## About Today's Game

The Hokies, the 15th seed, are 9-21 on the season and finished 2-16 in ACC action.
The Hurricanes, the 10th seed, are 16-15 overall and finished 7-11 in the ACC.


The winner of today's game will play seventh seed NC State on Thursday at 7 p.m.

## Georgia Tech 62, VT 51

The Hokies lost 62-51, at Georgia Tech on Saturday afternoon in the regular season finale.
Joey van Zegeren led the Hokies with a careerhigh 21 points.

## Wilson Sets New Standards

Devin Wilson set a new Virginia Tech freshman record in the home loss to Virginia. He now has 143 assists this season, the most ever for a Tech freshman, breaking the old mark of 113 , set by Hank Thorns in the 2007-08 season.
Wilson also set a new Tech freshman record with 178 free throw attempts, surpassing the old mark of 164 attempts by Dale Solomon in the 1978-79 season.
Wilson finished the ACC season with 80 assists, breaking the old school mark of 78 assists in an ACC season set by Malcolm Delaney in 2009-10.

## Academic Success

The Hokies place four players on the 2014 ACC AllAcademic Men's Basketball Team.

## Heading to The Gate City

Virginia Tech will make its 10th appearance in the ACC Tournament this week in Greensboro, N.C. ... Tech finished the regular season 9-21 overall and 2-16 in ACC action ... Tech finished the regular season in 15 th place ... Tech will play 10 -seed Miami in the first round on Wednesday ... The winner of that game will play fourth-seed Virginia at 2:30 p.m., on Friday afternoon.

## The Hokies in Greensboro

Tech has played in the Greensboro Coliseum 17 times over the years, with a 6-11 record ... Tech is 3-10 all-time in the building against teams currently in the ACC ... Tech's last appearance in the building was on March 14, 2013, when the Hokies lost to NC State, 80-63, in last season's ACC Tournament ... Tech is 2-4 in ACC Tournament games in this arena.

## The Series vs. Miami

The Hurricanes hold a slim 13-12 advantage in the all-time series ... The Hokies swept the season series this year from the Hurricanes ... This will be the fourth ACC Tournament meeting between Tech and Miami, and Tech has won two of the previous three meetings ... Miami defeated the Hokies, $70-65$, in the first round of the 2010 ACC Tournament, exactly four years ago today, which is the only time the two schools have played each other in this building ... The Hokies are 11-7 against Miami since joining the ACC.

## Tech in Conference Tournaments

This will be the 10th ACC Tournament for the Hokies and the 11th-straight conference tournament for the Hokies ... Tech is 8-10 in ACC Tournament action ... The Hokies have a combined 32-50 all-time record in postseason conference tournaments ... Tech is 9-17 all-time against current ACC members in post-season conference tournaments.

## The ACC Tournament

Virginia Tech makes its 10th appearance in the ACC Tournament ... This is the 61st annual ACC Tournament ... This is the Hokies' fifth trip to the Greensboro Coliseum for an ACC Tournament ... Greensboro has hosted 25 ACC Tournaments ... The next most-common venue is Reynolds Coliseum in Raleigh (13) ... Of the 10 other arenas to host the event, three, the Capital Centre in Landover, Maryland, the Charlotte Coliseum and the Omni in Atlanta, are no longer standing ... Miami is the defending ACC Champion ... Tech is $0-4$ against the defending ACC Champion in the following year's tournament.

## Hokies in the ACC First Round Games

The Hokies are 4-2 in ACC first round games since joining the league.

## Sweeping the Champ

With the Hokies' 52-45 win over Miami, Tech swept the season series against the defending ACC Champion ... Over the last two seasons, Tech is 3-0 against the ACC champion from the previous season ... It marks the first time that Tech has swept a two-game season series from the defending ACC champion.

## Putting a Lid on the Basket

In Tech's 52-45 win over Miami, the Hokies allowed the Hurricanes just 15 points in the first half ... That is the lowest point total for a Virginia Tech ACC opponent since Tech joined the league in the 2004-05 season ... The previous low was 19 points, which occured three times, most recently by No. 15 Virginia in the first half of the Hokies' 47-45 victory in JPJA on Jan. 22, 2012.

## Accomplishing A Lot with A Little

Virginia Tech's 52-45 victory over Miami marks the fewest points the Hokies have scored in a victory since a 47-45 win over No. 15 Virginia on Jan. 22, 2012 in JPJA ... It is just the third Tech victory when scoring less than 53 points since joining the Big East Conference in the 2000-01 season.

## He's Legendary

Former Virginia Tech standout Bobby Stevens has been named to the 2014 ACC Men's Basketball Legends Class ... Stevens was a sharpshooting, ball-hawking guard who helped provide the leadership for head coach Don Devoe's 1973 Virginia Tech basketball team which ended up winning the school's first national championship in basketball, claiming the 1973 National Invitation Tournament title in New York's Madison Square Garden with a 92-91 overtime win against Notre Dame ... With the clock running down and Tech trailing by a point, Stevens, who had seven points in the overtime session, threw up a shot which missed, but he was able to get the long rebound and quickly put up a shot at the buzzer that gave the Hokies a one-point overtime upset win over the Irish and the NIT Championship ... The Legends will be honored at this year's ACC Men's Basketball Tournament in Greensboro at the annual ACC Basketball Legends Brunch, which will be held on Saturday, March 15, beginning at 10 a.m. in the Guilford Ballroom of the Sheraton Four Seasons Hotel.

## Holding Down the Opponent

On Feb. 15, Tech held Miami to 25.9 percent from the field ... That is the lowest opponent's field goal percentage for Tech in ACC play ... The previous ACC low was 28.6 percent by NC State in a 72-52 Tech win Feb. 10, 2010 in Raleigh ... It is also a season-low for a Tech opponent and the lowest since the Hokies held Mississippi Valley State to 25.9 percent last year.

## Wilson Honored

Virginia Tech guard Devin Wilson has been named to the ACC All-Freshman team by both the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSMA) and the ACC coaches' votes ... Wilson, a freshman from McKees Rocks, Pa., started all 30 games for the Hokies in the


Devin Wilson regular season and led the Hokies in minutes played, assists and steals ... He set Virginia Tech freshman records for minutes played, assists and free throws attempted.

## Last Time Out: Georgia Tech 62, VT 51

The Hokies lost at Georgia Tech, 62-51, on Saturday afternoon to close out the regular season ... Joey van Zegeren recorded a career-high 21 points to lead the Hokies ... Ben Emelogu returned from missing the last four games to score eight points off the bench for VT.

## Taking Care of Business in Class

Virginia Tech boasts four members of the 2014 ACC All-Academic Men's Basketball team ... Jarell Eddie was named to the team for the third consecutive year and was joined on this year's squad by teammates Will Johnston,
Joey van Zegeren and Trevor Thompson ... Tech and Pittsburgh each had four members of the 16 -man squad ... All four Hokies on the team are currently starters for Tech.

## Monster Strides

Although he probably won't be named the ACC's Most Improved Player this season, no one could argue that the Hokies' Joey van Zegeren has made major strides in the last 12 months to becoming
 Joey van Zegeren a top-level post player in the league ... JVZ averaged 3.0 points and 2.8 rebounds in 14.3 minutes of action last season in his redshirt freshman season ... This season, he averaging 6.4 points, 5.1 rebounds in 22.1 minutes of action ... Those number rise to 7.8 points and 5.6 rebounds in 25.2 minutes of action in ACC games this year ... JVZ set a new career-high of 14 points at Maryland in the next-to-last regular season game and topped that with 21 points in the regular season finale at Georgia Tech on Sunday ... Oh, and he was also named the the 2014 ACC All-Academic Men's Basketball team on last Tuesday ... Pretty good week.

## Six in the 20-Point Club

Six Hokies have scored 20-or-more points in a game this season ... Most recently, Joey van Zegeren posted a career-high 21 points at Georgia Tech, joining Adam Smith, Devin Wilson, Cadarian Raines, Ben Emelogu and Jarell Eddie in the 20-Point Club ... The Hokies and North Carolina are the only ACC teams with six players to score 20-or-more points in a game this season ... The last time that Tech saw at least six players score at least 20 points in a game in the same season was the 1990-91 season, when Rod Wheeler, Jay Purcell, Thomas Elliott, Erik Wilson, Anthony Moses, John Rivers and Dirk Williams all matched the mark.

## Young Punch

As of the end of the regular season, the freshmen and sophomores on the Virginia Tech team are averaging 56.6 percent of Tech's scoring this season .. In ACC play, that number jumped to 58.7 percent.

## Better on the Boards

The Hokies averaged 34.4 rebounds per game in ACC play this season ... That is the team's best average since the 2009-10 season, when Tech averaged 36.1 rebounds per game in league action ... This year's average has been a real team effort, as only three Hokies,
Joey van Zegern ( 5.6 rpg ), Trevor Thompson ( 5.2 rpg ) and Jarell Eddie ( 5.0 rpg ) average at least five rebounds per game.

## Hitting 1,100

With his three-point field goal at the 18:21 mark of the first half in the loss to \#2/2 Syracuse, Jarell Eddie recorded his 1,000th career point ... In the home game against Virginia, Eddie scored his 1,100th career


Jarell Eddie point ... He has a career point total of 1,166 points, 35 th on the all-time list, after passing Dick Sayre in the Georgia Tech game.

## Struggling Through Injuries

Adam Smith continues to be hampered by a strained left calf, an injury suffered in late November, and an MRI revealed a stress fracture in the left fibula as well ... He will miss today's game ... Cadarian Raines missed the home win over Miami with illness, but returned for the Virginia game, where he sprained his left ankle, causing him to miss the NC State game ... He played one minute at Duke, but has not played the last three games... He will miss today's game ... In the loss at Maryland, C.J. Barksdale sprained his right ankle ... All three are questionable for today's game ... Ben Emelogu also missed the four games previous the the season finale at Georgia Tech due to a re-aggrevated left ankle injury, but returned to score eight points in 27 minutes against the Yellow

## Balanced Attack

When Trevor Thompson led the Hokies in scoring at No. 6/7 Duke, he became the ninth different Hokie to lead the team in scoring this season ... Last season, only Erick Green and Jarell Eddie led the team in scoring in a game.

