#### NO. 8 SEMINOLES PLAY HOST TO MIAMI IN INTRA-STATE CLASH OF ACC TEAMS

Florida State, which is ranked in the nation's top 10 for the school-record fourth consecutive week, plays host to Miami at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee on Saturday, February 8, 2020 at 12 noon. The game between the Seminoles and the Hurricanes is the second meeting of the two teams this season with Florida State winning the first in overtime by an 83-79 margin at the Watsco Center in Coral Gables, Fla. Florida State enters Saturday's game having won 18 consecutive home games – a streak that began with a 77-68 win over Clemson on January 22, 2008. The Seminoles winning streak includes 12 consecutive ACC wins (in both the 2018-19 and 2019-20 seasons) and six non-conference wins to begin the 2019-20 season. Florida State enters its game against Miami having won four consecutive games against the Hurricanes. Following Saturday's game against the Hurricanes, the Seminoles travel to play Duke in Cameron Indoor Stadium on Monday, February 10 at 7:00. Florida State returns to the Tucker Center for a two-game homestand against Syracuse (February 15) and Pittsburgh (February 18).

#### VASSELL NAMED A FINALIST FOR THE JULIUS ERVING AWARD

Florida State sophomore Devin Vassell, the leading scorer for the No. 8 ranked Florida State Men's Basketball team, has been selected as one of 10 finalists for this year's Julius Erving Award presented by the Naismith Ball Hall of Fame. This honor recognizes the top small forward in men's college basketball. With each game Vassell takes advantage the opportunity to make a difference in the Florida State program. He leads the team in scoring (13.5 ppg), rebounds (5.3 rpg) and blocked shots (1.1 bpg) and is one of three players in the ACC who leads his team in all three categories. Vassell enters Saturday's game against Miami ranked fourth in the ACC in field goal percentage (.502) and ranked in the top 15 in the ACC in blocked shots (1.1 bpg) and steals (1.5 spg). Against Virginia Tech, he led his team to victory scoring a career-high 27 points and tying an ACC mark by shooting seven for seven from 3-point range.

#### FLORIDA STATE HAS WON 95 PERCENT OF ITS HOME GAMES SINCE FEBRUARY 27, 2015

Florida State is 60-3 (.952 winning percentage) in its last 63 home games since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. The Seminoles earned a 15-1 record at home during the 2018-19 season. The Seminoles enter Saturday's game against North Carolina having won .952 percent of their games (60-3) and .912 percent of their ACC games (31-3) at home since the tail end of the 2015-16 season. Florida State's streak began with a 77-56 win over No. 23 Notre Dame on February 27, 2015. The Seminoles were 18-0 at home (including 9-0 in the ACC) during the 2016-17, 15-1 at home during the 2018-10 season and are 11-0 at home this season.

#### FLORIDA STATE IS THE ACC'S ONLY UNDEFEATED TEAM AT HOME THIS SEASON

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami as the only undefeated team at home in the ACC this season with an 11-0 record. The Seminoles are 5-0 at home in ACC play with wins over Clemson (72-53, December 8), Georgia Tech (70-58, December 31), Virginia (54-50, January 15), Notre Dame (85-84, January 25) and North Carolina (65-59, February 3).

#### FLORIDA STATE IN ACC PLAY

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami looking to improve its record in ACC play to 10-2 for just the second time in school history. The Seminoles began the 2011-12 ACC season with a 10-2 record as they gained a 76-62 win over NC State on February 18, 2012 in Raleigh.

#### FLORIDA STATE RECENTLY IN THE ACC

Florida State is 21-3 in regular season ACC games (.875 winning percentage) since defeating Clemson (77-68) on January 22, 2019 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee. The Seminoles won 12 of their final 13 regular season ACC games of the 2018-19 season and have won nine of their first 11 ACC games of the 2019-20 season. During that stretch of games, Florida State is 11-0 at home and 9-3 on the road in ACC play.

#### LOOK FOR FLORIDA STATE TO...

...Defeat Miami and win its 20<sup>th</sup> game of the season. It would mark the school-record fifth consecutive season the Seminoles have won 20 or more games. Including this season, the Seminoles have won 117 games and are averaging 23.4 wins per season since the 2015-16 season;

...Defeat Miami and win its 10<sup>th</sup> ACC game of the season for the second consecutive season and the ninth time the Seminoles would have earned double figures in conference wins in a single season;

...Defeat Miami and win its 25<sup>th</sup> consecutive game that has been played in the state of Florida – each game since a 77-68 win at home over Clemson on January 22, 2019.

**HAMILTON THE SIXTH WINNINGEST COACH IN ACC HISTORY**

With 353 career victories during his tenure at Florida State, 18<sup>th</sup>-year Head Coach Leonard Hamilton enters the Seminoles' game against Miami needing only ONE win to move into a tie for fifth among the all-time winningest coaches in ACC history (tying Georgia Tech's Bobby Cremins). He became only the sixth coach in the illustrious history of the nation's best basketball conference to win 350 career games with the Seminoles' victory over Miami on January 18 in Coral Gables.

