HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS

- The Hurricanes are set to host three consecutive matches in 15 days, welcoming FAU, San Diego State and Stetson to Cobb Stadium.

EUROPEAN PIPELINE

- Five international players have been recruited by Sarah Barnes and her staff, with four traveling over from Europe, Gudrun Haralz (Iceland), Mari Horpestad (Norway), Maria Jakobsdottir (Iceland) and Ine Østmo (Norway).
- Haralz led the Hurricanes last season with seven goals and two assists, finishing with a team-high 16 points. This season, Østmo has a co-season-high five points and two goals, while Jakobsdottir notched her first collegiate tally against FAU.
- Østmo has started all three matches at midfield with Horpestad at center back, while Jakobsdottir has earned the starting role against FDU and FAU.

NEW FACES IN THE BOX SCORE

- Only four of Miami's 19 goals from last season are from players who will be competing during the 2019 season. Michelle Giampertone (two), Kristina Fisher (one) and Morgan Asmussen (one).
- Gudrun Haralz (seven) and Lexi Castellano-Mugica (one) are on medical leave. Mallory Olsson (four) and Rachel Sorkenn (one) transferred. Jaime Brunworth (two) graduated.
- Nine different players have notched goals to kick off the 2019 campaign, including six who didn't score in 2018. Tia Dupont (two), Lauren Markwith (two), Østmo (two), Jakobsdottir (two), Bayleigh Chaviers (one) Emma Tucker (one), Ariana Muñoz (one) and Sierra Frey (one)..

STAGE IS SET FOR THE CLASS OF 2020

- In the season opener, all four seniors who are able to play on the pitch this season earned points. Bayleigh Chaviers (two) and Dejah Cason (one) both recorded assists from the back line against UTRGV, while Kristina Fisher and Lauren Markwith both tallied goals against the Vaqueros.

A LOOK BACK ON LAST SEASON'S ACC FINALE

- In front of a record setting home crowd, the Hurricanes topped the eventual 2018 National Champions and then-ninth-ranked Florida State 1-0 in the season finale.

SARAH BARNES

Head Coach
Second Season
UCONN, 1998

The University of Miami announced Feb. 27, 2018 the hiring of Sarah Barnes as the new head coach of the Hurricanes soccer program.

Barnes enters her second season at Miami after spending six seasons as the head coach at George Washington University, where she was named the 2015 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year.

Over her six seasons at GW, Barnes led the Colonials to a 60-41-14 (.583) mark, including a 48-23-8 (.658) record the last four years.

In 2013, her second season at GW, Barnes guided the Colonials to their first A-10 Championship berth since 2002, beginning a streak of five consecutive years in the conference tournament.

The following year, Barnes turned in the first of four straight seasons with double-digit victories, as the Colonials finished 12-6-1 (4-3-1).

In 2015, Barnes led GW to a 15-5-0 (10-0-0) mark and the program's first A-10 regular season title since 1995. It was the first time in school history the team finished with a perfect conference record. After tallying an 11-7-3 (4-3-3) record in 2016, Barnes concluded her GW tenure with a 10-5-4 (5-2-3) campaign.

Prior to joining the Colonials, Barnes spent four seasons as an assistant at the University of Texas. The Longhorns went 47-30-12 (.596), both reaching the NCAA Championship and notching 12-plus victories three times.

Barnes started her coaching career at her alma mater, the University of Connecticut, from 1998-2007. She spent two years as a volunteer assistant, seven as an assistant coach and one as the associate head coach.

In her decade on the UConn staff, the Huskies went 167-57-17 (.728), winning six BIG EAST regular season title and two conference tournament crowns. UConn made the NCAA Championship all 10 years, advancing to the Sweet 16 eight times, the Elite Eight six times and the national championship once, in 2003.

Barnes holds multiple United Soccer Coaches certifications and a U.S. Soccer Federation "D" license. She spent two years with the Olympic Development (ODP) Region I staff, working with the U-14 and U-16 age groups.

Additionally, Barnes served as a Connecticut ODP head and assistant coach from the U-13 to U-17 age groups. In 2006, she earned the Thomas E. Krusewski Memorial Young Coach of the Year from the Connecticut Junior Soccer Association.

During her collegiate playing career, Barnes led UConn to a dazzling 83-14-2 (.848) record, including a school record 23 wins her final season. The Huskies made the NCAA Elite Eight every year, reaching the College Cup in 1994 and 1997, advancing to the national final the latter year.

In 1997, her last season, Barnes was a co-captain, co-team MVP and a Second Team All-BIG EAST honoree. She graduated magna cum laude from UConn in 1998 with a degree in sociology. The next year, Barnes earned a master's degree with a dual emphasis on social psychology and women in sports.

A native of Snohomish, Wash., Barnes made the NCAA Championship 17 of 18 years as a player or coach from 1994 through 2011.
