## **COACH LARRANAGA**

Jim Larranaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided the program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999) – including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee Coach of the Year.

## THE GAME

At UM: 18-11 (1st)

Miami will face Georgia Tech in the First Round of the ACC Tournament on March 8 at 9 p.m. in Philips Arena. THE **SERIES** 

Miami is 8-6 against Georgia Tech overall, winning seven of the last nine outings. The Canes defeated the Yellow Jackets, 64-49, in Atlanta earlier this season.

Head coach Jim Larranaga is in his 28th season as a head coach and first at Miami. He has a 488-345 overall record and holds a 461-319 record in D-I games. Coach L was also the head coach of D-II American International (27-26) for two years.

## QUICK HITS

UM is 3-2 and Georgia Tech is 2-3 in its last five games.

UM is 13-3 at home and 5-8 away from the BankUnited Center this season. In ACC play, Miami was 6-2 in Coral Gables and 3-5 on the road.

Miami is 16-4 when shooting better than 40 percent from the field, 5-0 when recording 15 or more assists, 14-3 when scoring more than 70 points, 15-4 when leading at halftime and 11-3 when four or more Canes score in double figures.

With the ACC's unbalanced scheduling, the Hurricanes have played the league's top-three teams in the standings five out of a possible six times (Duke once, North Carolina twice and Florida State twice).

Miami was 3-5 in conference games on the road this season, the first time the Canes have won three ACC road games in a season since the 2005-06 campaign, when the team was 3-5. UM was 3-5 in league games on the road in its inaugural season in the ACC, 2004-05, too.

After the victory at Duke, the Canes have defeated 10 of 11 ACC teams on the road since joining the league for the 2004-05 season. Miami has yet to beat NC State in its home arena. UNC is the only ACC team Miami has not defeated in Coral Gables since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season.

## LARRANAGA BY THE NUMBERS

1 - Coach Jim Larranaga is the only ACC coach not at UNC or Duke with a Final Four appearance to his credit.

4 - In 2006, Coach Jim Larranaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the NCAA Final Four in 27 years.

7 - Larranaga is no stranger to the ACC. In his seven seasons as an assistant coach at Virginia, the Cavaliers participated in the NCAA Final Four in 1981 and 1984, won three ACC Championships and finished in the Top 5 of the AP rankings. 8 - In all there are eight ACC coaches with three or fewer years' experience in the league, including Larranaga.

12 - Larranaga has made 12 postseason appearances in the past 22 years, including five NCAA Tournaments.

28 - Larranaga is in his 28th year as a head coach and has successfully transitioned two institutions into successful programs: Bowling Green and George Mason.

## LARRANAGA - WHY MIAMI?

Along with returning to the best basketball conference in the country, Coach L had a few personal reasons for accepting the head coaching job at Miami. Coach's grandfather was from Cuba, where he produced the Larrañaga [lare-en-YAH-ga] cigar. Coach's father was raised in Key West before moving to The Bronx, N.Y., geting married and raising six children. Coach L was raised in The Bronx, but vacationed to Florida as a boy. He also has owned a house in Sarasota - which he bought from Dick Vitale's daughter - for eight years and three of his siblings have retired to Florida.

## **THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT CANES HOOPS**

UM is in its eighth season in the ACC.

UM has played in the postseason 12 of the past 17 years, five of which were in the NCAA Tournament.

The Hurricanes have advanced to the postseason five times in seven seasons, with four NIT appearances and one NCAA appearance.

In 14 years at George Mason, Larranaga led the Patriots to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999), including the 2006 Final Four.

A Hurricane has led the ACC in three-point field goal percentage in four of the last six seasons — Malcolm Grant in 2011 (.428), Adrian Thomas in 2010 (.421) and Jack McClinton in 2009 (.453, with an ACC-high 3.2 threes per game) and 2007 (.440, with an ACC-high 2.9 threes per game).

The Hurricanes have made a three-point basket in 340-straight games and have made at least one trey in 797 of 800 games since the NCAA adopted the three-point shot in 1986.

Miami has held 654 of its last 655 opponents to less than 100 points. UNC was the last team to score 100+, defeating UM 105-64 on Jan. 31, 2007.

#### MIAMI AT THE ACC TOURNAMENT

The Hurricanes are now 6-7 in ACC Tournament play and have advanced past the first round of competition in five of the last six seasons, including two-straight (with a run into the ACC semifinals two years ago).

After dropping last season's heartbreaker to the Tar Heels, Miami is 0-3 versus top-seeded teams in the ACC Tournament, falling by an average of just 3.0 points in each of those games.

In 2011, the ninth-seeded UM team staged a 10-point comeback in the final 40 seconds of regulation to take eighth-seeded Virginia to overtime, then defeat the Cavaliers in the First Round. In the Quarterfinals, Miami was on the other end of a comeback, falling 61-59 to UNC after leading by 19 points with 9:55 left in the game.

In 2010, the 12th-seeded 'Canes upset fifth-seeded Wake Forest, 83-62, and then knocked off fourth-seeded Virginia Tech, 70-65, in the quarterfinals to advance to the ACC semifinals for the first time. There Miami fell to topseeded Duke, 77-74, after leading by three at the half.

In 2009, the ninth-seeded Hurricanes fell to eighthseeded Virginia Tech, 65-47.

In 2008, the Hurricanes were seeded fifth - their highest seed in ACC Tournament play. Miami defeated 12th-seeded NC State, 63-50, in the first round before falling to fourth-seeded Virginia Tech, 63-49.

In 2007, the 12th-seeded Hurricanes knocked off fifth-seeded Maryland, 67-62, in the first round and then took fourth-seeded Boston College to overtime in the quarterfinals, before falling 74-71.

In 2006, the 8th-seeded Miami squad defeated ninthseeded Clemson, 66-63, in the opening round, before falling to top-seeded Duke, 80-76, in the quarterfinals.

In Miami's 2004-05 inaugural season, the sixthseeded Hurricanes fell to 11th-seeded Virginia in the first round, 66-65.

#### IT'S ACC TOURNAMENT TIME

The University of Miami men's basketball team has been dealt the No. 6 seed and will face No. 11-seed Georgia Tech in the first round of the 59th Annual ACC Tournament held at Philips Arena in Atlanta, Ga., March 8-11. Catch the game live on ESPNU at 9 p.m.

