'Canes Travel to Florida Gulf Coast for Midweek Affair...

Miami and NC State are set to meet on the diamond this weekend for a three-game Atlantic Coast Conference baseball series inside Alex Rodriguez Park in Coral Gables, Fla., beginning on Friday, April 8, at 7 p.m.

The Hurricanes (18-11, 8-3 ACC) are returning home after a three-game road stretch at Boston College and Florida Gulf Coast. Beginning the season 0-5 in games away from Alex Rodriguez Park, the 'Canes have now won six consecutive road games since falling at top-ranked Florida on March 6.

Miami is 3-3 in home conference games this year, sweeping Virginia Tech and falling in three in its last home series against 12th-ranked Georgia Tech. Overall, the 'Canes have won three consecutive games – taking victories in 13 of their last 16 games.

The Hurricanes are led by the play of this week's ACC Co-Player of the Week first baseman Rony Rodriguez. The Miami native tops the team in batting average (.329), slugging percentage (.553) and home runs (4). In his last game against Florida Gulf Coast, the Miami native was 3-for-3 at the plate – posting his first triple of the season – and collecting two RBI and scoring once.

Rodriguez has hit safely in his last four games.

Behind him offensively is infielder Harold Martinez, playing shortstop as of late for the injured Stephen Perez. Martinez has raised his average 147 points over the course of the last month, toting a .297 average into the weekend with a team-leading 30 hits and 22 RBI.

Also swinging the bat well of late is freshman Dale Carey, now batting .250 with hits in each of his last four games, including seven of his last eight overall. In that span, Carey has collected multi-hit games three times, while tallying multi-RBI games on four occasions.

The Miami pitching staff for the weekend will see a slight switch, with sophomores Eric Whaley and E.J. Encinosa swapping days on the hill. Freshman southpaw Bryan Radziewski (4-2, 3.47 ERA) will toe the rubber in the opener, and righty Whaley (5-1, 2.79 ERA) will appear in his first Saturday game of the season – typically serving on Sunday's for the Hurricanes. Right-hander Encinosa (1-2, 3.38 ERA) will close the series on the mound Sunday.

Last weekend against Boston College, Whaley began the first game of Sunday's doubleheader, going four innings on the mound in collecting the win, with Encinosa tossing three innings in his first relief action of the year. Encinosa didn't allow a single hit in his time on the bump against the Eagles.

Miami Against NC State...

The Hurricanes lead the Wolfpack by a 24-11 margin in a series that dates back 21 years. The two first met in the 1990 NCAA Atlantic Regional in Coral Gables. NC State and Miami have faced one another five times in NCAA Tournament play, with the Hurricanes winning all five, and 20 times since the Canes joined the ACC for the 2004-05 school year.

Overall in the series, Miami has won six of the last seven games, with a lone loss being a 7-6 setback in an 11-inning affair last year in Raleigh, N.C.

Scouting the NC State Wolfpack...

NC State (18-12, 5-7 ACC) enters the weekend working on a three-game win streak of its own, picking up victories in the final two games of last weekend's Wake Forest series (dropping the opener on Friday night), and fellow in-state opponent East Carolina, respectively. The Wolfpack have won eight of their last 10 overall, including a series victory over Clemson to close-out the month of March.

The Pack uses Pratt Maynard as one of three players to hit above a .300 clip on the campaign. Maynard leads the team with a .357 average, using a team-leading 41 hits – riding a team-best 12-game hitting streak into the series in Coral Gables. Maynard also ties for the team lead in doubles (8), in addition to leading the Pack in RBI (23) and slugging percentage (.496).

Behind him offensively is Chris Diaz who carries a .333 average at the dish into the weekend, registering 35 hits and scoring 21 times with a team-best five stolen bases on seven attempts. Brett Williams also bats above .300, currently batting .307 with 31 hits, eight doubles, three homers and 15 runs driven in.

The Wolfpack will send junior Cory Mazzone (2-3, 3.97 ERA) to the mound to pitch the se-ries opener Friday evening. Senior Rob Chamra (4-0, 3.75 ERA) will start the middle game of the series Saturday. Chamra has made eight appearances this season, six of them out of the bullpen. He is 3-0 with a 3.31 ERA as a reliever, and 1-0 and 4.70 in his two starts.