**HAMILTON RANKED IN THE TOP FIVE IN ACC HISTORY**

With 164 career ACC victories (regular season and ACC Tournament), Seminole Head Coach Leonard Hamilton is the fifth winningest coach in league history in ACC games only. Including Florida State's victories over Clemson on December 8, 2019, Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019, at Louisville on January 4, 2020, at Wake Forest on January 8, 2020, against Virginia on January 15, 2020, at Miami on January 18, 2020, against Notre Dame on January 25, 2020, at Virginia Tech on February 1, 2020 and against North Carolina on February 3, 2020, Hamilton has led the Seminoles to 164 ACC wins during his career.

**FLORIDA STATE SHOOTS 88 PERCENT FROM LINE AGAINST N. CAROLINA; CONTINUES TO LEAD ACC IN FT PERCENTAGE**

Led by Patrick Williams' perfect six-of-six performance from the free throw line in Florida State's victory over North Carolina on Monday in Tallahassee, the Seminoles made 15 of 17 free throws (including their final eight of the game) and enter Saturday's game against Miami as the ACC leaders in team free throw percentage with a .770 mark. The Seminoles performance against the Tar Heels marked the eighth time this season they have shot 80 percent or better from the line.

**FLORIDA STATE SHOOTING 78 PERCENT FROM THE FREE THROW LINE IN ACC PLAY**

Florida State enters Saturday's game against Miami as the ACC free throw percentage leaders in both all games played and ACC games only. The Seminoles are shooting .782 from free throw line in their 11 ACC games.

**FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME**

No. 9-ranked Florida State forced 24 turnovers, including three in a row in overtime, and rallied to earn their ninth consecutive victory by beating Miami 83-79 at the Watsco Center on Coral Gables, Fla., on January 18, 2020. Sophomore Devin Vassell set a career high for the third consecutive game by leading Florida State with 23 points while adding 11 rebounds and five assists. His two free throws with six seconds left sealed the win. M.J. Walker played only 23 minutes because of foul trouble but scored 19 points, all in the second half, and Malik Osborne’s three-point play with 2:25 left in overtime put the Seminoles ahead to stay. The Seminoles won despite shooting 42 percent and committing 16 turnovers. They compensated by scoring 21 points off takeaways. Not that Florida State’s characteristically strong defense wasn’t stout from the start. The Hurricanes had to call a timeout when they were trapped on the game’s first possession. They blew a dunk, threw up air balls and had 10 shots blocked.

Senior Trent Forrest, who has at least one steal in each of Florida State's last nine games, enters Saturday's game against Miami with 205 career steals. He is chasing the Seminoles' all-time record of 238 by Seminole great Charlie Ward who played basketball from 1991-94. Ward played in both the Metro Conference (1990-91 season) and the ACC (1991-92 through 1993-94 seasons). Forrest is just the sixth player in school history with 200 or more career steals and will pass Seminole great Bob Sura and move in to third place in Florida State history with just five more steals.

### RAIQUAN GRAY BLOCKS HIS CAREER-HIGH OF 4 SHOTS IN FLORIDA STATE'S VICTORY OVER NORTH CAROLINA

Redshirt sophomore RaiQuan Gray blocked his career-high of four shots in Florida State's staunch defensive effort in its win over North Carolina on Monday night. It marked the second time in his career that he had blocked multiple shots in a game – he also blocked two in the Seminoles' victory over Georgia Tech on December 31, 2019. Gray enters Saturday's game against Miami with a single-season career-high 15 blocked shots.

### RAIQUAN GRAY IN HIS LAST FOUR GAMES...

...He has scored 40 points and is averaging 10.0 points scored per game. He scored his career-high of 13 points in Florida State's victory over Notre Dame on January 25 and totaled 12 in the Seminoles' win over North Carolina on February 3;

...He is shooting .800 percent from the 3-point line (four of five) and has made at least one 3-point shot in three of the last four games;

## **FSU Hoops Succeeds With Unselfish Players Putting Team First**

Florida State's basketball program doesn't need a star to carry its program. The 10th-ranked Seminoles are succeeding by committee and doing things the way coach Leonard Hamilton wants them.

For a stretch of three-plus minutes to start the second half Wednesday against Wake Forest, the most annoying college basketball team in the country to play against did everything wrong.

They turned the ball over on three consecutive possessions. They missed all five field goal attempts. They were out of whack defensively, which led to Wake Forest going on a 11-0 run on its home floor and taking a 45-41 lead.

