THE GAME

- Coming off a 47-10 win over North Carolina at Hard Rock Stadium in its ACC opener last time out on Sept. 27, No. 17/17 Miami opens its
 month of October with its annual rivalry game against Florida State on Saturday, Oct. 6. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m. from Hard Rock Stadium.
- The game will be broadcast on ABC with Bob Wischusen (play by play), Brock Huard (analyst) and Allison Williams (sidelines) on the call. Joe Zagacki (play by play) and Don Bailey, Jr. (color) are in the 560 WQAM radio booth for their 17th season together, while Josh Darrow will handle the sideline duty. Jose "Chamby" Campos (pxp) and Joe Martinez (color) will carry the game on 990AM ESPN Deportes. WVUM 90.5 FM, UM's student radio station, will also be broadcasting the game, as will Compass Media Networks for national radio (Jesse Agler and Chad Brown).

THE SERIES

- The Hurricanes carry a slight 32-30 lead in the rivalry series all-time, with Florida State leading, 20-16, in games played in Miami or Miami Gardens.
- . In the 2017 matchup between the two teams, a touchdown grab from WR Darrell Langham with six seconds left gave UM a miraculous 24-20 win.

THE HURRICANE

- Miami is fresh off a 47-10 win over North Carolina on Sept. 27, the Canes' 12th straight at home in the regular season (dating to Oct. 15, 2016).
- The Hurricanes' current 12-game winning streak at home in the regular season is its longest since winning 26 straight games from 1999 2003.
- After another dominant performance by its defense vs. UNC, Miami is ranked No. 2 nationally in total defense allowing 244.8 yards per game.
- The "Turnover Chain" was all over the place Thursday night, with Miami recording a season-high six turnovers in the win its most since recording six against NC State on September 29, 2012. Miami's defense tied the school record with three defensive touchdowns in the victory; DL Jon Garvin (9-yard fumble return), DL Joe Jackson (42-yard interception return) and DB Romeo Finley (83-yard interception return) all scored vs. the Heels.
- Among UM's top offensive performers against UNC were RB DeeJay Dallas (114 rushing yards, 1 TD) and WR Mike Harley (70 receiving yards).
- QB N'Kosi Perry made the first start of his collegiate career and finished 8-for-12 for 125 passing yards, one touchdown and one interception.
- Miami has returned 14 starters and 44 letterwinners from a 2017 team that won 10 games (10-3) for the first time since 2003 and advanced to the ACC Championship Game for the first time eyer. The Hurricanes ended the year in the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time since 2003.
- Miami's seven wins in ACC play (7-1) in 2017 were the most in program history, as the Hurricanes captured the ACC's Coastal Division title for the
 first time. Mark Richt was named ACC Coach of the Year in a year where UM finished with a perfect 7-0 home record during the regular season.

THE OPPONENT

- Florida State is under the direction of head coach Willie Taggart who has a compiled a 50-52 overall record and a 3-2 mark with the Seminoles.
- The Seminoles are coming off a 28-24 win at Louisville last time out; Florida State has won back-to-back games entering Saturday's matchup.
- The Seminoles' offense is led by WR Nyqwan Murray (25 catches, 345 yards), QB Deondre Francois (1,377 passing yards, 9 TDs) and RB Cam Akers (316 yards, 1 TD). Defensively, Florida State is paced by DB Hamsah Nasirildeen (40 total tackles) and DE Brian Burns (6.5 TFLs, five sacks).

QUICH HITS

UM HOST RIVALRY MATCHUP WITH FSU

- The No. 17/17 Hurricanes wrap up a season-long homestand on Saturday, Oct.
 6 when they host the rival Florida State Seminoles at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Miami has an 8-6 record all-time in ACC openers since joining the conference in 2004, including wins in both ACC openers under head coach **Mark Richt** (2016 at Georgia Tech, 2017 at Duke).
- The Hurricanes have opened ACC play with North Carolina only once before in 2008, when they dropped a home matchup, 24-28, on Sept. 27, 2008 10 years to the day before Thursday's matchup.
- UM is opening ACC play at home for the first time since the 2013 season; it opened on the road four straight years (2014-17).

MIAMI THRASHES UNC IN ACC OPENER

- The Hurricanes crushed North Carolina in their ACC opener Thursday, Sept. 27, topping the visiting Tar Heels, 47-10, at Hard Rock Stadium.
- Opening ACC play at home for the first time since 2013, the Hurricanes improved to 9-6 all-time in conference openers with the win over the Heels.
- QB N'Kosi Perry made the first start of his career and finished 8-for-12 for 125 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- UM's defense tied the school record by scoring three touchdowns (two interception returns, one fumble return) in the win. The last time Miami did that was at West Virginia on Sept. 23, 2000.

HURRICANE DEFENSE CONTINUES TO SHINE

- Miami's defense continues to shine under third-year defensive coordinator Manny Diaz, who has shaped the Hurricanes' unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure.
- The Hurricanes defense ranks among the nation's best in several categories, including No. 1 in both opponent third down conversion percentage (17.1%), team tackles for loss per game (12.0) and passing yards allowed per game (138.8 yards).
- The Canes are ranked second nationally in total defense (244.8 yards per game) and are ranked fourth nationally in turnovers gained (12)
- Miami has conceded just 70 first downs on defense, the 13th-fewest nationwide and the fewest among all defenses in the ACC.

