STORY LINES

- After earning their first Atlantic Coast Conference series victory of the season over then-No. 24 Virginia Tech, the Miami Hurricanes will wrap up a six-game homestand Wednesday against visiting Florida Atlantic. First pitch is set for 6 p.m.
- Miami will be looking to continue its dominant stretch in midweek play. The Hurricanes are off to an impressive 8-1 mark in midweek games this season, and took down FAU in late February with a dramatic 5-4, extra-inning victory.
- · Coming off its most recent series victory on the road at Arkansas State, FAU is off to an impressive 15-9 start this season and a 4-2 mark in Sun Belt Conference play.
- Freshman David Thompson was the hero last time out against FAU, connecting on his first career homerun to tie the game in the eighth before an 11th-inning single from **Brad Fieger** clinched the Hurricanes' fourth straight win over the Owls.
- The Hurricanes own a 52-10 all-time series advantage over the Owls, and have won eight of the past 10 matchups.
- Among this week's most impressive midweek performers: senior Michael Broad (.391 average, five RBI's), senior Chantz Mack (.382, 11 runs scored), junior Brad Fieger (.364, 12 RBI's), and freshman LHP Thomas Woodrey (3-0, 2.21 ERA).

Starting Pitcher Notes

- Salas will be making his second consecutive start in the midweek role after opening 2013 on the weekend.

- Salas delivered one of the best starts of his UM career as a sophomore against FAU, striking out a career-best 10 batters in an April 24, 2012 win over the Owls.



3 JIM MORRIS 2001, 1999 & 1994 COACH OF THE YEAR • 2008 ACC COACH OF THE YEAR



In his 20th season at Miami, no other program nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. which has qualified Miami, for Tournament an NCAA-record NCAA 40 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 19 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

- Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 869-329-3 (.724) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,373-596-4 (.696) Division I record in 31+ years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 34 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,504-637-4 (.701) mark
- In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 19 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

- Jim Morris earned his 28th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2012 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the first round of the postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 19 seasons (1994-2012), winning 15 of his last 19 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.
- Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2012 Hurricanes to their 40th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2012 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft: E.J. Encinosa, Eric Erickson, Steven Ewing, Peter O'Brien and Stephen Perez.

MORRIS IN 35th SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

- Morris currently has a 1,373-596-4 (.696) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,504-637-4 (.701) record over 30-plus years.
- Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.
- Morris entered 2013 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball history with 1,354 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division.
- Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.



JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 19 seasons and led the Canes to NCAA Regional Championships, straight an NCAA
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

HOME SWEET HOME...

- After winning their first Atlantic Coast Conference series against then-No. 24 Virginia Tech, the Hurricanes wrap up a six-game homestand Wednesday with a 6 p.m. tilt against Florida Atlantic.
- The Hurricanes boast an impressive 16-4 record (.800) inside the friendly confines of Alex Rodriguez Park, including an 8-1 mark in midweek contests played in Coral Gables.
- Miami is hitting .285 as a team at home, led by junior Brad Fieger (.353, 18 RBI's), junior Alex Hernandez (.348, 19 runs) and senior Alex San Juan (.305, nine RBI's).
- Including road games, the Hurricanes are 18-6 this season inside the state of Florida and 1-2 outside of it.

MAKING HISTORY...

- For his 16-strikeout performance in a March 23 complete game win over the Hokies, southpaw Bryan Radziewski was recognized with ACC Pitcher of the Week honors Monday.
- The complete game shutout was the first for a Miami pitcher since David Gutierrez accomplished the feat in 2009.
- The 16 strikeouts represented the sixth-most ever for a Miami pitcher, tying Jim Muelhausen's single-game mark from 1969. The total represented the most punchouts for a Miami pitcher since Joe Grahe fanned 18 in 1989, and came just three shy of the ACC single-game record.
- The Pitcher of the Week award was the first for a Miami hurler since E.J. Encinosa was recognized on April 9, 2012.
 Radziewski was also named a Louisville Slugger Player of the Week by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and College Sports Madness ACC Player of the Week.

