WEEKEND STORY LINES

- After splitting its midweek pair with UCF and FGCU, **No. 25 Miami** opens a weekend series with **No. 3 Virginia** beginning Saturday at Alex Rodriguez Park. The series finale will be played on **ESPNU** as part of the channel's **ACC Monday** package.
- Miami **dropped two of three games in the 2013 series** between the two teams on the road at Davenport Field. Virginia captured the first two games of the weekend set, but the **Hurricanes won the series finale** by a final score of **4-3**.
- The **all-time series** between Miami and Virginia is **tied at 20-20**; the first meeting between the two teams occurred in **1985**.
- Head coach **Jim Morris won his 1,400th game** at the Division I level during Miami's sweep of Boston College (**March 8**). Morris enters the team's weekend series against the Cavaliers **just one win away from No. 900** as Hurricanes skipper.
- After struggling to hit for power in 2013, **Miami is tied for the ACC lead with 13 home runs**. **Dale Carey ranks fourth** in the ACC with **four homers**, **Zack Collins has three**, and **Tyler Palmer & Garrett Kennedy have two home runs each**.
- Miami's set against No. 3 Virginia continues a **challenging start to open the spring slate**. Miami has played weekend series with **then-No. 23 Florida**, **No. 2 Florida State**, and travels to **No. 10 NC State** next weekend (March 28-30).
- Miami wraps up its **short homestand** with a matchup against FGCU on Wed., March 26 at Alex Rodriguez Park. The Hurricanes won a March 19 game against the Eagles at Hammond Stadium in **extra innings by a final margin of 5-2**.

3 JIM MORRIS HEAD COACH

THE HURRICANES SKIPPER

In his 21st season at Miami, few programs have qualified for the College World Series as much as Jim Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament an NCAA-record 41 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 11 of Morris' 20 seasons in Coral Gables. Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris won a record 13 consecutive NCAA Regionals from 1994-2006.

Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 899-355-3 (.717) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,403-622-4 (.693) Division I record in 32 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 36 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. (now Georgia Perimeter College) from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,534-662-4 (.698) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 20 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium project.

MORRIS IS A REGIONAL REGULAR

Jim Morris earned his 29th consecutive NCAA regional bid in 2013 when he guided the Canes to a No. 2 seed in the Louisville [Ky.] Regional. He has led Miami to a regional in each of his 20 seasons (1994-2013), winning 15 of those appearances. The 13 consecutive regional championships (94-06) was an NCAA record. He also went to nine straight regionals from 1985-93 with Georgia Tech. Additionally, Miami has advanced to nine Super Regionals under Morris.

Affectionately known as "3" by those surrounding the UM program, Morris led the 2013 Hurricanes to their 41st-straight NCAA Tournament. Despite six signees being drafted in the 2013 MLB Draft, the Hurricanes reeled in a top 5 recruiting class by national publications.

MORRIS IN 36th SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Morris entered 2014 as the fifth-winningest active coach in Division I baseball with 1,391 wins. His impressive win total ranks him No. 12 all-time for any coach, regardless of division. Including his time at DeKalb C.C., Morris won his 1,500th game as a head coach in Miami's 4-1 upset of No. 1 North Carolina on March 15, 2013 in Chapel Hill, N.C.

Morris currently has a 1,403-622-4 (.693) record at the Division I level. As a head coach overall, he has compiled a 1,534-662-4 (.698) record over 30-plus years.

Morris notched his milestone 1,000th win against his former school, Georgia Tech, with a 16-13 win on April 4, 2004. Thirteen days later, he notched win No. 500 at Miami with a 7-3 win against Florida State on April 17. Morris' 1,000th win as a head coach, including four years at DeKalb Junior College, came in a 5-3 win over Northeastern in March 2001



MAJOR LEAGUE GUIDANCE

Over 150 professional baseball players have played under Morris during their college careers at Miami, Georgia Tech and DeKalb.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that went on to play in the Major Leagues were Yonder Alonso (San Diego), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Pat Burrell (Tampa Bay), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Yasmani Grandal (San Diego), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Eddy Rodriguez (San Diego), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Blake Tekotte (Chicago White Sox), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Valencia (Minnesota Twins), Jon Jay (St. Louis), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston).

Standout players under Morris from his days at Georgia Tech were Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jay Payton (Oakland A's) and Jason Varitek (Boston Red Sox).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the International scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta. At the Goodwill Games, his USA squad won two of three games against Cuba, marking the first time in history a senior-level team won a series with Cuba. In 1987, Morris served as pitching coach under Ron Fraser at the Pan American Games (Silver Medal).

Coach Morris and his wife Nhan live in Miami with their two-year old son, Will.

