CAN MIAMI END ITS TALLAHASSEE STRUGGLES?

The University of Miami will pay visit to the Florida State Seminoles on Sunday at 3:30 p.m. The intrastate and conference rivals have played a home and home series since the Canes joined the conference in 2004. However, Miami hasn't won in the state capitol since Jan. 29, 1987.

A PROGRAM FIRST

For the first time in the history of the program, the Hurricanes defeated a Top 5 team. Maryland visited the BankUnited Center on Jan. 12 with a perfect 16-0 record and a No. 5 national ranking.

Miami, behind 34 points from Riquna Williams defeated the Terrapins 75-63. At the time, Maryland was the highest scoring team in the nation and were also ranked No. 1 nationally in rebound differential. The Canes held the Terps to 21 points below their season average and outrebounded them 48-40.

SHOWTIME

Miami senior guard Riquna Williams has saved her best performances for the biggest games. Against No. 11 Rutgers, the 5-6 Pahokee, Fla. native poured in a career-high 36 points in the double-overtime victory. Then against an undefeated and fifth-ranked Maryland team, Williams matched a career-best with eight three-pointers, leading her team to a 75-63 win.

MIAMI TRIO SET TO MAKE HISTORY

Senior Shenise Johnson is 15 points shy of becoming just the fourth Hurricane in history to reach 2,000 career points. Fellow classmate Riquna Williams isn't too far behind with 1,941 career points. Additionally, junior forward Morgan Stroman needs only 62 points to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

After a nationwide survey, only one program in NCAA history has had two 2,000-point scorers and a 1,000-point scorer on the same team. The 2000-01 Georgia Bulldogs' trio of Kelly and Coco Miller and Tawana McDonald accomplished the feat.

PROTECTING THE BANKUNITED CENTER

With Miami's season-opening win over Texas-Pan American, the Canes won their 25th-consecutive home contest - setting a new program record.

Miami has extended that record to 34 games after its 75-63 victory over No. 5 Maryland on Jan. 12. The streak is currently the third-longest active streak in the nation. Connecticut (94) and Stanford (71) are the two teams with longer active win streaks. Coincidentally, Stanford's Tara VanDerveer, Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Miami's Katie Meier shared last season's AP National Coach of the Year Award.

The streak began with the team's final regular season home game of the 2009-10 season and continued with a perfect 20-0 home record last season.

The previous record of 24 straight wins at home was set from the 1990-91 through the 1992-93 seasons.

ARE YOU SERIOUS?!

Miami senior Shenise Johnson is having a remarkable start to the 2011-12 season. The Preseason AP All-American and ACC Player of the Year leads the conference in several categories and ranks among the best in others. Johnson is the only player in the conference to rank among the Top 10 in scoring, rebounding and assists. In fact, in all the BCS automatically qualifying conferences, only Colorado's Chucky Jeffery shares that distinction with Johnson (Pac 12).

APPLYING THE HEAT

At 15.5 steals per game, the Hurricanes rank No. 1 in the nation. Shenise Johnson, with 4.0 thefts per contest, is No. 1 in the conference and ranks fourth nationally. Riquna Williams and Morgan Stroman aren't too far off, having a hand in 2.6 and 2.2 steals per game respectively. In all, Miami forces 25.5 turnovers per game and scores 27.9 points per game off of them, 14.3 points per game more than its opponents.

MORE HARDWARE FOR THE TROPHY CASE

With back-to-back double-doubles in the Miami Holiday Tournament, Shenise Johnson led the Hurricanes to wins over Holy Cross and VCU. For her performance in the two-day event, the senior guard was named the Tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Earlier in the season, Johnson was named the Most Outstanding Player of the Great Alaska Shootout.

"EPIC" PERFORMANCE

After rolling her ankle in Miami's win at Michigan State on Dec. 1, it wasn't a guarantee that Riquna Williams would play against No. 11 Rutgers on Dec. 5. Not only did Williams play, she scored a career-best 36 points. Williams only had five points at halftime, but poured in 31 in the second half and two overtime sessions in helping the Canes erase a 16-point second-half deficit and defeat the Scarlet Knights, 92-81.

MORE THAN ANY OTHER

After wins over Rutgers (12/5) - 36 points - and Ole Miss (12/10) - 17 points - Riquna Williams was voted the ACC Player of the Week for the seventh time in her career. No other active player has earned the award more than Williams. Second place on that list with six awards is Shenise Johnson.

THREE-POINT STREAK SNAPPED

For the first time in 340 games, Miami went an entire game without hitting a three-pointer. The Canes finished 0-10 from beyond the arc at Georgia Tech on Jan. 9.

THE BIG TEN/ACC CHALLENGE

The women's 2011 Big Ten/ACC Challenge ended in a 6-6 draw in its fifth year. The ACC won each of the previous four challenges.

Miami earned its first victory in the challenge in three attempts with its 76-60 victory at Michigan State. The Canes fell to Michigan in 2007 and then Indiana in 2008.

