No. 15 Hurricanes Conclude Yearly Series with Owls...

The No. 15 University of Miami baseball team is set to host its final non-conference opponent of the 2011 regular season Tuesday, May, 17, welcoming South Florida foe Florida Atlantic University to Alex Rodriguez Park at 6 p.m. Gates will open at 4:30 p.m.

Miami (32-18) is preparing for a rigorous week, playing four games in five days – beginning with the Owls of Florida Atlantic (30-20) out of the Sun Belt Conference, and concluding with its final ACC series with Duke. This will be the rubber match of the yearly series between the Hurricanes and Owls, with the series standing at 1-all – and the home team winning each of the contests to date. UM took the last contest in Coral Gables on March 15, using a 7-3 advantage behind the pitching of sophomore Steven Ewing.

The Hurricanes are coming into the week after a tough weekend at top-ranked Virginia, where UMiami took the opening game of the three-game tilt, before the Cavaliers bounced back for a pair of one-run victories in two classic pitching duels. UM enters Tuesday's contest having won 10 of its last 11 non-conference outings – dropping the last game to Hofstra in the three-game series finale on May 8 at Alex Rodriguez Park.

Miami is led offensively by junior center fielder Nathan Melendres with a .329 batting average on 50 hits (12 doubles, two triples) and fellow junior left fielder/designated hitter Rony Rodriguez hitting at a .306 clip with 49 hits – including a team-leading nine home runs and 32 RBI. Over the weekend at Virginia, Rodriguez hit his ninth homer of the season with a shot to left field in the upset win over the top-ranked Cavaliers as part of the series-opener on May 13.

Sophomore outfielder/infielder Zeke DeVoss leads the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) with 28 stolen bases, as well as helping the Hurricanes with a team second-best 52 hits – adding 11 doubles, three triples and a team-high 47 walks (third most in the league). Freshman third baseman Brad Fieger and junior first baseman Harold Martinez each hold a .293 batting average, while Fieger has a team-high 54 hits and team-high matching 12 doubles. At the plate, Fieger has just 19 strikeouts in a team-leading 184 at-bats.

On Tuesday, Miami will send sophomore left-hander Steven Ewing to the mound for the third time this season against the Owls. Ewing enters working on a 7-1 record – his only loss being a 7-4 setback in Boca Raton against FAU in his first start of the season. Following back-to-back no-decision contests at USF and at home against Illinois State, Ewing has collected seven consecutive wins in posting a team-leading 2.49 ERA – good for seventh place in the league.

In his last outing against the Owls, Ewing went six innings on the bump, giving up three unearned runs on just two hits while striking out eight FAU batters and walking two in the win.

FAU will counter tomorrow night with right-hander Jake Meiers, who also started the last contest against UMiami on March 15. Meiers owns a record of 4-5 on the campaign, and uses an ERA of 4.83. Meiers took the loss in the last game against the Hurricanes, going 5 1/3 innings with seven runs (four earned) on six hits and striking out three with three walks.

Scouting the Florida Atlantic Owls...

Florida Atlantic enters the game with a 30-20 record, and holds a record of 16-11 in the Sun Belt Conference. The Owls are led at the dish by six players hitting above a .300 mark, starting at the top with left fielder Alex Hudak, now staking a .383 average on a team-leading 67 hits (15 doubles, three home runs). Behind him are shortstop Nick Delguidice (.337) and Raymond Church (.332). Delguidice leads the Owls with 40 RBI and 19 doubles, while Dan Scheffler and Andy Mee each lead the team in homers with four apiece.

Miami Against Florida Atlantic...

Miami leads the all-time series with FAU, 48-9, with the two teams splitting two games played this season – as the home team won each contest in Boca Raton and Coral Gables, respectively. FAU took the series-opener on Feb. 23, using a 7-4 decision, and UM came back for a 7-3 win on March 15. UM has won eight of the last 10 meetings between the two schools.

Now You See Them, Now You Don't...

Sophomore **Zeke DeVoss** and junior **Nathan Melendres** not only flash brilliance at the plate, but they are bringing it on the base paths as well. DeVoss leads the Hurricanes and the league in stolen bases (28), while teammate Melendres is second on the squad and seventh in the ACC with 19.

Bringing the Orlando Magic...

Sophomore pitcher **Steven Ewing** may have come to South Florida from

In his 18th season at Miami, no other program, nor head coach, has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a NCAA-record 38 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 17 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 26 years, 17 at Miami and nine at Georgia Tech.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 808-316-3 (.716) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,312-560-4 (.699) Division I record in 29 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 32 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,443-601-4 (.705) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 18 years, Morris has personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and has logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the new stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 26th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2010 when he guided the 'Canes to the NCAA Coral Gables Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 17 seasons (1994-2010), winning 15 of his last 17 appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris has led the 2010 Hurricanes to their 38th-straight NCAA Tournament. Five players from the 2010 team were selected in last year's Major League Baseball Draft. In 2008, the 'Canes reached the College World Series after winning the Atlantic Coast Conference, widely considered one of the toughest - if not the toughest - collegiate baseball conference in the country.

