MIAMI LOOKS FOR THIRD STRAIGHT WIN ON THURSDAY NIGHT

- ▶ The Miami Hurricanes will play in their second of three-straight home games when they welcome Virginia to Sun Life Stadium Thursday night. The game will start at 8:06 p.m. and will be televised on ESPN and ESPN3D.
- ▶ Thursday night marks the 76th contest involving an ACC team on ESPN's Thursday Night package. It is the first time Miami and Virginia are meeting in a Thursday night game and will be UM's 18th appearance overall.
- Saturday's victory over Georgia Tech marked the third consecutive time the Canes had defeated the Yellow Jackets. No other ACC team has ever beaten The Ramblin' Wreck two consecutive seasons since Paul Johnson became the head coach.
- ▶ The Hurricane defense held the nation's second-ranked rushing attack to only 134 yards on the ground. That total was more than 200 yards below Georgia Tech's average coming into the contest.
- ▶ Miami's leading tackler Sean Spence once again led the Canes with 10 takedowns on Saturday against Georgia Tech, six of them solo and one for a loss. The Miami native ranks 10th nationally in tackles per game and seventh in tackles for loss. Spence has been named the ACC Linebacker of the Week each of the last three weeks and on three occasions has been recognized as the College Football Performance Awards Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week. On the year, Spence has tallied 65 tackles, 35 of those solo.
- ▶ Junior wide receiver Tommy Streeter continues to be a lightening rod for the Miami offense. The Miami native ranks fifth nationally with a 20.4 yards per reception average. Of Streeter's 21 receptions on the season, nine have gone for 25-yards or more, including catches of 48 and 32 yards against Georgia Tech. The 6-5 speedster also has five TD receptions on the season, leading the team.
- ▶ Since the Golden Era began, the Hurricanes have improved in several key statistical categories that speak to Coach Golden's brand of football—smarter, tougher and more disciplined. Since a season ago, the Canes have improved 54-plus spots among the nation's FBS schools in turnover margin, fewest penalties per game and fewest yards penalized per game. The chart below is a breakdown of where the Canes stand.

- ▶ Miller is second in the Atlantic Coast Conference with 114.1 rushing yards per game, ranking 14th nationally.
- ▶ Through the first four games of the season, Miller was the only back in America with a rush of 40-yards or more in every game. He did not extend that streak at Virginia Tech, but did have runs of 37 and 30 yards.
- ▶ Of his 11 career rushes/receptions of 25-yards or more, nine have come after halftime.
- ▶ Miller recorded 166 rushing yards on 18 carries against Virginia Tech, posting his fifth-straight game with at least 100 yards rushing. Miller is the first Cane to open the season with five-straight 100-yard rushing games. Willis McGahee started the 2002 season with 100-plus in four of the first five games. The last time a Cane recorded five-straight 100-yard rushing games was Clinton Portis in 2001.
- ▶ Miller has nine plays of 25-yards or longer this season--seven rushes and two kick returns.
- ▶ Until the Ohio State game (184 yards), Miller's output against Tech was a career best. The Hokies' run defense came into the 2011 meeting ranked No. 4 nationally giving up only 58.20 yards on the ground.
- ▶ Miller joins former Cane Tyrone Moss (2003-06) with seven career 100-yard rushing games. Edgerrin James (1995-98) is the all-time leader with 15 games of 100 or more yards on the ground.

When IT COUNTS

▶ You can only bottle up the electric Lamar Miller for so long. His career shows that the second half is clearly Miller Time. Not only do his biggest plays (especially runs) come in the second half, but nearly 60 percent of his career yards have come after intermission.

Only working press will be admitted to the Sun Life Stadium press box. Seats will be issued according to the following criteria:

- 1. State newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from UM and opponent's schools.
- 2. Other daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover UM.
- **3.** Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting.
- **4.** Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover UM.
- **5.** Scouts. Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status.

A CANES WIN OVER THE CAVALIERS WOULD...

- ▶ Give the Hurricanes their third consecutive victory.
- ▶ Give the Hurricanes a winning Atlantic Coast Conference record.
- ▶ Be Miami's third straight Atlantic Coast Conference victory.
- ▶ Give Miami a 16-2 ESPN Thursday Night record.
- ▶ Give Al Golden a 4-1 record at Sun Life Stadium.

The **COACHES**

- ▶ Head Coach Al Golden and Virginia's Mike London are no strangers as the two coached together at Boston College and Virginia. Golden served as the defensive coordinator at Virginia from 2001-05, while London coached the defensive line from 2001-04. When Golden left to take the head coaching job at Temple, it was London who replaced him as defensive coordinator at Virginia. Prior to their time together at UVa, Golden (1997-99) and London (1997-2001) were on Tom O'Brien's staff at Boston College as the linebackers and defensive line coaches, respectively.
- ▶ Golden enters the game with a 31-37 overall record and 4-3 at the helm of the Hurricanes. London owns a career record of 32-16 and is 8-11 at Virginia.

