STORY LINES

- Two of the most storied programs in college baseball renew their historic rivalry this weekend, as homestanding Miami welcomes No. 8 Florida State for a three-game series at The Light. First pitch for Friday's series opener is set for 7:30 p.m.
- Miami will be looking to win their second consecutive home ACC series after taking two of three against No. 22 Virginia Tech from March 22-24. The Canes boast a 16-6 record (.728 winning percentage) through their first 22 home contests of 2013.
- While Miami has just a 5-7 ACC record, the team's southpaw rotation of **Chris Diaz**, **Bryan Radziewski** and **Andrew Suarez** each rank in the top 20 in earned run average in conference play, highlighted by Radziewski at No. 2 (1.20 ERA).
- Miami's most recent Rating Percentage Index (RPI) rank was No. 19 by both *Boyd's World* and *WarrenNolan.com*. In addition, *Warren Nolan* ranks the Hurricanes' schedule as the second-toughest in the country.
- Among last season's top performers against FSU: **Dale Carey** (six hits, .500 AVG) and **Michael Broad** (grand slam, four RBI's).
- **Jim Morris** and **Mike Martin** rank among the winningest coaches in college baseball history. The counterparts have combined for over 3,000 wins in 66 combined years as Division I head coaches, and each rank among the top five in active total wins.

3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 870-333-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,374-600-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,505-641-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,1374-600-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,505-641-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

RIVALRY RENEWED...

• Two of the most storied programs in college baseball renew their historic rivalry this weekend, as homestanding Miami welcomes No. 8 Florida State for a three-game series at The Light. First pitch for Friday's series opener is set for 7:30 p.m.

• The Seminoles have had the edge over Miami of late, sweeping the 2012 regular season series in Tallahassee and capturing seven of the last ten games overall. The all-time series in Coral Gables is tied at 62-62-2.

• Head coaches Jim Morris and Mike Martin have combined for over 2,500 wins at their respective institutions, and both rank in the top five among winningest active college baseball coaches.

BUILDING MOMENTUM...

• In the latest Ratings Percentage Index rankings from *Boyd's World* and *WarrenNolan.com*, Miami is ranked No. 19 in RPI.

Additionally, *Warren Nolan* has Miami with the second-toughest schedule in the nation.

• The Hurricanes have a 5-6 record against teams ranked in *Baseball America's* most recent Top 25 poll, including wins over No. 1 UNC, No. 5 Virginia and a series victory over No. 22 Virginia Tech.

• Miami's weekend set with No. 8 Florida State will mark the team's fourth straight series against a ranked foe.

STARTING OFF STRONG...

• Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering a team-best five quality starts in seven chances this season. The Florida City, Fla., native ranks 10th in the ACC with an ERA of 2.38, and went a career-long eight innings in his most recent win over Virginia Tech (March 22).

• Junior Bryan Radziewski boasts a team-best ERA of 0.98, having surrendered just three earned runs all season. He has also recorded an eye-popping 41:5 strikeout-to-walk ratio through five starts.

• Diaz (3.76, No. 20), Radziewski (1.20, No. 2) and sophomore Andrew Suarez (2.22, No. 14) all rank in the top 20 in ERA among ACC starters in conference competition this season.

CLOSING IT OUT...

• Senior Eric Nedeljkovic has been Miami's most reliable reliever out of the bullpen, and has not allowed a run in 16.2 innings of work this season.

• The Folsom, Calif., native, who ranks second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with six saves, has allowed only nine hits in 15 appearances, and has a dominant 18:2 strikeout-to-walk ratio.

LAST YEAR'S SERIES...

• Miami starter Eric Erickson matched a career-high with six earned runs allowed in the opener, as FSU struck for five late runs in an 11-2 win at Dick Howser Stadium.

• In a game two marred by a 97-minute rain delay, a four-run second inning would help the Seminoles earn a 6-1 decision.

• Michael Broad connected on his fourth career grand slam for Miami in a seven-run fourth inning in the series finale, but an RBI single in the bottom of the tenth inning earned FSU the series sweep.

GETTING DEFENSIVE...