The Hurricanes ended the regular season 18-11 overall and 9-7 in the ACC under first-year head coach Jim Larranaga.

Miami finished tied for fourth in the ACC, the best finish since landing fifth in the league in 2007-08, but were dealt the sixth seed due to tie-breakers with NC State and Virginia.

This season the Canes also posted its most wins (9) in ACC play since joining the ACC eight seasons ago.

The winner of the Miami-Georgia Tech game advances to the ACC Quarterfinals to face third-seeded Florida State on Friday, March 9. at 9 p.m. The game will be televised on ESPN2. The Seminoles, along with the other top-four seeded teams, received a first-round bye.

#### LAST YEAR'S COMEBACKS AT THE ACC TOURNAMENT No. 9 seed Miami vs. No. 8 seed Virginia

The ninth-seeded Miami men's basketball team used an amazing comeback in its ACC Tournament opening round game last season - overcoming a 10-point deficit with under 40 seconds to go, to force overtime and knock eighth-seeded Virginia out of the ACC Tournament with the 69-62 decision. It is believed to be the biggest comeback in under a minute to play in ACC Tournament history, as the 'Canes erased a 53-43 deficit beginning with a Durand Scott three-pointer with 34 seconds to play in regulation.


## No. 9 seed Miami vs. No. 1 seed North Carolina

The Hurricanes were on the opposite side of a comeback bid in the ACC Tournament quarterfinal game versus top-seeded, and sixth-ranked, North Carolina. The Hurricanes led by as many as 19 points with 9:55 to go in the game, when the Tar Heels nailed four straight three-pointers en route to a heart-

wrenching comeback over the 'Canes. It was North Carolina's biggest comeback in a game in five years, dating to when the Tar Heels rallied from 20 down in the first half to beat Georgia Tech in 2006. North Carolina would do the same to Clemson in the ACC semifinals on the following day. The Hurricanes registered a season-high 12 steals versus the Tar Heels, as North Carolina turned the ball over 20 times — a season high for a Miami opponent and two off UNC's season high.

#### **CANES SET MARK FOR MOST ACC WINS**

The Hurricanes ended the season 9-7 in the league and have set the UM record for the most Atlantic Coast Conference wins in a season

Miami also ended their regular season tied for fourth in the ACC, the best finish since landing fifth during the 2007-08 campaign.

Miami ended the 2007-08 season 8-8 and played in the NCAA Tournament that season. The last time Miami won more than eight league games was under Coach Perry Clark in 2001-02, when UM was 10-6 in the BIG EAST and 24-8 overall. That team also played in the NCAA Tournament.

## THREE CANES ON ALL-ACC TEAMS

Three Miami players - Kenny Kadji, Durand Scott and Shane Larkin - have earned 2011-12 All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors, as announced Monday by the ACC, following a vote of 62 members of the Atlantic Coast Sports Media Association (ACSMA).

Kadii was selected to the All-ACC Third Team, Durand Scott was voted an honorable mention performer and Larkin earned a spot on the ACC All-Freshman Team.

#### **RETURNING TO GEORGIA**

Senior DeQuan Jones grew up just outside of Atlanta, in Stone Mountain, Ga., and attended Wheeler High. He was the Class 5A Player of the Year as a senior.

Sophomore Rion Brown's father, Tico, played college ball for Georgia Tech, the CBA and overseas. When Tico retired, he was the CBA's all-time leading scorer (8,538 pts).

### LARRANAGA REUNITED WITH PRESIDENT OBAMA

On February 23, President Barrack Obama was on the University of Miami campus speaking with students about gas prices and the energy policy. Coach Larranaga was invited by UM President Donna Shalala to attend the event. Coach L asked Obama about his hoops game, and the President asked Larranaga about living in Miami and the Canes' season.

Larranaga has met the President a handful of times, dating back to Coach L's tenure in Fairfax, Va., at George Mason. Larranaga's son, John, also plays basketball with the President.

## LINSANITY ASSOCIATED WITH LARRANAGA FAMILY

Coach Jim Larranaga's son, Jay, is the head coach of the Erie Bayhawks, the Knicks' Developmental League team where Jeremy Lin played one game before being sent to New York City. In that one game, Lin delivered the single-best performance by an Erie player this season notching the team's only triple-double thus far, scoring 28 points, dishing out 12 assists and grabbing 11 rebounds in the BayHawks' 122-113 win over Maine.

## **TWO HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS SIGN NLI WITH CANES**

High school seniors Melvin Johnson and Tonye Jekiri have each signed a National Letter of Intent with the University of Miami men's basketball program, head coach Jim Larranaga announced. Jekiri, a 6-11, 220-pound center from Nigeria, is a local product from Hialeah's Champagnat Catholic School. Johnson is a 6-3, 188-pound guard from the Bronx, N.Y., who plays high school ball at St. Benedict's Prep (N.J.).

Jekiri is rated the 17th-best center in the country by ESPN.com and No. 13 by Scout.com. The big man can play with his back to the basket or step out for a 10-12-foot shot, and he can run the floor like a guard. A native of Nigeria, Jekiri moved to South Florida in September 2010 to begin his basketball career. He averaged 14 points and 10 rebounds per game last season with Champagnat, his first year of organized hoops. On the AAU circuit, he played with Team Breakdown over the summer, where he dominated at the Source Hoops Elite Camp and led Team Breakdown to championships in the Breakdown Hoops Festival and the Big Shots Myrtle Beach I. Jekiri chose Miami over considerations from Virginia Tech, Clemson, Florida State, Auburn, Vanderbilt and Alabama.

Also complementing Miami for the 2012-13 season will be Melvin Johnson, a senior guard at St. Benedict's Prep in Newark, N.J. Johnson is rated by ESPN.com as the 44th-best shooting guard in the country in 2012 and ESPNU ranks him No. 51 nationally, and ninth in New York, at the point guard position. He is a deadly spot-up shooter who can stretch opposing defenses and will contribute to Miami's uptempo offensive attack as a combo guard. Johnson traveled the AAU circuit with the Long Island Lightning, earning the MVP of the Hoop Group Elite Camp Session I. Johnson began his prep career with current Cane Durand Scott at Rice High in Harlem, but when the school closed last year, Johnson moved to St. Benedict's. Johnson chose Miami over Virginia Tech, Georgetown, South Florida, Dayton and College of Charleston.

