### **MIDWEEK STORYLINES & NOTABLES**

- No. 12 Miami opens an eight-game homestand to close the regular season Wednesday against Bethune-Cookman.
- Miami is ranked in the top 20 of every college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at #8 in Collegiate Baseball Newspaper, #10 by Perfect Game, #12 in the Coaches' Poll, #13 by D1Baseball, #13 by NCBWA & #17 by Baseball America.
- The Hurricanes have a four-game lead in the ACC's Coastal Division with a 19-8 ACC record; Miami is 34-13 overall.
- Miami opened the week with the second-best team batting average (.304) and fourth-best staff ERA (3.27) in the ACC.
- The Hurricanes' "Magic Number" to clinch the ACC's Coastal Division for the second year in a row is 1.
- Based on the latest rankings from WarrenNolan.com, Miami has the #2 strength of schedule nationwide and #3 RPI.
- Jim Morris became just the eighth coach in Division I baseball history to accumulate 1,400 wins last year. With a 9-5 win over Louisville in March 2015, Morris moved into seventh in all-time wins (1,445) for a coach at a four-year college.
- Sophomore Willie Abreu carries a team-best 13-game hitting streak into Wednesday's game vs. the Wildcats.
- Junior lefthander Thomas Woodrey has tossed at least 6.0 innings in all 11 of his outings this year his first as a starter.
- Junior David Thompson was named to the Golden Spikes Award Midseason Watch List (top amateur player) in mid-April.
- Sophomore closer Bryan Garcia ranks fifth in UM history with 24 saves; nine saves in 2015 are third-most in the ACC.
- Miami captured the 2014 ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship, finishing atop the ACC with a 24-6 record. Miami's streak of 42 consecutive NCAA postseason appearances is the longest active streak in Division I athletics.



Entering his 22nd season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 42 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 21 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 965-377-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,469-644-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,600-684-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

### **MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR**

Jim Morris earned his 30th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2014 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host spots in the tournament. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 21 seasons (1994-2014), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (1994-2006) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2014 Hurricanes to their 42nd-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top-fve recruiting class by national publica tions, with Zack Collins named *Baseball America* National Freshman of the Year under his direction in 2014.

### MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2015 as the fourth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 victory on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including time at



DeKalb College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001.

### **MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE**

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

Coach Morris and his wife Nhan live in Miami with their threeyear old son, James W. Morris IV (Will).

### HOMESTANDING HURRICANES

- No. 12 Miami closes out its regular season with eight straight home games before traveling to Durham, N.C. for the 2015 ACC **Baseball Championship** at Durham Bulls Athletic Park. The homestand begins Wednesday against Bethune-Cookman at 7 p.m.
- Miami leads the all-time series by a commanding 29-5 margin, and topped the Wildcats 13-3 in the only other head-to-head matchup of 2015 on April 1. Bethune-Cookman is 16-37 and 14-10 in MEAC play.
- Miami is 8-2 in midweek games this season, and has a 23-4 mark in games played at Mark Light Field.

### **SAVING THE BEST FOR LAST**

- Senior **Garrett Kennedy** has been one of Miami's top contributors in his final season, hitting for a .344 average in 39 starts - the second-best average among all regular starters.
- Kennedy, who batted just .231 in his junior season, is hitting .400 over the past five games and hitting .360 in conference play.
- Kennedy has already set career high in hits (52), runs (33), doubles (seven), triples (one), home runs (five) & RBI (31). His on base percentage (.441) is third-best among regulars, while his +7 strikeout-to-walk ratio is the best among all offensive players.
- Through Miami's first 48 games of the 2014 season, Kennedy was hitting just .202 with two home runs and 14 RBI.

### **HEATING UP**

- Over the past 10 games, sophomore Willie Abreu is hitting .441 with 15 hits (15-for-34) and 10 RBI. He has 24 total bases over the stretch with a team-best **OPS** (on-base plus slugging) of **1.218**.
- Over the past 15 games, junior infielder **George Iskenderian** is hitting .410 (25-for-61) with team-high totals of 25 hits, 11 walks and nine runs scored. His OBP during that stretch is a team-best .507.
  - Junior David Thompson is slugging .610 in ACC play.
- Senior righthander Daniel Briggi has allowed runs in just two of his 16 appearances, and has not allowed a run in his last eight appearances (10.1 innings).
- Junior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** has tossed **at least 6.0** innings in all 11 of his starts - he has allowed two earned runs or fewer in seven of his 11 starts on the mound.

### STRIKE EARLY, STRIKE OFTEN

- 141 of Miami's 343 runs scored this season (41.1%) have come in the first three innings of the game - Miami is 25-4 when scoring first in 2015. The Hurricanes have a 9-9 record in games when their opponent scores first.
- The Hurricanes have jumped over pitching at home this season, outscoring opponents 87-38 in the first three innings of games played at Mark Light Field.
- When scoring in the **first inning**, Miami has a **16-2 record**. When its opponent scores in the first inning, Miami is 6-6.
- Miami's .304 team batting average to open the week was the second-best mark in the ACC. The Hurricanes' .405 on-base percentage on Wednesday was the ninth-best mark nationwide.

