## » THE OPENING TIP

- » Winners of six straight games, No. 2 Duke hits the road for three of its next four, beginning Saturday night at Miami.
- » The Blue Devils have won two straight and three of the last four versus the Hurricanes in a series that dates back to the 1962-63 season. Duke leads the series 20-7.
- » Duke capped the decade of the 2010s with 300 wins (tied for third-most in the decade), an .811 winning percentage (third-best) and two national championships (tied for the most).
- » The Blue Devils lead the nation in scoring margin (+20.8), while also leading the ACC in scoring (83.3; 7th NCAA), rebound margin (+10.0; 9th NCAA) and blocks (6.7; 4th NCAA).
- » Duke is the No. 1-ranked team in KenPom (No. 3 in defensive efficiency and No. 8 in offense). In the month of December, Duke allowed just 58.6 points per game (23rd NCAA).
- » Freshman **Vernon Carey Jr.**, who is the No. 1-ranked player in KenPom's Player of the Year ratings, has posted eight double-doubles this season (most among NCAA freshmen) -- all eight have been 15-10 efforts.
- » Carey, who leads the ACC in field goal percentage (.613), is also third in the conference in scoring (17.9), third in rebounding (9.0) and fourth in blocks (2.2).
- » Duke is averaging 33.2 points from the bench over its six-game winning streak. For the season, Duke's bench is averaging 25.8 points -- its highest bench scoring average since 26.9 by the 2007-08 team.
- » Since Thanksgiving, no team in college basketball has averaged more blocked shots than Duke's 7.8 per game.



» Freshman **Matthew Hurt** scored a career-high 25 points in the BC win. He's averaging 14.0 points and shooting .557 from the field over his last seven games.

## » TEAM NOTES

### 115TH SEASON OF BASKETBALL

- » The 2019-20 campaign marks the 115th season of Duke Basketball. The Blue Devils have compiled a 2,188-888 all-time record to rank fourth all-time in victories.
- » Only Kentucky (2,304), Kansas (2,284) and North Carolina (2,269) have more all-time wins than Duke.
- » Duke's all-time .711 winning percentage is also the fourth-best in NCAA history, behind only Kentucky (.764), North Carolina (.738) and Kansas (.726).

### ON THIS DATE

- » Duke is 20-8 when playing on January 4th and has won eight of its last 11 on this date.
- » In ACC games, Duke is 7-4 on this date, including the largest-margin ACC win of the Coach K era -- a 53-point victory over Georgia Tech, 110-57, in the 2016-17 season.

### DUKE VS. MIAMI

- » Duke is 20-7 all-time versus Miami, which includes an 8-5 mark in road games (6-4 at the Watsco Center).
- » The Blue Devils won last year's meeting at Cameron Indoor, 87-57, behind 19 points from both **RJ Barrett** and **Cam Reddish**.
- » In the last trip to Coral Gables, Duke pulled out an 83-75 win on Jan. 15, 2018, rallying from down 13 in the second half as **Gary Trent Jr.** dropped a game-high 30 points on 6-of-9 from three-point range.
- » The teams have split the last 10 games in the series.

### SCOUTING THE HURRICANES

- » Miami is 9-3 overall and 1-1 in ACC play after dropping an 87-74 decision to Louisville in the season opener, but beating Clemson, 73-68, in overtime on New Year's Eve.
- » The Hurricanes are led by **Chris Lykes**, **Kameron McGusty** and **DJ Vasiljevic**, each averaging 15.0+ points -- the only team nationally with three guards averaging 15.0+ points.
- » Lykes and Vasiljevic were held to four points each in last year's game at Cameron Indoor.

### THREE-POINT STREAK

- » Duke has connected on at least one three-pointer in 1,072 straight games, the third-longest streak in the nation.
- » It has been 30 years since Duke was held without a three-point field goal -- Dec. 30, 1989, versus Hawai'i.
- » The Blue Devils' streak was in jeopardy Dec. 28 versus Brown until junior **Alex O'Connell** canned a trey with 6:41 remaining as Duke finished 2-of-16 from three-point range.

### NCAA'S NET NUMBERS

- » Duke sits at No. 7 in the NCAA's latest NET rankings, which were released on Jan. 2.
- » Duke is 4-0 in Quad 1 games -- one of only three teams nationally with four+ Quad 1 wins (Butler and Kansas)
- » Duke, Gonzaga and Butler are the only top-20 NET teams with multiple Quad 1 road wins.