In four starts from March 4 versus Penn State through March 25 against

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 794-309-3 (.718) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,298-553-4 (.700) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,429-594-4 (.705) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,298-553-4 (.700) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,429-594-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Rodriguez Named ACC Co-Player of the Week...

After hitting .750 and producing his team-leading fourth home run in helping the University of Miami to a perfect 3-0 week, junior infielder Rony Rodriguez has been selected as the Atlantic Coast Conference Baseball Co-Player of the Week for the week of March 28 – April 3.

Rodriguez, who started all three games last week for the Hurricanes at first base, led Miami in batting average with a .750 clip, producing six hits in eight official at-bats – including two walks and scoring seven runs. His 80.0 percent on-base percentage is the best for any Hurricanes performer in a week at this point on the campaign.

The Sunset High alum and former Miami Dade College product, now in his second year as a UMIAMI student-athlete, helped keep the Hurricanes perfect on the road in ACC play at 5-0 – using a doubleheader sweep of Boston College on Sunday in 19-4 and 7-6 (5 innings) wins in Chestnut Hill, Mass. His slugging percentage for the week was 1.125, and he was perfect defensively with 14 putouts and an assist, all coming at the first base position.

Against BC, Rodriguez was 2-for-2 with three runs scored and two walks in the doubleheader opener, only to follow with a 2-for-3 performance in the nightcap – registering a solo home run in the fifth, which proved to be the game-winning RBI for the 7-6 decision in the curfew rule enforced five inning affair.

to 5-0 on the road in the ACC...**Cade Kreuter**, the sophomore transfer from USC, finally showed his promised and erupted at the plate in the first game of the series...He went 3-3 with four RBI's, including a first-pitch towering homerun to straight away center field...**Chantz Mack** hit his first career homerun in the third inning of the first game of the series off BC pitcher Nate Bayuk.

Hit Me One More Time...

Miami pounded out a season-high 26 hits against Boston College in the opener of Sunday's doubleheader. That almost doubled the previous-high of 14 set against Illinois State (March 8). On the day, Miami staked 36 hits and scored 26 runs with five home runs from five different Hurricanes.

Carey Me Home...

Freshman outfielder Dale Carey picked up his first multi-hit game as a Miami Hurricane on Tuesday against Florida Gulf Coast, going 2-for-4 at the plate with a pair of RBI and a run scored. It was also the first multi-RBI game of the career for the native of Marietta, Ga. He shares a common bond with another UMiami athlete – DeQuan Jones of men's basketball, both being highly-touted athletes out of Wheeler High School in the Greater Atlanta Metropolitan Area.

Notes from the FGCU Game - 'Canes Storm Past Eagles for Second Time in as Many Weeks...

Harold Martinez makes his fourth consecutive start at shortstop for the injured **Stephen Perez**... **David Villasuso** is back behind the plate after a day off on Sunday...**Chris Pelaez**, coming off a shoulder injury, makes his second start of the year – as he was slotted as the DH and hit sixth...**Zeke DeVoss** hit a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the fourth inning to give the Hurricanes a 10-0 lead... It was the second grand slam of the season for the 'Canes, as **Michael Broad** hit one exactly a week ago against UCF...For DeVoss, it was his first home run of the season, and his first since May 29, 2010, against Virginia in the ACC Tournament...It was also DeVoss' second career grand slam, last clearing the bases against Boston College on May 27 of last year – also in the ACC Tournament...Freshman outfielder **Dale Carey** recorded his first and second extra-base hits of his career when he doubled in the second and third innings, respectively...Carey's double in the second inning drove home a run – his third RBI in as many games...With a double in the eighth inning, **Brad Fieger** reached base four times in one game for the first time this season...Sophomore **Michael Broad** hit a deep home run over the left field fence in the fifth inning, his second blast of the season. This was the first game this season where the Hurricanes had hit two home runs in one game...**Cade Kreuter** pinch-hit for Rony Rodriguez in the bottom of the fifth, and took over for him at first base in the top of the sixth inning...It was the first time all season Kreuter saw action in the field, defensively.

Recapping the Last Game - vs. Florida Gulf Coast (April 6)...

Three Hurricanes registered multi-hit games – led by Rony Rodriguez's 3-for-3 night with two RBI, as the University of Miami raced past homestanding Florida Gulf Coast, 8-1, Wednesday night at Hammond Stadium in Fort Myers, Fla.

