#### HEADLINES

- > Temple, under the direction of first-year head coach Aaron McKie, brings a 7-2 record into the 2019 Air Force Reserve Basketball Hall of Fame Invitational presented by Citi game against Miami.
- > Senior guard Quinton Rose leads the Owls in scoring (14.7 ppg) and assists (33) and is third in steals (15).
- > Junior guard Nate Pierre-Louis tops Temple in rebounding (8.6 rpg), steals (21) and blocks (6) while ranking second in scoring (12.3 ppg) and assists (29).
- > Senior Alani Moore II (9.9 ppg) has more than doubled his offensive output from last year (4.1 ppg) while leading the team in three-pointers (21) and free throw percentage (.875).
- > Rounding out the starting five are juniors J.P. Moorman II (5.9 ppg), who ranks second on the team in rebounding (6.0 rpg), and Justyn Hamilton (4.6 ppg).
- > Sophomore Jake Forrester (8.8 ppg), who scored a game and career-high 17 points against Saint Joseph's, along with junior De'Vondre Perry (6.2 ppg) and redshirt junior Monty Scott (5.9 ppg) give Temple a boost off the bench.
- > This will be the fifth meeting between Miami and Temple and the first since the Hurricanes knocked off the Owls, 60-57, at Madison Square Garden in the 2015 NIT Semifinals. The teams have split the previous four encounters.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### SCOUTING MIAMI

- > Miami is coached by Jim Larranaga, who earned his 650th win against Illinois, 81-79 on Dec. 2. He is one of only 10 active D-1 coaches with 650 victories.
- > The Hurricanes feature a balanced scoring attack with three players, DJ Vasiljevic (14.9 ppg), Chris Lykes (14.6 ppg), and Kameron McGusty (14.1 ppg), avergaing double figures.
- > Miami does not turn the ball over, averaging a mere 10.0 per game, and sports a +2.8 turnover margin.

### SERIES HISTORY

- > Temple and Miami are meeting for the fifth time in program history with the series even at 2-2.
- > Miami won the last meeting, also in New York, a 60-57 decision in the 2015 NIT Semifinals at Madison Square Garden.
- > The Owls last win was a 73-56 victory at home on Nov. 27, 2005.
- > Two seasons prior, the Hurricane won 72-66 on their home court on Dec. 20, 2003 as part of the Orange Bowl Classic.
- > The first meeting between the teams was on Dec. 29, 1961. Temple won that game 85-67.

### LAST MEETING: March 31, 2015- Miami 60, Temple 57

- > Miami narrowly defeated the Owls in the NIT Semifinals at Madison Square Garden.
- > Temple led the Hurricanes for much of the game before falling behind and nearly came back from a seven-point deficit. A three-point shot by Quenton DeCosey bounced off the rim at the final buzzer and ended the Owls' season.
- > Obi Enechionya had a season-best performance, leading all players with 17 points and recording five blocks and eight boards.
- > Following a few early ties, the Owls went on an 8-0 run to give them a 15-9 lead with 13 mintues left on the clock.
- > Temple went up by 11 with under five mintues left in the first half before heading into the locker room with a 30-25 lead.
- > Temple held a arrow lead for the first 12 minutes, but both teams continued to struggle offensively and the Owls were unable to maintain but separation.
- > A 12-4 Miami run gave the Hurricanes a 56-49 lead with less than four minutes remaining, but a 6-0 run for the Owls wasn't enough for the win as the team missed a pair of free throws and a trey at the buzzer.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### LAST TIME OUT: Dec. 10 Temple 108, Saint Joseph's 61

> The victory was the first 100-point game for Temple since 2013 and the 20th in program history. It was the most points Temple has scored since defeating St. Bonaventure, 109-70, in 2007 and just one point shy of tying the record for most points scored at the Liacouras Center,

> It was also the largest margin of victory for Temple in a Big 5 game.

> Temple's defense came up big, holding Saint Joseph's to 31 percent from the field.

> Five Owls scored in the double digits, with sophomore Jake Forrester leading at 17 points. Quinton Rose scored 12, going 8-of-9 from the foul line, dishing six assists.

> Rose and J.P. Moorman II each made three steals, while Nate Pierre-Louis recorded two blocks.

> All but one player scored for Temple and no Owl attempted more than eight shots in the contest.