BIG-TIME TEAM ON THE SMALL SCREEN

The Nov. 17 meeting with Tennessee was the first of 12 games that will be televised this season - a program record. Miami's next televised contest will be at home against Wake Forest on Jan. 26. FSN South will provide coverage beginning at 7 p.m.

MOVING UP THE RANKS

Shenise Johnson currently sits in fourth place all-time at Miami with 1,985 career points and needs 200 points to pass Frances Savage (1988-92) for third place. With 1,941 points, Riquna Williams ranks fifth all-time.

SWEDISH THREE-BALLS

Junior Stefanie Yderstrom is tied with teammate Riquna Williams for the ACC lead with 35 three-pointers this season. The Ostertalje, Sweden native now has 135 career three-point field goals, ranking sixth in program history. Williams is far and away the school's most prolific three-point shooter, sinking 240 for her career - 88 more than Desma Thomas' (1992-97) second-place total of 152.

DOUBLE-FIGURE STREAK SNAPPED

Shenise Johnson was held to six points against Maryland on Jan. 12, ending her nation-long streak of 87 straight games of scoring in double-figures.

EXPLOSIVE DUO

During the 2010-11 season, Riquna Williams and Shenise Johnson combined for 50 or more points on five occasions. Against Rutgers (12/5) the duo combined for 61 points - the most ever for the two seniors.

THE ACC KNOWS

Johnson, the ACC Preseason Player of the Year and a preseason All-American, scored a game-high 18 points in a 72-55 victory over Alaska Anchorage in the Great Alaska Shootout's first round, earning Player of the Game honors. In the tournament final against USF, Johnson nearly recorded a triple-double with 11 points, nine rebounds and nine assists. For her performance in the two games, Johnson was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player.

The Henrietta, N.Y., native amassed game-highs in points (22), rebounds (6), assists (8) and steals (7) against Longwood in a 92-43 victory to wrap up the week.

GREAT ALASKA SHOOTOUT CHAMPIONS

The Hurricanes won their first Great Alaska Shootout in their third appearance in the event. A win over host Alaska Anchorage in the opening round and then over USF in the final gave the Canes the championship.

Shenise Johnson was named the Shootout Most Outstanding Player and earned Player of the Game honors against UAA. Riquna Williams was named the Player of the Game against the Bulls.

In their previous two appearances, the Canes had a combined 3-3 record.

HIGH PRAISE FOR THE CANES

After Miami defeated Michigan State in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, Spartan head coach Suzy Merchant said, "I'm not surprised. We knew what they were going to do. We practiced against six and seven guys on our scout team. But from 1 to 5, that's the fastest, most athletic team we've faced in my career. We've played Duke, and it's not even close."

ULM's Mona Martin had even more praise to hand out, saying, "Last year we played Texas A&M, and they end up winning the thing [NCAA title], and I think this UM team could be a big contender for the national championship if they stay healthy," Martin said. "They have so much depth, play so hard. They're going to be way up there this year. I've watched a lot of film, lot of ballgames, and they run the floor better than any team I've watched from point guard to post. Their transition offense is unbelievable. I can't say we've ever played a team that runs the floor that well, and I've been in this business 36 years. There is a lot of desire and fight in those kids."

CANES BACKCOURT NAMED TO WATCHLISTS

The University of Miami's Shenise Johnson and Riquna Williams have been named to the Women's Preseason Nominee List for the 2011 John R. Wooden Award. The duo has also been selected to the "Wade Watch" list for the State Farm Wade Trophy Division I Player of the Year, as well as the Naismith Player of the Year List.

ON THE DOUBLE

Shenise Johnson and Morgan Stroman have each recorded multiple double-doubles for the Hurricanes this season. Johnson's fourth double-double of the season (12 points/13 rebounds) against VCU gave her 31 for her career - the most among any ACC player.

Stroman's second double-double came in a win at Georgia Tech as she scored 18 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. The junior forward now has 17 career double-doubles.

MORE TO COME

National Player of the Year candidate Shenise Johnson ranks in the Top 10 of many categories for UM career records including points (4th), assists (5th), rebounds (4th), and steals (2nd). Johnson is the only player in Miami history to be ranked in the Top 10 of all four of those categories.

JOHNSON TABBED ACC PRESEASON POY

Shenise Johnson returns as the 2011-12 ACC Preseason Player of the Year. The senior was named the 2010-11 ACC Player of the Year, the first Hurricane player to win the award, and voted to last year's All-ACC First Team and All-ACC Defensive team.

CANES OPEN SEASON RANKED SEVENTH

The Hurricanes, who finished the 2010-2011 season ranked tenth in the final ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll, moved up three spots in anticipation of their 2011-12 season. The No. 7 ranking in the Coaches' Poll is the highest rank in program history to begin a season.

The Hurricanes were also ranked No. 7 in the preseason Associated Press Poll.

