### Miami Visits McCamish Pavilion for Saturday Matinee

Closing out its three-game homestand with a Saturday matinee, Georgia tech hosts defending Atlantic Coast Conference champion Miami with a 2 p.m. regionally-televised game at McCamish Pavilion.

The ACC's Regional Sports Network will provide regional coverage of the game. Radio coverage of the game will be provided by the Georgia Tech IMG Sports Network and can be heard in Atlanta on WYAY-FM (106.7). The Tech radio broadcast can be heard nationally on satellite radio (Sirius ch. 108, XM ch. 192).

Tech brings an 8-2 homecourt record into Saturday's game, following Tuesday night's 81-74 loss to No. 21 Pittsburgh, and is looking for its first home win against the Hurricanes since the 2010-11 season.

In its third season under head coach Brian Gregory, Tech has continued to improve offensively while maintaining its solid defense and excellent rebounding. The Yellow Jackets' 70.7 points per game average this season is their highest under Gregory by more than six points. Defensively, Tech ranks 85th nationally in scoring yield (67.7 ppg) and 44th in field goal percentage defense (40.7 pct.) while also outrebounding 14 of 16 opponents this season.

Miami (9-7, 1-3 ACC) comes to Atlanta on the heels of a 63-53 home loss to Florida State Wednesday night. The Hurricanes, who have also lost to Virginia Tech and Syracuse in conference play, have a 4-2 road record this season, including their only ACC win at North Carolina.

After Saturday, Tech will play four of its next five games on the road, beginning with a 9 p.m. game at Boston College Tuesday.

### **Fast Break Points**

- Georgia Tech is looking for its first homecourt win against Miami since March 6, 2011, when the Yellow Jackets closed out a 55-year run in Alexander Memorial Coliseum with a 66-57 victory. Since then, the Hurricanes have beaten Tech twice at Philips Arena and once at McCamish Pavilion.
  - Tech played Pittsburgh Tuesday night with just eight scholarship players, competing without four

members of the team who had combined for 22 starts and were key parts of the rotation at the start of pre-season practice - forward Robert Carter, Jr., swingman Jason Morris, and guards Travis Jorgenson and Solomon Poole. (More details below)

- Marcus Georges-Hunt and Chris Bolden were the heroes of last year's Tech win over Miami, ranked No. 6 at the time, in Coral Gables. Bolden scored a career-high 21 points, and Georges-Hunt scored the game-winning basket, tipping in his own miss, as time expired. Tech rallied from 13 points down in the second half, it's biggest second-half rally to win a game under Brian Gregory.
- Tech has out-rebounded 14 of 16 opponents this season. Duke and Pittsburgh are the only teams to win the boards against the Yellow Jackets.
- Ten of the 15 ACC schools are ranked higher than Tech's current No. 133 (as of Friday), and six of those are in the top 68. Miami will be the 10th top-100 team Tech has faced.

### Series vs. Miami

- Georgia Tech snapped a three-game losing streak in the series with a 71-69 victory over 6th-ranked Miami in Coral Gables on March 6 of last season, earning a split in the season series. The Hurricanes had won the first meeting of the season in Atlanta, 62-49 and maintains a 10-7 lead in the overall series.
- The March 6 victory was only the second win for Tech at the BankUnited Center and first since Feb. 26, 2005. It also was Tech's first win over a top-10 team on the road since the 2003-04 season
- After winning the first two meetings with Miami after the Hurricanes became members of the ACC, Tech has dropped nine of the last 12. Miami won the only regular-season meeting between the two teams in 2011-12, as well as their ACC Tournament meeting, both games at Philips Arena.
- Miami was the opponent for Tech in its last game at Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game the Yellow Jackets won 66-57 to close out the 2010-11 regular season. Tech won four of six games against the Hurricanes in the building.
- Eleven of the 17 meetings have been decided by 10 points or less.
- The last meeting between the two schools prior to Miami's joining the ACC occurred in December of 1997 as part of the Orange Bowl Classic doubleheader at Miami Arena, the Hurricanes' home court until the team moved into the oncampus Convocation Center last year. The Yellow Jackets, led that year by senior forward Matt Harpring, won that game, 69-61.
- Tech played Miami twice under former head coach Whack Hyder, losing the first-ever meeting in the series by 22 points in 1953, then taking a six-point homecourt victory in 1967. That was the only pre-ACC visit by the Hurricanes to Alexander Memorial Coliseum, and the 90-84 Tech win has been the highest scoring game in the brief series.

scholarship players (Robert Sampson is sitting out this season as a transfer) and a deep projected rotation. But a series of injuries has forced head coach Brian Gregory to play without at least one of his key players in every game.

- Tech played its game Tuesday night without four of those players - forwards Robert Carter, Jr. (knee), and Jason Morris (concussion), and guards Travis Jorgenson (knee) and Solomon Poole (migraine).
- Tech has been without sophomore forward Robert Carter, Jr., still No. 1 on the ACC rebounding chart, for its last four games after he sustained a tear of the meniscus in his left knee during the Yellow Jackets' game at Charlotte Dec. 29. Carter, Jr., underwent surgery Jan. 7 and it is not yet known whether he can return this season.
- This is the second significant injury Tech has sustained since the season began. Freshman guard Travis Jorgenson, who had averaged nearly 20 minutes a game off the bench and was becoming a key reserve as a point guard, was lost for the season with a torn ACL in the season's fourth game.

• Morris missed the Pitt game after suffering a concussion in a traffic accident last Saturday, four games after getting back in the starting lineup. He was sidelined for Tech's first 10 games this season after surgery to repair a stress fracture in his left foot.

- Poole, who started five games early in the year, has missed the last two games with a migraine.
- The Carter, Jr., Poole and Morris absences all come on the heels of a rotational adjustment Tech's coaching staff made during the Christmas break and implemented for the Charlotte game. Morris was inserted in the starting lineup in place of a struggling Chris Bolden. Freshmen Quinton Stephens and Corey Heyward were given more promiment backup roles in place of Stacey and Solomon Poole, respectively, who were also struggling.
- Tech won the Charlotte game but lost Carter, Jr. Senior Kammeon Holsey, who had started 43 games in his first two seasons at Tech but none last year, replaced him at Maryland. Tech won its game againat Notre Dame but then lost Morris, and Bolden, who had 14 points against the Irish, has returned to the lineup in his place.

