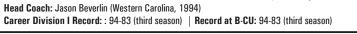

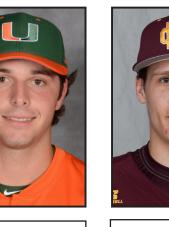

### **3 JIM MORRIS**

### **HEAD COACH**

### THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

1999 & 2001 National Coach of the Year (*Collegiate Baseball*) 1999 & 2001 National Coach of the year (*ABCA*) 1994 Coach of the Year (*Baseball America*) 2008 ACC Coach of the Year

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 927-360-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,431-627-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,562-667-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

### MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 30th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2014 when he guided the Canes to one of 16 host sites for the 2014 postseason. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 21 seasons (1994-2014), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2014 Hurricanes to their 42nd-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top-five recruiting class by national publications.

### MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001.



### MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

### NCAA REGIONAL NEWS & NOTES...

### DEATH, TAXES & THE NCAA POSTSEASON...

• After posting a 41-17 overall record (including its run at the 2014 ACC Championship in Greensboro, N.C.), as well as a 24-6 mark in ACC play and an ACC Regular Season Championship, Miami was named one of 16 Regional host sites for the 2014 NCAA postseason.

• The Coral Gables Regional will mark Miami's 25th time as host in the postseason, and its 42nd consecutive postseason trip - the longest active streak in Division I athletics. Miami's 43 total NCAA appearances is the third-most of any program nationwide (Texas -56, Florida State - 52).

• Miami has an all-time record of 117-43 (.731) in the Regional round, including a 1-2 mark in the Louisville Regional in 2013. Miami's all-time mark in the postseason stands at an impressive 178-91 (.662).

### **CONFERENCE CROWN...**

• Miami ended the season as the hottest college baseball team in the nation - with wins in 27 of its last 30 regular season games - and captured its second ACC Regular Season Championship by defeating North Carolina in two of three games in its final home set.

 By winning two of three games against the Tar Heels, the Hurricanes set a new program record for ACC victories (24) and tied the all-time ACC record in the same category. Only three other ACC teams had ever won 24 league games in a season: Florida State twice

(2008, 2012) and Clemson (2006). Miami earned two top conference awards: catcher Zack Collins was named 2014 ACC Freshman of the Year and starter Chris Diaz was named ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year. In addition, seven players earned 2014 All-ACC recognition.

### TALE OF TWO SEASONS...

• Miami went 13-12 (.520) in its first 25 games of the regular season, including just a 5-4 mark (.555) in its first three ACC series.

• The Hurricanes reeled off wins in 27 of its last 30 in the regular season, including a 19-2 mark in its final seven conference weekends. The impressive stretch also included four ACC three-game road sweeps - the first time since 2005 the feat has been accomplished.

 Miami did not lose an ACC series after dropping two of three at home to Virginia (March 22-24). The Hurricanes reeled off 10 ACC wins in a row during its overall 14-game winning streak - a new record.

• The Hurricanes' previous best record in league play came in 2008, when it finished 23-5 and earned a No. 1 seed at the ACC Championship in Jacksonville, Fla.

### SEVEN NAMED ALL-ACC...

 In addition to Freshman of the Year and Co-Pitcher of the Year awards, seven Hurricanes earned All-ACC recognition in the conference's annual awards.

• Chris Diaz, named ACC Co-Pitcher of the Year, was the only representative on the All-ACC first team. But fellow starters Bryan Radziewski (second team) and Andrew Suarez (third team) were also recognized.

• Dale Carey (second team), Zack Collins (third team) and Willie Abreu (third team) were recognized in the field, while closer Bryan Garcia earned a second-team nod at relief pitcher.

### NCAA REGIONAL NEWS & NOTES

### MILESTONES FOR MORRIS...

• Head coach Jim Morris became just the eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball to accumulate 1,400 wins when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8.

• Two weeks later, Morris won his 900th game with the Hurricanes in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. Morris ranks second in wins in Miami history behind the late Ron Fraser (1,267).

• Morris ranks fourth among active Division I coaches in career victories (1,432) and eighth all-time in the category. He is also the second-winningest coach in ACC history.

### **DIAZ DOMINATION...**

• The Hurricanes won every one of Chris Diaz' regular season starts in 2014, but fell in his ACC Championship tilt against Clemson in Greensboro, N.C. (May 22).

• Diaz allowed two earned runs or less in 12 of his 15 starts this spring, including a recent stretch of eight straight (March 22 -May 9). In his two seasons as a starter, he has yielded two earned runs or less in 24 of his 31 starts.

• Diaz picked up his fourth win over a ranked opponent this season in a 5-2 victory over then-No. 20 Clemson (April 25). The Florida City, Fla., native has earned a decision in nine of his 15 starts and ranks second in the ACC with nine wins (9-0). He ranks 12th in the ACC with a 2.31 ERA.

• His 2014 record includes wins over No. 3 Florida (2/14), No. 4 FSU (2/28), No. 8 Virginia (3/22), then-No. 25 NC State (3/28) and then-No. 20 Clemson (4/25). Miami had not lost a game started by Diaz since May 24, 2013 until falling against Clemson on May 22, 2014 - a stretch of 363 days.

