- Carolina plays its fourth ACC road game and eighth true road game this year when it visits Coral Gables on Saturday, January 28th, to play the Miami Hurricanes. Game time is 1 p.m.
- Carolina enters the contest with a one-game lead in the ACC. The Tar Heels are 7-1; Florida State, Notre Dame and Virginia are 6-2.
- This is the sixth time in 14 seasons under Roy Williams the Tar Heels are 7-1 or better in their first eight ACC games (2005, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017).
- Carolina will be without junior swingman Theo Pinson at Miami. Pinson was injured in Thursday night's win over Virginia Tech. Pinson came down awkwardly while retrieving a rebound and rolled his right ankle. He left the game moments later and did not return. Doctors continue to evaluate his injury. There is no timetable for his return.
- The coaches and basketball staff will be wearing suits and sneakers at Miami for the annual Coaches vs. Cancer awareness week (Jan. 23-29). This is a nationwide event that unites coaches across the country to raise awareness about the American Cancer Society's lifesaving mission, and promote the American Cancer Society as a place for help and support. UNC's coaches also wore sneakers in the Virginia Tech game on 1/26.
- This is one of three instances on the ACC schedule this year when the Tar Heels play two games in three days: Jan. 14-16 (home games vs. Florida State and Syracuse); Jan. 26-28

Joel Berry II and Justin Jackson both made five three-pointers against Virginia Tech. It was the first time two Tar Heels made five or more three-pointers in the same game since 12/2/1996 when Ademola Okulaja and Shammond Williams both made five threes in a 106-62 win over Bethune-Cookman.

The All-America candidates combined for 41 points, 10 three-pointers, eight assists and zero turnovers vs. the Hokies. Carolina has scored 85 or more points in a school-record seven consecutive ACC games. That's the fourth-longest streak in ACC history and the third longest in one season.

Carolina has scored more than one point per possession in each of the last three games and five of the last six: 1.05 vs. NC State, 1.06 vs. Wake Forest, .90 vs. Florida State, 1.02 vs. Syracuse, 1.00 vs. BC and 1.08 vs. Virginia Tech.

Carolina has won 19 games. UNC has won at least 19 games in all 14 of Roy Williams' seasons as head coach. UNC has 57 20-win seasons, including 12 in the Roy Williams Era.

Kennedy Meeks is second in the country in offensive rebounding percentage (17.8 percent).

As of 1/18/17, the University of North Carolina received a record number of first-year applications for the 12th consecutive year. UNC has received 40,792 applications, an increase of 13.7 percent over last year and the second-largest increase in the last 25 years.

(home vs. Virginia Tech and at Miami); and Feb. 25-27 (away games at Pitt and Virginia).

- The Tar Heels are 19-3 overall and 7-1 in the ACC. UNC has won seven consecutive conference games and scored 85 or more points in all seven games, the first time in school history the Tar Heels have scored 85 or more points in seven straight ACC games.
- It's the fourth-longest streak in ACC history in which a team scored 85 or more points in seven straight ACC games (regular season and Tournament included) and the third-such streak in one season.
- NC State scored 85 or more in nine straight ACC games over a two-year period in 1974 and 1975; Duke did it nine games in a row in 1976, Virginia did it eight games in a row in 1955 and UNC has done it in seven straight this year.
- This is the eighth time in 14 years under Roy Williams the Tar Heels are at least 6-1 in conference play (2005, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016 and 2017).
- Carolina started ACC play 7-1 or better in five of Williams' first 13 seasons (2005, 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2016). UNC began league play in 2016 with eight wins.
- UNC is ranked No. 9 in the Associated Press and No. 6 in the USA Today/Coaches polls.
- Miami is 13-6 overall and 3-4 in the ACC. The Canes are coming off a one-point home win over Boston College.
- Miami is 9-1 at home this year and has won 22 of its last 23 games at the Watsco Center.

UNC-MIAMI SERIES

- Carolina leads the series against Miami, 20-6, including a 13-5 record since the Hurricanes joined the ACC prior to the 2004-05 season.
- The Tar Heels have won the last two games in the series. Those wins followed a four-game win streak by the Canes from 2012-14.
- Carolina is 8-2 against the Canes in Miami, including 6-2 in the Watsco Center.
- Roy Williams is 16-6 against Miami. He was 2-1 as the head coach at Kansas and is 14-5 as Carolina's head coach.