- When healthy, Miami's infield defense has been one of the brightest spots on the season.
- Miami's 2013 infield features four newcomers: freshman first base platoon David Thompson & Christopher Barr, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior third baseman Brad Fieger completes the infield lineup.
- The play of the Hurricanes infield has been the catalyst for a majority of the team's 28 double plays - the third-most of any team in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff have received 13 quality starts from their starters this season - including three consecutive in its series victory over No. 22 Virginia Tech.
- Sophomore LHP Chris Diaz set a new personal record by going eight innings against the Hokies, allowing two earned runs.
- Junior LHP Bryan Radziewski allowed four runs but only two earned in his six-inning stint in Charlottesville against No. 5 Virginia.
- Sophomore Andrew Suarez delivered three straight quality starts against Duke (March 10), UNC (March 17) and Va Tech (March 24), and ranks 15th in the ACC with a 2.92 ERA.
- Freshman LHP Thomas Woodrey went eight innings against Maine in a midweek start (March 5), tied for the second-longest any pitcher has gone this season.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...

- A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications.
- Despite starting just 15 of the team's 32 games, 1B/OF Christopher Barr is reaching base at a team-best .466 clip. He ranks second on the team with 16 walks.
- RHP Frank Grandinette ranks third on the team in appearances (14), just one shy of teammates AJ Salcines and Eric Nedeljkovic.
- Junior Alex Hernandez has started all 32 games this season for Miami, and recently moved from second to shortstop due to an injury to teammate Brandon Lopez.
- Freshman 1B David Thompson leads the team in RBI's (21).

SCOUTING THE SEMINOLES...

- After a 25-4 start to its season, Florida State finds itself in the top 10 of nearly every major collegiate baseball poll.
- The Seminoles are currently placed atop the Atlantic Division of the ACC with an 8-4 record in conference play.
- Offensively, Florida State ranks sixth in the ACC with a .285 team average. On the hill, FSU boasts a team ERA of just 2.62 - the third-best mark in the ACC.
- RHP Luke Weaver will be making his 2013 weekend debut, and is projected to start Friday's series opener. The Seminoles are without 2012 Freshman All-America Mike Compton, who will miss the season due to Tommy John surgery.
- Among the team's top hitters: Joze Brizuela (.343 average, 24 RBI's) and Stephen McGee (.326, four homeruns, 29 RBI's).
- On the hill, the Seminoles have been powered by starters Scott Sitz (0.69 ERA) and Weaver (1.09), as well as closer Robby Coles (1.04 ERA, 24 strikeouts, seven saves).

The Hurricanes have dedicated the 2013 season in memory of former head coach Ron Fraser, who passed away before the season after a battle with Alzheimer's Disease.

Miami has taken special steps to remember "The Wizard of College Baseball," who helped guide the Hurricanes to over 1,200 wins and two national championships in his storied 30-year tenure as head coach.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb. 23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion," a trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

A commemorative home plate painted on the field with the number 1, Fraser's retired jersey number, will remain all season.

Alex Rodriguez Park took form in a three-phase process:

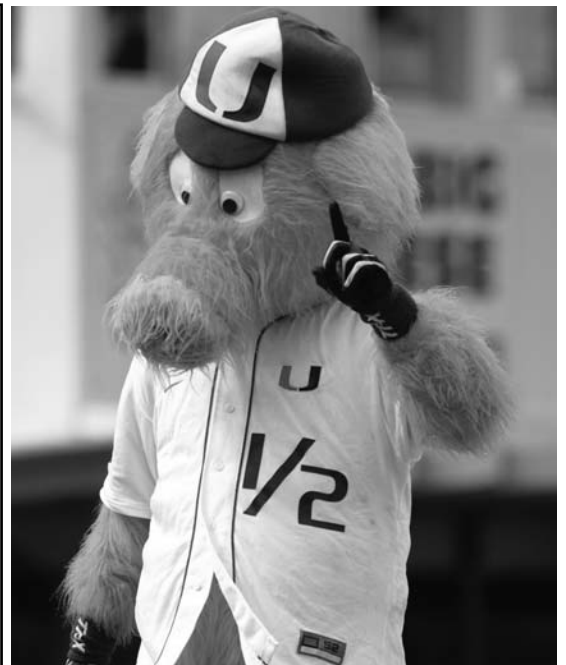
- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.

