CANES FACE BIG NON-CONFERENCE TEST VS. OHIO STATE

- ▶ The Miami Hurricanes opens their 2011 home season Saturday against Ohio State at Sun Life Stadium. UM is 63-21 in home openers and 15-7 at Sun Life Stadium. The game will be televised live on ESPN HD.
- ▶ Miami will face Ohio State in its 86th home opener. The Hurricanes are 63-21 in home openers and 15-7 at Sun Life Stadium.
- ▶ Both the Hurricanes and the Buckeyes began the 2011 season with new head coaches. Miami's Al Golden came to the program after spending the last five seasons as the head coach of Temple, while Ohio State is led by Luke Fickell, who spent the last nine seasons as an assistant coach with the Buckeyes.
- ▶ The Hurricanes are coming off their first and only bye week of the 2011 season after falling to Maryland, 32-24, in the season-opener on Labor Day night. Ohio State survived a Week 2 scare when it held on for a 27-22 win over Toledo on Saturday. The Buckeyes are 2-0 and ranked 17th in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and 16th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.
- ▶ Miami free safety Vaughn Telemaque led the Hurricanes with seven solo tackles against Maryland. He also played a large role in the Canes buckling down in the redzone. The senior intercepted Danny O'Brien in the endzone in the first quarter and made two of his eight tackles inside the Canes' 20-yard line.
- ▶ It was expected that many newcomers were going to see significant action at Maryland. In all, 14 players made their collegiate debuts, including nine true freshmen. Among the standouts were LB Denzel Perryman, DE Anthony Chickillo and WR Phillip Dorsett. Perryman and Chickillo combined for five tackles, while Dorsett made his first career reception and returned two kicks for a combined 43 yards.
- ▶ CollegePressBox.com, the official media website of ACC football, will provide updated media information throughout the season. Media Information includes game notes, statistics, media guides and high-resolution headshots and logos, as well as weekly news conference transcripts. The site also includes a complete media archive for all 12 schools, dating back to 2005. Information will be updated continuously throughout the season, including postseason, bowl games, final season statistics, bios and photos leading up to the NFL Draft.

COACHES SHOW

UM's coaches show, "Hurricane Game Day with Al Golden" airs twice weekly on CSS, at 5:30 p.m. Thursdays and 10 a.m. Saturdays. The show is hosted by Joe Zagacki and Don Bailey Jr. and features Hurricanes players as coach Golden's guests.

HURRICANE HOTLINE

Hurricane Hotline is a weekly two-hour show hosted by Joe Zagacki and Don Bailey Jr. that airs from 7-9 p.m. Tuesday or Wednesday nights during the season from Monty's (2550 South Bayshore Drive Coconut Grove, Florida 33133). Hurricane Hotline features interviews with UM head football coach Al Golden, players, coaches and other UM personnel as well as other featured guests. Fans are encouraged to listen on 560 WQAM or view the show in-person at Monty's in Coconut Grove.

The MIAMI-OHIO STATE SERIES

- ▶ Ohio State leads the all-time series, 3-1. The two teams last met a year ago when the Buckeyes edged the Canes, 36-24 in Columbus.
- ▶ This will be the fifth overall meeting and first meeting between the two teams in Miami. The first meeting between the two teams came in 1977 in Columbus. In 2002, the two teams met in the National Championship game—Fiesta Bowl, with the Canes falling in two overtimes, 31-24 to the Buckeyes.

A CANES WIN OVER THE BUCKEYES WOULD...

- ▶ Give Al Golden his first victory at Miami.
- ▶ Give Al Golden a 2-4 record in home-openers as a head coach.
- ▶ Give Miami a 64-21 record in home-openers and improve to 16-7 at Sun Life Stadium.

The COACHES

▶ Al Golden is in his first year as Miami's head coach and owns an overall record of 27-35. Luke Fickell is in his first year as Ohio State's head coach after spending the last nine seasons as an assistant coach for the Buckeyes. Prior to joining the OSU staff, Fickell spent a season at Akron after getting his coaching start as a graduate assistant at Ohio State in 1999.

Scouting THE BUCKEYES

- ▶ With the 42-0 win over Akron to open the 2011 season, Luke Fickell became the first Ohio State head coach to record a shutout in his head coaching debut since Woody Hayes in 1951.
- ▶ Ohio State's rushing defense is tops in the Big Ten and ranks fourth nationally as the Buckeyes give up only 40.5 yards per game on the ground. OSU also is No. 1 in its conference with 4.5 sacks and 9.5 tackles for loss. On the flip side, the Buckeyes have yet to allow a sack of QB Joe Bauserman.
- ▶ Punt returner Chris Fields' 21.0 yards per return rank fifth nationally for Ohio State, helping his team to an average drive start on their own 38-yard line.
- ▶ Ohio State has featured a Top 20 scoring defense in each of the last nine seasons, including a top 6 in each of the last six. 2010 (5th - 14.3ppg), 2009 (5th - 12.5), 2008 (6th - 13.9), 2007 (1st - 12.8), 2006 (5th - 12.8), 2005 (5th - 15.3), 2004 (19th - 18.3), 2003 (16th - 17.6) and 2002 (2nd - 13.1).

