STORYLINES

QUICK HITS

- This is the 96th season of Northeastern men's basketball. Northeastern has an all-time record of 1,158-1,071 (.520) in 2,229 games.
- Northeastern will face its first ranked opponent during the regular season since taking on #RV/24 VCU on Nov. 29, 2013, a 66-79 loss. The Rams were ranked in the Coaches poll.
- The Huskies are facing their first opponent ranked in the AP poll during the regular season since taking on Connecticut on Dec. 6, 2006.
- Northeastern faced, and nearly knocked off, AP No. 11 Notre Dame last season in the second round of the NCAA Tournament on March 19, 2015.
- The Huskies earned their first win over an ACC foe last season defeating Florida State 76-73 in Tallahassee.
- Miami and Northeastern have met two times in history, both in Coral Gables
- Two Huskies hail from Florida, brothers Quincy (R-Senior) and Sajon (Freshman)

- Ford. The Fords are natives of St. Petersburg, about a four-hour drive to Coral Gables.
- The Huskies are 362-244 (.597) all-time in conference play including a 104-74 (.584) record since joining the CAA in the 2005-06 season.
- The Huskies have amassed 12 regular season conference championships and eight tournament titles including last season's title which sent the Huskies to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 24 years.

A WIN WOULD....

- Improve the Huskies record to 5-1 for the second straight season
- Give the Huskies a two-game win streak over ACC opponents
- Mark the first win over Miami in three meetings, the first coming in the 1990-91 season.
- Snap a 19-game losing streak to AP ranked opponents dating back to 1986.
- Be the first win over a ranked team since the 1986-87 season, when NU knocked off No. 2 Louisville 88-84 at the Great Alaska Shootout.

HUSKIES IN FLORIDA

- The Huskies return to Florida for the second straight season, facing another ACC foe this time around.
- Last season, Northeastern headed to Tallahassee and defeated Florida State 76-73 on their home turf.
- The Huskies are 4-13 all-time in the state of Florida, 3-9 against teams from the state, 0-2 against Miami.
- Northeastern has played in four tournaments in the state including the Central Florida Tournament (Orlando), Florida Southern Festival (Lakeland), Hatter Classic (DeLand) and UCF Holiday Classic (Orlando).

SCOUTING THE HURRICANES

Six Hurricanes are averaging double figures on the season, including Tonye Jekiri who is averaging a double-double, 10.2 ppg and 10.0 rpg.

Miami is led by Sheldon McClellan who has scored 17.4 ppg through the first five contests. The entire starting lineup for the Hurricanes are averaging double-figures.

Miami has won each of its games by a 20.6 margin of victory and are shooting .519 from the field as a team.

THIS SEASON: Miami is off to a 5-0 start to the season and coming off of the Puerto Rico Tip Off Championship where they defeated two ranked teams en route to the title.

Jekiri was named the ACC Player of the Week for his efforts after being named to the TipOff All-Tournament team



In three games, the 7-footer averaged 13.3 points, 11.3 rebounds, 1.3 assists and 1.3 blocks in 28.0 minutes. He was 15-21 (71.4%) from the field and 10-11 (90.9%) at the line.

ALL-TIME SERIES: The two teams have met just two times in the past beginning the series in the 1990-91 season and last facing each other over 15 years ago on Nov. 25, 2000.

The Huskies hung tough with the Big East's Miami, but lost a tight 92-86 decision at Miami Arena.

Charles Cranford led the way with 20 points and 10 rebounds.

NU shot a blistering 67.9 percent (19-28) in the first half and trailed just 48-43 at the half. NU had a 21-16 lead, before the Hurricanes charged back to take the lead for good.

Jean Bain had a strong afternoon with 17 points and 11 assists. He is the first player since Halim Abdullah to record a double-figure assist total in a game for the Huskies. Abdullah had 10 against Drexel on March 5, 1994.

Miami was led by current Cleveland Cav James Jones and former NBA player John Salmons who each had 14 points on the day.