RIVALRY RENEWED AS #17/#17 HURRICANES WRAP UP HOMESTAND

- The No. 17/17 Miami Hurricanes wrap up a season-long homestand when they host Florida State in their annual rivalry matchup on Saturday, Oct. 6 at Hard Rock Stadium. Kickoff is set for 3:30 p.m.
- Both the Hurricanes and Seminoles are coming off their first conference wins of the season; Miami took down North Carolina, 47-10, in its ACC opener while FSU topped Louisville, 28-24, on the road.
- The Hurricanes will be looking for their 13th straight regular-season home win when they host the Seminoles; UM's last loss at home in the regular season came all the way back on Oct. 15, 2016.
- Miami leads the all-time series by a slight 32-30 margin, with FSU carrying a 20-16 lead in games
 played in Miami. The Hurricanes captured a thrilling 24-20 win in Tallahassee in the 2017 matchup.
- The Canes check in at No. 17 in the Associated Press poll and were also ranked No. 17 in the Amway Coaches Poll - Miami has appeared in both polls for the last 23 straight polls, dating to Jan. 10, 2017.

LAST TIME OUT: MIAMI CRUSHES CAROLINA IN CONFERENCE OPENER

- Miami downed visiting North Carolina, 47-10, on Sept. 27 in the Hurricanes' first Thursday night home game since 2012. The win was Miami's fourth in a row and 12th straight regular-season home victory.
- The Hurricanes' 37-point margin of victory over the Tar Heels was the third-largest in an ACC game in program history, trailing only a 52-7 win over Duke in 2005 and a 52-7 win over Wake Forest in 2004.
- Miami's defense overwhelmed North Carolina in the rout, scoring three touchdowns tying the program record - on two interception returns for touchdowns and one fumble return for a score.
- The Canes finished with 14 tackles for loss, three sacks, three interceptions and three forced fumbles.
- The Hurricanes' six turnovers marked their most since also having six vs. NC State on Sept. 29, 2012.
- Miami scored touchdowns four different ways: interception return, fumble return, passing and rushing. It was the first time Miami did it in those four ways since August 28, 2003 vs. Louisiana Tech.
- Others that enjoyed strong performances in the win over UNC include WR Mike Harley, who totaled a team-high 70 receiving yards, and RB DeeJay Dallas, who had a career-best 114 yards and one TD.
- Miami is 9-6 all-time in ACC openers, and has won all three of its opening conference games under head coach Mark Richt. The Hurricanes have an 11-4 all-time record in ACC home openers since 2004.

DEFENSE CONTINUING TO DOMINATE UNDER DIAZ'S DIRECTION AS D.C.

- The Hurricanes defense has shined under the direction of third-year defensive coordinator Manny
 Diaz, who has molded Miami's unit into one of the nation's elite during his tenure as coordinator.
- In the NCAA rankings released Sept. 30, Miami was second in the nation and first in the ACC in total defense (244.8 yards per game); its 138.8 passing yards allowed per game was best in the nation.
- Miami's defense ranked No. 1 nationally in both third down conversion percentage (17.1%) and team tackles for loss (12.0). The Hurricanes' 12 turnovers gained are tied for fourth-most in the nation.
- Among Miami's top performers on defense has been DL Gerald Willis III, who is tied for third in the
 nation and leads the ACC in tackles for loss (2.1 per game). Right behind Willis, in 11th place nationally
 and second place in the ACC, is DL Jon Garvin, who has totaled 9.5 tackles for loss (1.9 per game).

BREAK OUT THE CHAIN AGAIN! TURNOVER CHAIN 2.0 IS HERE FOR 2018

- When sophomore DB Trajan Bandy pounced on a loose ball in the second quarter of Miami's game
 vs. Savannah State, the crowd turned to observe a familiar sight from 2017: the "Turnover Chain."
- But instead of last year's chain, which was modeled in the shape of the iconic "U" logo, Bandy was
 presented a brand new turnover chain to wear featuring a charm in the model of Sebastian the Ibis.
- Turnover Chain 2.0 is comprised of more than 4,000 stones (compared to 900 last year), weighs roughly three kilograms (compared to two last year) and has an 8.5-inch charm (compared to 5.5).

JACKSON, QUARTERMAN RECOGNIZED FOR DOMINANT GAMES VS UNC

- Juniors **Joe Jackson** and **Shaq Quarterman** were honored for their dominant performances against North Carolina in a 47-10 win on Sept. 27, earning weekly ACC honors from the conference on Oct. 1.
- Jackson was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week after tallying five tackles, one sack, two forced fumbles and his second career TD on a 42-yard interception return in the second quarter.
- Quarterman, the ACC's Co-Linebacker of the Week, set a career high with 3.0 tackles for loss, had two sacks and forced a fumble that resulted in Miami's first of three defensive touchdowns on the night.
- Jackson and Quarterman join **Gerald Willis III** (Defensive Lineman, Sept. 4) as ACC weekly honorees.

