MIDWEEK STORY LINES & NEWS

- No. 6 Miami travels to Orlando for its first nonconference road game against host UCF. First pitch is set for 6:30 p.m.
- UM has an 11-2 record through its first 13 nonconference games, and has won six in a row entering Wednesday's matchup.
- The Hurricanes lead the all-time series against the Knights 19-5, including a perfect 6-0 record in road games in the series.
- Miami is ranked in the top 10 of every major college baseball poll. The Hurricanes check in at No. 5 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, No. 6 in NCBWA and *Baseball America* and USA Today Coaches Poll & No. 10 by D1Baseball.com.
- Bryan Garcia moved into sole possession of fourth place in all-time saves (30) in UM history on March 12 vs. Virginia Tech.
- Head coach Jim Morris entered 2016 with the sixth-most wins in Division I history (1,485) and the fourth-most among active skippers. With 11 more wins in 2016, Morris will move into fifth place in all-time Division I wins (Larry Hays, 1,508).
- The Hurricanes made their 24th trip to the College World Series in 2015, finishing with a 50-17 record and a 22-8 mark in ACC play. Miami was the No. 5 national seed for the postseason, and won its second straight ACC Coastal Division title.
- In a preseason poll of ACC head coaches, the Hurricanes were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division in 2016.
- Miami returned several hitters from an offense that ranked No. 1 nationwide in runs scored in 2015, including Preseason All-America Zack Collins, two-time All-ACC outfielder Willie Abreu and CWS All-Tournament selection Jacob Heyward.

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 43 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 12 of Morris' 22 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2015, when Miami was awarded the No. 5 national seed heading into the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 16 of 22 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 31 years - 22 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 994-408-3 (.706) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,498-652-4 (.694) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,628-693-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

MIDWEEK NEWS & NOTES

CANES TRAVEL TO ORLANDO, PLAY UCF

- After capturing a **road series win** in its opening ACC weekend against Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, sixth-ranked Miami travels to Orlando and Jay Bergman Field Wednesday for a matchup with **UCF**.
- The Hurricanes carry a **19-5 lead** in the all-time series against the Knights, including a perfect **6-0 mark in road games** (Kissimmee Orlando). Miami bested the Knights 4-2 at home in **2015**, and won 6-5 in its last trip to Orlando in **2014**.
- Miami has an **11-2 mark** in its first 13 nonconference games, and have won **six straight nonconference games** entering Wednesday.

MILESTONES IN SIGHT FOR MORRIS

- With two more victories in 2016, head coach Jim Morris will become just the **sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball** to reach the **1,500-win milestone** (1,498).
- Morris, who has won **994 games** during his illustrious 22-year-plus tenure, is **six wins away** from becoming the second coach in Miami history to reach **1,000 wins** at the helm (Ron Fraser - 1,267).
- With 11 more wins, Morris will move past **Larry Hays** (1,508) as the **fifth-winningest coach** in Division I baseball history by victories.
- Since his arrival in 1994, Miami's 994 wins are **sixth-most in D1**.

COMEBACK CANES TOP HOKIES

- After dropping its ACC opener 14-3 on March 11 in Blacksburg, Miami **came back to win the final two games** of the series (11-6, 7-2) against the host Hokies at English Field.
- The road series win marked **Miami's fourth in its last five ACC road trips** dating to 2015, and the Hurricanes' **fourth straight series win over the Hokies** overall. UM is **28-8** all-time against Virginia Tech.
- Miami's offense led the way in the series win, connecting for **29 hits, seven doubles** and **four home runs**. The Canes reached base at a .381 clip and hit a combined .293 over the weekend.
- Offensive leaders for Miami over the weekend included junior **Zack Collins** (.500 [4-for-8], two home runs, six RBI, four walks), sophomore **Carl Chester** (.400, four hits, three runs, three steals) and junior **Johnny Ruiz** (.400, first career home run, four RBI).

USA TODAY TABS MIAMI #3 PROGRAM

- In a ranking of Division I baseball programs by athletic competitiveness, academic quality, return on investment and leadership, **Miami was ranked the No. 3 program in America by USA Today**.
- Miami trailed only Vanderbilt & LSU in the list released on March 4.

CLIMBING UP THE RECORD BOOKS

- Closer Bryan Garcia entered the year with the **fifth-most saves in Miami history (25)**, and recorded back-to-back saves against Rutgers (Feb. 19-20); his fifth save of 2016 was **Virginia Tech** on **March 12**.
- Garcia's five saves in 2016 are the **XX-most in the ACC**.
- Garcia is chasing the **all-time record for saves in a career**, which is **39** - held by **George Huguet** (2001-2004). Garcia's 15 saves as a freshman in 2014 tied for the **seventh-most in a single season**.
- Garcia moved past **Danny Graves** (1992-94) for sole possession of fourth place last time out (30), and needs four more to tie **Robbie Morrison** (1996-98) for third (34), seven more to tie **Rick Raether** (1984-86) for second (37) and is nine behind **Huguet** for first (39).

- Miami went 4-1 last week, and got strong offensive performances from **Jacob Heyward** (.353, 2 2B, 1 HR, 4 RBI), **Johnny Ruiz** (.333, 6-for-18, 1 HR, 4 RBI) and **Zack Collins** (.333, 2 HR, 6 RBI, .500 OBP).
- On the hill: **Danny Garcia** (7.0 IP, 5 H, 0 ER, 7 Ks), **Bryan Garcia** (5.0 IP, 1 H, 3 BB, 11 Ks, two saves) and **Keven Pimentel** (first win).