Scouting THE CAVALIERS

- ▶ Virginia is looking to bounce back after dropping one to NC State in Charlottesville, 28-14.
- ▶ The Cavaliers possess one of the nation's most potent pass defenses allowing only 176 yards per game through the air, ranking 12th nationally.
- ▶ Look for the Cavaliers to rely heavily on the run as freshman quarterback Michael Rocco has a two-to one interception to touchdown ratio, averaging an interception per game.
- ▶ Junior wide receiver Kris Burd is the favorite target for the young quarterback, raking in a team-high 34 catches for 447 yards, Burd will be looking for his first touchdown this season.
- ▶ Running back Kevin Parks is a touchdown machine with a team-high seven touchdowns while averaging 5.2 yards per carry.
- ▶ Kicker Justin Moore has been unreliable this season going 4-for-8 on field goal attempts with a long of 40 yards and two blocked kicks.
- ▶ The Cavaliers defense comes out strong at the beginning of games, allowing opponents to only seven points in the first quarter.

Up **NEXT...**

▶ The Canes' home stand continues as the Duke Blue Devils come to town the following week (11/5) before the Canes head back out on the road to take on intra-state rival Florida State (11/12).

Streak CONTINUES

- ▶ Former Hurricanes and current proCanes Kellen Winslow (Tampa Bay) scored his first touchdown of the season and Jimmy Graham (New Orleans) had two scores in Week 7 of the NFL season.
- ▶ At least one former Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season a span of 146 straight weeks.

JoJo NICOLAS RECOGNIZED FOR OUTSTANDING PLAY

- ▶ College Sports Madness has named Miami Safety JoJo Nicolas ACC Defensive Player of the Week for his exceptional performance this past weekend. The senior ended the Georgia Tech game with an interception and a fumble recovery for a touchdown.
- ▶ The safety also was recognized by Intersport as he was nominated for the Defensive Performance of the Year The Defensive Performance of the Year is part of a four-month competition that lets fans determine which individual performances reign supreme during the 2011 college football season.
- ▶ The senior is third on the team with 41 tackles and he leads all Miami players with two interceptions on the season.

Welcome **BACK**

▶ After sitting out the first six games of the 2011 season due to suspension, junior defensive end Olivier Vernon returned to the lineup in time to face Georgia Tech last Saturday. In limited action, Vernon recorded a solo tackle.

Spence ONE OF THE NATION'S BEST

- ▶ For the third-consecutive week, University of Miami senior Sean Spence was named the ACC Linebacker of the Week.
- ▶ Spence was again the Canes' leader on defense. The prolific linebacker played in the middle against the Yellow Jackets and racked up 10 tackles to lead all Miami players. The Miami native had six solo stops and a tackle for a loss of two yards. As the defensive captain, Spence helped hold Georgia Tech one of the nation's most potent offenses to a season-low seven points, 35.9 off of its average.
- ▶ Spence has been the anchor of the defense all season and has amassed 65 total tackles (10th nationally), 9.5 tackles for loss (seventh nationally) for 35 yards, three sacks for 23 yards and a forced fumble.
- ▶ No other player at a BCS institution has won defensive player of the week honors for their conference three times. Only Mike Taylor, a linebacker at Wisconsin, has won it twice.

A GAME OF FIRSTS - GEORGIA TECH RECAP

- ▶ The win over Georgia Tech made the Hurricanes the first team to defeat the Yellow Jackets in consecutive seasons since Coach Paul Johnson became the head coach.
- ▶ Marked the first game of the season for junior defensive lineman Olivier Vernon after serving a six-game suspension.
- ▶ Defensive back JoJo Nicolas recovered a fumble in the endzone to record the first touchdown of his career.
- ▶ In the second quarter, freshman LB Denzel Perryman recorded his first-career sack, a three yard loss for the Yellow Jackets.
- ▶ Jacory Harris had his first interception after going more than 17 quarters without a pick.

GSR SCORES SHOW CONTINUED SUCCESS OF MIAMI ATHLETICS

- ▶ In what is becoming an annual upward trend, student-athletes at the University of Miami continue to excel in the classroom at a record pace. According to the NCAA's Graduation Success Rates (GSR), Miami established a new athletics department-wide record with a GSR of 89 percent.
- ▶ Last year, the athletics department-wide GSR was at its then record-high 86 percent.
- ▶ The Athletics Department has exceeded the NCAA average for GSR in each of the last seven years.

