## FLORIDA STATE PLAYS HOST TO MIAMI AT DONALD L. TUCKER CENTER

Florida State, which has won four of its last five games, plays host to Miami on Sunday, February 14, 2016 at 6:30 at the Donald L. Tucker Center in Tallahassee in the second meeting of the season between the two ACC schools from the state of Florida. The game between the Seminoles and the Hurricanes will be televised nationally as part of the wildly successful ACC Sunday Night Basketball series on ESPNU. The Seminoles have won four of their last five conference games with victories over Boston College (Jan. 26; 72-62), Clemson (Jan. 30; 76-65), NC State (Feb. 1; 77-73) and Wake Forest (Feb. 6, 91-71) as they have improved their ACC record to 6-6 after beginning league play with an 0-3 record. Florida State enters Sunday's game against Miami with an 8-2 record at home with victories over Clemson and NC State in its two most recent home games. The Seminoles have three ACC wins at home with a victory over No. 11 Virginia (Jan. 17, 69-62) on its resume. Following Sunday's game against Miami, the Seminoles play host to Georgia Tech (Feb. 17; 9:00 p.m.) before travelling to play at Virginia Tech (Feb. 20; 3:00 p.m.) and Duke (Feb. 25; 7:00 p.m.) to close out the road portion of their ACC schedule.

## SEMINOLE COACHES SUPPORTING COACHING FOR LITERACY

Members of Florida State's coaching staff are wearing bright green wristbands and lapel pins in support of Coaching for Literacy, a program designed to raise awareness about illiteracy in America and also generate financial support for effective, local literacy programs. Florida State has joined forces with 17 other NCAA schools and the Washington Wizards as a partner of the Coaching for Literacy and its Assistant Coach Program. The program achieves the mission of the organization by permitting individuals to receive an all-access fan experience in exchange for a donation to a local literacy initiative. The Seminole men's basketball program and the Early Learning Coalition of the Big Bend Region have joined forces to raise awareness about the number of people who are functionally or totally illiterate in the United States.

## FRESHMAN SENSATION BEASLEY CHASING ACC RECORD

Freshman sensation Malik Beasley enters Sunday's game against Miami having scored in double figures in the first 24 games of his career – a streak that is only two games away from tying an ACC record for freshman. Former Georgia Tech great Stephon Marbury scored in double figures in the first 26 games of his career during the 1996 season. Beasley who is averaging 17.1 points scored per game, has scored in double figures in each of his first 24 games as a Seminoles and is tied with former Duke All-American Jahliil Okafor (the third overall selection in the 2015 NBA Draft) for consecutive double figure games to begin his collegiate career. Beasley scored 14 points against Syracuse on Thursday night at the Carrier Dome to vault past a pair of All-Americans – Joe Smith of Maryland and Johnny Dawkins of Duke – who both scored in double figures in the first 23 games of their careers.

## LEONARD HAMILTON AMONG ALL-TIME ACC COACHING GREATS

Florida State's Leonard Hamilton, the ACC Coach of the Year in 2009 and 2012, is the winningest coach in school history, is the 10<sup>th</sup> winningest all-time coach in ACC history (with 252 all-time victories at Florida State, is the 11<sup>th</sup> all-time winningest coach for career ACC victories (ACC regular season and ACC Tournament) with 113 and is the ninth all-time winningest ACC road game coach in ACC history (38). Hamilton needs 13 overall wins to surpass Frank McGuire of North and South Carolina who won 264 career games; needs only five victories to surpass Norm Sloan of NC State with win 117 career ACC games and needs only five ACC road wins to surpass Lefty Driesell of Maryland who won 42 career ACC road games.

...Defeat No. 11/12 Miami and gain its second victory of the season over a nationally ranked team. The Seminoles defeated No. 11 Virginia (which has been ranked as high as No. 4 this season) at the Donald L. T. Center (69-62) on Jan. 17;

...Defeat Miami in Tallahassee for the second consecutive and defeat the Hurricanes for the eighth time in the last 10 meetings at home. The Seminoles defeated Miami six consecutive times in Tallahassee from 2007 through 2012.

**FLORIDA STATE'S WIN TOTAL IN THE LAST 11 YEARS**

Florida State is the third winningest program in the ACC in the last 11 years (since the start of the 2005-06 season) in total games played with 229 wins. The Seminoles average 20.0 wins per season with records of 20-10 (2005-06), 22-13 (2006-07), 19-15 (2007-08), 25-10 (2008-09), 22-10 (2009-10), 23-11 (2010-11), 25-10 (2011-12), 18-16 (2012-13), 22-14 (2013-14), 17-16 (2014-15) and 16-8 (2015-16).

**FLORIDA STATE GETTING IT DONE ON THE DEFENSIVE END**

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Miami ranked second in the ACC in steals with 180 and a 7.5 steals per game average. The Seminoles totaled 10 steals and a 28-19 points off of turnover advantage in their game against Syracuse on Thursday night. It marked the seventh time this season the Seminoles have earned 10 or more steals in a game with their season high of 13 steals coming in their victory over VCU (Dec. 6; 76-71) and their ACC season-high of 13 steals coming in their win over Clemson (Feb. 1; 76-65). Florida State ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in the ACC with a 5.5 steals per game average during the 2014-15 season.

