**Miami Returns Home with 'Dig Pink' Match on Tap...**

The University of Miami (12-7, 5-4 ACC) returns home for the first time since Oct. 4 this weekend when playing host to the University of North Carolina (Oct. 23) and NC State (Oct. 25) at the James L. Knight Sports Complex in Coral Gables, Fla. The Hurricanes just went 3-1 in a critical road stretch in ACC play.

Miami comes into Friday's match facing a very strong UNC squad that holds a 10-9 record overall, but a 6-2 mark in ACC play. UM and UNC split last year's series with each other as the home team prevailed each time. The match in Chapel Hill turned out to be an important one for the 'Canes as it was an NCAA statement match for both teams.

The Hurricanes are led by sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico with an ACC-best 323 kills (4.40 kps) and hitting a .262 clip on the season. Carico has registered 15-or more kills in nine straight contests entering the UNC match. Senior Cassie Loessberg comes in ranked atop the league in digs (377 / 5.24 dps) as she has anchored the UM defense.

Freshman Lizzie Hale played big last weekend for Miami, pulling in season highs in kills (3) and digs (18) against Boston College. Additionally, strong play continued from Christine Williamson as she picked up 12 kills against BC, and two blocks against Maryland. Ariell Cooke was equally important against the Eagles of Boston College, putting down six blocks on the night.

Miami is also using this weekend's UNC match as its *Dig Pink* match in the fight against breast cancer. The Hurricanes have developed a website where fans and other interested parties can donate funds via credit card, money order or simply by mailing a personal/certified check. The website was created in conjunction with the Side-Out Foundation in the fight against breast cancer, and also gives UM fans and friends the opportunity to see just how much money was raised from the University of Miami.

Quick Hits on North Carolina...

The University of North Carolina enters the weekend holding a 10-9 overall and 6-2 in league play in the midst of the conference season. Carolina defeated then ACC leader Duke Friday and Wake Forest Sunday, both with match scores of 3-1. Carolina ranks first in the ACC in digs per set, led by sophomore libero Kaylie Gibson's 5.16 digs per set in eight conference games. The Tar Heels are 2-6 on the road this season.

Series Against North Carolina...

Miami leads this series by the slimmest of margins, 8-7, after the two teams split a pair of matches last

season, with the home team winning each time. UNC had won three in a row until Miami collected the final match of the 2007 season, and the first of the '09 campaign. Ultimately, UM has won two of the last three matches in the series.

Quick Hits on NC State...

NC State (7-16, 0-8 ACC) returns to the road after hosting Wake Forest and Duke at Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh a week ago. The Wolfpack boasts five players with triple-digit kill totals, including Kelly Wood (170), Keri DeMar (149), Isis Gardner (139), Lisa Kretchman (125) and Alex Smith (103). Smith also has 526 set assists, while Kelly Burns has lifted 187. Sarah Griggs and Taylor Pritchard have both landed 16 service aces, while Lisa Kretchman's 63 total blocks leads the roster. Lindsay Benac owns 339 digs.

Series Against NC State...

The Hurricanes have dominated this series with a commanding 10-0 all-time series lead against the Wolfpack. Miami has captured 3-0 scores in each of the last three matches, and four of the last five overall.

ACC Digs Pink for the Cure Together...

ACC volleyball teams are doing their part this weekend to fight breast cancer. Four ACC teams—Florida State, Miami, Clemson, and Georgia Tech—will host events on Friday and Saturday to raise funds for both breast cancer awareness

and research.

On Friday, October 23, Florida State will host a "Paint It Pink" match when the Seminoles take on NC State in Tully Gymnasium at 7 p.m. Also on Friday, Miami will host North Carolina at the Knight Sports Complex at 7 p.m., in promotion of "Dig Pink".

Clemson will welcome Wake Forest to Jervey Gymnasium for its "Dig Pink" match at 6 p.m., on Saturday. Finally, another "Dig Pink" match will take place at O'Keefe Gymnasium on Saturday, October 24 when Georgia Tech hosts Duke at 7 p.m.