LAST TIME OUT

- Northeastern went 3-1 last week, falling for the first time on the season to host team Miami (OH) in the finale of the Men Against Breast Cancer Challenge.
- The Huskies were led by David Walker, Quincy Ford and Zach Stahl over the course of the weekend.
- Walker and Ford were named to the MABC Challenge All-Tournament team, while Walker was dubbed the MVP of the tournament after averaging 23.3 ppg over the course of the weekend.
- During that time Walker hit the 30-point mark for the first time in his career and was the first Husky to do so since Matt Janning dropped 34 at URI on Nov. 28, 2007.
- Ford finished game two with 18 points and a career-high 19 rebounds. The 19 rebounds were the most since Dan Callahan had 21 against Vermont on March 4, 1995.
- The double-double marked the fifth of Ford's career and first since Dec. 29, 2012. Ford has tallied double digits in each and every game this season.
- Stahl tallied double-digits in each game, including his third career double-double on a 20p-11r effort against Florida Atlantic.

MOVING ON UP

- Quincy Ford has improved from 23rd, where he began the season on the Northeastern all-time scoring chart, to 14th place with 1,211 career points.
- Ford has tallied 71 points this season. Up next for Ford is Joel Smith's 1,328 points.
- Walker began the year in 29th place, and with his 104 points this season, currently sits 23rd (recently passing Hall of Famer and current Providence assistant coach Andre LaFleur (1,143).
- The duo also finds themselves on the career 3-point field goals list while Ford can be found on the career blocks chart.

SETTING SCHOOL RECORDS

- Just two games into the season and the 2015-16 Huskies have broken a school record
- Forcing 24 Wentworth turnovers, the Huskies stole the ball away from the Leopards a school record 20 times
- The mark bests the previous record of 19 steals set against Connecticut on Nov. 25, 1996.

TIPPING POINT

- Kwesi Abakah has controlled every opening tip for the Huskies this season
- The 6-8 redshirt junior has helped the Huskies to control the ball and get on the board first three of the five games on the season.

FLORIDA TIES

- The Huskies have a couple of Florida natives on their roster in brothers Quincy and Sajon Ford.
- The Ford brothers are natives of St. Petersburg, Fla., a mere four hour ride to Coral Gables.
- Quincy and Sajon are two of 11 Ford siblings.

ALL AROUND THE COUNTRY

- Although Northeastern is located in Boston, Mass. in the northeastern part of the United States, the Huskies, and the starting lineup in particular, come from all around the country.
- The Northeastern roster is represented by eight different states, two of which are found in the northeast.
- Northeastern's starting lineup hails from five different states, Ohio, Texas, Florida, Minnesota and Georgia.

WALKER ON FIRE

- Senior David Walker has been on fire as of late
- He currently ranks 2nd in the conference and 35th in the country with his 20.8 ppg average.
- His 18 field goals made, tops the conference and ranks 18th in the nation.
- Walker began the season setting a new career high with 27 points against Boston University in a season opening, overtime victory over the crosstown rivals.
- This past weekend, in his return to his home state of Ohio, Walker could not be stopped.



- Walker averaged 23.3 points over the course of the weekend also collecting 11 rebounds, 11 assists and nine steals while shooting .561 from the field and .450 from behind the arc.
- Walker set a new career high against Lipscomb tallying 30-points, his first 30-point effort and the first for a Husky in nearly eight seasons.

HUSKIES VS. RANKED TEAMS

- Northeastern will be facing an AP ranked team during the regular season for the first time since the 2006-07 season.
- The last AP ranked team Northeastern faced during the regular season was at No. 19 Connecticut on Dec. 6, 2006, the third ranked team Northeastern faced that season.
- The last team ranked in any poll that the Huskies faced was #RV/24 VCU, who was ranked in the Coaches Poll and receiving votes in the AP poll on Nov. 29, 2013.
- Northeastern did face a ranked team last season when they took on AP No. 11 Notre Dame in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, a 65-69 loss on March 19, 2015.
- The Huskies are currently on a 19-game losing streak to AP ranked teams dating back to the 1986 season
- During that year, Northeastern knocked off the reigning national champions No. 2 Louisville in the Great Alaska Shootout, before falling to No. 10 Iowa in the tournament championship.
- The win propelled the Huskies to No. 19 in the AP rankings, the last time Northeastern was ranked in the AP poll.

Bill Coen, in his 10th season as head coach at Northeastern, continues to lead a basketball renaissance on Boston's Huntington Avenue.

In 2014-15, Coen guided Northeastern to the program's first Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) tournament title, and in turn, its first NCAA Tournament berth since 1991. The Huskies finished with a 23-12 record, the 23 wins the most since the 1986-87 season, and advanced to the CAA tournament championship game for the second straight season. The trip to the NCAA tournament was the Huskies' fourth postseason appearance in a six-year span. Coen led the Huskies to the nation's ninth-best shooting percentage (48.6) and the Huskies were a perfect 15-0 when shooting over 50 percent in 2014-15.

