@GW_MBB Opens Wooden Legacy vs. Miami

George Washington men's basketball puts its undefeated record to the test on Thanksgiving Day against Miami (Fla.) in the opening game of the 2013 DIRECTV Wooden Legacy at Cal State Fullerton's Titan Gym.

GW is off to a 4-0 start for the first time since 2009 and will be seeking its first 5-0 start since its banner 2005-06 season during which it opened with eight straight victories en route to NCAA Division I's best regular season record of 26-1

The Colonials improved to 4-0 last Tuesday as six players reached double figures in a 94-50 victory over Delaware State at the Charles E. Smith Center. It marked GW's most one-sided win since a 94-49 rout of Dartmouth on Nov. 14. 2006, and was the first time six players reached doubledigit scoring since a 2006 NCAA Tournament victory over UNC Wilmington.

GW and Miami (Fla.) are meeting for the third-ever time on the hardwood at the Wooden Legacy, with the Colonials bringing a 2-0 series advantage to Orange County, Calif. While only two previous meetings link the GW and Miami programs, more connections can be made between the programs and their head coaches Mike Lonergan and Jim Larrañaga. GW posted a 3-1 mark against Larrañagacoached George Mason teams from 1997-2011, while two prior meetings between Vermont's Lonergan and Mason's Larrañaga in 2007 and 2008 were decided by a total of eight points.

Mike Lonergan is in his third season as head coach for men's basketball at the George Washington University.

Coach Lonergan entered the 2013-14 season as one of the winningest coaches in all of NCAA Division I, ranking 28th among active coaches with a .673 winning percentage (400-194) and 44th on the active victories list. He has averaged 20 wins per season during his 20 years as a collegiate head coach, highlighted by his 400th career victory with a thrilling 81-80 overtime win over Dayton in the 2012-13 regular-season finale.

Coach Lonergan has reestablished a recruiting pipeline in the fertile DC metro area, as well as on the international scene, both of which are expected to pay big dividends for the Colonials during his tenure.

Born and raised in the DC metro area, Coach Lonergan returned to the nation's capital in May 2011 after a successful six seasons as head coach at the University of Vermont.

"The opportunity to return to my roots in the Washington, DC, area and build a program at an exceptional school like George Washington was too good to pass up. The combination of GW's strong academics, commitment to excellence and athletics tradition make it an ideal position. I am committed to supporting and developing our student-athletes and building a program that will make GW proud," said Coach Lonergan.

Among Coach Lonergan's 20 years experience as a college head coach are 15 winning seasons, 13 NCAA Tournament victories including a NCAA Division III National Championship, 13 postseason appearances, 12 regular season conference titles, 12 years of 20 or more victories, 10 NCAA Tournament qualifications and six conference tournament championships. He was named the **2001 Division III National Coach of the Year** and **America East Coach of the Year in 2007 and 2011**. Deeply committed to academic success for student-athletes, Coach Lonergan has achieved a 100 percent graduation rate as head coach.

Coach Lonergan came to GW after six seasons as the head coach at Vermont, where he led one of the most successful mid-major programs in the nation. Under his leadership, Vermont achieved a 126-68 overall record and 69-27 conference record, both the best in the America East Conference. Vermont captured three America East regular season championships, in 2007, 2009 and 2011, and appeared in three America East Championship games, in 2006, 2007 and 2010, winning the title in 2010. He guided the Catamounts to the 2010 NCAA Tournament and twice to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT), in 2007 and 2011. At Vermont, Coach Lonergan also served as Director of the Vermont Basketball Camp, holding two sold out sessions each summer.

Prior to his service at Vermont, Coach Lonergan served from 2004-05 as assistant coach at the University of Maryland under head men's basketball coach Gary Williams. At Maryland, he was involved in every aspect of a top Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) program including recruiting, scouting, practice and game preparation, off season workouts and community service events. He helped lead the team to a season sweep of top ranked Duke and a semifinal appearance in the 2005 NIT.

From 1992-2004, Coach Lonergan served as head coach for The Catholic University of America's men's basketball program and associate athletic director. At Catholic, Lonergan was the winningest coach in the program's 100-year history, with an overall record of 251-88. He led the team to nine of the 13 NCAA Tournament appearances in the history of the program, including the first since 1964. Under his leadership, Catholic won the Division III national title in 2001 and Coach Lonergan was named the 2001 Division III consensus National Coach of the Year.