LAST YEAR VS. MIAMI

- Carolina shot 54.2 percent as a team and beat No. 11 Miami, 96-71, on 2/20 in Chapel Hill.
- The 25-point margin of victory was Carolina's largest against a top-25 team in the AP poll since beating No. 13 Michigan State, 98-63 (35 points), on 12/3/08 in Detroit.
- Six Tar Heels scored in double figures led by Brice Johnson, who had 16 points and 15 rebounds.
- The Tar Heels had assists on 16 of 21 field goals in the second half.
- Justin Jackson sank three 3FGs and had a

- Nate Britt scored 10 points, the most he scored in an ACC game in 2015-16.

LAST TIME IN MIAMI

- Carolina beat the Canes, 73-64, in Coral Gables on 2/28/15.
- Brice Johnson led Carolina with 22 points and 11 rebounds. He was 11 for 15 from the floor.
- J.P. Tokoto scored 10 rebounds, grabbed 10 rebounds, had six assists and four steals.
- Freshman Justin Jackson had 11 points (6-8 FTs).
- The Tar Heels had lost five of their previous seven games.
- The win also snapped UNC's four-game losing streak against Miami.

LAST GAME

UNC 91, VIRGINIA TECH 72

- Carolina scored 85 or more points for the seventh consecutive ACC game. UNC had never done that in more than five straight ACC games in its history prior to this stretch.
- UNC came into the game No. 1 in the nation in rebounding (45.9 per), offensive rebounds (16.5 per) and rebound margin (+14.2). The Tar Heels out-rebounded the Hokies, 43-22 (+21) and grabbed 19 offensive boards.
- Led by Kennedy Meeks with seven, UNC grabbed 19 offensive rebounds; the Hokies had 18 defensive rebounds.
- The Tar Heels scored 20 second-chance points, the 12th time this year and the sixth time in the last seven games UNC scored at least 20 second-chance points.
- Led by five each from Joel Berry II and Justin Jackson, UNC made a season-high 14 three-pointers in a season-high 30 three-point attempts.

• It's the most three-pointers since UNC made 15 against Mississippi State in Maui on 11/19/2012.

• It's the first time UNC has attempted 30 three-pointers in a game since it shot 31 against East Tennessee State on 12/8/2012. The 30 attempts equal the 13th-most in any game in UNC history.

• UNC shot 46.7 percent from three-point range, tying the third-highest percentage this year (.529 vs. Kentucky, .471 vs. Oklahoma State and .467 vs. Chattanooga).

• It's the highest percentage in the dozen games this year in which UNC attempted at least 20 three-pointers.

• It was the 12th time UNC shot 40 percent or better from three-point range; UNC is 11-1 in those games.

• Carolina handed out 25 assists, most since a season-high 26 against Chattanooga in the second game of the season.

• Carolina turned the ball over only seven times, fewest in an ACC game this year and fewest since five against Northern Iowa on 12/28/2016.

• Carolina shot 61.3 percent in the second half, its highest percentage from the floor in an ACC half this year. It's the fifth time this year UNC shot 60 percent from the floor in a half.

• Carolina had a points per possession of 1.27 in the second half (47 points in 37 possessions), its highest in a half in ACC play this year.

• The Tar Heels converted only five of nine free throws -- season lows in both categories.

• Virginia Tech shot 51 percent from the floor. They are the third team (first ACC opponent) to shoot 50 or better this year against UNC (.519 by Tennessee and .541 by Kentucky).

• Virginia Tech became the first ACC team and second opponent this year (also Kentucky) to have a points per possession of 1.0 or greater in both halves. The Hokies were 1.03 in the first and 1.08 in the second.

• Jackson led UNC in scoring for the 10th time this year with 26 points, his 10th 20-point game of the season (and his fifth 25-point game).

• Jackson tied his career high with 10 made field goals (Kentucky) and 20 field goal attempts (Clemson).

• It was the fifth time this year Jackson has scored 20 or more points without a turnover. He also had four assists.

• Jackson made five three-pointers, the fourth time this year he's made at least five threes in a game.

