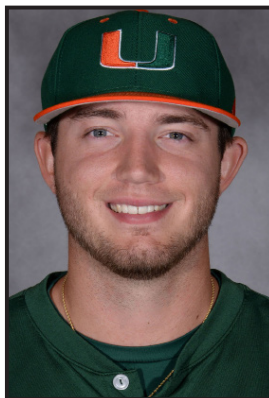

WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS

- Miami continues an **eight-game homestand** with a weekend series against **Duke** at Mark Light Field (ACC Network Extra).
- The Canes lead the all-time series with the Blue Devils **35-8**, including a **19-6 lead** in games played at Mark Light. The Hurricanes are **9-1 in their last 10 games** against Duke, and **swept the Blue Devils** at Durham Bulls Athletic Park in **2016**.
- Last time out, Miami topped St. Thomas (FL) 14-2 on Wed., April 5; 14 runs were the **second-most** scored by UM all year.
- Junior righthander **Jesse Lepore** (2-2, 2.39 ERA) will oppose Duke lefty **Mitch Stallings** (3-2, 4.18 ERA) in the opener.
- Sophomore **Romy Gonzalez** leads Miami with nine multi-hit games, eight multi-RBI games, six home runs and 22 RBI.
- Head coach **Jim Morris** has the **fifth-most wins** in Division I history (1,548), the **third-most** wins among active coaches, a **.695** winning percentage (**sixth** among active coaches), and **189** more wins than the next active coach - Mike Fox of UNC.
- The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition; **Michael Mediavilla**, **Jesse Lepore** and **Johnny Ruiz** were recognized by *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper* while **Carl Chester** was honored by Baseball America.
- The Hurricanes made their **25th trip to the College World Series in 2016**, finishing with a 50-14 record and a 21-9 mark in ACC play. Miami was the No. 3 national seed for the postseason, and won the **2016 ACC Regular Season Championship**.
- The Canes had **seven** players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick **Zack Collins**.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008, 2014 and 2016.

In his 23-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,044-435-3 (.707) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,548-679-4 (.695) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,679-718-4 (.701) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion - to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. From his days at Georgia Tech include Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles), Jay Payton (Oakland) and Jason Varitek (Boston).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the international scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

MIAMI CONTINUES HOMESTAND WITH DUKE

- The Hurricanes will continue an **eight-game homestand** with a weekend series against visiting **Duke** from April 8-10 at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field (ACC Network Extra, ESPNU).
- Miami carries a **35-8 all-time series lead** against the Blue Devils, and has won **nine of the last 10 matchups** - including a **three-game sweep** of Duke at Durham Bulls Athletic Park (April 15-17) in 2016.
- The two teams enter the weekend **tied for fourth** in the ACC Coastal standings with a 5-7 conference record. The series was moved to Saturday-Sunday-Monday with Monday's game being showcased on **ESPNU**. Games 1 and 2 are live on **ACC Network Extra**.
- Miami junior righthander **Jesse Lepore** (1-4, 4.38 ERA) will start opposite Duke's **Mitch Stallings** (3-2, 4.18 ERA) Saturday night.

LAST TIME OUT: CANES TOP ST. THOMAS, 14-2

- Thanks largely to its offense drawing a **season-high 16 walks**, Miami topped visiting NAIA school St. Thomas, 14-2, on April 5. The win was Miami's **24th in a row** over the Bobcats.
- Freshman **Greg Veliz** delivered another strong start for Miami, allowing just two runs over 5.1 innings. He struck out six batters and surrendered just one walk to pick up the win (3-2).
- Sophomore **Romy Gonzalez** crushed his sixth home run of the season, a two-run shot, to lead the offense. He finished 2-for-5 and now has a team-leading 22 RBI.
- The win marked Miami's fourth straight midweek victory at home, while **Veliz** tossed at least 5.0 innings for his fifth straight start.

HEATING UP: GONZALEZ, BARGFELDT IMPRESS

- Sophomore **Romy Gonzalez** has been among Miami's top offensive performers, and is bating **.317** over his last five games with six hits, one home run and a team-high .526 slugging percentage.
- Miami lefthander **Jeb Bargfeldt** has been the most consistent weekend starter for the Hurricanes. In four ACC starts, Bargfeldt is **1-1** with a **1.77 ERA**. He is holding ACC opponents to a **.182 average**.
- Sophomore **Andrew Cabezas** has been among Miami's top performers out of the bullpen this season. In the last 10 games, he has made a team-high six appearances and totaled **nine strikeouts compared to one walk** in 8.0 combined innings with a 3.38 ERA.
- Serving as the team's midweek starter, freshman **Greg Veliz** has been impressive, boasting a **2.56 ERA** and a **.165** opponent average.

LOOKING FOR A FOUR-PEAT

- Miami won its **third straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.
- The Hurricanes have won **67 ACC games in the prior three seasons** - the **most wins in a three-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a 30-game conference schedule** in 2005.
- Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship three times, most recently in **2016** when the Canes finished **21-7; UM won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008**.
- The Hurricanes have won **four ACC Coastal Division titles** (2008, 2014, 2015, 2016) in history and **one ACC Championship** (2008).
- Since the beginning of the **2014** season, Miami has won **25 of its past 34 ACC series**. The Hurricanes went **8-2** in ACC series in **2014**, **7-3** in **2015**, **9-1** in **2016** and are **1-3** in **2017**.