Miami is currently ranked 13th in the AP Poll and 11th in the Coaches Poll.

JOHNSON NAMED LOWE'S CANDIDATE

Shenise Johnson is one of 30 women's basketball student-athletes from around the nation to be named a candidate for the 2011 Lowe's Senior CLASS award.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

TOP-10 MATCH UP IN TIP-OFF CLASSIC

On Nov. 15, the seventh-ranked Hurricanes traveled to Knoxville, Tenn. to face the third-ranked Lady Vols in the 19th Annual State Farm Tip-Off Classic.

Miami was led by the performances of seniors Riquna Williams and Shenise Johnson, who scored 24 and 17 points, respectively.

However, an early second-half run from Tennessee broke the halftime tie and in the end, five Lady Vols scored in double-figures in the game, leading to a 92-76 Tennessee victory.

MIAMI VOTED ACC FAVORITES

The Hurricanes women's basketball team has been predicted to finish atop the 2011-12 ACC Women's Basketball standings for the first time since joining the league in 2004. The predictions were made by a vote of the Blue Ribbon Panel, consisting of national and local media, as well as school representatives.

The Hurricanes, who earned 30 of a possible 40 first-place votes, are coming off the ultimate turnaround in which the squad finished 12th in 2009-10 and then tied with Duke for the ACC regular season crown one year later. The 12 ACC wins last season were the most for the UM program in the league, while Miami also won 20 games for the 10th time in program history.

2010-11 Season Recap**MIAMI FINISHES MEMORABLE SEASON**

The 2010-11 University of Miami women's basketball team finished one of the best seasons in program history with an 88-83 loss to 21st-ranked and sixth seeded Oklahoma in the second round of the NCAA Tournament at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Va.

The Hurricanes finished 28-5, recording the most wins since the 1991-92 team tallied 30 victories.

STRONG NON-CONFERENCE RECORD

Miami took care of business in the non-conference portion of the schedule, going 15-2 outside the ACC. Their signature win was the 81-72 victory over No. 20/12 Georgetown on Dec. 7 to establish the Canes as a national contender.

DANCING

Miami earned a No. 3 seed in the NCAA Tournament in the Dayton Region. It was the first time since 2004 that the program advanced to the "Big Dance."

The Canes won their first round match up 80-62 over No. 14 Gardner-Webb at John Paul Jones Arena in Charlottesville, Va. behind 18 points from junior Shenise Johnson to setup a second-round game against No. 6 Oklahoma. It was the first win in the NCAA Tournament for the Hurricanes since 1993.

WILLIAMS ALSO HONORED

Riquna Williams also picked up a number of accolades throughout the season, including being named to the All-ACC First Team. The guard was named ACC Player of the Week on four occasions throughout the year, and was a finalist for the WBCA/State Farm All-America team.

KATIE MEIER EARNS MAJOR AWARDS

Head coach Katie Meier picked up several high-profile postseason awards for her success on the year. Meier was tabbed by the Associated Press as its Coach of the Year, sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

In addition, she took home the Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year Award and RUSSELL ATHLETIC/WBCA Region 2 Division I Coach of the Year honors, an award voted on by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

Meier also won the Babe Didrickson Zaharias award and gained entrance to UM's prestigious Iron Arrow Society – known as the highest honor attained at the university.

START IT UP

Head coach Katie Meier was the only coach in the nation to use the same starting lineup for the entire 2010-11 season. Riquna Williams, Shenise Johnson and Stefanie Yderstrom started at guard, while Morgan Stroman and Sylvia Bullock started at forward.

JOHNSON RECOGNIZED FOR SEASON

Shenise Johnson had one of the best seasons of any player in the country, earning a litany of awards for her efforts. Prior to the ACC Tournament, the junior was named ACC Player of the Year, the first Hurricane player to win the award, and voted to the All-ACC First Team and All-ACC Defensive team. In addition, the league honored her with Player of the Week on Jan. 3.

Johnson also earned honors on the Associated Press Third Team All-America, Full Court Press Second Team All-America, USBWA All-America and WBCA/State Farm All-America teams. She was also a finalist for the Wooden Award given to the top player in women's college basketball.

ACC TOURNAMENT

Miami earned the No. 2 seed in the 2011 ACC Tournament at the Greensboro Coliseum in Greensboro, N.C., receiving a first-round bye. The Canes drew NC State in the quarterfinals, defeating the Wolfpack 93-85 with four players scoring at least 15 points. In the semifinals, North Carolina jumped out to a big lead and never looked back, routing Miami 83-57 to end the tournament for the Canes.

20-20

Miami won 20 games for the 10th time in program history. Following the 22-14 record in 2009-10, it was the first time the team had consecutive 20-win seasons since the 1988-89 season through the 1991-92 seasons.

SCORING TITLE

Riquna Williams led the ACC in scoring last season, averaging 21.7 points per game. Williams also totaled the most overall points in the league with 717 on the year. Shenise Johnson finished the season right behind her in scoring, finishing second in the conference at 19.6 points per game.