MORRIS IN HIS 33RD SEASON AS A COLLEGE COACH

Morris currently has a 1,312-560-4 (.699) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,443-601-4 (.705) record over 30-plus years.

Jim Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern on March 23, 2001.

Prior to his 17 seasons in Coral Gables, Morris went 504-244-1 at Georgia Tech from 1982-1993. In his first stint as a head coach, he guided DeKalb Junior College to a 131-41 mark from 1976-79.

JIM MORRIS MAKING HISTORY

- Guided the Miami Hurricanes to College World Series National Championship in 1999 and 2001.
- The only coach in NCAA history to take a school to the College World Series in each of his first six years at a program. Morris has gone to Omaha with Miami in 11 of 17 seasons and led Miami to 13 straight NCAA Regional Championships, an NCAA record.
- Named National Coach of the Year five times while at Miami, by Baseball America in 1994 and by the ABCA and Collegiate Baseball in 1999 and 2001.

SHORTSTOPS AND JIM MORRIS

Morris, who played shortstop during college at Elon and then in the Boston Red Sox organization, has had great success developing the position while a head coach. Over the last decade Morris has taught prominent shortstops such as Nomar Garciaparra at Georgia Tech and Bobby Hill and Alex Cora at Miami.

Morris worked with Javy Rodriguez, who entered 2002 as a preseason All-American. Rodriguez led UM in just about every category as a junior in 2001, including a national-high 66 stolen bases. He currently works with sophomore Stephen Perez, a slick-fielding switch-hitter expected to bat near the upper-half of the order this year for the 'Canes.

Morris coached Hill, who played for the San Diego Padres, from 1997-99. Before Hill, it was Cora and Mike Metcalfe. Both players went on to play at the Major League level with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cora is currently with the Nationals. Garciaparra played under Morris during the coaches' final two seasons in Atlanta and went on to become an All-Star with the Red Sox and played for the Oakland A's in 2009.

Last Time vs. Florida Atlantic – March 15, 2011...

Three University of Miami pitchers combined to strikeout 13 while allowing just two FAU hits in a quick 7-3 win over the Owls Tuesday night at Alex Rodriguez Park. Starter Steven Ewing and relievers Adam Sargent and Daniel

Miranda combined to retire the final 16 batters, as a two-out, fourth-inning walk marked the last time anyone would reach base for the Owls.

The win moves Miami to 9-8 overall while FAU fell to 11-7.

Making his fourth mid-week start of the season, Ewing (1-1) recorded a career-high eight strikeouts in earning his first win. For the big left-hander, the outing looked a lot more like his last – when he allowed just one run in five innings to Illinois State last week – than it did his last time out against the Owls, when he surrendered four earned runs in 4 1/3 innings.

Tuesday night, the Orlando native allowed three unearned runs on just two hits while walking two and piling up his record strikeout total in six innings of work.

He was relieved by Sargent, who struck out three in two innings before Miranda came on to strikeout two more in a scoreless ninth.

FAU starter Jake Meiers (1-3) suffered the loss, allowing seven runs – four earned – on six hits while walking three and striking out three in 5 1/3 innings. Ahmed Garcia and Hugh Adams went the rest of the way for the Owls, holding the 'Canes scoreless over the final 2 2/3 innings.

Miami got all the runs it would need in a four-run first, but added three more three innings later. The 'Canes have combined to scored 18 over

their last two games after an 11-run showing against Virginia Tech on Sunday.

Harold Martinez finished the night 2-for-4 with two runs scored for the 'Canes, while Michael Broad went 1-for-3 with a two-run triple and Nathan Melendres and Zeke DeVoss each chipped in with an RBI.

The lone FAU

hits came off the bats off Colby Gratton (1-for-2, one run) and Nick Delguidice (1-for-3).

UM didn't waste any time getting on the board in this one, scoring four runs in the bottom of the first, mostly capitalizing off FAU miscues. After DeVoss scored the first run on a Melendres ground-out, a pair of FAU errors allowed three more runners to cross. Runs two and three came in on a dropped fly ball in right-center before run No. 4 came in on a throwing error by shortstop Delguidice.

Miami returned the favor in the third when a throwing error by Ewing led to three unearned runs for FAU.

But that would be as close as the Owls would get all night.

The following inning, Miami went back up by four on Broad's big triple followed by a sacrifice fly to left off the bat of DeVoss.

