facility show photos of celebrity Canes fans throwing up the U.

Katie Meier completed her 13th season at the helm of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2017-18. A well-known and respected figure in women's basketball with 17 years of head coaching experience, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition.

In 2017-18, Meier guided her team to a ninth consecutive postseason, including a seventh trip to the NCAA Tournament in the last eight years and fourth straight trip to the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever. Miami also reached 20-plus wins for the eighth time in nine years and double-digit ACC victories for the sixth time in eight seasons, both program firsts.

Following the 2016-17 season, Meier was inducted into the University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame, becoming the fourth

basketball coach, male or female, to garner the prestigious honor.

In January 2014, Meier was named a corecipient of the 2013 USA Basketball National Coach of the Year award after leading the USA U19 team to a gold medal and perfect 9-0 record at the 2013 FIBA U19 World Championship.

All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season when she was named the Associated Press National Coach of

the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

That season, Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA tournament for the first time since 2004 and their win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for Miami since 1993. The Canes entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll after a season in which they were the No. 12 seed in the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and, at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Meier continued that success into the 2011-12 season, a year in which the Canes accomplished many firsts for the program.

Miami defeated Maryland - the eventual ACC Tournament champ - twice during the regular season, the first when the Terrapins were ranked fifth in the nation. It was the first time in program history that the Hurricanes had defeated a top-five

team. Later in the year, UM ascended to its highest ranking ever, also at No. 5.

The Hurricanes have proved to be formidable on the court in the BankUnited Center, as the 2011-12 season saw Miami go undefeated at home for the second consecutive season. Their 16-0 mark on the year pushed the Canes record home win streak to 40 straight games. Only Stanford ended the season with a longer active streak.

For her dedication to the University of Miami and the athletic department, Meier was signed to a two-year contract extension, securing the Wheaton, Ill., native through the 2017-18 season. Prior to the 2014-15 season, Meier received another extension, through the 2020-21 campaign, and donated \$75,000 back to the school to go towards women's athletics as well as challenged to community to contribute as well.

Meier earned another well-deserved extension after a 2016-17 season that included the Hurricanes hosting NCAA Tournament play for the first time since 1993. The new deal added three years to her contract, which now runs through the

Five people who have been assistants for Meier during her head coaching career have gone on to earn Division I head coaching positions: Lynn Bria (Stetson), Amanda Butler (Florida and Clemson), Darrick Gibbs (North Florida), Carolyn Kieger (Marquette) and Stephanie McCormick (Western Carolina). Additionally, 22 of Meier's players at Miami have gone on to play

professionally after their college careers.

Through the 2017-18 campaign, Meier has a career record of 321-208, including a 252-163 mark at Miami.

Hired April 19, 2005, Meier was appointed by then-Miami AD Paul Dee in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the

coaching ranks. Following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal was to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

Creating a Winning Program
In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. They fought through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

During the season, Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as No. 25 Mississippi, No. 21 Boston College and No. 25 Virginia Tech, and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under Meier's direction, in 2005leading scorer. James was selected with the eighth overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.


In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games—including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career

victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50.

Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer, upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The All-ACC Second Team selection a set school records in single-game scoring with 42 points at Houston. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more 3-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was named to the All-ACC Defensive Team.

Johnson lived up to the hype, as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time in history.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named first team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history, with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, then-Miami AD Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a

contract extension through 2015.

Miami's success proved to be immediate, as it earned a conference regular season title in 2010and returned to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in seven seasons.

Johnson and Williams turned out to be the All-America candidates that they were expected to become. In fact, Johnson was named to four different All-America squads and became the second player in program history to be named the conference player of the year (Frances Savage - BIG EAST - 1992). Johnson also garnered All-ACC Defensive Team honors for the second straight season and was named to the ACC All-Tournament Team. Williams, along with Johnson, was named First Team All-ACC and was the conference scoring leader, posting 21.7 points per game.

The duo combined for seven ACC Player of the Week accolades on the season as Williams

took home the award on four occasions. No other team in the league was recognized more than

Miami's success continued into the 2011-12 season. The Canes finished second in the conference standings with a record of 14-2 and were 26-6 overall. UM also defeated the eventual

conference tournament champion, Maryland, both times they played in the regular season.

Seniors Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams continued to live up to the hype of being the nation's top backcourt duo as they were second and third in the league in scoring and each were again named First Team All-ACC. The accolade was the third straight honor for Johnson and the second for Williams. Johnson was also named to the All-ACC Defensive Team for the third consecutive season. Johnson earned a place on five different All-America teams, including the WBCA squad for the second straight year. Williams earned AP All-America third team recognition in her final collegiate campaign as well.

Unfortunately, junior forward Morgan Stroman, a former McDonald's All-American who was a Third Team All-ACC pick in 2010-11 after posting a team-best 11 double-doubles, suffered a season-ending injury midway through the conference schedule. However, junior guard Stefanie Yderstrom stepped up and ended the season with more 3-pointers than any other player in the league and was rewarded with a Third Team All-ACC nod.

Miami once again advanced to the NCAA Tournament as a No. 3 seed. The Canes traveled to Spokane, Wash., and defeated the No. 14 seed, Idaho State in the first round, but fell to host Gonzaga in the second.