WILLIS WREAKING HAVOC AS ONE OF FBS TACKLE-FOR-LOSS LEADERS

- Playing in his first game since Nov. 26, 2016, DL **Gerald Willis III** delivered an overpowering performance in the trenches against a talented LSU offensive line in the season opener on Sept. 2.
- Willis posted a career-high eight tackles in his first career collegiate start (four solo), and recorded an eye-popping 4.0 tackles for loss the first such performance by a Hurricane defender since 2008.
- UM has had six individual performances of 3.0 tackles for loss this year through the first five games; Miami had six total in the first two seasons combined under Manny Diaz' direction (26 games).
- Willis, who was named ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for that performance, has not slowed down since; he is tied for third in the nation in tackles for loss per game, averaging 2.1 per contest, and leads the Hurricanes with three games of at least 3.0 tackles for loss this season
- The last Hurricane with 4.0 tackles for loss in a game was Marcus Robinson vs. Virginia Tech in 2008.

OFFSEASON FOCUS ON 3RD DOWN PAYING OFF FOR OFFENSE, DEFENSE

- After the very first day of fall camp, Mark Richt & staff stressed an emphasis on third downs on both sides of the ball, saying Miami practiced third downs on Day 1 as opposed to waiting til later in camp.
- The Hurricanes, who finished last year ranked 125th in third down conversion percentage on offense and 75th on defense, have benefited from the offseason focus; Miami is up to No. 17 on offense on third down conversion percentage (48.4%) and ranked No. 1 nationally on the defensive side (17.1%).
- The Hurricanes converted 3 of 6 (50%) of fhird downs vs. UNC and surrendered just 2 of 13 (15.4%).
- Against FIU (Sept. 22), Miami converted 53.3% of its third downs on offense (8 of 15) and allowed the Panthers to convert just 21.4% (3 of 14) of its third-down opportunities. The Hurricanes finished 6 of 16 (37.5) on third downs vs. LSU (Sept. 2) and held the Tigers to a paltry 3 of 16 mark (18.7).
- Against Savannah State (Sept. 8), Miami finished 7 of 12 on offense (58.3) and held the Tigers to a 2-for-16 (12.5) success rate. In the Hurricanes' game at Toledo (Sept. 15), the Miami offense converted 46.6 percent (7 of 15) of third downs compared to just 18.1 percent (2 of 11) by the Rockets.

HURRICANES HAVE BEEN TOUGH TO BEAT AT HARD ROCK UNDER RICHT

- With a 47-10 win over North Carolina last time out on Sept. 27, the Hurricanes won their 12th straight regular season game at home. The streak dates back to Oct. 15, 2016, its last loss (vs. North Carolina).
- Miami has a 14-3 overall record at Hard Rock Stadium since **Mark Richt**'s arrival prior to 2016, and finished last year with a 7-1 record at the venue including a perfect 7-0 mark in the regular season.
- Miami's 7-0 record at home in the 2017 regular season marked the first undefeated regular season at home since 2002; the Hurricanes finished a perfect 4-0 in ACC games at Hard Rock Stadium last year.
- UM's lone 2017 loss at the venue came in the Capital One Orange Bowl, falling to Wisconsin, 34-24.
- In 16 regular season games at home under Richt's direction, the Hurricanes are averaging 40.75 points per game and allowing an average of 15.8 points per game, a positive average of 24.95 points.

MIAMI HAS TWO-PRONGED RUSHING ATTACK IN DALLAS AND HOMER

- Miami's two-pronged running back attack in junior RB Travis Homer (364 rushing yards) and RB
 DeeJay Dallas (338 rushing yards) has provided a boost for the Hurricanes offense this season.
- Dallas has averaged 7.0 yards per carry on just 48 carries with two touchdowns, while Homer, who has started every game at running back this season, is averaging 5.8 yards per carry with one TD.
- The two running backs have split reps over the past few weeks, with Dallas recording 100-yard rushing games vs. Toledo (Sept. 15, 110 yards) and North Carolina (Sept. 27, 114) and Homer doing it vs. FIU (Sept. 22, 114). Homer has four career 100-yard rush games while Dallas has two such games.

N'KOSI IMPRESSING, TO MAKE SECOND CAREER START SATURDAY VS FSU

- QB **N'Kosi Perry** impressed in the first major action of his career, throwing for a career high-tying three TD passes and finishing 17-of-25 for a career-best 224 yards and one INT vs. FIU (Sept. 22).
- Perry entered in the third series and eventually compiled the longest scoring drives of 2018 by yards (87) & time (7:11), while tying the season long for a scoring drive by play count (14) in that game.
- Perry made the first start of his career vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) and finished 8-for-12 for 125 passing yards, one touchdown and one interception. He is completing 66.7 percent of his passes.
- The Ocala, Fla., native was a consensus four-star quarterback by 247Sports, ESPN, Rivals and Scout, and was rated as the third-best dual sport in the nation by ESPN and sixth-best by 247Sports.
- Perry, ranked No. 84 in the final ESPN300 rankings, chose Miami over offers from Auburn, Georgia, Tennessee, Florida State and West Virginia, among others. He has 7 TDs and 3 interceptions this year.