• It was the first time two Tar Heels made five or more three-pointers in the same game since 12/2/1996 when Ademola Okulaja and Shammond Williams both made five threes in a 106-62 win over Bethune-Cookman.

• Meeks posted his eighth double-double of the season (20th career) with 15 points and 14 rebounds. He had seven offensive rebounds (came into the game sixth in the country with 3.9 per game).

• Theo Pinson rolled his right ankle coming down with a rebound midway through the first half. He left the game a few moments later and did not return. He was held out of the rest of the game as a precaution.

800 WINS FOR ROY**AT CAROLINA AND KANSAS**

• Carolina head coach Roy Williams became the ninth Division I coach to win 800 games with UNC's 85-68 win over Syracuse on 1/16.

• Williams is 802-212 in 29 seasons.

• Williams joined Mike Krzyzewski, Bob Knight, Jim Boeheim, Dean Smith, Adolph Rupp, Jim Calhoun, Jim Phelan and Eddie Sutton with 800 wins as a Division I coach.

• Williams won his 800th game in fewer seasons (29) than any coach in history and in the second-fewest games (1,012) in NCAA history.

• Dean Smith and Mike Krzyzewski won their 800th game in their 33rd season.

• Adolph Rupp reached 800 wins in his 972nd game.

• Williams has the most wins of any coach after 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28 and 29 seasons.

• Jerry Tarkanian held the previous record for wins after 29 seasons with 701. Williams has 800 in his 29th season. No coach won that many games in 30, 31 or 32 seasons either.

• Williams has wins over 196 teams of the 202 schools he has faced at Kansas and North Carolina.

• Williams has 10 or more wins against 18 different schools, including three schools 30 or more times, and seven schools 20 or more times.

• Williams has 36 wins over Kansas State, 33 over Colorado and 31 over NC State.

• Williams entered the season averaging 28.0 wins per season, the most wins per year among coaches who have won at least 800 games. Mike Krzyzewski is second with 25.4 wins per season.

• Williams is sixth all-time and first among active coaches with 20 years experience in winning percentage at .791. He is second all-time behind Adolph Rupp (.822) in winning percentage among those who have coached at least 1,000 games.

"Last year especially, Coach was huge all year. I hit my low confidence-wise in basketball. I was just going into his office as much as I could to talk to him. He continued to tell me that he believed in me and continued to tell I was a good player, that I could shoot the ball. I think that was huge for me last year.

"He was there when I needed him. He was huge and that is what helped me grow as a person in every aspect in life.

"He gets the best out of his players. Sometimes he is hard on the players and when he needs to be he comforts his players. Last year I wasn't shooting the ball well, I wasn't making shots at all. He was there. He was telling me, 'Kenny, you are a good player. It will come.'

"He finds a way to get the best out of his player and there is enough evidence to back that up."

- Carolina is ninth nationally in offensive efficiency, but fell to 21st in defensive efficiency (KenPom's version of points per 100 possessions).
- Carolina's 107 points vs. NC State, 93 at Wake Forest and 96 vs. Florida State marked the first time UNC scored 90 or more points in three consecutive ACC games since 1992 and the first time UNC scored 93 or more points in three straight ACC games since the 1986-87 season (only happened 12 times in ACC history).
- Small forward Justin Jackson and point guard Joel Berry II are Carolina's leading two scorers. The last time UNC's top two scorers were perimeter players was 1990-91, when small forward Rick Fox (16.9) and shooting guard Hubert Davis (13.3) were UNC's top two scorers.

- Isaiah Hicks would lead the ACC in field goal percentage at .608 but he is three made field goals short of qualifying.
- Carolina averages 5.7 more field goal attempts per game than its opponents. Only two UNC teams have averaged more – 1967 (9.4), 1968 (6.5).
- Isaiah Hicks is 24 for 35 from the floor (.686) and 30 for 34 from the line (.82) in the last five games.

- Forward Isaiah Hicks led UNC in scoring three times (Hawai'i, Chaminade and Syracuse) and forward Kennedy Meeks topped the Tar Heels with 18 points vs. Northern Iowa.
- Justin Jackson leads the team with 20 double-figure scoring games. Isaiah Hicks and Kennedy Meeks are tied for second with 16.
- Justin Jackson has scored 20 or more points 10 times, including 26 or more five times.
- Jackson's scoring average is up 6.3 points from a year ago (12.2 to 18.5). The last returning starter to improve that much in one season was Marcus Paige, who increased his average 9.3 points from his freshman to sophomore seasons.