The rest of the game belonged to the pitchers, who put up a bunch of zeros the rest of the way.

With 2,641 in attendance, the game lasted just 2 hours and 11 minutes, much in part to yet another impressive outing by the UM pitching staff, who boasts a 2.65 ERA and has held opponents to three runs or less nine times already this season.

Miami will return to action this weekend when it travels to Winston-Salem, N.C. for a three-game ACC series against Wake Forest. Game one of the series is slated for Friday at 6 p.m.

Last Time Out... No. 1 Virginia Takes Series from No. 16 Miami (May 15, 2011)...

The No. 1 Virginia Cavaliers scored four runs with two outs in the seventh inning to take down the visiting No. 16 Miami Hurricanes by a count of 5-4 at Davenport Field in the rubber match of the three-game Atlantic Coast Conference baseball series. UVa took the series, 2-1, winning the final two games on Saturday and Sunday.

It was a case of déjà vu for the Hurricanes (32-18, 17-9 Atlantic Coast Conference) in the seventh inning – mirroring the sixth in almost the exact same fashion. Starting pitcher E.J. Encinosa hits the batter with two outs; the runner takes second on a steal; and the next batter knocks him in. That would lead to the big inning the top-ranked Cavaliers were seeking against the hard-throwing Encinosa, who had kept them under control for 6 2/3 innings.

With the game tied at 1-all, Virginia's David Coleman was hit by an Encinosa pitch and then took second base on a steal. That allowed first baseman Jared King to cross him with a two-out double down the right field line over the first base bag – advancing the Cavs to a 2-1 lead.

The next two batters for UVa – Werman and Taylor – each registered doubles to blow open the game at 4-1.

The fifth and final run for the Cavaliers (45-6, 22-5 ACC) came across off relief pitcher Daniel Miranda when John Barr singled to right center to plate Taylor, before being called out trying to advance to second on the throw to the plate. A play that went 9-2-6 earned the third out, but the damage was already done.

But a resilient Hurricanes team mounted a comeback attempt in the ninth that was almost similar to Saturday's contest. With UVa closer Branden Kline on the mound to try and close the game out, the Miami bats came alive.

Nathan Melendres singled and Rony Rodriguez reached on an error by shortstop Chris Taylor to put two men on to begin the ninth. Both runners would advance on a wild pitch before Harold Martinez hit a deep sacrifice fly to center field to plate Melendres and advance Rodriguez. The Hurricanes would make it 5-4 in the next at-bat, using a Brad Fieger RBI single to center in order to advance Rodriguez 90 feet to the plate.

Chantz Mack entered the game as a pinch runner for Fieger, but was caught stealing second for the second out of the inning. After Dale Carey walked to put the tying run on first, sophomore pinch hitter Cade Kreuter represented the go-ahead run – but a Kline slider struck him out swinging, stopping the Canes' rally attempt just short for the second consecutive day.

Miami opened the game's scoring with a double-steal by Stephen Perez and Nathan Melendres. The throw to get Melendres at second was high from UVa catcher John Hicks, with the ball rolling into center field to allow the speedy Perez to trot in from third for the 1-0 Canes advantage.

The Hurricanes had a chance to widen the lead when Rony Rodriguez hit a ball right to second baseman Keith Werman, but UM's Nathan Melendres was thrown out at the plate streaking home from third on the hit, as the throw from Werman was well in time for the out to Hicks at the plate.

Virginia tied it up in the bottom of the sixth as the Cavs took advantage of Barr being hit by a pitch and stealing second. The tying run came across off the bat of John Hicks with a two-out single through the right side.

Martinez extended his hitting streak to a team-high 11 games with a single to start the bottom of the third inning...Of the 15 combined hits in the game, only two went for extra bases...**Zeke DeVoss** and Mike McGee doubled for the Hurricanes and Seminoles, respectively...The crowd of 4,291 set a new season-high for attendance at Alex Rodriguez Park...The previous best was 3,908 in an extra inning win against NC State on April 9 when the program honored the 2001 national championship team...Sophomore **Eric Whaley** (6-2, 3.00 ERA) will look to get the Hurricanes a win on Saturday night in game two of the series, going up against Hunter Scantling (3-0, 2.25 ERA). Game time is set for 7 pm...With two sacrifice bunts and a sac fly in the second inning, the Hurricanes posted the most amount of sacrifice hits in an inning since April 30, 2005, when they had three in the first inning against Maryland (one sac bunt, two sac fly).

The 18th-year UMiami skipper enters elite company with the win, joining just four other active Division I coaches to achieve the honor – Augie Garrido (Texas), Gene Stephenson (Wichita State), Mike Martin (Florida State) and Mark Marquess (Stanford).
• Others close to the honor include Pete Dunn (Stetson) and Jim Gilligan (Lamar).