> No one from Temple played more than 25 minutes and the Owls bench contributed 60 points in the game.

### DEFENSE DOES IT

> Temple has been one of the top teams in the country defensively this season and currently leads the AAC and ranks fifth nationally in field goal percentage defense (.351). The Owls are also second in the AAC (39th NCAA) in three-point percentage defense (.282) and scoring defense (60.1 ppg/27th NCAA).

### WAIVER APPROVED

> The NCAA has approved Jake Forrester's waiver to compete during the 2019-20 season making the Temple University sophomore forward immediately eligible. Forrester will be dressed and available to play for the Owls' opening game at the Orlando Invitational.

> "We are thankful that the NCAA has approved our waiver to allow Jake to play this season," said Temple head coach Aaron McKie. "Jake has been competing hard in practice and we are looking forward to seeing him in game action."

> As a freshman at Indiana, Forrester, a 6-8, 220-pound forward, played in 56 minutes over 13 games, averaging 2.1 points and 1.3 rebounds while shooting 54.5 percent from the field. He scored a career-high eight points and added two rebounds and a steal in seven minutes of action against Central Arkansas.

> As a high school senior at Westtown (Pa.) High, Forrester was ranked as the #127 recruit by Rivals and #131 by 247Sports. The ALL-USA Pennsylvania Boys Basketball Second Team honoree averaged 12.2 points and 9.0 rebounds per game while leading Westtown to a 23-10 record and its fifth straight Friends Schools League championship. As a junior, he helped Westtown to a 32-2 record and a Pennsylvania Independent Schools Athletic Association (PAISAA) championship while earning first team all-conference accolades.

### DAWN OF A NEW ERA

> It is the dawn of a new era for Temple University men's basketball, as Aaron McKie takes over the program where he starred as a player under Hall of Fame head coach John Chaney and served as an assistant coach for five seasons under Fran Dunphy.

> McKie, who has spent his entire life immersed in the Philadelphia basketball scene, is the 18th head coach in Temple men's basketball history, but just the fifth since Hall of Fame coach Harry Litwack took over the reins of the program in 1952.

> He is also the first alum to serve as the Owls' head coach since Litwack, who won 373 games and made two Final Four appearances in his 21-year tenure.

> McKie had an early debut as the team's head coach as the Owls traveled to the Bahamas (Aug. 2-8) for a three-game foreign tour, winning all three contests.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### FAST START

> Aaron McKie became the first Temple rookie head coach to win his first four games since Josh Cody opened his coaching career with a 5-0 record in 1942-43.

> This is the first time a Temple team had just one loss in its first seven games under a new head coach since James Usilton, Sr. took over the program in the 1926-27 season.

> His 7-2 record through nine games is tied for the best in school history.

### BAHAMA MAMAS

> Temple started its season early with a foreign trip (Aug. 2-8) to the Bahamas where the Owls swept three exhibition games against Bahamian National teams. > Temple made the debut of new head coach Aaron McKie a successful one with a thrilling 98-96 win over the Commonwealth Bank Giants.

> It was a balanced scoring attack in game one as five players tallied double figures led by senior Quinton Rose (24) and junior Nate Pierre-Louis (19).

> The Owls used a 16-3 run to overcome a 90-81 deficit over a five minute stretch to pull ahead for good 97-93. Rose led the way with nine points in the run, including a breakaway three-point play off a feed from junior JP Moorman II that gave TU the lead, 94-92.

> Game two saw Temple run away from the IBA Select team early and never let up in a 94-67 win. The Owls led 36-7 after the first quarter and extended the margin to 40 points, 59-19, at the break.

> Justyn Hamilton and Tai Strickland, sitting out this season due to NCAA transfer rules, led the team with 13 points each as McKie rested Rose and Nate Pierre-Louis

> The Owls completed the trip with an 88-74 victory over a Bahamian Select Team. > It was another balanced attack as five players scored in double figures. Hamilton, Moorman and Damion Moore led the Cherry and White with 13 apiece while Rose added 12 and Nate Pierre-Louis chipped in with 11 points.

### CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAINS

> Temple men's basketball head coach Aaron McKie selected senior Quinton Rose and juniors Nate Pierre-Louis and J.P. Moorman II as the captains for the 2019-20 season.