- Thirty-two percent of the opponents' baskets have been three-point field goals. Twenty-four percent of UNC's field goals are behind the arc.
- The opponents have attempted 39 percent of their shots from three-point range. UNC has attempted 30 percent of its field goals from behind the arc.
- The opponents are making 0.5 more three-pointers per game than the Tar Heels. Last year, Carolina made 2.1 fewer threes per game than the opponents.

Free Throws

- Carolina has made 388 free throws, while the opponents have attempted 382.
- Three starters are shooting 78 percent or better from the FT line— Joel Berry II (.898), Isaiah Hicks (.819) and Justin Jackson (.787).
- Berry is second in the ACC and 20th in the nation in free throw shooting at 89.8 percent.
- Berry II has the highest career free throw percentage in UNC history at .856 (172 for 201). That's 11th in ACC history.
- Berry is 53 for 59 from the line this year – 89.8 percent, the second-highest in UNC history. UNC's single-season record is 91.1 percent by Shammond Williams in 1997-98.
- Four of UNC's top five all-time leaders have played for Roy Williams.

- Carolina's strength of schedule is the 16th-toughest in the country (KenPom).
- Carolina's opponents have the eighth-highest average points per possession of any team in the nation.
- Carolina has played 12 games this year in which it had a points per possession of 1.0 or better with a season high of 1.14 vs. Kentucky and 1.13 vs. Oklahoma State.
- Carolina's points per possession in its 19 wins is .99; the opponents' points per possession in UNC's three losses is .98.
- Carolina's points per possession in the second half is 1.00 per game. UNC has scored 1,027 points on 1,022 second-half and overtime possessions.

- Carolina is third in the nation in assists (18.6 per game) behind UCLA (22.1) and Purdue (19.8).
- Carolina has 410 assists and 283 turnovers, while the opponents have 253 assists and 336 turnovers. UNC is third in the ACC behind Notre Dame and Virginia in assist-turnover ratio.
- Carolina had eight more turnovers than assists in its first two ACC games without Theo Pinson and has 45 more assists than turnovers in the last six games in which Pinson has played.
- Carolina averages 10.6 more second-chance points per game, 8.0 more points off turnovers and 15.0 more points in the paint than the opponents.
- Tar Heels have won ACC Player of the Week honors five times already this season. Joel Berry II won four times for his play against Tulane/Chattanooga, the Maui Invitational, Clemson/NC State and Wake Forest/FSU. Justin Jackson won following his 34-point performance against Kentucky.
- Four Tar Heels have played 100 or more college games, including Isaiah Hicks (134), Nate Britt (133), Kennedy Meeks (126) and Justin Jackson (100).
- Meeks has started 99 games, two more than Jackson (97).
- The Tar Heels have won seven of their last nine overtime games.

BERRY WINS FOURTH ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARD THIS SEASON

- Junior point guard Joel Berry II won ACC Co-Player of the Week honors (with Notre Dame's Steve Vasturia) for his play at Wake Forest and vs. Florida State.
- Berry scored 18 points and had seven assists and only one turnover at Wake Forest and scored a game-high 26 points (17 in the first half) against ninth-ranked Florida State.
- It was the fourth time this season Berry has won ACC Player of the Week honors. He also won the award last year after winning MVP honors in the ACC Tournament.
- Berry is the seventh Tar Heel to win ACC Player of the Week honors at least five times in a career and the sixth to win at least four times in one season.
- Berry has won National Player of the Week honors in each of the last two weeks – Naismith (Clemson/NC State) and NBC Sports (Wake Forest/Florida State).