THOMAS SHOWCASING ELECTRIC PLAYMAKING ABILITY IN YEAR 2

- Sophomore WR Jeff Thomas has showed off his playmaking abilities through the first five games.
- In UM's last road game vs. Toledo (Sept. 15), Thomas led Miami in all-purpose yards (171) for the third straight game. He had a 100-yard receiving game (105) and tied a career mark with five catches.
- Thomas, who struggled with dehydration vs. FIU (Sept. 22), left in the first quarter and did not return.
- Thomas ranks first in the nation in yards per reception, averaging a whopping 24.62 yards per catch.
- Against LSU (Sept. 2), Thomas started and made a number of acrobatic catches, hauling in a careerhigh five passes for a career-high 132 yards; his previous highs were three receptions and 101 yards.
- Thomas once again showcased his electric speed vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8). Thomas hauled in a 67-yard TD pass and finished with 183 all-purpose yards - including career-high 90 punt return yards.
- Thomas, who led the Hurricanes with 22 plays of at least 20 yards in 2017, already has 14 such plays (six receptions, five kick returns, three punt returns) - including six of UM's top-10 longest off. plays.
- Thomas' 67-yard TD vs. Savannah State was UM's longest play of the season and the fourth catch of at least 50 yards in his career; Thomas also hauled in a 50-yard reception in the opener against LSU.
- The East St. Louis, Ill., native was on the receiving end of the two longest pass plays for UM in 2017.

JORDAN EMERGING AS TOP TARGET AT TIGHT END AS TRUE FRESHMAN

- Playing his first season of college football, TE **Brevin Jordan** has already emerged as a go-to target in the Miami offense; Jordan is tied for second in both receptions (13) and receiving touchdowns (3).
- Jordan, who has 123 receiving yards and is averaging 9.5 yards per reception, has played in all five games and made four starts this year. He had a career-best 67 yards in Miami's win ys. FIU (Sept. 22).
- The Las Vegas native posted a career-high seven catches and two TDs vs. Savannah St (Sept. 8).
- Miami's projected starting tight end, **Michael Irvin II**, suffered an MCL injury during fall camp.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals.

HARLEY IMPRESSING AS SOPHOMORE, WAS A CAPTAIN FOR UNC GAME

- With WR **Jeff Thomas** struggling with first-quarter dehydration against FIU (Sept. 22), WR **Mike Harley** stepped up in his absence and delivered the best performance of his career in a 31-17 win.
- Harley led all players with a career-best seven catches in the win over the Panthers, posting a career-high 76 yards. His long catch of 42 yards is tied for the seventh-longest play by Miami this season.
- Harley was named a team captain vs. North Carolina (Sept. 27) and made his first career start. He led all Hurricanes with 70 receiving yards, and tied a career-long with a 42-yard reception vs. UNC.
- The south Florida native has a team-high 16 catches for 173 yards this season besting his personal totals from last season already (nine catches, 91 yards). He is averaging 34.6 yards per game.

CAGER HAS BEEN A TOUCHDOWN MACHINE FOR HURRICANES OFFENSE

- WR Lawrence Cager has a team-leading four touchdowns this season and has been among Miami's top targets in the end zone. Cager had the first multi-TD game of his career vs. FIU (Sept. 22)
- Cager's four touchdowns this season already mark a career high; his previous high was three in 2017.
- Of Cager's 33 career catches, eight have gone for touchdowns (24.2%); his two-touchdown performance vs. FIU was just the second by a Hurricane this year (Brevin Jordan vs. Savannah State).
- Cager's four receiving TDs this season are tied for 28th-most nationwide and third-most in the ACC.
- Cager still holds the Calvert Hall high school jump record from 2015, having jumped a whopping 6'2".

JONATHAN GARVIN ENJOYING SOPHOMORE SURGE ON DEFENSIVE LINE

- The Miami Hurricanes' defensive line took a hit when three of its four 2017 starters departed this past
 offseason, but one of the players who has stepped up in his sophomore year has been end Jon Garvin.
- Garvin, who totaled just nine tackles as a true freshman in 2017 ranks second on UM with 25 tackles this year; he set a career high with eight vs. LSU (Sept. 2) and matched it vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8).
- Garvin is ranked 11th in the nation and second in ACC with an average of 1.9 tackles for loss per game. The only player he's trailing? Teammate **Gerald Willis III**, who leads the ACC in the statistic (2.1/game).
- Garvin, who had just 3.0 tackles for loss as a true freshman, already has 9.5 tackles for loss in 2018; he became the first Hurricane to have multiple games with 3.0 TFL since **Denzel Perryman** in 2011.
- The Lake Worth, Fla., native goes by "Neo" his middle name and the name of his grandfather.

"NO FLY ZONE" - MIAMI'S PASSING DEFENSE RANKS AS NATION'S BEST

- Miami's defense, ranked second nationally in total defense, has been especially stout on quarterbacks, holding opponents to a nation-low average of 138.8 passing yards per game.
- The Hurricanes' team passing efficiency defense is second-best in the ACC (111.40) and 8th nationally.
- Miami is allowing just 16.8 points per game the second-best scoring defense in the ACC.
- Led by two apiece from Jhavonte Dean and Sheldrick Redwine, the Hurricanes have totaled seven interceptions through the first five games the 11th-most nationwide and third-most in the ACC.