Lizzie Hale Storms Through...

In a 3-1 win over Boston College last weekend, freshman Lizzie Hale racked up a season-high 18 digs and three kills for the match. For the California native, the matches against BC and Maryland also marked the first two starts of her career.

# Nicole Lantagne Welch

**Head Coach**  
**Ninth Year at Miami**  
**Maryland, 1994**  
**Record at Miami: 163-94**  
**Overall Record: Same**



This season marks Nicole Lantagne Welch's ninth year at the helm of the University of Miami women's volleyball program. Under her guidance since 2001, the team has posted winning records in six

of the last eight seasons, including a second-place finish in the team's first year in ACC play in 2004.

Last season, Lantagne Welch led the Hurricanes to a tie for third place in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) standings, and the team's best regular season record since 2002. During the year, Lantagne Welch collected her 150th career victory when the 'Canes defeated NC State, 3-0, on November 21, 2008. It was just two seasons ago that she posted her 100th career victory in the 2006 season-opener for UM with a 3-2 win over Alabama.

The 2008 season was special for UM as the team posted a record of 26-6 overall (14-6 ACC), finishing just one match shy of tying for an ACC Championship. Not to be overlooked was Lantagne Welch leading the 'Canes to three in-season tournament titles, including a tournament title at NCAA Tournament participant University of San Francisco as part of the Asics/Coca-Cola Invitational in San Francisco, Calif.

For those achievements and more, Lantagne Welch was tabbed ACC Coach of the Year, as well as American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) East Region Coach of the Year. It was her first ACC coaching honor, while being the second AVCA Regional honor, collecting the award in 2002 during Miami's historic run to the Round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament.



Under her guidance, Lantagne Welch would later see freshman Lane Carico named ACC Freshman of the Year, as well as AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico would go on to be named to the All-ACC Second Team, as well as teammates Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. Carico would represent the first-ever ACC Freshman of the Year coached by Lantagne Welch, while Ellis and Mayhew would become the seventh and eighth players in school history to be named to the All-ACC Volleyball Team.

Overall, her career at UM is highlighted in part by three seasons with at least 20 wins (2003-04, '08) and a trip to the "Sweet 16" in the Hurricanes' first-ever appearance at the NCAA Tournament in 2002. In her eight years at the helm in Coral Gables, Lantagne Welch has averaged 18.9 wins per seasons with a career record of 151-87.

While new records were set during the 2007 campaign, the 2008 season saw even those records fall as Lantagne Welch and her staff assembled one of the best records in school history. Lantagne Welch led Miami to its best ACC record in school history. It was also the second-best record in school history on the Division I level of athletics.

Katie Gallagher moved in sole possession of second place all-time at UM for assists in a career during the 2008 season, while Cassie Loessberg placed herself in second place for digs in a career. In addition, Loessberg broke her own school record from a year ago for digs in a single-season, upping the new record to 554—besting her old school-record mark by two.

As for Gallagher, she etched her name once again as one of the Top 10 single-season assists leaders in school history. Already sitting at third place in school history from the 2007 season where she collected 1,243 assists, Gallagher added to that total with 1,202 in 2008—good enough for sixth place all-time in school history.

Freshman Lane Carico broke the freshman record for kills in a single-season for UM with 369, adding her name to 10th all-time for single-season kills. Meanwhile, Miami tied a school-record for hitting percentage in a five-set match, collecting a .329 percentage at Florida State on Nov. 26, 2008. The 'Canes would also collect the second-best single-set hitting mark in school history with a .615 clip against Boston College in the third set on Oct. 10, 2008.

Lantagne Welch would see two more student-athletes graduate following the 2008 season. Angelica Ellis and Bridget Bomhach both earned their Bachelor's Degree, while Ashley Woods completed her Master's Degree.

