COLLEGE WORLD SERIES STORYLINES & NEWS

- The Miami Hurricanes have clinched a trip to the College World Series for the second straight year and 25th time in history.
- Miami's back-to-back CWS trips are its first since 2003 / 2004; its 25 all-time trips to Omaha are second-most (Texas 35).
- UM finished the NCAA Regional & Super Regional rounds 5-1, beating Boston College in two of three to advance to the CWS.
- . Miami's 48 wins in Omaha and 88 total College World Series games played are both fourth-most by a program in history.
- · With its selection as regional host, UM extended its NCAA-record streak of postseason appearances to 44 straight years.
- . Miami is the only school nationwide to qualify for a football bowl game, men's & women's NCAA hoops tournaments & CWS.
- UM has never missed the World Series when earning a national seed: 1999, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2008, 2015 & 2016.
- Seven Canes were selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, bringing UM's all-time total to 280 the most of any ACC school.
- With a 50-12 record in 2016, the Canes posted back-to-back 50-win seasons for the first time since 1998 / 1999.
- Miami was one of 10 ACC teams to earn a postseason berth, tying the record total from one conference in NCAA history.
- Miami's regional was paired with the Oxford Regional hosted by Ole Miss and featuring Tulane, Boston College & Utah.
- UM ended the regular season ranked as high as No. 2 (by D1Baseball) and was ranked No. 3 in most top-25 baseball polls.
- Head coach Jim Morris won his 1,000th game at the University of Miami in a 5-4 walk-off win over Clemson on March
 26. With a victory over FGCU on April 5, Morris moved past Larry Hays (1,508) into fifth place in all-time Division I wins.
- Morris became just the sixth head coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win milestone on March 18.
- Miami had seven players earn All-ACC honors: junior Zack Collins (first team), junior Johnny Ruiz (second), and junior Willie Abreu, sophomore Carl Chester, junior Bryan Garcia, senior Brandon Lopez & sophomore Michael Mediavilla (third).
- Reliever Frankie Bartow was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America after leading Miami in appearances (41).
- Junior closer Bryan Garcia ranks first in Miami history with 43 career saves; he is the nation's active saves leader.
- Junior catcher Zack Collins ranks third among the nation's active leaders in career home runs (41) & career RBI (181).
- On June 10, sophomore lefthander Michael Mediavilla became UM's first 11-game winner since Chris Hernandez in 2008.

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams in his 23rd season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in both 2008 and 2014.

In his 22-plus season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including back-to-back years in 2015 and 2016.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13-straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - 23 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,031-417-3 (.711) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,535-661-4 (.698) Division I record in 33 years as a head coach.

Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 37 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,665-700-4 (.703) mark.


In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 22 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. A walk-off grand slam from junior Willie Abreu gave Morris his 1,500th.

In 2015, Morris led the Hurricanes to their second straight ACC Coastal Division title, the 24th College World Series appearance in program history, and reached the 50-win mark for the 12th time in his 22 seasons.

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history. The conference win total set a new record for the program and tied the ACC's all-time single-season win total.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. The Hurricanes, who have never missed the Atlantic Coast Conference Championship since joining the ACC in 2004, qualified for their 10th straight conference tournament under Morris and earned a Regional host spot for their 42nd consecutive postseason trip.



Morris has reached a number of other coaching milestones in his time in Coral Gables. His 1,000th Division-I game on April 4, 2004, at his old stomping grounds at Georgia Tech. He also achieved another milestone during the 2004 season, winning his 500th game at the helm of the Miami program. Morris' 500th win came just a few weeks following his 1,000th overall win as a Division-I head coach by beating Florida State 7-3 on April 17.

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), and Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston). Several more Hurricanes during the Morris tenure are right on the cusp of making the show, including Mike Rodriguez (Houston), David Gil (Cincinnati) and Jon Jay (St. Louis). Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

FINAL 2016 ACC STANDINGS

BACK HOME IN OMAHA

- Miami has an all-time record of 48-40 (.545) in the College World Series, with its 48 wins and 88 total games played both ranking fourth-most in CWS history.
- Miami has qualified for the College World Series 13 times in head coach Jim Morris' 23-year tenure at the helm; UM made it to Omaha 12 times in Hall of Fame coach Ron Fraser's 30 seasons.

FEELING SUPER

- Miami won Game 1 (12-7) and Game 3 (9-4) of the Coral Gables Super Regional against Boston College to clinch one of eight spots in the 2016 College World Series. The Canes lost Game 2 to BC 5-3.
- With its best-of-three series victory, the Hurricanes improved to 18-11 all-time in the NCAA Super Regional round, including a 14-2 record at Mark Light Field in Super Regional games.
 - UM batted .375 with six homers & 24 runs scored in three games.
- Miami has never missed the College World Series when named a national seed, having made the field of eight in 1999, 2001, 2003, 2004, 2008, 2015 and 2016.

