Miami has just **9** eligible scholarship student-athletes on the roster, led by seniors Davon Reed and Kamari Murphy, and junior Ja'Quan Newton.

The Hurricanes have 4 new players wearing Miami uniforms this season, all of whom are true freshmen.

Among active coaches, Coach L is the 11th-winningest coach in the country with 608 victories, and ranks No. 41 on the list of all-time winningest coaches.

Miami's facilities are undergoing \$1.7 million in renovations with graphics and new features in the office areas and locker rooms of the Watsco Center.

This season Jim Larrañaga and associate head coach Chris Caputo are in their **15**th season on the sidelines together, dating back to their time at George Mason.

Miami defeated three ranked teams this season, downing No. 9/6 North Carolina and No. 10/11 Duke in Coral Gables, as well as No. 18/19 Virginia on the road. This is the third straight year and the fifth time in Coach L's six seasons that the Canes have defeated two top-15 teams.

After receiving votes in at least one poll each of the first 16 weeks, Miami entered the national rankings for the first time in the 2016-17 season at No. 25 in both the AP and USA TODAY Coaches Poll on Feb. 27.

Miami won its third straight ACC-Big Ten Challenge matchup, defeating Rutgers in Coral Gables, Fla.

Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted five 20-win seasons in his first six years at The U and the Canes have won seven or more ACC games each season under Coach L.

Senior Davon Reed is the recipient of the ACC's 2017 Skip Prosser Award, presented annually to the top scholarathlete in ACC men's basketball. Reed will graduate in May with a degree in sports administration and double minors in communications and marketing.

Freshman Bruce Brown, who is majoring in sports administration, was named to the All-ACC Academic Team.

Guard Bruce Brown recorded a triple-double with 11 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists against South Carolina State on Dec. 6. It was the second triple-double in program history at Miami

Coach Larrañaga recorded his 600th career win on Jan. 14 at Pitt. With 600 wins, he is one of five ACC coaches with 600 victories, and the other four men are in the Basketball Hall of Fame.

In Miami's 21st game of the season vs. Florida State on Feb. 1, Larrañaga coached his 1,000th career game.

Miami's game against Georgia Tech was Coach L's 200th game at UM.

With a 78-67 win over Columbia on Dec. 28, 2016, the University of Miami men's basketball program earned its 1,000th program victory.

In his 109th game at The U, senior guard Davon Reed scored 17 points against George Washington, solidifying his name in Miami's 1.000-point club.

For two straight seasons, Miami has sold out its season ticket allotment for all home games at the Watsco Center.

The Miami coaching staff reeled in Miami's top recruiting class in program history, signing McDonald's All-American Dewan Huell, Jordan Brand Classic All-American Bruce Brown, Australian standout Dejan "DJ" Vasiljevic and Rodney Miller from national powerhouse Oak Hill Academy (Va.). The group was ranked No. 9 by 247Sports, No. 10 from Scout, No. 13 from ESPN and No. 13 from Rivals.

Jim Larrañaga has signed three ESPN Top 100 players for the 2017 class in McDonald's All-American and Jordan Brand Classic All-American guard Lonnie Walker (No. 18), guard Chris Lykes (46) and forward Deng Gak (92). New Zealander Sam Waardenburg also joins the class, and is practicing with the team this spring.

HEAD COACH JIM LARRAÑAGA

Coach Jim Larrañaga has led the Hurricanes to a pair of NCAA Sweet 16 appearances and won the 2013 ACC regular season and ACC Tournament titles. He has been named the AP, Naismith, USBWA and Henry Iba National Coach of the Year, twice was both the ACC and USBWA District Coach of the Year (2013, 2016), and was the 2013 NABC District Coach of the Year. With Miami's win over Pittsburgh on Jan. 14, 2017, Coach L earned his 600th career victory.

LARRAÑAGA BY THE NUMBERS

COACH L TIES TO THE ACC

Coach Jim Larrañaga was an assistant coach at Virginia from 1979-1986, under the leadership of Terry Holland. In those seven seasons, Larrañaga helped the Cavaliers to five NCAA appearances: Final Four twice, Elite Eight once, Sweet 16 once and Round of 64 once, as well as two NIT appearances, including the Championship and Quarterfinal round.

LARRAÑAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West, Fla., before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., getting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also owns a house in Sarasota, Fla., and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

RECAPPING THE 2013 ACC TOURNAMENT AND 2013 CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

ACC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAMS AND MVP

Shane Larkin was named the ACC Tournament MVP, while Durand Scott was listed on the first team and Trey McKinney Jones and Julian Gamble were on the second team.

Larkin averaged 23.7 points, 5.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.3 steals, while shooting 51.1 percent from the field, 45.0 percent from distance and 88.9 percent at the line. Scott averaged 15.7 points, 2.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists. Gamble posted 8.3 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 1.7 bpg, while McKinney Jones put up 11.7 ppg, hitting eight shots from distance.

CHAMPIONSHIP VS. NORTH CAROLINA - GAME RECAP FROM 2013

Miami claimed its first conference tournament championship in school history ... Miami became the first school outside of North Carolina since 1985 (GT) to win the ACC outright regular-season and tournament titles in the same season. Miami is also the first ACC school outside of the state of North Carolina to do so ... Shane Larkin was named the ACC All-Tournament MVP ... Larkin and Durand Scott were named to the ACC All-Tournament first team, while Julian Gamble and Trey McKinney Jones were named to the second team ... The Hurricanes improve to 5-18 against North Carolina in the all-time series, which dates back to the 1949-50 season. The Canes have defeated UNC three times this season after losing 10 straight games to the Tar Heels ... The Hurricanes shot 54.4 percent from 3-point range and connected on 12-of-22 3-point attempts, breaking their previous ACC Tournament mark of 10 (recorded against Florida State on March 9, 2012) ... Miami shot 75 percent from the free throw line and has now posted back-to-back games shooting over 70 percent from the free throw line ... Shane Larkin scored a career-high 28 points, surpassing his previous mark of 27 against Jacksonville on Nov. 16, 2012 ... Larkin now has three straight 20-point performances. He has reached double figures in nine consecutive games, and has scored in double figures in all five games played in the tournament (12, 16, 20, 23, 28) ... Trey McKinney Jones recorded a careerhigh 20 points, as well as connecting on a career-high six 3-pointers. His previous career high was 18 points (and five 3-pointers) against Michigan State on Nov. 28, 2012 ... Rion Brown who finished the game with 12 points and recorded his highest point total since scoring 10 points vs. Virginia on Feb. 19. Brown has scored in double digits five times this year, including two straight games against BC on Feb. 5 and UNC on Feb. 9 ... Brown, who shot 60 percent from the field for the game, has shot better than 43 percent from the field eight times, including 81.8 percent (9-11) at Georgia Tech ... Four Hurricanes finished the game with double digit scoring, Shane Larkin (28), Trey McKinney Jones (20), Rion Brown (12) and Julian Gamble (11).

THE HURRICANES IN THE ACC TOURNAMENT

The Canes are the No. 9 seed for the fourth time in UM history.

Miami last faced North Carolina in the 2013 ACC Tournament, when the Canes defeated the Tar Heels, 87-77, to win the ACC Championship.

The Canes are playing in the ACC Tournament for the 13th time.

Miami is 14-11 in ACC Tournament play.

Under head coach Jim Larrañaga, Miami is 8-4 in the ACC Tournament in just five seasons. The Hurricanes were 6-7 in the first seven years in the league, including two seasons (2005, 2009) without a victory in the ACC Tournament.

UM has won at least one game in the tournament in 11 of 13 seasons, including eight straight.

UM has won seven of its last 10 games in the ACC Tournament after going 3-0 in 2013 and 1-1 in 2014, 2015 and 2016.

Miami won the ACC Tournament in 2013, defeating North Carolina, 87-77, in the championship game, for the Canes' first ACC title. UM also finished the 2013 regular season atop the standings.

Miami's three wins in 2013 are the most by the Canes in the ACC Tournament.

Miami's highest seed was No. 1, in 2013.

Since Miami joined the ACC in 2004-05, four teams have won both the regular season and tournament, once by Miami (2013) and Virginia (2014), twice by Duke (2006, 2009) and three times by North Carolina (2007, 2008 and 2016).