HISTORIC WINNING STREAK

Miami won 17 straight games overall from Nov. 17-Jan. 24 - the second longest streak in program history and at one point the longest active streak in the country. The Hurricanes have only reached a winning streak of at least 10 games five times previously and it was the first such streak for the 'Canes since the 1992-93 season, in which they won 10 consecutive games. The longest winning streak in team history occurred during the 1991-92 season, when Miami won 30 straight games.

GIMME THAT

The Canes finished second in the nation with 13.7 steals per game. Morgan Stroman averaged the fifth-most steals per game, 3.7, with Shenise Johnson ranking tenth in the country at 3.2 per contest. Stroman, Johnson and Riquna Williams (2.8/game) were the top three stealers in the ACC. Miami grabbed a season-high 21 steals on three occasions – against Clemson, Lipscomb and Kennesaw State.

Bolstered by their steals, the Hurricanes also finished fourth in the nation in turnover margin (+7.97).

100 HURRICANE VICTORIES

Head coach Katie Meier won her 100th game at the helm of the Hurricanes with the team's March 20th victory over Gardner-Webb in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. The sixth-year head coach is just the third coach in the program's 40-year history to reach the milestone.

UP AND DOWN THE COURT

Katie Meier's fast-paced offense averaged 79.9 points per game – fourth highest in the country. The Canes beat up on a number of opponents, with a +17.2 scoring margin – 12th-best in NCAA Division I out of 333 teams.

NOT CLOSE

The Hurricane didn't play too many close games in 2010-11. Here is a breakdown of certain situations from last season.

Head Coach Katie Meier

Katie Meier enters her seventh season as the head coach of the Hurricanes' women's basketball program in 2011-12. A well known and respected figure in women's basketball, Meier has worked tirelessly to put her mark on Miami's program and to build a winning tradition. All of her hard work was rewarded after the 2010-11 season as she was named the Associated Press National Coach of the Year - sharing the award with Connecticut's Geno Auriemma and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer.

Meier led the Hurricanes into the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2004 and its win over Gardner-Webb in the first round was the first tournament win for the 'Canes since 1993. Miami entered the 2010-11 season with high internal expectations, but were picked eighth in the Preseason ACC Poll and were coming off a season in which it was the No. 12 seed in the ACC Tournament.

However, the Hurricanes exceeded all of the outside expectations and at one point, won 17 straight games. They were a perfect 20-0 inside the BankUnited Center and finished 12-2 in ACC play - earning their first regular season conference title since joining the league in 2004. As a reward, Meier was named the

ACC Coach of the Year and later would be selected as the WBCA/RUSSELL ATHLETIC Region 2 Coach of the Year, as voted on by her peers.

Hired on April 19, 2005, then UM Athletics Director Paul Dee announced the appointment of Meier in front of national and local media, fans, alumni and support staff, signifying the beginning of a new era.

Following an unprecedented career as one of the greatest athletes to ever play in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Meier quickly established herself in the coaching ranks. Upon her appointment at UM, following an impressive four-year tenure as the head coach at Charlotte where she helped bring the 49er program into national prominence, Meier made it clear that her goal is to make Miami one of the premier women's basketball programs in the country.

In her first season, Meier wasted little time in making the first steps towards those goals. After receiving little attention in the ACC preseason polls, the Hurricanes posted an impressive overall record of 17-13. After fighting through a conference that would send nine teams to the postseason, including three to the NCAA Final Four. Miami finished with a sixth-place, 6-8 record in ACC play en route to earning a berth into the second round of the 2006 Women's National Invitation Tournament.

Throughout the season Miami posted wins over ranked teams such as Mississippi (No. 25), Boston College (No. 21) and Virginia Tech (No. 25)--and nearly knocked off then-No. 1 Duke in double-overtime. The Hurricanes also recorded wins over two eventual conference champions in Hartford (America East) and Oakland (Mid-Continent). Under her direction, standout Tamara James produced one of the greatest seasons ever seen by a UM player in 2005-06, including becoming the University's all-time leading scorer before being taken as the No. 8 overall pick in the 2006 WNBA Draft by the Washington Mystics.

In Meier's second season in 2006-07, the Hurricanes got off to a strong start, winning seven of their first eight games--including a 79-70 win over Indiana to claim the UM Thanksgiving Tournament title. On Dec. 1, Meier picked up her 100th career victory as the Hurricanes defeated Jackson State, 77-50. However, with only eight healthy players to call upon by the start of the ACC schedule, Miami faced challenge after challenge competing in a league that ranked among the top-three strongest women's basketball conferences nationally and produced two of the NCAA Tournament's four No. 1 seeds in 2006-07.