### BROTHERS IN ARMS

> With the addition of incoming freshman Josh Pierre-Louis, Temple will have siblings on its men's basketball team for the first time in program history.

> Josh, a second team all-state selection out of Roselle Catholic (Plainfield, N.J.) joins his older brother Nate Pierre-Louis, who earned AAC and Bg 5 Most Improved Player honors in 2018-19.

### A ROSE AMONG OWLS

> A 2019 second team all-American Athletic Conference honoree, Quinton Rose enters the season as one of the leading contenders for conference Player of the Year honors as well as national accolades.

> The 6-8 guard, who was named preseason first team all-AAC, should become just the sixth Temple player to average double figures in points for four seasons.

> He has a chance to be just the fifth Owl to eclipse the 2000-point plateau. He currently has 1,485 points and is 20th on Temple's all-time scoring list.

> Fresh off a near triple-double vs. Davidson, Rose was named the American Athletic Conference Player of the Week and the Big 5 Co-Player of the Week (Dec. 1). It is his first AAC Player of the Week honor and the second Big 5 POW.

> Rose leads the Owls in scoring (14.8 ppg) and assists (3.4 apg) while ranking third in rebounding (5.3 rpg).

> The team co-captain averaged 14 points, 8.7 rebounds, and 5.7 assists and earned All-Tournament honors at the Orlando Invitational.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### RISING JUNIORS

> Since their arrival on campus in the fall of 2017, Justyn Hamilton, J.P. Moorman II, De'Vondre Perry and Nate Pierre-Louis have been heralded as the future of Temple Basketball. Well the future is now as these four juniors are set to be the leaders of the 2019-20 team.

> Pierre-Louis, along with senior Quinton Rose, is one of two returning players to have started every game for the Owls last season, but each of the three other juniors made their way into the starting lineup in '18-19.

> Perry started the first 20 games before giving way to Moorman for the remainder of the season.

> Hamilton made four starts while averaging nearly 20 minutes per game over the final 13 contests.

### RECORD-SETTING GAME

> Temple's impressive 108-61 victory over Saint Joseph's was its first 100-point game since 2013. The win marked the 20th triple-digit game for the Owls, who are 20-0 when they score 100 points.

> Just one point shy of tying the record for most points scored in the Liacouras Center, the win marked the most points Temple has scored since a 109-70 win over St. Bonaventure in 2007. It was also the largest margin of victory for Temple in a Big 5 game.

> It was the first time since 1997 that Temple had 40+ defensive rebounds and the first time since 2007 that Temple has made 40+ field goals. Both games were against St. Bonaventure.

> Shooting nearly 63 percent (42-67) from the field, the game was the first time since 2013 that the Owls have shot above .600 and is the best shooting percentage for the team since shooting nearly 69 percent (35-51) against Rhode Island in 2010.

### THEIR TIME IS NOW

> Two Temple players who redshirted the 2018-19 season will finally get their chance to take the floor wearing the Cherry and White.

> Redshirt junior guard Monty Scott, who sat out last season due to NCAA transfer rules, averaged 17.3 points per game as a sophomore at Kennesaw State in '17-18, ranking third in the ASUN Conference.

> Redshirt freshman Arashma Parks, who sat out last season due to a shoulder injury, will bolster the Temple frontcourt. Parks, whose brother Omari Spellman is a member of the Golden State Warriors, averaged 11.6 points and 9.2 rebounds as a senior in high school ('17-18) at the Phelps School in nearby Malvern, Pa.

### WAITING IN THE WINGS

> Tai Strickland, a 6-2, 180-pound guard who played last season at Wisconsin, is currently redshirting the 2019-20 season.

> Strickland played sparingly in his one season with the Badgers, averaging 1.8 points per game while playing just 50 minutes.

### OWL IN THE FAMILY

> Aaron McKie has added two former Temple greats to his staff in Mark Macon (Assistant to the Head Coach) and Jason Ivey (Director of Player Development).

> Macon, the program's all-time leading scorer with 2,609 points, played from 1987-91. The Saginaw, Mich. native was a first team All-American in '87-88 when he led the program to its only #1 ranking.

> The only four-time first team all-A10 honoree in conference history is starting his second stint on the Owls' staff after serving as an assistant coach for three seasons (2003-06) under Hall of Fame coach John Chaney.