Up NEXT...

▶ The Hurricanes remain home for the next two weekends, facing Kansas State (9/24) and Bethune-Cookman (10/1). The Buckeyes return to Columbus to host Colorado.

Streak CONTINUES

- ▶ Former Hurricanes and current proCanes Jimmy Graham (New Orleans), Andre Johnson (Houston) and Reggie Wayne (Indianapolis) all hauled in touchdown passes in the opening week of the NFL season.
- ▶ At least one former Cane has now scored a touchdown every NFL week since Week 15 of the 2002 season - a span of 140 straight weeks.

Canes TO OPEN NEW ERA UNDER HEAD COACH AL GOLDEN

- ▶ First-year head coach Al Golden will make his Sun Life Stadium debut Saturday when he leads the Canes against Ohio State.
- ▶ Golden owns an overall record of 27-35 and is in his sixth season as a head coach.
- ▶ Golden arrived in Coral Gables after spending the last five seasons as the head coach at Temple University. Over five seasons at Temple, Golden took the Owls to unprecedented heights. Before his arrival, TU had just two winning seasons over its previous 26 years and had only won 22 percent of its games over the previous 30 years. Quickly, Golden made the Owls a contender, leading the team to a combined record of 17-8 his last two years there. The 2009 season marked Temple's first winning season since 1990, and Golden was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors.

GAME DAY PRESS POLICIES

Only working press will be admitted to the Sun Life Stadium press box. Seats will be issued according to the following criteria:

1. State newspapers by circulation, wire services, national publications, newspapers from opponent's area, and student newspapers from UM and opponent's schools.
2. Other daily newspapers, with preference to those that regularly cover UM.
3. Radio and television personnel not broadcasting, but considered reporting.
4. Non-daily newspapers, with preference to those which regularly cover UM.
5. Scouts. Freelance and/or non-daily writers may be asked to produce copies of actual publications in which their work has appeared. In some cases, these materials will be required as verification of the writers' status.

UM LEADS STATE & NO. 38 IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT RANKINGS

- ▶ In the 2012 edition of the U.S. News & World Report's annual "Best Colleges" issue, released today, the University of Miami has risen to number 38 - up from 47 last year, a nine point rise. UM remains the highest ranked school in the state of Florida.
- ▶ In an impressive ascent, UM has moved up 29 slots in the last 10 years, making it one of the fastest-rising institutions among national universities in recent times. UM is the only school currently in the top 50 to move up nine spots in one year and 29 spots in the past 10 years.

Dynamic DUO

- ▶ Running backs Lamar Miller (18) and Mike James (12) totaled 30 carries against Maryland. It was the first time two Miami players had at least 12 carries in a game since Graig Cooper (16) and Damien Berry (12) on Nov. 28, 2009 in a 31-10 victory at South Florida.
- ▶ The last time two Miami players each recorded 12 carries in a season-opener was in 2007. Javarris James (14) and Cooper (12) helped carry Miami to a 31-3 home victory over Marshall.

Hitting THE GROUND AND RUNNING

- ▶ Miami's 172 rushing yards at Maryland was the Hurricanes' most in a road opener since also rushing for 172 in a win on Sept. 23, 2004 at Houston.
- ▶ Lamar Miller led the way with 119 yards on 18 carries, while Mike James added 34, Maurice Hagens 15 and Stephen Morris four.

Hello, MY NAME IS

- ▶ Hurricanes faithful may notice a few unfamiliar names on jerseys as 20 newcomers saw substantial playing time in the season-opener at Maryland.
- ▶ Fourteen players made their first collegiate appearance, including nine true freshmen.
- ▶ Six Canes made their first career starts in Dalton Botts (P), Darius Smith (DT), Jake Wieclaw (K), James Gaines (LB), Maurice Hagens (FB) and Allen Hurns (WR).
- ▶ Appearing for the first time as Miami Hurricanes were Thurston Armbrister, Malcolm Bunche, Anthony Chickillo, Phillip Dorsett, Jon Feliciano, Thomas Finnie, Jalen Grimble, Darion Hall, Shane McDermott, Gionni Paul, Denzel Perryman, Olsen Pierre and Andrew Swasey.
- ▶ In addition, four-year cornerback transfer Mike Williams (Wake Forest) started the game for UM.