- In a win over Toledo on Sept. 15, Dallas posted the first 100-yard game of his career (110) in Miami's 49-24 victory. Dallas has already surpassed his 2017 true freshman mark of 217 total rushing yards.
- Dallas' 17 rushes against the Rockets also marked a career high for the Brunswick, Ga., native.
- Dallas did it again vs. UNC on Sept. 27, posting a career-high 114 yards on just 11 carries with one TD.
- His 420 all-purpose yards are the second-most on Miami, trailing only WR Jeff Thomas' 636 APY.
- Dallas, whose full first name is Demetrius, served as recruiting ambassador for the Hurricanes'
 "#Squad17" class and was originally committed to Richt during his time as Georgia head coach.

LINGARD POSTS LONGEST RUN BY TRUE FRESHMAN SINCE DUKE IN 2012

- With a 64-yard touchdown run on Sept. 8 against Savannah State, RB Lorenzo Lingard recorded the longest rush by a true freshman running back since Duke Johnson had a 65-yard rush against Duke in his true freshman season finale on Nov. 24, 2012 in Durham, N.C., which was also a touchdown run.
- Lingard, who has seen action in four games, is third on the team with 136 rushing yards this season on 17 carries. Lingard is averaging 8.0 yards per carry and 34.0 yards per game through his first four games.

HURRICANES SET RECORDS IN WIN OVER TIGERS IN HOME OPENER

- The Miami Hurricanes opened their 11th season at Hard Rock Stadium on Sept. 8 vs. Savannah State, capturing a 77-0 shutout victory to improve to 11-0 all-time in home openers at the stadium. Miami has outscored opponents 500-69 for an average margin of victory of 39.2 points in those 11 games.
- Miami's 77 points tied a program record for most points in a single game (also set against Savannah State, in September 2013), while its 77-point margin of victory was the largest in program history.
- The Hurricanes have not lost a home opener since 2006, when they fell to Florida State 13-10 at the Orange Bowl on Sept. 4, 2006. Miami has won 12 straight home openers since, a program record.

DEFENSE RECORDS FIRST SHUTOUT SINCE 2015 IN WIN OVER TIGERS

- The Miami Hurricanes' defense was able to compile its first shutout since the 2015 season opener against Bethune-Cookman (Sept. 5, 2015) in a 77-0 win over Savannah State on Saturday, Sept. 8.
- The shutout was the first under the current Miami staff, including defensive coordinator Manny Diaz.
- Diaz's last shutout as defensive coordinator came exactly six years to the day before Miami's win over Savannah State; as the coordinator at Texas, Diaz's Longhorns shutout New Mexico on Sept. 8, 2012.

- Former head coach Howard Schnellenberger led the 1983 champions "through the smoke" at halftime of Miami's game against FIU. Roughly 65 former players, coaches & staff members from that national championship team were in attendance. UM held a special closed ceremony on Sept. 21 on campus.
- The Hurricanes finished that season with an 11-1 record and topped Nebraska, 31-30, at the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1984 for the first national championship in program history.

- After discussing his future with legendary Miami safety Ed Reed, DB Jaquan Johnson turned down
 the opportunity to enter the NFL Draft, choosing to return for his senior season with the Hurricanes.
- The Hurricanes are undoubtedly happy with his decision, as Johnson a Preseason All-America first-team selection by the Associated Press, a Preseason All-ACC selection and a watch list member for three major defensive awards led Miami with 96 tackles and tied for the team lead with four picks.
- In his first game of 2018, Johnson served as one of four captains and totaled a game-high 11 tackles.
- Johnson missed games vs. FIU (Sept. 22) and North Carolina (Sept. 27) with a hamstring injury.
- As a junior, Johnson was of four defensive semifinalists for the Walter Camp Player of the Year.
- Johnson was named ACC Defensive of the Back three weeks in a row in 2017 (Nov. 6, Nov. 13, Nov. 20), becoming the first Hurricane player to ever be honored by the ACC in three consecutive weeks.
- The last ACC player to earn honors in three straight weeks was Deshaun Watson of Clemson in 2014.

THREE-HEADED LINEBACKER MONSTER IN MIDST OF JUNIOR YEARS

- Miami's three-headed monster junior linebacker trio Zach McCloud, Michael Pinckney and Shaq
 Quarterman has started nearly every game together since arriving to UM as early enrollees in 2016.
- Last time out vs. UNC (Sept. 27), the trio started, combining for 17 total tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss, two sacks & one forced fumble. The trio has started alongside each other four of five games in 2018.
- McCloud has started 26 of 31 career games through the first five weeks of 2018. McCloud finished with 48 tackles (29 solo), 4.5 tackles for loss in 2017. He led Miami with eight total tackles vs. UNC.
- One of UM's most instinctive players, Pinckney started 11 of 13 games last season and ended up with 68 total tackles, 11.0 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks. He recorded four total tackles last time vs. UNC.
- Quarterman, who has started all 30 games for the Hurricanes in two-plus seasons, ranked second on the team with 83 tackles a sophomore in 2017. Quarterman was unblockable last time out, finishing with 3.0 tackles for loss, two sacks, one forced fumble and five total tackles in a 47-10 victory.

