## STORY LINES

- The Hurricanes open up their 2014 midweek schedule with a Wednesday night matchup against FAU. **Miami won the season series in 2013, capturing two of three midweek matchups**, including a thrilling 5-4 win in extra innings.
- Miami returns its entire starting rotation in 2014, **including its trio of lefthanded weekend arms**: Chris Diaz, Bryan Radziewski and Andrew Suarez. The three combined to **give up just two earned runs on opening weekend**.
- **Miami is ranked in the top 20 in every major college baseball poll.** The Hurricanes check in at No. 11 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* rankings, No. 16 from *Baseball America* and No. 17 in the *USA Today Sports Coaches Poll*.
- In addition to a number of returning starters on the mound and in the field, **Miami welcomes a recruiting class ranked No. 4 by Collegiate Baseball and No. 6 by Baseball America.** Four freshman Hurricanes were selected in the 2014 MLB Draft.
- The Hurricanes **extended their college baseball record with their 41st consecutive postseason appearance** in 2013, earning a spot in the Louisville Regional. Miami finished its postseason run with a 1-2 record at Jim Patterson Stadium.
- Miami's projected starter for Wednesday night, **Javi Salas** (0-0, 0.00 ERA) **was named a team captain** alongside fellow senior **Tyler Palmer** ahead of the 2014 season. He made his season debut in Saturday night's loss, pitching two innings.

**3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH**

**THE HURRICANES SKIPPER**

In his 21st season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 889-347-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,393-615-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,524-655-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

**MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR**

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of his last 20 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class.

**MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH**

Morris enters 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris currently has a 1,393-615-4 (.693) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,524 655-4 (.698) record over 30-plus years.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



**MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE**

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

## OPENING WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

### FAMILIAR FOE...

• The Miami Hurricanes open their challenging 2014 midweek slate with a Wednesday tilt against visiting FAU. **Miami owns a 53-11 all-time advantage** over the Owls, including a **45-9 mark at home**.

• Head coach **Jim Morris** boasts an **all-time mark of 35-7** against the Owls while at Miami. The Hurricanes have a **7-2 mark** against FAU in Boca Raton and a **1-0 record** in neutral site games.

• **Miami captured the season series in 2013 by winning two of three games.** The Hurricanes won a thrilling 5-4 affair in extra innings on the road on Feb. 20, 2013, lost 6-1 at home on March 27, but won the season series rubber match 6-4 on April 24.

### STARTING OUT...

• **Three freshmen were in head coach Jim Morris' Opening Day lineup:** first baseman Zack Collins, designated hitter Willie Abreu and second baseman Johnny Ruiz. Shortstop Laz Rivera and designated hitter Jacob Heyward earned starts in game two against Maine.

• **Three Hurricanes pitchers made their career-first appearances** in the team's series victory over Maine: righthander Bryan Garcia, lefthander Danny Garcia and righthander Cooper Hammond.

• **Four Hurricanes connected on their career-first basehits** in Sunday's finale: Willie Abreu (double), Edgar Michelangeli (double), Laz Rivera (RBI single) and Brad Zunica (single).

• **Miami starting pitchers** combined to allow just **two earned runs over 15 innings** against Maine - one each from Chris Diaz and Andrew Suarez. **Canes starters threw 27 strikeouts** compared to just five walks.

- Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member **Class of 2014** to be inducted into the **College Baseball Hall of Fame**, the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- Fernandez and Fiore join former head coach **Ron Fraser** (Class of 2006), assistant coach/player **Skip Bertman** (2006) and pitcher **Neal Heaton** (2008) as **University of Miami inductees** into the College Baseball Hall of Fame.
- Fernandez was named **Freshman of the Year** and a **first-team All-American in 1989**, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, **Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks**, including hits (341), runs (258), doubles (63), runs batted in (235) and total bases (506).
- The 2014 class will be inducted into the National College Baseball Hall of Fame as part of the annual **Night of Champions event on June 28 in Lubbock, Texas.**