LOOKING FOR A THREE-PEAT

- Miami won its **second straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2015, posting a **22-8 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes, who were picked to win the ACC Coastal Division once again in 2016, have won **46 ACC games over the past two seasons** - the **second-best two-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule** prior to 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship twice, most recently in **2014** when the Canes finished **24-6**; the Hurricanes won the **ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008**.

CANES SWEEP JASPERS

- Miami cruised to a **weekend sweep of Manhattan** at Mark Light Field from March 4-6; the Hurricanes **outscored** the Jaspers **31-8** in the three-game series, while the staff recorded a collective **2.33 ERA**.
- Among Miami's top performers **at the plate** against the Jaspers were **Edgar Michelangeli** (.750, 9-for-12, 3 RBI), junior **Zack Collins** (.625, 5-for-8, 1 HR, 5 RBI) & sophomore **Carl Chester** (.400, 4-for-10, 5 runs, 3 RBI); UM hit .371 as a team and recorded 39 hits vs. MC.
- Senior lefthander **Thomas Woodrey** delivered a brilliant start against the Jaspers in the series opener, tossing eight shutout innings, allowing two hits, one walk and striking out a career-best 10 batters.
- In 20 combined innings against Manhattan, Miami's **starting pitchers** went 3-0, allowed 11 hits, surrendered one earned run and totaled 18 strikeouts and just five walks (**0.45 combined ERA**).

MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

- Miami dropped **two of three** in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes **won Game 2** by a final score of **5-3**, but dropped Games 1 and 3.
- The Hurricanes got five strong innings from lefthander **Michael Medavilla** (2-0) Saturday and four RBI from slugger **Zack Collins**.
- Saturday's 5-3 win was played in front of a **sellout crowd of 4,999**; over **13,000 fans made their way through the gates** to see the annual rivalry between the Hurricanes and Gators.

OPENING WEEKEND SWEEP

- Led by dominant performances from the starting rotation, Miami **opened its 2016 season with a sweep** of visiting Rutgers Feb. 19-21.
- Lefthanders **Thomas Woodrey** (5 IP, 1 ER), **Michael Medavilla** (6 IP, 0 R, 7 K) and **Danny Garcia** (7 IP, 0 R, 4 K) combined for a 0.50 ERA with two walks and 15 strikeouts in 18 innings of work.
- Junior **Johnny Ruiz** led the offense with a .667 (6-for-9) average against the **Scarlet Knights**.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the **top 10 in preseason polls** from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a **No. 4** ranking from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* and a **No. 6** ranking from several outlets.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* was its **highest from the publication since 2005**; its No. 6 ranking from *Baseball America* was its highest from BA since **2007**.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

- Miami made its return to the **College World Series in 2015**, marking the program's first trip to Omaha, Neb., since **2008**. Miami's **24** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program**.
- The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program nationwide; Miami's **four national championships** (1982, 1985, 1999, 2001) rank **fifth-most**.

ONES TO WATCH

- Two Hurricanes picked up 2016 Preseason All-America honors: junior catcher **Zack Collins** and junior closer **Bryan Garcia**.
- Collins, a unanimous Preseason All-America candidate, was among the 50 players named to the initial watch list for the **Golden Spikes Award** by USA Baseball. He was also named to last year's list.
- Garcia, who was recognized by Louisville Slugger and Perfect Game, was named to the watch list for the **Stopper of the Year Award** by NCBWA for the second straight year.
- Both players have earned All-America recognition in their two-year Hurricane careers; Collins was a **third-team ABCA/Rawlings All America** choice last season, while Garcia was a **NCBWA third-team All American** after his freshman year in 2014.
- UM had three All-Americans in 2015: **David Thompson** (unanimous), **George Iskenderian** (NCBWA) & **Collins** (ABCA).

MIAMI ADDS ANOTHER MAJOR LEAGUER

- Arizona Diamondbacks slugger **Peter O'Brien** became the **53rd** former University of Miami player to play in Major League Baseball when he was called up late in 2015.
- O'Brien joined a 2015 group that included now Oakland A's teammates **Yonder Alonso** and **Danny Valencia**, new San Diego Padres outfielder **Jon Jay**, Dodgers All-Star catcher **Yasmani Grandal**, new D-Backs catcher/outfielder **Chris Herrmann**, infielders **Ryan Jackson** and **Jemile Weeks** and Milwaukee All-Star **Ryan Braun**.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander **Andrew Suarez**, third baseman **David Thompson**, infielder **George Iskenderian**, catcher **Garrett Kennedy** and outfielder **Ricky Eusebio**.

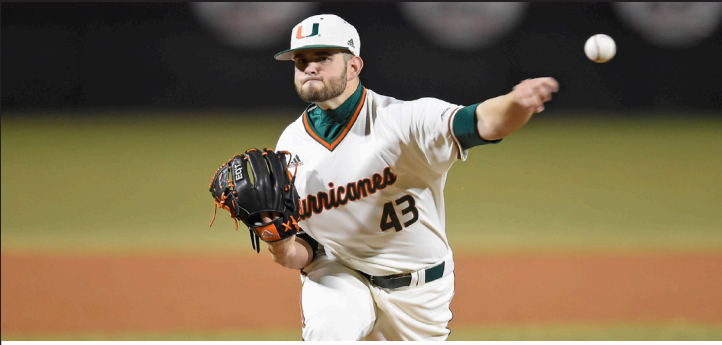