**FLORIDA STATE'S IMPROVED DEFENSE**

Florida State enters Sunday's game against Miami with 180 steals and a 5.5 steals per game average and needs only two steals to surpass their steals total from the 2014-15 season (181). The Seminoles enters Saturday's game with 100 blocked shots for the 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive season and have blocked at least one shot in each of their 24 games this season. Florida State blocked nine shots in their victory over Clemson on Feb. 1 and totaled eight blocked shots in their victories over VCU and Florida Atlantic (Dec. 19; 64-59).

**FLORIDA STATE FROM THE 3-POINT LINE**

Florida State, which has made at least five 3-point field goals in each of its last nine games and in 20 of its 24 games this season, enters Sunday's game against Miami with 154 3-point field goals made and have already surpassed its total from the entire 2014-15 season. The Seminoles made 147 3-point shots during the entire season a year ago. Florida State averages nearly two additional made 3-point field goals made this season as compared to last season.

Florida State is shooting .361 and averaging 8.7 made 3-point field goals in their last three games including victories over NC State (Feb. 1) and Wake Forest (Feb. 6). The Seminoles tied their season high with 10 3-point field goals made in their 91-71 victory at Wake Forest.

**SEMINOLES SCORING**

Florida State, which has earned three of its last four ACC wins by double digits enters Sunday's game against Miami averaging 78.7 points scored per game. It's the first time the Seminoles have averaged 78 or more points per game since the 1992-93 season when they averaged 86.3 points per game in advancing to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament. The Seminoles fell one game short of advancing the NCAA Final Four for the second time in school history.

**SEMINOLES REACH 90 POINTS AGAINST WAKE FOREST**

Florida State scored its ACC season-high of 91 points in its 91-71 victory over Wake Forest on Feb. 6 in Winston-Salem. It marked the sixth time the Seminoles have scored at least 90 points in a games this season (109 vs. Nicholls State, 98 vs. Jacksonville, 91 against Wake Forest, 90 against Ohio, 90 against Southeastern Louisiana, 90 against North Carolina and 91 against Wake Forest). The Seminoles have scored at least 90 points more times this season (six) than they did during the 2012-13 (once), 2013-14 (three times) and 2014-15 (once) seasons – combined.

**FLORIDA STATE GOES TO THE OFFENSIVE GLASS AGAINST SYRACUSE**

Led by four offensive rebounds by Boris Bojanovsky against Syracuse on Thursday night, the Seminoles earned 17 offensive rebounds and earned an 18-14 advantage on second chance points against the Orange. The Seminoles offensive rebound total of 18 was their second highest of the season behind only 19 against Iowa (Dec. 2)

**FLORIDA STATE VS. MIAMI – THE LAST GAME**

Sheldon McClellan scored 20 of his 21 points in the second half, and No. 12 Miami beat Florida State 72-59 on Jan. 9, 2016 at the BankUnited Center in Coral Gables. Ja'Quan Newton had 13 points for the Hurricanes. Davon Reed added 12 points. Reed went 3 for 3 from 3-point range to help Miami to a 32-24 halftime lead. He went 0 for 8 from beyond the arc in his three previous games, McClellan missed all four of his field-goal attempts in the first half, and then took over. He went 7 for 7 in the second half, including two 3s. Miami center Tonye Jekeri had eight points, 10 rebounds and perhaps the play of the game on a dunk with 14:49 left in the first half. Malik Beasley had 13 points, Dwayne Bacon finished with 10 points, and Rathan-Mayes had four assists for Florida State.

**MALIK BEASLEY IS...**

...Freshman sensation Malik Beasley is the ONLY freshman in the ACC who is ranked in the top 10 in both the field goal shooting (tied for eighth, .500) and free throw (seventh, .842) categories in the ACC Statistics;

...Freshman sensation Malik Beasley the ONLY freshman in the ACC who is shooting 50 percent or better from the field (.500), AND 40 percent or better from the 3-point line (.419) AND 80 percent or better from the free throw line (.842). He is one of only two players in the ACC (regardless of class) who is a 50-40-80 shooter. Only Sheldon McClellan of Miami comes close to matching Beasley's shooting numbers. McClellan is shooting .534 from the field, .402 from the 3-point line and .867 from the free throw line.

**BOOKERT IS WHITE HOT FROM THE 3-POINT LINE IN ACC PLAY**

Senior Devon Bookert, who is one of the most lethal 3-point shooters in the ACC, enters Sunday's game against Miami ranked second in the ACC (in conference games only) with a .509 3-point shooting percentage. He has made 29 of 57 3-point shots in ACC play and trails Virginia's London Perrantes by one one-hundredth of a percentage point entering this weekend's schedule of ACC games.

