## THE TEN COUNT

- ◆ Missouri State continues a five-game road swing this week when the Bears travel to Charleston, S.C., for three bracketed games at the Charleston Classic. MSU will open the event with a first-round game against Miami (Fla.) on Thursday at 10:30 a.m. (Central) from TD Arena in Charleston. Depending on outcomes, the Bears will play Florida or St. Joseph's (Pa.) on Friday, have a day off Saturday, and conclude the event on Sunday against UConn, Buffalo, Xavier or Towson (complete bracket on next page). The Bears wrap up their five-game road swing Nov. 29 at LSU.
- ◆ Lamont West (Sr., Cincinnati, Ohio) needs just **12** points to reach 1,000 for his career. West scored 945 points in 109 games at West Virginia before transferring to MSU this season. The graduate transfer also has 361 career rebounds and 160 3-pointers in his collegiate career.
- ◆ The Bears are just **10** wins away from reaching 700 as a Division I program. Since joining the DI ranks in 1982-83, Missouri State is **690-478** (.591), now in their 38th Division I season -- 18.6 wins per season.
- ◆ For just the second time since joining the league in 1990-91, Missouri State is the preseason favorite to win the Missouri Valley Conference. The Bears were also picked atop the Valley's preseason poll in 2017-18.
- ◆ Missouri State enters the week ranked 9th nationally in 3-point field goal defense (.215) with its foes having made just 17-of-79 attempts from beyond the expanded arc.
- ◆ The Bears are also 26th among all Division I programs this week in scoring defense, having surrendered just 57.3 points per game through their first four contests.
- ◆ Missouri State has shot the ball at a higher percentage than three of its first four opponents this season, racking up a 2-1 mark when doing so. The Bears are now 11-2 under coach Dana Ford when shooting better than their opponent with Friday's loss at No. 21 Xavier being this season's only blemish (.477 for the Bears to .415 for the Musketeers).
- ◆ Keandre Cook (Sr., Baltimore, Md.) erupted for a career-high 31 points and flirted with a school 3-point record to help the Bears to a 59-50 win over Alabama State on Sunday. He made 9-of-13 shots overall, 6-of-7 from 3-point range, and 7-of-7 at the foul line. Cook followed that effort with 19 points in MSU's win over Cleveland State on Tuesday.
- ◆ Cook is just 8 points away from 500 for his Missouri State career (36 games) and is averaging 13.4 points per game as a Bear with 58 3-pointers. Cook ranks 53rd nationally in free throws made (53), 80th in FT percentage (.905), 52nd in 3-point field goal percentage (.500), 94th in 3-pointers made (10), and 97th in total points (71).
- ◆ With just 8.5 turnovers per game, Miami enters the week ranked 6th nationally in that category while ranking 32nd in fewest total turnovers (34), and 43rd in turnover margin (5.8). The Hurricanes also commit just 12.8 personal fouls per game, which ranks 14th among the nation's 350 Division I programs.

