MIDWEEK STORY LINES

- No. 20 Miami carries a **nine-game winning streak** into a weekend series with ACC newcomer Pittsburgh at Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field beginning Friday, April 11. The Hurricanes **have not played the Panthers** since the 2009 season.
- Miami leads the **all-time series** over the Panthers by a perfect **6-0 mark**, with all six wins coming inside Mark Light Field.
- Miami is ranked in the **top 25 in every major college baseball poll**. The Hurricanes check in at No. 20 in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* rankings, No. 23 by NCBWA, No. 24 in *Baseball America*, and No. 24 in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll.
- For the **first time since joining the conference** in 2004, the Hurricanes **swept back-to-back** three-game ACC road series. Miami captured all three against then-No. 25 **NC State** (March 28-30), and did the same against **Virginia Tech** (April 4-6).
- Head coach **Jim Morris won his 900th game** as Hurricanes skipper in the team's series-opening victory over No. 3 Virginia (March 22). He also won his **1,400th game** as **Division I coach** during Miami's sweep of Boston College (March 8).
- After struggling to hit for power in 2013, Miami is tied for **fourth in the ACC with 17 home runs**. **Zack Collins ranks second in the ACC** with six homers, **Dale Carey has five (seventh)**, and **Tyler Palmer & Garrett Kennedy have two**.
- The Hurricanes **have not lost a game started** by junior lefthander **Chris Diaz** dating back to **May 24, 2013** - a stretch of **nine consecutive starts**, including his **first eight of the 2014 season**. Diaz is **5-0** with a **2.45 ERA** this spring.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 909-357-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,413-624-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,544-664-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

• Miami enters the weekend with a firm hold on second place in the Coastal Division, just one game behind No. 3 Virginia. The Hurricanes are one of just four ACC teams with double-digit ACC wins through the first five conference weekends (11-4).

HEATING UP...

• After struggling through the first month of the season, freshman slugger Zack Collins has turned it up a notch. Collins is hitting at a .400 clip over his past five games with two doubles, one triple, and 10 RBI.

• Also picking up the pace is senior captain Tyler Palmer - who is hitting .316 over the last five games with team-high totals of six runs and three steals.

• Over his last five starts, redshirt sophomore Andrew Suarez has allowed just seven earned runs in 38.1 innings (1.88 ERA). He is 3-0 over that stretch with 19 strikeouts compared to just six walks.

• Freshman Willie Abreu is hitting an impressive .346 in ACC play, and leads all freshmen with 31 starts. He ranks fifth on the Hurricanes with 16 RBI, and is hitting .364 over his last 10 games.

MILESTONES FOR MORRIS...

• Head coach Jim Morris became just the eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball to accumulate 1,400 wins when Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8.

• Two weeks later, Morris won his 900th game with the Hurricanes in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22. Morris ranks second in wins in Miami history behind the late Ron Fraser (1,267).

• Morris ranks fourth among active Division I coaches in career victories (1,413) and eighth all-time in the category. He is also the second-winningest coach in ACC history.

DIAZ DOMINATING...

• Junior LHP Chris Diaz picked up his third win over a ranked opponent this season in a 7-1 victory over No. 3 Virginia (March 22). Diaz has earned a win in five of his eight starts and is tied for fourth in the ACC with five wins. He ranks 14th in the ACC with a 2.45 ERA.

• Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his fifth win of the 2013 season until May 10 against Wake Forest. He finished 2013 with a 7-5 record.

• The Hurricanes have won every single one of Diaz' starts in 2014, including victories over then-No. 23 Florida (2/14), No. 1 FSU (2/28), No. 3 Virginia (3/22) and No. 25 NC State (3/28). Miami has not lost a game started by Diaz since the 2013 ACC Tournament in a 7-1 loss to NC State (May 24).

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

POWER SURGE...

