## STORY LINES

- After its fourth road game in the first six weeks of the season, Miami will open a season-long three-game homestand Saturday when it faces North Carolina at Sun Life Stadium at 2:32 p.m. ET.
- Saturday will mark the 15th series meeting, with both schools having won seven games. The Hurricanes have won the previous two meetings, including a 30-24 win at Chapel Hill in 2011.
- Miami, tied atop the ACC Coastal Division standings, is the only ACC team with three conference wins thus far. The Canes are looking for their first 4-0 start in ACC play.
- Senior CB **Brandon McGee** recorded a career-best nine tackles against Notre Dame. Eight of the tackles were solo and one was for a four yard loss.
- With 168.3 all-purpose yards per game, RB **Duke Johnson** ranks 14th nationally among FBS players (first in the ACC) and leads all freshmen in that category.
- Nine different Miami players had a reception in Miami's loss to Notre Dame, including four catches each by senior WR **Davon Johnson** and sophomore WR **Rashawn Scott**.
- In each of Miami's four wins, Miami made up a deficit of at least seven points to come back and win.
- The Canes became the first team since Stanford in 2011 to score in the first quarter against the Notre Dame defense after **Jake Wieclaw** hit a 28-yard FG on UM's second drive of the night.
- Four different Hurricanes have receptions of 50 yards or more on the season. WR **Rashawn Scott** (76 yards, 52), WR **Phillip Dorsett** (65, 62), TE **Clive Walford** (56) and RB **Duke Johnson** (50) each have 50-yard receptions.
- The Hurricanes are the only team in the nation to have two RBs that have scored at least four touchdowns in a game this season. **Duke Johnson** scored four times against Bethune-Cookman on Sept. 15 and **Mike James** scored four at Georgia Tech a week later.

- Saturday's contest between Miami and North Carolina will be televised nationally at 2:32 p.m. EDT on ESPNU. **Anish Schroff** (play-by-play), **Dan Hawkins** (analyst) will call the action.

### ACC TELECONFERENCE

Miami head coach **AI Golden** and the league's other 11 coaches will be featured on a weekly teleconference each Wednesday during the 2012 football season from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., beginning Aug. 29, and concluding Nov. 21.

Each coach will have 10 minutes to make an opening statement and answer questions. There will be an audiofile available of each teleconference on the Conference's official website (theACC.com) each Wednesday afternoon as well as a written transcript of the call.

Golden's schedule time is 12:20 p.m. to 12:30 p.m. ET each Wednesday. Media representatives wishing to participate in the teleconference should contact the ACC Communications Office.

## QUICK HITS

- Notable Miami ACC statistical rankings: 2nd in kickoff coverage (42.1), 3rd in passing offense (307.2), 3rd in sacks against (1.17), 3rd in turnover margin (0.50), 4th in kickoff returns (24.7), 4th in 3rd down conversions (45.1), 5th in total offense (441.3), 6th in scoring offense (30.2), 6th in first downs (20.7).
- Notable Miami NCAA statistical rankings: 18th in passing offense, 26th in sacks allowed, 29th in kickoff returns, 33rd in turnover margin, 40th in total offense.
- **Duke Johnson** ACC statistical rankings: 1st in all-purpose yards (168.3), 3rd in kick return average (27.9), 14th in scoring TD among non-kickers (7.0), 5th in rushing (63.5).
- **Duke Johnson** NCAA rankings: 14th amongst all-purpose runners, 20th in kickoff returns.
- Junior QB **Stephen Morris** ranks first among ACC quarterbacks in passing yards per game (306.0) and is second in total offense (313.5).
- **Stephen Morris** NCAA rankings: 18th in total offense.
- **Phillip Dorsett** NCAA rankings: 45th in receiving yards per game (78.3).
- Through six games, 18 freshmen have seen action for the Miami Hurricanes, including 15 true freshmen.
- Six freshmen have started at least one game for the Miami Hurricanes — true freshman RT **Ereck Flowers**, true freshman RB **Duke Johnson**, true freshman WR **Malcolm Lewis**, true freshman S **Deon Bush**, redshirt freshman LB **Eddie Johnson** redshirt freshman DL **Corey King**.
- In the first 18 games of the **AI Golden** era, Miami has used 16 different defensive starting lineups.