**RADZIEWSKI EARNS PRESEASON ACCLAIM...**

- Redshirt junior LHP **Bryan Radziewski** ended the 2013 season as the **only Hurricane to earn All-ACC recognition** (first team), and was named a **2014 preseason All-American** by a number of publications, including *Collegiate Baseball*, *The Sporting News* and NCBWA.
- In 2013, **Radziewski became the Hurricanes first All-American since 2010** with Louisville Slugger second-team honors from *Collegiate Baseball* and Rawlings third-team honors from ABCA.
- Radziewski finished the 2013 season with a **9-3 record** and **1.78 ERA** across 14 starts. He **struck out a career-high 109 batters in 91.0 innings**, including a 16-strikeout gem against Virginia Tech in his return to the weekend rotation.

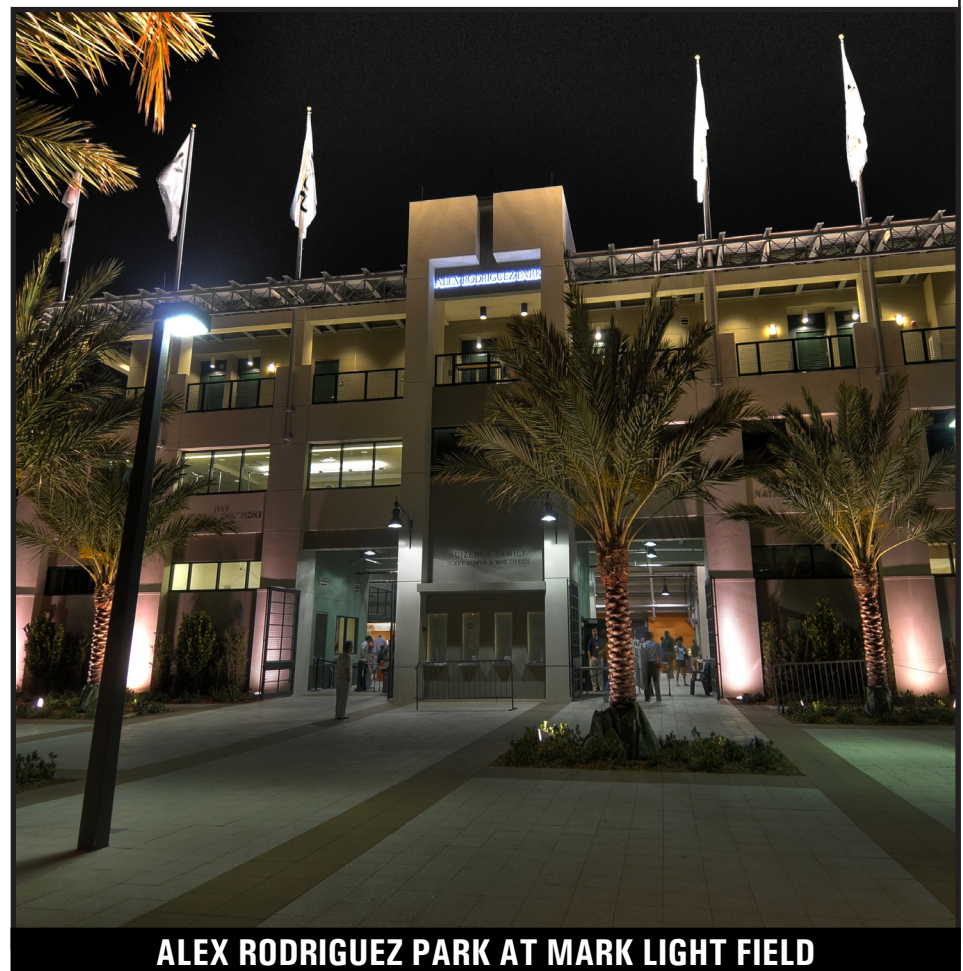