KEEPING IT IN THE "U FAMILY"

- As is often the case at the University of Miami, a number of Canes have family ties to 'The U'
- Five Canes had fathers who suited up in orange and green: TE Michael Irvin II (father is Michael) II, DL Scott Patchan (Matt), DL Pat Bethel (Randy), P Zach Feagles (Jeff) & DB Al Blades, Jr. (Al, Sr.)
- WR Evidence Njoku is the brother of David, who was taken by Cleveland in the 2017 NFL Draft.
- QB Cade Weldon is the son of Casey Weldon, former quarterback at Florida State under Mark Richt.

TRUE FROSH TIGHT END DUO MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR MIAMI

- Two key members of Miami's #Storm18 signing class have played bigger roles than already was anticipated after junior tight end Michael Irvin II suffered an MCL injury during fall camp.
- Freshman tight end duo Brevin Jordan and Will Mallory, who became friends through the recruiting
 process and were ranked among the nation's best at the position, have been counted on early in 2018.
- In addition to playing together on the field, Jordan and Mallory are freshman roommates at The U.
- In the home opener vs. Savannah State (Sept. 8), Mallory opened the game's scoring with a two-yard touchdown pass the very first catch of his career. Mallory made his first career start in the victory.
- Jordan, who started the season opener, had a dominant outing of his own against the Tigers, setting career marks in receptions (seven) to go along with the first two touchdowns of his Miami career.
- Jordan was ranked the No. 1 tight end in the country by ESPN.com and 247Sports and No. 2 by Rivals, while Mallory was ranked the third-best tight end by ESPN.com. The two are roommates at The U.

ROSIER SETS CAREER MARK AT TOLEDO, NOW HAS 44 TDs FOR CAREER

- In his first season as Miami's starting quarterback in 2017, Malik Rosier set UM's single-season "touchdowns responsible for" record with 31 besting Vinny Testaverde's previous record of 30 set during Testaverde's 1986 Heisman Trophy campaign. He threw for 26 TDs and rushed for five scores.
- The Hurricanes have posted a 14-4 record in games started by Rosier during his Miami career as QB.
- The Mobile, Ala., native threw for 3,120 yards, setting the single-season total offense record at Miami (3,588) and finishing with a 10-3 record for the year. He has compiled 10 TDs in 2018 (5 rushing, 5 passing. He had a career-high five TD on the road at Toledo on Sept. 15 (3 rushing, 2 passing).
- With five TDs in Miami's win over the Rockets, Rosier has now been responsible for 44 career touchdowns (11 rushing, 33 passing). He also started the game vs. FIU, playing in two series.
- Rosier's performance against Toledo was the first three-rushing TD, two-passing TD game by a Hurricanes quarterback since Miami joined the ACC for the 2004 season.

HIGHTOWER WOWS IN FIRST COLLEGIATE GAME, SCORES TOUCHDOWN

- Among Miami's most impressive freshman performers vs. LSU (Sept. 2) was WR Brian Hightower, who hauled in a 32-yard TD reception on a connection with QB Malik Rosier in the fourth quarter.
- Hightower, who saw signification action in the game vs. LSU, became the first Hurricane wide receiver to record a touchdown for his first collegiate catch since Tyre Brady vs. Nebraska in 2015.
- Hightower made the first start of his career on Sept. 22 vs. FIU; he has 3 catches for 53 yards this year.
- The last Hurricane to have his first catch end up in a touchdown was FB **Marquez Williams** in 2016.
- Hightower was a consensus four-star recruit ranked the No. 141 overall player in his class by ESPN.

DEFENSE, TURNOVER CHAIN HAS DAZZLED UNDER DADE'S OWN DIAZ

- Defensive coordinator **Manny Diaz** has directed the UM defense into one of the nation's top groups in his two-plus seasons at The U, and his 2017 unit ranked among the nation's best in several stats.
- Miami's defense ranked ninth nationally in opponent yards per play (4.5) in 2017, the most important modern metric when measuring a college football defense. UM ranked No. 16 in OYPP (4.7) in 2016.
- The Hurricanes led the nation in team sacks (3.38) and was 3rd in team tackles for loss (8.8) in 2017.
- One of college football's biggest storylines in 2017 was the emergence of Miami's "turnover chain," and after the Canes posted the ACC's best turnover margin in 2017, the chain will be back in 2018
- Miami's 31 turnovers gained were the third-most in the nation and most in the ACC, while its +1.00 average turnover margin (+13 for the season) was tied for the fifth-best mark in the nation.
- The Hurricanes have already begun to make their mark in 2018, ranking fourth nationally in total defense, first in third down conversion percentage defense and first in team tackles for loss.

10 TRUE FRESHMEN, 13 TOTAL SEE FIRST ACTION OF CAREER VS. LSU

- 10 true freshmen suited up for the first time in the season opener vs. LSU, while three others redshirt freshman WR **Evidence Njoku**, DL **Tito Odenigbo** and OL **Venzell Boulware** also debuted.
- 10 true freshmen made their debuts against LSU in the AdvoCare Classic: RB Lorenzo Lingard, WR Brian Hightower, DB Al Blades, Jr., DB DJ Ivey, WR Dee Wiggins, TE Brevin Jordan, DL Gregory Rousseau, K Bubba Baxa, OL DJ Scaife, Jr. and TE Will Mallory.

