

La Salle Explorers (9-2) at Miami Hurricanes (8-3)

NOTEWORTHY

• The Explorers (9-2) are off to their best start since the 1989-90 team started 10-1 with National Player of the Year Lionel Simmons. The 2005-06 squad also started 9-2. Only nine teams in program history have started better.



- Ramon Galloway and Sam Mills both played high school basketball in South Florida. Galloway, a Philadelphia native, spent his final two high school seasons at William T. Dwyer High School (90 minutes north of Miami). Mills is a Sunrise, Fla. native and played at Cardinal Gibbons HS (45 minutes north of Miami).
- La Salle has won six of its last eight road games.
- Ramon Galloway leads the A-10 in scoring at 18.4 ppg. while Tyreek Duren ranks sixth at 16.1.
- La Salle leads the A-10 and is ranked 30th nationally in three-point pct (.386). The Explorers are 2nd in the A-10 and 32nd in three-point FG/game (8.2).
- Ramon Galloway ranks third in A-10 and 13th nationally in three's/game (3.3). He is seventh in A-10 and 19th nationally in 3P Pct. (.456).
- La Salle is second in the A-10 with 11.4 turnovers/game and ranks 25th nationally.

THE OPPONENT

Miami comes into the game with a 8-3 record having lost two out of three at the Diamond Head Classic in Hawaii from December 22-25. The Hurricanes beat Hawaii before falling to Arizona and Indiana State. Durand Scott leads Miami in scoring at 15.6 ppg. followed by Shane Larkin (son of MLB Hall of Famer Barry) at 13.1 ppg.

THE SERIES

La Salle leads the all-time series 9-4, with all 13 meetings coming between 1951 and 1970. Complete series information can be found on page 3.

LAST TIME OUT

Senior Ramon Galloway, the Atlantic 10's top scorer, connected on six three-pointers on his way to a game-high 22 points as La Salle defeated Siena, 80-52, on Saturday night at the Times Union Center. Junior Tyreek Duren had 13 points while sophomore D.J. Peterson scored a career-high 11 for the Explorers, who continued their best start at 9-2 since the 1989-90 season. "I thought that was the best game we've played," head coach Dr. John Giannini said. "The reason I say that is that we were very good defensively and offensively, the numbers show that. It was just one of the nights where we started making three's and our effort was at a high level. I thought we played terrific."

Dr. John Giannini enters his ninth season as head coach at La Salle University in 2012-13 coming off a NIT berth and 21-win season a year ago.

AT LA SALLE

Giannini is La Salle's all-time winningest coach in Atlantic 10 play and has produced the program's only winning A-10 records since joining the league in 1995-96. He is also the winningest coach in the University of Maine's history. When he left Rowan University, Giannini was the winningest active NCAA Division III head coach.

He was introduced as the 18th head coach in the history of Explorer men's basketball on August 23, 2004. The late-summer appointment made recruiting efforts impossible, leaving Giannini with a team consisting of only a handful of available scholarship players for most of the season.

Giannini quickly turned La Salle into a conference contender as two years later in 2005-06, the Explorers posted their most wins (18) in 14 years and a third place finish in the Atlantic 10 Conference, the school's highest showing since it joined the league for the 1995-96 season.

The 18-10 finish set records for most Atlantic 10 wins in a season (10), most Atlantic 10 road wins in a single season (four) and delivered a winning season to the La Salle community for the first time since the 1992-93 season. For his efforts, Giannini was named a Jim Phelan Award candidate for National Coach of the Year.

Giannini followed that impressive performance by recruiting one of the deepest and most highly-regarded incoming classes which included five freshmen who would have an immediate impact on the program. The Explorers experienced growing pains as five of the top seven players in the 2006-07 rotation were freshman. That group meshed together in 2008-09, winning 18 games and finishing in the top half of the Atlantic 10 for the third time in four seasons.

La Salle entered 2009-10 with high expectations, including a preseason fourth pick in the Atlantic 10 coaches poll, but injuries decimated the roster. Seniors Ruben Guillandeaux, Kimmani Barrett and Yves Mekongo missed a combined 46 games and the Explorers near 3,000 points on the bench were the most sidelined in the nation at one time.

lin 2011-12, Giannini led the Explorers to a 21-win season and a trip to the NIT First Round, the first postseason appearance for the program in 20 years. The 21 wins were also the most since 1990.

Jerrell Wright became the fifth Explorer in the past six seasons to receive A-10 All-Rookie recognition in 2011-12, making La Salle the only team in the conference to have as many representatives during that time span.

Seven Explorers have earned All-Atlantic 10 recognition during Giannini's tenure, including two-time A-10 Player of the Year Steven Smith, one of four players in the 33-year history of the league to win the award multiple times. In addition, six players have been NABC All-District selections.