CANES DROP SERIES OPENER TO SEMINOLES

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. - Opening up one of the most anticipated series of the college baseball season, the No. 12 Miami Hurricanes dropped game one of their weekend set with the No. 2 Florida State Seminoles by a final score of 11-2.

On a perfect night for baseball at Dick Howser Stadium, veteran Eric Erickson entered the opener looking to extend his dominance over the team's in-state rival. Unfortunately for the Hurricanes (26-12, 12-7 ACC), the southpaw lasted only five innings against the Seminoles, matching a career-high with six earned runs allowed, as Miami fell to 7-6 on the road.

Shortstop Justin Gonzalez powered Florida State on Friday night, connecting for two homeruns and three RBI in a dominant showing from the team's offense. The Seminoles combined for 13 hits off Hurricanes pitchers, plating runs in five different innings.

It was the Canes who nearly opened the scoring with a bases-loaded opportunity in the top of the first, but came up empty as Seminoles' starter Brandon Leibrandt (4-1) got out of a tough jam.

After recording the first two outs of the inning, the freshman lefthander allowed his first of two walks in the inning to Chantz Mack. Brad Fieger then reached on a catcher's interference, while Stephen Perez helped load the bases on Leibrandt's second walk. But Rony Rodriguez, making his first start since April 7 after suffering a hand injury, flew out to deep right-center to end the threat.

The Seminoles (31-7, 17-2 ACC) struck for the game's first run in the bottom of the inning, as Sherman Johnson led off the game with his first of three doubles on the day. Back-to-back singles from Devon Travis and James Ramsey would load the base with no outs, but Erickson buckled down in his opening frame to hold the Seminoles to only one run. The veteran southpaw induced a foul-out from Jayce Boyd, a fielder's choice RBI from Stephen McGee and a strikeout of Jose Brizuela to get out of the inning with minimal damage and keep his team with in striking distance.

The Hurricanes would tie the game up at one run apiece in the third inning, keyed by a lead-off double from Tyler Palmer. In true "small-ball" fashion, sophomore centerfielder Dale Carey advanced Palmer to third with a perfect sacrifice bunt before Mack drove him in on a sacrifice fly to right field.

But after tying the game in the top half of the third, a defensive miscue from Mack would help the Seminoles regain the lead in the bottom of the frame. With Sherman Johnson on third after another lead-off double, Travis connected on a single to left that was bobbled by Mack, plating Johnson for the Noles' second run of the night.

Florida State would not relinquish the lead the rest of the way, as they tacked on four runs in the next two innings, including three in a crucial fifth inning, putting the Hurricanes away for good. Gonzalez delivered the knockout blow in a five-run seventh with his second homerun of the game, this one a two-run shot off reliever Alex San Juan, extending the Noles lead to 9-1.

HURRICANES TRIPPED UP BY FLORIDA STATE 6-1

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. -- The No. 12 Miami Hurricanes continued their series with the homestanding No. 2 Florida State Seminoles on Saturday, dropping their second straight contest with their in-state rivals by a final score of 6-1.

In a game marred by a 97-minute rain delay, defensive miscues and a lack of timely hits plagued the Hurricanes (26-13, 12-8 ACC) at Dick Howser Stadium. The team committed four errors leading to three unearned runs, all of which were charged to junior righthander Eric Whaley (3-3). The Pompano Beach, Fla. native issued a career-high six walks, lasting only four innings in his shortest stint of the season.

The Seminoles (32-7, 18-2 ACC) used a big four-run inning to build a lead they wouldn't relinquish, helped by two errors from the Hurricanes and a balk from Whaley. After Stephen McGee opened the second frame with a single, Jose Brizuela connected on a grounder to first base that looked like a potential double play ball. But Esteban Tresgallo's throw to Stephen Perez pulled the junior infielder off the bag, leaving both runners safe on the play. Both McGee and Brizuela would advance on the balk call, after which Whaley walked Justin Gonzalez to load the bases.