> Ivey, a former teammate of McKie's ('92-96), was the sixth man on Temple's 1993 Elite Eight squad.

> A starter in 40 games as an Owl, Ivey was an assistant coach at UMKC for seven seasons (2000-07) and spent two seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations at Hartford.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### WELCOME BACK FENERTY

- > After four years away from North Broad Street, Jimmy Fenerty returns to the Temple men's basketball staff as an assistant coach under Aaron McKie,
- > Fenerty, who spent the last four seasons as an assistant coach at Lafayette, was a two-year graduate manager with the Owls from 2013-15.

### FRIENDS FLOCK TOGETHER

- > Aaron McKie looked no further than one of his closest friends for his right hand man, adding veteran head coach Monte' Ross as his associate head coach.
- > Ross has 23 years of Division I college coaching experience, with 10 coming as the head coach at the University of Delaware (2006-16).
- > The Philadelphia native won 132 games, second most in UD men's basketball history, and guided the Blue Hens to one of their best seasons in program history in 2013-14. That season UD posted a 25-10 record en route to a Colonial Athletic Association regular season (14-2) and tournament championship.
- > It marked just the fifth NCAA Tournament appearance in school history and the first since 1999.

### GOING OT

- > Temple is 65-50 all-time in overtime games.
- > The Owls were 4-0 last season and have won their last five overtime contests.
- > Since the 2008-09 campaign, Temple is 23-7 in OT contests.

### FOR THREE

- > Temple has made at least one three-pointer in 779 consecutive games.
- > The last time the Owls did not make a three-pointer in a game was February 1, 1996. Temple missed all 16 three-point attempts that day in dropping a 59-35 decision to #1 UMass at McGonigle Hall.

### WALKING ON

- > Temple will again have three walk-ons on its 2019-20 roster.
- > Seniors Anto Keshgegian and Tim Waddington along with sophomore Jasen West are in their second season with the program.
- > Keshgegian, a 6-3, 185-pound guard, transferred to Temple from Eastern College. The Media, Pa. native played HS ball at nearby St. Joseph's Prep.
- > Waddington, a 6-5, 195-pound forward, earned first team all-conference honors for Central Bucks South as a senior. He is a Warrington, Pa. native.
- > West, a Winter Springs, Fla. native, helped Lake Highland Prep to a 22-win season as a senior in 2017-18.

### MASCOT DOUBLE TROUBLE: HOOTER AND STELLA

- > Temple Athletics has both a traditional and a live mascot cheering on its teams, as Hooter the Owl and Stella can both often be found on the sidelines.
- > To honor Temple's beginning as a night school for ambitious young people, the nocturnal owl was adopted as its mascot. The owl represents wisdom and knowledge and is known for being perceptive, resourceful and courageous.
- > Hooter the Owl is a part of Temple's Spirit Squad, making appearances games, alumni events and more.
- > Stella, a great horned owl, began her career as Temple's live mascot in 2013. Though she's small—just 2 feet tall and only 3 pounds—Stella is a mighty predator, with an impressive 60-inch wingspan and talons capable of crushing prey with 28 pounds of force per square inch.
- > Stella resides in the Elmwood Park Zoo in Norristown, Pa., where she also is a wildlife conservation teacher.

### 20/20 VISION

- > Temple recorded its 37th 20-win season in 2018-19.
- > From 2007-13 Temple recorded six straight 20-win seasons, tying the program record for consecutive 20-win seasons, set under Hall of Fame head coach John Chaney (1995-01).
- > Chaney posted 15 20-win seasons (24 seasons) while fellow Hall of Fame coach Harry Litwack compiled eight (21 seasons).

## NEWS AND NOTES

### HOME SWEET HOME

> The Liacouras Center has proven to be a tremendous home court advantage. Since the arena opened its doors in 1997, the Owls have posted a 229-77 (.749) all-time record, and set the record for wins in a single season with 16 in 2014-15.

> Temple is 135-39 (.776) at home since the start of the 2007-08 campaign.

### 19-20 SIGNING CLASS

> Temple signed two guards on National Letters of Intent Day, welcoming Quincy Ademokoya and Jahil White.

> Ademokoya is a 6-6, 185-pound guard out of Norcross (Ga.) High while White is a 6-7, 180-pound guard out of Wildwood (N.J.) Catholic.