- Miami is tied for fourth in the ACC with 17 home runs. Zack Collins ranks second in the ACC with six homers, while Dale Carey is tied for seventh in the conference with five.
- The offense already has four multi-homerun games this season (after recording just two in all of 2013): games one and two against Florida (Feb. 21 & 22), game one against Georgia Tech (March 14) and game three against NC State (March 30). Miami is 4-0 when hitting more than one home run.
- Zack Collins recorded the first multi-home run game for the Hurricanes since Peter O'Brien accomplished the feat in 2012 in Miami's 12-5 win over NC State (March 30). He drove in six runs in the win.
- The Hurricane offense exploded for six home runs in its series with Florida (Feb. 21-23), the most for a Miami team in a single series since an April 2010 weekend set at Virginia Tech.

BUILDING A RESUME...

- Miami has used its nine-game winning streak, including back-to-back ACC road sweeps, to vault to No. 23 in the latest Warren Nolan Top 25 RPI (April 10).
- Miami has eight wins against teams in the Warren Nolan Top 50 RPI, including a road win over No. 3 Florida State, a series victory over No. 4 Florida, a win over No. 10 Virginia, a road sweep of No. 40 NC State and a road win against No. 44 Georgia Tech.
- With a challenging ACC slate remaining, Miami's strength of schedule is rated No. 25 by Warren Nolan.

FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- Nine freshmen saw the field in Miami's dramatic 8-7 come-from-behind victory against Virginia Tech on April 4: Zack Collins (first base), Willie Abreu (right field), Johnny Ruiz (third base), Sebastian Diaz (second base), Brad Zunica (designated hitter), Carlos Diaz (catcher) and pitchers Bryan Garcia, Danny Garcia and Cooper Hammond.
- The six field players combined for six hits, two walks and five RBI. An RBI single from Collins in the ninth proved to be the game-winner.
- Willie Abreu, Zack Collins and Johnny Ruiz have been regulars in the starting lineup, while Brad Zunica, Sebastian Diaz, Jacob Heyward and Laz Rivera have also earned starts.

CALLED UP CANES...

- Miami's current nine Major League players are tied for the most of any school in the ACC (North Carolina) and the third-most of any program nationwide. The Hurricanes trail only Arizona State (11) and Long Beach State (10) in Major League players.
- Seven former Miami Hurricanes found themselves on 2014 MLB Opening Day rosters: Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Los Angeles Dodgers), Gaby Sanchez (Pittsburgh) and Danny Valencia (Kansas City).
- Jemile Weeks (Baltimore) and Chris Herrmann (Minnesota) opened the season on their respective team's 40-man rosters, and were called up from AAA within the first two weeks of the season.

#CardiacCanes...

- Miami is 6-1 in one-run games in 2014, including two such wins in a road sweep of Virginia Tech (April 4+5) and a 6-5 victory decided in the ninth inning at UCF (April 9). The Hurricanes also took the first two games of its series with then-No. 25 NC State by final scores of 2-1.

- Through their first 34 games (22-12), the Hurricanes have scored 84 of their 187 runs (44.9%) in the sixth inning or later. Miami is 7-6 when its opponent scores first and have played three extra inning games (1-2).

- Freshman slugger Zack Collins has had the game-winning hit in three of Miami's six one-run games, including both of Miami's first two wins over Virginia Tech (April 4+5).

- Salas needed just 113 pitches to get through his outing, scattering six strikeouts across his night of perfection. His perfect game was the first for a Miami pitcher since Kevin Sheary accomplished the feat on March 4, 1987.

- Miami's two perfect games are tied with Auburn and Iowa for the second-most of any program all-time behind Washington State.

SALCINES SENIOR AWARD CANDIDATE...

- Senior relief pitcher AJ Salcines was among the thirty NCAA baseball student-athletes selected as candidates for the 2014 Senior CLASS Award in collegiate baseball

- To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas – community, classroom, character and competition.

- With 93 career appearances across his four years as a Hurricane, Salcines recently cracked the top 10 all-time mark in program history.

CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member Class of 2014 to be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the College Baseball Foundation announced.

- They will join Ron Fraser (2006), Skip Bertman (2006) and Neal Heaton (2009) as College Baseball Hall of Fame inductees from the University of Miami in a special celebration that takes place in Lubbock, Texas in June 2014.

- Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks, including hits (341) and runs (258).