He has received high praise for the Huskies' success, earning National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 10 Co-Coach of the Year and U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) District I Coach of the Year honors, and also was named a finalist for the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award after the 2013-14 season.

With four starters returning for the 2015-16 campaign, Coen again has the Huskies poised for another championship run. Already one of the CAA's all-time winningest coaches, Coen is widely regarded for his ability to evaluate and develop talented players.

In his nine seasons at Northeastern, NU players have earned 26 All-CAA honors, including six First Team and six All-Rookie selections. Thirteen of Coen's former players have earned professional contracts and nine Huskies remain active in professional basketball.

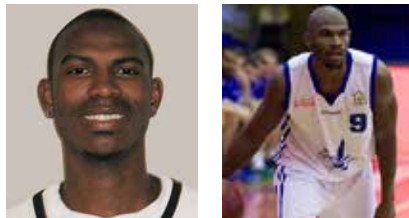

He finished his career fourth all-time in assists (430) for Northeastern and ninth in scoring (1,550). The sharp-shooter is fourth on NU's all-time 3-point field goals list, trailing only fellow pros J.J. Barea, Joel Smith, and Matt Janning and second in career steals (232) behind Andre LaFleur.



BENNET DAVIS
2004-07 • France

Davis finished his Husky career 18th on the career scoring list, totaling 1,185 points during his tenure on Huntington Avenue. He also ranks second in blocks (170) and ninth all-time in rebounds (757), leading the team in 2004-05 and in his senior season of 2006-07 when he also led the Huskies in scoring.



SCOTT EATHERTON
2013-15 • Italy

A two-time All-Conference, All-Defensive team, All-Tournament team and the 2014 CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Eatherton left his mark in the Husky record book in just two seasons on Huntington Ave. Led the team in scoring and rebounding in each of his seasons on campus and finished his career with the best shooting percentage in Northeastern history (56.6).



JONATHAN LEE
2010-13 • Lithuania

Lee's name appears throughout the Northeastern record books. He finished his career second all-time in career 3-point percentage (.404), fifth in career free throw percentage (.798), and 21st in career scoring (1,161). He holds the record for the all-time best single-season performance from 3-point range (.472) and registered the seventh-best single-season performance at the free throw line (.846). Lee also is tied for the single-game record for free throws made (18).



JOEL SMITH
2010-13 • Mexico

The shooting guard averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game as a senior and helped lead the Huskies to the CAA regular-season title. Smith was one of the best pure shooters in Northeastern history, and holds the single-season record for 3-pointers made (83). He ranks second in career 3-point field goals made, third in career 3-point percentage, and 13th in career scoring.



MATT JANNING

2007-10 • Turkey

Janning ranks fourth all time in NU scoring (1,836) behind the likes of Reggie Lewis, Jose Juan Barea and Pete Harris. Nearly a third of his career points came via the 3-pointer as he ranks third in 3-point field goals (223). A two-time All-CAA First Team selection, Janning helped lead Montepaschi Siena to the Italian League championship in his second pro season.



DINKO MARSHAVELSKI

2010-11, 13 • Bulgaria

Marshavelski played in 27 games in his final season at Northeastern. A proven scoring talent, he battled back from an ACL injury before his final season.



EUGENE SPATES

2007-09 • Qatar

Spates' names also appears in the NU record books. Most notably, he finished his career ranked 10th in career 3-pointers made (140) playing in two career postseason games with the Huskies in his final season on Huntington Ave. Spates, alongside Adako, helped Al Gharafa to win the Qatar Cup in 2014. Spates finished with 29 points in the final, sinking 22 3-pointers during the tournament.



BOBBY KELLY

2004-07 • Ireland (retired)

Kelly finished his career ranking second all-time in career 3-point field goal percentage (.380) turning in the fifth-best single-season 3-point field goal performance, shooting 44 percent in 2005-06. He was a captain of the 2006-07 squad—Coen's first at Northeastern.



NKEM OJOUGBOH

2008-10 • NBA D-League (retired)

Ojougboh finished his career with 849 points to rank 48th all time at Northeastern. He was better known for his rebounding prowess, leading the Huskies in rebounding in 2007-08, at 6.4 per game, and again in 2009-10, at 7.2 per game. He earned CAA All-Academic honors in back-to-back seasons.