TWO GAMES AGO

UNC 90, BOSTON COLLEGE 82

- Justin Jackson scored 22 points and Kennedy Meeks had 20 points and nine rebounds to lead Carolina to its fifth straight win at Boston College and the Tar Heels' 10th win in a row over the Eagles.
- It was the fifth time in the last six games UNC scored 20 or more second-chance points (24).
- It was Justin Jackson's ninth game this year with at least 20 points.
- Meeks scored 20 points. It was his second 20-point game this year and his sixth career 20-point game.
- It was Carolina's 73rd ACC road win in Roy Williams' 14 years at Carolina. Only one other school has more than 42 ACC road wins in that span (Duke has 70).
- Isaiah Hicks was 7 for 8 at the free throw line and led UNC in assists with four. It was the second time in three games he led UNC in assists.
- Theo Pinson had three offensive rebounds, all in a four-possession stretch, when UNC scored eight second-chance points to up its lead to six points late.
- The Tar Heels have won 10 straight games against BC, including five in a row at Conte Forum. UNC is 7-1 at Conte Forum all-time.
- Tony Bradley had six rebounds and five points in 11 minutes in his first game back after missing a pair of contests due to a concussion suffered at Wake Forest.
- Boston College attempted seven free throws, which matched Syracuse for the fewest by an opponent this year, and made 12 three-pointers, which equaled the dozen made by Tulane in the season opener.

THREE GAMES AGO

CAROLINA 85, SYRACUSE 68

- Justin Jackson (19/10) and Kennedy Meeks (15/12) had double-doubles and Isaiah Hicks led with 20 points in an 85-68 win over Syracuse on 1/16.
- The win was the 800th in Roy Williams' career. He became the ninth coach to win 800 games as a Division I head coach.
- Carolina shot 56.7 percent from the floor in the second half, its highest percentage in any half in an ACC game and its highest in a half since shooting 61.8 percent in the second half against Northern Iowa on 12/21.

- It was the eighth time the Tar Heels shot 50 percent in the second half.
- Syracuse made 11 of its first 14 shots from the floor in the second half (.786), then made 4 of its next 19 to finish the game.
- Carolina had 44 rebounds and out-rebounded the Orange by 20.
- The Tar Heels scored 20 second-chance points.
- The Tar Heels scored 26 points off turnovers. That was the fifth time UNC scored at least 25 points off turnovers.
- Hicks led UNC with 20 points and added eight rebounds in a career-high tying 30 minutes. It was the first time in his career he scored 16 or more points in three straight games (16 at Wake Forest, 22 vs. Florida State) and the first time he scored 20 or more points in back-to-back games.
- Hicks tied his career highs with eight made field goals and 13 field goal attempts (also was 8 for 13 against Chaminade).
- It was the third time this year and fifth time in his career Hicks led UNC in scoring. It was also the second time this year (and career) he played 30 minutes in a game (Wisconsin) and the second time this year he was not whistled for a personal foul (also vs. Chaminade in 27 minutes).
- Meeks had six offensive rebounds and converted five into field goals.
- Theo Pinson led UNC with five assists in 14 minutes. It was the third time he led UNC in assists and the second time he did that in less than 15 minutes. He led UNC with five assists in 13 minutes against NC State and shared team honors with three vs. Florida State.
- Kenny Williams made two three-pointers and had four assists and two steals.
- Carolina has won five in a row over Syracuse and leads the series, 9-4.

SMITH CENTER WINS

- Carolina is 196-53 in the Smith Center against ACC teams and 193-15 against non-ACC teams.
- Roy Williams is 105-4 in the Smith Center against non-ACC competition.
- The Tar Heels are 389-68 overall in the Smith Center.

RECAPPING THE TITLE IN MAUI

- Carolina is the second team to win at least four Maui Invitational titles (Duke has five).
- Carolina became the first team to win 18 games in Maui in the Maui Invitational (plus one win in a mainland game).
- Roy Williams has won more games than any coach in Maui Invitational history (16 in Maui plus one on the mainland) and is the second coach to win at least four titles in Maui. Williams won the Maui Invitational at Carolina in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2016-17 and at Kansas in 1996-97.
- Carolina averaged 94 points, shot 55.1 percent from the floor and held the opponents to 64 points per game and a field goal percentage of .368 for the three games.
- Carolina held Wisconsin to 56 points, the fewest ever in the Maui Invitational champion-

ship game.

- Carolina became just the third team in Maui Invitational history to score 100 points in consecutive games (Oklahoma in 1992-93 and Loyola Marymount in 1990-91).
- Joel Berry II became the fourth Tar Heel and third UNC point guard in a row to win MVP honors. Berry averaged 18.0 points, 3.7 assists and 2.3 steals. He shot 19 of 30 from the floor (.633), 8 of 14 3FGs (.571) and 8 for 8 FTs (1.000).
- Carolina advanced to the Final Four the other three seasons it won the Maui title and won the NCAA title the previous two times it won in Maui.