The Hurricanes went to a school record third straight NCAA Tournament in 2012-13, earning a No. 8 seed. Miami dropped its first round contest to ninth-seeded lowa, the host school, but picked up two top-10 wins during the season. Meier's Hurricanes defeated No. 6/7 Penn State and knocked off No. 5/4 Duke on senior day, marking the first win over a team in the top four of either poll in program history and the school's first win over the Blue Devils, who went 20-1 against ACC opponents that season, including winning the ACC Tournament. Stroman averaged 12.9 points and 8.8 rebounds, while Ydestrom posted 11.7 points per game, and both received First Team All-ACC honors.

After reaching the WNIT in 2014, Meier guided the Hurricanes back to the NCAA Tournament in 2015 and the 11th-seeded Hurricanes defeated No. 6 seed Washington in the first

round, before dropping their second round matchup against third-seeded lowa, the host school. The victory over the Huskies made Meier the first coach in program history to win an NCAA Tournament game in three different years.

Earlier in the 2014-15 season, Meier also led the Hurricanes to the program's first win over a team in the top four of the AP Poll. They defeated No. 4/4 Notre Dame, 78-63, the Fighting Irish's only loss in their first two years in the ACC. Sophomore guard Adrienne Motley went on to be named a consensus First Team All-ACC pick after averaging 16.9 points on 49.2 percent shooting. Meier also earned her 250th career win during the season.

In 2015-16, Meier led Miami to a 24-9 record to tie for the fifth-most wins in a season in program history. The Hurricanes defeated No. 14/10 Florida State, 74-56, to reach the ACC Tournament semifinals for the second time. Miami received a No. 5 seed the NCAA Tournament and made its fifth appearance in the field in the past six years.

The 2015-16 campaign also saw the Hurricanes beat both Duke and North Carolina in the same year for the first time. The victory at North Carolina was good for the 200th of Meier's tenure at Miami. Adrienne Motley was also tabbed as a consensus First Team All-ACC honoree for the second straight year, in addition to garnering WBČA All-America Team Honorable Mention recognition.

In 2016-17, Meier guided the Hurricanes to a second straight 24-9 record. In the quarterfinals of the ACC Tournament, Miami again defeated a Florida State team ranked in the top 10, downing the No. 8/12 Seminoles, 56-54, to earn back-to-back semifinal appearances for the first time. The Hurricanes beat four top-25 teams, defeating three ranked teams – two of which were in the top 10 - away from home for the first time in the ACC era. Miami earned a No. 4 seed in the NCAA Tournament, hosting the first two rounds of play, and reached the second round for the fourth time in seven years.

Adrienne Motley and Jessica Thomas were both Second Team All-ACC picks in 2016-17, with Motley becoming Miami's fifth WNBA Draft pick. In addition, Motley, Thomas and Keyona Hayes formed the second Miami teammate trio to all reach 1,000 points and each signed a WNBA contract, the first time three Hurricanes in the same class did so.

Despite losing so many talented players to graduation and others to injury, Meier led the Hurricanes to a 21-11 finish in 2017-18 and surpassed 250 wins in her tenure with the program. Erykah Davenport, a Second Team All-ACC honoree, and Keyanna Harris became the first Miami seniors to make four straight NCAA Tournaments. Miami had two freshman all-league honorees for the first time since 1992-93 in the BIG EAST, as Mykea Gray and Kelsey Marshall both made the cut. The Hurricanes upended three top-25 foes, including a pair that reached the Sweet 16 in No. 14/15 Duke and No. 23/23 NC State.

#### Establishing Her Legacy as a Player

Meier's success as a coach is a direct reflection of her playing career as a standout at Duke University. A four-year letter winner for the Blue Devils under head coach Debbie Leonard from 1986-90, Meier's name is scattered throughout the Duke record books.

She currently ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in scoring average (16.2 points per game), steals (232), free throws made (447) and free throws attempted (624). She is also listed among Duke's leaders in career points (1,761), field goals made (653), field goals attempted (1,283), assists (409) and rebounding average (6.1 rebounds per

Méier wasted no time making her mark at Duke, earning ACC Rookie of the Year and Basketball Yearbook Freshman All-America honors in 1986. Meier injured her knee in 1988 during her junior season and ultimately missed the entire 1988-89 campaign while recovering

Meier returned to Duke for her senior season in 1990 without missing a beat, earning Kodak/WBCA District 2 All-America and All-ACC first team accolades while being named the Blue Devils' most valuable player.


In 2002, Meier was honored by Duke for her efforts as a player when she was named to the inaugural induction class in the Blue Devils' Hall of Honor. That same year, Meier was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team. In 2006, she was once again honored by the conference when she was named an ACC Legend at the 2006 ACC Women's Basketball Tournament.

Meier's success on the court was only outdone by her accomplishments in the classroom. She was named to the Dean's List from 1986-88. In 1988 she also earned GTE Academic All-America Second Team honors.

After receiving a bachelor's degree in English literature with cum laude honors in 1989, Meier went on to earn a master's degree in teaching English from Duke in 1990.

Following her career at Duke, Meier moved overseas to play three seasons with BBC Mini-Flat Waregem in Belgium from 1990-93. There, she helped lead her team to three First Division regular season titles and one Belgian Cup Championship. While in Belgium, Meier also spent time teaching classes of conversational English while coaching teams of

A native of Wheaton, Ill., Meier graduated from Wheaton Central High School in 1985 and in October 2009 was inducted into her high school's athletic hall of fame.