## NORTH CAROLINA SERIES HISTORY

- Miami is 7-7 all-time against North Carolina, but has won the last two meetings with the Tar Heels.
- The series opened in 1946, with UNC beating the Canes 21-0 in the Orange Bowl.
- The Canes are 6-3 against North Carolina at home and has won six of the last seven meetings on their home field, including a 33-10 win at Sun Life Stadium in 2010.
- Miami defeated the Tar Heels in Chapel Hill for the first time in five chances last season.

## A WIN BY MIAMI WOULD...

- Give the Hurricanes their 4-0 start in conference play since joining the ACC in 2004.
- Surpass Miami's ACC win total from 2011.
- Give the Hurricanes their third consecutive win over UNC and an 8-7 all-time series edge between the teams.

## THE GREAT WALL OF CORAL GABLES

- Miami's offensive line has allowed just one sack — Sept. 29 against NC State — in the last four games, while helping pave way for offense to average 353.5 yards through the air and 492.8 yards of total offense.
- In Miami's first two games, the Canes O-Line surrendered six sacks, while the offense managed 338.5 yards of total offense.

## TWO-MINUTE OFFENSE

- 12 of Miami's 27 scoring drives this season have needed less than two minutes, including five that have needed less than 60 seconds.
- At Boston College, Miami had three scoring drives that lasted under two minutes, including a pair of drives that resulted in a **Duke Johnson** TD run of more than 50 yards.
- Six of the 12 scoring drives have occurred in the last two ACC games. In Miami's 44-37 home win over NC State, the Hurricanes had four scoring drives that needed less than 100 seconds — a 14-yard TD pass (0:42), a 24-yard TD pass (1:36), a 76-yard TD pass (1:12) and the game-winning 62-yard TD pass (0:29).

## THE #DUUKE OF MIAMI

- In the first quarter against Bethune-Cookman, Johnson returned a kickoff 95 yards for Miami's first score of the game. The return tied **Tremain Mack** (at Syracuse, 1996) for the eighth-longest kickoff return in Hurricanes history. It was Miami's third kickoff returned for a touchdown since 2005.
- Johnson ranks 14th nationally with 168.33 all-purpose yards per game. That total is 13.5 yards per contest more than Maryland's Stefan Diggs, who ranks second in the ACC.
- Against Boston College in the season-opener, Johnson became the first UM freshman RB to rush for 100 or more yards in first college game since **Clinton Portis** in 1999.

## SIX WEEKS, SEVEN ACC PLAYER HONORS

- Through the season's first six weeks, the Miami Hurricanes have collected seven ACC Player of the Week honors, including a season-high three honorees Oct. 1.
- Freshman RB **Duke Johnson** and redshirt freshman LB **Eddie Johnson** have tallied two honors each, three of which were ACC Rookie of the Week honors. Junior QB **Stephen Morris** (Offensive Back), sophomore LB **Gionni Paul** (Linebacker) and sophomore WR **Phillip Dorsett** (Receiver) each have one ACC weekly honor.

## DORSETT ADDED TO BILETNIKOFF WATCH LIST

- Sophomore WR **Phillip Dorsett** was one of 11 receivers added to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.
- Dorsett was one of 11 watch list additions released Tuesday. The others included Davante Adams (Fresno State), Brandin Cooks (Oregon State), Mike Edwards (UTEP), Quintin Payton (NC State), Chip Reeves (Troy), Alonzo Russell (Toledo), Dawan Scott (Miami, Ohio), Tommy Shuler (Marshall), Willie Snead (Ball State) and Marquelo Suel (Akron).
- Junior WR **Allen Hurns** was on the Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List released in July.
- The Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation, Inc. will announce the 10 Biletnikoff Award semifinalists on Nov. 12, 2012, following the vote by the Biletnikoff Award National Selection Committee. Likewise, the three finalists will be declared, following another vote, on November 19, 2012.