## Seeing More Time

Entering this season, Will Johnston averaged 9.9 minutes played per game for his career and averaged 11.0 minutes played per game last season ... So far this season, Johnston is averaging 19.9 minutes


Will Johnston played per game overall and 22.8 mppg in ACC play this season ... Johnston played a then-career-high 34 minutes against Wake Forest and 31 minutes at Virginia, starting both games ... He returned to the starting line-up against NC State and played 33 minutes ... In the loss at Maryland, Johnston set a new career-high with 38 minutes played.

## Games Missed

It has been well-documented that the Hokies have suffered a slew of injuries and illnesses, so here's a note on games missed ... So far this season, scholarship players at Virginia Tech have missed a total of 37 game appearances due to either illness or injury and 31 of those games were against ACC competition ... These numbers do not include the fact that Marquis Rankin left the team at the semester break, having not appeared in a game this season.

## JvZ Blocking

Joey van Zegeren is having an outstanding season blocking shots for the Hokies ... In the loss at Notre Dame, JvZ recorded a career-high six blocked shots ... He has 52 blocked shots so far this season, the most in a season for a Hokie since Dennis Mims blocked 58 shots in the 1999-2000 season ... His 53 blocked shots so far this season is seventh in single-season blocked shots at Virginia Tech.

## Clamping Down on the Glass

In the home loss to No. 14/16 UVa, the Hokies held the Cavaliers to just 28 total rebounds ... That was the lowest total rebounds for an ACC opponent to that point and the lowest for Tech in an ACC game since Clemson had 21 rebounds in a 69-61 home win on March 2, 2013 ... In the loss at Georgia Tech on Saturday, the Hokies held the Yellow Jackets to just 26 rebounds, a new seasonlow.

# The Freshman Class 

## Devin Sets a Standard

In the loss to Virginia on Feb. 18, Devin Wilson dished out five assists, upping his season total to 114 at that point ... That mark set a new school record for assists in a single season by a freshman ...
 It eclipses the old mark of 113, set by Hank Thorns in the 2007-08 season ... After five assists at Georgia Tech in the regular season finale, Wilson now has 143 assists for the season, the sixth-best single season by any Hokie, regardless of class.

## Another Assist Mark for Devin

With his five assists in the regular season finale at Georgia Tech, Devin Wilson ended the ACC season with 80 assists, a new school record for the Hokies ... The old mark was 78 assists in ACC play by Malcolm Delaney in the 2009-10 season.

## Another Freshman Mark for Devin

Devin Wilson leads all ACC freshmen in free throw attempts this season ... Wilson is averaging 5.9 free throw attempts per game this season, fifth-best among all ACC players this season ... He has shot more free throws (178) than the next two Hokies on the list (161) ... In the North Carolina game, Wilson shot 12 free throws, at the time, giving him 174 for the season, establishing a new Virginia Tech freshman record, besting the old mark of 164 free throws attempted by Dale Solomon in the 1978-79 season ... He now has 178 free throw attempts this season.

## And Yet Another Mark by Devin

Devin Wilson is averaging 34.8 minutes played per game this season, highest on the team ... That is the most minutes averaged for a Tech freshman since entering the Big East Conference in 2000-01 season ... Wilson played all 40 minutes in the loss to Wake Forest and played 39 minutes in the loss at Virginia ... In the loss to Maryland, he was credited with 40 minutes of action, but actually came off the court for a stretch of 11 game seconds ... In the Georgia Tech game, he set a new Virginia Tech record for minutes played by a freshman, with 1,043 minutes played this season, breaking the old mark of 1,024 minutes by Dell Curry in the 1982-83 season.

## More on Devin's Playing Time

Devin Wilson played 46 minutes in the double overtime loss at Pittsburgh ... That 46 minutes played set a new school record for minutes played in an ACC game, a mark he shares with Jarell Eddie ... The last Hokie freshman to play more than 46 minutes in a game was Carlos Dixon, who played 48 minutes in an 84-75 double overtime win against High Point on Dec.30, 2000.

## Getting Better at the Line

Entering the Florida State game on Feb.
5, Devin Wilson was shooting . 634 from the free throw line and .561 from the line in ACC games ... However, in the nine games since then, the freshman point guard has made 41 of his last 54 attempts, raising his numbers to .669 overall and .645 in ACC play.

## 2 Frosh with 20

With his career-high 20 points in the loss at Notre Dame, Devin Wilson joins Ben Emelogu as Virginia Tech freshmen to have 20 -point games in the same freshman season ... Emelogu scored 22 points
 Ben Emelogu in the win over West Virginia on Nov. 12, 2013 and had his second such game with 21 points against Maryland ... The last duo to pull off the feat was Jeff Allen and Malcolm Delaney, who each had a single 20-point scoring night in their freshman season of 2007-08.

## Dishing It Out

In the win over Furman, Devin Wilson recorded 11 assists ... The last Hokie freshman to record 11 assists in a single game was Dell Curry, who had 11 assists as a freshman against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Dec. 4, 1982 ... The 11 assists is also one assist shy of the Tech overall school record of 12 , set by Dave Sensibaugh, Bimbo Coles and, most recently, Troy Manns in 1997 ... In the home win over Miami, Wilson had nine assists, his personal high in assists in an ACC game and ties the school's record for assists in an ACC game ... He matched that total of assists with nine in the NC State game... Wilson also has two games of eight assists each.

## Hauling It In

Devin Wilson grabbed a career-high seven rebounds in the loss to UNCG ... It is the most rebounds for a Virginia Tech freshman point guard since Malcolm Delaney grabbed eight rebounds in a win over Boston College on Feb. 26, 2008.

## Talking Trevor

In the win over VMI, Trevor Thompson recorded five blocked shots ... That is the most blocked shots by a Virginia Tech freshman since Cadarian Raines blocked five shots in a win over UMBC on Dec. 22, 2009 ... In the win over Western Carolina, he recorded his first career double-double ... He scored 15 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in just 21 minutes of action ... It's the first double-double by a Hokie freshman since Marshall Wood had 14 points and 16 rebounds in an overtime loss at NC State last season ... In the loss to Wake Forest, Thompson recorded his second career doubledouble, with 10 points and a career-high 12 rebounds


Trevor Thompson in just 18 minutes of action ... It marks the first time that a Virginia Tech freshman has recorded multiple double-doubles in a season since Jeff Allen had nine double-doubles as a freshman in the 2007-08 season ... His 12 rebounds is the most by a Hokie freshman since Wood's 16 rebounds in the NC State game last season ... Thompson has started the last eight games and tied his career-high with 12 rebounds in the home win over Miami and tied his career-high with 15 points at Duke ... Thompson added 10 rebounds in the loss at Maryland.


## The Freshman Class

## A Dynamic Duo

When healthy. the Hokies have started a pair of freshmen in the backcourt this season, Ben Emelogu and Devin Wilson ... The pair is averaging 19.9 points per game this season, the second-highest average for any freshman duo in the ACC this season ... Only the duo of Jabari Parker and Matt Jones of Duke, who are averaging 21.2 points per game, is ahead of Wilson and Emelogu ... NC State's duo of Anthony Barber and Kyle Washington is third at 14.1 points per game.

## Hasn't Happened Often

Devin Wilson scored a career-high 26 points in the loss to Wake Forest ... That is the second-highest point total in a game by a Virginia Tech freshman since 1999 ... The only time a Virginia Tech freshman scored more than 22 points in a game was on Jan. 28, 2006, when A.D. Vassallo scored 29 points at Wake Forest ... When Ben Emelogu scored 22 points in the win over West Virginia, he became the first Tech freshman to score 20-or-more points in a game since Malcolm Delaney scored 20 points as a freshman in a loss at No. 5 North Carolina on Feb. 16, 2008 ... Emelogu's 21 points in the home loss to Maryland was just the 19th time since 1999 that a Hokie freshman has scored 20-or-more points in a game.


## Wilson Boards, Too

Devin Wilson leads the Hokies in minutes played, assists and steals this season, but one area that is sometimes overlooked is his rebounding ... Wilson averages 3.3 rebounds per game this season ... The last Virginia Tech freshman guard to average more rebounds was Jamon Gordon, who averaged 4.6 rebounds per game as a freshman in 2003-04.

## Captain Ben

Ben Emelogu was named a team captian this season as a freshman for the Hokies early in the preseason ... The guard from Grand Prairie, Texas came to Tech during the summer and established himself with his teammates immediately, earning the honor ... It took a great effort to even play in the Western Carolina game, as Emelogu was suffering from flu-like symptoms and recieved an IV prior to the game ... He scored 16 points in 27 minutes in that victory.

## Mueller Sits Out This Season

The NCAA ruled freshman guard Malik Mueller ineligible for the 201314 season due to initial eligibility rules ... Mueller has been able to practice with the team this season and will be eligible to play four years beginning next season.

## Kirby to Redshirt Season

Virginia Tech freshman post Maurice Kirby has chosen to redshirt the 2013-14 season ... Kirby has been practicing and travelling with the team and will play four years beginning beginning next season.

## Second Half Surge

Devin Wilson set a then-career-high with 20 points in the loss at Notre Dame ... Entering the locker room at intermission, he had two points ... His 18 second-half points is the most by a Hokie this season and the most second half points by a Hokie since Erick Green scored 21 points in the second half at Virginia on Feb. 12, 2013 ... Wilson upped his careerhigh to 26 points in the loss to Wake Forest, 25 points coming in the second half.

## Freshman Points

Since 1999, Virginia Tech freshmen have scored 20-or-more points in a game 19 times, most recently a 21-point game by Ben Emelogu vs. Maryland on Feb. 1 ... Here is a list of the top five performances on that list.

## Coming Next Year

Virginia Tech has announced the signing of three players to national letters of intent ... Justin Bibbs, a 6-5, $205 \mathrm{lbs} .$, guard from Dayton, Ohio, Jalen Hudson, a 6-5, 190 lbs . guard from Akron, Ohio and T.J. Lang, a 6-7, 190 lbs., wing from Mobile, Ala., all signed with the Hokies on Nov. 13 and will join the program in the fall of 2014.

## Finally a Two

After hitting a three-pointer at Georgia Tech, Will Johnston has now made 47 field goals and all but three of them have been three-pointers ... Johnston scored a two-point field goal in the home Maryland game ... During the off-season, Johnston was awarded a scholarship for his efforts both on and off the court ... He made a career-high four threepointers in the win over Furman, a feat he matched at FSU.

