## WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS

- Miami will wrap up the regular season with a **three-game home series** against **Virginia Tech** beginning Thursday, May 18.
- The Canes lead the all-time series by a commanding **28-8** margin, and won **two of three** games in Blacksburg in **2016**.
- Junior leftthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** (6-3, 2.28 ERA) will start Thursday night; the Virginia Tech starting pitcher is **TBD**.
- Miami next travels to the **2017 ACC Baseball Championship** in Louisville, Ky., and will open play either **May 23** or **May 24**.
- Sophomore **Romy Gonzalez** leads the Hurricanes with 14 multi-hit games, 11 multi-RBI games, 11 home runs and 35 RBI.
- Junior **Jeb Bargfeldt** lowered his ERA to a team-best 2.28 with a complete game three-hitter at No. 10 Virginia (May 13).
- Head coach **Jim Morris** has the **fifth-most** wins in Division I history (1,561), the **third-most** wins among active coaches, a **.695** winning percentage (**sixth** among active coaches), and **183** more wins than the next active coach - Mike Fox of UNC.
- The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition; **Michael Mediavilla**, **Jesse Lepore** and **Johnny Ruiz** were recognized by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* while **Carl Chester** was honored by Baseball America.
- The Hurricanes made their **25th trip to the College World Series in 2016**, finishing with a 50-14 record and a 21-9 mark in ACC play. Miami was the No. 3 national seed for the postseason, and won the **2016 ACC Regular Season Championship**.
- The Canes had **seven** players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick **Zack Collins**.

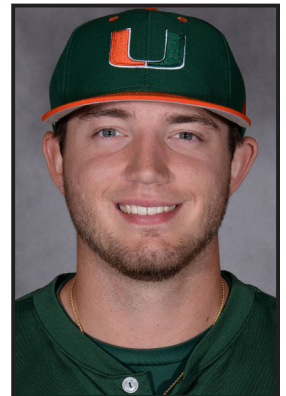

**3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH**

**THE HURRICANES SKIPPER**

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008, 2014 and 2016.

In his 23-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,057-445-3 (.707) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,561-689-4 (.695) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,692-728-4 (.701) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion - to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

### CANES WRAP UP REGULAR SEASON WITH VT

- Miami will wrap up the regular season with a **three-game series** against **Virginia Tech** beginning Thursday, May 18 at 7 p.m. at Mark Light Field (ACC Network Extra, 560 WQAM, WVUM 90.5 FM)
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series with the Hokies by a commanding **28-8 margin**, and won **two of three games** in the 2016 regular season series at English Field in Blacksburg, Va.
- Miami will next be traveling to Louisville, Ky., for the **2017 ACC Baseball Championship** and begin play either May 23 or May 24.
- Junior lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** (6-3, 2.28 ERA) will start the series opener Thursday night.

### WEEK IN REVIEW: UM TOPS FGCU TUESDAY, 5-1

- Freshman righthander **Evan McKendry** had the best outing of his young career to lead Miami past FGCU, **5-1**, Tuesday night at Mark Light Field to open a four-game homestand.
- Making the sixth start of his career, McKendry set a **career high with 10 strikeouts** in a **career-long-tying seven innings** Tuesday. He allowed just two hits and two walks across 102 pitches.
- Junior lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** twirled a gem in the first game of a doubleheader at #10 Virginia on May 13, tossing the first complete game by a Cane since May 2015 to lead Miami to a 5-1 win.
- Bargfeldt allowed just **three hits** and **one run**, needing 107 pitches to get through the best start of his Hurricanes career.
- Miami took a **4-0 lead in Game 2** of the doubleheader, but allowed eight runs in a second inning that ultimately doomed them in a 13-6 loss to set up a rubber match.
- Trailing for most of the game Sunday, the Hurricanes **tied the game 3-3 in the eighth** but allowed four runs in the home half of the inning, and fell 7-4 to drop the series.

### HEATING UP: RUIZ, CHESTER ON HIT STREAKS

- Senior **Johnny Ruiz** has been Miami's top performer at the plate for the last two weeks and is riding a **six-game hitting streak** into Thursday's series opener. Over that stretch, he is batting .474 (9-for-19) with two doubles, one home run, four RBI and a .643 OBP.
- Junior **Carl Chester**, hitting leadoff for the last four games and for the first time since a late February series at Florida, has batted **.412** (7-for-17) with six runs scored since being reinserted into the role on May 13. He is also riding a six-game hitting streak entering Thursday.
- Miami lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** has been the most consistent weekend starter for the Canes. In nine ACC starts, Bargfeldt is **5-2** with a **1.68 ERA**. He is holding ACC opponents to a **.173 average**.

### UNC SNAPS STREAK OF UM COASTAL CROWNS

- Miami won its **third straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- North Carolina clinched the 2017 Coastal Division crown this past weekend in a series against Virginia Tech (May 12-14), snapping Miami's impressive streak.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship three times, most recently in **2016** when the Canes finished **21-7**.
- Since the beginning of the **2014** season, Miami has won **28 of its past 39 ACC series**. The Hurricanes went **8-2** in ACC series in **2014**, **7-3** in **2015**, **9-1** in **2016** and are **4-4-1** in **2017**.

**ROMY POWERING OFFENSE**

• Sophomore infielder **Romy Gonzalez** leads Miami in **home runs** (11), **RBI** (35) and **slugging percentage** (.485), and ranks second in **doubles** (8) and **steals** (11).

**JEB! SHINING IN YEAR 1 AT MIAMI**

• Junior **Jeb Bargfeldt** has been among Miami's top performers this season in his first year as a Hurricane. He transferred to UM after spending 2015 at **Wichita State** and 2016 at **Cisco College** (TX).  
 • Bargfeldt has a **team-best 2.28 ERA** and has made 13 starts, all as a member of the weekend rotation. He is holding opponents to a .195 average, allowing just 19 earned runs in 75.0 innings.

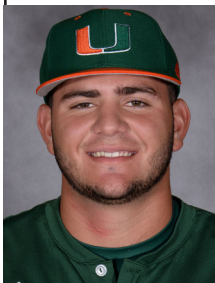