### GETTING DEFENSIVE

- » Duke has held two consecutive opponents to 50 points or less for the first time since the 2010-11 season -- 83-48 vs. Bradley (Dec. 8) and 84-47 vs. Saint Louis (Dec. 11).
- » The Blue Devils are allowing just 60.7 points over their six-game winning streak and the 58.6 points allowed in December were the 23rd-fewest in the nation.
- » Four straight foes have scored less than 70 points and three straight have scored less than 60.
- » Duke is ranked No. 3 in KenPom's defensive efficiency, with top-20 ranks in both defensive steal percentage (12.6; 19th) and blocked shots percentage (15.9; 12th) -- one of only four teams nationally in the top 20 for both.

## BLUE DEVILS' BIG BENCH

- » Duke has been boosted by a deep bench this season, with seven players averaging 5.8+ points per game.
- » Over Duke's six-game winning streak, the bench has averaged 33.2 points, which includes 43 in the Wofford win, 35 in the win at Virginia Tech and 34 versus Brown.
- » For the season, Duke's bench is averaging 25.8 points -- its highest bench scoring average since 2007-08 (26.9) and the fourth-highest in Duke history.

## LAST GAME: DUKE 88, BC 49

- » Freshman **Matthew Hurt** out-scored Boston College, 20-19, in the first half and Duke cruised to an 88-49 win over the Eagles on New Year's Eve as Duke closed the decade with its 300th win in the 10-year span.
- » Hurt finished with a career-high 25 points on 10-of-16 from the field and 5-of-10 from three-point range.
- » All 11 Blue Devils that played in the game scored at least three points and had at least one rebound.
- » Sophomore **Tre Jones** returned from a two-game absence (foot) and racked up 10 assists (one turnover) -- the most assists against an ACC opponent in his career.
- » Duke out-rebounded BC 44-34, blocked seven shots and tallied nine steals in winning its sixth straight game.
- » The 39-point margin of victory marked the largest in the series against BC, and marked Duke's largest in an ACC game since the 2016-17 season (110-57 win over Georgia Tech).

## BLOCK PARTY

- » Duke, which set a single-season school record for blocked shots last year (257), is back to its shot-swatting ways.
- » Since Thanksgiving, no team in college basketball has averaged more blocked shots per game than Duke's 7.8.

## » DUKE IN THE NBA [24]\*



- » A total of 78 former Duke players have appeared on NBA rosters.
- » Overall, 41 Duke players have been selected in the first round of the NBA Draft in the Coach K era, including 23 in the past nine years.
- » There are 24 Duke players on current NBA rosters -- the Blue Devils 25 last year were the most by any ACC school in a single season in the history of the league.
- » Four Duke players have been selected No. 1 in the NBA Draft -- **Art Heyman** (1963), **Elton Brand** (1999), **Kyrie Irving** (2011) and **Zion Williamson** (2019).
- » In 2019, Duke had three players drafted, bringing its total to 64 under **Mike Krzyzewski**.
- » Duke has had 28 players selected in the NBA Draft Lottery, the most in the nation since the system was put into place in 1985.
- » Overall, between Duke and USA Basketball, Coach K has coached 106 NBA players.
- » In 1999, Duke became the first program in the history of the NBA Draft to have four players from the same school selected in the first round. Three of the four -- **Elton Brand** (Chicago), **Trajan Langdon** (Cleveland) and **Corey Maggette** (Seattle) -- were lottery picks.
- » In 2002, **Jason Williams** (2nd overall) and **Mike Dunleavy** (3rd) became the first college teammates in the history of the NBA Draft to be the first two collegians selected.
- » Six former Duke players -- **Jeff Mullins** (Golden State, 1975), **Danny Ferry** (San Antonio, 2003), **Shane Battier** (Miami, 2012 and 2013), **Kyrie Irving** (Cleveland, 2016), **Dahntay Jones** (Cleveland, 2016) and **Quinn Cook** (Golden State, 2017 and 2018) -- have been part of NBA championship teams.
- » Duke players who've played under Coach K have earned approximately \$1.5 billion in NBA contracts. That figure includes roughly \$160 million by active Duke NBA players.

Now in his 40th season at Duke, Mike Krzyzewski - a Naismith Hall of Fame coach, five-time national champion and 12-time Final Four participant - has built a dynasty that few programs in the history of the game can match.