Woods placed her name eighth all-time in sets played (367), as well as eighth place all-time in total attacks (1,764). Ellis now ranks ninth in attacks (1,209), while also collecting the third-highest individual single-season hitting percentage (.350) from the 2008 campaign. Overall, Ellis is third in school history in career hitting percentage with a .275 clip through 318 sets and 1,209 attacks. Woods is tied for fifth in career hitting percentage, holding a .256 clip, sitting alongside Ciara Michel (2004-07).

The eighth-year head coach also coached three All-ACC Second Team members with

Lane Carico, Angelica Ellis and Genny Mayhew. In addition, Carico and Ellis were each named as AVCA All-America honorable mention, while Carico was selected the 2008 AVCA East Region Freshman of the Year. Carico was also the true definition of "student-athlete" as she was named to the All-ACC Academic Team.

A native of Encinitas, Calif., Lantagne Welch grew up in a family where volleyball had been a major part of their livelihood. Her parents, Joe and JoAnn, owned and operated a highly regarded volleyball scouting service that evaluated high school players, covering the regions of California, Nevada and Arizona. Lantagne Welch's sister, Jenelle Duvall, was an All-American at the University of Pittsburgh and served as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona and Northern Illinois. She also served as head coach at Metro State College of Denver.

Lantagne Welch played at the University of Maryland from 1990-1993. In her role as a four-year starting setter, she guided the Terrapins to their first-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship (ACC) title and an automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament in 1990. As a top collegiate setter, Lantagne Welch garnered First Team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in 1992 and '93, and earned Second Team All-ACC accolades in 1991. She would also be named AVCA National Player of the Week (Oct. 12, 1993) following an upset victory over Florida State.

Serving as a team captain through her final two seasons, Lantagne Welch finished her outstanding collegiate career as Maryland's all-time assists, digs and matches played leader. Throughout her career in College Park, Lantagne Welch accumulated various academic honors including ACC Honor Roll and district academic All-America as a senior. She graduated in 1994 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Marketing. For her accomplishments as a student-athlete, Lantagne Welch was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference 50th Anniversary Volleyball Team along with five other Terrapins from teams of the 1990s.

Lantagne Welch arrived at Miami after serving as an assistant coach at Texas A&M. During her three seasons there, the Aggies finished ranked in the top 20 and qualified for the NCAA Tournament each season (1997-99). In 1999, Texas A&M advanced to the elite eight of the NCAA Tournament, compiling a 28-6 record and a No. 9 final ranking.

In 2002, she married Wesley Paul Welch of Denver City, Texas, in her hometown of Encinitas, Calif. On Dec. 7, 2004, the couple celebrated the birth of their daughter, Riley Jaye and on April 8, 2007, son Ayden Fletcher was born. Lantagne Welch and her family reside in Miami.

## Hurricanes VB Media Policy

### KNIGHT SPORTS COMPLEX

Press row for University of Miami volleyball matches is located on the north side of the court at the James L. Knight Sports Complex, across from the team benches. The media entrance to the arena is from the southwest corner of the Complex, and the southwest entrance is also used for Will Call pick-up of credentials. Parking is located in either the lot for Mark Light Field, or Cobb Stadium directly adjacent to the Knight Sports Complex.

### MEDIA & PHOTO PASSES

Credentials for Hurricanes home matches are issued for working media only and must be requested through the sports media relations office at least 24 hours prior to the selected home event you wish to attend. Credentials are issued on a match-by-match basis and a formal request must be issued to the Miami Sports Media Relations Office. Only photographers on assignment from an accredited media agency will be issued credentials. Photographers are required to abide by the guidelines set forth by the NCAA on shooting limitations from the sidelines. Those not complying with the guidelines may be removed.

### MEDIA SERVICES

Pregame media supplements including notes, statistics, media guides and gameday programs will be available prior to the start of the first set. Between-game and final statistics, plus a running play-by-play and post game notes will be provided. Final statistics will be emailed and/or faxed via Miami's broadcast system following the conclusion of the match. In-game questions or concerns can be addressed on press row by Assistant Sports Media Relations Director Bryan J. Harvey.