### **Noting the Yellow Jackets**

- Tech has scored 74 points in each of its last two games, hitting its season average in field goal percentage (44.2), making 15-of-43 three-point shots (34.9 pct.) and 27-of-39 (69.2 pct.) from the free throw line. Tech also recorded 32 assists (23 turnovers) on 53 made field goals (60.4 pct.).
- Going back to the Duke game, Tech has shot 45.6 percent from the floor in its last three games.
- Pittsburgh's 56.9 percent shooting from the floor was the highest recorded by an opponent in head coach Brian Gregory's three seasons at Tech.
- •Tech's 18 rebounds against Pitt were its fewest in at least the last 14 years, going back through the 2000-01 season. The lowest total recorded during that time previously was 21.
- Trae Golden's 22 points led the Yellow Jackets in Tuesday's 81-74 ACC loss to visiting Pitt. It was Golden's second straight game with 20 points or more, third in his last vive games and fourth this season. He has reached double figures in 13 games.
- Golden also leads Georgia Tech in assists with 59 (3.47 per game), and has shot 97 free throws this season (nine more than Tech's leader for all last season).
- Kammeon Holsey has gone 6-of-9 from the floor in each of his last two games, raising his shooting percentage for the season to .511, and has averaged 12.5 points and 6.0 rebounds.
- Daniel Miller, *in ACC games only*, leads the conference in blocked shots (3.25 pg), ranks eighth in rebounding (7.3) and fifth in steals (1.75).
- Miller ranks second all-time at Tech in blocks with 245, and is tied for 15th place in ACC history with North Carolina's Sam Perkins.
- Marcus Georges-Hunt added 13 points against Pittsburgh for his 13th double-figure outing in 17 games this season.
- Reserve point guard Corey Heyward has played 28 minutes in Tech's last two games, re-

## LAST MEETING

Georgia Tech 71, Miami 69

### March 6, 2013 • Coral Gables, Fla.

Marcus Georges-Hunt followed his own miss with the winning tip-in as time expired, and Georgia Tech rallied past No. 6 Miami 71-69 to prevent the Hurricanes from clinching the outright Atlantic Coast Conference title.

The Hurricanes (23-6, 14-3 ACC), who squandered a 13-point lead in the second half, lost their second straight game.

Georgia Tech (16-13, 6-11) beat a Top 25 team for the first time since March 2010. The Yellow Jackets became the first team to win at Miami this season

Miami led 45-32 early in the second half. Julian Gamble's three-point play with 12 minutes to go made it 56-45 before the Yellow Jackets rallied, taking the lead on Chris Bolden's fast-break layup following a steal with 3:38 remaining.

After a basket by Tech's Daniel Miller's made it 69-all with 2:14 left, each team misfired. Robert Carter Jr. intercepted a pass by Durand Scott to set up the final possession with 35 seconds left.

Georges-Hunt drove into the lane and threw up a one-hander that bounced off the rim. He and Carter both appeared to get a hand on the rebound, and the tip-in was credited to Georges-Hunt for only his second basket of the game.

cording four assists, five rebounds and no turnovers.

- Stacey Poole, Jr., received his most extended playing time of the season against Pitt, playing 17 minutes and scoring seven points (2-4 FG, 3-3 FT).
- Freshman Quinton Stephens fouled out in just 10 minutes against Pitt, but had four assists and made a three-point shot. He has averaged 6.0 points, 3.4 rebounds, and hit 11-of-28 shots from the floor in the last five games.
- Trae Golden (15.0 ppg), Marcus Georges-Hunt (12.8 ppg) and Daniel Miller (10.8) are all averaging in double figures against the ACC and for the season.
- Robert Carter, Jr., (9.3 rpg) remains the ACC leader in rebound average, while Daniel Miller (7.9) is fifth. The last Yellow Jacket to lead the ACC in rebounding was Alvin Jones (10.4) in 2000-01.
- Tech has had eight 20-point efforts in its first 17 games this season. The Jackets had only four all last season, and the first came in the season's 16th game.
- Tech has averaged 11.3 turnovers in ACC games, compared to 13.1 in non-conference play.
- Each of Tech's first six losses came by double digits. Tech lost to Pitt by seven.
- Tech is 5-3 this season in games decided by 10 points or less after going 10-15 in such games the last two seasons.
- Tech has hit the 80-point mark three times this season after reaching that figure only once last season and three times in all of 2011-12.
- Tech has averaged 14.4 assists per game (1.7 per game better than last season), and has assisted on 55.6 percent of its field goals.
- Tech has a plus-1.14 assist/turnover ratio, and seven players who have seen regular action are either even or on the positive side of that ratio.
- Four Tech players made the Dean's List in the fall semester, including top two scorers Trae Golden and Marcus Georges-Hunt and walk-ons Brooks Doyle and Colin Gurry.

### Free Throws Are Really Free

Georgia Tech has made a tremendous improvement in its free throw shooting this season, not only in getting to the line more often, but making a greater percentage than it has done in nearly 20 years.

The Yellow Jackets have shot 70 percent as a team over a full season only once in the last 17 seasons, and three times since Tech's first Final Four season of 1989-90. Tech shot 63.5 percent from the stripe last year and 65.4 percent in its first season under Brian Gregory.

- Tech has attempted 20.3 free throws per game so far (compared to just 16.2 last season) and has scored an average of 14.0 points per game from the stripe (10.3 points per game last season).
- Tech has attempted more free throws than its opponent in 10 of 17 games. Last year, that happened only 13 times all season, and Tech was 11-2 in those games.
- Tech is 8-2 this season when attempting more free throws than its opponent, and 26-10 when doing so under Brian Gregory.

70 percent for the season - Trae Golden (76.3 pct.), Kammeon Holsey (75.8 pct.) and Daniel Miller (70.5 pct.). Marcus Georges-Hunt is at 66.7 percent.

• Trae Golden has been Tech's best at drawing fouls and getting to the line. He has shot 97 free throws in 17 games, exceeding the total for Tech's leader all of last season. His current rate, which ranks seventh in the ACC, would leave him with a total of 177 at the end of the regular season.

### **Offensive Efficiency Continues to Improve**

Georgia Tech's offense, despite the team's injuries and different lineups that have resulted, continues to improve. The Yellow Jackets are producing more shots from the floor, more three-point field goals, more free throws and more points, and are doing so against stiffer competition than in previous years.