SACRED HEART NOTES

- La Salle scored 66 points in the first half, two short of tying a school record of 68 set versus Loyola Marymount on December 31, 1990.
- La Salle made its first seven shots and 14 of its first 17 shots to race to a 40-16 lead after 10 minutes.
- The 100 points were the most since a 117-86 win over Puerto Rico-Mayaguez on December 19, 2007.

NON-CONFERENCE WINS

La Salle has nine non-conference victories with two games to go. Last year's team won 11 non-conference regular season games, which was the most since the program joined the MAAC in 1983-84.

MR. EFFICIENCY

La Salle sophomore D.J. Peterson is ranked 29th nationally in offensive rating percentage according to statsheet.com at 133.2. Offensive rating pct. is determined by this formula (FG + FT + Asts + OR) / possessions.

TALE OF TWO HALVES

Ramon Galloway scored 21 points and had three assists in the first half against Iona and zero points and seven assists in the second half. In head coach Dr. John Giannini's opinion, the second half was the best half he has ever played. "Our leading scorer passed, defender and led and it was his best game as a basketball player," Giannini said.

HOME COOKING

La Salle has won 20 of its last 24 in Gola Arena and was 14-3 at home last season, the best home record since the 1968-69 team was 14-0 on its way to a 23-1 season. The 14 wins was also a Gola record for most wins in a season. La Salle has won 13 of its last 14 non-conference regular season games at Gola, with the only loss being Central Connecticut State on November 18.

ROAD WARRIORS

La Salle has won six of its last eight road games.

SCORING MACHINES

Ramon Galloway leads the A-10 in scoring at 18.4 ppg. while Tyreek Duren ranks sixth at 16.1.

RAMON HEATING UP

Ramon Galloway is averaging 22.0 ppg. over his past five games and has shot 19-for-33 from three point range (57.6%). He has made at least three three-pointers in all but one game this season, including the last nine.

EARLY RPI LOOK

The Explorers have an RPI of 48 through 11 games (according to RealTimeRPI.com), which ranks fifth in the A-10. The A-10 has 10 teams ranked in the top 100 in the RPI.

"Philadelphia has been the home of many great lead guards and Duren's game mirrors the city in which he plays. Tough, savvy, and incredibly cerebral, the junior point guard plays his best when it matters most..."

CAREER NIGHT

Tyreek Duren had a career-high 29 points in the 82-57 win over Penn State on December 5.. He shot 9-for-13 from the floor and 4-for-7 from three-point range.

A-10 AND BIG 5 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Tyreek Duren was named the Atlantic 10 and Big 5 Player of the Week on December 10 after averaging 20.5 ppg. in two La Salle wins. He also hit the game-winner with 1.2 seconds left in a 66-64 win at Northeastern on Saturday. It is the second time in three weeks he won the Big 5 honor.

MR. CLUTCH

Tyreek Duren has proved to be clutch through the first month of the season. He hit a game-tying three-pointer with seven seconds left in regulation to tie the game versus Villanova and his lay-up with 18 seconds gave the Explorers the lead and the win. At Northeastern, he hit a fadeaway with 1.2 seconds left to propel La Salle to a 66-64 win

SHOOTING THE THREE

La Salle made 16 three-pointers vs. Penn State, the most since the turn of the century and just two shy of tying a school record set on December 31, 1990 vs. Loyola Marymount and then again on December 28, 1991 vs. Oregon.

IN GOOD HANDS

La Salle coughed up a season-low four turnovers vs. Penn State, the least allowed during head coach Dr. John Giannini's tenure.

DOMINANT DECEMBER

La Salle is 11-2 in December in the last two seasons.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

La Salle has held non-conference opponents under 53 points in wins at Hartford, Rider and Siena. It marks the eighth, ninth and tenth times that La Salle has held an opponent under 55 since the beginning of the 2011-12 season, which is as many as the previous eight years combined. La Salle is 10-0 when holding opponents under 55.

MAN OF STEAL

Ramon Galloway ranks fourth in the Atlantic 10 in steals per game (2.5 spg.) and is 21st nationally.

SCORING BACKCOURT

Tyreek Duren and Ramon Galloway form one of the best backcourt duos in the Atlantic 10. They are one of two guard teammates to rank in the top 10 in the A-10 in scoring, joining Saint Joseph's guards Carl Jones and Langston Galloway.

DUREN BIG 5 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Tyreek Duren was named the Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Week, it was announced on Nov. 26. Duren averaged 19.0 ppg. in a pair of Explorer wins last week, including a 77-74 overtime victory over Villanova. Against the Wildcats, Duren scored 19 of his 23 points after

halftime. His three-pointer with seven seconds remaining in regulation tied the game at 67-67. In overtime, his lay-up with 18 seconds left gave La Salle its first lead since late in the first half. His 23 points against Nova were one short of a career-high set last year against the Wildcats.