## #CANESNOTES

- In the first 18 games of the **@GoldenAI** era, Miami has used 15 different defensive starting lineups.
- **Duke Johnson** one of 9 players with more than 1,000 all-purpose yards this season – tops among ACC players and FBS freshmen.
- Miami's O-Line allowed 6 sacks in first 2 games. Men in the trenches have given up only 1 sack in last 4 games. #GreatWallOfCoralGables
- Miami is first **@125NDFB** opponent since **@StanfordFBall** in 2011 (first in 2012) to score against the Irish in first quarter.
- The Hurricanes have posted their first 3-0 ACC start since 2004 – their first season in the conference.
- Miami is one of only eight FBS schools with at least three conference wins.
- Miami has now won 100 straight games when scoring at least 40 points. Last loss: Hail Flutie game, 1984.
- **Stephen Morris** set Miami and **@theACC** single-game record with 566 passing yards vs **@PackFootball**.
- #Canes recorded 23 points in first quarter against **@PackFootball**, most since Miami scored 27 points in 1Q at **@OwlSports.com** on Oct. 15, 2005.
- Miami's 651 yards against **@PackFootball** are third-most in UM history, trailing 689 vs. **@UCLAFootball** in 1998 and 655 vs. **@BCSportsNews** in 1984.
- 12 of Miami's 26 scoring drives this season have needed less than two minutes. #TwoMinuteDrill
- Miami has trailed at some point in each of its first six games.
- In each of Miami's four wins, the Canes made up a deficit of at least seven points to come back and win. #ComebackCanes
- In Miami's three **@theACC** wins, #Canes have scored 41 (**@BCSportsNews**), 42 (**@GT Athletics**) and 44 (**@PackFootball**). Have won by combined 22-point margin.

**WHAT WE'VE LEARNED FROM @BYTIMREYNOLDS (POST-NOTRE DAME)**

- There is one team at 3-0 in the ACC. It is the Miami Hurricanes.
- Since 1944, three Miami teams have lost twice by at least 38 points in same season: 1977, 2007 and 2012. (And they have best record in ACC)
- The seven sacks allowed by Miami through six games is the fewest given up in the first half of a Hurricanes season since 2003 (three).
- All or nothing: When it wins, Miami averages 41.3 points. When it loses, Miami averages 8.0 points.
- Even after a season-low 201 yards Saturday against @125NDFB in Chicago, junior QB **Stephen Morris** is fifth nationally in passing yards (1,836).
- Freshman RB **Duke Johnson** is 14th nationally in all-purpose yards per game (168.3), and tops in that category among freshmen.
- Combined records of the teams that have beaten Miami: 10-0. Combined records of teams Miami has beaten: 11-11.
- Only five teams in the nation have faced more ranked opponents so far this season than Miami. (4 – @AZAthletics, @UKAthleticsNews; 3 – @MSU\_Football, @CalAthletics, @UW\_Football).
- Only one team – @ULMWarhawks – has played fewer home games this season than Miami.
- Miami has won its last two meetings with next week's opponent, @TarHeelFootball. Combined score of those games: 63-34.
- Miami enters its upcoming three-game homestand as one of 49 teams in the country still perfect at home this season (2-0).
- Miami's defense is on the field an average of 35:07 per game, fifth-most in the nation.
- Miami has given up more total first downs (158) and more rushing first downs (82) than any team in the nation this season.

**#ROOKIECANES**

- In Miami's sixth game of the season, 15 freshmen (12 true freshmen) played vs. Notre Dame.
- Redshirt freshman LB **Eddie Johnson** made his fifth start while true freshman S **Deon Bush** made his third. Redshirt freshman DL **Corey King** made his career-first start.
- True freshmen DL **Dequan Ivery** and LB **Raphael Kirby** made their collegiate debuts.
- In his third start, **Deon Bush** tallied four tackles and forced two fumbles. He is tied with fellow freshman teammate **Eddie Johnson** with three forced fumbles on the season - the most in the ACC.