## Tough Stretch of Games

The March 1 game against No. 19/21 North Carolina was the first time since Feb. 21 \& 25, 2012, when Tech played No. 25 Virginia and No. 5 Duke, that the Hokies have played back-to-back games against nationally-ranked teams ... It also marks the first time since the same stretch in 2012, that the Hokies have played three games in a four-game stretch against ranked teams (the Hokies also played No. 20 Florida State two games prior to the Virginia/Duke stretch) ... Today is the Hokies' sixth game this season against a nationallyranked team, the most since playing eight ranked teams in the 2011-12 season.

## Hokies vs. Ranked Teams

With the loss to No. 6/7 Duke, the Hokies are 13-48 against nationally-ranked teams since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season ... Tech is 30-156 all-time against teams ranked in the AP poll ... Tech is $0-5$ this season ... The last time the Hokies defeated a nationallyranked team was Dec. 1, 2012, when Tech defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State, 81-71, in Cassell Coliseum ... These numbers are only for teams ranked in the AP poll.

## 2,500 Games

The game against Clemson marked the 2,500th game in school history ... Virginia Tech is now 1366-1148 all-time in collegiate basketball, good for a .543 winning percentage ... This is the Hokies' 105th season of men's basketball.

## Hot Inside on a Cold, Winter's Night

In the loss at Notre Dame, the Hokies shot 52.1 percent from the field, including 62.5 percent in the second half... The 52.1 percent is Tech's highest percent in ACC play this season and third-highest overall this season ... The last time the Hokies shot better than 52.1 percent from the field in an ACC game was when Tech went 23 -of- 42 from the field ( 54.8 percent) in the win over Clemson on March 2, 2013 ... Tech shot 62.5 percent from the field in the first half of that game ... The last time Tech hit better than 62.5 percent from the field in a half was the 81-63 win over Winthrop on Dec. 3, 2013.

## Cap \& Gown

On Friday, Dec. 20, the Virginia Tech men's basketball team traveled to Richmond, Va., to play the next day against VCU in the Governor's Holiday Hoops Classic ... Before the bus rolled down the highway, the team and, in particular, Cadarian Raines had something to do ... Raines earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from the College of Liberal Arts that morning in Cassell Coliseum and his teammates were all there to see the accomplishment ... After plenty of photos and congratulations from family, friends and teammates, Raines hopped on the bus for the three hour trip to the State Capital.

## Boarding School

In the loss at No. 25/22 Pittsburgh,
Cadarian Raines grabbed a career-high nine offensive rebounds ... That is the most offensive boards by a Tech player this season ... Raines had seven offensive boards in a game three times last season ... It is the most offensive rebounds by a Hokie since joining the ACC in 2004-05.

## Always There When You Need Him

In the loss at Notre Dame, Christian Beyer earned his first collegiate start ... The walk-on has seen increased playing time in the new year due to injuries and other factors for the Hokies ... Coming off the bench at VCU, Beyer saw 16 minutes of action, all coming in the second half ... He led the team with eight rebounds, including three off the offensive
 Chistin Beyer ... in the loss to Clemson, Beyer led the team in rebounding and played a season and ACC-game high of 26 minutes ... He tied his career-high with 27 minutes played at Boston College, scoing seven points and grabbing six rebounds ... He grabbed four rebounds in just three minutes of action at Pittsburgh.

## Two With Twenty

In the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, Adam Smith scored 27 points and Jarell Eddie scored 23 points ... It marked the first time that two Hokies each had 20-or-more points in the same game since Jan. 9, 2013, when Erick Green scored 24 points and Eddie had 21 points in a loss to Boston College ... In the loss at Notre Dame, Devin Wilson and Cadarian Raines, who each scored 20 points, matched the feat ...In the loss to Wake Forest, Wilson scored 26 points and Eddie scored 20 points, which combined with the Notre Dame game, became the first time since November 2012 that the Hokies had consecutive games in which two players scored 20-or-more points.

## Juggling the Injuries

30 games into the 2012-13 season, the Hokies had used six different starting line-ups ... This year, head coach James Johnson has been forced to juggle his line-ups game-bygame, due, primarily to injuries ... In the loss NC State, Johnson used his 10th different starting line-up ... In the end, Tech used six different starting line-ups last season.

## A Lot of Points in a Double

Jarell Eddie recorded his fourth doubledouble this season and seventh of his career with 23 points and 10 rebounds at Boston College ... The last time a Hokie scored at least 23 points in a double-double was on Dec. 8, 2012, when Erick Green had 23 points and 10 assists at West Virginia ... The last time a Hokie had at least 23 points in a doubledouble that included rebounds was on Feb. 13, 2011, when Jeff Allen had 25 points and 14 rebounds in a home win over Georgia Tech ... Allen had eight games of at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in his career.

## Hokies in Overtime

With the double overtime loss at No. 25/22 Pittsburgh, the Hokies are now 60-46 all-time in overtime games ... Tech is 1-1 this season and was 2-2 in overtime games last season ... Tech is 27-24 in road overtime games, 26-9 in home overtime games and 7-13 on neutral courts ... Tech is $13-6$ in ACC overtime games ... Tech is 3-7 all-time in overtime games against ranked teams ... Tech is 5-9 in doubleovertime games and 1-2 in triple overtime games.

## That's A Lot in A Little

The win over VMI was the final game in a stretch that saw the Hokies open the season with four games in the first nine days of the regular season.

## Spreading the Offense Around

When Will Johnston and Joey van
Zegeren scored in double figures in the win over Furman, it marked the ninth and 10th different players to record a double-figure scoring game this season ... Eight players scored at least 10 points in a game in the each of the previous four seasons.

## 350 and Counting

The Hokies have hit at least one threepointer in every game since joining the ACC in the 2004-05 season ... Tech has now hit a three in 364 consecutive games, the most in school history ... Since the three-point arc was added to college basketball for the 1986-87 season, the Hokies have hit at least one three in all but three games ... The last time that the Hokies did not record a three-point field goal in a game was at Providence on Feb. 1, 2003.

## Rebounding Differential

In the win over VMI, the Hokies outrebounded the Keydets, 52-31 ... The 21-rebound differential is the largest for the Hokies since outrebounding Oklahoma State, 47-24, on Dec. 31, 2011 in a 67-61 Tech win in Stillwater.

## There's a First Time for Everything

Will Johnston made his first collegiate start at Virginia last year ... It marked the first time a walk-on had started for the Hokies since Joey Racer started in the home finale against NC State two seasons ago ... It was the first time that the Hokies have started a walkon in a non-Senior Day situation since at least the 1999-2000 season ... In the loss at Notre Dame, walk-on Christian Beyer made his first collegiate start.

## Being Stingy

In the loss to Boston College on Jan. 11, the Hokies committed a season-low six turnovers ... That is the fewest turnovers for the Hokies in a game since committing five turnovers in a loss at Clemson on Jan. 27 last season ... The Hokies matched that total of six turnovers in the loss to Wake Forest.

## 500-Plus in the Cassell

The Hokies have a 538-174 overall record in Cassell, good for a .756 winning percentage ... Tech was 8-10 in Cassell Coliseum this season ... Tech was 11-7 in the 2011-12 season and was 12-4 in Cassell the season before, the 50th year for the arena ... The win over Florida State on Jan. 8, 2011, was the 500th victory in the building ... The win over FSU in 2008 marked the Hokies' 600th game played in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech defeated Rhode Island, $86-63$, on Nov. 20, 2002, in its 500th game in the arena ... Tech has had just one break-even home season and two losing season in Cassell Coliseum ... The 17 victories for the Hokies at home in the 2009-10 season set a new Cassell Coliseum and school record.

## Hitting Threes

The Hokies made a season-high 13 threepointers in the loss to No. 1 Michigan State ... It is the most three-point field goals made by the Hokies since they made 14 threes in a win at UNC Greensboro on Nov. 19, 2012 ... With the 12 made three-pointers in the win over Furman, Tech made 10-or-more threepointers in four consecutive games, the first time that has happened at least since the 1999-2000 season ... With the 12 three-point field goals in the overtime win at Miami, the Hokies have made at least 10 three-pointers in five of their 18 games, plus five more games of 8-or-more three-pointers.

## Call It a Comeback

Virginia Tech trailed West Virginia, 29-12, with 8:21 remaining in the first half ... From that point forward, the Hokies outscored their rivals from Morgantown, 75-52, to claim an 87-82 victory ... The 17 points is the largest deficit overcome by the Hokies since Feb. 8, 2009, when Tech came back from an 18-point deficit in an overtime win at NC State ... In the overtime win at Miami, the Hokies came back from a 13-point second-half deficit, the largest deficit overcome in a conference game by Tech since the NC State game.

## The Multi-Lingual Big Man

Communicating with Joey van Zegeren is easy for most students at Virginia Tech, regardless of nationality ... The redshirt sophomore from The Netherlands is fluent in five languages and has understanding of several others ... If you see him around campus, make sure to say "Hello", or "Hola", or "Hallo", or "Bonjour", or, well, you get the idea.

## Eddie was Honored

Jarell Eddie was named the ACC Player of the Week for the week ending Dec. 9, 2013 ... This was the first time that Eddie won the award and is the first Hokie to earn the honor this season ... The same week, Tech women's basketball player Uju Ugoka won the same award for ACC women, marking the first time since joining the conference in 2004 that the Hokies have swept both the men's and women's award in the same week ... He was named to the All-Tournament team of the Coaches Vs. Cancer Classic.

## Back in the Cassell

The Hokies returned to Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 15 for the first time in two weeks ... The game against Maryland on Feb. 1 was the Hokies' only home game between Jan. 22 and Feb. 15 and the second between Jan. 15 and Feb. 15 ... Tech opened January with a three-game home stand, but all three of those games came before school started on Jan. 21 ... The NC State game was the final game of another three-game home stand ... Tech finishes the season with three-of-the-final-four games on the road.

## Hot Night at the Line

In the loss to No. 1 Michigan State, the Hokies were 14-15 from the free throw line ... The 93.3 percent is Tech's highest free throw percentage in a game in which they have shot at least 10 free throws since Feb. 21, 2010, when the Hokies made 15-16 from the line in a loss at No. 6 Duke ... An interesting side note, the Hokies have made 25 of their last 26 free throw attempts against Big Ten Conference opponents ( 96.2 percent).

## Lotsa Swats

Virginia Tech recorded 13 blocked shots in the win over West Virginia ... The last time Tech blocked more than 13 shots in a game was on Dec. 9, 2009, when the Hokies tied a school record of 15 blocks in a win over VMI in Cassell Coliseum ... Tech also blocked 15 shots in a win over Coastal Carolina on Dec. 4, 1993.