Since 2012, four teams from outside the state of North Carolina have won the ACC Championship: Florida State, Miami, Virginia and Notre Dame. Prior to 2012, a team from North Carolina won the previous seven, and 17 of the past 18.

JAN. 28 - NORTH CAROLINA AT MIAMI

Bruce Brown was a one-man wrecking crew in the Hurricanes' 77-62 victory over North Carolina. He finished the game with 30 points, connecting on 8-of-11 shots from the field as he helped propel the Hurricanes to a 77-62 victory. Brown's 30-point performance was the most by a Miami freshman since UM joined the ACC in 2004-05. Miami's win over North Carolina handed the Hurricanes their first win over a top-10 team this season and the first over a top 10 opponent since the Hurricanes downed No. 3 Virginia last season. The win was Miami's fifth in its last seven meetings against the Tar Heels. The win also was the Hurricanes' secondlargest victory over the Tar Heels and their largest since 2013. Teammates Ja'Quan Newton and Davon Reed also chipped in, as they scored in double figures, finishing with 18 and 14 points, respectively. The Hurricanes defeated North Carolina in nearly every statistical category, including rebounds (41-36) and points in the paint (28-22). UNC entered the game as the No. Trebounding team in the nation, averaging 4.59 rebounds per game. The Hurricanes were also strong defensively, as they forced the Tar Heels into 14 turnovers, blocked six shots and held UNC to a then-season-low 21 made field goals. North Carolina jumped out to an early lead in the first half as it outscored Miami 11-2 with 16:28 to go until halftime. The Hurricanes responded in a big way over the next seven minutes as they went on a 24-5 run to take a 26-16 lead with 9:25 remaining until the break. Miami closed the half with a 10-4 spurt to take a 39-22 lead into the locker room. The Hurricanes came out firing in the second half, as they opened up a 22-point lead with 14 minutes to go in the game. UNC trimmed Miami's lead to 11 on two separate occasions, but the Tar Heels would get no closer as the Hurricanes captured their second straight win.

Game Notes - Freshman guard Bruce Brown finished the evening with a career-high 30 points, to go along with five assists, four rebounds, two blocks and two steals. In addition to setting a new individual career-high and team-high for the season, Brown scored the most points for a freshman since Miami joined the ACC in 2004-05. Durand Scott previously held the record with 29 points against North Carolina on March 2, 2010 ... Defensively, Miami held UNC to its then-lowest point total (22) in a half this season. UNC's previous low was 29, which was recorded twice against both Wisconsin and Indiana. The Hurricanes were the first team since Duke, on March 9, 2013, to lead the Tar Heels by 15 or more points heading into the locker room ... UM held North Carolina to shoot 20.7 percent (6-29) from the field and 22.2 percent (2-9) from beyond the arc in the opening half. The Canes did not allow a field goal in the closing 8:36 of the half.

DID YOU KNOW ...

Coach L became the first Miami coach to win 20+ games in his first two seasons at UM and only the third of 12 UM coaches to post at least three 20-win seasons and second (Bruce Hale, 5, 1954-67) to have five.

Former Cane Rick Barry was named one of the Greatest Players in NBA History.

Miami native and former Cane standout James Jones won the 2010-2011 NBA All-Star Weekend 3-Point Contest and the NBA Championship in the 2011-2012 and 2012-13 seasons.

Six-time NBA All Star Amar'e Stoudemire enrolled at UM in 2013 and took classes to earn his bachelor's degree.

Coach L led the George Mason Patriots to the 2006 Final Four with big wins over some of basketball's elite teams such as Michigan State, North Carolina and UConn. He was the first coach to take a mid-major to a Final Four in 27 years (Penn '79) when his team advanced in 2006.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larrañaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

Miami basketball received APR (Academic Progress Rate) Public Recognition Awards for being among the top 10 percent in APR in its sport. Miami ranks in the top 10 percent of NCAA men's basketball with a 990 APR

The Miami Department of Athletics recorded a Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 89 percent. Miami's department-wide GSR is 16th overall among FBS programs. UM has exceeded the NCAA average GSR in each of the last 10 years.

