


WEEKEND STORY LINES & NEWS

- Miami will host Georgia Tech for its opening ACC weekend from March 10-12 at Mark Light Field on ACC Network Extra.
- Miami leads the all-time series with the Yellow Jackets **58-36-2**; the Hurricanes won **three of four games** against the
- Jackets in 2016, including a weekend series in Atlanta and their 2016 ACC Championship opener in Durham, N.C (4-0). • UM has won four of the last five head-to-head series against GT since 2012, and has won six of the last seven games.
- Junior righthander Jesse Lepore has the third-lowest ERA (0.90) in the ACC; he has allowed two runs in 20.0 innings.
- UM dropped its midweek home-and-home to FIU on March 7-8; it was the first two regular season meetings since 2008.
- The Hurricanes made their 25th trip to the College World Series in 2016, finishing with a 50-14 record and a 21-9 mark in ACC play. Miami was the No. 3 national seed for the postseason, and won the ACC Regular Season Championship.
- Head coach Jim Morris has the fifth-most wins in Division I history (1,539), the third-most wins among active coaches, a
- .695 winning percentage (sixth among active coaches), and 194 more wins than the next active coach (Mike Fox, UNC).
- The Hurricanes had four different players earn Preseason All-America recognition; Michael Mediavilla, Jesse Lepore and Johnny Ruiz were recognized by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper while Carl Chester was honored by Baseball America.
- The Canes had seven players selected in the 2016 MLB Draft, including Chicago White Sox' first-round pick Zack Collins.




<u>Game 1</u>: RHP **Jesse Lepore** 1-2, 0.90 ERA

It doesn't matter if his roster is full of rookies or veterans, University of Miami head coach Jim Morris continues to produce some of college baseball's most consistent and dominant teams entering his 24th season in Coral Gables. With a talented staff around him, Morris' Hurricanes are continually the class of collegiate baseball, having won national titles in 1999 and 2001 and the ACC Baseball Regular Season Championship in 2008, 2014 and 2016.

In his 23-season tenure at Miami, no program has qualified for the College World Series as much as Morris and his Hurricanes. Miami, which has qualified for the NCAA Tournament a college baseball-record 44 consecutive years, has made it to Omaha in 13 of Morris' 23 seasons in Coral Gables - including most recently in 2016, when Miami was awarded the No. 3 national seed for the NCAA postseason.

Morris set an NCAA record for guiding a program to the CWS in each of his first six years at UM. In addition, Morris has won 17 of 23 NCAA Regional appearances at UM, including a record 13 straight to start his tenure in Coral Gables. His teams have qualified for NCAA Regionals for the last 32 years - all 23 at Miami and his final nine at Georgia Tech.

A three-time national coach of the year and 2008 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Morris has directed the Hurricanes to a 1,035-427-3 (.710) mark since arriving in 1994. Including his 12 seasons at Georgia Tech (1982-93), Morris has forged a 1,539-671-4 (.697) Division I record in 35 years as a head coach. Overall, Morris has been the head coach at the collegiate level for 39 seasons, spending the first four at DeKalb (Ga.) C.C. from 1976-79, and has recorded a 1,670-711-4 (.702) mark.

In addition to carrying on Miami's great baseball reputation in the last 23 years, Morris personally led the charge in the construction of Alex Rodriguez Park, and logged hundreds of hours raising funds for the stadium's renovation prior to its reopening in 2009.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in 2016, as he led the program to its 25th College World Series appearance in history, its third straight ACC Coastal Division title and the program's second ACC Regular Season Championship in a three-year span.

Morris became just the sixth coach in the history of Division I baseball to reach the 1,500-win plateau when Miami topped Louisville 8-4 in dramatic fashion on March 18, 2016. Eight days later, Miami topped Clemson 5-4 in 11 innings - also in walk-off fashion - to send Morris to his 1,000th win at the helm of the Hurricanes.

Under his direction, the Hurricanes set the program record for fielding percentage with a sparkling .983 mark in 2016, a figure that ranked best nationwide. Seven Hurricanes were selected in the 2016 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, including the program's first first-round selection since 2010 in catcher Zack Collins (No. 10, Chicago White Sox). Morris also helped guide two Hurricanes to a pair of major awards: Collins became the first Hurricane to win the Johnny Bench Award as the nation's top collegiate catcher in 2016, while Bryan Garcia set the program saves record and became the first Hurricane to win the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Award.

Morris entered 2015 as among the winningest active coaches in Division I baseball with 1,435 wins. He wasted little time in moving up the record books, moving into sole



possession of eighth place in all-time wins (1,439) on Feb. 15 with a 25-4 win over Rutgers and then seventh place with a 9-5 win over Louisville on March 7 (1,445).

Miami captured the 2014 ACC Regular Season Championship under his watch, recording 24 wins in conference play for the first time in program history.

Morris reached two coaching milestones in the first half of the 2014 season. He became just the eighth Division I coach to reach 1,400 wins in a 5-2 win over Boston College on March 8, and won his 900th game at Miami in a 7-1 upset of No. 3 Virginia on March 22.