### **GRANT FINDS HIS RHYTHM**

Senior Malcolm Grant knocked down four shots from distance in two straight games, notching 14 points at NC State and 12 against Boston College. Prior to Feb. 29, his last dou-

ble-digit scoring night was on Feb. 1 against Maryland when he notched 14 points. Grant has now hit at least four treys in seven games this season.

## **AGAINST RANKED TEAMS**

Miami downed No. 7/5 Duke on Feb. 5 in Cameron Indoor Stadium for the first win over a ranked team since the 2009-10 season, when UM beat No. 20/20 Georgia Tech.

On Feb. 26, Miami defeated No. 15/16 Florida State to win a pair of games over ranked teams in the same season for the first time since 2008-09. That year. the Canes downed No. 7/6 Wake Forest (2/4/09) and No. 24/17 Boston College (1/10/09).

Miami is 44-125 against ranked teams overall and 12-60 on the road. This season, UM is 2-5 against ranked teams, 1-12 at home and 1-3 on the road. Since joining the league for the 2004-05 campaign, the Canes are 15-29 vs. ranked ACC teams, 10-13 at home and 4-16 on the road.

## MIAMI DEFEATS TWO RANKED TEAMS IN SEVEN GAMES

Miami defeated two of the four ranked teams it faced in the past seven games. The Canes downed No. 7/5 Duke on Feb. 5, matched up with No. 15/17 Florida State Feb. 5 and No. 8/7 UNC on Feb. 15, and beat No. 15/16 FSU on Feb. 26.

## **KEY BENCH POINTS ADDING UP**

Miami's bench continues to be productive, scoring 20 points or more in the past six games -- 154 points (25.6 ppg) in six outings. In 17 of 29 games this season, Miami's bench has scored 20+ points.

The reserves notched 31 against Boston College, 28 at NC State, 27 against Florida State, 26 at Maryland, 20 vs. Wake Forest and 22 against North Carolina.

In those six games, Rion Brown leads the bench scorers averaging 8.2 ppg, followed by Trey McKinney Jones at 7.8 and DeQuan Jones with 6.0 ppg.

## **ELEVEN PLAYERS WITH STARTS; TEN LINEUPS**

Eleven Miami players have earned at least one start this season, with Durand Scott as the only Cane to be on the court at tip off in all 29 games.

Coach Jim Larranaga has used 10 starting lineups in 29 games so far this season. *See all of the lineups at the bottom of page eight of the notes.* 

## WRAPPING UP MIAMI VS. BC ON MARCH 1

Coach Jim Larranaga started seniors DeQuan Jones, Ryan Quigtar, and Malcolm Grant along with junior Durand Scott and junior Reggie Johnson ... Jones recorded the first play of the game, a block against Boston College center Dennis Clifford. Jones played 23 min-

teriter Definits Childra. Joines prayed 25 minutes and tallied nine points, one assist and two blocks ... Grant hit a three for Miami's first points of the game. Grant played a total of 27 minutes while accumulating 12 points (all from distance) two assists and one steal ... Quigtar started his first game of his career, playing the first and last four minutes. Quigtar went 1-of-2 from the line while adding one assist and one rebound ... Miami had its best shooting performance in any first half of any game this season. The Canes shot 17-of-28 (60.7%) from the field. The previous season high in the first half was on Jan.

> 18, against Clemson, when the Canes shot 16-28 (57.1%) ... Half of Miami's 28 made shots had an associated assist. Eight Canes notched a total of 14 assists, led by Reggie Johnson (4) ... Johnson made his fourth 3-point shot of his career going 1-of-2 from the beyond the arc. Johnson is now 4-of-9 from three-point land for his career ... Scott made a bucket from just inside the half-court line as time expired in the first half to extend the Canes' lead 46-25 ... The 77-56 win marks the second straight year the Canes have swept the Eagles. Miami defeated BC on Jan. 29, 73-54, and twice last season, both in Coral Gables (72-71) and in Massachusetts (73-64).

## SHARING THE SCORING LOAD

Seven Canes have led the team in scoring in a game, and in 12 games, four or more players have scored in double digits. In nine other games, at least three players notched at least 10 points. Four Canes are currently averaging at least 10 points per game overall and three are in league play.

## THE BIG REGG EFFECT

Center Reggie Johnson adds a 6-10, 284-lb presence in the paint, but also has given the Canes an offensive boost in 20 games (since Dec. 17). With defenses focusing on Big Regg inside, the perimeter has opened up for UM.

In the first nine games, UM shot 39.9 from the field, but since Johnson's return, the team has hit 45.2 percent.

In 20 games since the Dec. 17 return of the big man, junior Kenny Kadji has improved from 7.3 points and 4.7 rebounds to 15.5 points and 6.1 rebounds per game. Durand Scott has improved from 30.2 percent shooting to 50.5 percent and Rion Brown improved from 3.3 points at 20.0 percent to 7.2 ppg to 46.2 percent. ## **GRANT AND SCOTT TOP MILESTONES**

Senior Malcolm Grant notched his 200th career three-pointer in the game at Florida State on Feb. 11.

Junior Durand Scott notched his 400th rebound against UNC on Feb. 15, his 400th field goal against Wake Forest, and his 300th made freethrows at NC State.

Grant and Scott have topped the 1,100 and 1,200-point plateaus after joining the 1,000-point club earlier this season.

## HOLDING OFF COMEBACKS

Against No. 7/5 Duke and Maryland, Miami led by 16 points in the second half, but both games went into overtime after a comeback by the opponent. Against Duke, UM held the 16-point margin with 19:04 remaining and with 7:09 remaining against Maryland, Miami held the 16-point lead.

## STREAKING CANES

Prior to the game at FSU on Feb. 11, the Canes were on their first five-game ACC winning streak in school history and won three consecutive ACC road games for the first time ever, after starting 1-3 in the league in 2011-12.