## Big Lead in the Locker Room

Virginia Tech took a 38-18 lead into the locker room at halftime in the win over Western Carolina ... The 20-point lead was the Hokies' largest halftime lead since a 44-24 lead against Wake Forest in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 15, 2011 ... The last time the Hokies led by more than 20 points at the half was a 50-11 lead over Mount St. Mary's in Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 2, 2011.

## Cleaning the Glass

The Hokies grabbed a season-high 22 offensive rebounds in the loss to Wake Forest ... The 22 total is tied for the second-most in a game by the Hokies since joining the ACC and is the most by the Hokies against an ACC opponent in a regulation game since joining the league in 2004-05 season ... The last time the Hokies had 22 offensive rebounds in a game was in a 59-57 win over Oklahoma State in the Preseason NIT at Madison Square Garden in 2011 ... Tech grabbed 27 offensive rebounds in a 104-100 double overtime loss to Maryland in Cassell Coliseum on Feb. 27, 2007 ... It is the 11th time that Tech has grabbed 20-or-more offensive rebounds in a game since joining the ACC and the sixth time with 20-or-more offensive rebounds in an ACC game.

## What is a Hokie?

That's the most frequently asked question regarding Virginia Tech athletics ... The answer leads all the way back to 1896 when Virginia Agricultural and Mechanical College changed its name to Virginia Polytechnic Institute ... With the change came the necessity for writing a new cheer and a contest for such a purpose was held by the student body ... Senior O.M. Stull won first prize for his "Old Hokie" yell which still is used today ... Later, when asked if "Hokie" had any special meaning, Stull explained the words he used had no hidden or symbolic meaning, but had been thought up in an effort to get attention ... Hokie soon became a nickname for all Tech teams and for those people loyal to Tech athletics.

## Beecher Joins the Hall

Former Virginia Tech men's basketball player Bobby Beecher was inducted into the Virginia Tech Sports Hall of Fame on Nov. 5 ... As a senior, Beecher averaged 14.3 points and 7.9 rebounds to finish his Tech career eighth in scoring $(1,548$ pts.) and sixth in rebounds (797) ... He played in 128 of 129 games as a Hokie, starting 126. Currently, he still ranks third all-time at Tech in blocked shots (170) and stands in the top 10 in career rebounds, field goals made (640) and free-throw percentage (.807). He is 16th all-time in scoring ... Beecher, who was selected in the fourth round of the 1986 NBA Draft by the Sacramento Kings, earned his Tech degree in human services with an emphasis in family and child development ... Beecher was joined in the 2013 Class by MLB pitcher Joe Saunders, softball's Clarisa Crowell, PGA Tour member Johnson Wagner, VT tennis great Jimmy Milley and former NFL player John Engelberger.

## Head Coach James Johnson



James Johnson is in his second season as Virginia Tech's head men's basketball coach. Due to a rash of injuries this season, Johnson has had to alter from his preferred up-tempo style of offense and defense to allow the Hokies to be more competitive through this stretch, but, with a fresh infusion of talent for the 2014-15 season, Tech will see a more pressure-oriented offense and defense.

During Johnson's first season, senior guard Erick Green became the first Hokie ever to be named the Atlantic Coast Conference Player of the Year and to lead the nation in scoring. Johnson and the Hokies defeated No. 15 Oklahoma State in December in Cassell Coliseum, earning the new coach a victory in his first-ever game against a nationallyranked team.

Just as important, two Hokies, Jarell Eddie and Christian Beyer were named to the 2013 All-ACC Academic team. And in 2014, a league-high four Hokies were named to the academic team, Eddie, Will Johnston, Joey van Zegeren and Trevor Thompson. Johnson has renewed a pledge to better involve the program into the daily life of the Virginia Tech campus and the New River Valley community. In the past year, the program became a part of the Christmas Store, Special Olympics and other activities and charities in the area.

No stranger to the Hokie Nation,

Johnson spent the previous five seasons on the men's basketball staff at Virginia Tech. He was an assistant coach from 2007-2011 before being promoted to associate head coach prior to last season. He had accepted an assistant coaches' position at Clemson on April 13 of this year, but returns to Blacksburg to take over the reins of the men's basketball program. Director of Athletics Jim Weaver named Johnson to the position on May 1, 2012.
"I am pleased with Coach Johnson's first year as head coach," Weaver said. "He has surrounded himself with an excellent staff who cares about the players and their development in both the classroom and the basketball court."

Johnson joined the Hokies following two seasons as an assistant at George Mason. While at Mason, he focused on organizing the team's defensive efforts in practice and games. The Patriots were a combined $45-23$ in his two seasons and advanced to the 2006 NCAA Final Four. Before GMU, Johnson spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Penn State. He was the recruitment coordinator for the Nittany Lions. Prior to Penn State, Johnson had a one-year stint as an assistant at the College of Charleston and he spent two years as an assistant at Elon.
"Virginia Tech and the Hokie Nation have a special place in my heart and I am blessed and excited for the opportunity to become the head basketball coach," Johnson said at the time of his hiring. "I look forward to working with a great group of young men and moving


forward with this program."
Johnson, a native of Powhatan, Va., was a four-year player and three-year starter at Ferrum College. A three-time Defensive Player of the Year, he helped guide his team to two conference championships and a berth in the NCAA Division III Tournament. He was also voted his team's Most Valuable Player in 1993. In 2001, Johnson was selected as one of the Top 10 players in Ferrum basketball history. In September of 2009, Johnson was elected into the Ferrum College Athletic Hall of Fame.

After graduating from Ferrum with a bachelor of science in psychology in 1993, he immediately stepped into the coaching ranks at his alma mater and served as an assistant for two seasons. Johnson helped guide the Panthers to a regular-season conference title. In 1995, Johnson moved on to Longwood College as an assistant and then spent one year at Hargrave Military Academy, where he worked with the post-graduate team. In 1997, he began a three-year run as an assistant at Old Dominion. Johnson is a member of the Black Coaches Association (BCA) and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). In March 2001, Rivals. com named Johnson one of the Top 20 Assistant Coaches at Mid-Major Division I Schools. He was a squad leader in the Army National Guard from 1989-91.

Virginia Tech lost 64-63 to USC Upstate in men's basketball action Saturday afternoon at Cassell Coliseum. This was the season-opener for both teams.

The game was close throughout, with neither team leading by more than six points. Tech took a 15-9 lead on a 3-pointer by freshman Ben Emelogu with 13:33 remaining in the first half. The game was tied at 23 with 5:45 remaining before intermission, and the lead flipped back and forth for the rest of the half. The Spartans took a 33-31 lead into the locker room.

Upstate opened the second half on a 10-7 run and took a 43-38 lead with 16:40 remaining on a jumper by Ty Greene, but the Hokies were able to reclaim the lead and took a 58-53 lead with 8:51 remaining on a 3-pointer by Will Johnston. Upstate then went ahead 60-58 with 7:04 remaining on a lay-up by Torrey Craig. Following a lay-up by Tech senior Cadarian Raines to tie the game at 62 with 4:09 to play, the Hokies could manage only one free throw by senior Jarell Eddie in the final four minutes.

With USC Upstate leading 64-63 in the final minute, the Hokies were able to get a few chances to take the lead, but all fell short and the Spartans claimed the victory.

Eddie led all scorers with 18 points and led Tech with seven rebounds. Raines, who was held scoreless in the first half, tallied a career-high 17 points and grabbed four rebounds. Redshirt sophomore Joey van Zegeren also grabbed seven rebounds in the loss and recorded a careerhigh five blocked shots. Green led the Spartans with 17 points and Craig added 13 points. Ricardo Glenn had 10 points, and Jodd Maxey grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds.

The Hokies held the Spartans to just 37.5 percent from the floor and just five of 16 from beyond the 3 -point arc ( 31.3 percent). Tech shot 39 percent from the field, including 36.4 percent from beyond the 3-point arc. The rebounds were even at 39 . The Hokies made just nine of 18 free-throw attempts, including 5 of 13 in the second half.

VIRGINIA TECH 87, WEST VIRGINIA 82

## NOV. 12, 2013 • 1 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.

Virginia Tech freshman Ben Emelogu scored a gamehigh 22 points, and Adam Smith made some key plays down the stretch to help the Hokies rally past West Virginia 87-82.

Smith scored 19 points for the Hokies who rallied from a 17-point deficit in the first half. He scored seven of Tech's last nine points in the game - all in the final 1:46.

His basket with 1:46 left in the game gave Tech an 8077 lead. West Virginia cut the lead to 80-79 on a bucket by Juwan Staten with 44 seconds left.

Smith then made one of the biggest plays of the game. He drove to the basket, put up a shot and made it, getting fouled in the process. He made the free throw, and the three-point play gave the Hokies an 83-79 lead with 33.2 seconds remaining.

West Virginia's Remi Dibo then hit a 3-pointer with 23.7 seconds left to cut the lead to 83-82, but Smith answered again, hitting two free throws to push the lead to 85-82 with 16.2 seconds remaining.

West Virginia (1-1) had a chance to tie the game, but Nathan Adrian's 3-pointer was short, and Tech freshman Devin Wilson got the rebound. Wilson made two free throws with 5 seconds left to seal the game for Virginia Tech.

Emelogu scored 13 of his 22 in the first half, rallying the Hokies from that 17-point deficit. Tech went on a 12-1 run that ended with Emelogu's 3-pointer at the buzzer to cut the lead to 41-36 at halftime. The Hokies then scored the first eight points of the second half, using that 20-1 run spanning both halves to get back into the game.

Wilson finished with 16 points for the Hokies, making 4 of 7 from the floor and all eight of his free-throw attempts. Jarell Eddie had 10 points - all in the second half.

Dibo led West Virginia with 17 points, while Eron Harris added 16 for the cold-shooting Mountaineers. West Virginia shot just 35.7 percent from the floor ( 25 of 70 ).

Trevor Thompson recorded his first double-double and Jarell Eddie had 17 points, as the Hokies led from start to finish in downing Western Carolina 79-61.

The Hokies (2-1) jumped out to 22-point, first-half lead and had a 20 -point halftime lead. Eddie scored 10 of his 17 points in the first half for Tech, which shot 51.6 percent on 16-of-31 shooting in the first 20 minutes

Western Carolina (2-2) scored just three points in the first eight minutes - all on free throws. The Catamounts missed their first 11 shots and didn't hit a field goal until Justin Browning's basket with 10:31 left in the first half.

