
## **WEEKEND STORYLINES & NEWS**

- #4 Miami fell from its two-week stay at #1 in the polls, but remained in the top five of every major poll released April 25.
- UM leads the all-time series with Florida A&M 19-7, including a 10-0 home mark. The two teams have not met since 1981.
- Miami dropped its first series since late February last weekend vs. Virginia, ending a stretch of seven straight series wins.
- The FAMU series will mark Miami's last nonconference series of 2016; Miami is 16-3 in nonconference games this year.
- Miami's 26-4 start to the season was the Hurricanes' best **through 30 games** since starting **27-3** to open the **2008** season.
- The team's 14-5 ACC record is the best in the Coastal Division Miami is looking for its third straight ACC Coastal title.
- In the most recent NCAA RPI release on April 28, UM was ranked No. 5 with 10 wins against the current RPI top 25 (10-5).
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,000th game at the University of Miami in a 5-4 walk-off win over Clemson on March 26. With a 4-0 victory over FGCU on April 5, Morris moved past Larry Hays (1,508) into fifth in all-time Division I wins.
- Miami's .983 fielding percentage through April 26 was the fourth-best mark in the country & the ACC's best percentage.
- Junior Zack Collins opened the week ranked third among active Division I players in career home runs (35) and RBI (166).
- Junior Bryan Garcia sits in third place in all-time saves (35) at Miami; he is the nation's active leader in career saves.
- In a preseason poll of ACC head coaches, the Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division in 2016.
   The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing 50-17 overall and 22-8 in ACC play.

## **JIM MORRIS**

## THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,011-413-3 (.709) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,515-657-4 (.697) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,645-696-4 (.700) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. A walk-off grand slam from junior Willie Abreu gave Morris his 1,500th.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

## **CANES WELCOME RATTLERS TO THE LIGHT**

- Fourth-ranked Miami continues an **eight-game homestand** Friday with the first of three games against **Florida A&M** at Mark Light Field.
- The Hurricanes carry a **19-7 all-time lead** in the head-to-head series with the Rattlers, but the two teams have not met since **1981**. Miami boasts a perfect **10-0** all-time record against FAMU at The Light.
- The weekend with FAMU will mark Miami's **final nonconference series** of 2016; Miami is **16-3** in nonconference games in 2016.
- Miami lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** (4-3, 4.94 ERA) will oppose Rattlers lefthander **JoJo Durden** (1-0, 3.51 ERA) in the opener.

## MIAMI RANKED IN TOP FIVE OF EVERY POLL

- The Hurricanes were ranked as high as **No. 3** in polls released on April 25; Miami was ranked No. 3 by D1Baseball and *USA TODAY* Coaches Poll, and were **No. 4** by *Baseball America*, *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, Perfect Game and NCBWA.
- Miami was ranked No. 1 in five of six polls released Monday, April 25 - marking the first time the Hurricanes were No. 1 in back-to-back weeks (April 18, April 25) since June 3, 2008 and June 10, 2008.

## **COLLINS, GARCIA SPIKES CANDIDATES**

- Miami juniors **Zack Collins** and **Bryan Garcia** were among the 60 players named to the midseason watch list for the **2016 Golden Spikes Award**, USA Baseball announced Wednesday, April 20.
- Miami was one of just **eight schools** to have multiple players listed; former 3B **David Thompson** was a 2015 Spikes semifinalist.

## **USA TODAY** TABS MIAMI #3 PROGRAM

- In a ranking of Division I baseball programs by "athletic competitiveness, academic quality, return on investment and leadership," Miami was ranked the No. 3 program in America by USA Today.
  - Miami trailed only Vanderbilt & LSU in the list released on March 4.

## **CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS**

- Closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the **fifth-most saves in Miami history (25)**, and has gotten off to a hot start in 2016. His **ACC-leading 10th save** of 2016 against **UCF** on April 13.
  - 35 career saves are the most by any active pitcher in the nation.
- Garcia is chasing the all-time record for saves in a career for a Miami reliever, which is 39 held by George Huguet (2001-2004).
- Garcia moved past **Robbie Morrison** (1996-98, 34) for third in the history of Miami Baseball with his 35th career save on April 13. He needs two more to tie **Rick Raether** (1984-86) for second (37) and is four behind **Huguet** to move into a tie for first (39).

