#RIVALRYWEEKEND STORYLINES & NEWS

- No. 4 Miami wraps up its regular season in Tallahassee, Fla., with a rivalry series against Florida State from May 19-21.
- UM is riding a seven-game winning streak into Thursday's series opener, and has won three straight weekend series.
- The Hurricanes clinched their third straight ACC Coastal Division title on May 15, and have a 19-6 mark in ACC play.
- By virtue of its Coastal title, Miami is assured of a top-two seed at the 2016 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, N.C.
- In the most recent NCAA RPI release on May 16, UM was ranked No. 3 with 13 wins against the current RPI top 25 (13-7).
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,000th game at the University of Miami in a 5-4 walk-off win over Clemson on March 26. With a 4-0 victory over FGCU on April 5, Morris moved past Larry Hays (1,508) into fifth in all-time Division I wins.
- Miami's .982 fielding percentage through May 16 was the fourth-best mark in the country & the ACC's best percentage.
- Senior Brandon Lopez has reached base in 34 straight games, and ranks 3rd in the ACC with a .404 batting average.
- Junior Zack Collins enters the weekend ranked 3rd among active Division I players in career homers (36) & 3rd in RBI (172).
- Junior Bryan Garcia sits in a tie for second in all-time saves (37) at Miami; he is the nation's active leader in career saves.
- Sophomore Michael Mediavilla and junior Danny Garcia are aiming to become Miami's first 10-game winner since 2010.
- Both Collins and Garcia were named to the Midseason Watch List for the 2016 Golden Spikes Award by USA Baseball.
- The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing 50-17 overall and 22-8 in ACC play.

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,022-414-3 (.709) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,526-658-4 (.697) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,656-697-4 (.700) mark.

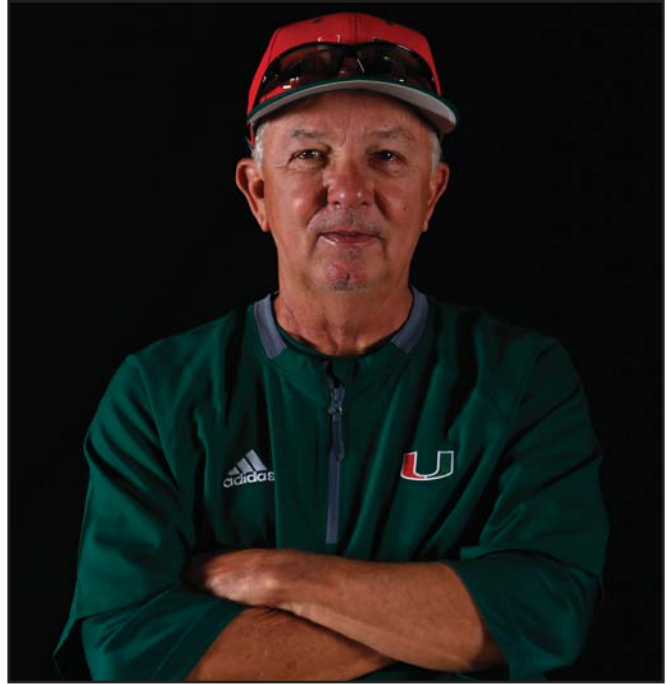
In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. A walk-off grand slam from junior Willie Abreu gave Morris his 1,500th.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

#RIVALRYWEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

CANES END REGULAR SEASON IN TALLY

- No. 4 Miami will wrap up its regular season with a three-game ACC series against No. 14 **Florida State** at Dick Howser Stadium in **Tallahassee, Fla.**, from May 19-21.
- The Hurricanes trail the all-time series **147-126-4**, including a **78-55-1** deficit in Tallahassee. Miami is looking to clinch its **second** ACC Regular Season Championship in **three years** this weekend.
- Freshman righthander **Andrew Cabezas** will be making the second start of his career in Thursday's opener opposite FSU's **Drew Carlton**.