The Catamounts shot just 22.2 percent on 6 -of- 27 shooting in the first half. They only made 32.8 percent ( 20 of 61) for the game, including 3 -of- 25 shooting from beyond the 3 -point arc.

Thompson's three first-half dunks got the crowd in the game, and in the second half, he scored nine points. He finished with 15 points on 4 -of- 7 shooting from the floor and 7 -of- 11 shooting from the free-throw line and he added 11 rebounds.

It marked the second straight solid performance for the 6 -foot-11 freshman, who did not play in the season opener against USC Upstate. He had seven points and five rebounds in 17 minutes in the Hokies' win over West Virginia.

The Catamounts cut the lead to 53-43 on two free throws by Browning with 7:43 left, but got no closer. But Thompson then hit two free throws, and after a turnover by Western Carolina's Brandon Boggs, the Hokies' Devin Wilson added two more free throws with 7:27 remaining to push the lead to 57-43. The Catamounts got no closer than 12 the rest of the game.

James Sinclair led the Catamounts with 16 points. Trey Sumler, who scored 29 points in the Catamounts' loss at Oregon, finished with 11 on just 5-of-14 shooting

## GAME 4

VIRGINIA TECH 105, VMI 92
NOV. 18,2013• 7 P.M. • BLACKSBURG, VA.
Jarell Eddie tied a career high with five 3-pointers and scored 21 points to pace a balanced attack, as Virginia Tech held on late to down Virginia Military Institute 105-92.

Led by Eddie, the Hokies hit a season-high 11 3-pointers. Eddie shot 7 of 12 from the floor overall including 5 of 5 from beyond the 3-point arc. He also made both of his free-throw attempts and grabbed six rebounds.

Eddie's shooting certainly opened things up for the Hokies, who topped the 100-point mark for the first time since the 2011 season. Five players scored in double figures for Tech, and every Hokie player who played in the game scored.

Freshman guard Ben Emelogu added 19 points off the bench for the Hokies and hit four 3-pointers. C.J. Barksdale, who was suspended for the first three games of this season by Johnson for a violation of team rules, scored 16 points and grabbed six rebounds in his season debut.

Tech led by as many as 20 in the second half after Adam Smith's 3-pointer with 13:50 remaining and appeared to be coasting toward an easy victory. But VMI started pressing, and the Hokies got sloppy with the ball. Eight of Virginia Tech's 16 turnovers came in the final 13 minutes of the game.

VMI cut the lead to 98-92 on two free throws by QJ Peterson with 1:18 left, but the Hokies scored the game's final seven points.

Barksdale scored on a lay-up with 1:10 left, and after a missed 3-pointer by Peterson, Smith hit a free throw to give the Hokies a 101-92 lead with 56 seconds to go. Trey Chapman then missed a 3-pointer, and Eddie got the rebound. He tossed it ahead to Barksdale, who broke free for a dunk to give the Hokies a 103-92 lead with 39 seconds left and all but seal the game.

Peterson missed a jumper with 33 seconds left and then fouled the Hokies' Will Johnston, who made two free throws with 31 seconds left to account for the final margin.

The Hokies fell 96-77 in their opening game of the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn. Jarell Eddie finished the game with a career-high six threes as part of a 23-point effort, while Adam Smith led the team with 27 points.

The Hokies (3-2) got out to a slow start as Michigan State (5-0) took an early 10-5 lead, but Tech controlled the boards early on and it would eventually pay off. The Spartans struggled from beyond the arc early, unable to connect on their first six attempts. Tech took advantage and eventually tied the game at 10 on a Ben Emelogu three. C.J. Barksdale followed it up with a bucket of his own to give the Hokies their first lead of the game nearing the midway point in the half.

Following the under-12 media timeout, the Hokies went on an 8-0 run for their largest lead of the night at 20-14. The game saw six lead changes over the next three minutes of play, but Michigan State began to pull away in the closing minutes of the half. The final five minutes of the first period were dominated by Michigan State's Adreian Payne, who scored 11 of the team's 15 points in that time frame.

Eddie neared yet another 20-point half as he had 17 at the break, including 4 threes, while Payne put up 20 by halftime, as neither team saw another player score more than six points in the first half.

Michigan State continued to roll in the second half as it opened with a 13-3 run. The Hokies scored just nine points in the first ten minutes of the second half, but midway through the period Smith came alive for Tech. He scored nine straight points for the Hokies and was the only consistent source of production for the squad in the later part of the game.

Barksdale neared a double-double for the Hokies, finishing with eight points and seven boards, while Smith also grabbed six rebounds and had five assists. Payne, as well as Branden Dawson finished with double-doubles for the Spartans. Payne went for 29 and 10, while Dawson scored 12 points and brought down 10 rebounds.

Virginia Tech's Jarell Eddie scored 14 points to lead the hot-shooting Hokies to a 75-54 nonconference win over Furman. Eddie's 14 points - his seventh straight game in double figures - paced five Tech players in double figures. The Hokies also got 13 points from Marshall Wood, a career-high 12 points from Will Johnston and 11 points from Adam Smith. Johnston hit four 3-pointers, while Wood and Smith hit three 3's each, as the Hokies hit 12 3-pointers.
The performance marked the fourth straight game in which the Hokies have made at least 103 -pointers. Eddie made 6 of 15 from the floor, including two threes, and he also grabbed 10 rebounds for his second straight doubledouble. It marked the fifth double-double of his career.
Furman scored the first basket of the game on a jumper by Stephen Croone. But the Hokies answered with an 18-1 run to take control of the game and never trailed again In the second half, Tech built the lead to 22 points following a Wood 3-pointer with 14:30 left that gave the Hokies a 43-21 lead. Furman cut the lead to nine points on two occasions, the final coming on a Croone 3-pointer that sliced the lead to 51-42 with 7:40 remaining.
But the Hokies' Johnston answered with a 3-pointer with 7:11 remaining to start a 15-2 run that pushed the lead back to 66-44, and the Hokies weren't threatened again Eddie scored seven of the 15 in that run.
Johnston, who played 26 minutes mainly because Ben Emelogu was out (concussion-like symptoms), knocked down 4 of 6 from beyond the arc. Wood, who reached double figures for the first time this season, made 4 of 8 from the floor, including 3 of 5 from beyond the arc
Virginia Tech also got a career-high 11 assists from freshman point guard Devin Wilson, who became the first Tech freshman to record 11 assists in a game since Dell Curry dished out 11 against Maryland-Eastern Shore on Dec. 4, 1982.
Croone led the Paladins with 27 points. He hit 8 of 14 from the floor and 10 of 11 from the free-throw line. Larry Wideman added 13 points for the Paladins, who only had four players score in the game.

Virginia Tech guard Adam Smith scored 28 points to carry the Hokies past New River Valley rival Radford 81-56 in a nonconference game played Friday afternoon.
Smith's 28 points were his career high as a Tech player, topping the 27-point outburst against Michigan State. He scored 32 in a game while at UNC Wilmington as a freshman before transferring to Tech before last season. Smith scored 17 of his 28 points in the first half for the Hokies, who used an 18-0 first-half run to break open the game against Radford, whose campus is only 15 miles from Tech's campus. Six different players scored in the run, and Jarell Eddie's three-point play with 13:09 left in the half gave the Hokies a 23-5 lead.
The Hokies led by as many as 22 points in the half. Smith hit 7 of 12 from the floor and both of his free-throw attempts in the first 20 minutes. C.J. Barksdale added 10 points for the Hokies.
Radford (4-2), which made just four shots in the first 12:30 of the game, hit just 33.3 percent in the first half (10 of 30 ), including 1 of 10 from beyond the 3 -point arc.
The Highlanders cut the lead to 62-48 on a 3-pointer by R.J. Price with 10:17 left in the game. But the Hokies scored six straight points, the last two coming on a basket by Barksdale with 7:57 remaining that pushed the Hokies' lead to 20. Virginia Tech wasn't threatened again.
Barksdale had 14 points and 10 rebounds for his second career double-double. Eddie added 13 points and 10 rebounds for his third double-double of the season and the sixth of his career.
The Hokies played without freshman guard Ben
Emelogu, who sat out a second straight game with concussion-like symptoms. Emelogu, whom Johnson said would be re-evaluated on Sunday, is averaging 14 points per game.

Despite playing without Adam Smith and Ben Emelogu because of injuries, the Virginia Tech Hokies got a career night from Jarell Eddie and pulled away from pesky Winthrop to record an 81-63 victory over the Eagles.

Smith missed the game with a calf strain, while Emelogu sat out a third straight game with concussion-like symptoms. With those two out, the Hokies relied on Eddie, and the senior delivered in a big way.

Eddie scored a career-high 34 points, surpassing his previous career high of 28 points, which came at UNC Greensboro last season. He hit 13 of 18 from the floor, including 6 of 8 from beyond the 3 -point arc

Eddie's six 3-pointers were one shy of the school record set by Malcolm Delaney at North Carolina in 2011. His 13 baskets were a career high and his six 3-pointers tied a career high.

Eddie started going off midway through the first half, scoring 17 straight points for the Hokies at one stretch en route to a 20 -point first half. He hit 7 of 11 from the floor in the first 20 minutes, including 5 of 7 from beyond the 3 -point arc. Tech hit seven 3 -pointers and shot 53.6 percent from the floor in bolting to a 42-33 halftime lead.

Winthrop managed to hang around, though, and cut the Tech lead to 55-53 on a basket by Keon Johnson with 7:40 left in the game. But Eddie answered with a basket to push the lead to 57-53 and start a 17-4 run that helped the Hokies pull away.
C.J. Barksdale added 13 points for the Hokies, and Devin Wilson pitched in 11 points and eight assists. The Hokies also got solid minutes from Joey van Zegeren, who made his second straight start, and Cadarian Raines, with van Zegeren scoring nine points and Raines added eight off the bench. The trio of Barksdale, van Zegeren and Raines combined to hit 11 of 17 from the floor.

A late run at the end of regulation helped lift the Virginia Tech men's basketball team past the Miami Hurricanes 61-60 in overtime on Sunday afternoon at the BankUnited Center. Senior Jarell Eddie led the Hokies with 24 points and eight rebounds, while Garrius Adams paced the Hurricanes with 14 points in each team's conference opener.

