Vaqueros Win Exhibition Game

November 7, 2015 at UTRGV Fieldhouse – The University of Texas Rio Grande Valley Vaqueros men's basketball team beat the Texas A&M International University Dustdevils 67-58 in an exhibition game. Graduate student **J.J. Thompson** led the Vaqueros with 17 points on 5-of-8 shooting, including 4-of-5 from behind the arc, plus 3-for-4 from the line. Junior **Nick Dixon** had 12 points, seven rebounds, three assists and two steals. Graduate student **Dakota Slaughter** had 10 points while going 3-for-6 from behind the arc. **Denzel Bellot** led the Dustdevils with 20 points on 6-of-11 shooting while going 7-for-7 from the foul line. **Arkeem Joseph** had 14 points and six rebounds. The game was tight in the opening minutes, but with the Vaqueros down 8-5, Thompson hit back-to-back three-pointers to spark a 16-4 run that saw the Vaqueros go up 21-12. The Dustdevils pulled within seven at 29-22 late in the half, but the Vaqueros went on a 6-1 run to push their lead into double-figures for the first time. After **Jordan VanDeKop** and Joseph ended the first half with baskets to bring the Dustdevils within eight, the Vaqueros scored the first eight points of the second half as part of a 19-7 run, capped by a four-point play by senior **Shaquille Hines**, that made it 54-34. The Dustdevils responded with a 15-6 run to pull within 60-49 on a **Denzel Bellot** jumper, but a Dixon breakaway dunk ended the run and the comeback attempt.

Broncs Fall in WAC Tournament Quarterfinals

March 12, 2015 at Orleans Arena – The seventh-seeded University of Texas-Pan American Broncs men's basketball team fell to the second-seeded Kansas City Kangaroos 70-61 in the WAC Tournament Quarterfinals. Senior **Shaquille Boga** led the Broncs (10-21) with 14 points and five assists. Junior **Everett Osborne** scored 11 points with three steals. Freshman **Dan Kimasa** posted his fifth double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds to go with two blocks. Junior **Shaquille Hines** scored 10 points with eight rebounds. Kimasa finishes the season with a freshman record 44 blocks, the fourth-highest single-season total in program history. **Reese Holliday** led the Kangaroos (14-18) with 18 points and eight rebounds. **Deshon Taylor** scored 16 points. **Martez Harrison** scored 14 points with six assists. Kimasa, Hines and freshman **Elijah Watson** each had a pair of layups as the Broncs jumped out to an 18-9 lead over the opening 10 minutes. Holliday, however, bookended a 14-5 with three-pointers as the 'Roos came back to tie the game at 23-23 four and a half minutes later. The 'Roos took their first lead at 28-27 on a Taylor three. It was the start of an 8-2 run to end the half as the 'Roos went up 33-29. The Broncs came back to tie the game at 38-38 on a Hines layup with 17:30 remaining, but **Frank Williams** hit a pair of threes and Taylor hit one of his own to power an 11-5 run that saw the 'Roos go up 49-43. They led the rest of the way.

Boga Punctuates Home Career as Broncs Knock Off Kansas City

March 7, 2015 at UTPA Fieldhouse – In his final home game, senior **Shaquille Boga** hit a game-winning three-pointer with 0.28 seconds left to lift the University of Texas-Pan American Broncs men's basketball team to a 53-51 come from behind victory over the Kansas City Kangaroos in front of a near-capacity crowd of 2,308. The Broncs (10-20, 4-10 WAC) trailed 51-44 with 2:22 remaining, but that's when Boga hit a jumper. Then, after a pair of free throws by junior **Shaquille Hines**, Boga nailed a three to tie the game at 51 with 1:14 left. **Deshon Taylor** missed a jumper with 32 seconds to go. Boga grabbed the rebound, and then knocked down a jumper just before time expired to cap the 9-0 run and the win. Boga led the Broncs with 26 points on 11-of-21 shooting to go with five rebounds. Sophomore **Janari Joesaar** also reached double-figures in scoring, finishing with 10 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals. **Martez Harrison** led the Kangaroos (13-18, 8-6 WAC) with 16 points. **Reese Holliday** scored 15 points. Holliday hit a pair of free throws and Martez made a jumper as the 'Roos jumped out to a 4-0 lead. The Broncs took their first lead at 11-10 on a layup by junior **Andreas Bigum** at the end of a 5-0 run, but the 'Roos responded with a 7-1 run to go up 17-12 on a Holliday layup. Boga tied the game at 26-26 with a jumper with 14 seconds left in the first half, but the 'Roos scored the last two points of the first half and first four of the second half to go up 32-26. The Broncs responded with an 8-2 run to tie the game on a layup by junior **Everett Osborne** before taking the lead back on a Boga three that made it 41-40 with 8:46 to go. The 'Roos answered with an 11-3 run to take their largest led of the game at seven before the Broncs started their comeback.