> Ademokoya (adem-oh-koy-ah), who is coming off a strong summer in the EYBL with the Georgia Stars, averaged 15.3 points and 5.3 rebounds in helping his previous team, Dacula High, reach the 2019 Georgia State playoffs. He shot 45 percent from the field (153-of-338) and 38 percent from three (63-of-165). Not unfamiliar with big city life, Ademokoya, a native of Bloomington, Ill., also played for the Chicago-based Nike Elite Youth League AAU team Meanstreets.

> A native of Whitesboro, N.J., White averaged 18.6 points and 6.1 rebounds per game as a junior, helping lead Wildwood Catholic to the Cape Atlantic League title and the NJSIAA South Jersey Non-Public A sectional championship. He contributed 10 points, five rebounds and three steals in that loss to a Ranney School team that finished the season ranked No. 1 in the NJ.com poll and No. 11 in the USA Today Super 25 rankings.

### RING WORTHY

> The Temple University Basketball Ring of Honor will honor its fourth class of inductees during the 2019-20 season with the addition of men's basketball greats Nelson Bobb (1943, 47-49) and Mike Vreeswyk (1985-89), and women's basketball standout Grace Schuler McGeoy (1942-45).

>The trio will be recognized at Temple's game against SMU on February 8.

>Known as "Nitzy," Bobb was one of Temple's most prolific scorers during the 1940s, scoring a then-record 984 points. Despite his career being interrupted by serving his country in World War II, the Philadelphia native led the Owls in scoring for three seasons: 1942-43, 1947-48 and 1948-49. Following his career at Temple, he was drafted by the Philadelphia Warriors as the third-round pick and played four seasons in the NBA. While at Temple, he led the school in scoring and set several Temple records, including the most points and most field goals in a season.

> One of the top three-point shooters in Temple history, Vreeswyk was a key player for the Owls, helping lead the team to three trips to the NCAA Tournament. The Morrisville, Pa. native scored 1,650 points (tied for 11th all-time at Temple with Aaron McKie) and set school records for three-pointers in a season (94, now 5th) and career (271, now 3rd). He also is fifth with a 39.2 career three-point percentage. The two-time All-Big 5 selection and Big 5 Hall of Fame honoree was second in scoring (16.7 ppg) on the 1987-88 Temple team that was ranked #1 in the nation and finished with a 32-2 record.

A three-time all-College basketball team selection, Schuler McGeoy led Philadelphia colleges in individual scoring honors with a 17.4 average as a senior in 1945 to cap the program's three-year unbeaten streak. She received numerous Women's Athletic Association awards and served as president in 1945. A three-sport athlete who also played tennis and field hockey, she was selected an Outstanding Senior at Temple and was a recipient of the Temple University Award for Athletics. She also served as the head women's basketball coach during the 1946-47 season, guiding the team to a 7-1 record.

## NEWS AND NOTES

### OWLS PICKED SEVENTH IN PRESEASON POLL

> Temple was picked to finish seventh in the preseason coaches' poll while for the first time in the league's seven-year history there was a tie for the top spot with Houston (7 first place votes) and Memphis (4) each receiving 113 votes.

> Cincinnati, which garnered the remaining first-place vote, was picked to finish third with 94 votes. The Bearcats were followed by Wichita State (88), USF (79), UConn (75), Temple (72), SMU (47), UCF (40), Tulsa (36), ECU (20) and Tulsa (15).

>The seventh place selection ties with the 2017-18 season as the program's lowest in its seven seasons in the conference.

### ROSE, PIERRE-LOUIS NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AAC

> Senior guard Quinton Rose has been selected to the Preseason All-American Conference First Team for the second straight season while junior guard Nate Pierre-Louis earned a spot on the preseason Second Team.

> A 6-8 guard, Rose, who scored in double figures in 30 games, has amassed 1,353 points in just three seasons to rank 33rd all-time in program history.

> The 2019 second team all-AAC honoree ranked ninth in the conference in scoring with 16.3 points per game and third with 2.2 steals per game. He also became the first Temple player to record 70 or more steals in a season (71) since Mardy Collins (89, 2005-06).

> A 6-4 guard, Pierre-Louis ranked fifth in the AAC with 1.6 steals per game, 16th with 13.3 points per game and 19th with 5.7 rebounds per game.