Eddie scored Tech's final 11 points as part of a 13-3 run in the last seven and a half minutes of the second half. Tech (7-3, 1-0 ACC) had numerous opportunities in the second half to regain a lead it hadn't seen since midway through the first half, but Miami (5-5, 0-1 ACC) had an answer and would not allow the Hokies to get within a possession.

Late in regulation, Tech freshman Devin Wilson was fouled and had the chance to tie it from the free-throw line, but he missed the front end of a 1-and-1. Miami's Adams was fouled on the rebound and made it a three-point game, going 1 -for- 2 from the line.

On the ensuing possession, Eddie was guarded tightly in the corner but pulled up anyway and nailed the 3 -pointer to tie it up at 56 with 45 seconds on the clock. On Miami's next time down the court, Davon Reed airballed a 3 that sailed out of bounds with 14 seconds to play. Eddie's attempt at a final shot was blocked and things headed to overtime.

Adams was the first to strike in extra time for Miami, but Tech sophomore Marshall Wood quickly answered with a 3 for the Hokies. With Tech trailing by two and less than 30 seconds to play, Eddie hit a jumper to put the Hokies up 6159. Adams was fouled on Miami's next possession, but he only made one of his two free throws with seven seconds left. Miami got the rebound, but an errant shot hit the back of the backboard, and the Hokies escaped

Redshirt sophomore Joey van Zegeren had a career-high 10 rebounds by the half and neared a doubledouble by game's end, adding eight points. Freshman Ben Emelogu was the only other Tech player to score in double figures, finishing with 11 points, while Wilson finished the game with five assists.

James Kelly had 12 points and nine rebounds for the Hurricanes, while Reed added 10 points. Neither team shot particularly well in the game, both under 35 percent.

VCU guard Melvin Johnson scored 19 of his career-high 27 points in the first half and sparked a big first-half run, as the Rams downed the Hokies 82-52 in a Governor's Holiday Hoops Classic game played at the Richmond Coliseum
Jarell Eddie and Ben Emelogu paced the Hokies with 12 points, but Tech shot just 35.4 percent from the floor and turned the ball over a season-high 27 times. VCU scored 42 points off the Hokies' turnovers.
Tech actually led early in this one, scoring the game's first six points. But after C.J. Barksdale's basket with 15:47 remaining that gave the Hokies an 8-6 lead, things fell apart. The Rams scored 31 straight points to take a 37-8 lead. Johnson hit five of his six first-half 3-pointers in the run and he capped the run with a 3-pointer that gave the Rams a 19-point bulge with 6:03 left in the half.
VCU's fullcourt pressure defense was just too much for the Hokies, who turned the ball over 15 times in the first 20 minutes and made just 8 of 24 from the floor ( 33 percent).
The Hokies, who are one of the best 3-point shooting teams in the nation, hit nine against the Rams, with Eddie hitting 4 of 7 from beyond the arc. Marshall Wood hit two, and Tech hit 9 of 20 for the game.
Making matters worse for the Hokies, they lost two players to injuries - Barksdale and guard Adam Smith. Barksdale sprained an ankle, while Smith re-aggravated a calf injury. Barksdale scored two points in seven minutes before leaving, while Smith scored three points in 15 minutes before his departure.

Marshall Wood tied a career high with 14 points, but the Hokies let an 11-point, second-half lead slip away in a 55-52 loss to UNCG at Cassell Coliseum.

Tech led 43-32 after two free throws by Ben Emelogu with 10:06 left in the game. But UNCG went on an 18-6 run over the next 9:23, with Kyle Cain scoring nine of his game-high 18 points in that span. The run ended with Kayel Locke's basket with 1:23 left that gave the Spartans a 50-49 lead - their first lead since the 19:47 mark of the second half.

Wood missed a 3-pointer with 1:07 left, and Locke went to work again for the Spartans, scoring on a layup with 34 seconds remaining to give UNCG a 52-49 lead

The Hokies got a free throw from Wood with 17 seconds left that sliced the UNCG lead to 52-50, and they then fouled the Spartans' Drew Parker, who made the second of two free throws that gave UNCG a 53-50 lead.

Tech had a chance to tie the game with 10.1 seconds left. Devin Wilson made a layup and was fouled, but he missed a free throw that would have tied the game at 53 .

RJ White hit two free throws with 9.3 seconds left to give the Spartans a 55-52 lead. Wood then missed a 3-pointer with three seconds left that would have tied the game.

Cain and Locke, UNCG's post players, combined for 33 points, with Locke scoring six of his 15 points in the final two minutes. Cain hit 8 of 14 from the floor and grabbed 10 rebounds for the Spartans, who battled the bigger Hokies even on the boards ( 34 each). Locke made 4 of 9, but hit 7 of 8 from the free-throw line. The two combined to hit 12 of 23 from the floor on a day when UNCG shot just 36.5 percent (19 of 52).

The Hokies got 11 points each from Emelogu and Joey van Zegeren.

A career day from freshman Devin Wilson and a big response from senior Jarell Eddie helped lift the Virginia Tech men's basketball team past the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore, 82-66, in Cassell Coliseum Tuesday evening. Wilson scored 16 points for Tech, while Eddie was anything but flat against the Hawks, adding 17 points and nine rebounds.

Eddie rebounded from his performance against UNCG early, scoring Tech's first points of the game and although both teams scored right away, things got out to a slow start in the opening minutes. Following the first media timeout junior C.J. Barksdale went on a 5-0 run of his own to help spark the Hokies. Tech turned it into a 12-2 streak to go ahead 19-8 with just under 12 minutes left in the first half.

The Hokies never let UMES get closer than 10 points and eventually took a 46-23 lead into the break. The 23 -point halftime difference was the largest in Tech's favor this season and the biggest halftime lead since holding a 50-11 advantage over Mt. St. Mary's in 2011.

Tech continued to cruise in the second half, leading by as many as 26 points at times. The Hokies finished the game outrebounding UMES 42-26. Freshman Ben Emelogu saw increased action at the point and finished the game with a career-high nine assists.

The Tech bench outscored the Hawks' reserves 22-2 in the first half, and 37-13 in the game much in part to the efforts of Barksdale, freshman Trevor Thompson and junior Will Johnston. Barksdale, who has seen limited action as of late due to knee and ankle injuries, finished the game with nine points, as did Johnston, while Thompson added eight points. The trio also combined for 15 rebounds.

Tech stayed with Syracuse for 35 minutes, but the No 2-ranked Orangemen pulled away and remained perfect on the season with a 72-52 victory.

Tech trailed by as many as 12 in the first half, but the Hokies held the Orangemen to just one field goal in the final eight minutes of the first half and managed to cut the lead to 35-29 at halftime. Adam Smith scored nine points to lead the way for the Hokies, hitting three of his six 3-point attempts.

In the second half, the Hokies cut the Syracuse lead to 44-40 when Ben Emelogu banked in a free-throw line jumper with 14:44 left to play. But the Orangemen then took control of the game.

Syracuse went on a 16-0 run after Emelogu's basket, stretching the lead to 60-40 on a basket by C.J. Fair with 6:45 left. The Hokies missed nine straight shots during that run and went more than eight minutes without scoring. Joey van Zegeren's dunk off a missed Marshall Wood jumpe stopped the run with 6:16 left.

Fair paced a balanced Syracuse attack with 17 points, as four Orangemen scored in double figures. Syracuse shot 46.7 percent from the floor.
C.J. Barksdale led the Hokies with 12 points. Tech was shooting 45.5 percent from the floor before Syracuse's run but really slumped in the final 14 minutes and shot just 36.7 percent for the game against Syracuse's noted 2-3 zone

Adam Smith returned to the court for the first time since the VCU game for the Hokies and added nine points Tech's leading scorer, Jarell Eddie, scored just six points and hit 2 of 9 from the floor.

## GAME 15

BOSTON COLLEGE 62, VIRGINIA TECH 59

Boston College's Lonnie Jackson hit a 3-pointer in the final 30 seconds, and Virginia Tech missed a shot in the waning moments, all of which sent the Hokies to a 62-59 defeat.

Tech took a 59-58 lead on a 3-pointer by C.J. Barksdale with 1:36 remaining. BC's Olivier Hanlan turned the ball over on the Eagles' next possession, but the Hokies couldn't take advantage, as Jarell Eddie missed a 3 -pointer with 47 seconds left.

BC then called a timeout with 33 seconds to go. After the timeout, Jackson got a good look from the left wing and hit the 3-pointer to give the Eagles a 61-59 edge with 27.4 seconds remaining.

The points marked Jackson's only points of the second half.

Tech got the ball up the court quickly and called a timeout with 22.8 seconds left. The Hokies ran the clock down before getting the ball into the hands of guard Adam Smith, who took a jumper from the baseline that came up short with two seconds to go.

BC's Joe Rahon got the rebound, and Smith fouled Rahon with a second remaining. Rahon made the first free throw, but missed the second one. Eddie got the rebound for the Hokies and time expired.

Jackson - who missed BC's first three games this season with a hamstring injury and had scored in double figures just once this season - came into the game averaging just 4.4 points per game. But he led BC with 17 points, hitting 6 of 11 from the floor, including five 3 -pointers. Hanlan added 14.

Virginia Tech shot just 28.6 percent in the second half (8 of 28) and 35.1 percent for the game (20 of 57). The Hokies also missed nine free throws.

Smith led the Hokies with 12 points, and Barksdale added 11. Eddie, Tech's leading scorer at 16.6 points per game, scored 10 for the Hokies, but made just 3 of 14 from the floor.

Devin Wilson scored 14 points, but it wasn't enough for Virginia Tech, which dropped another close game, this time to the Clemson Tigers by a score of 56-49 in an ACC game played Wednesday night at Cassell Coliseum.

Tech had its biggest lead of the game after point guard Devin Wilson hit the second of two free throws to give it a 36-30 lead with 14:01 remaining. But the Tigers responded by scoring the next 10 points. Damarcus Harrison and Adonis Filer hit 3-pointers in the run, as Clemson reclaimed the lead for good.

Clemson's spurt ended up being a 16-4 run that ended when Jaron Blossomgame hit the second of two free throws that gave the Tigers a 46-40 lead with 6:37 left - their biggest lead of the game.

Clemson led 49-43 after K.J. McDaniels hit his lone 3 -pointer of the night with 4:09 to go, but the Hokies scored six straight points, tying the game on Ben Emelogu's 3-pointer with 2:01 left. Those were the Hokies' last points of the game.