STARTING OFF STRONG...

- Sophomore Chris Diaz has impressed as Friday night starter, delivering five quality starts in six chances this season.
- The Florida City, Fla., native ranks seventh in the ACC with an ERA of 1.58, and went a career-long eight innings in Friday's win over Virginia Tech (March 22).
- Sophomore Andrew Suarez delivered a strong outing in the series finale against No. 1 UNC (March 17), striking out a career-best seven batters through 6.2 innings of work.
- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff went with a new rotation of Chris Diaz, Bryan Radziewski and Andrew Suarez against No. 24 Virginia Tech. The trio of southpaws gave up just four earned runs across 23.2 combined innings of work, good for a staff ERA of 1.52.

SCOUTING THE OWLS...

- FAU is off to a strong 15-9 start in 2013, including a 4-2 mark in Sun Belt Conference play.
- The Owl offense has been powered by Mitch Morales (.325 average, 12 RBI's), Mark Nelson (five homeruns, 22 RBI's), Tyler Rocklein (.295 average, four homeruns) and Nathan Pitman (11 RBI's, eight steals).
- On the hill, FAU has been led by starters Austin Gomber (2-1, 1.37 ERA), Brandon Rhodes (2-1, 2.59) and relievers Bo Logan (11 appearances, 2.25 ERA) and Hugh Adams (six saves, 3.09).



GETTING DEFENSIVE...

- Miami's defense has been one of the many brightest spots on the season, boasting a .970 fielding percentage - the fifth-best mark in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Miami's 2013 infield features four newcomers: freshman first base platoon David Thompson & Christopher Barr, junior second baseman Alex Hernandez and freshman shortstop Brandon Lopez. Junior third baseman Brad Fieger completes the infield lineup.
- The play of the Hurricanes infield has been the catalyst for a majority of the team's 24 double plays - the second-most of any team in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY...

- Head coach Jim Morris and his staff have received 12 quality starts from their starters this season · including three consecutive in its most recent series with No. 24 Virginia Tech.
- Sophomore LHP Chris Diaz set a new personal record by going eight innings against the Hokies, allowing two earned runs.
- Sophomore Andrew Suarez has delivered three straight quality starts against Duke (March 10), UNC (March 17) and Va Tech (March 24), and ranks 16th in the ACC with a 2.73 ERA.
- Freshman LHP Thomas Woodrey went eight innings against Maine in a midweek start (March 5), tied for the second-longest any pitcher has gone this season.

HEATING UP...

- OF Ricky Eusebio is hitting a team-best .357 over the past five games, all starts, and is leading all starters with five RBI's over that stretch.
- Senior OF/DH Michael Broad, who has started four of the past five games, is hitting .455 with five hits and two runs in his last 11 at hats.
- Junior lefthander Bryan Radziewski, who was recognized with ACC Pitcher of the Week honors Monday, is 3-0 in his last three starts. He has allowed just one run across his last 19 innings of work (0.47 ERA), and has an eye-popping 32:2 strikeout-to-walk ratio over that stretch.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH...

- A number of the Hurricanes' most important contributors were part of a recruiting class ranked in the top 10 by national publications.
- Despite starting just 11 of the team's 27 games, 1B/OF Christopher Barr ranks 17th in the ACC in walks (15). He is getting on base at a team-best .509 clip.
- RHP Frank Grandinette is tied for second in the conference in appearances (13), just one shy of teammate AJ Salcines (14).
- Junior Alex Hernandez, who has started all 27 games this season, ranks second in the conference in fielding percentage (.984) and No. 22 in on-base percentage (.443).

STAYING HOT IN THE SUNSHINE STATE...

- The Hurricanes' current six-game homestand continues a stretch of 25 of the team's first 28 games that will have been played inside state lines to open up the 2013 season.
- 20 of the team's first 27 games will have been played at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
- Including the team's weekend series in Gainesville, Fla., and a midweek matchup on the road at FAU, the Hurricanes did not travel outside the Sunshine State until March 15.