Regardless, Renee Taylor emerged as the ACC's leading scorer--upholding Miami's streak of producing the league's leading scorer in all three years it had been a member. The All-ACC Second Team selection set school records in single-game scoring with 42 points at Houston and became the 19th Hurricane to score at least 1,000 points--and just the sixth to do so in her first two seasons. In addition, transfer Maurita Reid emerged as a defensive threat, tying the school record with 10 steals versus Wake Forest and finishing among the ACC's leaders and NCAA's top 10 in steals per game.

The 2007-08 season, Meier's third with the Hurricanes, saw Maurita Reid continue her rise among the ACC elite. The senior was nothing short of impressive shooting beyond the arc and picking opponent's pockets. She hit four or more three-pointers on 10 different occasions and finished the season with 110 steals, good for second in the conference and fifth in the NCAA. The Queens, N.Y. native led the team in points (15.3 ppg) and rebounding (5.6 rpg) and was also named the ACC All-Defensive Team.

With a No. 21 incoming recruiting class, Meier and the Hurricanes saw significant improvement during the 2008-09 season. The freshman class was highlighted by McDonald's All-American Shenise Johnson - out of Henrietta, N.Y. and Riquna Williams - from nearby Pahokee, Fla.

Johnson lived up to the hype as she was the team leader on the season in points, rebounds, assists and steals. Under Meier's guidance, Johnson was named the ACC Rookie of the Week on three occasions and was named to the ACC All-Freshmen team as well as ACC Honorable Mention. The versatile guard/forward also led the U19 USA team to a gold medal finish in the 2009 World Championships in Bangkok, Thailand.

The 2009-10 season was one of the most successful in program history. Under Meier's vision, the Hurricanes advanced to the WNIT Championship game. Miami posted a 22-14 overall record - the first 20-win campaign since the 2002-03 season and just the eighth all-time.

In her sophomore season, Johnson was joined by a healthy Riquna Williams and the duo racked up accolades throughout the season. Johnson was named First Team All-ACC, while Williams garnered second-team honors. The tandem led Miami to a 5-1 WNIT record - the deepest postseason run in team history - with both earning all-tournament honors along the way.

Following the 2009-10 campaign, University of Miami Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced that Meier signed a contract extension through 2015.

"We are excited about the tremendous progress our women's basketball team achieved this past season," said Hocutt. "Coach Meier continues to assemble a special group of talented young women at the University of Miami and we look forward to the future success of our program."

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Miami was leading by 20 points, and coach Katie Meier was steaming mad at halftime anyway.

"You are playing," she said, "as bad as my haircut."

OK, so Meier's locks were a bit out of place Friday. Maybe it was worth a bad hair day to see national player of the year candidate Shenise Johnson come within an assist of a triple-double, have nine different players score and the seventh-ranked Hurricanes open their season with an 83-37 win over Texas-Pan American.

Johnson finished with 20 points, 13 rebounds and nine assists. Riquana Williams scored 16 points and the Hurricanes (1-0) forced 35 turnovers on the way to winning their 25th straight game at home, a program record.

"Not quite sure exactly why we were so awkward to start the game," said Meier, who won the AP's national coach of the year award last season. "I don't know a better word. It just felt very awkward. There was no flow, there was no rhythm, there was no energy and that was really disappointing. ... I'm sure it had to do a lot with Texas-Pan Am."

Say this for Texas-Pan American: The Broncos weren't intimidated early. Miami's lead was only 24-13 with less than 4 minutes left in the first half before the Hurricanes hit five straight shots, the last two by Stefanie Yderstrom.

The Hurricanes were shooting 23 percent late in the half then shot 54 percent the rest of the way.

"We found out what you have to do and how hard to you have to play against a team like this," Broncos coach Denny Downing said. "I think we learned from their passion, because obviously they're very passionate about what they're doing."

LaQuita Garner scored 14 for the Broncos (0-1). Texas-Pan American played some of the Big 12's toughest teams last season - Baylor, Texas, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State - and lost them all by an average of 50.8 points.

This one didn't seem as though it would turn into one of those blowouts, not the way the Broncos hung around for much of the first half.

Yderstrom and Morgan Stroman scored 12 each for the Hurricanes, who visit No. 3 Tennessee on Tuesday.

"We had it in mind," Yderstrom acknowledged afterward, when asked about the looming trip to Knoxville. "You can't overlook any competition. I think they gave us a good game, especially in the first half. We needed it."

Johnson was nearly perfect on the day. She shot 6 for 9 from the field, made all eight of her foul shots and controlled pace for the Hurricanes.

"The opponent is our opponent," Johnson said. "But if Miami does what Miami is supposed to do, we'll win. I don't think we were looking ahead. I think we were just worried about Miami."

And while it was the beginning of a season with Final Four hopes, Miami's start was more than a little rusty.

Miami was 6 for 26 from the field in the first 16 minutes, an uncharacteristic clip for a team that shot 43 percent last season. Here's a great example of how cold the Hurricanes were in the opener: There was one possession where four players all missed shots and Miami came away empty, a series that had Meier pivoting around and taking a somewhat purposeful walk a few steps down the sideline.