- •Tech's scoring average in all games has risen from 60.2 in Brian Gregory's first season to 64.3 last season to 70.7 so far this season.
- In conference play, Tech has averaged 66.5 points this season, compared to 62.8 last year and 58.6 the year before.
- Tech's national ranking has improved from No. 313 in 2011-12 to No. 254 last season to No. 221 this week.
- Tech has attempted 58.3 field goals per game this season, compared to 57.8 per game last season and 52.9 in 2011-12.
- Tech has made its greatest strides so far this season in free throw shooting, both in getting to the line and in accuracy. The Jackets are averaging 14.0 points scored from the foul line this season and has hit 69.0 percent from the stripe, a solid improvement from the 10.1 points per game and 64.4 percent accuracy Tech posted in the first two seasons under Gregory.
- Tech has improved its assist rate by 2.6 per game (14.4) over its first two seasons under Gregory (11.8), and has assisted on 55.7 percent of its made field goals this season compared to 50.6 the last two seasons. Tech's national ranking in this category has improved from No. 298 in Gregory's

- Tech's turnover rate has improved from 14.4 per game in 2011-12 to 12.9 last season to 12.6 this season (11.3 per game in ACC play). Likewise, Tech's assist/turnover ratio is +29 so far this season compared to -13 combined the last two seasons. The Jackets rank No. 117 nationally in assist/turnover ratio after finishing No. 155 last year and No. 300 in 2011-12.
- Tech has scored 80 points three times this season, after doing it just once last season and four times combined in its first two seasons under Gregory.
- Tech scored 70 or more points 11 times last season, compared to seven times in 2011-12. Tech has scored 70 more points in eight of 17 games this season.

### **Boardwork Empire**

One of the cornerstones of head coach Brian Gregory's philosophy is that everybody rebounds and Tech wins the rebounding battle every game. The Yellow Jackets have done so in 14 of 16 games this season so far, and Tech ranks sixth in the ACC currently in rebound average and eighth in rebound margin (+5.6), and ranks 44th nationally in rebound margin.

- •Tech ranks fourth in the ACC in defensive rebound percentage (72 pct.) - percentage of available rebounds taken on the defensive glass.
- Tech's season-opening 14-game streak of outrebounding opponents was the longest the Yellow Jackets have had dating back to the 2000-01 season. Tech had an 11-game streak in 2005-06.
- After getting outrebounded in its first three ACC games last season by an average of 9.3, Tech outrebounded 11 of the last 17 teams it played (one tie). In a late three-game stretch, Tech outrebounded the No. 1 (Maryland), No. 2 (NC State) and No. 3 (Miami) teams in the ACC in rebound margin against league foes by an average of 4.0.
- Last season, Tech ranked fourth in the ACC and 97th in the nation in rebound margin (+2.8). In 2011-12, Tech ranked third in the ACC and 60th nationally in rebound margin (+3.5).
- Tech has outrebounded 53 of its 79 opponents under Gregory, with three ties, and 23 of its 40 ACC opponents.
- Tech has had a double-figure rebound game 20 times since the beginning of last season - Daniel Miller (10 times), Robert Carter, Jr. (nine), and Marcus Georges-Hunt (once).
- Tech is 31-22 when it has won the rebounding battle under Gregory, and is 6-20 when it has lost the rebounding battle.

### **Pure Golden**

Trae Golden, who was a solid player in many facets in three years at Tennessee, has given Georgia Tech exactly what it expected in terms of offense and experience at the quard position.

The 6-2 senior has scored in double figures in 13 of 17 games and holds the team scoring lead at 13.6 per game. He has scored 20 points or more three times in Tech's last five games, and in each of the last two

Golden has come up big when the Jackets were in trouble, including his best effort in a Tech uniform against Notre Dame with 20 points (8-of-

11 FG), including the go-ahead three-point field goal with 45 seconds left as the Jackets won 74-69. He followed that with 22 against Pitt, including four three-pointers.

He lifted Tech nearly single-handedly at Charlotte with 24 points in a 58-55 victory. He scored 10 of Tech's final 11 points and sank what proved to be the game-winning shot, a three-point field goal with four seconds left.

Golden scored five points and assisted on another field goal in the final four minutes as Tech finished off Kennesaw State with a 15-5 run on Dec. 16. He also scored a game-high 18 points in Tech's win at Georgia, and a game-high 20 with seven assists against North Carolina A&T, helping Tech erase an 11-point second-half deficit.

A Powder Springs, Ga., native who played at Tennessee his first three seasons, Golden has put up numbers similar to those he posted for the Volunteers, hitting 76.3 percent of his free throw attempts while getting to the line more than six times per game, averaging 3.5 assists in addition to his scoring.

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey said about Golden, "His strength is hard to deal with. He's barreling down on you all the time. It's kind of hard to guard him without fouling because he's so physical. He's really changed their team. I know he's new this year. He's been a great addition for them."

### **Miller Time**

Since taking over the Yellow Jacket reins, head coach Brian Gregory has counted on Daniel Miller for more than just his ever-present high basketball IQ, shot-blocking and passing skills. The third-year Tech coach asked his pivotman for more scoring, rebounding and aggressiveness, and the 6-11 1/2 senior has responded, establishing himself as the key cog when Tech's inside-out offense is working well.

- The fifth-year senior is averaging career highs in scoring, rebounding and field goal percentage this season, and has made strides in every area each season of his career at Tech. He ranks fifth in the ACC in rebound average (7.9), third in blocked shots (2.3) and might lead the conference in field goal percentage if he met the league minimum of five field goals made per game (Miller averages 4.5).
- Miller has averaged 12.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and has hit 35-of-60 shots (58.3 pct.) from the floor over Tech's last seven games. He also went 14-for-20 from the free throw line, recorded 12 assists, 22 blocks and 11 steals.
- Miller had 10 points and 13 rebounds against Notre Dame, his third double-double of the season and eighth of his career. The Loganville, Ga., native scored the game-winning basket as part of a 9-point performance against Illinois. He has averaged 10.3 points and 8.3 rebounds in ACC play.
- A member of the ACC's All-Defensive team last season, Miller has managed to play excellent defense and avoid foul trouble. He has fouled out only twice in his career and averaged 1.7 fouls per game the last two-plus seasons after committing 2.4 per game as a freshman.
- After Tech's win over Notre Dane, Fighting Irish head coach Mike Brey said, "He is a heck of a

college basketball player. I'm very impressed with him."

• Before the season, Miller was included among a list of the nation's 15 least appreciated players by Jon Rothstein of CBSSports.com, who wrote: "If there's a better post defender in the ACC, we'd like to see him. Miller regularly neutralizes the opponent's best interior scorer and has given Brian Gregory stability in the pivot as he attempts to rebuild the Yellow Jackets' program."