REGIONAL CHAMPS AGAIN

- Miami topped No. 4 Stetson 4-2 in its Coral Gables Regional opener and beat No. 3 Long Beach State on back-to-back nights (4-3, 9-8) to advance to the second weekend of the postseason.
 - The regional championship was Miami's 29th all-time title.
- Miami placed five players on the Coral Gables Regional All Tournament team: outfielders Willie Abreu & Carl Chester, shortstop Brandon Lopez, catcher Zack Collins & pitcher Danny Garcia.
 - Chester was named the regional's **Most Outstanding Player**.





COLLEGE WORLD SERIES NEWS & NOTES

SEVEN CANES SELECTED IN MLB DRAFT

- Miami had seven players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft.
- Zack Collins (first round, Chicago White Sox), Willie Abreu (sixth round, Colorado), Bryan Garcia (sixth round, Detroit), Brandon Lopez (10th round, Minnesota), Danny Garcia (15th round, Seattle), Jacob Heyward (18th round, San Franciso) and Johnny Ruiz (28th round, Houston) were all drafted from June 9-11.
- Collins became UM's first first-rounder since Yasmani Grandal was drafted No. 12 overall by Cincinnati in 2010.

ACC REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

- For the second time in a span of three seasons and for the third time in history, Miami won the ACC Regular Season Championship.
- The Hurricanes clinched the title during a doubleheader at Florida State. Miami won its third straight ACC Coastal Division title on May 15 during its series finale with Pitt at Mark Light Field.
- The division crown was the fourth all-time for Miami, who have also claimed titles in 2008, 2014 and 2015.

ALL-AMERICA HONORS

- Junior catcher Zack Collins was named to the Baseball America All-America First Team last week, marking Miami's second straight vear with at least one first-team selection; David Thompson was named a consensus first-team All-American in 2015.
- Collins is the **16th Hurricane** to earn first-team honors from BA.
- Freshman reliever Frankie Bartow was recognized with Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America honors by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper.

DEFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST

- In the newest NCAA Division I statistics released June 14. Miami had the second-best fielding percentage in the country at .982.
 - Miami has made just 41 errors, compared to 90 by opponents.
- The Hurricanes' starting infield of third baseman Edgar Michelangeli (3), shortstop Brandon Lopez (5), second baseman Johnny Ruiz (8) and first baseman Christopher Barr (2) have combined for just 18 errors.

MIAMI RANKED IN TOP THREE OF EVERY POLL

- The Hurricanes were ranked as high as No. 2 in the final polls before postseason were released on May 30; Miami was ranked No. 2 by D1Baseball and NCBWA and No. 3 by Baseball America, Perfect Game, Collegiate Baseball Newspaper & the USA TODAY Coaches Poll.
- Miami was ranked No. 1 in five of six polls released Monday, April 25 - marking the first time the Hurricanes were No. 1 in back-to-back weeks (April 18, April 25) since June 3, 2008 and June 10, 2008.

ALONE AT THE TOP

- Junior closer Bryan Garcia set the Miami record with the 40th save of his career on May 26 vs NC State. His 18 saves are the most in the ACC and second-most in the nation.
- 43 career saves are the most by any active pitcher in the nation and tied for ninth-most in Division I history.
- Garcia moved past Rick Raether (1984-86) into sole possession of second place (38) with a save against Florida State in Game 1 of the series, and tied Georgia Huguet (2001-2004) for first in Game 2 (39).

COLLINS, GARCIA AWARD CANDIDATES

- Juniors Zack Collins and Bryan Garcia were among the 60 players named to the midseason watch list for the 2016 Golden Spikes Award on April 20; Collins was named a semifinalist on June 1.
- On May 20, both Collins and Garcia were named among 43 semifinalists for the **2016 Dick Howser Trophy**.
- Collins (**Johnny Bench**) and Garcia (**Stopper of the Year**) are also major award finalists for their respective positions catcher & closer.

MEDIAVILLA SHINING IN ROTATION

- With a win over Boston College in the NCAA Super Regional round on June 10, **Michael Mediavilla** became Miami's first 11-game winner on the hill since Chris Hernandez in **2008**.
- Mediavilla was a Freshman All-America relief pitcher in 2015.

MORRIS EARNS MILESTONE WIN IN STYLE

 With a walk-off grand slam by junior Willie Abreu vs. Louisville on March 18, Miami head coach Jim Morris became just the sixth coach in history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win milestone.