2017 ACC LEGENDS ANNOUNCED

ANTAWN JAMISON TO REPRESENT UNC

- National Player of the Year (1998) Antawn Jamison will represent the Tar Heels at the ACC Tournament in Brooklyn in the 2017 ACC Legends class.
- Jamison was the unanimous National Player of the Year in 1998, when he became the second Tar Heel and third player in ACC history to be named ACC Player of the Year, ACC Tournament MVP, NCAA Regional MVP and National Player of the Year in the same season.
- Jamison averaged 22.2 points and 10.5 rebounds in 1998, the first double-double by a Tar Heel since Mitch Kupchak in 1976. He is sixth at UNC in career rebounds with 1,027 and eighth in scoring with 1,974 points.
- He grew up in Charlotte and was the first player in ACC history to earn first-team All-ACC honors as a freshman, sophomore and junior. He led UNC to ACC Tournament titles and Final Fours in 1997 and 1998 and was voted the 1998 ACC Male Athlete of the Year.
- He played 16 NBA seasons and was an All-Star in 2005 and 2008. Jamison is one of only 40 players in NBA history to score at least 20,000 career points (20,042).

NBA TAR HEELS

- Fourteen Tar Heels are on NBA rosters.
- Vince Carter is playing in his 19th NBA season, which sets a record for most seasons played by a former Tar Heel in the NBA.
- Carter plays for the Memphis Grizzlies. Earlier this year he became the 24th player to score 24,000 career points in the NBA.
- Carter is the fourth-leading scorer among active NBA players behind only Dirk Nowitzki,

LeBron James and Paul Pierce.

- Pierce played for head coach Roy Williams at Kansas and was selected in the 1998 NBA Draft with Carter and Antawn Jamison.
- Every non-active player in the top 35 in NBA career scoring is a member of the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame (exceptions Kobe Bryant and Tim Duncan, who retired this year and are not eligible yet for the Hall of Fame).
- Marcus Paige (Salt Lake City Stars, Utah Jazz), P.J. Hairston and J.P. Tokoto (both with the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, Houston Rockets) are playing in the NBDL.

TAR HEELS SIGN FOUR IN NOVEMBER

- Carolina has signed four players to National Letters of Intent: Jalek Felton, a 6-4 guard from West Columbia, S.C.; Brandon Huffman, a 6-9 forward from Anchorage, Alaska; Sterling Manley, a 6-10 forward from Reynoldsburg, Ohio; and Andrew Platek, a 6-4 guard from Schenectady, N.Y.
- Felton attends Gray Collegiate Academy in West Columbia, S.C. He attended Mullins High School for three years.
- Huffman moved from Alaska to Raleigh where he attends Word of God Christian Academy.
- Manley attends Pickerington (Ohio) Central High School.
- Platek attends Northfield (Mass.) Mount Hermon School.

GAME-BY-GAME NOTES

North Carolina 95, Tulane 75

- Justin Jackson and Joel Berry II had career scoring highs -- Jackson with 27 and Berry with 23.
- It was the first time Berry and Jackson scored 20 in the same game as Tar Heels.
- Kennedy Meeks had a career-high 15 rebounds.

North Carolina 97, Chattanooga 57

- Carolina had 26 assists on 34 field goals.
- Carolina scored 33 points off 26 UTC turnovers (Tar Heels had 14 steals). That's more points off turnovers since UNC scored 33 against Chaminade on 11/21/12.
- Meeks had 14 points and a game-high 12 rebounds, Berry had 18 points, five assists and Kenny Williams scored a career-high 11 points and also had career highs in rebounds (6), assists (5) and steals (3).

North Carolina 93, Long Beach State 67

- It marked the first time UNC opened a season with three straight 90-point games since 1994-95.
- Berry tied his career high with 23 points.
- Jackson posted his third career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds.