J12 AMONG THE BEST

- ▶ Quarterback Jacory Harris enters the season ranked among Miami's top signal callers. Harris, who will get his first start of the season after being suspended for the Maryland game, appears in six different career records categories.
- ▶ Harris is ranked third all-time in pass attempts, passing yardage and total offense, second in touchdown passes thrown and sixth in pass completions percentage. Harris is on track to upend Ken Dorsey in two categories, needing to complete 161 passes and attempt 284 passes to surpass Dorsey as the record holder. Last season he connected on 148 passes and attempted 270.
- ▶ He moved into sole possession of second place all-time in career passing TDs on Oct. 23, 2010 when he threw touchdown passes to LaRon Byrd, Travis Benjamin and Leonard Hankerson against the Tar Heels.

Canes SCHEDULE AMONG THE TOUGHEST

▶ According to Phil Steele's College Football Preview, Miami will face the 10th-toughest schedule of any FBS school this season. Only Colorado, Iowa State, Baylor, Oregon State, LSU, Boston College, USC, Washington and Auburn face a tougher road according to the publication.

▶ After traveling to Maryland for the season-opener, the Canes return home to host non-conference foes Ohio State and Kansas State in back-to-back weeks at Sun Life Stadium. A few weeks later, Miami will face a pair of difficult tests on the road in consecutive trips to Virginia Tech (Oct. 8) and North Carolina (Oct. 15). The yearly rivalry game with Florida State will also come on the road, as the Canes will travel to Tallahassee to face the Seminoles on Nov. 12.

Home SWEET SUNSHINE STATE HOME

▶ Miami's game on September 5 in College Park, Md., was the first of only three games that the Canes will play outside of the Sunshine State this season.

▶ Miami will travel to Virginia Tech for a game on October 8 and to North Carolina the following week.

▶ Nine games this season will be played in Florida, including a trip to Tallahassee to face Florida State on Nov. 12 and to Tampa for a tilt with USF on November 19.

Leader OF THE PACK

▶ Two weeks into the season, running back Lamar Miller leads the Atlantic Coast Conference and ranks third nationally in all-purpose yards, averaging 222.0 per game. Miller rushed for 119 yards against Maryland in the opening game of the season and added 100 more on kickoff returns in addition to pulling in a three-yard catch.

▶ Miller is averaging 31 more yards than the next-closest player, NC State's T.J. Graham (191.0).

Miami FOOTBALL RANKED EIGHTH NATIONALLY IN APR

▶ When the NCAA's Academic Progress Report (APR) was announced in May, the Canes' football program headlined an outstanding academic showing by the University of Miami this past school year. The football team (along with baseball, men's basketball and men's tennis) improved upon its APR score for an impressive seventh straight season. In fact, the UM football program's APR score (978) ranked eighth among all FBS schools.

Eight CANES GO IN 2011 NFL DRAFT

▶ The University of Miami's success in the NFL Draft continued this past spring, as eight Canes were selected in 2011. Orlando Franklin (2nd round to Denver), Brandon Harris (2nd round to Houston), Leonard Hankerson (3rd round to Washington), DeMarcus Van Dyke (3rd round to Oakland), Allen Bailey (3rd round to Kansas City), Colin McCarthy (4th round to Tennessee), Richard Gordon (6th round to Oakland) and Matt Bosher (6th round to Atlanta) were all taken off the board in the Top 200 picks.

▶ Miami's eight draftees trailed only USC (9) and North Carolina (9) for the most in the country in 2011.

▶ Since 2000, only Ohio State (78) and USC (77) have had more players drafted than the Canes (75).

▶ Miami continues to comfortably lead the nation in first round draft picks in recent years, as 26 Canes have been selected in the first round since 2000. Ohio State (17) remains a distant second.

Players RETURN TO THE LINEUP

▶ Five of eight University of Miami football student-athletes that were suspended for the season-opener against Maryland are eligible to play Saturday against Ohio State.

▶ DL Marcus Forston, LB Sean Spence, DL Adewale Ojomo, WR Travis Benjamin and QB Jacory Harris served their one-game suspensions during the Maryland contest. DB Ray-Ray Armstrong and TE Dylon Dye are required to sit out three more games, while DL Olivier Vernon will be required to sit out five more contests.

▶ WR Aldarius Johnson has been suspended indefinitely for a violation of team rules.

In THE ZONE

▶ Miami is tied for first in the ACC in red-zone offense, converting 100 percent of its trips (3-3) into points. The Canes scored on two rushing touchdowns and a field goal from within the 20-yard line against Maryland. Miami is tied with Virginia (11-11), Georgia Tech (10-10) and NC State (6-6) going into Week 3 of the season.

Honoring A LEGEND

▶ The University of Miami will honor Russell Maryland in an on-field ceremony between the first and second quarters of Saturday's contest against Ohio State to commemorate the defensive tackle's upcoming induction into the College Football Hall of Fame in December.

▶ Maryland finished his college career with 279 tackles, 25 tackles for losses and 20.5 quarterback sacks. He was the Jack Harding Most Valuable Player Award winner in 1990 and led the Hurricanes to four consecutive bowl berths, two national championships and an overall record of 45-3 during his career.