Eventually, the defending Atlantic Coast Conference regular-season co-champions got going, making their final five shots of the opening half. Yderstrom hit a 3-pointer with 1:22 left to push the lead to 33-13, and she converted a nifty reverse layup about a minute later to keep the margin at 20 points going into halftime.

So while Miami couldn't have liked the offensive numbers in the first 20 minutes, the defense made up for at least some of the trouble at the other end. In the first half, Texas-Pan American had 21 shot attempts - and 20 turnovers, unable to handle Miami's pressure.

In the second half, the offensive surge just kept going. The Hurricanes made seven of their first 13 shots after intermission, capped by a three-point play by Pepper Wilson with 13:14 left that gave Miami a 54-28 lead.

"Our bench did a fantastic job of changing our rhythm," Meier said. "And that's fun."

TENNESSEE 92, MIAMI 76 - NOV. 15, 2011

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (AP) - Pat Summitt has fielded plenty of questions about her health lately. Certainly nothing has changed about her ability to grill her players at halftime when she's disappointed in their performance.

The third-ranked Lady Vols came into halftime tied at 42 with seventh-ranked Miami after being manhandled on the boards. Summitt got onto them hard during her halftime speech, and they responded with a 92-76 victory on Tuesday night in the State Farm Tip-Off Classic.

"If you ever doubt if Pat Summitt is still coaching, look at how our team responds coming out in the second half," associate head coach Holly Warlick said. "She got on them pretty hard. We all did as a staff about our rebounding effort, our hustle plays that weren't there. We challenged them for 20 minutes, and they responded."

It was the first big test of the season for two veteran teams, and the matchup lived up to its billing in the first-ever meeting for the programs.

Though the game pitted preseason All-Americans Shekinna Stricklen and Shenise Johnson against one another, the spotlight was stolen by Taber Spani and Meighan Simmons, who together hit 7 of 13 from 3-point range.

The Lady Vols (2-0) came out after intermission and unleashed an 18-4 run to take control. Glory Johnson, who struggled in the first half against Miami's inside defense, hit a layup that made it 60-46 with 16:19 to go.

The Lady Vols got sloppy, committing three turnovers that helped the Hurricanes charge back with nine unanswered points to cut the margin to seven, and with 7:31 to go, Shenise Johnson hit a jumper to cut the Lady Vols' lead to 73-68.

Miami (1-1) would get no closer. Two possessions later, Spani took an inbound pass with 10 seconds on the shot clock and launched a 3-pointer that hit nothing but net as the buzzer sounded.

"I thought that was the turning point of the game, as we were struggling kind of to get back in it," Miami coach Katie Meier said.

A couple of minutes later, Spani rebounded a missed 3-point attempt by Shenise Johnson and launched the ball across the court to Simmons, who charged to the basket for a layup to make it 84-68. The basket capped an 11-0 run that began with Spani's trey and sent the orange-clad crowd into a frenzy.

"I think it's more mental than anything else," said Spani, who played 39 minutes. "Obviously all of us have shot millions of shots throughout our careers, so it's just a mindset going in and knowing that you can knock down shots."

Simmons scored 18 points, Glory Johnson finished with 16 and nine rebounds, Stricklen added 15 points and Ariel Massengale had 11 points and nine assists.

"I thought across the board, everybody contributed in certain ways," Summitt said. "It's just a matter of who's coming in. At any given moment, we've got enough people that somebody's going to step up."

The Tennessee coaches expected a strong rebounding effort by the Lady Vols, so they instead asked the players to focus on not turning the ball over. By halftime, Tennessee had just six turnovers but had 13 fewer rebounds than Miami.

By the end of the game, the Lady Vols had put enough an effort on the boards to trail the Hurricanes 45-38 in rebounding, and it was Miami that was struggling to hang onto the ball. The Hurricanes turned the ball over 21 times, leading to 23 points for the Lady Vols - 10 more than Miami got off giveaways.

Riquana Williams, who led the Atlantic Coast Conference in scoring a season ago, sank 24 points for Miami. Shenise Johnson added 17 and Morgan Stroman scored 11.

The stingy defensive play by both teams forced the ball to the hands of the outside shooters during the first half, leading four lead changes and two ties.

Miami took an early edge after scoring eight unanswered points. Williams and Stefanie Yderstrom each had a 3, while Stroman hit a pair of free throws to take an 8-2 lead, their largest margin of the first half.

A few minutes later, Tennessee went on an 8-0 run of its own, capped by a 3-pointer by Simmons off a dish by Massengale. The basket gave the Lady Vols an 18-16 lead - their first since the opening basket. They slowly built their margin to 38-31 on a jumper in the paint by Alicia Manning with 4:52 in the first half, but Miami scored the final five points of the half to tie it at the break.

"Our confidence was high," Shenise Johnson said. "The score was zero-zero."