North Carolina 83, Hawai'i 68

- Carolina shot 63.3 percent from the floor in the second half, its highest percentage in any half this year. That followed a first half in which UNC shot a season-low for any half at 35.1 percent.
- Tony Bradley grabbed a season-high 13 re-

bounds, most by a UNC freshman since Meeks had 13 against Iowa State in the 2014 NCAA Tournament.

- Isaiah Hicks led UNC with 16 points and Nate Britt scored a season-high 13 points on 3 of 5 shooting from three-point range.

North Carolina 104, Chaminade 61

- Carolina shot a season-high 57.8 percent from the floor and had a season-high rebound margin of plus 29 (52-23).
- It was the first time in four seasons that Hicks (22) and Meeks (20) each scored 20 points in a game.
- Hicks set a career scoring high with 22.

North Carolina 107, Oklahoma State 75

- Carolina shot 56.3 percent from the floor in the first half and 59.4 percent in the second half. Carolina also shot season-high percentages from three-point range (8 of 17, .471) and the free throw line (25 of 29, .862).
- Carolina held Oklahoma State to 75 points, 29.8 under the Cowboys' season average coming into the game.
- Berry set his career high with 24 points. Jackson had 22 points, eight rebounds, six assists and no turnovers.

North Carolina 71, Wisconsin 56

- Carolina won its fourth Maui Invitational title. The Tar Heels have won more games in the Maui Invitational than any school in the nation (18) and are second in titles with four. UNC has won the Maui Invitational in 1999-2000, 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2016-17.
- Carolina held Wisconsin to 56 points, the fewest ever in the championship game of the Maui Invitational.
- Berry scored 22 points vs. the Badgers and earned Maui Invitational MVP honors.
- Meeks had a career-high 16 rebounds vs. Wisconsin and earned All-Tournament honors.

Indiana 76, North Carolina 67

- Carolina shot a season-low 39.3 percent from the floor, scored a season-low 67 points and did not out-rebound an opponent for the first time this year.
- Jackson scored a game-high 21 points.
- The Tar Heels were just 10 for 28 from the floor (.357) and made eight turnovers in the first half when the Hoosiers built a 17-point and ultimately out-scored UNC, 41-29.

North Carolina 95, Radford 50

- The Tar Heels made six of their first 10 3FG attempts.
- The Tar Heels had a 26-5 edge in points off turnovers.
- Williams scored a career-high 19 points (16 in the first half) and set a career high with five three-point field goals.

North Carolina 83, Davidson 74

- Jackson tied his career high with 27 points and set a career high with seven three-point field goals made.
- Luke Maye had career-highs in points (10) and steals (3) and tied his career best with six rebounds. He scored all 10 points and grabbed all six boards in the opening half.
- Carolina shot a season-low 37.7 percent from the floor.
- Berry did not play due to a sprained left ankle.

North Carolina 73, Tennessee 71

- Carolina rallied from a 15-point deficit in the first half (13-28 and 15-30) and an eight-point halftime deficit (36-44). The 15-point comeback was Carolina's largest since 2/17/14 when UNC rallied from a 21-6 deficit at Florida State to win, 81-75. The eight-point halftime deficit was the largest in a UNC win since 3/12/11 when UNC trailed Clemson, 38-28, but won 92-87 in overtime in the ACC Tournament semifinals.
- Tennessee shot 65.4 percent from the floor in the first half. Carolina held the Vols to just 39.3 percent shooting from the floor in the second half.
- Nate Britt made a career-high five steals and tied his career high with seven assists.

Kentucky 103, North Carolina 100

- It was the second time in UNC history and the first time in a regulation-length game UNC lost a game when it scored 100 points. Carolina had won 51 straight games when scoring 100 points.
- It was the 10th game in UNC history in which both teams scored 100 or more points and just the fourth in a 40-minute game.
- Carolina shot 53.0 percent from the floor, only the fourth time in 184 games UNC shot 50 percent from the floor under head coach Roy Williams and lost.
- Jackson scored a career-high 34 points, Berry had 23 points and seven assists and Maye set a career high with 11 points, scoring all 11 in the second half.
- Kentucky's Malik Monk scored 47 points, which ties the second most against UNC in history and is the most since Georgia Tech's Rich Yunkus scored 47 on 2/14/1970.