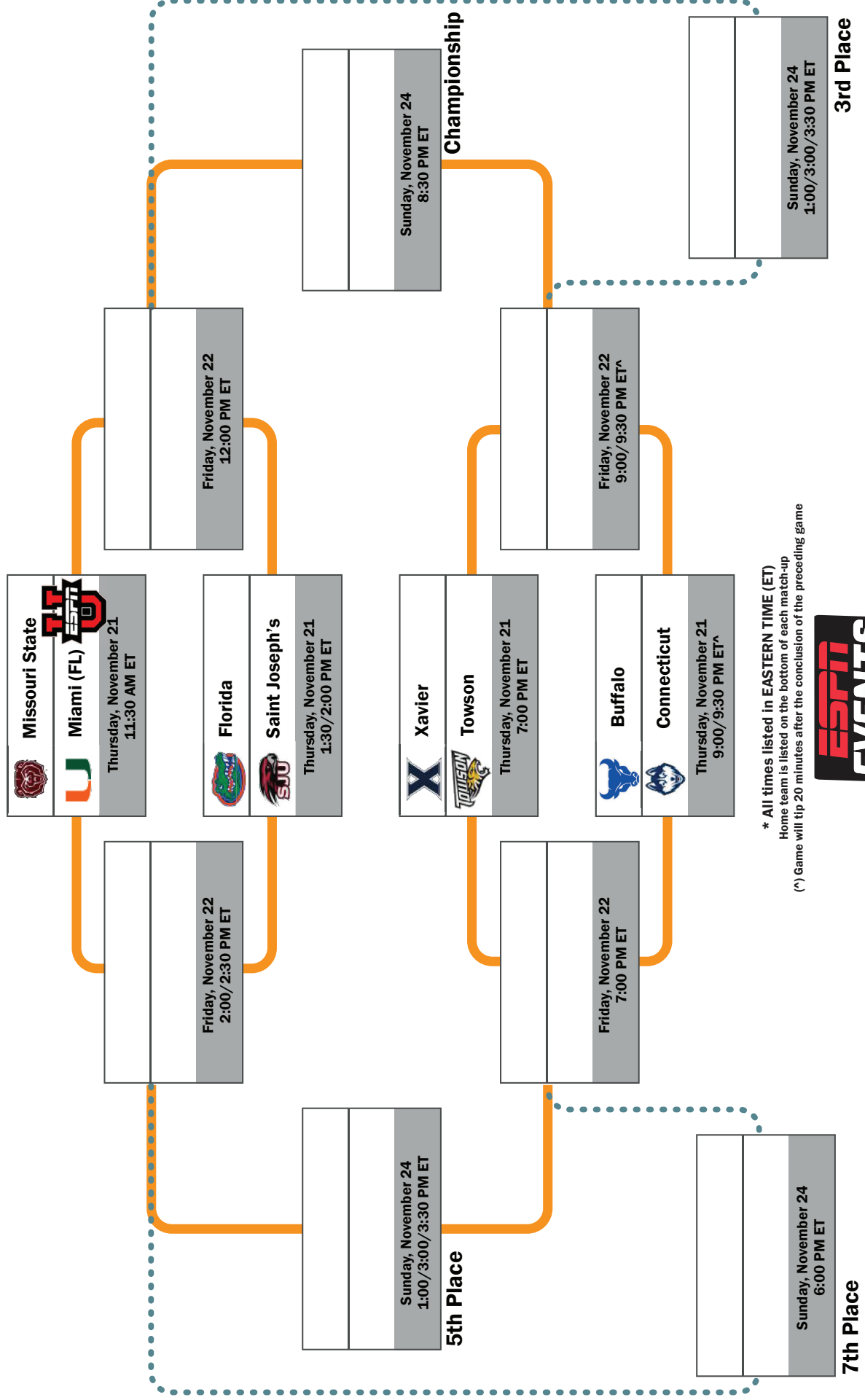

## HEAD COACH DANA FORD

Dana Ford (Illinois State, 2006) is 18-18 (.500) in his second season as Missouri State head coach, including a 13-5 ledger at JQH Arena, 5-10 ledger in away games, and 0-3 mark at neutral sites. He is now 75-83 (.475) in his sixth season as a head coach. He is 0-0 vs. Miami.

In his first season in Springfield, Ford led the Bears to a tie for third place (10-8) in the Missouri Valley Conference with the program's first winning record in Valley play since 2011. He guided two players -- Tulio Da Silva (first team) and Keandre Cook (third team) -- to All-MVC honors in addition to three players on the MVC All-Newcomer Team, including Newcomer of the Year Da Silva.

He was introduced as Missouri State's 18th men's basketball coach on March 22, 2018 after coaching the previous four seasons at Tennessee State. The native of Tamms, Illinois was 57-65 (.467) at Tennessee State, including a 52-39 ledger in his last three seasons in Nashville. He coached five All-OVC players and two OVC All-Newcomer Team selections during his tenure at TSU.