Athletics Gets a Changing of the Guard...

• On April 12, 2011, the University of Miami officially announced the hiring of Shawn Eichorst as the new Director of Athletics for the Hurricanes. He took over for Interim Director of Athletics, Tony Hernandez, who was serving in the position vacated by former AD Kirby Hocutt who left in March for a similar position at Texas Tech University. Eichorst comes to UMiami from the University of Wisconsin, having also served in the Department of Athletics at the University of South Carolina.

Former Cane Gets MLB Contract Extension...

- Former University of Miami outfielder and current Milwaukee Brewers left fielder Ryan Braun signed a \$105-million, five-year contract extension with the Brewers on Thursday, April 21. The deal includes a mutual option for one additional year worth up to \$20 million and is the longest commitment to a player in Brewers franchise history.
- Braun gets a \$10-million signing bonus and will make salaries of \$19 million a year in 2016-18, \$18 million in 2019, \$16 million in 2020. The mutual option is worth up to \$20 million with a \$4-million buyout.

Rony Rodriguez Picks Up Weekly ACC Award for Canes...

- After hitting .750 and producing his team-leading fourth home run in helping the University of Miami to a perfect 3-0 week, junior infielder **Rony Rodriguez** has been selected as the Atlantic Coast Conference Baseball Co-Player of the Week for the week of March 28 – April 3. He shares the award with Clemson infielder Richie Shaffer for the week of April 4. On the week, Miami defeated Florida Gulf Coast and Boston College, respectively.
- Rodriguez, who started all three games last week for the Hurricanes at first base, led Miami in batting average with a .750 clip, producing six hits in eight official at-bats – including two walks and scoring seven runs. His 80.0 percent on-base percentage is the best for any Hurricanes performer in a week at this point on the campaign.
- The Sunset High alum and former Miami Dade College product, now in his second year as a UMiami student-athlete, helped keep the Hurricanes perfect on the road in ACC play at 5-0 – using a doubleheader sweep of Boston College on Sunday in 19-4 and 7-6 (5 innings) wins in Chestnut Hill, Mass. His slugging percentage for the week was 1.125, and he was perfect defensively with 14 putouts and an assist, all coming at the first base position.

• Against Boston College, Rodriguez was 2-for-2 with three runs scored and two walks in the doubleheader opener, only to follow with a 2-for-3 performance in the nightcap – registering a solo home run in the fifth, which proved to be the game-winning RBI for the 7-6 decision in the curfew rule enforced five inning affair.

• **Game 2:** With the win, head coach **Jim Morris** earned his 1,300th Division I victory...At four hours and five minutes (4hr, 5 mins) – tonight's game was the longest for the Hurricanes this season...**David Villasuso's** game-winning double was his sixth of the season and his first game-winning hit of the year...Miami's 14-runs scored are the fifth double-digit outpour in winning-fashion on the year for the Hurricanes...UM has scored an amazing 65 runs in its last six games dating back to the conclusion of the Georgia Tech series...Starting pitcher **Eric Whaley** has gotten out every first batter he's faced this season. game's ceremonial first pitch...Miami head coach **Jim Morris** is familiar with the Yellow Jackets, having coached Georgia Tech from 1982-93 winning 504 games...Since moving from third base on March 11 versus Virginia Tech, **Harold Martinez** has resurged as a hitter going on a nine-game hitting streak... Before March 11, he was batting just .167. Since the switch, he is hitting .441...Tonight's game marks the sixth time this season in which the 'Canes have committed at least four errors...It also marks the second game in a row with at least four errant plays...Tonight's six errors are the most by a UM team since the 'Canes committed seven at Florida in the 2010 Gainesville Super Regional...Junior pitcher **Sam Abrams**, in 6 2/3 innings, has yet to give up a run this season...The bullpen's streak of 22 consecutive innings without an earned run came to an end when freshman Javi Salas gave up three runs in the eighth.

• **Game 2:** With two RBI's on two hits, freshman **Dale Carey** recorded the first multi-hit game of his career...Carey is now on a three game hitting streak... Coming into the beginning of the week, Carey had only recorded one hit on the year...**Harold Martinez**, despite getting on base twice, was unable to get a hit to extend his hitting streak, which ended at nine games...Junior relief pitcher **Sam Robinson** gave up a double to lead off the eighth inning...This was the first extra-base hit given up by Robinson this season, after 16 previous innings without allowing an extra base hit...However, now with 17 innings pitched in 15 different appearances, Robinson has yet to allow a run...Junior closer **Daniel Miranda** also gave up the first home run of his season in the top of the 10th inning...Since moving from third base on March 11 versus Virginia Tech, **Harold Martinez** has resurged as a hitter going on a nine-game hitting streak...Before March 11, he was batting just .167...Since the switch, he is hitting .395 with a .425 on base percentage...After committing a season-high six errors the night before, the Miami defense, with the same lineup, responded with an error-free performance...All nine Georgia Tech runs in the 10th inning came with two outs...The 12 runs by the Yellow Jackets are the most allowed by the Hurricanes this year.