> The 2019 AAC and Big 5 Most Improved Player has scored 641 points in his first two seasons and is on pace to reach the 1000-point plateau this year.

## Head Coach **AARON MCKIE**

First Season

Temple '94

Aaron McKie has officially taken over the program where he starred as a player under Hall of Fame head coach John Chaney and served as an assistant coach for five seasons under Fran Dunphy, assuming his new role in April of 2019.

McKie, who has spent his entire life immersed in the Philadelphia basketball scene, became the 18th head coach in Temple men's basketball history, but just the fifth since Hall of Fame coach Harry Litwack took over the reins of the program in 1952. He is also the first alum to serve as the Owls' head coach since Litwack, who won 373 games and made two Final Four appearances in his 21-year tenure.

Prior to the 2018-19 season, McKie was named associate head coach under Dunphy after spending four years as an assistant coach. The Owls went 23-10, earned an NCAA Tournament berth, and tied for third in the American Athletic Conference after being picked to finish sixth. The 20-win season was the third for Temple in McKie's five years on the staff, during which the Owls went to the NCAA Tournament twice and to the NIT Semifinals in 2015.

The Philadelphia basketball roots are deep for McKie and started in high school where he played at nearby Simon Gratz ('90). There, under the tutelage of legendary coach Bill Ellerbee, he helped lead the Bulldogs to the 1990 Philadelphia Public League Championship, their first title since 1939.

McKie then took his talents to North Broad Street to play under another legend in Chaney. Arguably one of the best players in Temple history, he had an incredible three-year playing career for the Owls (1991-92 through 1993-94) and is tied for sixth on the school's all-time scoring list with 1,650 points. A starter for all 92 games, he averaged 17.9 points per game while leading the Owls to three NCAA Tournaments and a trip to the 1993 Elite Eight. He earned many accolades during his heralded collegiate career, including Atlantic 10 Conference and Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Year for his performance in the 1992-93 season, when he averaged a team-best 20.6 points per game.

Selected in the first round (17th overall) of the 1994 NBA Draft by the Portland Trail Blazers, McKie played 13 seasons, including eight with the Philadelphia 76ers where he was coached by another basketball giant in Larry Brown. As a member of the Sixers in 2000-01, McKie enjoyed his best season, taking home Sixth Man of the Year honors while helping his hometown team reach the NBA Finals.

McKie has more than a decade of coaching experience. Besides serving as an assistant coach under Dunphy for the past five seasons, he was also a five-year assistant (2007-13) on the 76ers staff and helped lead the franchise to four NBA playoff appearances.

McKie resides in the Philadelphia area with his wife, Lisa, and their four children, Erin, Jaron, and twin sons Justin and Julian.

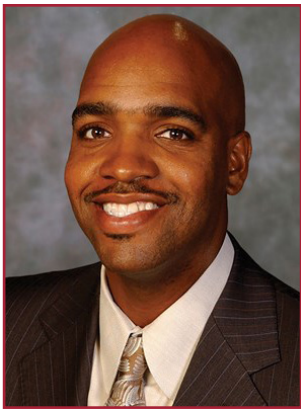

## Associate Head Coach **MONTÉ ROSS**

First Season

Winston-Salem '92

Monté Ross, who has 23 years of Division I college coaching experience with 10 coming as the head coach at the University of Delaware, was named the men's basketball associate head coach in April 2019.

A Philadelphia native, Ross previously served as the head coach at Delaware for 10 seasons (2006-16) and his 132 wins are second most in UD men's basketball history. He guided the Blue Hens to one of their best seasons in program history in 2013-14, posting a 25-10 record en route to a Colonial Athletic Association regular season (14-2) and tournament championship. It also marked just the fifth NCAA Tournament appearance in school history and the first since 1999. Ross was named the 2014 Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year as well as the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association Clarence (Big House) Gaines Division I Coach of the Year and the National Association of Basketball Coaches UPS District 10 Coach of the Year.

Ross also guided Delaware to another postseason tournament in 2011-12, leading the Blue Hens to an 18-14 record. It was the program's first winning record in eight seasons and it culminated with a berth in the CBI. He also coached 13 Colonial Athletic Association all-conference players in his tenure, including two-time first team selection Devon Saddler.