The teams launched a flurry of long shots during their streaks, and the Lady Vols hit 7 of 13 and Miami 6 of 14 from behind the arc in the first half. Tennessee finished 11 of 22 from long range, while Miami missed all nine of its second-half attempts.

The Lady Vols have now won 38 straight games at home on the court named for Summitt, dating to a 62.54 loss to Duke on Feb. 16, 2009. They travel to Virginia on Sunday before hosting No. 1 Baylor at The Summit on Nov. 27.

MIAMI 107, PRAIRIE VIEW A&M 26 - NOV. 17, 2011

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - The start of a stretch against top-tier conference teams started dreadfully for Prairie View.

After a season-opening win against Rice, the Panthers lost 107-26 at No. 7 Miami on Thursday night. The Hurricanes (2-1) ran off to a 19-0 start in the opening 5:17 and eventually built a 39-2 lead with 10:30 remaining in the first half. Johnson scored 10 points in Miami's early surge and finished the half with 17 points.

Prairie View, a 2011 NCAA tournament qualifier from the Southwest Athletic Conference, was held without a field goal until Jeannette Jackson's short jumper with 9:40 remaining that made the score 39-4.

"They played at a different speed," Panthers coach Toyelle Wilson said. "The girls were shell shocked a little bit. It's hard to prepare for a team like the University of Miami in practice."

Miami led 60-9 at halftime. The Hurricanes forced 26 Panthers turnovers and allowed three field goals on 22 attempts in the first half. Their pressure defense also resulted in 17 first half steals.

The 81-point margin of victory set a Miami school record, beating the time the Hurricanes beat Homestead Air Force Base, 100-20, on Jan. 14, 1976.

"I thought that was a tremendous performance by our bench but it was initially a statement from our starters," Miami coach Katie Meier said. They played very angry, very determined and with a ton of confidence but with an absolute focus of fixing what we didn't do well at Tennessee."

Tennessee outscored the Hurricanes by 16 in the second half and defeated Miami, 92-76. Meier praised her team's defensive effort against Prairie View.

"We didn't like having 92 points scored against us," Meier said. "So we had a mission we were going to shut down and play defense."

Meier substituted freely early. The Miami reserves played 52 minutes and the starters 48 in the first half.

"Those veterans, the starters, set the tone. They were the teachers."

Johnson struggled offensively against Tennessee and made up for it by shooting 10-of-12, including 5-of-5 from 3-point range. Johnson played only 20 minutes.

"I was disappointed with my effort at Tennessee," said Johnson, who shot 8-of-19 and converted only one 3-pointer against the Volunteers. "I was just focused on hitting shots."

The Hurricanes (2-1) ran off to a 19-0 start in the opening 5:17 and eventually built a 39-2 lead with 10:30 remaining in the first half. Johnson scored 10 points in Miami's early surge and finished the half with 17 points.

Prairie View, a 2011 NCAA tournament qualifier from the Southwest Athletic Conference, was held without a field goal until Jeannette Jackson's short jumper with 9:40 remaining that made the score 39-4.

"I told (the players) we were going to throw them in the fire early," said Prairie View coach Toyelle Wilson coach. "Miami is ranked number seven for a reason."

Johnson's 3-pointer with 4:16 remaining gave the Hurricanes their first 80-point lead, 101-19. Johnson finished 5-of-5 from behind the arc.

For the game, the Hurricanes converted on 10-of-17 3-pointers.

Stefanie Yderstrom scored 13 points and Stroman finished with 12 points for the Hurricanes. Before the game, the Hurricanes players and coaches were presented with their 2010-11 ACC regular season championship rings. Two new banners also were displayed from the rafters recognizing the team's the conference regular season title and its berth in the 2011 NCAA tournament.

MIAMI 72, ALASKA ANCHORAGE 55- NOV. 55, 2011

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP) - Shenise Johnson scored 18 points and No. 9 Miami beat Alaska-Anchorage 72-55 on Wednesday night in the opening round of the Carrs-Safeway Great Alaska Shootout.

The Hurricanes (3-1) shot just 27 percent in the first half against the Division II Seawolves (4-1) and trailed much of the period. Alaska-Anchorage's biggest lead of the half was four, but Johnson's 3-pointer just before the first-half buzzer gave Miami a 28-26 lead.

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - A 20-hour trip from Alaska failed to affect No. 9 Miami.

Still shaking off jet-lag from their return home early Saturday morning, the Hurricanes were down Longwood in a 92-43 rout Sunday afternoon.

Shenise Johnson scored 22 points on 9-of-11 shooting and had six assists to lead the Hurricanes (5-1). Morgan Stroman finished with 20 points, shooting 8 of 10 from the field.

"We handled a very difficult travel situation, getting home at 1:30 in the morning and having practice later," Miami coach Katie Meier said. "Flying through the night, grabbing a nap wherever you could, I'm really in awe of the maturity of this team. I'm really proud of them for how they handled it."