• **Game 3:** Junior **Harold Martinez** started at shortstop every game of this series, and has started all 25 games this season...Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** made his first start of the series behind the plate and batted eighth in the lineup...Starting pitcher **Eric Whaley** continues to pitch brilliantly, striking out a career-high 10 batters through seven innings...Whaley only gave up one run on two hits, but did not factor in the decision...For Whaley, it was his third consecutive start with eight-or-more strikeouts, and his fourth of the season...Collecting their 15th straight win, Sunday marked the first time the Yellow Jackets of Georgia Tech ever swept the Hurricanes in Coral Gables, and the first sweep overall by Georgia Tech since 1967...The last time the 'Canes were swept by anyone at home was Clemson in 2006...Reliever **Sam Robinson** gave up a run in the top of the ninth inning...For Robinson, it was his first earned run given up after 17 2/3 innings this season...Today's match-up was the 78th all-time meeting between the two schools in a series that dates back to 1958...After committing a combined 10 errors in games on Wednesday (Florida Gulf Coast) and Friday (Georgia Tech), the Miami defense responded with back-to-back error-free performances on Saturday and Sunday against the Rambling Wreck.

Canes Overwhelm Eagles in Battle of the Birds (March 23)...

• **Zeke DeVoss** started in center field tonight in place of **Nathan Melendres** – who served as designated hitter – and **Chantz Mack** suited up in left field with **Rony Rodriguez** over in right field...Late in the game, head coach **Jim Morris** made defensive substitutions with Martinez playing shortstop; Rodriguez moving to first base; **Dale Carey** going to center and Mack moving to right...DeVoss recorded his team-high tying fifth double of the night in the fourth inning, before swiping his team-leading 11th steal of the season – reaching safely at third...Junior pitcher **Travis Miller** saw action in his second game this year, picking up his first win since May 2, 2010...Miller toed the rubber in the fifth inning in relief of starter **AJ Salcines**...Miller's only other action came against Illinois State (March 8)...**Daniel Miranda** picked up his team-best sixth save of the year – sitting second-best in the ACC in that category...Miranda earned his fifth save in the last six games – and his fifth consecutive when toeing the rubber in relief...For the sixth consecutive game, the UMIAMI bullpen did not allow a single run, this time using the combination of **Travis Miller** – who earned the win, **Adam Sargent**, **Sam Robinson** and **Daniel Miranda** for the final five frames in relief of starter **AJ Salcines** who tossed the first four frames...**Harold Martinez** recorded a hit in his eighth straight game tonight, using a single to right in the sixth inning...Since making the move to first base in the series-opener against Virginia Tech on March 11, Martinez has a team-high .467 average at the plate – adding a team-leading 14 hits and a slugging percentage of .533 during that span.

Rodriguez Is Burnt Orange and Money Green...

• After a blistering fall campaign, leading the Hurricanes in batting average and hits, junior infielder/outfielder **Rony Rodriguez** has burst out of the gates quickly as a team leader in the spring as well. Rodriguez was selected as the ACC Co-Player of the Week (April 4-10), and is second on the Hurricanes team in batting average (.316) while leading the Canes in home runs (6) and slugging percentage (.579).

Position Change...

• In the second game of the series against Virginia Tech, Miami head coach **Jim Morris** elected to move All-American third baseman **Harold Martinez** to first, in a straight switch with freshman **Brad Fieger**. Since the move, Martinez has a .955 fielding percentage and leads the team in batting average with a .379 clip over the course of the past 23 games.

One Whale of a Game...

• Sophomore pitcher **Eric Whaley** picked up his team-best third win of the year in Miami's series finale win (and series sweep) of Virginia Tech on Sunday, March 13, going a season-long tying seven innings — allowing just three hits and striking out three with zero walks issued to the Hokies. The Pompano Beach native has earned wins in all three home series finales on the campaign.

The ACC and the RPI – Best of the Best...

• The RPI formula is based on a team's winning percentage, its opponents winning percentage, and its opponent's opponents winning percentage, which are weighted to determine their RPI score. Baseball weights its RPI as .25 for winning percentage, .50 for opponents' winning percentage, and .25 for the opponents' opponents' winning percentage. The weighted values of these three categories are then added together to obtain a raw RPI score. The teams are then rank ordered based on this score, a ranking that is imperfect in its current form.

• The Atlantic Coast Conference not only has several teams rated amongst the top 15 in the latest RPI ranking, but as a conference, the ACC is second in 2011, behind only the SEC.