### WEBSITES

As a general rule, fan-based web sites containing at least one or more of the following: chat rooms, message boards, recruiting information, scouting reports and links to news sites, as well as other fan-based features shall not be issued credentials to Miami volleyball matches. Local and national organizations that maintain a news-based Web site in connection with their regular newspaper or magazine, as well as radio or television broadcast, shall be issued credentials on a match-by-match basis. Live, real-time updates will not be permitted. Fan-based web sites wishing to discuss coverage and credential options should contact the Miami Sports Media Relations office at (305) 284-3244.

### INTERVIEWS

Following home games, Miami head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch will return to the court to handle any media questions, and players will also be available after a brief cooling-off period following the match's conclusion. Miami's locker will be closed at all times.

### TELEPHONES

Telephone lines at the Knight Sports Complex are limited to home radio and the visiting teams' "official" sports administrator/media relations contact. All media wishing to file stories should contact Bryan J. Harvey prior to the conclusion of the game in order to make arrangements to be escorted back to the Sports Media Relations Office in order to work in a work-friendly environment. Any and all questions will be addressed in this designated area.

### Life in the Fast Lane...

Miami sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico recorded 22 kills and 22 digs in a 3-1 win over Wake Forest (Oct. 8), the first 20-20 performance in the ACC this season. Additionally, she recorded another double-double with 15 kills and 13 digs in a 3-0 loss to Duke (Oct. 10) to run her streak to seven straight matches with a double-double. Overall, Carico has a league-leading nine double-doubles.

### Carico Makes Another ACC First...

Sophomore outside hitter Lane Carico's 25 kills against Boston College were the fourth-best mark in the ACC this season, the best output for a four-set match. She has now registered 15-or more kills in nine consecutive matches, and has 15 total matches with double-digit kills on the campaign.

### Lantagne Welch Goes for Seconds...

Head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch registered back-to-back wins on the road against her alma mater (the University of Maryland) for the first time in her coaching career last weekend in UM's 3-0 sweep of the Terrapins.

### Fast Noting the 'Canes...

The Hurricanes have out-hit their opponents in nine of their 10 wins in 2009. Junior setter Katie Gallagher (299) is one set assists away from making Miami the third league team to have two players post at least 300 assists this season.

### Playing the Numbers with UM...

*The number 8*—Consecutive double-doubles for sophomore Lane Carico before her streak was snapped in Miami's 3-0 win over Maryland (Oct. 18). Carico's streak was the longest active streak in the ACC at that time.

### Sundararaman Already Moving Up...

Freshman setter/right side hitter Nrithya Sundararaman has quickly made a move on the all-time assists charts at UM, placing herself sixth with 474 assists. She has shared time with Katie Gallagher to quickly vault her way near the middle of the UM all-time list.

### On These Dates in History...

The dates of Oct. 23 and Oct. 25 throughout time haven't favored the Hurricanes as they hold just a 5-6 overall mark. In matches played on Oct. 23, UM is 1-2, while sporting an even 4-4 mark in Oct. 25 matches. The last match played on either date occurred last season when UM fell, 3-1, in a crucial ACC road match at Virginia Tech.

### Mayhew Shooting for 1,000...

Senior outside hitter Genny Mayhew is closing in on 1,000 kills as she now has 997 kills in her career. If she cracks the 1,000-kill plateau, she will be just the fifth UM player all-time to have eclipsed that mark. Currently, she ranks fifth all-time at UM in career kills.

Duke Predicted to Win ACC Regular Season...

The Duke University volleyball team is predicted to win the 2009 Atlantic Coast Conference championship and headlines a list of 18 student-athletes selected to the 2009 Preseason All-ACC volleyball team, as announced today by Commissioner John D. Swofford.



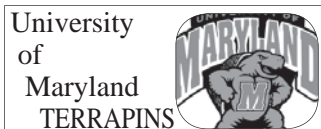
Duke takes in 116 of a possible 121 points, including seven of 12 first place votes. Coaches' votes for the predicted order of finish were tallied with 11 points being applied to a first-place vote, 10 points for a second-place vote, etc. Coaches were not permitted to predict their own team's order of finish.