The Canes have averaged 20.0 wins over the last 12 seasons.

The Hurricanes have made at least one trey in 969 of 977 games since the NCAA adopted the 3-point shot in 1986. The last time Miami was held without a 3-pointer was Feb. 26, 2014 at Virginia.

Miami has held 828 of its last 829 opponents to less than 100 points. North Carolina was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM, 105-64, on Jan. 31, 2007.

THE SERIES: MIAMI VS. NORTH CAROLINA

In the six years since Coach L's arrival for the 2011-12 season, Miami (5-4) and Duke (8-4) are the only two teams with a winning record over North Carolina

Miami is a combined 10-7 against Carolina (5-4) and Duke (5-3) under Coach L. Notre Dame (8-7) is the only other ACC school to have a combined winning record against the Blue Devils and Tar Heels in those six years. In the six years prior to Coach L's arrival, Miami was 2-17 overall against North Carolina (1-8) and Duke (1-9).

The Hurricanes have won five of the last seven meetings with North Carolina.

On Feb. 9, 2013, Miami tied a program record by hitting 15 3-pointers in its 87-81 victory over UNC.

Miami won the ACC Tournament in 2013, defeating North Carolina, 87-77, in the championship game, for the Canes' first ACC title. UM also finished the 2013 regular season atop the standings.

Jim Larrañaga and George Mason bested Roy Williams and UNC, 65-60, in the second round of the 2006 NCAA Tournament on GMU's way to the Final Four.

Jack McClinton set Miami's record for most points in ACC game when he scored 35 in 2009 against North Carolina.

Miami's first game in the Watsco Center was Jan. 4, 2003, a 64-61 overtime victory over the Tar Heels.

CANES FROM NEW YORK

Head Coach Jim Larrañaga, associate head coach Chris Caputo and forwards Kamari Murphy and Rodney Miller have returned to their home city of New York for the ACC Tournament.

Coach L grew up in the Park Chester neighborhood of The Bronx, playing on the courts "down the east." He played high school basketball at Archbishop Molloy, for legendary coach Jack Curran. Being from The Bronx, Larrañaga took the city bus to school every day, a trip of 90 minutes.

Caputo is from Elmhurst, N.Y., and also attended Archbishop Molloy, playing for Coach Curran.

Murphy graduated from Lincoln High School in Brooklyn, the same school that produced Stephon Marbury, Sebastian Telfair and Lance Stephenson. He averaged 17 points and more than 10 rebounds per game as senior and helped lead Railsplitters to PSAL Class-AA title game as senior and Brooklyn regular-season crown and borough title.

Miller is from Laurelton, N.Y., but played high school ball at Oak Hill (Va.).

MURPHY RETURNS TO BROOKLYN

In his first game played in Brooklyn since his prep days at Lincoln High, redshirt senior Kamari Murphy notched his fourth double-double of the season with 16 points and 10 rebounds against Syracuse.

BRUCE ALMIGHTY

In 70 total minutes against No. 9/6 North Carolina and No. 10/11 Duke (Feb. 25) freshman Bruce Brown tallied 55 points, nine assists, eight rebounds, four blocks and four steals. He had 30 points, five assists, four rebounds, two blocks and two steals in 34 minutes against UNC and 25 points, four assists, four rebounds, two blocks and two steals in 36 minutes against Duke. Against Duke, Brown shot 11 for 18 and had four assists, while his teammates shot just 11 for 40 with four assists combined. Brown scored or had the assist on nine of Miami's first 11 field goals.

HOLDING DOWN A TOP-RANKED TEAM

On Jan. 28, Miami outrebounded North Carolina, the then-No. 1 rebounding team in the NCAA, 41-36. The Tar Heels entered the game averaging 45.9 rebounds per game. Miami also held the then-No. 4 team in the NCAA in offensive scoring per game (89.4) to just 62 points, its lowest point total of the season to that point. UNC's original season low was 63 against Georgia Tech, Dec. 31, 2016

All interview requests for coaches or athletics department staff members must be approved and cleared by Amy LaBrie in the UM Communications office. Credential requests are taken via e-mail to LaBrie (LaBrie@miami.edu). Any misuse of credentials will result in removal from the Watsco Center and the permanent voiding of the credential. The UM locker room is closed at all times. For home games, Coach L and at least one Hurricane player will report to the media room for interviews following the opposing team's press conference.