Miami Too Much for Demon Deacons on the Road (March 18-20)...

• Miami claimed its the sixth consecutive conference win with a sweep of the Demon Deacons on the road. It's the first time Miami has started the Atlantic Coast Conference season 6-0 since 2006...The Canes advanced to the College World Series that same year...The Hurricanes claimed their first three road wins of the year, entering the weekend 0-5 in that capacity...**Bryan Radziewski** laid claim to his third win of season while striking out a season-high 10 batters in 6 1/3 tossed on Friday night...**Eric Whaley** collected his team-leading fourth win of the season with six innings pitched, accounting for nine strikeouts and allowing three earned runs [a three-run homer]...**Zeke DeVoss** batted .500 for the weekend, scoring six runs and claiming five hits and walking a team-leading four times...**Harold Martinez** drove in the game-winning run in back-to-back games during the second and third game of the series, respectively...Junior **Rony Rodriguez** hit his third home run of the season in helping start a Canes come-from-behind win in Sunday's series finale.

Canes Sweep Hokies in Much-Anticipated Rematch (March 11-13)...

• The 'Canes opened up ACC play last Friday night with a win against the Virginia Tech Hokies. Miami has dominated Virginia Tech in Coral Gables, winning six of the seven match-ups on its home field. The 'Canes are now 5-3 all-time in ACC-opening games...**Nathan Melendres** returned to the lineup as well, playing center field after a four-game absence due to a hand injury...Playing Small Ball — Miami looked to manufacture runs against the Hokies, bunting

ALEX RODRIGUEZ PARK INFORMATION

Renovations to Alex Rodriguez Park are thanks in large part to a \$3.9 million contribution by New York Yankees third baseman and 11-time MLB All-Star Alex Rodriguez. The gift - the largest ever to the University of Miami baseball program - has assisted the program in continuing to develop first-class facilities. The official announcement of his gift was made on Oct. 10, 2002.

Alex Rodriguez Park has taken form in a three-phase process:

- Phase I called for seating modifications, new dugouts, new stadium lighting and utility infrastructure and new rest rooms.
- Phase II entailed renovating below the grand stand area in addition to adding new concession areas.
- The final phase included adding a new clubhouse, weight room, training room, meeting room, video room and academic area. In addition, a new press box – along with four VIP suites – have been built atop the grandstand. This past offseason, addition seating was added down both lines while a new scoreboard was constructed in left field.

The previous high was 10 against Appalachian State in the series finale on February 26...Sunday's Starters — Six of today's starters collected hits, while all nine starters reached base safely. **Harold Martinez** posted multiple hits for the second time in as many games (third time this year), knocking in a season-high four RBI...**Nathan Melendres** registered a season-high three hits, adding a RBI and scoring twice...**Rony Rodriguez** and **Stephen Perez** both tallied multiple RBI in the series finale...Sophomore right-hander **Eric Whaley** had another solid production in his fourth start of the year...Whaley went seven innings on the hill, spreading out three hits with no runs, no walks and striking out eight batters...Whaley has a team second-best 23 strikeouts on the year...Scoring 11 runs on nine hits meant Miami scored runs with guys on base, moving them over with bunts and driving them in with timely hits...Miami began the game with three consecutive bunt singles...UMiami has tallied five-plus hits in each of the last six games, including 14 against Illinois State (March 8)...The Canes showed great plate awareness on Sunday, drawing 10 walks from six Virginia Tech pitchers...The 10 walks taken was a season-high for UM.

The First Father/Son Duo...

- Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland** has stepped right into the UMiami starting lineup and taken charge. He belted his first home run over the weekend against Appalachian State. The Tampa native is the son of former UMiami second baseman and current international scout for the New York Yankees, Donny Rowland. They are the first father/son duo to ever play baseball at the "U".

Miami Predicted to Finish Third In Coastal Division...

- Miami baseball has been predicted to finish third in the Coastal Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference Coaches Preseason Poll. The poll is voted on by the league's 12 head coaches. Capturing a 20-10 league record in 2010, the Hurricanes finished the year third in the Coastal Division behind Virginia and Georgia Tech, respectively. Miami posted a 43-20 overall record en route to claiming the NCAA Coral Gables Regional title, and advancing to the NCAA Gainesville Super Regional.

Top-Ranked Gators Bite Back in Tough Gainesville Series (March 4-6)...