North Carolina 85, Northern Iowa 42

- The Tar Heels held the Panthers to 42 points, which equaled the fewest allowed by a Roy Williams-coached team at North Carolina.
- Carolina shot 61.8 percent from the floor in the second half, including 6 for 11 from three-point range, and Carolina committed only five turnovers for the game.
- Meeks led UNC with 18 points and eight rebounds. It is the first time this season he led the Tar Heels in scoring.

North Carolina 102, Monmouth 74

- Carolina scored 100-plus points for the fourth time in 14 games this year, grabbed a season-high 57 rebounds and made a season-high 33 free throws.

- The two teams combined for 52 fouls (27 on Monmouth, 25 on UNC) and 72 free throw attempts. It was a season high for fouls both by UNC and by an opponent.
- Jackson led all scorers with 28 points, making six three-pointers in nine attempts.

Georgia Tech 75, North Carolina 63

- Carolina committed a season-high 20 turnovers, shot a season-low 33.3 percent from the floor scored a season-low 63 points.
- Carolina's points per possession was a season-low .64 for the game (season low .62 in the first half and .67 in the second half, which matched the previous low for a half at Indiana).
- The Tar Heels were 5 for 26 from three-point range. It was the fewest made threes in at least 25 attempts since UNC went 5 for 27 against Wake Forest in 2011.

North Carolina 89, Clemson 86 (OT)

- Berry had career highs in points (31), field goals (12) and three-point field goals (7), scoring 19 of UNC's 23 points from 14:07 to 6:39 in the second half.
- Williams scored six of UNC's 12 points in overtime.
- Meeks tied his career high with 16 boards and had a career-best 10 offensive rebounds.
- Clemson shot 53.3 from the floor in the first half, but only 15 of 38 (39.4 percent) in second half and extra period.

North Carolina 107, NC State 56

- Carolina scored the most points ever in a UNC-NC State game and won by the largest margin in the series since 1921 in a 107-56 win.
- The game was postponed from Jan. 7 to Jan. 8 due to a snow and ice storm.
- The 51-point win was the largest ever by UNC in an ACC game (against any opponent). Previous was a 103-55 win over Florida State (48 points) on Jan. 24, 1998.
- UNC scored 56 points in the first half and allowed 56 in the game.
- Berry had 19 points, five rebounds, five assists and two steals, Jackson hit six 3FGs and scored a game-high 21 points, and Bradley and Maye combined for 19 points and 16 rebounds.

North Carolina 93, Wake Forest 87

- It was the first time this season all five Tar Heel starters scored in double figures led by Jackson with 19, and Berry and Meeks with 18 each.
- Meeks posted his sixth double-double this year, attempted a career-high 18 shots from the floor, made a season-high nine field goals and added three steals and three blocks.
- It was the fourth time this year the Tar Heels shot 50 percent from the floor in both halves (and the first time since Kentucky on 12/17).
- Wake Forest had a points per possession of 1.18 in the second half, the highest for any opponent in a half this season.

Carolina 96, Florida State 83

- It was the first time three Tar Heels scored 20 points since 3/18/11 against LIU in Charlotte in the first round of the 2011 NCAA Tournament. Berry (26), Hicks (22) and Jackson (22) accomplished that vs. the Seminoles.
- Carolina out-rebounded the Seminoles, 56-34. This was the eighth time this year the Tar Heels have grabbed 50 or more rebounds. The previous high by an FSU opponent this year was 52 by George Washington.
- The Tar Heels entered the game No. 1 in the nation in rebounding margin and out-rebounded the Seminoles by 22. The previous high for rebounding margin against FSU this year was 10 when George Washington out-rebounded FSU, 52-42.

Carolina 85, Syracuse 68

- Jackson (19/10) and Meeks (15/12) had double-doubles and Hicks led UNC with 20 points.
- The win was the 800th in Roy Williams' career.

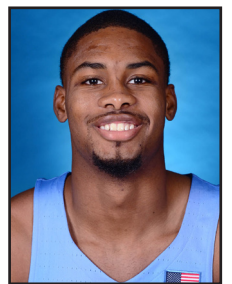

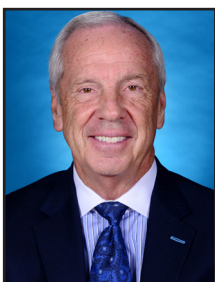