Filer broke the tie for the Tigers, driving to the basket and hitting a layup while getting fouled. He made the free throw, and three-point play with 1:24 remaining to give Clemson a 52-49 lead.

The Hokies got 14 points from Wilson and 11 each from Emelogu and Joey van Zegeren. Virginia Tech shot 41.7 percent against Clemson's defense, which is ranked first nationally in scoring ( 53.9 ppg ) and second in field-goal percentage ( 35.9 percent). But the Hokies hurt themselves by making just 4 of 14 from the free-throw line.

Virginia Tech has lost five of its past six games and hasn't scored 60 points in any of the five losses. The Hokies' leading scorer, Jarell Eddie, scored just three points against the Tigers.

McDaniels led the Tigers with 14 points, hitting 4 of 9 from the floor, including both 3 -point attempts. Rod Hall added 11 points for the Tigers, who shot just 40.4 percent from the floor (19 of 47).

## NOTRE DAME 70, VIRGINIA TECH 63

A big second half for freshman Devin Wilson and an exciting return for redshirt-senior Cadarian Raines weren't enough for the Virginia Tech men's basketball team as it fell to Notre Dame, 70-63, in the Purcell Pavilion.

Redshirt sophomore Joey van Zegeren began the game with three blocks in the opening three minutes as play remained back-and-forth for the opening five. Notre Dame went on an 8-0 run following the first media timeout and was able to maintain the distance until Raines checked in for the Hokies with 9:32 left in the first half. He quickly went to work, scoring nine points in his first five minutes of action over the last three games.

Seven straight points from Raines got the Hokies back to within three as they trailed 21-18 with $6: 15$ left before the break, but they were unable to score a field goal in the closing four minutes of the half and allowed the Irish to take a commanding 39-24 lead into the half.

Tech quickly shifted the momentum out of the locker room, starting the second stanza with a 9-3 run. Wilson, who had just two points in the first half, quickly scored six in the first four and a half minutes of the second, making it 44-37 and forcing a Notre Dame timeout.

A 7-0 run for Tech got the Hokies within two points with 9:55 to play, but back-to-back threes for the Irish quickly reestablished some distance. Tech was able to get back within five points on two occasions, but that was as close as it got.

Wilson matched his previous career high in the second half alone and also added seven assists in the game, while van Zegeren blocked a career high six shots. Tech outrebounded the Irish 35-30 and Raines led the way with six. C.J. Barksdale put up 12 points for Tech, reaching double figures for the third time in the last four games. The Hokies played without starting guard Ben Emelogu, who missed the game due to a sprained right ankle, suffered in practice on Friday.

Virginia Tech point guard Devin Wilson scored a career-high 26 points, but the Hokies got off to a slow start and couldn't catch up, falling to Wake Forest 83-77

Behind Travis McKie, Wake Forest got off to a sizzling start, shooting 54.8 percent from the floor in the first half (17 of 31 ) and making 7 of its 103 -point attempts. The Demon Deacons made eight straight baskets at one stretch, and they took what turned out to be their biggest lead of the game on a 3-pointer by Miles Overton with 4:15 left in the half that gave them a 40-19 edge. McKie scored 15 firsthalf points, and Wake Forest led 42-27 at halftime.

The Hokies tried to make a game of it in the final five minutes, as Wilson scored 17 of his career-high 26 in the final 5:35. He scored the Hokies' final 10 points of the game.

But Miller-McIntyre answered again. He hit the first of two free throws and grabbed the rebound after missing the second one. He then scored with 2:10 remaining to give Wake Forest a 74-63 lead, and Virginia Tech got no closer than the final margin.

Wake Forest came into the game shooting 44.3 percent from the floor and 31.8 percent from beyond the 3 -point arc. But the Demon Deacons tied a season high with nine 3 -pointers and shot 53.6 percent ( 30 of 56 ) from the floor for the game

The Hokies missed their first 11 shots from the floor and shot just 33.8 percent ( 22 of 65 ) for the game.

Wilson made 6 of 10 from the floor, including 3 of 4 from beyond the 3 -point arc. He also hit 11 of 14 from the free-throw line.

Eddie finished with 20 points for the Hokies, and Trevor Thompson had 10 points and 12 rebounds.

Devin Wilson scored 12 points, but the Virginia Tech Hokies' cold shooting spelled doom in their game against Virginia, as Tech fell 65-45 to the in-state rival Cavaliers.

The 45 points marked the fewest Tech has scored in an ACC game since falling 69-44 at Duke on Jan. 4, 2009.

Tech suffered through a miserable first half on the offensive end of the floor. The Hokies shot just 27.3 percent, making only six field goals. Tech only trailed 13-11 after the Hokies' Ben Emelogu banked in a 3-pointer with 14:35 left in the half, but the Hokies only hit two more baskets the rest of the half.

Tech went more than eight minutes without scoring during one stretch. UVa closed the half with a 21-6 run and led 34-17 at halftime. The Cavaliers shot 54 percent from the floor and got 11 points from Malcolm Brogdon and 10 from Joe Harris in the half.

In the second half, the Hokies tried to climb back in it. They cut the lead to 36-24 on a layup by Cadarian Raines with 17:44 remaining. But Harris hit two free throws for UVa, and after Tech's C.J. Barksdale made the first of two free throws, UVa's Brogdon nailed a 3-pointer. That started an 8-0 UVa run, and the Hokies never threatened again.

Tech shot a season-worst 33.3 percent from the floor for the game and made just 3 of 18 from beyond the 3-point arc - tying for the fewest 3-pointers made in a game this season. Wilson, coming off a career-high 26 points against Wake Forest, made just 2 of 8 from the floor, but did make 8 of 11 from the free-throw line. Barksdale, Jarell Eddie and Joey van Zegeren each scored seven points.

Brogdon paced the Cavaliers with 18 points, hitting 6 of 10 from the floor and 4 of 5 from beyond the 3-point arc. Harris added 12 points.

Senior Jarell Eddie came out prepared and energized against Boston College, but his big first half couldn't lift the Virginia Tech men's basketball team past Boston College. Tech fell to the Eagles 76-52 on Wednesday night at Conte Forum. Eddie put up 19 points in the first half and finished the game with 23 points and 10 rebounds.

The Eagles (6-14, 2-5 ACC) pulled away early on with an 11-0 run a little more than three minutes into the game, which was capped off by a pair of 3's from Patrick Heckmann. Eddie put an end to the BC's streak on Tech's (8-12, 1-7 ACC) first possession out of the 16-minute media timeout and went on to score 10 of Tech's next 12 points.

Boston College kept the distance for the remainder of the opening half, as Tech never got any closer than seven and trailed by as much as 15 . The Eagles took a 46-33 lead into halftime, matching the most points allowed by the Hokies in a first half this season. Michigan State also put up 46 to start the game in the Coaches vs. Cancer Classic in Brooklyn on Nov. 22.

Back-to-back 3's by Olivier Hanlan and a jumper from Ryan Anderson in the first minute and a half of the new period helped Boston College extend its first-half lead and keep the momentum in its possession. The Hokies' first points of the second half came nearly three minutes into play, as Hanlan fouled Devin Wilson and argued the call to pick up a technical and his fourth foul of the game. Eddie made both of the free throws for the technical, and Wilson went 1 of 2 from the line on the personal foul

Even with the team's leading scorer on the bench for much of the second half due to foul trouble, Boston College was able to keep its lengthy lead for the remainder of the game. It led by as many as 30 points late in the game.

Cadarian Raines ended a three-minute scoring drought by the Hokies with 14 minutes remaining and Emelogu got Tech back to within nine with a three on the next possession, but the Seminoles had an answer for everything Tech did. Florida State's Aaron Thomas not only answered the Emelogu three, but showed off his range making three straight to give the Seminoles a 15 -point lead at 48-33 and force a Tech timeout.

Florida State continued to extend its lead as the second half proceeded on. Tech got back to within 12 on two occasions, but Florida State never let up and won by its largest lead of the night, 20 points.

## PITTSBURGH 62, VIRGINIA TECH 57

## FEB. 8, 2014•12 P.M. • PITTSBURGH, PA.

In a game that saw eight ties and 10 lead changes, the Virginia Tech men's basketball team was unable to hold on at No. 25/22 Pittsburgh, falling 62-57 in double overtime at the Petersen Events Center.

Outside of two instances, once in the opening minutes of action and again in the second overtime, neither team ever held a lead of more than two possessions throughout the entire game. Pittsburgh scored on five of its first six possessions to jump out to a 13-5 lead in the opening minutes of the game and force a Tech timeout before the first media timeout

The Hokies responded after the regrouping and went on an 8-0 run of their own, with half of the points coming from Trevor Thompson. Ben Emelogu capped off the run with a long 3-pointer to give Tech its first lead of the game at 14-13 with less than 11 minutes remaining in the half.

Tech wasted no time regaining the advantage in the second half, as Emelogu drained his second 3 of the day on the first possession. The Hokies were able to hold on to the lead for much of the second half, but a 3-pointer by James Robinson with 6:44 left to play in regulation put Pittsburgh ahead for the first time in the new half.

The Hokies were not rattled by the big play, and less than a minute later, Jarell Eddie connected from 3-point range to tie the game at 44 . Tech scored four points in the final three minutes of regulation and held the Panthers scoreless until Robinson was fouled on a 3-pointer and converted the four-point play to tie the game at 48 and force overtime.

Tech entered the extra time with one overtime game under its belt so far this year, its lone conference win at Miami back in December. Pittsburgh's Lamar Patterson, who scored 25 points in the Panthers' overtime win at Miami earlier in the week, was 0 for 5 at the end of regulation.

Scoring was limited in the first overtime, as both teams scored just four points apiece, all of which came from the freethrow line. With 43 seconds remaining, Devin Wilson zoned out the entire crowd chanting his name and sunk a pair of free throws to tie the game at 52 . He finished the game with 10 points, eight of which came from the freethrow line.