REGGIE SPENCER

2011-15 • Italy

Over the course of his Northeastern career, Spencer took part in 125 games, starting 82 of them. He tallied 992 career points, 36th all-time on the Northeastern scoring leaders list and took down 648 rebounds over the course of his career, finishing as the Huskies rebound leader during his freshman and sophomore campaigns. His 77 career blocks rank 10th all-time on the career blocks list.

CATCHING UP WITH Matt Janning

I finished the year last year in Istanbul, Turkey on a lower note than what I wanted. We lost the league finals, but I have to look back and say it was a pretty good year for me personally. Team success, plus a good amount of individual success usually means you will continue moving forward. I made the tough decision to turn down some guaranteed money to stay and give the NBA another shot with Denver.

I got to Denver early August. Most teams will bring guys in around then to start going through individual workouts and some basic pickup games with whoever is around. It's a great way to get in shape for the actual training camp that lies ahead. We had a real good mix of the veteran guys as well as younger guys in the gym just about every day for three weeks. That, along with help from the coaching staff, really helped me prepare for training camp, the grind of NBA practices, and the preseason games.

Being able to workout and play alongside some great vets like Jameer Nelson, Randy Foye, Darrell Arthur, Mike Miller, and Danilo Gallinari, among others, was a great experience in itself. The best part is that you get to see how hard guys work to get their bodies and minds prepared for the long season. I tried to pick those guys' brains as much as I could and really learn the inner ropes of what it takes to not only be an NBA player, but maintain that level mentally and physically.

My situation in Denver was tough, as I knew there was a very slim chance of making their opening day roster. They had 16 contracts with at least some type of guarantee when we opened camp, and I was one of three non-guaranteed contracts. NBA allows 15 players on each roster. Each day I went into it and said I was going to do whatever it takes to outplay the guys in front of me, but also push them to make this team better.

And when it came down to it, I chose to take a deal with my new club, Hapoel Jerusalem. We play in the Israeli Winners League, which is the top league here in Israel, and we also compete in international competition, the Eurocup. This team is filled with some high level talent from both the states and Israel.

From home in Minneapolis to Denver, getting a chance to train at the USA Olympic training facility in Colorado Springs, playing and scoring in a preseason game against last year's NBA champions, the Golden State Warriors, and now continuing my journey and living in Jerusalem, Israel, my round trip experience that brought me back to Europe was something I'll always remember.

In this business; preparation is the key to success. I've prepared my whole life to play basketball, but getting the opportunity to attend Northeastern prepared me for 'life' as a basketball player. The high level education is something I pride myself on achieving. Walking away with a degree in business is something I hope to use when I am finished playing. More so, I pride myself in saying I played for such a great program.

Playing for Coach Coen opened my eyes to unlimited possibilities. He, along with the rest of the coaches, prepared us so well them at nothing surprises me now at this level. I look back at the college days and reminisce, but more importantly I am thankful for every day I was able to spend at NU. Northeastern prepared me to be a professional on and off the court.

The dream remains alive to get another shot at the NBA, but I sit back and look at the big picture: I'm fulfilling a million other dreams playing the same game.

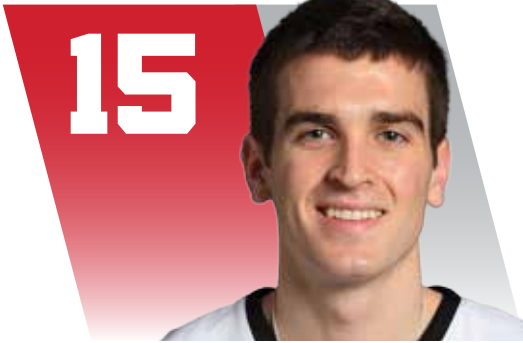

BOSTON - Led by David Walker's overtime heroics and career-high 27 points, the Northeastern men's basketball team defeated Boston University 87-84 at Case Gymnasium Friday night in its season opener.

The Huskies (1-0) and Terriers (0-1) forced a third-straight overtime game at "The Roof" (2011, 2009) where Caleb Donnelly, with 16 seconds remaining on the clock, hit a clutch three-pointer to give the Huskies an 87-84 lead and the eventual win. John Papale air balled the game-winning try for BU.