### **Holsey Back in Starting Lineup**

Georgia Tech's Kammeon Holsey began this season a prime candidate for the the ACC's sixth man award, which the conference will bestow for the first time at the end of this season. He is now back in Tech's starting lineup because of an injury to teammate Robert Carter. Jr.

Holsey started 12 games as a freshman and all 31 games his sophomore year before giving way to Carter, Jr., last year and making a name for himself as one of the ACC's top sixth men. He made his 45th career start at Duke, passing the number started by Carter, Jr., the last season and a half

The 6-8 1/2 forward has continued where he left off last season, averaging 7.0 points and 5.4 rebounds and hitting 51.1 percent of his field goal tries this year. His free throw shooting has improved remarkably from 61 percent last year to 75.8 percent this season.

The senior from Sparta, Ga., was among the Yellow Jackets' top four in scoring average all of last season, finishing third at 8.8 points a game while playing under 20 minutes a game. This season he has averaged 18.6 minutes and stands sixth on the Tech scoring chart.

### **Mr. Consistency**

As Georgia Tech's leading scorer as a freshman and No. 2 this season, Marcus Georges-Hunt has been nothing if not consistent.

The 6-5 sophomore from College Park, Ga., has reached double figures in 13 of 17 games this season after doing so in 19 of 31 games a year ago.

Georges-Hunt has posted his best games this year against Tech's best opponents, scoring 20 points (7-9 FG) with seven rebounds, three blocks and three steals in Tech's Dec. 3 win over Illinois. In that game, he scored seven points during the Jackets' closing 19-4 run. He scored 18 points on 8-of-12 shooting with four rebounds and two assists at Duke on Jan. 7, and had 13 against Pittsburgh.

He has improved statistically this season in most categories, from scoring (10.8 to 12.0 ppg) to field goal percentage (42.6 to 45.5 pct.) to free throw percentage (62.9 to 66.7 pct.) to assists (1.48 to 2.53 per game) to ballhandling (1.31 assist/turnover ratio to 1.59).

Georges-Hunt has recorded at least one assist in 15 of 17 games, two or fewer turnovers in 14 of 17 games, and four or more rebounds in 12 of 17 games.

## **Magna Carter**

Before being sideline by a knee injury in Georgia Tech's game at Charlotte Dec. 29, big for-

ward Robert Carter, Jr., had developed into a force on the boards and a dependable scorer inside and out for Georgia Tech this season. The 6-8 sophomore added strength and shed body fat over the off-season, has become a more trim and mobile presence inside, and was close to averaging a double-double through 13 games.

- At the time of his injury, Carter, Jr., was tied for the ACC lead in rebound average at 9.3 per game and has led the ACC alone on occasion this season. His 15-point, 15-rebound performance Dec. 16 against Kennesaw State was his fourth double-double of the season, tied for the most in the ACC, and seventh of his career. It also was his fifth double-digit rebound game this season.
- Additionally, the Thomasville, Ga., native has scored in double figures seven times this season, including a three-game stretch in which he has averaged 15.9 points (16-of-26 FG, 13-of-17 FT) and 10.7 rebounds while recording six assists. He began that streak with a career-best 21 points in Tech's 67-64 victory over Illinois in which he scored seven of those points in the Yellow Jackets' 19-4 game-ending run.
- Carter, Jr.'s early performances attracted the attention of ESPN analyst and former college coach Fran Fraschilla, who tweeted, "GT post Robert Carter is quietly becoming a double double machine. He has excellent hands and feel. Great player to build around."

### **Tech Storylines**

- This is the 99th season of basketball for Georgia Tech and its 35th season of competition in the Atlantic Coast Conference. Tech was a member of the Southern Conference for 11 years (1921-32), the Southeastern Conference for 32 years (1932-64), independent for 11 years (1964-75), a member of the Metro Conference for three years (1975-78), and independent for one more year (1978-79) before joining the ACC.
- Georgia Tech's primary goals are always to play solid team and one-on-one defense, win the rebounding battle and be efficient on offense. Brian Gregory prefers to fuel the Yellow Jackets' transition game with superior defensive rebounding rather than by playing the passing lanes and gambling for steals.
- Tech's returning players for 2013-14 combined for 84.6 percent of the Yellow Jackets' scoring in 2012-13, 88.3 percent of the rebounds and 80.1 percent of the minutes.
- Carter, Jr., and Georges-Hunt both were invited to training camp for the USA Basketball Under-19 team, which was to compete in the FIBA U19 World Championship in July. Georges-Hunt survived the first of two roster cuts but did not make the second, while Carter, Jr., who had trained with the U18 in the summer of 2012, did not make the first cut.
- Daniel Miller is the ACC's career blockedshot leader among active players and 15th alltime with 245. He is No. 2 on Tech's all-time list, but the Tech record of 425 posted by Alvin Jones is probably out of reach.
- Only three Tech players were on the last Yellow Jacket team to play in Alexander Memorial Coliseum - rising seniors Kammeon Holsey, Daniel Miller and Jason Morris.

• Only two players remain on the Tech roster who were in the program the last time Tech played in the NCAA Tournament (2010) - Daniel Miller and Kammeon Holsey - and both red-shirted that season.

• Quinton Stephens is the first scholarship player on the Tech basketball roster from the Marist School in Atlanta since Matt Harpring, whose No. 15 is retired at Tech.

### **Homegrown Jackets**

Georgia Tech's 2013-14 team features 14 players from the state of Georgia, unprecedented in the history of Yellow Jacket basketball. Tech has more players from its home state on its roster than any team on Division I college basketball, followed by Charlotte (13), Wisconsin-Milwaukee (13) and Purdue (12). Of Tech's 13 scholarship players, 10 are from Georgia.

### The Five-Year Plan

Georgia Tech has a rarity in present-day college basketball in Daniel Miller and Kammeon Holsey, two seniors in their fifth year in the program.

Miller and Holsey are the last members of a 2009 recruiting class that also included Derrick Favors, who spent one season at Tech before becoming an NBA lottery pick, Mfon Udofia, who completed his eligibility last season, Glen Rice, Jr., who played three seasons at Tech and is now a member of the Washington Wizards, and Brian Oliver, who played two seasons at Tech and transferred to Seton Hall.

They are the only two players on the Tech roster who were on the team the last time it went to the NCAA Tournament (both red-shirted that year), and along with Jason Morris, are the only team members to have played home games at Alexander Memorial Coliseum.

Both are from small towns in Georgia - Miller from Loganville and Holsey from Sparta - and have become good friends.