REED ACC'S TOP SCHOLAR-ATHLETE

Davon Reed is the recipient of the ACC's 2017 Skip Prosser Award, presented annually to the top scholar-athlete in ACC men's basketball. Reed will graduate in May with a degree in sports administration and double minors in communications and marketing. A three-time All-ACC Academic Team selection, he is also one of four of the league's top 20 scorers to be named to the 2017 All-ACC Academic Team.

REED NAMED ALL-ACC AND TO ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAM

Senior guard Davon Reed earned third team All-ACC honors. as well as a spot on the ACC All-Defensive Team. Reed ended the regular season 17th in scoring, 25th in rebounding, third in minutes played, sixth in free throw percentage, eighth in 3-pointers made per game and 10th in 3-point field goal percentage in ACC games.

Defensively, he helped Miami to the second-best mark in the ACC in points allowed, and helped UM to be 18th in the nation (third in the ACC) in defensive efficiency. He held Luke Kennard to 11 points, Steve Vasturia to 10 points, Terry Henderson to eight points and London Perrantes to four points.

MIAMI IN TOURNAMENT PLAY UNDER COACH L

Miami is 16-5 in tournament play over the past three seasons. with an 8-2 record in non-conference tournaments, a 3-2 mark in the ACC Tournament, 2-1 clip in the NCAA Tournament and a 4-1 record in the NIT. In six seasons under Coach L, Miami is 30-13 in tournament play, including regular and postseason.

MIAMI EARNS 20TH REG. SEASON WIN AND 10TH ACC VICTORY

Coach Jim Larrañaga has posted five 20-win seasons in his first six years at The U. and 11 career 20-win seasons. This is Miami's eighth 20-win season since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 campaign. Larrañaga is just the second coach in Miami history with five 20-win seasons, joining Bruce Hale (1954-67).

Also in six seasons under Coach Jim Larrañaga, the Canes have won seven or more ACC games each season and have had 10 or more league victories in four years. Prior to the arrival of Coach L, Miami had never won 10 ACC games in a season.

MIAMI PICKED NINTH, FINISHES T-SEVENTH, IN ACC

Miami finished tied for seventh in the league after being predicted to finish ninth out of 15 teams in the ACC this season, as announced by the league at the 55th annual Operation Basketball. In his six years, Coach Jim Larrañaga's Canes have exceeded or matched preseason expectations every campaign. In that time, Larrañaga is the only coach in the ACC to finish above or at the preseason poll predictions every season.

Miami posted a 5-3 record against teams predicted to finish in the top six this season. The Canes were 5-4 against the projected bottom eight squads. The Canes went 6-1 against teams that finished below Miami in the final standings, falling only at 10thseeded Wake Forest. Miami's all-time preseason poll breakdowns and finishes are as follows:

CANES NEED 70 POINTS

This season Miami is 17-1 overall and 8-1 in ACC play when scoring 70+ points. UM has scored fewer than 60 points in six of its nine losses.

LUCKY SEVENS FROM LONG RANGE

Miami has made at least seven shots from long range in 121 of Larrañaga's 207 games at UM. The Canes are 93-28 when making at least seven from 3-point range. This season. Miami is 11-5 when hitting seven from deep. 2015-16: 17-3; 2014-15: 18-5; 2013-14: 9-6; 2012-13: 19-3; 2011-12: 19-6.

PLAYING AS THE UNDERDOG

Miami is 11-23 under Coach Larrañaga when entering a game as the underdog against an AP top-25 team. The Canes are 6-11 when the opponent is in the AP top 10.

REED SERVING AS MARKETING INTERN

Senior Davon Reed will graduate in May with a degree in sports administration with a minor in marketing and communications. Since June of 2016, Reed has been an intern in the athletics marketing department, assisting the execution of strategic marketing planning for athletics programs with a focus on increasing attendance, game atmosphere and fan experience at Hurricane athletics events.