**DEVON BOOKERT FROM THE 3-POINT LINE...**

...Devon Bookert has made at least one 3-point field goal in a career-high 13 straight games and is shooting .500 from the bonusphere (32 of 64) since a three of seven performance in Florida State's victory over Florida on Dec. 29;

...Devon Bookert scored his 1,000<sup>th</sup> career point on Feb. 6 against Wake Forest. His 1,000<sup>th</sup> point came on – what else – a 3-point shot. He has made 327 career field goals with 170 (.519 percent) of his career field goals coming as 3-point shots.

...Devon Bookert is ranked second in the ACC (in conference games only) with a .509 3-point field goal shooting percentage (29 of 57). He is one of only two players since ACC play began in late December to shoot .500 or better from the 3-point line;

**Devon Bookert** – “Growing up I wore No. 11. After I lost a couple of family members who were among my biggest supporters as a person and a basketball player, I felt that part of me was missing so I chose to wear No. 1 instead of No. 11.”

**Benji Bell** – “I wear No. 3 at Florida State as a tribute to my brother who passed away in 2007. I wore No. 22 at Northwest Florida because my brother also wore that number and it’s the date of my mom’s birthday (July 22). In addition to wearing No. 22 (currently worn at Florida State by Xavier Rathan-Mayes) my brother also wore No. 3 in high school and during his days playing AAU basketball.”

**Dwayne Bacon** – “I wear the No. 4 because that’s my favorite basketball number. There is no significance – it’s just the number I am most comfortable wearing.”

**Malik Beasley** – “I wear No. 5 at Florida State because I want to carry on the success from my high school career. Also my dad wore No. 10 when he played professionally and we are very, very close. I’m like his other half so I chose to wear No. 5.”

**Terance Mann** – “I wear No. 14 because that’s the number my mom wore when she played at Georgetown. It’s also the date of my grandmother’s birthday – December 14.”

**Boris Bojanovsky** – “I used to wear No. 8 but when I moved to Spain the No. 8 jersey was too small for me – so I was give the biggest jersey and it was No. 15 and I just stuck with it. I like the number and my birthday just happens to be on April 15 so I quickly liked the number even more because of that.”

**Xavier Rathan-Mayes** – “I wear No. 22 because that’s the number my father Tharon wore when he played at Florida State. I have always wanted to follow in his footsteps; I always wanted to break the records he set wearing the same number he wore as a Seminole. “

**Jarquez Smith** – “I wore No. 22 I high school because every male in my family that was has played basketball has worn that number. I switched to No. 23 this year because that’s the closest to 22, which is my family’s number.”

**Montay Brandon** – “I switched to No. 32 after my freshman year (from No. 5) to honor my best friend Josh Level who passed away on February 19, 2013. He wore No. 32 throughout high school and AAU ball. We became friends when I was nine years old we played for the same AAU team.”

In one of greatest scoring exhibitions in college basketball history, Florida State guard Xavier Rathan-Mayes scored 30 points in a span of 4:38 on Feb. 25, 2015 in the second half of Miami’s 81-77 victory over the Seminoles. At one point during the run, Rathan-Mayes did not miss a single shot -- 6-for-6 on 3-pointers, two layups and four made free throws -- for 26 points in a 3:35 span. He finished the game with 35 points. "One of the greatest shooting performances I have ever seen," Miami’s Jim Larrañaga said after the game.

### RATHAN-MAYES’ IMPROVED FREE THROW NUMBERS

Sophomore Xavier Rathan-Mayes enters Sunday’s game against Miami ranked second on the team and 10<sup>th</sup> in the ACC with a .813 free throw shooting percentage. He has improved his free throw shooting percentage by nearly 12 percentage points this season as compared to the 2014-15 season.

### SMITH’S RECENT BLOCKING SPREE HAS HIM IN THE SEMINOLES’ ALL-TIME TOP 20

Junior Jarquez Smith has 13 blocked shots in the last six games (2.2 bpg) and enters Sunday’s game against Miami tried for 17<sup>th</sup> in school history with 84 career blocked shots. He blocked a season high of five shots in Florida State’s victory over Boston College (Jan. 26) and added three blocked shots in the Seminoles’ victory over NC State (Feb. 1). Smith is averaging one blocked shot per game and needs only blocked shot to surpass Anthony Richardson (84 career blocked shots; 2002-05) and two blocked shots to surpass Jerome Fitchett (85 blocked shots, 1985-88) to move into 16<sup>th</sup> place for career blocked shots at Florida State.

### SMITH AT HIS BEST IN THE ACC

Junior Jarquez Smith totaled a near double double of 13 points and nine rebounds to go along with five blocked shots in Florida State’s victory over Boston College (Jan. 26) for the best combined offensive and defensive performance in an ACC game during his career. His night against the Eagles bested a 15-point, six rebound and three blocked shot performance against Georgia Tech during his junior season.

### NOTING MONTAY BRANDON

Following his 13-point and six rebound performance in Florida State’s victory over Wake Forest on Jan. 6, senior Montay Brandon is averaging 7.3 points scored (as compared to his 4.0 points per game scoring average for the 2015-16 season) and 4.0 rebounds (as compared to his 3.4 rebounds per game average for the 2015-16 season) while shooting .583 from the field (seven of 12) (as compared to his .464 shooting percentage for the entire season) in the last three games.