During a special tribute night against Milwaukee on Feb.
23, head coach Jim Morris called for the "Grand Illusion,"
trick play for which Fraser became instantly famous after
the 1982 College World Series. A new outfield banner
portraying the legendary coach was also unveiled
by Fraser's wife Karen, his three daughters and five
grandchildren during the game.

The Hurricanes are wearing patches in remembrance of Fraser; #1 patches adorn the right breast of each and every jersey, while #1 decals have been placed on the back of each player's batting helmet.

A commemorative home plate painted on the field with the number 1, Fraser's retired jersey number, will remain all season.



LAST TIME OUT...

Feb. 20, 2013: No. 20 HURRICANES TAKE DOWN FAU 5-4 in EXTRAS

BOCA RATON, Fla. -- The No. 20 Miami Hurricanes won their first midweek match-up of the season in extra innings Wednesday, taking down the homestanding Owls of Florida Atlantic by a final score of 5-4.

With the help of a late offensive surge, Miami (4-0) was able to pull off its first road victory of the year. Freshman David Thompson's first career homerun in the top of the eighth helped force extras, while Brad Fieger's RBI single in the top of the 11th inning proved to be the gamewinner.

Thompson's homerun, crushed over the leftfield wall off Owls' closer Hugh Adams, was the first of the Hurricanes' season. The Miami, Fla., native reached base three times on the night, including the decisive 11th inning, when he led off the frame with a walk. Freshman pinch-runner Chris Barr advanced to third on two groundouts, and eventually scored on Fieger's single through the right side of the infield.

The game moved deeper into extras thanks in large part to junior outfielder Tyler Palmer, who saved the night with an impressive diving grab. With a man on second base and two outs, FAU's Levi Meyer flared a ball into left field that had a chance to plate the winning run. But Palmer extended for the catch, snaring the ball just before it hit the ground.

Making his first career start, freshman Thomas Woodrey delivered a solid outing on the mound at FAU Baseball Stadium. The Lighthouse Point, Fla., native scattered seven hits through his 4.2 innings of work, walking one and striking out five.

It was the hosts who struck first, notching a run in the bottom of the second inning on an RBI single from senior Nathan Pittman. With a runner on second and two outs, Woodrey allowed a walk to junior infielder Sean Murrell. After making an impressive diving catch in the first inning, Pittman then drove in the game's first run on a single to the leftfield gap. Woodrey escaped any further damage by inducing a flyout from catcher Levi Meyer to end the inning.


The Hurricane offense struggled early, as Owls' freshman Nathan Rhodes set down eight of the first ten Miami batters. Fieger broke the streak with a one-out single in the third inning, one of only six hits allowed by Rhodes in his first collegiate start.

Miami threatened in the fifth, as Alex San Juan (single) and Michael Broad (single) gave the Hurricanes two runners on with two outs. But a flyout from Brandon Lopez to shallow rightfield ended the threat. A two-run homerun from FAU's Tyler Rocklein in the bottom half of the inning would signal the end of Woodrey's night, as the southpaw departed with his team facing a 3-0 deficit.

The Canes finally broke through in the sixth, as Tyler Palmer opened the frame with a double and junior Alex Hernandez followed up with a single. With runners on the corners, Mack hit a ball that landed just fair in right field. Palmer scored easily, but Hernandez was tagged out at home on a nice defensive

relay from FAU. Mack, who took third on the throw, would later score on a wild pitch from reliever Michael Sylvestri, cutting the deficit to 3-2.

After Thompson's eighth-inning blast, the Hurricanes' bullpen bent but did not break to force extra innings. Junior closer AJ Salcines loaded the bases with two outs in the ninth, but senior Eric Nedeljkovic (1-0) induced a groundout of Rocklein to end the threat. The Folsom, Calif., native pitched two more scoreless innings, clinching Miami's fourth-straight win to open the season.