But as Florida State is wont to do, Leonard Hamilton's starless team awakened by using its athleticism and length, allowing the Seminoles to permanently regain control of the game they eventually won, 78-68. Just as it did in a 78-65 road win at Louisville four days earlier, FSU snapped out of a funk and went on a 17-5 run, never allowing its opponent to feel comfortable the rest of the game.

This is the FSU way. The Seminoles are an eminently beatable team in spurts, often aided by their own self-destruction, but outplaying them over 40 minutes is a difficult chore. They have a tendency to wear people down with a suffocating defense that clogs passing lanes, causing opponents to often rush shots and taking them out of their game plan.

FSU's current success — a seven-game win streak, going a league-best 16-2 in ACC games since last January — didn't happen overnight. It took Hamilton more than a decade of 18 seasons in Tallahassee for his game-winning formula to evolve, but the No. 10-ranked Seminoles (14-2, 4-1 in ACC) are on a pretty good roll now.

They come at opponents in waves, playing 10 or more players each game. You never know from one minute to the next whether guards Trent Forrest, M.J. Walker, Devin Vassell or a relatively unknown player will be the cold-blooded assassin.

That's because Hamilton trusts the second guy near the end of the bench almost as much as his starters on the floor.

Case in point: when FSU's frontcourt ran into early foul trouble at Wake Forest, he put seldom-used, walk-on Harrison Prieto in the game. Playing a career-high 10 minutes, the 6-foot-8 junior contributed two offensive rebound buckets and a steal that led to a Vassell three-pointer.

At that point, Prieto had played only 12 minutes all season in blowout wins. Yet Hamilton sent him out there in an ACC road game because he needed a big body to hold the fort until Patrick Williams, Malik Osborne and Dominik Olejniczak could return.

"We win by committee and most teams feature people," Hamilton said Thursday in a phone interview. "We don't feature one particular person. We let the game come to them. We have a system where we get everybody involved. I think that makes us more challenging to play. The go-to person is the guy with the highest percentage shot. Our guys all feel equal.

"We don't have a Zion Williamson that makes you [media] guys tickle your fancy. We're not quite as sexy. We are different. We're not like everybody else."

That's part of the appeal in Hamilton's recruiting pitch. He and top assistant Stan Jones — who has been with Hamilton for 25 years, dating back to his coaching stints with the NBA Washington Wizards and the University of Miami — have convinced players to accept their role. Even if it means reduced playing time.

Over the last four seasons, where FSU is 92-31 overall and 38-21 in ACC play, Hamilton's system has taken the 'Noles to three consecutive NCAA tournaments and a potential top-4 seed this year.

After a Sweet 16 and Elite Eight appearance the past two seasons, FSU again looks like someone nobody wants to play because Hamilton has a team — six of the top eight players by playing time are freshmen or sophomores — performing better than the sum of its parts.

"It's the vision the coaches have for us," said Forrest, a senior and the team's leading scorer at 12.1 points per game.

"Part of the reason you come to FSU is because you know you're going to play with other unselfish guys. It's a credit to the coaches for recruiting those players and then the players for buying into it.

"So far, everything they've said about this program has happened. It doesn't matter how you get the win. That's how we play. Some days, you play great. Other days, you can play the sorriest team in D-I and they can go on a run, but it's how you respond to it that matters."

The players tend to reflect Hamilton's unflappable sideline demeanor. When things go haywire, like it did briefly against Wake Forest, the Seminoles appear unfazed and just go about their business.

"You look over and see [Hamilton] calm, cool and collected," said Forrest. "That's a reason a lot of us don't get worried too much when we hit adversity."

The Seminoles certainly don't get rattled in tight games coming down to the final minute. Since winning at Duke on Michael Snaer's buzzer-beater in January 2012, FSU is 36-8 in games decided by one possession or overtime, where it has won eight straight the last three years.

Under Hamilton, 71, the fifth-longest tenured coach at any Power 5 school, FSU has gradually made the climb in recent years to challenge the ACC bluebloods, where Duke, North Carolina, Virginia, Louisville and Syracuse have long established traditions.

"When you're in a conference with rich programs that have Hall of Fame coaches, it challenges every fiber you have to compete at a consistent level," said Hamilton. "We've kind of figured out how to maintain who we are.

"There's a reason why all programs are where they are. Florida State had been inconsistent for a long time. The reality is nobody cares about the challenges you face. The bottom line is to get it done."

In the twilight of his coaching career, Hamilton — tied with Maryland's Lefty Driesell as the sixth-winningest coach in ACC history with 348 victories — has FSU basketball in a good place.

Just like Hamilton's milestone marriage to wife Claudette, with their 50th anniversary approaching in September, the patience he and the FSU administration have had with each other is now bearing fruit.

Not many ACC coaches would have survived going their first six years without making the NCAA tournament. Hamilton has taken his share of criticism over the years for in-game strategy and simply not winning enough.