This season is the first time Miami has won three ACC road games in a season since the 2005-06 campaign when UM won at UNC, FSU and GT.

From Jan. 18- Feb. 9, Miami won six of eight league games for the first time since Feb. 9-23, 2008.

Since joining the ACC in 2004-05, Miami has won 15+ total games in seven of eight seasons, has 6+ league wins in six of those eight years and has 10+ wins at home in seven campaigns.

### CANES IN THE POLLS

Following the Feb. 5 overtime upset of No. 7/5 Duke, the Miami Hurricanes received a vote in the Feb. 6 AP Poll. The last time Miami was in the polls was Jan. 11, 2010 when the Canes were ranked No. 23 in the AP Poll and were receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Poll.

## **CANES & COACH L MAKE COMMITMENT**

The University of Miami and Coach Jim Larranaga have agreed to terms on a three-year contract extension that will run through April 30, 2019. Larranaga's extension adds three years to his existing five-year contract which began in April 2011.

## **CANES LOCK DOWN ON DEFENSE**

The Canes' goal is to hold each of their opponents to less than 40 percent shooting from the field and 30 percent from distance and Miami did just that in its 78-74 overtime win at Duke. The Blue Devils shot 38.2 percent from the field and 29.0 percent from long range, along with 59.1 percent at the stripe. Duke entered the game shooting 48.8 FG percentage, 40.0 3FG and 70.5 FT.

## PLAYERS ON A ROLL

Malcom Grant has made multiple threes in 18 games, including seven-straight games to start the season. Until the game at UNC, he had hit a three in 35-straight games, which is 11th in the ACC and ties UM's school record for consecutive games making a trev.

Durand Scott has shot 50.5 percent from the field in the past 20 games after starting the year 26-of-86 (30.2%) in the first nine games. He has scored double-digit points in 24-of-29 games and has at least three assists in 18 games.

Kenny Kadji has scored more than 11 points 20 times. He has seven blocks in the past three games and has two or more blocks in 14 games this season. Since Johnson's return, Kadji has averaged 15.5 points, 6.1 rebounds, 1.8 blocks, 53.3 field goal percent and 45.5 three-point percent.

Reggie Johnson has scored in double digits in 12 of 19 games and pulled down at least seven rebounds in 13 of 19 games. He has 13 assists in the past six games.

Shane Larkin has a steal in 20 of his 28 games, including five in his last two outings. He was fifth in the ACC in steals as a freshman. He has 24 assists in the past 10 games.

Rion Brown has shot 46.9 percent from the field and 43.3 percent from three in his past 19 games. He shot 20 percent FG (5-25) and 21.4 percent 3FG (3-14) in his first seven games. He has hit 26 threes in the past 20 games after only knocking down three in the first seven games.

Trev McKinnev Jones is shooting 48.5 percent from the field in the past 20 games. He has hit at least two threes in 13 games.

DeQuan Jones has scored more than four points in 14 of his 19 outings and grabbed more than three rebounds 11 times, despite only averaging 17.7 minutes per game.

## JOHNSON OUT VS. FSU, RETURNS AT NC STATE

Junior Reggie Johnson was declared ineligible prior to the game against Florida State, but prior to the game at NC State, was reinstated by the NCAA with the following conditions: he must repay the value of benefits that were unknowingly received from a member of the former coaching staff and serve a one-game withholding penalty (Florida State).

In the process of the ongoing joint NCAA-UM inquiry, it was discovered that members of Johnson's family received impermissible travel benefits from a member of the former basketball coaching staff. Johnson was unaware of the benefits and his family was told they were permissible by that member of the former basketball coaching staff.

The UM locker room is closed at all times. For home games, Coach Larranaga and a handful of Hurricane players will report to the media room for interviews following the opposing team's postgame press conference.

## AT THE BANKUNITED CENTER

The Hurricanes were 13-3 in the BankUnited Center this season after going 13-4 at home in 2010-11. UM is 108-47 overall at the arena since it opened in the 2002-03 season. Miami has compiled an 94-34 record at home since joining the ACC for the 2004-05 season. The Hurricanes have notched double-digit home wins at the BankUnited in five-straight seasons.

## **GAMBLE GRANTED SIXTH YEAR**

Forward Julian Gamble has been granted a clock extension by the NCAA, allowing the senior to play basketball next season. Gamble is sidelined this season after tearing the ACL in his left leg in August. A team leader, Gamble started 13 games in 2010-11 and averaged 3.8 points, 4.0 rebounds and 0.8 blocks per game. In his three-season career, Gamble has played in 93 games, averaging 3.4 points, 3.0 rebounds and 0.7 blocks per game.

## JOHNSON ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Reggie Johnson was named the ACC Player of the Week (Feb. 6) after leading Miami to a pair of overtime victories that week, including the Canes' first-ever win over No. 7/5 Duke at Cameron Indoor, and a double-overtime victory against Maryland. Johnson averaged 20 points, shooting 56.7 percent from the field, and averaged 8.5 rebounds, 10 of which were offensive. He also had a pair of steals, a block and an assist in 30 minutes per game. Johnson notched 27 points, 12 rebounds and a steal in 35 minutes against No. 7/5 Duke on Sunday. He was 11-of-17 from the field (56.7%) and eight of his 12 boards were offensive. Against Maryland, Johnson scored 13 points and grabbed five boards. He drained his first-career three-point attempt, a shot from the top of the key, and had an assist, a block and a steal against the Terps.

## **CANES FIRE UP THE NETS**

Since the return of Reggie Johnson, the Canes have averaged a 45.2 percent clip from the field. In those 20 games, UM has averaged 73.6 ppg, up from the 67.2 average in their first nine outings. Against FAU, the first game with Reggie Johnson back in the lineup, Miami hit 31-of-50 (62%) from the field and 14-of-20 (70%) from beyond the arc.

### NEW LINEUP SPARKS REBOUNDING NUM-BERS

With the addition of big men Reggie Johnson and DeQuan Jones, the Canes have outrebounded 11 of their past 19 opponents after coming up short in the rebounding battle in eight of the first 10 games. Miami outrebounded Charlotte 38-30, the first time the Canes outrebounded an opponent since the game at Purdue. The +15 against Wake Forest was the second-highest differential of the season, behind UM's +16 (42-26) against Tennessee Tech in the season opener.