A native of Bowie, MD, Coach Lonergan is a 1984 graduate of Archbishop Carroll High School in Washington, DC, where he was class salutatorian. He is a 1988 graduate of Catholic University, where he was a starting point guard and captain of the men's basketball team. He also holds a Master of Science degree from American International College. Coach Lonergan and his wife Maggie have five children: Jack, Margaret, Michael Jr., Robert (Moe) and Regina.

GW Hoops to Honor Wizard of Westwood in Wooden Legacy

▶ GW men's basketball will participate in the all-new Wooden Legacy during the 2013 Thanksgiving holiday in Orange County, California. GW will be one of eight teams to take part in the newly-named event that combines the former John R. Wooden Classic and the Anaheim Classic - the eight-team, three-day, 12-game bracketed event that has been staged the past six years in Anaheim.

During a Nov. 13 pre-tournament media teleconference, Coach Mike Lonergan elaborated on his opportunity to meet Coach Wooden in 1997:

"Yeah, I'm good friends with Morgan Wootten, who's a hall-of-fame coach at DeMatha [Catholic] High School, and when I was a coach at Catholic University, my alma mater, we took our team out to California and played in the Whittier Classic, a Division III tournament, and we were allowed to practice at Pauley Pavilion, and thanks to Steve Lavin and Coach Morgan Wootten [they] hooked it up where John Wooden came and spoke to our team. My dad made that trip and got to meet John Wooden and I have a picture in my office. I keep his Pyramid of Success in my wallet, and it was like meeting the Pope. It's one of the highlights of my coaching career to be honest with you. To participate in the tournament, the Wooden Legacy named after him, it's really special for me."

- ▶ With approximately 5,000 combined alumni in Los Angeles and Orange County, 2,000 in nearby San Diego and another 4,000 up the coast in the Bay Area, Orange County will be covered in Buff and Blue as the Colonials compete against arguably one of the toughest multi-team event fields in college basketball next season.
- ▶ Arizona State, Cal State Fullerton, College of Charleston, Creighton, Marquette, Miami (Fla.) and San Diego State will comprise the new Wooden Legacy. Six of those teams reached the postseason and won at least 22 games in 2012-13, with Creighton, Marquette, Miami and San Diego State all advancing to the third round of the 2013 NCAA Tournament.
- ▶ The event's first two rounds will be held at Fullerton's Titan Gym on Thursday, Nov. 28 and Friday, Nov. 29, while the final round will be held at Anaheim's Honda Center on Sunday, Dec. 1. All of the event's 12 contests will be televised on the ESPN networks.

@GW_MBB Improves to 4-0 Ahead of Next Week's Wooden Legacy

WASHINGTON (11/19/13) - Six players reached double figures as GW continued its best start in four seasons with a 94-50 victory over Delaware State at the Charles E. Smith Center on Tuesday.

GW, which received a vote in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll, improved to 4-0 for the first time since 2009 with its most one-sided win since a 94-49 rout of Dartmouth on Nov. 14, 2006.

Senior Isaiah Armwood led an all-around team effort with 17 points, five rebounds, four assists, three blocks and two steals in 21 minutes. Freshman Nick Griffin buried all four of his three-point attempts en route to 14 points, while graduate student Maurice Creek made a trio of threes to finish with 11 points, along with sophomore Patricio Garino. Sophomore Kevin Larsen scored in double figures for the fifth straight game dating back to last season with 10 points, and classmate Paris Maragkos added a career-high 10 points off the bench.

GW, the Atlantic 10's highest scoring team at 89.5 points per game, shot a scorching 60 percent (35-58), aided by 25 assists, nine dunks and 10-of-17 shooting behind the arc, en route to their third game with 80-or-more points this season. The Colonials also owned sizable advantages in rebounding (41-24), points in the paint (44-18), fast-break points (16-4) and bench points (48-16).

Delaware State (1-3) scored the opening basket 1:39 into the game, then GW responded with an 11-0 run sparked by six points from Larsen to go ahead for good. Ten players entered the scoring column, with Griffin and Creek combining for five 3-pointers, as the Colonials shot 60 percent and held the Hornets to 28 percent shooting to build a 54-19 halftime advantage.