WHAT A HOMECOMING

Redshirt freshman Rohan Brown made quite an impression in his first game back playing in his hometown of Hartford. Brown had a double-double with a career-high 10 points and 12 rebounds. "Our vision for him was to rebound like a big guy but to be able to pass and be a good decision maker like a guard. He's the only guy in our program like that. He brings the physical toughness of a big guy and the decisionmaking and low turnovers of a guard." - Head coach Dr. John Giannini

SAM I AM

Sam Mills is second in the Atlantic 10 in minutes per game (37.5) and is 17th nationally according to statsheet.com. He averaged 35.5 mpg. last season, a team-best, and the fifth best in the league. Tyreek Duren is eighth in the A-10 in minutes per game (35.2).

Head coach Dr. John Giannini coached his 700th game on December 8 at Northeastern.

SOMETHING ABOUT CCSU

Jerrell Wright had a game-high 18 points and career-best four assists in a 81-74 loss to Central Connecticut State on Nov. 18. He posted his career-high of 21 points vs. CCSU last season.

STUKES SIGNS NLI

Amar Stukes (Philadelphia, Pa. / La Salle College HS) has signed a National Letter of Intent to play men's basketball at La Salle University, head coach Dr. John Giannini announced today. Stukes will join the Explorers for the 2013-14 season." I like everything about Amar Stukes as a person and as a player," Giannini said. "On the court he is a highly intelligent and unselfish playmaker. He is also a long, quick, and committed defender. "As a person, he will represent us with great character. I feel he will be a cornerstone player who we can depend upon and build around in future years." Stukes (6-1, 165), a first team All-Catholic League selection as a junior, averaged 13.4 ppg. last season. The team captain was also a third team All-Catholic League pick as a sophomore.

ZACK ATTACK

Sophomore center had a breakout game in the season opener vs. Delaware, scoring a career-high 19 points in a career-best 38 minutes vs. Delaware. He tied a career-high with eight rebounds, drawing a tweet from ESPN's Fran Fraschilla "Who's jumping on Steve Zack bandwagon yet? 6'11" La Salle sophomore had 19 in win over Delaware. Averaged 1.4 last yr but staff loves him." Zack had a career-high 14 rebounds in 42 minutes vs. Villanova.

THAT'S WHY THEY ARE FREE

La Salle shot 23-for-25 (92%) from the foul line vs. Delaware, the best mark by the Explorers since making 14-of-15 (93.3%) vs. UMass on February 19, 2005.

PROTECT THE ROCK

La Salle committed only four turnovers vs. Penn State, the lowest since at least the 2001-02 season. The Explorers were 6-1 last season when committing single-digit turnovers and are 9-1 this season when committing less turnovers than their opponent.

BEST BACKCOURT?

College Chalk Talk ranked the Explorers as having the best back-court in the Atlantic 10. "La Salle has the best three guard trio in the league in Tyreek Duren, Sam Mills and Ramon Galloway. If the criteria were just two guards then SJU would be our pick, but it isn't here. La Salle's guards are legit. And that's not even including Virginia Tech transfer Tyrone Garland, who's eligible at the mid-year." CCT also named Garland as the league's top transfer (along with Jake O'Brien of Temple.

ROOKIE BIG MEN IN A-10

Jerrell Wright was one of three freshman A-10 big men to start on a NCAA or NIT team last season joining Chris Wright (Dayton) and Lavoy Allen (Temple). (Since 2000).

S.I. SAYS WRIGHT READY FOR BREAKOUT

Sports Illustrated writer Luke Winn wrote that Jerrell Wright is the #3 sophomore nationally to be ready for a breakout second campaign. Using a formula that only evaluates returning freshman who played 20 minutes per game or less that used at least 24% of possessions. Wright averaged 9.8 ppg. in 19.8 mpg. while being used in 26.5% of possessions. "According to kenpom.com's similarity scores, the player whose freshman season Wright's most closely matched was J.J. Hickson's 2008 at NC State -- and Hickson jumped to the NBA straight after that. Wright has real star potential in the Atlantic 10."

COACH'S CORNER

Head Coach Dr. John Giannini is in his ninth season, the second longest tenure by an Explorer coach since Speedy Morris coached for 15 years from 1986-2001. Giannini is also fourth all-time at La Salle in wins.

WHY ARE WE THE EXPLORERS?

La Salle University's nickname—the Explorers—was announced by *the Collegian* in March 1932 as the winning entry to a student contest. However, in the fall of 1931, a Baltimore sportswriter covering the La Salle/St. John's (Md.) football game erroneously alluded to La Salle as being named for the French explorer La Salle, not St. John Baptist de La Salle. Were the two events related? We'll never know for sure.