Among the players Morris coached at Miami that have gone on to play in the Major Leagues are Peter O'Brien (Kansas City), Chris Hermann (Arizona), Yasmani Grandal (Los Angeles Dodgers), Jemile Weeks (Boston), Danny Valencia (Oakland), Jon Jay (Chicago), Yonder Alonso (Oakland), Ryan Braun (Milwaukee), Ryan Jackson (St. Louis), Pat Burrell (Philadelphia), Alex Cora (New York Mets), Bobby Hill (San Diego), Aubrey Huff (Detroit), Chris Perez (Cleveland), Cesar Carrillo (San Diego), Brian Barton (St. Louis), Gaby Sanchez (Florida), Charlton Jimerson (Houston), Jay Tessmer (New York Yankees), Danny Graves (Cincinnati) and Jason Michaels (Houston), among many others. From his days at Georgia Tech include Nomar Garciaparra (Los Angeles), Jay Payton (Oakland) and Jason Varitek (Boston).

Morris has also enjoyed success on the international scene. From 1989-90, Morris served as head coach of the USA Baseball team that won a Silver Medal in the 1989 Presidential Cup (Taiwan), Bronze Medal at the Goodwill Games and the 1990 International Baseball Association (IBA) World All-Star Game in Atlanta.

CANES HOSTING JACKETS FOR ACC OPENER

• The Miami Hurricanes will host their **first conference series** of the spring beginning Friday, March 10 against #23 **Georgia Tech**. First pitch for Game 1 is slated for 7 p.m. from Mark Light Field on **ACC Network Extra** and **WVUM 90.5**.

• Miami took **three of four games** against Georgia Tech in **2016**, including a **weekend series victory** at Russ Chandler Stadium in Atlanta, where the Hurricanes won two of three games, and its **2016 ACC Championship opener** at Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

• Miami carries a **58-36-2 all-time series lead** against the Jackets, including a **31-13-2** mark at Mark Light Field. The Canes have won **four of the last five** head-to-head regular season series, including **two straight home series** (2013, 2015)

• Miami junior righthander **Jesse Lepore** (1-2, 0.90 ERA) will oppose Georgia Tech freshman righthander **Xzavion Curry** (3-0, 1.69 ERA) in the series opener Friday night.

LAST TIME OUT: CANES DROP MIDWEEK PAIR

• Miami dropped its **home-and-home** with crosstown **FIU** on March 7 and March 8; the Hurricanes fell 12-1 at Mark Light in Game 1 and FIU walked off with a 3-2 victory in Game 2.

• Miami's freshman duo of **Greg Veliz** and **Evan McKendry** impressed against the Panthers on the mound.

• **Veliz** struck out a career-best seven batters in 5.1 innings in his first mound start at home, while **McKendry** tossed five shutout innings with six strikeouts in his first career start at FIU.

• UM will face the Panthers at Mark Light Field on **April 26**; the first game, slated for Feb. 22 at FIU, was postponed due to rain.

LEPORE IMPRESSING AS WEEKEND STARTER

• After spending the 2016 season as the midweek starter, junior righthander **Jesse Lepore** has been impressive as Miami's Friday night starter in 2017.

• Despite picking up 1-0 losses in back-to-back weekends against No. 2 Florida (2/24) and Dartmouth (3/3), Lepore has pitched **three straight quality starts** to begin his 2017 season.

• Lepore went a **career-long 8.0 innings** in his most recent start against the Big Green. He has gone **at least six innings in all three starts** and his **0.90 ERA is third-lowest** in the ACC.

• The Beverly Hills, Fla., native went **9-0** for the Hurricanes in 2016 as the team's midweek starter, compiling a **2.20 ERA**. His career record on the hill is **10-2**.

LOOKING FOR A FOUR-PEAT

• Miami won its **third straight ACC Coastal Division title** in 2016, posting a **21-7 record in ACC play** to earn the division crown.

• The Hurricanes have won **67 ACC games over the past three** seasons - the most wins in a three-year stretch by any program since ACC expanded to a **30**-game conference schedule in 2005.

• Miami has won the ACC Regular Season Championship three times, most recently in **2016** when the Canes finished **21-7**; UM **won the ACC regular season crown & ACC Tournament in 2008.**

• The Hurricanes have won **four ACC Coastal Division titles** (2008, 2014, 2015, 2016) in program history and **one ACC Championship** (2008).

• Jim Morris' 1,539 wins at the Division I level are fifth-most in the history of college baseball and **third-most** among active skippers.

 This weekend's series against Georgia Tech pits two of the winningest coaches in college baseball history: Morris (1,539 wins) and Georgia Tech's Danny Hall (1,175), who replaced Morris in Atlanta when Morris was named Miami's head coach prior to the 1994 season

 Morris reached two major milestones in 2016 - he became the fifth coach to reach 1,500 wins on March 18 against Louisville and won his 1,000th game at Miami on March 26 vs. Clemson.

WELCOME TO THE LIGHT!

 Miami has made College World Series trips in back-to-back seasons (2015 and 2016) thanks in large part to its **dominant play** inside the confines of Alex Rodriguez Park at Mark Light Field.