## **GRANT TIES RECORD IN THREES; 11TH IN ACC**

Malcolm Grant made a three-pointer in 35-straight games from the Dec. 30, 2009 outing against Pepperdine until the Jan. 7, 2012 game at Virginia. His 35 tied the Miami school record with former Cane Jack McClinton. The 35 makes are the 11th-best in ACC history, tying Grant with J.J. Redick (Duke) and McClinton.

#### **CANES INCOMPLETE ROSTER**

Prior to the game against UNC, Miami had a complete roster of uninjured players for only five practices to that point in the season. The Canes were without center Reggie Johnson for the first

nine games this season, then DeQuan Jones joined the team for the 11th game of the year, but Malcolm Grant missed two games due to a death in the family. Since Dec. 17, Garrius Adams missed five games due to a lower extremity injury, had surgery on Jan. 19 and returned for the Feb. 18 game. Julian Gamble is out for the season with a knee injury and Bishop Daniels will redshirt this season.

With 17 points against UNCG, junior Durand Scott joined teammate Malcolm Grant in the 1,000 Point Club, the 33rd player in Canes history to top the mark. 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## LEARNING THE SYSTEM

Along with understanding the expectations of the new coaching staff, the Canes are learning an entirely new system under Coach Larranaga. Miami is playing man-to-man a majority of this season's possessions after playing 2-3 zone primarily in the 2009-10 season. Larranaga has also added his Scramble defense to the Canes' playbook, which has been used multiple times this season. With injuries to the big men early in the season, the team also worked without a true back-to-the-basket center, and has played many possessions with a smaller, four-guard lineup.

## **MIAMI SHOOTS 70 PERCENT FROM LONG RANGE**

The Canes hit 70 percent (14-20) from long range against FAU, topping their previous season high of 47.1 percent (8-17) against UMass on Dec. 3, 2011. Since the 2005-06 season, Miami's top three-point percentage was 63.2 (12-19) against Maryland on Jan. 7, 2006.

Miami drained 14 three pointers in the game, the most since the 2009-10 season when the Canes hit 14 against Nova Southeastern (11/16/09), then 15 against South Carolina State (12/12/09).

## LARRANAGA INDUCTED INTO NYC HALL OF FAME

Coach Jim Larranaga was inducted into the New York City Basketball Hall of Fame on Sept. 22, 2011, in a ceremony held at the New York Athletic Club on Central Park South at 59th Street. Born in the Bronx, N.Y., Larranaga built the George Mason Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (2008, 2001, 1999). Larranaga was joined at the 2011 induction ceremony by Donnie Walsh, former New York Knicks President; longtime Knicks trainer Mike Saunders; former Knick John Warren; a member of the Knicks 1969-70 NBA championship team, the late Lloyd "Sonny" Dove; Debbie Mason, the former All-America from Queens College known as "Lady Pearl"; Tom Henderson, an all-city performer from DeWitt Clinton H.S. in the Bronx; and former Fordham All-America Kenny Charles.

#### CANES VISIT LORRAINE MOTEL WHERE MLK WAS ASSASSINATED

On Nov. 26, the University of Miami men's basketball team visited the Lorraine Motel in Memphis, Tenn., where Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated on April 4, 1968. The building is now attached to the National Civil Rights Museum.

Miami stayed in Memphis after Friday's game at Ole Miss. The players and staff made an early pit stop to visit the motel on their way to the airport, receiving a quick history lesson on its way to West Lafayette, Ind., for a Tuesday matchup with Purdue.

## **GRAHAM RECIPIENT OF THE 2011 ED BLOCK COURAGE AWARD**

The New Orleans Saints announced that second-year tight end Jimmy Graham has been voted by his teammates as the 2011 recipient of the Ed Block Courage Award. Graham, a 6-6, 260 pound native of Goldsboro, N.C., graduated from the University of Miami with degrees in both marketing and management in 2009. He was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2010 NFL Draft after playing just one year of college football. Prior to that, Graham was a four-year letterman for the Hurricanes in basketball. Graham spent portions of his childhood living in a group home before being taken in by a legal guardian, Rebecca Vinson. Despite putting herself through nursing school and overcoming financial struggles of her own, Vinson helped mentor and stress the importance of education to Graham while providing him with a caring home. The Ed Block Courage Award Foundation is dedicated to improving the lives of neglected children and ending the cycle of abuse. The purpose is to raise Awareness and Prevention of child abuse.

## UM ALUM WILL ALLEN RECEIVES NCAA'S HIGHEST HONOR

Former University of Miami basketball player Will Allen has been recognized as a Theodore Roosevelt Award winner by the NCAA. Allen graduated from the University of Miami with a B.A. in physical education and went on to be drafted No. 60 overall in the fourth round of the 1971 NBA Draft by the Baltimore Bullets. After a short career in the ABA and playing professionally in Belgium, Allen started a career in marketing with Proctor and Gamble. In 1993, he left Proctor and Gamble and purchased Growing Power, a plant nursery on the north side of Milwaukee, Wis. The Rockville, Md., native has since been recognized as a leader in the industry of urban farming and sustainable food production. The "Teddy" award is the highest honor the NCAA bestows upon individuals.

## **CANE HOOPER NAMED TO PRO BOWL**

Former Cane hooper Jimmy Graham (2005-09) was one of five New Orleans Saints to be named to the 2012 NFL Pro Bowl.

Graham, a tight end, had 12 receptions for 158 yards and three touchdowns in the postseason for the Saints. In two years with New Orleans, Graham has 142 receptions for 1,824 yards and 19 touchdowns.

With 1,310 regular season receiving yards, Graham broke Kellen Winslow's 31-year-old NFL record of 1,290 receiving yards in a season by a tight end. But New England Patriots tight end Rob Gronkowski, notched 1,327 yards this season to put his name atop the record listing.

At Miami, Graham played basketball from 2005-2009, graduated with a double major in marketing and management, then joined the 2009 football team while taking graduate classes. That season he totaled 17 receptions for 213 yards and five touchdowns. Graham averaged 4.2 ppg, shooting 49.5 percent from the field, and 4.2 rpg in 120 games in his four years with the Miami men's basketball team.