## MORRIS EARNS MILESTONE WINS IN STYLE

- With a walk-off grand slam by junior Willie Abreu vs. Louisville on March 18, Miami head coach Jim Morris became just the sixth coach in history of Division I baseball to reach the 1.500-win milestone.
- A little over a week later, Morris became the **second coach** in the history of Miami baseball to win **1,000 games** when the Hurricanes walked off against Clemson 5-4 on **March 26** (Ron Fraser 1,267).
- With a 4-0 win over FGCU on April 5, Morris moved Larry Hays (1,508) as the fifth-winningest coach in Division I history by wins.
  - Since his arrival in 1994, UM's 1,011 wins are sixth-most in D1.

## **WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES**

## **COLLINS AMONG NATION'S BEST**

• As of games through April 26, junior slugger Zack Collins ranked among the nation's active career leaders in a number of hitting categories: home runs (35, 3rd), RBI (166, 3rd), walks (147, 1st), and on-base percentage (.471, 1st).

## **GOLD GLOVE DEFENSE**

- In the newest NCAA Division I statistics released April 26, Miami had the fourth-best fielding percentage in the country and the best fielding percentage in the ACC at .983.
- Miami has made just 25 errors in 2016, compared to 60 by opponents. The Hurricanes had made 47 errors at this point in 2015 (38 games) - a year where Miami made it to the College World Series.
- The Hurricanes' starting infield of third baseman Edgar Michelangeli (1), shortstop Brandon Lopez (5), second baseman Johnny Ruiz (4) and first baseman Christopher Barr (2) have combined for just 12 errors.

## **BUILDING A RESUME**

- In early Preseason 'Field of 64 projections' by both Baseball America and D1Baseball.com in late April, Miami was projected to be the No. 2 national seed for the NCAA postseason.
- In the most recent NCAA RPI release of 2016 on April 28, Miami was No. 5. The Hurricanes have 10 wins against the NCAA RPI top 25 (10-5) and are 18-7 against the RPI top 100 by WarrenNolan.com

## **WOODREY SENIOR CLASS AWARD FINALIST**

- Senior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** was recognized as one of 10 finalists for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award - an acronym standing for "Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School"
- Woodrey was one of two representatives from the ACC, joining Louisville righthander Kyle Funkhouser.
- The award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

## MIDWEEK WARRIORS

• Miami is 9-1 in midweek games this season, including a 7-1 home mark. UM suffered its first midweek loss to No. 21 FAU 4-3 on April 20.

## **LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT**

- Miami won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title in 2015, posting a 22-8 record in ACC play to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, won 46 ACC games over the 2014-2015 seasons - the second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule prior to 2005.

## WALK-OFF WILLIE

- Junior right fielder Willie Abreu has earned the nickname "Walk Off Willie" after connecting on walk-off home runs on back-to-back Friday nights vs. Louisville (March 18) and Clemson (March 25).
- Abreu's first walk-off was a grand slam against Cardinals All American closer Zack Burdi, the second a two-run HR vs. Clemson.

## **WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES**

## **DESTINATION: OMAHA**

- Miami made its return to the College World Series in 2015, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since 2008. Miami's 24 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program.
- The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami's **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.

## MIAMI SWEEPS TAR HEELS AT THE LIGHT

- The Hurricanes captured their fourth straight series over No. 9 North Carolina and fifth straight series of 2016 from April 1-3.
- The series win was Miami's third straight over North Carolina and sixth in the last seven years dating back to 2010.
- Miami won the head-to-head series in 2010, 2011, 2012, 2014,
   2015 and 2016, and lost the series in 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

## CANES HAND CARDS 1ST ACC SERIES LOSS

- By capturing the **first two games** of a weekend series against **#4 Louisville** (8-4 in Game 1, 6-3 in Game 2) from March 18-20, Miami handed UofL its **first ACC series loss** since joining the conference.
- UM is now 13-3 in ACC play through its first six weekends, having won 6 of 7 ACC series (VT, UofL, Clemson, UNC, ND and Duke).

## MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

- Miami dropped **two of three** in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes **won Game 2** by a final score of **5-3**, but dropped Games 1 and 3.
- The Hurricanes got five strong innings from lefthander Michael
   Mediavilla (2-0) in Game 2 and four RBI from sluger Zack Collins.
- The Game 2 5-3 win was played in front of a **sellout crowd of 4,999**; over **13,000 fans made their way through the gates** to see the annual rivalry between the Hurricanes and Gators.

## **CANES SWEEP JASPERS**

- Miami cruised to a **weekend sweep of Manhattan** at Mark Light Field from March 4-6; the Hurricanes **outscored** the Jaspers **31-8** in the three-game series, while the staff recorded a collective **2.33 ERA**.
- Among Miami's top performers at the plate against the Jaspers were Edgar Michelangeli (.750, 9-for-12, 3 RBI), junior Zack Collins (.625, 5-for-8, 1 HR, 5 RBI) & sophomore Carl Chester (.400, 4-for 10, 5 runs, 3 RBI); UM hit .371 as a team and recorded 39 hits vs. MC.
- Senior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** delivered a brilliant start against the Jaspers in the series opener, tossing eight shutout innings, allowing two hits, one walk and striking out a career-best 10 batters.

## **HIGH EXPECTATIONS**

- Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from several outlets.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* was its **highest from the publication since 2005**; its No. 6 ranking from *Baseball America* was its highest from BA since **2007**.

## MIAMI ADDS ANOTHER MAJOR LEAGUER

- Arizona Diamondbacks slugger Peter O'Brien became the 53rd former University of Miami player to play in Major League Baseball when he was called up late in 2015.
- O'Brien joined a group that now includes Oakland A's teammates Yonder Alonso and Danny Valencia, San Diego Padres outfielder Jon Jay & infielder Jemile Weeks, Dodgers All-Star Yasmani Grandal, new D-Back Chris Herrmann, and Milwaukee All-Star Ryan Braun.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander Andrew Suarez, third baseman David Thompson, infielder George Iskenderian, catcher Garrett Kennedy and outfielder Ricky Eusebio.

## **ESPN NETWORK TO CARRY HOME SCHEDULE**

- All 37 of UM's home games will be carried on the ESPN Networks in 2016 - Miami is the only ACC school to have its entire home schedule carried.
- In total, 46 of Miami's 55 games are tentatively slated for broadcast on ESPN Networks.
- 560 WQAM, the flagship radio station for Miami Athletics, is slated to carry 15 regular season games throughout the 2016 season. WVUM 90.5 FM carries every game, home and away.

## **HURRICANES TOP ALUMNI IN EXHIBITION**

- In its annual exhibition against the program's alumni, the 2016 Hurricanes won 17-4 on Saturday, Feb 13.
- Roughly 2,000 fans made their way thorugh the gates for Fan Fest and the Alumni Game, which featured a number of Hurricane greats taking part in pregame ceremonies.
- MLB All-Star Yasmani Grandal, former Marlins first-round Draft pick and retired number honoree Charles "CJ" Johnson and 2015 Miami staff ace **Andy Suarez**, with about 50 others, were introduced.
- Alumni taking part in the game included "Downtown" Kevin Brown, former MLB outfielder Brian Barton, fan favorite Jose Trujillo and sidewinder Sam Abrams, who was a key member of Miami's 2015 CWS team.
- Sophomore Carl Chester finished the Alumni game 3-for-6 with four RBI, while junior Johnny Ruiz went 3-for-4 with four runs scored.

## DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with their 43rd consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason in 2015. Miami has not missed the postseason since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 43 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in 31 straight years - all 22 years at Miami and his final nine years at Georgia Tech.
- Miami is the only school in the state of Florida to have won a national championship; UM won titles in 1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001.