His critics have quieted down, especially now that Hamilton is experiencing the kind of consistent success Seminoles' fans wish they could get back to in football.

FSU doesn't need a star player who can carry the program. It's doing just fine the Leonard Hamilton way.

## Leonard Hamilton's Twitter Account Gives FSU Fans A Peek Into His Personality

If you only see Leonard Hamilton on game day, you probably think you have an idea of who the Florida State men's basketball head coach is.

For the better part of the last 20 years, the FSU men's basketball coach has patrolled the sidelines during games with a rarely-changing facial expression.

Emotions at either end of the spectrum -- happiness or anger -- rarely escape from behind Hamilton's stoic facade. As such, one might think just from watching him in this setting that he can be unpleasant to be around and hates fun.

Ask those who know him best and this couldn't be further from the truth.

"I have a lot of friends that always ask me, 'How's coach Ham? He always looks so serious, like he's mad.' I'm like, 'He's the complete opposite,'" FSU sophomore Devin Vassell said of Hamilton.

When you're around him, he's always making jokes and laughing. He always tells us that, in the games, he needs to have a serious face because how is he going to be able to yell at us and be laughing and everything. I respect it." While Hamilton's gameday demeanor hasn't changed this season, he's begun to show supporters that other side of him a bit more through the use of his Twitter account @FSUCoachHam.

Hamilton has had the account since 2009, but until recently, he used it just to talk about his team and former players and celebrate their accolades.

That changed this school year as Hamilton has embraced the modern-day internet, beginning to share funny images and show fans the personality that many may not have seen much throughout his time in Tallahassee.

"I do feel that it's important for people to know that I do have a little personality," Hamilton told the *Democrat*. "I'm not the focused, intolerant guy that they see, intense guy on the sidelines all the time. I have lots of fun with my players."

The first-such image dropped the day of FSU's 2019 football opener, Aug. 31. When FSU fans noticed the turnover backpack was no longer on the sidelines, Hamilton quote tweeted a photoshopped image of him holding up the turnover backpack with the caption, "I promised Willie (Taggart) I would take good care of it."

The timing of Hamilton's Twitter emergence has been in tune with the Seminoles' re-emergence as a program. FSU has been to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament each of the last two seasons -- just the second time that has happened in program history -- and won 59 of its last 62 home games.

The Seminoles saw their 10-game win streak snapped Tuesday at Virginia, but remain all but assured of making their fourth consecutive NCAA Tournament this season. That would also be tied for the longest streak of tournament appearances in FSU history.

Because of this successful run, Hamilton knew the interest would be there for him to start having a little more fun on his account.

"Basically all my coaching career, I've been kind of matter of fact, business approach, low-key approach to developing programs. And I've always been the underdog in certain situations and programs I've had to build so we've had to strategically operate under the radar," Hamilton said.

"But in this new age of social media, this is a movement that youngsters and young adults or just sports fans have gotten into that people are always looking for information about who you are and what you're doing..."

"Even though my whole career, I've been somewhat reserved and laid back, I feel a need for people to know about who we are, how we do it and allow our fans and supporters more of an inside look at who we are and what we do in our program. It's been fun trying to decide what's important for fans to know and to try to have a little fun with it as well. We've kind of gotten a kick out of some of the things that we've done. It seems to have drawn a lot of attention."

The funny pictures on Hamilton's Twitter have ranged from a Space Jam parody to old pictures of himself.

A common theme among many of the images and jokes is his age. Hamilton turned 71 last August, but is praised by everyone in the business for how he looks far younger than he actually is.

In November, Hamilton participated in the decade challenge, sharing pictures of him from 2009 and 2019 that show minimal aging with the caption, "I promise these photos are accurate. Told y'all about the Ham Sauce."

Hamilton's personal favorite tweet, however, is a picture posted in December of him at three years old. He's decked out in a full suit with an accompanying caption that reads, "I don't know why I'm not considered one of the best-dressed coaches in college hoops. This is me at 3 years old. I'm just saying. #Smooth"

"That picture says a lot about what my life has been about. That was a picture on a Sunday where my grandmother dressed me up because we went to church every Sunday," Hamilton said.

"If you look at that picture, you'll see from head to toe, I'm probably three years old dressed like a grown adult going to church. That was my grown-up look, my Sunday best clothes going to church... Because I'm dressed so elegantly, I want people to know that I've been dressing well for a long time."

Even as long as he's had his Twitter account, Hamilton's players still aren't entirely how he gets it to work given his technical expertise.

But they're ok with the fact that the rest of the world is finally starting to see the full version of the coach they've known since they were recruits.

"Half the time he doesn't even know what's going on on Twitter, but he somehow tweets out stuff," FSU point guard Trent Forrest said.

"People have him all messed up because he's a hilarious guy. Everybody, they see him on game day and on TV and they see just the stern face, but coach Ham is hilarious."