The numbers that illustrate Coach K's career are simply staggering:

- Five national championships (1991, 1992, 2001, 2010, 2015)
- Six gold medals as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team
- Nine National Players of the Year (11 honors)
- Six National Defensive Players of the Year (nine honors)
- 10 consecutive top-10 AP poll finishes (1997-06)
- 12 National Coach of the Year honors (eight seasons)
- 12 Final Four appearances (tied for most in NCAA history)
- 12 ACC regular season championships
- 15 ACC Tournament championships (most in league history)
- 25 NBA Lottery picks (most in Draft history)
- 34 All-America selections (48 honors)
- 35 NCAA Tournament bids (most by one coach)
- 64 NBA Draft selections, including 41 first-round picks
- 65 ACC Tournament wins (most in league history)
- 97 NCAA Tournament wins (most in NCAA history)
- 126 weeks ranked No. 1 in the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 359 weeks ranked in the top 5 of the AP poll (most by a coach in poll history)
- 493 ACC wins (most in league history)

Coach K became the Division I men's career wins leader on Nov. 15, 2011, at Madison Square Garden, moving past his former coach Bob Knight with his 903rd victory. His historic 1,000th career victory came against St. John's at The World's Most Famous Arena on Jan. 25, 2015, as he became the first Division I men's basketball coach to achieve a four-figure win total.

Krzyzewski's 1,071 victories at Duke are an NCAA record by a coach at one school. With 1,071 of the Blue Devils' 2,188 all-time victories, Coach K has presided over nearly half (49 percent) of the men's basketball wins in Duke history.

Krzyzewski has won a league-record 493 ACC games (regular season and tournament), passing former North Carolina head coach Dean Smith (422) on Feb. 4, 2015. He has also won an ACC-record 183 conference road games.

Coach K's five national championships are the second-most in NCAA history. Krzyzewski and former Connecticut coach Jim Calhoun are the only coaches in NCAA history to win national championships in three different decades.

Coach K has led the Blue Devils into the NCAA Tournament 35 times - more than any other coach in NCAA history. He has taken Duke to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 24 seasons -- the longest streak all-time, surpassing Dean Smith (23).

Krzyzewski holds NCAA Tournament records for games coached (126) and wins (97) while ranking second all-time and leading active coaches with a .764 NCAA Tournament winning percentage (min. 20 games). He has reached the Sweet 16 on 25 occasions, six more than any other coach in NCAA history, and has advanced to the Elite Eight 16 times.

Of the 1,357 games Krzyzewski has coached at Duke, 1,212 - 89.2 percent - have been as a ranked team. The Blue Devils are 989-223 (.815) as a ranked team under Coach K.

Coach K has taken top-ranked Duke teams into games on 254 occasions and compiled a 219-35 (.864) record as the AP's No. 1 team, ranking first in poll history in both number of games and wins as coach of a top-ranked squad.

Krzyzewski has tutored 64 NBA Draft picks during his time at Duke, including a total of 41 first-round selections that leads all active coaches. Duke has had at least one player taken in 32 of the 39 NBA Drafts during the Krzyzewski Era.

Since the inception of the NBA Draft Lottery in 1985, Coach K and Duke have produced 28 lottery picks - a draft-record total for both a school and a coach.

Through the 2018-19 season, Coach K's former Duke players have accumulated nearly \$1.5 billion in NBA salaries. Lottery selections who played for Krzyzewski at Duke have combined to earn approximately \$1 billion, an average of nearly \$50 million per individual.

Under Coach K's watch, Duke has produced multiple All-ACC Academic selections in 11 of the last 12 years. The 2015 NCAA championship team featured a program-high five All-ACC Academic honorees. Quin Snyder, Amile Jefferson and Grayson Allen are the only players in Duke history to earn All-ACC Academic honors four times. Jefferson, a three-time captain, departed the university in 2017 with both bachelor's and master's degrees.

Krzyzewski has had six players collect a total of nine CoSIDA Academic All-America honors, headlined by two-time first-team honorees Battier (2000, 2001) and Mason Plumlee (2012, 2013). Allen became the sixth in 2016 when he garnered second-team accolades.

Fittingly, Coach K has earned nearly every award imaginable. The crown jewel of that haul, however, came in 2001 when he was inducted into the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame.

Since his enshrinement in Springfield, Mass., Krzyzewski has also been inducted into the Army Sports Hall of Fame (2009), the Chicagoland Sports Hall of Fame (2010) and the Duke Athletics Hall of Fame (2011).