COLLINS AMONG TOP HITTERS NATIONWIDE

- Entering the 2016 College World Series, **Zack Collins** ranks among the nation's most productive active players; he is third in career homers (41), third in career RBI (181) and first in career walks (174).
- Collins has continued his ascent into the Miami record books; he is alone in **seventh** in career homers and alone in **10th** in career RBI. His 75 walks are tied for **third-most** in a single season at Miami, while his 174 career walks are **fourth-most** in UM history.

SENIOR SHINES AT THE PLATE

- Entering the College World Series, senior **Brandon Lopez** ranks second in the ACC with a .385 batting average and has been among Miami's top contributors at the plate in his final year.
- Known more for his glove during his first three years, Lopez has set career highs in hits (79), doubles (13), home runs (two) & RBI (42).

USA TODAY TABS MIAMI #3 PROGRAM

• In a ranking of Division I baseball programs by "athletic competitiveness, academic quality, return on investment and leadership," Miami was ranked the No. 3 program in America by USA Today.

MIDWEEK WARRIORS

 Miami finished the year 12-1 in midweek games, including a 10-1 home mark. UM beat FGCU 8-3 in its final midweek game on May 17.

WALK-OFF WILLIE

- Junior right fielder Willie Abreu earned the nickname "Walk Off Willie" after connecting on walk-off home runs on back-to-back Friday nights vs. Louisville (March 18) and Clemson (March 25).
- Abreu's first walk-off was a grand slam against Cardinals All American closer Zack Burdi, the second shot was a two-run HR vs. Clemson.
 - Miami has six walk-off wins, including three via homer, in 2016.

HAPPY HOMECOMING FOR HEYWARD

- · Largely thanks to a career day from junior Jacob Heyward, Miami won its rubber game with host Georgia Tech at Russ Chandler Stadium Monday, May 9 to secure its tenth series victory of 2016.
- Heyward, a native of McDonough, Ga., had five RBI one shy of his career high - with a pair of two-RBI doubles and a solo home run.
- Heyward would continue his flare the following weekend at home, crushing a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11th to seal a series victory over Pittsburgh on May 14.

CANES HAND CARDS 1ST ACC SERIES LOSS

- By capturing the **first two games** of a weekend series against #4 Louisville (8-4 in Game 1, 6-3 in Game 2) from March 18-20, Miami handed UofL its first ACC series loss since joining te conference.
- UM finished 21-7 in ACC play through 10 weekends, winning nine of a possible 10 ACC series in 2016.

MIAMI HANDS #1 FLORIDA FIRST LOSS

• Miami dropped two of three in its weekend series with No. 1 Florida at Mark Light Field from Feb. 26-28; the Hurricanes won Game 2 by a final score of 5-3, but dropped Games 1 and 3.

HIGH EXPECTATIONS

- Miami was ranked in the top 10 in preseason polls from nearly every major college baseball outlet, including a No. 4 ranking from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper and a No. 6 ranking from several outlets.
- Miami's preseason ranking of No. 4 from Collegiate Baseball Newspaper was its highest from the publication since 2005; its No. 6 ranking from Baseball America was its highest from BA since 2007.

MIAMI ADDS ANOTHER MAJOR LEAGUER

- Arizona Diamondbacks slugger Peter O'Brien became the 53rd former University of Miami player to play in Major League Baseball when he was called up late in 2015.
- O'Brien joined a group that now includes Oakland A's teammates Yonder Alonso and Danny Valencia, San Diego Padres outfielder Jon Jay & infielder Jemile Weeks, Dodgers All-Star Yasmani Grandal, new D-Back Chris Herrmann, and Milwaukee All-Star Ryan Braun.
- Miami had five players selected in the 2015 MLB Draft: lefthander Andrew Suarez, third baseman David Thompson, infielder George Iskenderian, catcher Garrett Kennedy and outfielder Ricky Eusebio.

DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON

- The Miami Hurricanes extended their own college baseball record with a 44th consecutive trip to the NCAA postseason in 2016. Miami has made the postseason each year since 1973.
- The Hurricanes' 44 straight trips to the NCAA postseason are the longest active postseason streak of any Division I program in any sport nationwide.
- Miami's 25 College World Series trips are the second-most of any program all-time, trailing only Texas.
- Jim Morris has led teams to the NCAA postseason in 32 straight years - all 23 years at Miami & final nine years at Georgia Tech.
- Miami is the only school in the state of Florida to have won a national championship; UM won titles in 1982, 1985, 1999 & 2001.