## We're 18 and We Know What We Want

Georgia Tech began pre-season practice with a roster of 18 players and more depth than the Yellow Jackets have enjoyed at any time since Gregory arrived on campus. Sixteen of those players, barring injury or other concerns, dress for every home game.

• Despite the loss of four scholarship players - guards Mfon Udofia, Brandon Reed and Pierre Jordan and forward Julian Royal - Tech rebuilt by signing 6-0 guard Travis Jorgenson and 6-9 forward Quinton Stephens in its freshman class, and added transfers Trae Golden, a 6-2 guard, and Robert Sampson, a 6-8 forward. Golden was declared eligible to play this season, while Sampson will be eligible next season.

• Tech also added depth in the backcourt with 6-1 Corey Heyward, a red-shirt freshman who sat out last season after twice tearing the anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee. Tech expects to have 6-5 senior Jason Morris (Augusta, Ga.), who underwent surgery to repair a stress fracture in his left foot Oct. 14, back on the court this week.

• The Jackets have five non-scholarship play-

ers on the roster who form the scout team in practice and is dubbed the "Iron Five" by Coach Gregory. That unit includes forwards Brooks Doyle, a sophomore, and Aaron Peek, a junior, both 6-4 players who each saw action for Tech last year, a pair of sophomore guards in Colin Gurry and Ron Wamer, and 6-6 freshman forward Rand Rowland. All but Gurry (Canton, Conn.) and Rowland (Cleveland, Ga.) are from the Atlanta area.

### **Notable Milestones and Streaks**

- Daniel Miller has started 110 consecutive games, the team's longest streak and more than any active ACC player except Wake Forest's Travis McKie (111). He is the only Tech player to start every game the last three-plus seasons, and he has not missed a game in his Tech career. By the end of the regular season, if he continues to start every game, he will rank fifth in Tech history with 124, three shy of the Yellow Jacket record of 127 held by Malcolm Mackey (1990-93).
- Tech has made at least one 3-point field goal in 275 straight games, dating back to an 0-for-5 effort against Duke on Feb. 23, 2005. The Jackets came close to breaking that streak twice in the 2011-12 season Saint Joseph's (1-for-12) and Virginia (1-for-15) and again this season against Delaware State, going 0-for-7 over the first 37 minutes of the game before hitting twice in the final three minutes.
- Trae Golden surpassed the 1,000-point mark for his career. He scored 931 in three seasons at Tennessee and now has 1,162.
- Miller surpassed 800 career points at Duke, and now has 827, while Kammeon Holsey (785 points) needs 15 to reach the same plateau.
- Holsey (469 rebounds) needs 31 to reach 500 for his career.
- Miller (698 rebounds) needs two to reach 700 for his career. He has moved into 15th place on Tech's all-time list and six to reach 14th place (Lenny Horton, 704, 1977-80).
- Miller holds second place in career blocked shots at Tech (245), having surpassed John Salley (243 from 1983-86) against Pittsburgh. He ranks 15th on the ACC's all-time list, tied with North Carolina's Sam Perkins. He needs five to catch Clemson's Trevor Booker (250) and nine to catch Duke's Shane Battier (254).
- Marcus Georges-Hunt surpassed 500 career points at Duke, and now has 538.
- Georges-Hunt surpassed 200 rebounds for his career (223) against Kennesaw State.
- Robert Carter, Jr., passed 400 career points against Illinois and 300 career rebounds against East Tennessee State.
- Jason Morris reached 500 points for his career at Charlotte.

## 200 Achieved Against Presbyterian

Georgia Tech head coach Brian Gregory earned the 200th victory of his head coaching career Nov. 8 when the Yellow Jackets downed Presbyterian 88-57 at McCamish Pavilion. The third-year Yellow Jacket skipper is 37-42 at Tech after posting a 172-94 mark in eight seasons as the head man at Dayton.

### **Gregory Receives Contract Extension**

Brian Gregory received a one-year extension to his contract in November, extending the original six-year contract for Gregory through the 2017-18 season. Gregory also received an increase in his base salary and additional basketball and academic performance incentives.

Gregory began his Tech career following a six-year period in which the Yellow Jackets had just two winning seasons, and played the 2011-12 season off-campus as McCamish Pavilion was being built. But the team improved by five victories overall and by two in Atlantic Coast Conference play during the 2012-13 season. The Jackets made significant improvements statistically according to the NCAA rankings and won three ACC games on the road, including eventual ACC champion Miami, ranked No. 6 at the time.

Every senior on the Tech team has graduated during Gregory's time. The Yellow Jackets also have made significant strides in the NCAA's Academic Progress Report, moving from last to sixth in the ACC during his tenure.

### Carter, Jr., Sidelined with Knee Injury

Robert Carter, Jr., is sidelined indefinitely due to a tear of the meniscus in his left knee.

A magnetic resonance imaging test taken last Tuesday revealed the injury, which Carter, Jr., sustained during Tech's game at Charlotte. The 6-8 forward from Thomasville, Ga., had surgery on the knee Tuesday, and his recovery timetable is unknown at this time.

"He's a tough kid, and this hit him pretty hard," said Gregory. "He's done everything we've asked of him this year. He's changed his body, he's become more aggressive on the glass, and his stats clearly show that he was having a tremendous sophomore season for us. He's a big part of what we do both offensively and defensively. We won't know exactly what the nature of the injury is until the surgery occurs."

Carter, Jr., was tied for the Atlantic Coast Conference lead in rebounding (9.3 per game) and was fourth on the Tech team in scoring (10.3 points per game) at the time of his injury. He has started all 44 games in his Tech career.

### Jorgenson Lost for Season with Knee Injury

Freshman guard Travis Jorgenson will miss the rest of the 2013-14 season after suffering a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee during Tech's Nov. 20 game against Dayton.

The 6-0 guard sustained the injury in the second half of the game, and an MRI test taken the next day revealed the tear. Surgery to repair the ligament was successfully performed on Dec. 12.

The Columbia, Mo., native had played in all four games off the bench, averaging 4.3 points and 2.5 assists in just under 20 minutes per game.

### **Games of November Remembered**

Georgia Tech's opener against Presbyterian was significant because it was the earliest calendar date that Georgia Tech has ever played a regular-season basketball game. It fell one day earlier than last year's opener against Tulane, and Tech's season opener of the 2007-08 season against UNC

Greensboro, which both fell on Nov. 9.