#### **CANES WEARING LEBRON COLORWAYS**

The University of Miami was one of three university basketball teams to hit the court on October 14 in their own colorways of the new Nike LEBRON 9. The Hurricanes are playing in white/white/gorge green/total orange this season. Miami's colorway shoe became available on retail on Nov. 29. Light yet powerful, like its namesake, LeBron James -- and designed in conjunction with his insight -- the LEBRON 9 is the first shoe to integrate Flywire technology and Hyperfuse construction in the upper for superior support. The shoe also combines Max Air 180 and a Nike Zoom unit for comfort and responsiveness.

## MIAMI IS A TOP ACADEMIC INSTITUTION

Already the top academic institution in the state of Florida and a world-renowned research institution, the University of Miami and its Department of Athletics are building upon its reputation for developing world-class students. In the 2012 edition of the U.S. News & World Report's annual issue, the University of Miami rose to number 38 - up from 47 last year, a nine-point rise. UM remains the highest ranked school in the state of Florida.

Named after President Theodore Roosevelt, whose concern for the conduct of intercollegiate athletics led to the formation of the NCAA in 1906, this annual award is given to an individual "for whom competitive athletics in college and attention to physical well-being thereafter have been important factors in a distinguished career of national significance and achievement."

## **CANES IMPROVE STRENGTH AND SPEED**

Miami adapted to many changes in the past few months with the addition of coaches and new philosophies. Now the team is learning how basketball is not just about playing defense and shooting a basketball, it's also about the weight room. Since Strength and Conditioning Coach Jim Krumpos joined the staff in the spring, the men's basketball team has increased its strength and speed exponentially. The players were first tested in various strength and agility tests in late May, then were checked again the first week of October. Within those five months, the Canes tremendously improved their team averages on the one-step vertical jump (two inches), the bench press average maximum (26 pounds), the 185 test (3.7 reps) and the mile run (90 seconds). Individually, Malcolm Grant and DeQuan Jones each added four inches to their one-step vertical jump, closely followed by a 3.5-inch increase by Garrius Adams. Four players - Raphael Akpejiori, Rion Brown, DeQuan Jones and Trey McKinney Jones - increased their leg press weight by 180 pounds and three players - Akpejiori, Reggie Johnson and Jones added 50 pounds to their bench press maximums. In the 185 test, bench pressing 185 pounds as many times as possible, Johnson upped his mark by eight reps and Adams added seven more up-and-downs. Adams and Jones also had major improvements in the chin up (body weight plus weight attached to a belt), notching 69 more pounds per pull up than their previous mark. In the mile run, Justin Heller and Durand Scott each knocked off at least three minutes from their original time, while Jones took two fewer minutes on his second testing. Akpejiori ran a team-best mile with a time of 5:22, closely followed by Rion Brown at 5:23.

#### **GODFREY SELECTED FOR THE 2012 ACC TOURNAMENT LEGENDS CLASS**

Miami's Ron Godfrey, who played basketball for the Canes from 1958-61 and coached the squad through four seasons, has been selected to the 2012 class of Atlantic Coast Conference Men's Basketball Tournament Legends Godfrey (1958-61), one of the finest forwards to play at Miami, was an honorable mention All-America as a senior in 1961. He finished his career ranked in the Top Ten in seven career categories in the Miami record book including 7th in points (1,384), 7th in field goals made (518), 6th in free throws made (384) and 7th in rebounds (767). Godfrey's totals of 159 free throws made and 207 free throws attempted in 1960 still rank 5th and 6th in the Hurricane career lists. His total of 22 made free throws against Oklahoma City in 1960 is still tied with Rick Barry for the most made in a game by a Miami player. For his career, he averaged 17.5 points a game. Playing alongside former Miami All-America Dick Hickox, Godfrey helped lead the Hurricanes to their first-ever NCAA tournament bid in 1960 as the Canes finished with a sparkling 23-4 record. In his senior year, Godfrey led Miami to a 20-7 mark and a berth in the National Invitation Tournament. In his three varsity seasons, Godfrey helped the Hurricanes to a 61-18 record. As a coach, he guided Miami for four seasons, leading the Hurricanes to championships in the 1967 Hurricane Classic and the 1968 Marshall Tournament and was inducted into the Miami Sports Hall of Fame in 1988. A native of Martins Ferry, Ohio, he now resides in Coral Springs, Fla.

Jim Larranaga was named the 12th head coach of the University of Mi-
mi men's basketball program on April 22, 2011.

ami men's basketball program on April 22, 2011. Larranaga came to Miami after serving as the head coach at George Mason for 14 seasons. He guided the program to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2011, 2008, 2006, 2001, 1999) – including an unprecedented run to the 2006 Final Four that captured the nation's attention, defeating Michigan State, North Carolina, Wichita State and Connecticut along the way. Following that run, he was selected the 2006 Clair Bee Coach of the Year. Larranaga built the Patriots' program into a perennial contender in the highly-regarded Colonial Athletic Association, winning more games than any other coach in program and conference history (273) en route to three conference titles (2008, 2001, 1999). A two-time CAA Coach of the Year honoree, Larranaga earned the ac-colade in 2011, leading the Patriots to a 27-7 overall record and 16-2 confer-ence mark en route to the CAA regular-season title and their fifth NCAA Tour-nament appearance under his leadership. Seeded a program-best eighth in the NCAA fournament, George Mason rallied from a double-digit deficit to defeat ninth-seeded Villanova, 61-57, before falling to overall No. 1 seed Ohio State in the third round.