Miami (18-11) defeated Florida Gulf Coast for the third time this season, improving to 7-0 all-time against the Eagles. It was also the third win against the Eagles in as many weeks.

FGCU (15-16) plated its lone run of the game with Tim Roberson's RBI to score leadoff batter second baseman Mikel Alvarez who kicked off the game with a triple. Alvarez had two of the Eagles' four hits on the night – both of them extra-base hits.

With Florida Gulf Coast leading 1-0 after an inning of play, Miami scored eight runs over the next three to complete the evening's scoring.

When Harold Martinez singled to start the second inning for UMiami, Rony Rodriguez tallied his first triple of the year on the next at-bat to bring in Martinez for the tying run. UM moved ahead for good on the strength of a Brad Fieger RBI ground-out.

The Hurricanes advanced their lead at 5-1 in the third inning as Nathan Melendres' RBI single to center plated Zeke DeVoss, and the lead stretched with RBI singles from Harold Martinez and Brad Fieger, respectively.

The final three runs of the game came in the fourth inning when Chantz Mack brought in Dale Carey on an RBI grounder to second, followed by Melendres' fielder's choice RBI to plate Shane Rowland. Rodriguez picked up his second RBI of the day with a single to left that allowed DeVoss to score for the second time in the game.

Hurricanes starting pitcher Steven Ewing (4-1) earned the win after tossing seven strong innings on the hill. He allowed just the one run in the opening inning and spreading out three hits and striking out eight batters on the bump. Relievers Sam Robinson and Adam Sargent finished the game for the 'Canes with an inning worked apiece.

The loss went to FGCU starter Jason Forjet (1-3) who went just 2 1/3 innings, giving up four earned runs on six hits and a walk. Reliever Harrison Cooney went just an inning before he was chased, allowing four runs (three earned) on four hits.

The bats have certainly come alive for Miami, now scoring 47 runs over the course of their last four games since the end of the Georgia Tech series.

UMiami used the bat of Rodriguez tonight, finishing 3-for-3 at the plate with his first triple of the year (the second of his career) and two RBI. Mack and Martinez each posted multi-hit performances on the night, with Fieger driving in two runs.

FGCU was led by Alvarez with a 2-for-3 night and the lone run scored for the Eagles. Zach Maxfield finished 2-for-4 as the only other FGCU performer with a hit on the evening.

Miami gets back to the diamond on Friday, April 8, welcoming Atlantic Coast Conference opponent NC State to Alex Rodriguez Park for a three-game series beginning at 7 p.m.

made his first career start at shortstop as a result of starter **Stephen Perez's** injured quadriceps and back-up **Joey Porro's** season-ending broken ankle...For the first time this season, **Chantz Mack** hit in the two-slot...UM's outfield traded places in the top of the seventh inning as **Zeke DeVoss** moved from left to center; Mack moved from right to left; and **Dale Carey** moved from center to right...Despite the loss, the 'Canes have won 10 out of the last 12 games since head coach **Jim Morris'** return from gall bladder surgery and an infection stemming from the surgery on March 8...Senior **Chris Pelaez** staked his first hit of the season on a single to the right side as a pinch hitter in the eighth inning...Both clubs came into tonight's contest on winning streaks – Miami having won its last nine, and Georgia Tech winning its last 13... After tonight's victory, GT remains the only program unbeaten in 2011 ACC play...Faces in the Crowd – Chicago Bears Tight End, and former 'Cane, Greg Olsen was in attendance...Former UM shortstop and recent University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame inductee **Bobby Hill** threw out the game's ceremonial first pitch...Miami head coach **Jim Morris** is familiar with the Yellow Jackets, having coached Georgia Tech from 1982-93 winning 504 games...Since moving from third base on March 11 versus Virginia Tech, **Harold Martinez** has resurged as a hitter going on a nine-game hitting streak...Before March 11, he was batting just .167. Game 3: Junior Harold Martinez started at shortstop every game of this series, and has started all 25 games this season...Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** made his first start of the series behind the plate and batted eighth in the lineup...Starting pitcher **Eric Whaley** continues to pitch brilliantly, striking out a career-high 10 batters through seven innings... Whaley only gave up one run on two hits, but did not factor in the decision...For Whaley, it was his third consecutive start with eight-or-more strikeouts, and his fourth of the season... Collecting their 15th straight win, Sunday marked the first time the Yellow Jackets of Georgia Tech ever swept the Hurricanes in Coral Gables, and the first sweep overall by Georgia Tech since 1967...The last time the 'Canes were swept by anyone at home was Clemson in 2006... Junior pitcher **Travis Miller** saw action in his second game this year, picking up his first win since May 2, 2010...Miller toed the rubber in the fifth inning in relief of starter **AJ Salcines**... Sophomore pitcher **Eric Whaley** picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech on Sunday, March 13, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