- **Miami is tied for the lead ACC with 13 home runs** through its first 22 games of the regular season. **Dale Carey** leads the team with **four homers, Zack Collins has three, and Garrett Kennedy and Tyler Palmer have two each.**
- The offense already has **three multi-homerun games** this season after recording **just two in all of 2013:** games one and two against **Florida** (Feb. 21 & 22) and game one against **Georgia Tech** (March 14). **Miami is 3-0** in 2014 when hitting **more than one home run.**
- Miami did not record its 13th home run in 2013 **until an 11-7 win over Georgia Tech on May 17 - the team's 55th game** of the season. The Hurricanes hit just 14 home runs collectively last season.
- The Hurricane **offense exploded for six home runs** in its series with Florida (Feb. 21-23), **the most for a Miami team in a single series** since an **April 2010 weekend set at Virginia Tech.**

THE 1,400 CLUB...

- **Head coach Jim Morris** became just the **eighth coach in the history of Division I baseball** to accumulate **1,400 wins** when **Miami beat Boston College 5-2 on March 8.**
- **Morris is just one win away from 900** with the Hurricanes entering the team's series with Virginia after **Miami beat FGCU Wed., March 19 for his 899th win.**
- **Morris ranks fourth** among active **Division I coaches** in **career victories (1,402)** and **eighth all-time** in the category.

HEATING UP...

- After struggling through the first month of the season, sophomore slugger **David Thompson** has turned it up a notch. Thompson is **hitting at a .424 clip** over his past **10 games** with two doubles, one triple and six RBI. He has **recorded a .525 on-base percentage** over that span.
- Over his last two starts, redshirt sophomore **Andrew Suarez** has allowed **two earned runs** in 16.0 innings of work (**1.12 ERA**). He went **9.0 innings against Georgia Tech** but earned a **no-decision.**
- Senior **Dale Carey** is 12 for his last 40 (**.300**) **over the last 10 games** entering the series with Virginia. He has **team-high totals of 12 hits, 12 runs and four doubles** over that stretch.
- Freshman **Willie Abreu** has settled into a groove entering the middle of March. The Hialeah, Fla., native, **hitting third** in the lineup, is **batting .340** with **18 hits and 12 runs scored** in the last **15 games.**

WEEKEND NEWS & NOTES

FOUR UP, FOUR DOWN...

- Junior LHP **Chris Diaz** picked up his fourth straight win to open the 2014 season in a 6-2 victory over Boston College (March 7).
- Diaz, who ranked second in the ACC in ERA in 2013 (1.64), did not pick up his fourth win of the 2013 season until May 3 against St. John's. He finished 2013 with a 7-5 record.
- The Hurricanes have won every single one of Diaz' starts in 2014, including a 10-8 win against Georgia Tech last time out. Miami has not lost a game started by Diaz since the 2013 ACC Tournament in a matchup with NC State (May 24).

FRESHMEN PHENOMS...

- Five freshmen were in head coach Jim Morris' lineup against FGCU on Wednesday: Zack Collins (catcher), Willie Abreu (right field), Brad Zunica (designated hitter), Johnny Ruiz (second base) and Derik Beauprez (starting pitcher).
- The four field players combined for six of Miami's 10 hits in the 5-2 win over FGCU, while Beauprez allowed just one run in his career-first start. Abreu drove in the gamewinning run in the 10th.
- Freshman reliever Bryan Garcia recorded the win with three scoreless innings of relief. He is tied for second in the ACC with five saves this season.

SIMPLY PERFECT...

- Senior RHP **Javi Salas** twirled just the second perfect game in program history and the 23rd in modern NCAA Division I history (since 1957) in a 17-0 shutout of Villanova on March 4.
- Salas needed just 113 pitches to get through his outing, scattering six strikeouts across his night of perfection. His perfect game was the first for a Miami pitcher since Kevin Sheary accomplished the feat on March 4, 1987.
- Miami's two perfect games are tied with Auburn and Iowa for the second-most of any program all-time behind Washington State's three. Salas' perfect game was the first for any Division I pitcher since Will Roberts (Virginia) in 2011.
- Salas, a Coral Gables native and graduate of nearby Christopher Columbus High School, was selected in the 38th round of the 2013 MLB Draft but elected to return for his senior season.

CANES LEGENDS RECOGNIZED...

- Alex Fernandez and Mike Fiore will be among the seven-member Class of 2014 to be inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the College Baseball Foundation announced.
- They will join Ron Fraser (2006), Skip Bertman (2006) and Neal Heaton (2009) as College Baseball Hall of Fame inductees from the University of Miami in a special celebration that takes place in Lubbock, Texas in June 2014.
- Fernandez was named Freshman of the Year and a first-team All-American in 1989, where he won 15 games with a 2.01 ERA and 177 strikeouts in 147 innings. A four-year UM starter, Fiore set 12 UM career batting marks, including hits (341) and runs (258).