- The Yellow Jackets played eight games scheduled in the month of November, an all-time high. Tech previously played seven games in November in the 2011-12, 2010-11 and 2006-07 seasons.
- A check of Tech's all-time scores and accounting for the number of games it has played in November provides a glimpse into the gradual lengthening of the college basketball season over time. In three seasons under Gregory, Tech has averaged 6.9 November games. Tech averaged 4.9 in 11 seasons under Paul Hewitt, with a low of two in the 2002-03 season. Tech averaged 2.5 games in November in 19 seasons under Bobby Cremins, including NONE in the 1992-93 season, and 1.3 games in November in eight seasons under Dwane Morrison. Whack Hyder's 22 Tech teams played a TOTAL of four November games.
- Tech's first November game was played Nov. 30, 1956, also the first game ever played at Alexander Memorial Coliseum, and resulted in a 71-61 loss to Duke. The Jackets are 101-37 all-time in November, including an 13-6 mark under Gregory.

## **Making History**

Georgia Tech has made a little bit of history during its first two-plus seasons under head coach Brian Gregory.

- The first came quickly, a 68-56 win over Georgia in Athens on Dec. 7, 2011, the team's first victory in Athens in 35 years.
- With its 80-71 win at Georgia on Nov. 15, Tech has now defeated its in-state rival three consecutive years for the first time since winning three straight from 1992-94. The Jackets have also won back-to-back games in Athens for the first time since winning three straight there from 1959-
- For the first time since Roy Mundorff in 1946-47 and 1947-48, Gregory has won in his first three tries against state-rival Georgia.
- Tech won three ACC road games, the most for the Yellow Jackets since the 2007-08 season, when they went 4-4 on the road. Tech was 3-29 on the road in the four seasons in between.
- Put another way, Tech has won three of its last five ACC road games after winning three of the previous 36 dating back to the beginning of the 2008-09 season.
- One of those road wins was Tech's first-ever victory over Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, a 64-54 win last Feb. 9. That came after seven losses in Cassell Coliseum.
- Like his two predecessors, Brian Gregory captured his first career ACC victory on the road (82-71 over NC State on Jan. 11). Bobby Cremins defeated Maryland for his first, 45-43 on Dec. 23, 1981, while Paul Hewitt won at Virginia, 73-68, on Jan. 9, 2000.
- On March 6 of last season, Tech beat a top-10 team on the road (No. 6 Miami) for the first time since 2004.

## Tech Signs Two in Class of 2014

Georgia Tech signed 6-2 guard Tadric Jackson and 6-10 Ben Lammers to letters of intent on the first day of the early signing period Nov. 13.

Jackson, a 6-2, 205-pounder from Tift County High School in Tifton, Ga., is a 4-star prospect ranked as high as 68th nationally in the class of 2014 (by ESPN.com) and is rated the top guard in the state by national recruiting analyst Justin Young on Hoopseen.com. Rated 14th nationally at his position, the left-handed Jackson averaged 15.4 points a game as a junior last season, which ranked 17th in class AAAAAA, and helped Tift County to a 26-5 record and a state ranking of No. 3. He plays for the Georgia Stars AAU team.

Lammers, a 6-10, 225-pounder, attends Alamo Heights High School in San Antonio, Texas. The 3-star prospect is rated the 10th-best overall prospect in the state of Texas according to Texashoops.com and the 19th-best center in the nation. An all-state performer each of the last two years, Lammers averaged 15 points, 10 rebounds and 4.5 blocks per game as a junior, helping Alamo Heights advance to the class AAAA regional finals and a 32-4 final record. Lammers, whose father played football at Texas A&M, played AAU ball for the South Texas Spurs.

### **ACC Schedule Notes for 2013-14**

New Atlantic Coast Conference members Notre Dame and Pittsburgh will visit McCamish Pavilion this season as part of Georgia Tech's 18-game conference schedule, while Boston College, Clemson, Duke, Miami, North Carolina, Virginia and Virginia Tech are on the Yellow Jackets' home men's basketball schedule for the 2013-14 season.

- The Yellow Jackets have home-and-away series with Clemson and Notre Dame (Tech's permanent partners), as well as Duke and Boston College.
- Miami, North Carolina, Pittsburgh, Virginia and Virginia Tech come to Atlanta, while Tech has road trips to new member Syracuse, Florida State, Maryland, NC State and Wake Forest. (Wake Forest is no longer a permanent home-and-away partner for Tech.)
- •Tech is the only ACC team to begin with two straight road games. Tech also has a three-game homestand in January, followed by four road games in the next five, followed by a four-game homestand in February, then three consecutive road games in late February/early March. Tech finishes with a home game against Virginia Tech.
- Of the three new conference members for 2013-14, Tech had faced <u>Notre Dame</u> the most, winning six of eight meetings in the series that dates back to 1941. Tech is 5-0 all-time against <u>Pitt</u>, and 2-2 against Syracuse.

### Non-Conference Slate Strongest Under BG

With five games against major conference teams and two others against perennially strong mid-major opponents, Georgia Tech has faced a significantly stronger non-conference schedule in its third season under head coach Brian Gregory.

 In the same season that former Big East powers Notre Dame, Pittsburgh and Syracuse join the ACC, the Yellow Jackets had Illinois and Dayton at home, and traveled to Charlotte, Georgia and Vanderbilt. This is in addition to the Barclays Center Classic tournament over Thanksgiving weekend, in which Tech played Mississippi (an NCAA team), and St. John's (NIT).

- By the numbers, Tech played three non-conference games on the opponent's home court, as opposed to one last year (at Illinois in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge), and five non-conference games away from home altogether. Of the five non-conference games against the power five conference foes, four of those were played away from home.
- Tech faced five RPI top 100 teams (based on CBSSports.com rankings at the time of the game) among its 13 non-conference games, and had only three foes ranked beyond 300, as opposed to five last year. Including ACC opponents, Tech is facing 16 teams that made the NCAA or NIT championships last season, as opposed to 14 on last year's schedule, and 17 RPI top 100 foes.
- Tech averaged 72.0 points per game in its pre-conference schedule, nearly six points per game better than 2012-13 (66.6) and eight better than 2011-12 (63.8). Tech also posted better numbers over last year in field goal percentage (44.3/44.0), free throw percentage (70.5/64.3), free throws made per game (15.5/11.4), assists (14.9/14.2) and rebound margin (+7.3/+5.9).
- •Tech's defensive numbers also rose over last year's pre-conference schedule (65.0 ppg/53.5, 38.8 pct. FG/35.1), but its ranking within the conference remained similarly high. Tech ranked 56th nationally (7th in the ACC) in scoring defense, 29th in field goal percentage defense (6th in the ACC)
- In its non-conference schedule, Tech played six teams ranked 116 or higher in the CBSSports. com RPI rankings (Illinois 17, St. John's 56, Dayton 57, Mississippi 73, Vanderbilt 84, Charlotte 116), only two of those at home.