Notes from the Wake Forest Series: 'Canes Sweep Deacs on the Road...

Miami claimed its the sixth consecutive conference win with a sweep of the Demon Deacons on the road. It's the first time Miami has started the Atlantic Coast Conference season 6-0 since 2006...The 'Canes advanced to the College World Series that same year...The Hurricanes claimed their first three road wins of the year, entering the weekend 0-5 in that capacity...**Bryan Radziewski** laid claim to his third win of season while striking out a season-high 10 batters in 6 1/3 tossed on Friday night...**Eric Whaley** collected his team-leading fourth win of the season with six innings pitched, accounting for nine strikeouts and allowing three earned runs [a three-run homer]...**Zeke DeVoss** batted .500 for the weekend, scoring six runs and claiming five hits and walking a team-leading four times...**Harold Martinez** drove in the game-winning run in back-to-back games during the second and third game of the series, respectively...Junior **Rony Rodriguez** hit his third home run of the season in helping start a 'Canes come-from-behind win in Sunday's series finale.

Notes from the the Virginia Tech Series...

The 'Canes opened up ACC play last Friday night with a win against the Virginia Tech Hokies. Miami has dominated Virginia Tech in Coral Gables, winning six of the seven match-ups on its home field. The 'Canes are now 5-3 all-time in ACC-opening games...**Nathan Melendres** returned to the lineup as well, playing center field after a four-game absence due to a hand injury...Playing Small Ball — Miami looked to manufacture runs against the Hokies, bunting six different times throughout the game — with four resulting in bunt singles and one in a sacrifice...UM also had three steal attempts on the night, with two successful tries by sophomore **Stephen Perez**...As a team, Miami improved to 17-22 with stolen bases on the season...Runners left on base plagued the Hurricanes once again in the opening game of the series, as they left 11 men on the base paths in tonight's game...The 'Canes left the bases loaded in three different innings, and two on in another, with each four of the innings ending in a strikeout... Freshman starting pitcher **Bryan Radziewski** tossed a gem in the series-opener, going seven shutouts innings to earn his second career victory...It was the longest start of his career; the second time he has gone 5-plus innings without giving up a run; and his third quality start of the season...Junior **Sam Robinson** pitched a perfect eighth, and has yet to give up a run on the season...**Daniel Miranda** came in and pitched a bumpy ninth, allowing his first run of the season, before closing the door on the Hokies...Freshman **Dale Carey** made a diving catch in the top of the ninth inning to rob shortstop Tim Smalling of a potential extra-base hit...The hit would have brought the tying run to the plate with nobody out...Carey was inserted into the game in the bottom of the eighth as a pinch-runner and later on **Stephen Perez's** RBI double... The First Father/Son Duo...

Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

Sophomore starting pitcher **E.J. Encinosa** went a career-long seven innings against top-ranked Florida (March 5). In a 1-0 loss to the Gators, Encinosa allowed just the one run on five hits and struckout three in a pitchers' duel with UF's Hudson Randall. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

The 40-40 Club in Miami...

Once again, the Hurricanes achieved a 40-win season, finishing 43-20 and a spot in the NCAA Super Regional. All-time at UMiami, the 'Canes have achieved at least 40 wins 32 seasons – including 13 times under **Jim Morris**. In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

Miami in the ACC...

The 2011 season marks the seventh season the 'Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

Miami Jumps 12 Spots in Latest RPI Poll...

Sitting at No. 42 just a week ago in the RPI standings, the University of Miami made a leap 12 spot this week to No. 30, with wins against UCF and Wake Forest – two teams with high strength of schedules and RPIs. The sweep of Wake Forest by the 'Canes definitely helped after the Demon Deacons took two-of-three in the series victory over the Tar Heels two weeks ago in Winston-Salem, N.C.