CAROL SOFFER INDOOR PRACTICE FACILITY OPEN FOR BUSINESS

- On August 17, 2018, history was made at the University of Miami, as the Miami Hurricanes practiced inside the Carol Soffer Indoor Practice Facility for the very first time during fall camp.
- In September 2016, Miami announced the largest donation in the history of the athletics department as the lead gift for a state-of-the-art football indoor practice facility. In honor of their mother Carol, Jeffrey Soffer and Carol's other children made a \$14 million commitment towards the facility.
- Head coach Mark Richt pledged \$1 million towards the facility and football alumnus and linebacker great Jon Beason was among those alumni to give to the project. Beason's gift was \$250,000, as Miami alumni and former players teamed up to contribute more than \$2 million for the project.
- The 81,800-square-foot facility features two field-turf fields one 90 yards long and one 40 yards.

HURRICANES LOOKING TO GAIN STRENGTH IN YEAR 3 UNDER RICHT

- Miami enjoyed an impressive 2017 season under the direction of head coach **Mark Richt**, who guided the Hurricanes to 10 wins and a College Football Playoff ranking as high as No. 2 in his second year.
- The Hurricanes, who captured the ACC's Coastal Division for the first time in its history for a spot in the ACC Championship, earned an invite to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years.
- Richt was named 2017 ACC Coach of the Year and was also named Walter Camp Coach of the Year.
- Miami had three players selected to the Preseason All-ACC Football Team: DB Michael Jackson, DB
 Jaquan Johnson and LB Shaquille Quarterman. In addition to his recognition by the conference,
 Johnson was selected to the Associated Press Preseason All-America First Team at safety.
- The Hurricanes return 3,120 of their 3,153 passing yards from 2017 (98.9%) and 1,697 of 2,090 rushing yards (81.2%), which accounts for a combined 91.8% of total offense returning heading into 2018.

TRUE FRESHMEN ALREADY MAKING AN EARLY IMPACT FOR UM IN 2018

- Miami's recruiting class, nicknamed #Storm18, was ranked the consensus No. 1 class in Florida and a consensus top-8 class overall for the first time since 2012. It was ranked No. 6 nationally by Rivals.
- True freshmen have accounted for six total touchdowns already, including two each from RB
 Lorenzo Lingard and TE Brevin Jordan. TE Will Mallory and WR Brian Hightower each have one.
- Both Jordan (two games) and Mallory (one game) have earned starts in the early going of their college careers, while DB Al Blades, Jr., was named special teams captain for UM's game at Toledo.
- UM's recruiting class included 14 players ranked in the ESPN300, 12 in 247Sports' national rankings, 12 ranked in Rivals 250, and 10 players who were either U.S. Army or Under Armour All-Americans.
- Miami's class was ranked No. 8 nationally by both 247Sports and ESPN and ranked the second-best class in the ACC by both organizations. 247Sports, ESPN and Rivals all had UM's class No. 1 in Florida.
- 10 members of the signing class enrolled early and took part in spring practice: QB Jarren Williams, RB Lorenzo Lingard, WR Brian Hightower, WR Dee Wiggins, DL Greg Rousseau, OL John Campbell, Jr., OL DJ Scaife, Jr., DB Gurvan Hall, Jr., DB DJ Ivey and DB Gilbert Frierson

HOMER IMPRESSED IN FIRST YEAR AS STARTING RUNNING BACK IN 2017

- After a season-ending injury to Mark Walton in the early part of 2017, RB **Travis Homer** stepped up and saw action in all 13 games last year. He took over starting duties four games into the year.
- Homer has posted 364 rushing yards through the first five games (5.8 yards-per-carry average) and had the first 100-yard rushing game of the season in a 31-17 victory over the FIU Panthers on Sept. 22.
- The 100-yard rushing performance was the fourth of his career; he had three such games in 2017.
- Homer rushed for 966 yards on 163 attempts (5.9 yards per carry) with eight rushing TDs in 2017.
- The West Palm Beach native, who was selected to the All-ACC Second Team in 2017, compiled 1,203 all-purpose yards and three 100-yard rushing games including 170 in his first start vs. Georgia Tech.
- The Palm Beach native became the eighth Miami tailback to have recorded a 100-yard game in his first career start since 2000, and the fourth to do it in an Atlantic Coast Conference game.
- Homer is Miami's leading active rusher with 1,374 rushing yards and nine rushing touchdowns.

THOMAS SHOWCASED SPEED, BIG PLAY ABILITY IN FRESHMAN YEAR

- WR **Jeff Thomas** was a key contributor in his first season at Miami and was responsible for two of the three longest offensive plays of the season and four of the top-11 longest plays of the year.
- Thomas had the two longest receptions of the season a 78-yard touchdown against North Carolina and a 70-yard reception against Georgia Tech. He also had a 48-yard reception vs. Wisconsin in the Capital One Orange Bowl and a 48-yard touchdown reception against Syracuse.
- Thomas, who totaled 374 receiving yards on 17 receptions, averaged a team-high 22.0-yards per catch and 28.8 receiving yards per game. He played in all 13 games and made four starts.