Larranaga's teams are known for their offensive efficiency and a frenetic defense dubbed the "Scramble." Last season, his Patriots – who were ranked 24th in the final RPI – finished the season 11th in the nation in three-point 24th in the final RPI – finished the season 11th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage (39.5), 18th in scoring margin (10.3), 22nd in turn-overs (11.1), 26th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.28) and 37th in scoring de-fense (62.5). During its 16-game win streak – which catapulted Mason to No. 25 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll on Feb. 28 – all but forur victories came by a double-digit margin. That streak included the 71-51 win at VCU on Feb. 15, with Mason holding the Rams to a season-low offensive output. He became Mason's all-time leader in men's basketball victories with his 131st win on January 22, 2005, with a 77-58 decision at James Madison. He became the CAA's all-time leader in wins on February 4, 2006, when the Patri-ots defeated UNC Wilmington. His Mason teams went 182-89 in CAA play.

ots defeated UNC Wilmington. His Mason teams went 182-89 in CAA play. In 2006, Larranaga became the first coach at a mid-major school to take his team to the Final Four in 27 years and earned an at-large berth for a CAA team for the first time in 20 years. Along the way, he led Mason to a school record in wins, the program's first-ever national ranking, George Mason's first-ever ap-pearance in the Top 10 and the school's first wins over Top 10 teams. The Patriots finished the year with a 27-8 record and a No.8 ranking in the final USA Today/ESPN Coaches Poll. Earlier that season, Mason cracked the polls at No. 25, but NCAA tournament wins over Michigan State, No. 10 North Carolina, Wichita State and No. 2 connecticut vaulted Mason up the poll, and into the national con-science making Largnaga a household name

The remarkable run at George Mason began just two years into Larranaga's tenure. After going 9-18 in his first year with the Patriots in 1997-98, Larranaga guided the 1999 Patriots' squad to a 19-11 overall record and a 13-3 CAA mark. That season, he earned his first Coach of the Year accolades in the CAA and NABC District 4 after making a 10-game improvement and leading the program to its first over company council coach of the Year accolades in the CAA and NABC title and first ever conference regular season championship, its second CAA Tournament title and first NCAA Tournament appearance since 1989. The Patriots followed that with another 19-11 over-

all mark in 1999-2000, tying for first place in the CAA at 12-4 and earning the top seed in the conference tourna-ment. In 2000-01, the Patriots finished 18-12 overall and 11-5 in the CAA, good for a tie for second place, and they won the CAA Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second time in three years. The Patriots produced another solid campaign with a 19-10 overall record (13-5 in the CAA) and a NIT berth in 2001-02. Mason's 2002-03 roster was hampered by injuries, but man-aged to pull together a 16-12 record (11-7 in the CAA), and a fourth-place CAA finish.

In 1986-87, the Falcons were the nation's most improved team under a first-year head coach that took over a program with a losing record, posting a 15-14 record for an eight-game improvement over the previous season. Larranaga went on to record a 170-144 mark in 11 years at Bowling Green, earning the 1997 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year honors after leading Bowling Green to a 22-10 record, a conference regular season co-championship and a berth in the National Invitation Tournament. The 22 victories were the most by a Bowling Green toam is d7 worr and the 13 conference were the most by a Bowling Green team in 47 years and the 13 conference wins were the second-highest

total in Falcon history. Larranaga's 170 victories at Bowling Green ranked second all-time on the Larrahagas 1/0 victories at bowing ureen ranked second an-unite on the Falcons' coaching list and he was only the second coach in the program to record consecutive postseason appearances. Larranaga led his squad to NIT berths in 1990 (18-11) and again in 1991 (17-13), the first time the Falcons enjoyed back-to-back postseason appearances since the early'60s. Bowling Green won better than 61 percent of its games in Larranaga's last four years, recording a 70-44 mark during that stretch. The Falcons finished fourth or better in the MAC in five of Larranaga's 11 ceasons and he is among the winninget coaches in MAC his. of Larranaga's 11 seasons and he is among the winningest coaches in MAC his-

tory. Larranaga received his first head coaching position in 1977 when he was

Larranaga received his first head coaching position in 1977 when he was named to the post at American International, a Division II program in Spring-field, Mass. Taking over a team that had suffered through five consecutive losing seasons prior to his arrival, Larranaga turned AIC into a winning program in his first year and compiled a 28-25 mark in two seasons. A 1971 graduate of Providence College with a degree in economics, Lar-ranaga was a four-year letterman for the Friars. As the team captain in his senior season, he led Providence to a 20-8 record and an NIT appearance. He graduated as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer with 1,258 points and was selected in the sixth round of the draft by the Detroit Pistons of the National Basketball Association. He was the team's top scorer as a sophornore and junior and was named New England's Division I Sophomore of the Year in 1969. He was inducted into the Providence College Hall of Fame in 1991. His first coaching opportunity came at Davidson College, where he served as an assistant coach to Terry Holland. Davidson captured three Southern Confer-ence regular-season championships and an NIT berth in his fire years there, and he compiled a 47-12 record doubling as the freshman team coach. In 1976, he left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball

left Davidson and spent one season as player-coach for the Geronemo Basketball Club in Belgium.

After his two-year stint at American International, Larranaga was reunited After his two-year stint at American International, Larranaga was reunited with Holland at the University of Virginia in April 1979. An assistant coach under Holland for seven seasons from 1979-86, he helped the Cavaliers reach the NCAA Final Four on two occasions (1981, 1984), finish in the top five of the AP and UPI polls and average more than 24 victories per season. The Cavaliers were 169-62, won three regular-season Atlantic Coast Conference championships and made four NCAA Tournament appearances. Virginia also made a pair of NIT appear-ances, winning the NIT Championship in 1980. Larranaga was on the staff during the careers of three-time National Player of the Year Ralph Sampson and NBA first-round draft choice Olden Polynice. ## Michael Huger Defensive Coordinator

**Michael Huger** enters his first season at the University of Miami and his fifth season as an assistant coach for head coach Jim Larranaga assisting in all aspects of the program. He brings six seasons of collegiate coaching experience and nearly a dozen years of professional basketball experience to Coral Gables.

In four seasons at George Mason, Huger helped lead the Patriots to the postseason every year, including NCAA berths in 2008 and 2011. In 2011, the team defeated Villanova to advance to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, earned a regular-season CAA title and posted a school-record tying 27 wins. In 2009, he helped Mason to an NIT bid and its secondstraight 20-win season. In 2008, Huger helped the Patriots to their second-highest win total in school history as they beat nationally-ranked Kansas State and won the CAA title for the first time since 2001.

Huger began his coaching career at Longwood University (Va.) under Mike Gillian, a former Mason assistant coach under Larranaga, where he spent two seasons.