The Hurricanes, who defeated Alaska Anchorage and South Florida in the Great Alaska Shootout Nov. 23 and 24, dealt with a return flight to Coral Gables that was plagued by delays before takeoff and subsequent flight connections.

"It was chaotic, we were on the plane for two hours figuring out when we were going to leave," Johnson said. "I thought we did a great job of not complaining. Coach did a great job of keeping us calm. We were going to get home at some point."

Longwood (1-5) could not capitalize. The Hurricanes kept the Lancers scoreless for a 7:54 stretch of the first half and built a 48-22 lead with 2:01 remaining. Stroman scored six consecutive points on fast-break layups during the stretch.

"I knew once I had the ball I could beat my defender so I just ran out in front," Stroman said. Miami expanded a 50-28 lead at halftime with a 16-4 spurt in the first 5:08 of the second half. Stroman's two free throws with 8:34 remaining gave the Hurricanes their first 40-point lead at 76-35. Miami had 20 steals and forced 28 Longwood turnovers and increased its home winning streak to

27. "I challenged the team at halftime to get their legs underneath them a little bit on defense," Meier said. "We had a goal that we wanted to hold Longwood under 40. To regroup at halftime and lock down on a 15-point performance I was very impressed with my team."
 Mina Jovanic scored 12 points to lead the Lancers.

"They were much better than us," Longwood coach Bill Reinson said. "We couldn't stop them in transition. We didn't quit and fought down to the end. We continued to make plays. I feel we can build from this game."

The Hurricanes enjoyed a 17-2 run early in the first half. Krystal Saunders' basket with 13:22 remaining capped the run and gave Miami a 25-8 lead.

Longwood rallied and outscored Miami 14-5 in the next 5:43. Brittani Billups' layup with 8:39 remaining ended the run and got the Lancers within eight at 30-22.

MIAMI 75, MARYLAND 63 - JAN. 12, 2012

CORAL GABLES, Fla. (AP) - Celebrating yet another 3-pointer, Riquana Williams hopped along the sideline, faced the stands and waved to coax more cheers from a crowd eager to witness a milestone win for the Miami Hurricanes.

"I've never done that before," the senior guard said.

It was a night of firsts. Williams scored 34 points and No. 13-ranked Miami defeated a top-five team for the first time ever, rallying past No. 5 Maryland 75-63 Thursday.

Williams tied a career high by sinking eight 3-pointers, the last coming with two minutes left to put Miami ahead by 11 points.

"The difference was we had no answer for Riquana," Maryland coach Brenda Frese said. "She was unstoppable. She was definitely in a zone."

The Hurricanes (14-3 overall, 3-1 Atlantic Coast Conference) won despite missing 21 consecutive shots in the first half, when they went 10 minutes without a basket to squander an early 12-point lead.

Miami extended its home winning streak to 34 games.

"There's something magical that happens at home - we just have these moments," coach Katie Meier said. "The crowd is in a frenzy, and we're an emotional team. The crowd totally helped."

Maryland (16-1, 3-1) was held 21 points below its scoring average of 84.4 points per game, best in the nation.

Miami outscored the Terrapins by 33 points from 3-point range and won even though Shenise Johnson shot 2 for 15 and had just six points, 10 below her average. That ended her streak of scoring in double figures in 87 consecutive games.

Johnson didn't seem to mind.

"We won. Period," the senior said. "I feel like I'm in some way responsible. This is a great win for our program, and I'm happy to be a part of it."

Williams shot 12 for 24, including 8 for 14 from 3-point range. Stefanie Yderstrom went 4-for-7 beyond the arc and scored 12 points. Morgan Stroman added 10 points and eight rebounds for the Hurricanes, who enjoyed an eight-rebound edge despite Maryland's height advantage.

Alyssa Thomas had 18 points for the Terrapins but committed eight turnovers. Laurin Mincy was held to six points, nearly nine below her average.

The Terrapins went 2 for 11 from 3-point range, while Miami shot 13 for 28. The loss was the first for Maryland since it was beaten in the second round of the NCAA tournament last year.

"We remember how it felt last time," Thomas said. "I know we're going to come back strong."

Miami trailed by seven points early in the second half but regained the lead when a 3-pointer by Williams made it 47-46. She sank back-to-back 3-pointers during a 10-0 run that put the Hurricanes up 64-56 with less than four minutes left.

That prompted her celebration along the sideline as she encouraged the fans' cheers.

"I wanted to let them know, 'You guys are helping us,'" she said. "It was a great emotional feeling, like, 'We want to win, and we're going to go get it.'"

Williams scored 15 points in the first 8 1/2 minutes to help the Hurricanes take a 22-10 lead. They then went cold, and a 15-1 run by the Terrapins put them ahead.

Meier described the Hurricanes' offense in the first half as "horrible."

"I said, 'If our offense is the problem, we're fine,'" she said. "We knew we would click at a certain point."