THREE STRAIGHT COASTAL CROWNS

- The Hurricanes clinched their **third straight ACC Coastal Division** title on May 15 at Mark Light Field, guaranteeing a **top-two** seed at the upcoming 2016 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, N.C.
- The division crown is the **fourth all-time** for Miami, who have also claimed titles in **2008, 2014** and **2015**.
- Miami has a chance to lock up the **third ACC Regular Season Championship** in program history this week against Florida State.

MIAMI RANKED IN TOP FOUR OF EVERY POLL

- The Hurricanes were ranked as high as **No. 2** in polls released on May 16; Miami was ranked No. 2 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, No. 3 by D1Baseball and *USA TODAY* Coaches Poll, and was **No. 4** by *Baseball America*, Perfect Game and NCBWA.
- Miami was ranked **No. 1** in five of six polls released Monday, April 25 - marking the first time the Hurricanes were No. 1 in **back-to-back** weeks (April 18, April 25) since **June 3, 2008** and **June 10, 2008**.

CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

- Closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the **fifth-most saves** in **Miami history** (25), and recorded his **ACC-leading 12th save** of 2016 against **Pittsburgh** on May 13.
- 37 career saves are the most by **any active pitcher** in the nation.
- Garcia is chasing the **all-time record for saves in a career** for a **Miami reliever**, which is **39** - held by **George Huguet** (2001-2004).
- Garcia needs one more to move past **Rick Raether** (1984-86) into sole possession of second place (38) and is two behind **Huguet** to move into a tie for first (39).

MORRIS EARNS MILESTONE WINS IN STYLE

- With a walk-off grand slam by junior Willie Abreu vs. Louisville on March 18, Miami head coach Jim Morris became just the **sixth coach** in history of **Division I baseball** to reach the **1,500-win milestone**.
- A little over a week later, Morris became the **second coach** in the history of Miami baseball to win **1,000 games** when the Hurricanes walked off against Clemson 5-4 on **March 26** (Ron Fraser - 1,267).

HEATING UP

- Riding a career-best 14-game hitting streak, senior **Brandon Lopez** has raised his average to .404 - the **ACC's third-best average**.
- Lopez has reached base in **34 consecutive games** - the longest active stretch for any Miami player, surpassing **Zack Collins'** stretch of **33 straight** games reaching base which ended April 29.
- Lopez leads the team with **12 doubles**, ranks second with **66 hits** and is **slugging .494** - the second-highest mark of any UM player.

COLLINS, GARCIA SPIKES CANDIDATES

- Miami juniors **Zack Collins** and **Bryan Garcia** were among the 60 players named to the midseason watch list for the **2016 Golden Spikes Award**, USA Baseball announced Wednesday, April 20.
- Miami was one of just **eight schools** to have multiple players listed; former third baseman **David Thompson** was a 2015 Golden Spikes Award semifinalist. **Pat Burrell** (1998) was UM's only winner.

ONE OF THE ACC'S COMPLETE TEAMS

- Miami & Louisville are the only tACC teams to rank in the top three of three major stats: batting average, ERA and fielding percentage.

USA TODAY TABS MIAMI #3 PROGRAM

- In a ranking of Division I baseball programs by "athletic competitiveness, academic quality, return on investment and leadership," Miami was ranked the **No. 3 program in America by USA Today**.
- Miami trailed only Vanderbilt & LSU in the list released on March 4.

COLLINS AMONG NATION'S BEST

- As of games through May 16, junior slugger **Zack Collins** ranked among the nation's **active career leaders** in a number of hitting categories: **home runs** (36, T-3rd), **RBI** (170, T-4th), **walks** (158, 1st), and **on-base percentage** (.470, 2nd).

GOLD GLOVE DEFENSE

- In the newest NCAA Division I statistics released May 16, Miami had the **fourth-best fielding percentage in the country** and the **best fielding percentage in the ACC** at .982.
- Miami has made **just 34 errors in 2016**, compared to 80 by opponents. The Hurricanes had made **61 errors at this point in 2015** (49 games) - a year where Miami made it to the College World Series.
- The Hurricanes' starting infield of third baseman **Edgar Michelangeli** (2), shortstop **Brandon Lopez** (5), second baseman **Johnny Ruiz** (6) and first baseman **Christopher Barr** (2) have combined for just 15 errors.