Before joining the coaching ranks, Huger played professional basketball in Europe, spending two years in Holland (1994-96) and nine in Belgium (1996-2005). He was selected Dutch League MVP in 1996 after averaging 25.3 points and 5.8 assists, and went on to earn First Team All-Belgium honors in 2000 and 2004 after leading his clubs to Belgium Cup championships in both seasons.

A native of New York City, Huger is a 1994 graduate of Bowling Green State University with a bachelor's degree in education. There he played for Larranaga from 1989-93, helping the Falcons to a pair of NIT appearances. He earned Mid-American Conference honors in his final two seasons, and was a Naismith Award nominee and the runner-up for conference player of the year as a senior. As a prep player, he helped lead Stevenson High School (Bronx) to back-to-back PSAL City Championships in 1988 and 1989.

Huger and his wife, Tonya, have a son, Michael Anthony II.

## Eric Konkol Offensive Coordinator

**Eric Konkol** enters his first season at the University of Miami and eighth as a member of head coach Jim Larranaga's staff. He assists in all aspects of the program including recruiting, practices, individual player workouts and game preparation.

Konkol previously worked with Larranaga at George Mason from 2002-03 through 2004-05 and 2007-08 through last season, helping to develop 12 All-CAA selections, five CAA All-Rookie honorees and 16 professional players. In the interim, he spent two years coaching at national power Hopkins High School in Minnesota under Ken Novak, Jr. - who was named 2011 ESPN RISE National Boy's Basketball Coach of the Year - and had a short stint on the coaching staff at North Dakota State.

He served as Mason's scouting director from 2002-05 and helped recruit the top non-BCS recruiting class in 2009 according to ESPN.com. Additionally, he monitored the academic progress of the men's basketball student-athletes, graduating 20-of-22 student-athletes who completed their eligibility - with two more students graduating in May 2011. In both 2009 and 2010, the program was recognized by the NCAA with an Academic Progress Rate in the nation's top 10 percent.

Konkol previously worked on Buzz Peterson's staff as a student assistant for NIT champion Tulsa in 2000-01 and as a graduate administrative assistant at Tennessee in 2001-02, earning a master's degree in sport management.

A native of Amherst, Wis., Konkol is a 2000 graduate of the University of Wisconsin at Eau Claire with a bachelor's degree in kinesiology, with an emphasis in exercise management. He played three seasons of basketball for the Division III program - advancing to the national championship game in 2000. He received the team's inspiration award after his junior and senior seasons with the Blugolds, and was an honorary captain as a senior.

He spent his first two years, including one redshirt season, at the University of Wisconsin at Platteville playing for current Wisconsin head coach Bo Ryan. A 1995 graduate of Amherst High School, he was a three-sport athlete (basketball, baseball and cross country) and closed his prep career as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,871 points.

Konkol and his wife Meagan, have two sons, Ethan and Ryan.

## Chris Caputo Scout Team Coordinator

**Chris Caputo** enters his first season with the Hurricanes and his 10th season on head coach Jim Larranaga's staff. Entering his seventh season as an assistant coach, his primary responsibilities include recruiting and scouting the opposition.

Caputo played a major role in George Mason's run to the Final Four in 2006, putting together scouting reports to prepare the Patriots as they played nationally-ranked teams and future NBA players in nearly every round.

He has also helped lead the Patriots to the postseason for a Mason-record four-straight seasons, including NCAA berths in 2008 and 2011. In 2011, the team defeated Villanova to advance to the third round of the NCAA Tournament, earned a regular-season CAA title and posted a school-record tying 27 wins. In 2009, he helped Mason to an NIT bid and its second-straight 20win season. In 2008, Caputo helped the Patriots to their second-highest win total in school history as they beat nationally-ranked Kansas State and won the CAA title for the first time since 2001.

As an assistant at Mason, Hoopscoop.com named him one of the Top 25 non-BCS assistant coaches in the nation. In 2010, Caputo attended the Villa 7 Consortium, an educational symposium and networking opportunity for some of the nation's top assistants. In 2011 alone, 19 alumni of Villa 7 have been hired as head coaches.

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# Fast Breaks: Garrius Adams

They are stories of perseverance. Stories about growing up, becoming men and being a part of a family. One-by-one, we hear from them. These are the Miami Hurricanes...

**I was raised** in Raleigh, NC. I was born and raised there. I was the only child and I had a lot of family to support me. When I was growing up I played basketball and soccer. Soccer was actually my first love. I played soccer until I was 13 or 14. It got way too hot in North Carolina, it's like a dry heat, so I just stuck with an indoor sport.

I started playing basketball when I was five or six. Probably because that's when those Fisher Price goals started coming out and I was dunking and all of your friends were talking about how high you could dunk on your Fisher Price goal.

**I secretly wish** I was five inches taller. I wish I was 7 feet. I feel like everything in basketball would be so much better if I was 7 feet.

**I'm a Miami Hurricane because** of my teammates, because of how they treated me so well on my visit. Also because I have a grandmother here and she always wanted me to visit more and it was awkward because I did not know I would be going here. Since I was an only child and really close to my family I thought I would stay in the state of North Carolina. But after taking a visit, I met my grandmother and just seeing her again here, I knew I would have another time here outside of school. She comes to games and tries to be the loudest one in the stands.

When I played basketball as a kid, I pretended to be Kobe Bryant, that was my favorite player. He still is, hands down. There was nobody else I imitated. I always watched Michael Jordan but Kobe was more of my time and he was doing all of the dunks and he was athletic and I stuck with him.

**Playing basketball** has given me something to do to keep me occupied and it is what I've been doing since I was a little kid. It's one of the best things I know how to do. It's kept me out of a lot of trouble.

**My family** is mostly from the East Coast. I probably have a family member in every state on the East Coast which is good because I always have support. My family is really strong and really close so my family is really big to me.

**Competition is** hard work and fun. Being born and raised in North Carolina, the ACC is everything. Competition is the most fun I've had, just being in this conference every night in and out.

**I am a Hurricane** because I wanted to play in the ACC. I grew up watching my dad play at Georgia Tech and all the ACC teams. I just felt like this would be a great place to live. They had a great coaching staff before and they have a great coaching staff now, so it felt like this is where I belong.