At Saint Joseph's, Ross spent 10 seasons on the sidelines (1996-2006) and was instrumental in the Hawks' "perfect season" in 2003-04. That Elite Eight team went 27-0 in the regular season and rose to No. 1 in the nation before ending with a 30-2 record. That was one of seven postseason teams that he was a part of at SJU, including four NCAA appearances.

Ross' career also includes a two-year stint as an assistant coach at Drexel (1994-96) where he played a part in the Dragons' first-ever NCAA Tournament win, a 75-63 first-round upset of Memphis in 1996. He also served one season (1993-94) as an assistant at Lehigh.

A 1992 graduate of Winston-Salem University, Ross learned the game from one of the best, playing for the legendary Clarence "Bighouse" Gaines.

Ross and his wife, Michelle, reside in Media, Pa. with their two children, Justin Monté (19) and Lauren Noel (18).





## *Assistant Coach* **CHRIS CLARK**

**Fourth Season**

**Temple '08**

Chris Clark, who served as the Temple men's basketball video coordinator during the 2015-16 season, joined the Temple men's basketball staff as an assistant coach in August of 2016.

A four-year member of the Owls (2004-08) as a player, Clark had a breakout senior season while serving as team captain in 2007-08. The Philadelphia native (St. Joseph's Prep) led the Owls in three-point percentage (57-137, .416) and helped lead Temple to a 21-13 record and the Atlantic 10 Conference Championship as the team's sixth man. Named the Philadelphia Big 5 Most Improved Player, he increased his scoring average from 2.6 points per game as a junior to 7.5 points per game as a senior.

His first stint as a college coach was at St. Francis (Pa.), where he spent four seasons (2009-13) on the Red Flash staff, helping the program to two consecutive Northeast Conference tournament appearances. His final season with the program, Clark served as the Associate Head Coach.

Clark left St. Francis (Pa.) to become an assistant head coach at Campbell University. He spent two seasons at Campbell (2013-15) before returning to Temple as the program's video coordinator last September.

Clark also has an extensive resume of community service. He has been a Big Brother Program volunteer, a Reading for Children volunteer, and has done community service at the Carousel House in Philadelphia. Additionally, he has volunteered with Midtown Parish United Methodist Church, Temple Rollin Owls Basketball League, and Cherry Hill's Martin Luther King Day.

He and his wife, Sharena, sons, Caysen and Chase, and daughter CrisMonae.





## *Assistant Coach* **JIMMY FENERTY**

**First Season**

**Dickinson '09**

After four years away from North Broad Street, Jimmy Fenerty returned to the Temple men's basketball staff as an assistant coach under Aaron McKie in April 2019. Fenerty spent two years with the Owls as a graduate manager from 2013-15.

Since leaving Temple, Fenerty has spent four years as an assistant coach for Lafayette men's basketball under head coach Fran O'Hanlon. At Lafayette, he served as the recruiting coordinator for the Leopards and was the lead recruiter for nine members of the 2019-20 team. He also recruited and mentored 2018 Patriot League Rookie of the Year Alex Petrie and 2019 third team all-Patriot performer Justin Jaworski.

While at Temple, Fenerty helped to design offseason individual workouts and assisted with recruiting endeavors. Additionally, he organized the team camp and oversaw the daily operations of the program as a whole. He earned his master's degree from Temple in 2015 in educational leadership.

Fenerty, the son of Hall of Fame Germantown Academy coach Jim Fenerty, was a member of the Dickinson College men's basketball team that posted a school record 21 wins his senior year, won the Centennial Conference Championship and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Division III Tournament.

While an undergraduate, the Warrington, Pa. native worked as a counselor at various summer basketball camps, including Temple, Hoop Group, Rutgers, Lafayette, Dickinson and Germantown Academy. Fenerty graduated from Dickinson in 2013 with a bachelor's degree in policy management.

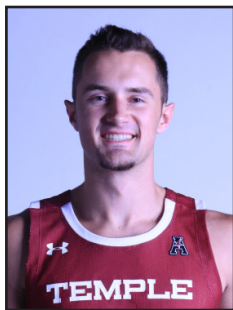

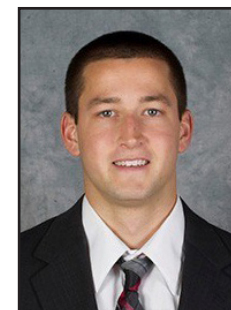