The margin never dipped below 34 points and peaked at 49 on Garino's third dunk of the night to make it 92-43 with 2:31 remaining.

Fast Start Rewarded With AP Vote >>

- ▶ Off to a 4-0 start for the first time in four years, GW men's basketball remained steady with a vote in the Nov. 25 Associated Press Top 25 poll, the second consecutive week with a poll vote.
- ▶ GW first checked in at No. 25 on one voter's ballot on Nov. 18, marking the first time the program received votes in the national rankings since concluding the 2006-07 season with three votes in the final AP



poll. The Colonials closed the 2006-07 season by capturing their second Atlantic 10 Championship title in three years to earn a third straight trip to the NCAA Tournament.

▶ That was also the last time both the GW men's and women's programs appeared together in the same poll, with the Colonials' women's team finishing the 2006-07 season at No. 14 after reaching the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16. GW women's basketball received 16 votes in the Nov. 18 AP Top 25 after knocking off then-No. 10/11 California, 75-72, on Nov. 15.



Welcome to the 'Zeek & Creek Show'

- ▶ Derived from his fondness of the Bernie & Ernie Show of Tennessee's 1970s duo of Bernard King and Ernie Grunfeld, GW Head Coach Mike Lonergan has dubbed his two local DMV upperclassmen Isaiah Armwood (whose nickname is 'Zeek') and Maurice Creek as the 'Zeek & Creek Show.'
- ▶ Creek leads the Atlantic 10's top scoring offense (89.5 ppg) at 17.3 points per game, including an A-10 best 15 three pointers at a league second-best 62.5 percent (15-24), just behind freshman teammate Nick Griffin's 66.7 percent (4-6). Armwood adds 15.5 points per game, ranks tied for sixth in the A-10 at 8.5 rebounds per game and leads the league with 2.8 blocks per game.
- ▶ Indiana graduate and transfer Maurice Creek, who is in his final season of eligibility, was among the highest scoring freshmen in the country during his debut season at IU in 2009-10. averaging 16.4 points through 12 games, including 31 against No. 4 Kentucky in December 2009, before being limited to 42 games over the next three seasons due to injury.

- Sophomore Surges for Larsen & Savage

 ► Sophomores Kethan Savage and Kevin Larsen are off to surging starts to their second seasons of college hoops. The pair comprise half of GW's quartet of double-digit scorers with Savage averaging 12.0 points on an A-10 best 78 percent (21-27) shooting and Larsen providing 12.8 points, tied for fourth in the A-10 at 61.3 percent shooting (19-31) and 6.3 rebounds over the opening four games.
- ▶ Savage was named the GWsports.com Colonial of the Week on Nov. 11 following his impressive 18-point, 6-rebound, 5-assist, 5-steal effort in the season-opening victory over Radford. He followed that performance by narrowly missing his first collegiate double-double with 18 points and career-high nine rebounds and three blocks against Maine.
- Larsen has scored in double figures in all four games and recorded his first collegiate double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds at Manhattan.

GW Men's Basketball Enjoys 'A Good Year' in 2012-13

The 2012-13 campaign - the 99th season in program history - was a good one for George Washington men's basketball, including a summer trip to Italy, a memorable Colonials Invasion at its former home at Fort Myer, and a near upset of 6th-seeded UMass in front of 700 alumni at Brooklyn's Barclays Center. While a 13-17 record won't qualify as great, there's plenty of good that can be extracted from the 3.5-game improvement from 2011-12:

- ▶ Four of the Colonials' top five scorers were in their first season with the program, including three in their first season of collegiate basketball.
- ▶ GW faced 15 teams (a total of 17 times) that would reach postseason play, including playing within a possession of three NCAA Tournament teams (Kansas State, Temple, Butler).
- ▶ The Colonials played 16 contests decided by single-digits last season, going 6-10 with close wins against postseason participants James Madison and Massachusetts and narrow losses to the likes of Kansas State, Rutgers, Temple, La Salle, Butler, Saint Louis and the Minutemen.
- ▶ GW started four freshmen for more than half the season and was one of only two teams in the nation, along with Army, to start at least four rookies.