While establishing Duke as one of college basketball's dynastic programs, Krzyzewski simultaneously spent more than a decade as one of the architects of the revitalization of USA Basketball. During his tenure at the helm of the program, the U.S. National Team amassed an extraordinary 88-1 record and claimed gold medals at the 2007 FIBA Americas Championship, 2008 Beijing Olympics, 2010 FIBA World Championship, 2012 London Olympics, 2014 FIBA World Cup and 2016 Rio Olympics, as well as a bronze medal at the 2006 FIBA World Championship.

Coach K was 24-0 in the Olympics as head coach of the USMNT and his time at the helm ended with the team in the midst of a National Team-record 76-game winning streak that began in 2006.

Sustained success under Coach K has resulted in coaching opportunities for several of his former players, as well as his former assistant coaches from both Duke and Army. More than 25 of Coach K's former players or assistants are currently either coaching or working in front office roles across professional and college basketball.

### The Coaching Tree

Ten of Coach K's former players or staff are currently Division I head coaches: Tommy Amaker (Harvard), Kenny Blakeney (Howard), Mike Brey (Notre Dame), Jeff Capel (Pittsburgh), Chris Collins (Northwestern), Johnny Dawkins (Central Florida), Bobby Hurley (Arizona State), Greg Paulus (Niagara), Mike Schrage (Elon) and Steve Wojciechowski (Marquette).

Quin Snyder is currently the head coach of the NBA's Utah Jazz, headlining a long list of former players, staff and managers that are connected to the NBA (see list on next page). That list also includes Grant Hill as part-owner of the Atlanta Hawks, Elton Brand as general manager of the Philadelphia 76ers, Trajan Langdon as general manager of the New Orleans Pelicans and Shane Battier as vice president of analytics and development for the Miami Heat.

Krzyzewski has shown a firm commitment to taking care of his own, having at least three former Duke captains on his staff every season since 1996-97. The Blue Devils have won three NCAA titles, 12 ACC Tournament championships and eight ACC regular season crowns during that time.

The 2019-20 staff of Nate James, Jon Scheyer, Chris Carrawell and Nolan Smith all held the captain role during their playing careers at Duke.

### Giving Back

Krzyzewski has been diligently committed to public service, both locally and nationally, throughout his coaching career. He is currently serving on boards for, while also assuming vital roles with, the Duke Children's Hospital, the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research, the NABC Foundation, the CEO Roundtable on Cancer and the Emily Krzyzewski Center.

Coach K's philanthropic activities also include the establishment and funding of the Emily Krzyzewski Center, a community center in Durham named in honor of his late mother. The Center's mission is to inspire economically disadvantaged students to dream big, act with character and purpose, strive for academic excellence and reach their highest potential as future citizen leaders.

In May 2018, Coach K and his wife Mickie announced their single-largest philanthropic gift, a \$3 million donation to the Emily K Center to kick start a \$15 million fundraising campaign for the Durham-based Center.

- » Mike Krzyzewski owns a 1,144-345 (.767) record as a head coach, including a 1,071-286 (.788) mark at Duke.
- » Coach K became the first Division I men's coach to record 1,000 career victories with a win over St. John's on Jan. 25, 2015 at Madison Square Garden.
- » He is also the only D-I men's basketball coach officially credited with 1,000 wins at one school, winning his 1,000th over Utah Valley on November 11, 2017 at Cameron Indoor.
- » Krzyzewski has won a record 493 ACC games (regular season and tournament). He has 428 regular-season ACC wins.
- » He owns 1,071 of Duke's 2,188 all-time wins, translating to 48.9 percent of the wins in Duke history.
- » Duke has won 20+ games in 23 straight seasons, making Coach K the second Division I men's coach to do so.

### TOURNAMENT SUCCESS UNDER K

- » Duke has a high level of success in tournaments under Coach K, winning 20 in-season, 15 ACC and five NCAA Tournaments for a total of 40 championships in his tenure.
- » The Blue Devils claimed the 2K Empire Classic this season, the program's 20th in-season crown, and last season won the ACC Tournament for the 15th time.

- » No freshman in ACC history and no player in Duke history recorded a better assist-to-turnover ratio than Jones in 2018-19, leading the conference with a 3.62-to-1 ratio.

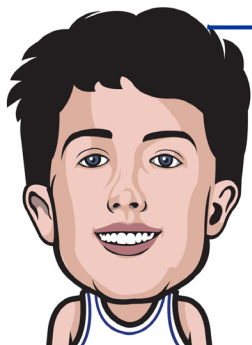