John Holland came up with an RBI single up the middle that would plate two, while a throwing error charged to centerfielder Dale Carey on the play advanced the remaining baserunners to second and third. The damage was not yet over, however, as back-to-back sacrifice flies from Seth Miller and leadoff hitter Sherman Johnson gave the Seminoles an early 4-0 advantage.

Similar to his fellow freshman Brandon Leibrandt on Friday night, Mike Compton (7-0) delivered an impressive pitching performance to keep the Seminoles in cruise control. Though he lasted just five innings, Compton allowed only five hits and struck out three batters.

The Hurricanes loaded the bases in the sixth inning with no outs but were only able to score one run. After singles from Garrett Kennedy and Tyler Palmer, Stephen Perez made his way to first on a rare fielder's choice, no-out play. But Luke Weaver, who entered the game in place of Compton in a volatile situation, held the Hurricanes to only one run. After Chantz Mack hit a sacrifice fly to plate Kennedy, Weaver got Rony Rodriguez looking before inducing an inning-ending popout from Brad Fieger.

Chris Diaz, who entered the game in the fifth inning for Whaley, pitched well for Head Coach Jim Morris out of the bullpen. The freshman lefthander pitched 3.1 innings, allowing only two hits while striking out two batters. He was charged for a run that came nearly two hours after the batter originally reached base, as the rain delay took place with two outs in the eighth. The Seminoles plated two more runs after the 97-minute delay, clinching the series with a 6-1 win.

LATE RALLY CUT SHORT AS HURRICANES FALL 7-4

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. --The No. 12 Miami Hurricanes closed out their series with in-state rival No. 2 Florida State in disappointing fashion on Sunday, dropping the finale 8-7 in extra innings.

Powered by a seven-run inning where the Hurricanes sent 13 batters to the plate, Miami surged to its first lead of the weekend at a time when the team needed it most. Junior infielder Michael Broad connected on his fourth career grand slam off reliever Hunter Scantling in the offensive outburst, guiding the Hurricanes to an eventual 7-4 lead.

Unfortunately for the Hurricanes (26-14, 12-9 ACC), the Seminoles would strike for four runs in the last five innings, including a walk-off single by Sherman Johnson with one out in the ninth off closer E.J. Encinosa (2-3) that clinched the win and the series sweep for Florida State.

Despite collecting only three runs combined through the first two games of the series, the Canes shook off an early 4-0 deficit with a collection of big hits and an effective stretch from junior southpaw Steven Ewing.

After Stephen Perez singled his way on base with a perfect bunt to begin the fourth inning, Seminoles starter Scott Sitz issued a walk to Chantz Mack and back-to-back RBI singles to Rony Rodriguez and Dale Carey before being pulled by Head Coach Mike Martin. Hunter Scantling entered the game in relief and promptly issued another walk, this one to Brad Fieger, before Michael Broad stepped to the plate with the bases loaded.

The Fort Lauderdale, Fla. native, who hit a grand slam earlier this season in a win over Florida Atlantic, belted his second homerun of the year over the left field wall for the Hurricanes' first lead of the weekend at 6-4. Two more walks and an RBI double from Tyler Palmer would extend the lead to 7-4 by the end of a productive fourth frame.

Despite the offensive barrage, it looked like history would be repeating itself when the Seminoles (33-7, 19-2 ACC) plated four runs to open the game. But Ewing would settle down after his rough first frame, retiring 12 of the next 13 batters over the next four innings. He would exit the game after 6.1 innings of work with the game tied 7-7, finishing with seven strikeouts on 114 pitches.

AJ Salcines pitched effectively in relief, allowing only one hit and one walk through 2.2 innings. But the Seminoles struck for two hits off Encinosa, who entered the game in the tenth looking to extend an already lengthy game even deeper into extra innings. After Gio Alfonzo connected for his first career hit and later stole second base, Johnson plated Alfonzo for the gamewinner with a single through the right side.