#BlocknessMonster to Lead Colonials' Large Returning Cast >> ► Isaiah Armwood, dubbed the 'Blockness Monster' by GW's Colonial Army

▶ Isaiah Armwood, dubbed the 'Blockness Monster' by GW's Colonial Army student fan group, was voted upon by the league's head coaches and select media as a 2013-14 Preseason Second Team All-Atlantic 10 and Preseason All-Defensive Team selection.

- ▶ Armwood led the team in scoring (11.9 ppg), rebounding (8.8 rpg) and blocks (2.3 bpg) in his debut season at GW in 2012-13. He finished the season among the Atlantic 10 leaders in scoring (26th), rebounding (2nd), field goal percentage (50.6%, 14th), blocked shots (2nd), offensive rebounds (2.5, 9th) and defensive rebounds (6.2, 2nd).
- ▶ Armwood, who enters his final season of eligibility in 2013-14, had one of the best individual seasons for a GW player since Yinka Dare in the mid-1990's, recording the highest blocks (68) and rebounds (263) totals since Dare's career from 1992-94, while adding a team-high 11.9 points per game on 50.6 percent shooting.



Garino Garners Preseason Atlantic 10 Honor >>

- ▶ Patricio Garino joined teammate Isaiah Armwood in earning Preseason Atlantic 10 All-Defensive Team accolades from the league's head coaches and select media.
- ▶ Garino led the team and ranked fourth in the Atlantic 10 (second in A-10 only games at 2.4 spg) with a GW freshman record 68 steals (2.3 spg) in 2012-13. His 68 thefts bested the previous rookie mark set by Carl Elliott in 2003-04.
- ▶ The 6-foot-6 combo guard-forward did a little bit of everything for the Colonials as a freshman he was GW's third-leading scorer at 8.8 points per game, and was second on the team in assists (62) and three-pointers (16), fourth in blocks (13) and fifth in rebounding (101).



- ▶ Sophomore Kevin Larsen, who averaged 8.2 points on 51.3 percent shooting and 5.0 rebounds in 24.3 minutes per game as a rookie, has shed 17 pounds (down to 247 pounds from 264) and half his body fat in the offseason.
- ▶ Larsen finished 12th in the A-10 in field goal percentage and 15th in offensive rebounds (2.2) in 2012-13.



Coach Lonergan Seeks More From McDonald & Mo in Backcourt >>

- ▶ GW will look to get more offensive production from sophomore point guard Joe McDonald the Colonials went 6-0 when he scored 11-or-more points last season. The 6-foot-1 guard averaged 7.5 points, 3.7 rebounds and 3.2 assists as a rookie in 2012-13.
- ▶ McDonald excelled in conference play in 2012-13, finishing 11th in the league in assists (3.6 apg) and 12th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3) over 16 league games, highlighted by a 16-point, 10-assist double-double while matching up against Chaz Williams in a 79-76 victory at UMass in January.

- Suilding Champions in Classroom, Competition & Community
 Nemanja Mikic, who hails from Novi Sad, Serbia and enters his final season of eligibility with 149 three-pointers in 92 career games at GW, completed his undergraduate studies in just three years and graduated with a bachelor's degree in finance from GW in May 2013. He was named to the CoSIDA/ Capital One Academic All-District 2 First Team in January, and became the third GW men's basketball player to earn multiple Atlantic 10 Academic All-Conference Team honors with his repeat selection this past March. He has been named to the A-10 Commissioner's Honor Roll with a grade-point average of at least 3.5 in five of his six semesters at GW, as well as all six semesters on the GW Athletics Academic Dean's List with a 3.0+ GPA.
- ▶ In July, Mikic was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Honors Court, which recognizes collegiate basketball student-athletes who excelled in academics, for the second consecutive year. Mikic was among more than 700 recipients of the 2012-13 award across all three divisions of the NCAA, as well as the NAIA. He was one of 175 Division I student-athletes on the Honors Court, including one of five from the Atlantic 10 Conference.
- ▶ When not serving as a team captain on the GW men's basketball team, or earning the Outstanding Academic Achievement Award for being in the top two percent of GPA in his pre-med/chemistry curriculum, John Kopriva serves as a campus and community leader at the George Washington University. ▶ Kopriva's list of community service efforts include Team Logistics Coordinator managing other student volunteers for the Clinton Global Initiative University (CGI U) hosted at GW in 2012; the university's Freshman Day of Service and MLK Day of Service; volunteering at the St. Mary's Court Elderly Home near the GW campus; and basketball clinics for USA Basketball's Hoops for Troops, and U.S. military installations NSA Naples and Camp Darby as part of GW Basketball's Summer 2012 tour of Italy.
- ▶ His most notable service initiative came in spring 2013 with Lemonade Day DC, an experiential learning program that teaches youth how to start, own and operate their own business - a lemonade stand. John spearheaded more than 30 GW student-athletes' participation with Lemonade Day - first by coordinating multiple visits to Northwest D.C.'s Paul Charter School to teach sixth- and seventh-graders a 14-step entrepreneurial business plan. On Lemonade Day DC on April 14, those middle school students mentored by John and other student-athletes put the skills learned over a month of instruction into action by launching their own businesses at lemonade stands on the GW campus and throughout the district.