- Sophomore **E.J. Encinosa** came into Gainesville and pitched the game of his life...Facing the number one team in the country on the road, Encinosa went 7+ innings, allowing just five hits and one run to go along with three K's...Encinosa was the tough luck loser, as the Canes were unable to push a run across...**Sam Abrams**, a walk-on, saw his first action of the season when he came in the game in the bottom of the fourth after relieving freshman **Bryan Radziewski**...Abrams went 3 2/3 innings without giving up a run, giving a Miami a chance to claw their way back into the game...**Dale Carey** was the only man to reach base for the Hurricanes in game two of the series, as reached twice with a hit and hit by pitch...He also stole his first base of he season, but no 'Cane was able to drive him home...Despite the 'Canes struggles offensively, **Shane Rowland** quietly had himself a nice series against the Gators...Although just batting at a .222 average, Rowland posted an impressive .400 on base percentage, and had one of the six RBI's for the Hurricanes...

Yet again, **Sam Robinson** pitched brilliantly out of the 'pen...In 2 2/3 innings, Robinson did not yield a run, while giving up three hits...On the season, he has not allowed a run in 7.2 innings pitched, and those three hits are the only three hits he's allowed...As the rest of the Hurricanes struggle to find their groove at the plate, **Rony Rodriguez** has been the only Canes player to hit with consistency...Through the first eleven games, he leads the team in batting average with a .286 mark, slugging percentage with a .536 mark, and doubles with four.

Encinosa Has a Career Day in Gainesville...

- Sophomore starting pitcher **E.J. Encinosa** went a career-long seven innings against top-ranked Florida (March 5). In a 1-0 loss to the Gators, Encinosa allowed just the one run on five hits and struckout three in a pitchers' duel with UF's Hudson Randall. Though not giving up the game-winning hit, Encinosa walked the first batter he faced in the eighth frame before being relieved out of the bullpen.

The 40-40 Club in Miami...

- Once again, the Hurricanes achieved a 40-win season, finishing 43-20 and a spot in the NCAA Super Regional. All-time at UMiami, the 'Canes have achieved at least 40 wins 32 seasons – including 13 times under **Jim Morris**. In fact, UM has claimed 50-plus wins 19 times in school history, and 60-plus wins on three occasions. Miami posted at least 40 wins from 1973-1986, marking one of the longest streaks in NCAA history with a school collected 40 or more wins in consecutive years.

Miami Defeats Appalachian in Three-Game Home Affair (Feb. 24-26)...

- Brad Fieger** had a career series against Appalachian State, going 6-13 for in the series, scoring three runs and doubling in the Canes series win... Sophomore **Stephen Perez** went 5-11, but slugged a robust .818 with nine total bases, as he doubled twice and tripled...In the rubber match of the three game set, **Eric Whaley** pitched seven innings of shutout ball with nine strikeouts to lead the Canes to a much needed 10-0 win...It was Whaley's second win of the season, and dropped is ERA to 2.13...**Joey Porro**, who was the student-manager for the Hurricanes last year, made his first career start on Sunday as he started at second base...He singled twice and drove in three runs for his first career hits and RBI...The Miami offense, which had struggled through the first part of the season, woke up on Sunday, when the Canes banged out a season-high 10 runs on 10 hits...They scored all their runs in three different innings, as they put up three in the fourth and eighth innings, and four in the sixth...The UMiami bullpen pitched brilliantly during the series, allowing just two earned runs over 8 2/3 innings during the series...**Adam Sargent** and **Daniel Miranda** each appeared in two games and allowed zero runs, while Miranda had a save in the first game of the series...Freshman catcher **Shane Rowland**, who had made his first career start against Rutgers on a Sunday, started all three games over the course of the weekend...Rowland took over for **David Villasuso**, who recorded one start at DH.

Canes Start the 2011 Campaign with Series Win Over Rutgers (Feb. 18-20)...

• The Canes trotted out **Brad Fieger** at first, **Michael Broad** at second, **Stephen Perez** at short, **Harold Martinez** at third and **David Villasuso** for the opening game...In the outfield, **Nathan Melendres** played center, while he was flanked by **Zeke DeVoss** in left and **Chantz Mack** in right...**Bryan Radziewski** started on the hill...Freshman infielder **Brad Fieger** started all three games at first base for the Canes in the season-opening series, the only freshman position player to start on Opening Day this season for Miami...Freshman hurler **Bryan Radziewski** became the first rookie starter in more than 18 years to pitch on Opening Night for the Miami Hurricanes...**Zeke DeVoss** started off the season hot, as he started in the leadoff slot for each of the opening series games against the Scarlet Knights...He posted a .533 on base percentage, a .727 slugging percentage, and scored two runs in the three game set...**Bryan Radziewski** became just the latest Hurricane starter to hurl a gem on opening night...With Radziewski's line of one run allowed in six innings while striking out eight, he became the fifth straight opening day starter to go at least five innings and give up just one run or less...Projected eighth and ninth inning men **Sam Robinson** and **Daniel Miranda** started the season off in style, as they both appeared in two games and gave up zero runs. Combined, they went 6 1/3 innings while striking out 9 and giving up just two hits and one walk...With the Canes 5-3 win on Sunday, Miami won their opening weekend series for the third consecutive season...They beat Rutgers two out of three last season, and swept Cincinnati in the 2008 campaign.