### **Tech's Accomplishments in 2012-13**

- With its March 6 win at No. 6 Miami, Tech beat a top-25 team for the first time since March 12, 2010, a 69-64 win over No. 19 Maryland in the ACC Tournament. Tech beat a top-25 team on the road for the first time since Jan. 16 of that year, beating No. 12 North Carolina, 73-71.
- Tech beat a team ranked in the top 10 for the first time since Jan. 9, 2010, a 71-67 homecourt victory over Duke. Tech's last win over a top-10 team on the road also came against Duke, on March 3, 2004 in Cameron Indoor Stadium by a 76-68 score.
- For head coach Brian Gregory, it matched the highest-ranking for an opponent one of his teams has beaten. Dayton defeated No. 6 Pittsburgh, 80-55, on Dec. 29, 2007.
- Tech's 16 wins were its most since the 2009-10 season, when the Yellow Jackets went 23-13 (18-11 in the regular season, 7-9 in the ACC).
- Georgia Tech accomplished its first season sweep of an ACC opponent (Wake Forest) since the 2010-11 season (also Wake Forest).
- Tech finished the season five games ahead of its mark from a year ago and surpassed its conference win total (4) from 2011-12.

this season over the corresponding month last season, except March.

- Tech secured a winning season in year two under Gregory. No Tech coach since Dwight Keith in 1945 had posted a winning record in his second vear on the Flats.
- Tech finished its first season in McCamish Pavilion with an 11-6 record (3-6 ACC) and averaged 7,365 in attendance with four sellouts.

### And the Children Shall Lead

Marcus Georges-Hunt and Robert Carter, Jr., became the first two freshmen to rank 1-2 on Georgia Tech's team in scoring since 2006-07, and the third freshman duo to accomplish that at Tech. Only other five teams in ACC history (two from Tech) have had freshmen rank 1-2 on their teams.

Georges-Hunt (10.8 ppg) was the Yellow Jackets' only player in double figures for the season, and Georges-Hunt was the only ACC freshman to lead his team in scoring.

Javaris Crittenton and Thaddeus Young, who each averaged 14.4 points during the 2006-07 season, were the last freshmen to finish 1-2 on the Tech scoring chart. Mark Price, who led the ACC in scoring at 20.3 points per game, and John Salley (11.5) also turned the trick in 1982-83.

Tech has had a freshman lead its team in scoring five times previously, first with Jim Wood (11.1) in 1973-74. That average was the lowest figure to lead a Yellow Jacket team in the modern era (since 1949-50) until Georges-Hunt.

### **Arts and Letters**

Not only has Georgia Tech improved on the court since Gregory arrived, but has made big strides in the classroom as well. Beginning with Moe Miller and Lance Storrs in the summer after Gregory took the head coaching position at Tech, every senior in the program has graduated, including Derek Craig and Nick Foreman in 2012.

Last year's senior class included Mfon Udofia, who finished his business administation degree work in the summer, and Pierre Jordan, who completed his Masters degree requirements in building construction in the spring. Brandon Reed graduated in the summer with his management degree before transferring back to Arkansas State to play his final year of basketball.

Sophomores Chris Bolden and Marcus

Georges-Hunt made the Academic All-ACC team as freshmen, and the Yellow Jackets have had at least one player named to that team since it was instituted for the 2010-11 season.

Tech's men's basketball scored a perfect 2010-11 team single year Academic Progress Report score of 1000 in the 2010-11 APR Report, a first for the program, and posted a four-year average of 972, an all-time high, last spring.

### Stability in the Lineup

Head coach Brian Gregory utilized seven different starting lineups in 2011-12. Two players -Kammeon Holsey and Daniel Miller - started every

In 2012-13, he went with essentially two different lineups, and three players - Carter, Jr., Miller and Mfon Udofia - started every game. Tech's lineup for 14 of the first 15 games was Mfon Udofia and Brandon Reed at the guards, Marcus Georges-Hunt and Robert Carter, Jr., at the forwards and Daniel Miller at center. Chris Bolden replaced Reed in game 16 at Duke and started 15 of the last 16 games.

This season, Gregory has made two significant lineup changes, and injury has forced a third. Carter, Jr., Georges-Hunt and Miller have started every game, though Kammeon Holsey will take Carter, Jr.'s place while he is sidelined. Solomon Poole started Tech's first five games, then gave way to Chris Bolden, who started six of the next seven. Jason Morris took Bolden's place Dec. 29 at Charlotte.

- Tech's rally from 12 points down against Illinois on Dec. 3 was the second-largest deficit Tech has overcome to win a game in Brian Gregory's two-plus seasons. The Jackets came back from 13 points down in the second half to win at No. 6 Miami last March, and erased a 13-point first-half deficit to beat VCU in Gregory's first season.
- Tech's 15-point lead (first-half) against Vanderbilt matched the largest lead the Yellow Jackets have held in a game they lost under Gregory (Tech also held early 15-point leads against St. John's this season and Boston College in last year's ACC Tournament). Tech held an 11-point second-half lead against Virginia Tech last season (Jan. 12) and lost that game in overtime.

### **Case for Tech's Defense**

- Tech ranked 33rd in the nation last season in adjusted defensive efficiency as calculated by Ken Pomeroy, allowing 91.6 points per 100 possessions. Miami (18), Virginia (20) and Duke (23) ranked ahead of Tech among ACC teams
- Tech ranks 86th in Pomeroy's defensive efficiency ranking this year, and the Yellow Jackets are 85th in scoring defense and 44th in field goal percentage defense.
- Only nine opponents have shot 50 percent from the floor against Tech since Brian Gregory became head coach.
- Tech has held 30 teams (eight ACC teams) under 60 points since Brian Gregory arrived and allowed only 17 to score as many as 70.
- The Yellow Jackets have held 33 of 76 foes under 40 percent from the floor under Gregory (six this season), seven under 30 percent.
- Only seven opponents have scored as many as 80 points, only one of those has reached 90, in Gregory's tenure.
- Tech gave up 62.6 points per game in 2011-12, which was the program's fifth lowest yield going back to the 1955-56 season, the first year statistics are available. Last season's yield was 62.4 ppg, which ranks fourth.
- Only one other Tech team (1984-85, 59.4 ppg) surrendered fewer points per game vs. the ACC than did Brian Gregory's first Tech team (65.5). Last year's yield of 67.1 ppg ranked fourth-lowest since the Jackets joined the ACC.
- Only three Tech teams since 1960 limited ACC teams to a lower field goal percentage than last year's team (40.3 pct.). Only four Tech teams in the ACC era have posted a better field goal percentage yield against the conference (43.2 pct. last year). Tech allowed ACC teams 42.5 percent last season, which became the third-best figure.