DARIAN BRYANT (G, 6-3, 200 lbs.) - Washington, D.C./St. John's College H.S./Team Takeover

Bryant earned Second Team All-Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC) honors as a junior in 2012-13, averaging 11.2 points on 47 percent shooting as he helped the Cadets reach the WCAC Championship game. It was Bryant's half-court, buzzer-beating game winner that helped St. John's edge DeMatha Catholic, 57-55, in the WCAC quarterfinals en route to the title game.

PAUL JORGENSEN (G, 6-2, 180 lbs.) - Ramsey, N.J./Don Bosco Prep/New Heights NYC

Nicknamed the 'Prince Harry of Harlem' for his performance during the Tri-State Classic's High School Showcase this past summer, Jorgensen will bring style and substance to the Colonials' backcourt. The 6-foot-2 guard averaged 17.6 points, seven rebounds, four assists and three steals for Don Bosco Prep as a junior in 2012-13. He posted 10 games of 20-or-more points for the Ironmen in 2012-13, including a season high of 31, and has totaled 748 points in three years on Don Bosco's varsity. Jorgensen shined this summer, helping his New Heights NYC AAU team to a title at the adidas Super 64 championship in Las Vegas and earning MVP honors of the Books and Ball Classic in New York in October. He is currently rated the 12th-best prospect in New Jersey, 49th in the Class of 2014 Point Guard rankings, and 59th in the East by ESPN.

ANTHONY SWAN (G/F, 6-7, 186 lbs.) - Los Angeles, Calif./Virginia Episcopal School/Boo Williams

Swan comes to GW as a two-time Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association (VISAA) All-State selection at Virginia Episcopal School (VES) in Lynchburg, Va.. The versatile 6-foot-7 wing averaged 17 points, six rebounds, three assists and two blocks to earn First Team All-State honors and help VES to a 21-4 overall record and an appearance in the VISAA Division II state title game as a junior in 2012-13 (#22 in highlights here and here). He was also a Second Team All-State pick as a sophomore as the Bishops' reached the VISAA D-II title game in 2011-12. Swan is currently rated the 45th-best prospect in the East and 47th in the Class of 2014 Small Forward rankings by ESPN.



Mike Brey '82, Kwame Evans '96 Part of GW Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2014

- ▶ Mike Brey '82, a former student-athlete who competed in men's basketball, will be inducted for the success he achieved beyond GW. One of the most successful college basketball coaches in the country over the past two decades, Brey finished his collegiate playing career as a Colonial in 1982. He led GW with 116 assists in 24 games en route to team MVP honors during the 1981-82 campaign before earning his bachelor's degree in physical education. His coaching career over three decades included time spent under Hall of Fame mentors like Morgan Wootten and Mike Krzyzewski before he became a decorated head coach himself. The Big East Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011, a year in which he led Notre Dame to 27 victories and was chosen National Coach of the Year by the AP, Sports Illustrated and CBSSports.com, Brey has 13 20-win seasons to his credit and 11 appearances in the NCAA Tournament. Brey will be honored in a special ceremony on January 14 at the Charles E. Smith Center when GW men's basketball hosts VCU.
- ▶ Kwame Evans '96 is one of the best players in GW men's basketball history. Evans helped the Colonials to 78 victories and four trips to the postseason during his career, including NCAA Tournament appearances in 1993, 1994 and 1996. Evans currently ranks fifth on GW's all-time scoring list.