Just 17 points separate the top-four teams as Florida State, Miami, and North Carolina also take in first-place votes. Florida State follows Duke in second place with 104 points and three first-place votes, while Miami is tabbed to finish in third with 101 points and one first-place vote. North Carolina lands in fourth with 99 points and one first-place vote.



Clemson is tabbed fifth with 75 points, and is followed by Virginia Tech (71), Virginia (62), Georgia Tech (49), Wake Forest (47), Maryland (33), NC State (21), and Boston College (14).



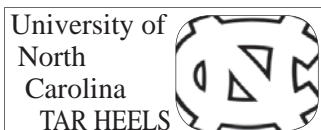

Last Time Out - at Maryland (10/18/09)...

The University of Miami used 18 kills from Lane Carico and eight more from Lici McGee to help power past the University of Maryland, 3-0 (25-23, 25-15, 25-18), on Sunday afternoon in an ACC volleyball matchup housed at Comcast Pavilion in College Park, Md.



Miami head coach Nicole Lantagne Welch was looking for a host of things to occur Sunday, most importantly help guide her team above the .500 mark in Atlantic Coast Conference play. She was also looking for back-to-back road wins against her alma mater, the University of Maryland.



"Winning on the road is never easy, and in the ACC anyone can challenge you on any given day," expressed Lantagne Welch shortly after the match.



Miami (12-7, 5-4 ACC) was playing its fourth consecutive road match on Sunday, and was looking at a chance to go 3-1 in a critical road stretch midway through the conference season.



The Hurricanes got a kill from setter Nrithya Sundararaman, and blocks by Lizzie Hale and Ali Becker to grab the early 12-8 lead. Trailing 17-11, Maryland (10-12, 2-7 ACC) began a 5-0 run as Taylor Jones and Maddi Lee combined for back-to-back Terrapins kills. A Sam Rosario service ace brought the Terps to within

17-16.

The 'Canes went back on top, 21-18, with the help of Carico's kill off the set of Sundararaman, as well as two Maryland attack errors. But the Terps fought back to within 21-20 as Kara Bates and Brittney Grove smashed kills before Miami called for a timeout.

Following the timeout, Miami senior libero Cassie Loessberg recorded consecutive service aces to push the Hurricanes advantage to 24-20. Miami got a kill from Becker to close-out the set point, 25-23.

Becker would finish the afternoon with seven kills and three blocks (assisted).

In the second set, Miami jumped out to an early 7-3 lead as Carico and McGee posted two kills apiece, and Hale added a service ace in what was a 5-0 Hurricanes run. Down 3-2 before the run, the 'Canes never trailed again in the set in using seven kills from Carico and five from McGee as they cruised to the 25-15 win.

Miami never trailed in the third set and there were no ties as Carico collected six kills in leading the 'Canes to the 25-18 win. Also playing well in the final frame was Becker, pouring in four kills and two assisted blocks. Becker also collected two service aces, giving her three aces total for the match.

After the win, Miami's Lantagne Welch expressed how much it meant for her team to get the road win and finish the stretch 3-1 against tough ACC opponents.

"These wins are something we want to build on as we get ready to come back home," said Lantagne Welch. "We need to keep getting better and better, and it's really going to be great coming back home next weekend against two more tough ACC teams."

Maryland was led on the day by Maddi Lee's 11 kills. She was followed by Katie Usher and Brittney Grove, each adding five kills. Usher also placed three blocks, and Grove collected a team-high 13 digs.

The 'Canes were led by Carico's 18 kills and six digs, while McGee tallied eight kills and one block assist. Sundararaman finished with a match-high 36 assists, and Loessberg added 13 digs on defense.

"I think it's important for our team's confidence in knowing it doesn't matter who's on the court and that we can prevail," commented Lantagne Welch on the team's character playing through injuries. "We had a lot of people playing in different spots and positions, and it's going to help us down the stretch in knowing those people can play in those positions."