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

SUPER SOPHOMORES: CABEZAS & BARTOW

- Two of Miami's top contributors out of the bullpen have been sophomore righthanders **Frankie Bartow** and **Andrew Cabezas**.
- Over the past 15 games, Cabezas has made nine appearances and has **18 strikeouts** compared to four walks in his last 14.0 innings. He has compiled an impressive 3.21 ERA over the stretch, and earned his first save with two scoreless innings on March 14 vs. Maine.
- Bartow leads UM with **six saves** and has a **2.25 ERA** in 12.0 innings. He was a **Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America** in 2016.

ONE OF THE GAME'S TOP SKIPPERS

- Jim Morris' **1,548** wins at the Division I level are **fifth-most** in the history of college baseball and **third-most** among active skippers.
- Miami's first ACC series against Georgia Tech pitted two of the winningest coaches in college baseball history: **Morris** and Georgia Tech's **Danny Hall** (1,182), who replaced Morris in Atlanta when Morris was named Miami's head coach prior to the **1994** season.
- Morris reached two major milestones in 2016 - he became the **fifth coach** to reach **1,500** wins on March 18 against Louisville and won his **1,000th game at Miami** on March 26 vs. Clemson.

OFFENSE SPARKS SERIES WIN VS. JACKETS

- Miami had **37 hits against the Yellow Jackets** in its most recent ACC series win. The Hurricanes totaled **23 walks, reached base at a .486 clip as a team, and slugged .532** to win their **third straight series** against Georgia Tech dating to **2015**.
- Junior **Carl Chester** batted .500 for the week (10-for-20) for Miami, including a **.615** (8-for-13) average against the Jackets. He recorded a **.666** on-base percentage and **.846** slugging percentage.
- Junior **James Davison** started at leadoff all three games against the Jackets and thrived; he **reached base at a .588 clip** and scored a **team-best seven runs**. He batted .417 for the weekend.
- Miami's 37 hits against Georgia Tech were more than its combined total in the **previous seven games** (36). UM had double-digit hit totals in each game - **10 in Game 1, 12 in Game 2** and **15 in Game 3**.

WELCOME TO THE LIGHT!

- Miami has made College World Series trips in back-to-back seasons (2015 and 2016) thanks in large part to its **dominant play inside the confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field**.
- Since the start of the 2015 season, Miami is a whopping **79-15** in its last **94 home games**, including its 2017 Opening Weekend series against Rutgers and opening ACC home series against Georgia Tech.
- Miami finished **36-5** at home in 2015 and **34-6** at home in 2016. The Hurricanes went **13-2 in ACC play** at The Light in 2015 and **12-3 at home in ACC play** in 2016.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the **top 25 in preseason polls** from three major college baseball outlets, including a **No. 8** ranking from *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, **No. 17** the *USA Today Coaches Poll* and a **No. 21** ranking from *D1Baseball*.
- Miami have won **three straight ACC Coastal Division titles** and have won the **ACC Regular Season two of the past three years**.

DESTINATION: OMAHA

- Miami made its second straight trip to the **College World Series in 2016**, marking the program's 25th all-time trip to Omaha, Neb.
- Miami's **25** College World Series trips are the **second-most of any program** in the country. The Hurricanes have won **48 games** in the College World Series, the **fourth-most** of any program; Miami's **four national championships** rank **fifth-most**.
- Since the NCAA began award national seeds prior to 1999, Miami has been **among the top eight seven seasons: 1999 (#1), 2001 (#2), 2003 (#8), 2004 (#3), 2008 (#1), 2015 (#5) and 2016 (#3)**.
- The Hurricanes have **never missed the College World Series** when earning a **national seed**, making it all eight times they've earned the distinction.

FOUR TO WATCH

- Four Hurricanes picked up 2017 Preseason All-America honors: junior outfielder **Carl Chester**, junior righthander **Jesse Lepore**, junior lefthander **Michael Mediavilla** and senior infielder **Johnny Ruiz**.
- Chester, a *Baseball America* Preseason All-America third-team selection, was among 55 players named to the initial watch list for the **2017 Golden Spikes Award** by USA Baseball on Feb. 15.
- Sophomore reliever **Frankie Bartow**, who was recognized as a Louisville Slugger Freshman All America last season, was named to the watch list for the **2017 Stopper of the Year Award** by NCBWA; former closer Bryan Garcia won the prestigious award in 2016.
- UM had three All-Americans in 2016: **Zack Collins** (several publications), **Garcia** (NCBWA) & **Mediavilla** (ABCA/Rawlings).

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with a **44th consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason** in 2016. Miami has made the postseason each year since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 44 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the **longest active postseason streak of any Division I program** in any sport nationwide.
- Miami's **25 College World Series trips** are the second-most of any program all-time, trailing only Texas.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in **32 straight years - all 23 years at Miami & final nine years at Georgia Tech**.
- Miami is the **only school in the state of Florida** to have won a **national championship**; UM won titles in **1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001**.

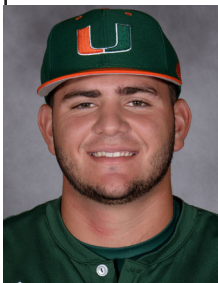