Texas A&M International (11/7)

- In their lone exhibition, the Vaqueros beat the Dustdevils 67-58.
- Graduate student **J.J. Thompson** led the Vaqueros with 17 points on 5-of-8 shooting, including 4-of-5 from behind the arc, plus 3-of-4 from the line. Thompson's career-high in three-pointers in the regular season is three (1/1/15 at Belmont).
- Graduate student **Dakota Slaughter** went 3-for-6 from behind the arc while scoring 10 points. His career-high in three-pointers in the regular season is two, accomplished on March 8, 2015 against Texas A&M in the SEC Tournament, and five days earlier vs. Ole Miss on senior day.
- The Vaqueros hit nine three-pointers. Last season's single-game high was eight three-pointers, accomplished twice, at Chicago State (2/7/15) and vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville (11/22/14). The last time the Vaqueros hit nine three-pointers in a regular season contest was Dec. 29, 2013, against Duquesne.

- In head coach **Dan Hipsher's** third season at Akron, the Zips were picked to finish seventh, but they finished first. This is Hipsher's third season at UTRGV, and the Vaqueros were picked to finish seventh.
- Senior forward **Shaquille Hines** earned All-WAC Second Team honors from both the coaches and media. CollegeSportsMadness.com also selected Hines as a member of the Madness Preseason All-WAC Second Team while sophomore **Dan Kimasa** and graduate student **J.J. Thompson** earned Madness Preseason All-WAC Fourth Team honors.
- The Vaqueros' schedule includes at least 11 games against 2015 postseason teams, including four against NCAA Tournament participants New Mexico State, North Dakota State and North Florida, two against NIT participants Miami and UTEP, two against CBI participant Seattle U, and three against CIT participants Grand Canyon and Tennessee-Martin.

2014-15 Notes

- In their 10 wins last season, the Vaqueros' average margin of victory stood at 6.6 points per game (total points: 66). The Vaqueros posted a 78-60 (+18) victory over North Dakota (11/29), which marked their largest margin of victory of the season. The Vaqueros had one other double-digits margin of victory, winning 68-57 (+11) over Seattle U (2/14).
- The Vaqueros ranked 69th in the NCAA in fewest fouls (544).
- Two Vaqueros earned All-WAC honors, as **Dan Kimasa** was on the All-Defensive Team and **Janari Joesaar**, who is now playing professionally in Estonia, was on the Second Team and All-Newcomer Team.
- Shaquille Hines** ranked 62nd in the NCAA in field goal percentage (.509), 212th in minutes per game (33:32) and 232nd in total field goals made (163).
- Dan Kimasa** ranked 130th in the NCAA in blocks per game (1.42), 142nd in total blocks (44), 155th in double-doubles (5), 183rd in defensive rebounds per game (4.68) and 233rd in rebounds per game (6.5).

UTPA Athletics hired Dan Hipsher, who had been the associate head coach at Alabama for the previous four seasons, as the head coach of the men's basketball team on April 4, 2013.

2014-15: In second season with the team, played eight games against teams that went on to play in postseason tournaments, including two each against New Mexico State (NCAA), Seattle U (CBI) and Grand Canyon (CIT), and on each against Utah (NCAA), Sam Houston State (CIT) ... Lead team to 3-0 start for the first time since 2006-07 ... Earned wins over the teams that finished second (Grand Canyon), third (Kansas City) and fourth (Seattle U) in the WAC ... Increase win total from previous season ... Won eight home games ... Brought in team's leading scorer and All-WAC Second Team honoree **Janari Joesaar**, who ranked second in the WAC in scoring (16.9 points per game) ... Coached freshman **Dan Kimasa** to All-WAC Defensive Team honors.