Canes OPEN NEW ERA UNDER HEAD COACH AL GOLDEN

- ▶ First-year head coach Al Golden and his Canes won consecutive games for the first time this season after a dominating performance against Georgia Tech at Sun Life Stadium on Oct. 22.
- ▶ Golden owns an overall record of 31-37 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.
- ▶ Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

Canes SCHEDULE AMONG THE TOUGHEST

- ▶ According to Phil Steele's College Football Preview, Miami will face the 10th-toughest schedule of any FBS school this season. Only Colorado, Iowa State, Baylor, Oregon State, LSU, Boston College, USC, Washington and Auburn face a tougher road according to the publication.
- ▶ After traveling to Maryland for the season-opener, the Canes returned home to host non-conference foes Ohio State and Kansas State and Bethune-Cookman in three consecutive weeks at Sun Life Stadium. After a tough loss at Virginia Tech, Miami defeated North Carolina (Oct. 15) in Chapel Hill. The yearly rivalry game with Florida State will also come on the road, as the Canes will travel to Tallahassee to face the Seminoles on Nov. 12.
- ▶ UM was only one of six FBS programs to play its first three games against BCS-conference opponents. The others are USC, FAU, Rice, Notre Dame and BYU.

Jacory IN THE CLUTCH

Harris' 62 career touchdown passes rank second in school history and 8th all time among ACC passers. His career TD-to-Int ratio is 1.44-to-1.

The numbers above show that Harris is a slow starter as his TD-to-Int ratio in the opening half is just 1.03-to-1. However, in the second half, his numbers improve dramatically to 2.38-to-1.

Beyond that increase, Harris' red zone numbers are outstanding. When inside the opponent's 20-yard and facing a more condensed defense, the senior has:

When the game is on the line and points are necessary in the red zone, Harris has proven to come through in the clutch.

Jacory SOARING

▶ Under the tutelage of offensive coordinator and quarterback coach Jedd Fisch, Miami quarterback Jacory Harrris' completion rate (62.1%), QB rating (155.93), yards per attempt (8.6) and longest pass (77 yards) this season are all career highs.

J12 AMONG THE BEST

- ▶ Jacory Harris is among the nation's best quarterbacks with a passing efficiency of 170.77 ranking 14th nationally. Harris has connected on 90 of 145 passes with 12 touchdowns and four interceptions.
- ▶ Harris entered the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers as he appears in six different career records categories.
- ▶ Harris is ranked second all-time in pass completions and touchdows thrown, while ranking third in completion percentage, attempts, passing yardage and total offense. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in two categories, needing to complete 61 passes and attempt 139 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.
- ▶ He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.
- ▶ With his three TD passes against North Carolina, Harris moved into eighth place on the ACC's Career TD passes list with 62. The senior is now only one touchdown pass shy of Chris Rix (Florida State 2001-04). NC State's Phillip Rivers is the all-time leader with 95.
- ▶ Harris passed Wake Forest's Mike Elkins (1985-88; 7,304), with his 267-yard performance against the Tar Heels, for 21st place on the ACC's career passing yardage stats, as he now has 7,584 career passing yards.

- ▶ The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Bosher (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.
- ▶ Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.
- ▶ Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).
- ▶ Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.

- ▶ In the 2012 edition of the *U.S. News & World Report's* annual "Best Colleges" issue, released today, the University of Miami has risen to number 38 up from 47 last year, a nine point rise. UM remains the highest ranked school in the state of Florida.
- ▶ In an impressive ascent, UM has moved up 29 slots in the last 10 years, making it one of the fastest-rising institutions among national universities in recent times. UM is the only school currently in the top 50 to move up nine spots in one year and 29 spots in the past 10 years.

Home SWEET SUNSHINE STATE HOME

- ▶ Miami's game at North Carolina was the last of three games that the Canes played outside of the Sunshine State this regular season.
- ▶ Miami traveled to play Maryland, Virginia Tech and North Carolina in its only out-of-state games on the year.
- ▶ Nine games this season will be played in Florida, including a trip to Tallahassee to face Florida State on Nov. 12 and to Tampa for a tilt with USF on November 19.

Miami FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

▶ When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami this past school year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

Four TO ENTER UM HALL OF FAME

▶ The University of Miami Sports Hall of Fame announced on Sept. 22 that four former Hurricane football players will be among those to be enshrined in its Class of 2012. Current Baltimore Ravens Ed Reed and Bryant McKinnie as well as Rich Mercier and Ray Bellamy - the university's first African-American football player - will be enshrined into the hall on March 29, 2012.

▶ Ed Reed (1998-2001)

Consensus First Team All-America and All-BIG EAST selection in 2000 and 2001... Set UM career records for interceptions (21) and interception return yards (389)... His nine interceptions in 2001 is the second-highest single-season total in UM history... Recorded eight interceptions in 2000 (third-best in UM history).

▶ Bryant McKinnie (2000-2001)

Outland Trophy winner as college football's outstanding interior lineman in 2001... Named a First Team All-American by *The Football News* in 2000 and a consensus first team All-American by every national service in 2001, including the Associated Press, Football Writers Association, *The Football News, The Sporting News* and the Walter Camp and the National Football Foundations... The 2001 National Player of the Year by CNNSI.com... The 2001 College Football Offensive Player of the Year by The Football News... Did not allow a quarterback sack during his entire UM career.

▶ Ray Bellamy (1967-1970)

Miami's first African-American football player... Endured hardships and led the way for future African-American athletes... In 1968, had 37 receptions for 549 yards and two touchdowns... 