- The Miami x Parley A1 uniforms were auctioned off with the proceeds going to the Rosenstiel School of Marine and Atmospheric Science to launch a fund for educational research.

RICHT RECOGNIZES MIAMI PAST, INVITES HONORARY CAPTAINS

- After his return to his alma mater, head coach Mark Richt instituted honorary captains all of whom are Miami Football alumni to speak to the team on the Fridays before home games in-season.
- The first honorary captain for the 2018 season was OL Dennis Harrah, who played at UM from 1972-74.
- Miami's ACC opener vs. North Carolina on Sept. 27 featured a special honorary captain LB Jon Vilma, who served as the ESPN analyst for the game in the broadcast booth.
- In 2017, the list of honorary captain list included all-time Miami greats like QB George Mira, DB Bennie Blades, WR Reggie Wayne, DB Ed Reed and DB Antrel Rolle, among others.
- Richt's invitation to honorary captains further extends his dedication to his alma mater and the
 alumni who have passed through the program; in August of 2017, Richt hosted his first "U Network"
 event dedicated to helping Miami Football alumni find jobs in their post-football lives.

MARK RICHT

HEAD COACH | THIRD SEASON AT MIAMI (18th OVERALL) | 168-59 (.740)

In just two seasons as head coach, Mark Richt has made an indelible impact on his alma mater's football program -- both on and off the field.

Richt posted a 19-7 record over his first two seasons, the third best start in Miami history, and a stretch that included a 15-game winning streak -- UM's longest since 2002. The Hurricanes won 10 games in 2017, climbing as high as second in the College Football Playoff rankings. Miami captured the Atlantic Coast Conference's Coastal Division for the first time in its history and earned an invitation to the Capital One Orange Bowl for the first time in 13 years. Richt won 2017 ACC Coach of the Year honors and was also named the 2017 Walter Camp Coach of the Year.

The Hurricanes ranked first in team sacks per game (3.38), and ranked third the nation in turnovers forced in 2017 (31). Junior quarterback Malik Rosier accounted for 31 total touchdowns, breaking Vinny Testaverde's single-season school record, and helping Miami rank 15th in the nation in red zone offense (90.7 percent). Junior defensive back Jaquan Johnson had a breakout season, leading the team with 96 tackles, picking off four passes and earning ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors three times. Overall, 10 Hurricanes earned All-ACC honors, including kicker Michael Badgley, who was named first-team All-ACC.

Off the field, Richt has energized the program, from supporting the fundraising efforts for the Carol Soffer Football Indoor Practice Facility to launching The U Network, which assists former Hurricanes in networking and career placement after their playing careers have concluded. Miami was one of three schools, along with Stanford and Northwestern, to earn the 2016 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Academic Achievement Award. In addition, the Hurricanes ranked first among all FBS programs in 2016 in the NCAA Team Works Helper Helper Community Service Competition, and helped Miami finish first among Division I schools overall in 2018.

Richt was named the University of Miami's 24th head football coach on Dec. 4, 2015. His hiring provided immediate dividends as the Hurricanes posted a 9-4 record in his first season in Coral Gables. Miami then defeated West Virginia, 31-14, in the Russell Athletic Bowl for the program's first bowl victory in 10 years. The Hurricanes were ranked No. 20 in

the final Associated Press poll and No. 23 in the final Amway Coaches Poll – the program's first season-ending rankings since 2009.

Miami had 10 players earned ACSMA All-ACC honors in 2016, while quarterback Brad Kaaya became Miami's all-time passing yards leader. Freshman wide receiver Ahmmon Richards broke the 31-year-old freshman receiving record at Miami originally set by Michael Irvin, while sophomore running back Mark Walton became the 11th 1,000-yard rusher in program history.

Six Hurricanes were selected in the 2018 NFL Draft. Nine Hurricanes were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, the most for Miami since 2006, including first-round pick David Njoku to the Cleveland Browns. Richt has had 99 of his players drafted as a head coach, including 14 first-round picks.

Richt, born in Omaha, Neb., and raised in Boca Raton, Fla., returned to his alma mater after leading the University of Georgia football program for the previous 15 years. He compiled a 145-51 overall record and an 85-40 mark in Southeastern Conference play. Georgia won two SEC championships, six SEC East titles and nine bowl games under Richt, and finished the season in the Associated Press Top-10 rankings seven times.

Richt's 164 career wins rank fourth among active FBS head coaches and his .744 winning percentage ranks as the seventh best among current FBS coaches with at least five years of experience. Richt is one of only seven head coaches in SEC history to record four straight 10-win seasons (2002-05).

Richt coached some of the greatest quarterbacks in Georgia history, including David Greene, a four-year starter who left Athens as the then-winningest quarterback in NCAA history with 42 career wins. Aaron Murray, also a four-year starter, is the SEC's all-time leader in passing yards (13,166) and touchdown passes (121). Matthew Stafford threw for 3,459 yards and 25 touchdowns (then a school record) as a junior for the Bulldogs.

Richt is married to the former Katharyn Francis of Tallahassee. The couple has four children – Jonathan, David, Zach, and Anya. Jon, the Miami quarterbacks coach, was married to the former Anna Cearley in May 2010. They have two daughters, Jadyn and Zoe.