### **MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES**

### **MILESTONES FOR MORRIS**

- After leading his team to a 44-19 record in 2014, head coach Jim Morris moved into ninth place all-time in college baseball history (regardless of Division, four-year colleges) with 1,435 wins.
- Morris wasted little time in moving up that list in 2015, taking over **sole possession of eighth place** when Miami topped Rutgers 25-4 on Feb. 15, 2015 - his 1,439th win as head coach. He moved into seventh place (1,445) when Miami beat Louisville on March 7.
- Morris ranks as the fourth-winningest among active Division I coaches by career victories (1,469) and fifth in winning percentage (.694). He is also the second-winningest coach in ACC history.
- Morris became just the eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball to accumulate 1,400 wins when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8, 2014.

### **POWER SURGE**

- After connecting for **four homers** in its series against Pittsburgh, Miami now has 38 home runs in 2015. The Hurricanes had just 25 homers in all of 2014.
- The Hurricane bats combined to hit just .261 through the first 47 games of the 2014 season, but are hitting over 50 points higher (.304) for the second-best team average in the ACC this spring.
- Only four players had more than home run at this point in 2014, and the team had just 19 total. Seven players have multiple home runs this spring, with UM home runs up 100% (from 19 to 38).
- Miami's offense is averaging 7.3 runs per game (compared to 5.65 at this point in 2014), and its slugging is up nearly 80 points to .444 (from .365 in 2014).

### SHUT THEM DOWN

- Miami's bullpen has recorded a 2.27 ERA in 181.2 combined innings this season, and has been a key reason for UM's success.
- Among the Hurricanes' top arms out of the bullpen: sophomore All-American closer Bryan Garcia (2.96 ERA, nine saves), freshman lefthander Michael Mediavilla (1.75 ERA, 25 appearances, 35 Ks), senior walk-on Daniel Briggi (1.40 ERA, 21 Ks) and righthanded sidewinder Cooper Hammond (2.20 ERA, 26 appearances).
- Garcia is in sole possession of fifth place in program history with 24 career saves: his nine this season are the third-most in the ACC.
- Miami's staff ERA to open the week (3.27) was the fourth-best mark in the ACC.

### THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

- Miami is off to a 23-4 start at home a 85.1 winning percentage.
- UM finished the 2014 season with a 11-4 home record in ACC play, and a 23-10 overall home record. UM's streak of nine straight home series wins was snapped against Florida State (April 24-26).
  - Miami is batting .318 at home with a .427 on-base percentage.
- Senior Garrett Kennedy is batting .393 in 27 games at home, with 33 hits, six doubles and 21 RBI. Junior George Iskenderian is batting .400 at home with 26 RBI and 33 runs scored.
- Miami's staff ERA is nearly 1.4 runs better at home (2.70) than on the road (4.09), while its batting average is over 30 points higher (.284).

### **MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES**

### **POSTSEASON RESUME**

- After capturing the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship, the Hurricanes entered 2015 ranked in the top 15 of every major college baseball preseason poll. They've lived up to expectations.
- Miami has faced the second-toughest schedule nationwide according to WarrenNolan.com, while its Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) is ranked No. 3 - both important postseason seeding factors.
- Miami has seven wins against RPI top 50 teams and has a 21-13 record against the RPI top 100. The Hurricanes need either one more ACC win or one more ACC loss by North Carolina to clinch the Coastal Division for the second straight year.
- Miami's recruiting class was ranked No. 2 nationwide by Perfect Game, and included MLB Draft picks: George Iskenderian (34th round), OF Carl Chester (38th) and LHP Michael Mediavilla (40th).

### PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF

- Then-freshman Bryan Garcia was named the team's closer just prior to the 2014 season opener and rewarded the coaching staff with an All-American campaign (NCBWA, third team).
- Garcia has **nine saves in 22 appearances**. He has 25 strikeouts on the year, and now has 24 career saves - fifth-most in UM history. His 22 appearances are the third-most among all relievers.
- An All-ACC Second Team selection as a reliever, Garcia set the Miami freshman saves record and tied for 11th-most saves nationally with 15 in 2014. He was a consensus Freshman All American first-team selection at reliever.

### **#CARDIACCANES**

- Miami has played 17 games decided by two runs or less in 2015, and is 11-6 in those contests. The opening stretch continues a trend for the Hurricanes, who were 16-3 in one-run games in 2014.
- George Iskenderian walked it off for UM vs. FAU (April 8) in extra innings, connecting on a winning single in the bottom of the 10th.
- Bryan Garcia earned back-to-back saves in wins over Duke (4-3, 3-2) to help clinch two one-run wins in a sweep for Miami.
- Miami won two one-run games against UNC, both by a final score of 4-3, and both required late comebacks for the Hurricanes. David Thompson's solo homer vs. NC State in the 10th inning (March 13) gave Miami its third walk-off win of the season.
- Miami picked up its first two walk-off wins of the 2015 season against Wright State, thanks Garrett Kennedy (HR) & Willie Abreu (1B).

### DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with their 42nd consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason in 2014. Miami has not missed the postseason since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 42 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in 30 straight years - all 21 years at Miami and his final nine years at Georgia Tech. Miami has not missed the postseason since 1972.
- Miami is the only school in the state of Florida to have won a national championship: UM won titles in 1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001.