### **Eight Tech Alumni on NBA Rosters**

Eight former Georgia Tech basketball stars were on NBA team rosters when the season opened, more than any team in the ACC except Duke (15) and North Carolina (14).

The newcomer in the Tech group is Glen Rice, Jr., who starred last season in the NBA's developmental league. He was selected by Philadelphia in the second round of the NBA draft and traded to Washington, where he opened the season.

Two players began the season with new teams. Jarrett Jack, a 10-year NBA veteran who helped lead Golden State to the NBA playoffs a year ago, signed with Cleveland in the off-season. Anthony Morrow began his eighth season in the league as a member of the re-named New Orleans Pelicans.

Chris Bosh, who spent the first seven years of his NBA career in Toronto, began his fourth season in Miami looking for his third NBA title with the Heat. Thaddeus Young is in his seventh season as one of the leaders of the Philadelphia 76ers, while Will Bynum, a member of Tech's 2004 Final Four team, is in his sixth year in Detroit.

Iman Shumpert is being looked upon to fill a leadership role in his third season with the New York Knicks after his career was interrupted by a knee injury a year ago, and Derrick Favors recently agreed to a new contract with Utah, where he is emerging as a star in his sixth NBA season.

### Welcome to The Hank

Georgia Tech played the 2012-13 season in a building that was, for all intents and purposes, brand new. The only physical elements of McCamish Pavilion that remain from the venerable Alexander Memorial Coliseum are the roof, which has been re-covered, and the 32 steel ribs that support it.

The capacity of McCamish Pavilion is 8,600, including 1,665 seats in the

new balcony level and 6,935 seats in the lower seating bowl. There are no suites, but there is a premium club area that seats 500. Alexander Memorial Coliseum seated 9,191 spectators in its final configuration.

The most striking features of McCamish Pavilion are its grand entrance, which fronts 10th and Fowler Streets, the ability for patrons to view the court from the main concourse nearly all the way around, and the theatrical lighting system, which bathes the court in bright light while leaving the seating areas dark, modeled after the Staples Center in Los Angeles and Madison Square Garden in New York.

Tech played 55 seasons in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, compiling a record of 556-194 (.741). Miami was the last team to play Tech in Alexander Memorial Coliseum, a game Tech won, and was the first ACC team to play in McCamish Pavilion on Jan. 5, which Miami won. For the 2011-12 season, Tech played its home games at Philips Arena and the Arena at Gwinnett.

### **Tech's NCAA Tournament History**

Georgia Tech played in the NCAA Tournament five times in 11 seasons under head coach Paul Hewitt and has played in the event 16 times in its history. Fifteen of those appearances have occurred from 1985 to the present.

Tech has a record of 23-16 in NCAA Tournament play, highlighted by its 2004 trip to the NCAA title game as well as a Final Four berth in 1990. The Yellow Jackets have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 seven times (1960, 1985, 1986, 1990, 1992, 1996, 2004).

The 2004 and 2005 appearances were the Yellow Jackets' first back-to-back appearances since Bobby Cremins led the Institute to the Big Dance nine straight years from 1985-93.

Georgia Tech has won at least one game in 11 of its 16 NCAA Tournament appearances.

### **Tech's ACC Tournament History**

Georgia Tech has played in 34 ACC Tournaments, and has a 24-31 all-time record in the event. The Yellow Jackets have won three championships, in 1985 (Atlanta), 1990 (Charlotte) and 1993 (Charlotte).

Tech has been a runner-up four times (1986, 1996, 2005, 2010). The 1986, 1996 and 2010 runs to the finals occurred in Greensboro.

Tech is 6-4 in ACC Tournament games played in Atlanta, going 4-2 in three tournaments at the Omni, including the 1985 title, and 2-2 in two tournaments at the Georgia Dome.

Tech was 0-2 in the ACC Tournament under coach Dwane Morrison, 15-16 under Bobby Cremins (including all three titles) and 9-11 under Paul Hewitt (runner-up in 2005 and 2010).

The Jackets are 3-5 when opening the tournament on Thursday.

## BRIAN GREGORY

### Head Coach - 3rd Season at Tech

Brian Gregory, who led the University of Dayton to 97 victories over his last four years there and worked under Tom Izzo at Michigan State when the Spartans won the 2000 NCAA championship, was named Georgia Tech's head basketball coach on March 28, 2011.

Gregory engineered a winning season and a five-win improvement for the Yellow Jackets in 2012-13, and secured his 200th career victory on Nov. 8 against Presbyterian.

Gregory is the 13th head coach in Yellow Jacket history. Gregory coached eight seasons at Dayton where he compiled a record of 172-94 and participated in the NCAA Tournament or NIT five times. His 2003-04 and 2008-09 teams earned NCAA Tournament berths, and the Flyers captured the 2010 NIT crown after beating North Carolina in the championship game.

The 1990 Oakland (Mich.) University graduate won 150 games faster (seven seasons) than any coach in Dayton history. Over the last four seasons combined, his teams went 13-4 against BCS-level teams.

Gregory clearly put an emphasis on academics during his tenure at Dayton and has continued that at Tech. Entering the 2013-14 season, every senior who has played for Gregory has graduated. All seven seniors who played on the 2010 NIT title team graduated that spring.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Dayton, Gregory spent the second of two highly-successful stints at Michigan State, where he was an assistant coach for two years before being promoted to associate head coach under Izzo for the 2001-02 and 2002-03 seasons. During those four years, the Spartans won one NCAA championship (2000), made three Elite Eight appearances, two Final Fours and claimed two Big Ten Conference championships.

A native of Mount Prospect, Ill., Gregory became a full-time assistant coach at Michigan State in 1992 and remained there when Izzo replaced Jud Heathcote as head coach. Gregory left to work one season under Stan Joplin at Toledo in 1996, then returned to the Big Ten where he worked as an assistant coach under Kevin O'Neill at Northwestern for two seasons.