## VIRGINIA TECH 52, MIAMI 45

Devin Wilson scored 12 points and dished out nine assists, and C.J. Barksdale came off the bench to score 12, as Virginia Tech snapped a 10-game losing streak with a 52-45 victory over Miami.
Tech grabbed the lead early in the game and used a 9-0 run in the first nine minutes to gain a 15-5 cushion. Neither team, though, shot well from the floor, as Miami made just five baskets in the first half, and the Hokies only made eight and took a 19-15 lead into halftime.
In the second half, the Hokies strung together a few more baskets and led by as many as nine points. The Hokies led by seven after Wilson's basket with 2:02 left gave them a 43-36 edge. Miami cut the lead to 49-45 on a layup by Davon Reed with 35 seconds remaining. But Wilson made the first of two free throws with 34 seconds left to give Tech a 50-45 lead, and after Reed missed a 3-pointer, Wilson made two free throws with 20 seconds left to push Tech's lead to 52-45.
Miami's Rion Brown missed a 3-pointer with 13 seconds left, and Tech's Joey van Zegeren grabbed the rebound. Miami elected not to foul, and the Hokies ran out the clock - and started celebrating.

It marked a great end to a strange week for Tech. The university closed both Thursday and Friday because of a snowstorm that dumped nearly two feet of snow in the area, and the Hokies were unable to practice, as per university policy. Several of the players got together for a players-only practice on Thursday and Friday, and then Johnson got the team together for a short practice Saturday morning.
Wilson scored all 12 of his points in the final 3:37. He hit 8 of 11 from the free-throw line in that span, and as a team, the Hokies knocked down 10 of 16 in the final 2:52. Barksdale, who had missed the previous four games with a groin injury, made 5 of 9 from the floor, including two 3 -pointers, and he also grabbed seven rebounds.

## VIRGINIA TECH VS VIRGINIA

Virginia Tech played one of its better games of the season, but in-state rival Virginia made big plays down the stretch, and the Cavaliers escaped with a 57-53 victory over the Hokies in an ACC game Tuesday night.

Tech led 43-35 after Ben Emelogu hit a 3-pointer with 10:14 remaining in the game. But the Hokies hit just one basket over the next nine minutes, and during a sevenminute stretch, they scored just one point.

That allowed UVa to rally, and the Cavaliers took advantage by hitting three consecutive 3-pointers. The Cavaliers closed the gap to $46-45$ on a 3 -pointer by Justin Anderson with 3:27 left, and after Joey van Zegeren turned the ball over for the Hokies, the Cavaliers grabbed 48-46 lead when Joe Harris hit a long 3-pointer with 2:40 to go.

UVa did not trail again. Emelogu missed a 3-pointer on the Hokies' next possession, and Anderson made them pay, hitting another 3-pointer with 1:45 left that gave UVa a 51-46 bulge.

Anderson came into the game shooting just 21.7 percent from beyond the 3-point arc in ACC games. He hit 2 of 6 from beyond the arc against the Hokies and scored nine points in the game - all in the final four minutes.

The Hokies cut UVa's lead to 56-53 on a follow-up basket by Joey van Zegeren with 7 seconds left. They then fouled Brogdon, hoping he would miss two free throws and give them a chance to tie. But he made the second one to push the UVa lead to four points and seal the game.

Tech played outstanding defense against UVa, holding Harris and Brogdon to a combined 5 of 21 from the floor. Brogdon scored 12 points to lead the Cavaliers, who shot just 39.2 percent from the floor, while Harris only scored 7.

Tech shot 44.2 percent against the nation's eighthbest field-goal percentage defense, and the Hokies outrebounded UVa 29-28. But they turned the ball over 14 times, and UVa scored 18 points off turnovers.

Virginia Tech got 14 points each from Jarell Eddie and Devin Wilson, but the Hokies couldn't overcome T.J. Warren's 31 points in falling to NC State 71-64.

Tech shot better from the floor than NC State, hitting 42.9 percent ( 18 of 42 ) compared to 40.6 percent ( 26 of 64 ) for the Wolfpack. The Hokies also out-rebounded NC State (39-31), but they missed 15 free throws and turned the ball over 17 times.

NC State got plenty of points from Warren, a 6-foot-8 sophomore small forward. The ACC's leading scorer at 23 points per game coming in, Warren connected on 12 of 21 from the floor for the Wolfpack. He hit 3-pointers on the Wolfpack's first two possessions of the game, and he hit 7 of 10 from the floor in the first half, scoring 17 of the Wolfpack's 35 first-half points and helping NC State to a 35-25 halftime lead.

NC State led 61-46 after two free throws by Ralston Turner with 7:21 left in the game. But the undermanned Hokies -Tech played without starting guard Ben Emelogu and reserve center Cadarian Raines, both nursing ankle injuries - scrambled back into the game late, using a 17-6 run to cut the lead to 67-63 on two Wilson free throws with 36 seconds remaining

Tyler Lewis pushed the lead to 68-63 for the Wolfpack after he made the first of two free-throw attempts with 34 seconds to go, and after Virginia Tech's C.J. Barksdale missed an open 3-pointer, Lewis made 1 of 2 again from the free-throw line with 22 seconds left to give the Wolfpack a 69-63 lead. Lewis' two free throws with 12.8 seconds left iced the game for NC State.

Warren scored 14 points in the second half for the Wolfpack. He scored at least 30 points in a game for the sixth time this season.

As has been the theme all season, Tech again played shorthanded. Emelogu, Raines and Adam Smith (stress fracture) sat at the end of the bench. Only Raines dressed out for the game.

## DUKE 66, VIRGINIA TECH 48

FEB. 25, 2014 • 7 P.M. • DURHAM, N.C.
Duke opened the game with a 24-4 run, and Virginia Tech never recovered, falling 66-48 to the No. 6 Blue Devils in an ACC game played Tuesday night at Cameron Indoor Stadium.
The Hokies got off to a terrible start against the Blue Devils, hitting just two of their first 14 shots from the floor against the Blue Devils' man-to-man defense. In contrast, Duke hit 6 of its first 11 shots, including four 3-pointers, and jumped out to the 20-point lead 10 minutes into the game.
For the game, Tech actually shot better than Duke - 42.6 percent to 38.7 percent. But the Hokies turned the ball over 15 times and gave up 14 offensive rebounds. Plus, Duke seemed to come up with a 3 -pointer at every key moment, particularly in the second half, and the Blue Devils finished with 10 for the game.
Tech settled down in the final eight minutes of the first half, hitting 7 of its final 10 shots from the floor. The Hokies used an 11-2 run to cut Duke's lead to 26-16 on a layup by Trevor Thompson, and they went into the locker room down 32-20.
Tech cut Duke's lead to seven, 34-27, in the second half on Jarell Eddie's layup with 18 minutes remaining in the game. The score prompted a Duke timeout, and the Blue Devils promptly answered out of it, getting a 3-pointer from Rasheed Sulaimon that pushed the lead to 37-27.
The Hokies cut the lead to eight points on two more occasions, but they struggled in the final 10 minutes of the game. Tech scored just two baskets in the final 11:06, and Duke gradually pulled away.
Thompson, starting his sixth straight game, led the Hokies with 15 points and six rebounds. The freshman hit 6 of 9 from the floor and 3 of 4 from the free-throw line. He scored all six of the Hokies' points in the final six minutes of the game.

Virginia Tech's Jarell Eddie scored 18 points in his final home game, but the Hokies couldn't overcome North Carolina in a 60-56 loss.

Tech out-rebounded the taller North Carolina Tar Heels, and the Hokies held star Tar Heel point guard and leading scorer Marcus Paige to nine points below his average. But the Hokies couldn't string together enough points down the stretch to pull off the upset.

Four of Tech's past five losses have been by seven points or less.

North Carolina led for much of the game, but the Tar Heels' biggest lead was only nine points, and they couldn't pull away.

After trailing 28-21 at halftime, the Hokies tied the game once in the second half, knotting things at 36 after Devin Wilson's 3-pointer with 12:16 remaining capped an 11-2 Virginia Tech run. But J.P. Tokoto hit a 3-pointer for the Tar Heels to end the run, and did not trail again.

The Hokies cut the lead to 42-40 on a basket by Jarell Eddie with 8:54 remaining. But North Carolina answered again, this time with seven straight points. McAdoo scored the last two points on a basket with 6:57 left that gave the Tar Heels a 49-40 lead - their biggest of the game.

Tech cut the lead to $58-54$ on a 3 -pointer by Eddie with 40 seconds left, and then North Carolina's Leslie McDonald missed two free throws with 35.8 seconds to go, giving the Hokies a chance to cut into the lead more. But Eddie missed a 3 -pointer with 19 seconds left, and Michael McAdoo hit the first of two free throws with 14 seconds remaining to push the lead to 59-54.

An Eddie layup cut the lead to $59-56$ with 5.6 seconds remaining, but McDonald made the second of two free throws with 4.8 seconds left to seal it for the Tar Heels.

The Hokies kept close tabs on Paige, but they couldn't handle McAdoo, who hit 6 of 9 from the floor and 3 of 6 from the free-throw line for the Tar Heels. Coming off a 35 -point outing in the Tar Heels' win over NC State on Wednesday and leading the Tar Heels in scoring at 18.9 points per game, Paige scored just nine points on 3-of-7 shooting from the floor. He only dished out one assist in 30 minutes.

A second-half surge for the Maryland Terrapins lifted them past the Virginia Tech men's basketball team 64-47 on Tuesday evening at the Comcast Center in College Park, Md.
The game got off to a slow start, as neither team scored in the opening two minutes of action. After keeping it within 4 to begin the game, Tech's C.J. Barksdale kicked off what would be a 14-4 run with a three-point play at the 12-minute media timeout. A 3-pointer from Jarell Eddie tied things at 15, and Tech took its first lead of the game on a pair of Marshall Wood free throws.
Dez Wells broke up the run with two free throws of his own, and Layman buried one of his four 3-pointers to get the Terps back to within one with less than six minutes to go in the first half. Tech went back up by five in the closing minutes of the half, but Maryland rallied late, and a Nick Faust dunk capitalized on a late Tech turnover and made it a 29-28 lead in the Hokies' favor at the half.
Tech out-rebounded Maryland 21-11 in the first half, but its seven first-half turnovers and Maryland's nine points off of them kept things close.
Maryland scored six straight points to open the second half and keep the momentum in its favor. After opening the second half with a three-point play by Wells, the Terps made five 3's on their next scoring possessions to get out to a double-digit lead.
After a layup by Joey van Zegeren got Tech to within eight with less than nine minutes to play, the Hokies never saw a single-digit difference again, and Maryland led by as many as 20 in the second half. The Hokies committed a costly 17 turnovers in the game, and Maryland got 18 points off Tech's mistakes. Tech kept the rebounding advantage, 40-30.