BUILDING A RESUME

- In early Preseason 'Field of 64 projections' by both *Baseball America* and *D1Baseball.com* in May, Miami was **projected to be the No. 2 national seed** for the NCAA postseason.
- In the most recent **NCAA RPI release of 2016** on May 16, Miami was **No. 3**. The Hurricanes have **13 wins** against the **NCAA RPI top 25** (13-7) and are **24-8** against the **RPI top 100** by WarrenNolan.com

WOODREY SENIOR CLASS AWARD FINALIST

- Senior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** was recognized as one of 10 finalists for the **2016 Senior CLASS Award** - an acronym standing for "Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School"
- The award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

MIDWEEK WARRIORS

- Miami finished the year **12-1 in midweek games**, including a 10-1 home mark. UM beat FGCU 8-3 in its final midweek game on May 17.

• Junior right fielder **Willie Abreu** has earned the nickname “Walk Off Willie” after connecting on walk-off home runs on back-to-back Friday nights vs. **Louisville** (March 18) and **Clemson** (March 25).

• Abreu’s first walk-off was a **grand slam** against Cardinals All American closer **Zack Burdi**, the second shot was a two-run HR vs. Clemson.

HAPPY HOMECOMING FOR HEYWARD

• Largely thanks to a career day from junior **Jacob Heyward**, Miami won its rubber game with host **Georgia Tech** at Russ Chandler Stadium Monday, May 9 to secure its **tenth series victory of 2016**.

• Heyward, a native of McDonough, Ga., had **five RBI** - one shy of his career high - with a pair of **two-RBI doubles** and a **solo home run**.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

• Miami made its return to the **College World Series in 2015**, marking the program’s first trip to Omaha, Neb., since **2008**. Miami’s **24 College World Series trips** are the **second-most of any program**.

• The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami’s **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.

MIAMI SWEEPS TAR HEELS AT THE LIGHT

• The Hurricanes captured their **fourth straight series over No. 9 North Carolina** and **fifth straight series** of 2016 from April 1-3.

• The series win was Miami’s **third straight over North Carolina** and **sixth in the last seven years** dating back to 2010.

• Miami won the head-to-head series in **2010, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2015** and **2016**, and lost the series in 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

CANES HAND CARDS 1ST ACC SERIES LOSS

• By capturing the **first two games** of a weekend series against **#4 Louisville** (8-4 in Game 1, 6-3 in Game 2) from March 18-20, Miami handed UofL its **first ACC series loss** since joining the conference.

• UM is now **19-6 in ACC play** through its first nine weekends, having won **eight of its first nine ACC series**.

MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

• Miami dropped **two of three** in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes **won Game 2** by a final score of **5-3**, but dropped Games 1 and 3.

• The Hurricanes got five strong innings from lefthander **Michael Mediavilla** (2-0) in Game 2 and four RBI from slugger **Zack Collins**.

• The Game 2 5-3 win was played in front of a **sellout crowd of 4,999**; over **13,000 fans** made their way through the gates that series.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

• Miami was ranked in the **top 10 in preseason polls** from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a **No. 4** ranking from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and a **No. 6** ranking from several outlets.

• Miami’s preseason ranking of No. 4 from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* was its **highest from the publication since 2005**; its No. 6 ranking from *Baseball America* was its highest from BA since **2007**.

• Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander **Andrew Suarez**, third baseman **David Thompson**, infielder **George Iskenderian**, catcher **Garrett Kennedy** and outfielder **Ricky Eusebio**.

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

• The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with their **43rd consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason** in 2015. Miami has not missed the postseason since 1973.

• The Hurricanes' 43 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the **longest active postseason streak of any Division I program** in any sport nationwide.