Last Time vs. NC State (3/28/10)...

The 12th-ranked University of Miami baseball team earned its first road shut-out against an Atlantic Coast Conference opponent in four years with a 4-0 victory over NC State Sunday afternoon at Doak Field at Dail Park. Junior left-handed starter Eric Erickson earned the win, tossing 5 2/3 scoreless innings before relievers E.J. Encinosa and Eric Whaley combined to go the rest of the way and secure the series win for Miami.

The Hurricanes (16-7, 7-2 ACC) have now won each of their first three ACC series - including back-to-back road series at Duke and NC State (15-9, 3-6 ACC). The road shut out was the first for the 'Canes against an ACC team since shutting out Duke, 3-0, on March 17, 2006 in Durham.

Erickson (2-1) turned in his best outing since the season opener, scattering seven hits while recording four strikeouts. Encinosa allowed just one hit and struck out two in 2 1/3 innings while Whaley struck out one in the ninth.

Yasmani Grandal capped off a big weekend at the plate with a 2-for-4 performance Sunday. David Villasuso also had a pair of hits, while Zeke DeVoss, who reached base three times with a single and two walks, scored two of UM's four runs.

NC State starter Alex Sogard suffered the loss despite allowing just one run on four hits and four walks in three innings of work. Anthony Tzamtzis allowed a run in three innings of work in relief of Sogard, before Vance Williams allowed UM's third run in just a third of an inning of work.

Kyle Wilson (2-for-4) and Chris Diaz (2-for-3) had four of NC State's eight hits.

The Hurricanes loaded the bases in the first on three walks before Harold Martinez's infield single to second plated a first inning run for Miami for the third time in the series.

Nathan Melendres smacked a solo shot to left in the sixth to plate UM's second run of the game before Scott Lawson's sacrifice fly to center the following inning scored DeVoss to put the 'Canes up 3-0.

Miami added an insurance run in the ninth on an error by Diaz after Frankie Ratcliff tripled to lead off the inning.

The Hurricanes will return to Alex Rodriguez Park this week to face FAU on Wednesday, March 31 at 6 p.m. before playing host to Wake Forest, April 2-4.

New Era Behind the Plate...

Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20 RBI and five home runs while serving as a backup to MLB First Round Draft selection and 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal.

Others battling for playing time this season will be freshmen **Corey Janson** and **Shane Rowland**. After the fall season, Villasuso will probably make the start to begin the season, but don't be surprised if and when Rowland takes the spot behind the dish with improved confidence and skill.

Athletics Gets a Changing of the Guard...

On March 3, the University of Miami Department of Athletics and UMiami President Dr. Donna E. Shalala announced that Tony Hernandez would succeed Kirby Hocutt as Interim Director of Athletics. Hocutt resigned a week prior to take a similar position at Texas Tech University. Hernandez has served in a variety of areas within the Department of Athletics at UM in his 13 years of service, including the last year and a half as Deputy Athletic Director.

Fresh Faces In the Dugout...

This season, head coach **Jim Morris** has one of his youngest teams in recent memory. UMiami has 13 newcomers on this year's roster (12 freshman and one sophomore transfer). The 'Canes lost 2010 ACC Player of the Year, Yasmani Grandal, to the MLB Draft—Grandal was selected 12th overall in the Draft.

'Canes In the Classroom...

During the fall semester of 2010, the University of Miami baseball team recorded its highest team GPA ever. Freshman catcher **Corey Janson** collected a 4.0 GPA last semester, giving him one of the highest GPAs in the entire UMiami Athletic Department.

Rookie Gets the Ball...

In starting the season-opener against Rutgers, freshman pitcher **Bryan Radziewski** became the first Hurricanes rookie hurler to start an opening night game in the 18-year tenure under head coach **Jim Morris**. Radziewski, a Florida Christian School alum, was named the Florida Class 1-4A Player of the Year in 2010 as a senior in high school.

You've Gotta Start Somewhere...

Sophomore **Joey Porro** made his first collegiate start (second base) on Feb. 26 against Appalachian State; followed by another start against Illinois State (shortstop) on March 9. Porro was a student-manager for UM in 2010, only to earn two starts and post a .286 average with two hits, three runs driven in and one score thus far in 2011.

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.