2013-14: In first season, took on a schedule that included 12 games against eventual playoff teams, including three against Utah Valley (NIT), two each against New Mexico State (NCAA) and Grand Canyon (CIT), and one each against SMU (NIT), Texas A&M (CBI), Sam Houston State (CIT), Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (CIT) and IPFW (CIT) ... Led team to five road wins, their highest total since 2007-08 ... Coached team to season sweeps of Chicago State and Kansas City, the No. 3 and No. 4 seeds in the WAC Tournament ... Brought in team's top two scorers as transfers over the summer, including **Javorn Farrell**, a fifth-year transfer from Massachusetts who averaged a team-high 16.1 points, ranked second in rebounds at 5.4, and tied for the team lead in assists at 3.3, and junior college transfer **Shaquille Boga**, who ranked second in scoring at 14.0, fourth in rebounds at 3.5, tied for first in assists at 3.3, and led the team in steals at 2.1 per game.

Career: Hipsher's knowledge and basketball acumen helped turn Alabama into one of the toughest defensive units in the country, while his eye for talent helped the Tide land a top-five recruiting class.

In 2012-13, Hipsher helped guide the Tide to a 23-13 record (12-7 SEC) and the NIT Quarterfinals.

In 2011-12, Alabama held 31 of its 33 opponents below their scoring average, allowing an average of 58.1 points per game. The Tide reached the 20-win mark for the second straight season, finishing with a 21-12 record, and made its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2006.

In his second season at UA, Hipsher helped turn a team with an early 5-5 record into one that amassed a 25-12 record and captured the 2011 Southeastern Conference Western Division title. That same squad made UA's first postseason appearance in four seasons and advanced to the NIT Championship Game.

The veteran coach came to Alabama after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of South Florida (USF). Prior to joining the USF staff, Hipsher was an assistant coach at Arkansas, where he helped the Razorbacks to back-to-back NCAA Tournament berths.

Before serving as an assistant and associate at the high major ranks, Hipsher spent 15 years as a head coach. He started with four seasons at Division III Wittenberg, where he compiled a 97-18 (.843) record, four conference championships and three NCAA Tournament appearances. He led his team to the 1990 Elite 8 in his first season, earning NCAC Coach of the Year and NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region Coach of the Year honors.

He then moved on to Stetson University for two years, where he went 29-27 (.518), including 20-12 (.625) in Trans-America Athletic Conference play. Hipsher earned TAAC Coach of the Year honors in 1994-95 after winning the conference regular season championship.

Hipsher next began a nine-year stint as the head coach at the University of Akron in 1995-96, turning around a struggling program after just two seasons by going 17-10 (13-5 Mid-American Conference) in 1997-98 while earning MAC Coach of the Year honors. He led the Zips to records of 18-9 (12-6 MAC) and 17-11 (11-7 MAC) over the following two seasons.

Overall, Hipsher has a 247-205 (.546) record as a head coach, including 147-118 (.555) in conference contests. He has earned conference Coach of the Year honors three times and regional coach of the year twice.

Hipsher has shown an ability to create both offense and defense. In 1991-92, Wittenberg led the nation in field goal percentage defense, while in 2000-01, Akron led the nation in three-point shooting percentage.

Hipsher began his coaching career in 1977-78 as a graduate assistant at Miami University, where, while earning a master's in education, he helped the RedHawks to a 19-9 record (12-4 MAC), a MAC Championship, a MAC Tournament Championship, and a victory in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Hipsher then spent two seasons at Miami Dade Community College as an assistant coach and health and physical education instructor before returning to the NCAA Division I ranks as an assistant coach at Dayton under legendary head coach Don Donoher from 1980-89. The Flyers made five postseason appearances during that time, advancing as far as the NCAA Tournament Elite 8 in 1983-84.

In 36 seasons as a coach, Hipsher has an overall record of 582-457 (.560), including 226-198 (.533) in conference play. His teams have made 14 postseason appearances, including nine in the NCAA Tournament and five in the NIT.

Hipsher graduated from Bowling Green State University in 1977 with a bachelor's degree in chemistry and biology. He was a two-time captain and academic All-American for the Falcons.

The 61-year old Hipsher and his wife, Sue, are the parents of two sons, Andy (35) and Bryan (33). Both played collegiately for their father at Akron.