**MIAMI'S THUNDER AND LIGHTNING**

- Senior RB **Mike James** and freshman RB **Duke Johnson** have combined for 687 of Miami's 806 rushing yards on 126 carries through six games. The lightning-quick Johnson, who has already collected two ACC Rookie of the Week honors this season, has amassed 382 yards and five rushing TDs on 60 carries, while the bruising James has 306 yards and three touchdowns on 66 carries.
- The duo has combined for 160-plus rushing yards in three of Miami's first six games. In the Hurricanes' 41-32 season-opening win at Boston College, Johnson rushed for 135 yards, while James added 54 yards. Two weeks later, the pair amassed 171 yards – Johnson 94 yards and James 77 yards (both season highs).
- Johnson (7) and James (4) have combined for 11 of Miami's 22 total touchdowns this season.

**CAREER DAYS ON DEFENSE**

- Senior CB **Brandon McGee** recorded a career-best nine tackles against Notre Dame. Eight of the tackles were solo and one was for a four yard loss.
- In his collegiate debut, LB **Raphael Kirby** recorded five tackles (1 solo, 4 assist).
- Freshman S **Deon Bush** forced a career-best two fumbles. He now has three on season, tied with teammate **Eddie Johnson** for the conference lead.
- DL **Corey King** recorded three tackles in his first career start.
- In his collegiate debut, DL **Dequan Ivery** was in on two tackles.

**PLENTY OF OPTIONS**

- Miami has 14 different players that have at least one reception in the first six games of the season.
- **Allen Hurns, Rashawn Scott, Phillip Dorsett, Clive Walford, Malcolm Lewis, Duke Johnson, Devon Johnson, Mike James, Asante Cleveland, Kendal Thompkins, Eduardo Clements, Dyron Dye, Maurice Hagens and Herb Waters** each have at least one grab through two games.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**

- More than half of the Miami Hurricanes' 2012 roster are freshmen and sophomores. All-told, Miami's roster includes 42 freshmen – 34 true freshmen and eight redshirt freshmen – and 22 sophomores (11 redshirt sophomores).

## JAMES SELECTED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- Senior RB **Mike James** is one of 22 student-athletes selected to the 2012 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, announced by Allstate Insurance Company and the American Football Coaches Association.
- James is the sixth Miami Hurricane to be named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, joining Robert Bass (1993), Tony Coley (1996), Ryan Clement (1997), Nate Books (1998) and Joaquin Gonzalez (2001).
- During his career at the University of Miami, James has contributed countless hours to supporting community service organizations in the Miami community, including volunteering for Empowered Youth, an organization providing mentoring to at-risk youth, serving as a project manager for the 2012 University of Miami Bone Marrow Drive and serving meals to the homeless with the Miami Rescue Mission. James has also been involved with The Ronald McDonald House, Rushing the Community and Canes on Patrol.

## 'MAD STORK' ON ACC LEGENDS CLASS OF 2012 ROSTER

- Former Hurricanes DE and Pro Football Hall of Fame DE **Ted Hendricks** is a member of the Atlantic Coast Conference's Class of 2012 Dr Pepper ACC Football Championship Game Legends.
- Hendricks, known as the "Mad Stork" for his tall (6-7), angular build and his dominating defensive play, started three seasons at defensive end for the Miami Hurricanes under coach Charlie Tate. A three-time All-America for the Hurricanes, he earned consensus, first-team All-America honors in 1967 and 1968, and led Miami to a 20-11-1 record. He ended his collegiate career as Miami's all-time leading tackler with 318 hits in 1968. That year, he was named UPI National Lineman of the Year and finished 5th in the Heisman Trophy balloting.
- He went on to a spectacular 15-year NFL career as an outside linebacker playing in 215 consecutive games with the Baltimore Colts, Green Bay Packers, Oakland and L.A Raiders. During his time in the NFL, he helped lead his teams to four Super Bowl championships, was an eight-time Pro Bowl selection, four times selected as an All-Pro and five times named second-team All-Pro. He was inducted into the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame in 1987 and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1990. He was named to the NFL's 75th Anniversary All-Time team and to the NFL's All-Decade team of the 1970's.
- He was inducted into the University of Miami Hall of Fame in 1980, to its Ring of Honor in 1997 and had his jersey number—number 89—retired, also in 1997.