NCAA Tournament Recap...

• Miami made its 38th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance last season, hosting two rounds of postseason action at Alex Rodriguez Park, where the club registered a 28-9 (.757) mark. The Hurricanes went 3-1 in the NCAA Coral Gables Regional, downing Dartmouth (12-8) and Texas A&M (14-1), before falling to the Texas A&M Aggies a day later (11-7). The Canes then overpowered the Aggies (10-3) to advance to the NCAA Super Regional. The Hurricanes fell to the Gators in consecutive games (7-2) and (4-3 - 10 innings) to end the season with a record of 43-20.

How About a Switch...

• Head coach **Jim Morris** is known for making the best changes possible for the team to win. Mid-season, the veteran skipper made the switch with **Brad Fieger** and **Harold Martinez** to opposite corners along the infield; switched sophomore **Zeke DeVoss** to more time at second base in place of **Michael Broad**; and has switched the pitching rotation with **Eric Whaley** and **E.J. Encinosa** – with Whaley now pitching in the second game of a weekend series.

Miami in the ACC...

• The 2011 season marks the seventh season the Canes have played in the Atlantic Coast Conference, and last year's 20-10 regular season mark in league play was the program's second-best behind the 2008 ACC championship squad that won 23 regular season league games.

New Era Behind the Plate...

• Three catchers will be battling for playing time behind the plate this year, including junior **David Villasuso**. A season ago, Villasuso batted .245 with 20

• Sophomore **Joey Porro** made his first collegiate start (second base) on Feb. 26 against Appalachian State; followed by another start against Illinois State (shortstop) on March 9. Porro was a student-manager for UM in 2010, only to earn two starts and post a .286 average with two hits, three runs driven in and one score thus far in 2011.

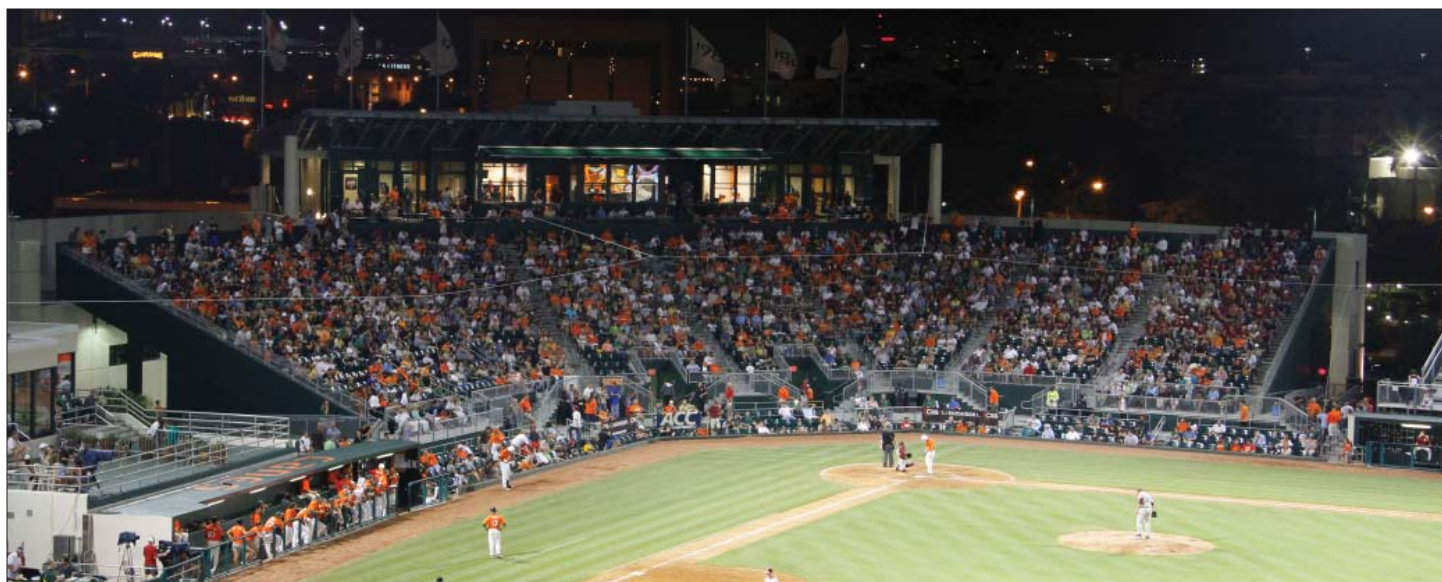