### **#CARDIACCANES...**

• Miami is 14-3 in one-run games in 2014, including wins in a road sweep of Virginia Tech (April 4+5), an extra-innings win over Pittsburgh (April 12), a recent come-from-behind victory over Duke (April 11), a 16-inning marathon over North Carolina (May 16) and an ACC Tournament victory over Duke (May 24).

• Through 58 games (41-17), the Hurricanes have scored 151 of their 319 runs (47.33%) in the sixth inning or later. Miami is 12-9 when its opponent scores first and have played seven extra inning games (5.2).

• Senior captain Tyler Palmer has often come through for the Hurricanes, and delivered a game-winning two-RBI single in the bottom of the 16th against North Carolina on May 16.

### **@UMOUTLAWS HEATING UP...**

• Senior OF Dale Carey is hitting a team-best .500 over the past five games with team-high totals of nine hits and four runs. He went 8-for-13 at the ACC Championship (.615), earning a spot on the ACC All-Tournament Team.

• Freshman OF Jacob Heyward went a career-best 3-for-4 with two runs, including the game-winner in the top of the 12th, in a 6-5 win over Duke at the 2014 ACC Championship.

 Senior OF Tyler Palmer is hitting .333 over the last 15 games with 20 hits and 10 RBI. He has a team-high six doubles over that span.

### NCAA REGIONAL NEWS & NOTES...

### **POWER SURGE...**

• Miami ranks eighth in the ACC with 23 home runs after hitting iust 14 in all of 2013. Freshman Zack Collins leads the team and is tied for **second** in the **ACC** with **nine homers**, while **Dale Carev** ranks second on the team and seventh in the ACC with seven.

• The Hurricanes (102) are one of just five teams in the ACC that will enter the week with 100 or more doubles, joining Clemson (111), Florida State (110), Georgia Tech (107) and Maryland (103).

• The offense has four multi-homerun games this season (after recording just two in all of 2013): games one and two against Florida (Feb. 21 & 22), game one against Georgia Tech (March 14) and game three against NC State (March 30). Miami is 4-0 when hitting more than one home run.

• Zack Collins recorded the first multi-home run game for the Hurricanes since Peter O'Brien accomplished the feat in 2012 in Miami's 12-5 win over NC State (March 30). He drove in six runs in the win.

### **CONFERENCE CONFIDENCE** ...

• Despite playing in one of the toughest college baseball conferences in the nation, the Hurricanes managed to perform well against teams from the ACC compared to their nonconference counterparts.

• Miami's team ERA in conference play was second-best at 2.77 (3.10 overall), its defensive fielding percentage was second-best at .976 (.970 overall), and offensively Miami has generally managed to match its production (.262 overall/.257 ACC).

 Individually, Zack Collins has the seventh-best average among all ACC hitters in conference play (.320), while fellow freshman Bryan Garcia has the second-most saves of any reliever in ACC play (11).

### **THE 300 CLUB...**

• Redshirt junior Bryan Radziewski became just the 13th pitcher in Miami history to record 300 career strikeouts during his start against then-No. 20 Clemson (April 27).

 Radziewski (324) is in sole possession of seventh place in program history after recording 23 over his last four starts: seven against Alabama State (May 4), four against Duke (May 11) six against North Carolina (May 17) and six more against Duke (May 24).

 Radziewski became the first pitcher to breach the 300-strikeout plateau since lefthander Chris Hernandez accomplished the feat in 2010.

### **CALLED UP CANES...**

• Miami's current nine Major League players are the second-most of any school in the ACC (North Carolina) and the fourth-most of any program nationwide. The Hurricanes trail, Arizona State (11), Long Beach State (10) and UNC (10) in Major League players.

• Seven former Miami Hurricanes found themselves on 2014 MLB Opening Day rosters: Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Rvan Braun (Milwaukee), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Los Angeles Dodgers), Gaby Sanchez (Pittsburgh) and Danny Valencia (Kansas City).

• Jemile Weeks (Baltimore) and Chris Herrmann (Minnesota) were called up from AAA within the first two weeks of the season.

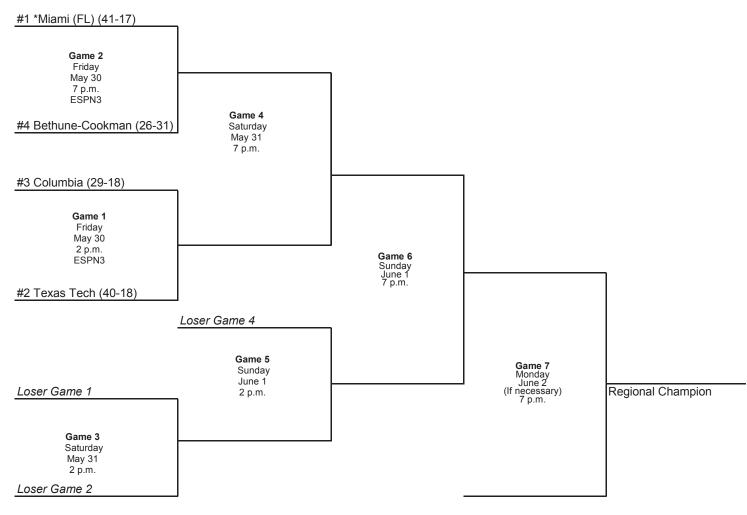