Under his leadership, Tennessee State also doubled its home attendance average and twice earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll during the 2016-17 season.

Ford, 35, was awarded the Ben Jobe Award in 2016 as the nation's top Division I minority coach. That same year, he was named Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year and NABC District 19 Coach of the Year after engineering one of the biggest turnarounds in NCAA history, swaying Tennessee State from a 5-26 record in his first season to a 20-11 mark in 2015-16.

He has served as an assistant at Tennessee State, Wichita State and Illinois State and was responsible for recruiting future NBA talents such as Robert Covington (Timberwolves) and Fred Van Vleet (Raptors).

## BEARS ON THE AIR

All Missouri State games will air live on the Missouri State Radio Network with Springfield flagship station KTXR (101.3 FM) providing the feed to the seven-station network and at RadioSpringfield.com.

The voice of the Bears, **Art Hains**, first began calling MSU's action in 1977 and is in his second stint and 39th season overall. He called MSU games from 1977-81 and returned to the mic in 1985. Hains celebrated his 1,000th MSU basketball broadcast on Jan. 2, 2013 and his 2,500th MSU event on Nov. 9, 2019. Former MSU great **Mike Keltner** (1970-74) provides color commentary.

## THE SERIES

The Bears and Hurricanes have met just once on the hardwood, an 81-72 Miami win at BankUnited Center in Coral Gables on March 21, 2011 in the second round of the NIT.

In that game, Missouri State jumped out to a 32-26 lead at the midway point before Miami stormed back in the second half behind a 56-percent shooting effort and six triples. Durand Scott finished with 20 points for the home team on 7-of-12 shooting, while Adrian Thomas scored 16 behind four treys. The Bears were led by Adam Leonard who scored 26 points on 7-of-8 from long range, while Kyle Weems scored 18 points in his final game as a Bear. MSU committed just 7 turnovers on the night.

## MR. SHOW-ME BASKETBALL

Freshman **Isiaih Mosley** (Columbia, Mo.) is just the fourth Mr. Show-Me Basketball to play at MSU. Named Missouri's top prep player in 2018-19, Mosley averaged 23.2 points per game as a senior at Rock Bridge HS where he (and fellow MSU teammate **Ja'Monta Black**) led the Bruins to a 25-3 record and Class 5 (largest) state title. The only other MSU Bears to earn the title of Mr. Show-Me Basketball are teammate **Jared Ridder** (2017), Drew Richards (2004) and Spencer Laurie (2003).

## LORDS OF THE DANCE

Three of Missouri State's newcomers have NCAA Tournament experience with their previous clubs. **Lamont West** (Sr., Cincinnati, Ohio) played in six NCAA games at West Virginia (2017 and 2018); **Tyrik Dixon** (Jr., Bentonville, Ark.) went to the NCAA Tournament with Middle Tennessee in 2017 and played two games; and **Josh Hall** (Jr., Houston, Texas) made a pair of NCAA trips (4 games) with Nevada (2017, 2018).

## REGAL RETURNEES

The Bears boast a pair of returning all-conference players in **Tulio Da Silva** (Sr., Formiga, Brazil, 14.3 ppg, 7.4 rpg) and **Keandre Cook** (Sr., Baltimore, Md., 12.8 ppg, 4.3 rpg, 48 threes).

**Da Silva** was an All-MVC first-team selection last year and earned MVC Newcomer of the Year honors (the third Bear in four years to earn the distinction). **Cook** was an All-MVC third-team pick a year ago.

Both Da Silva and Cook were on the 2019 MVC All-Newcomer Team.

## INTERESTING ENDING IN CINCY

Missouri State dropped a 59-56 decision at No. 21 Xavier on Nov. 15 in the "non-bracketed" portion of the Charleston Classic. After surrendering the first 10 points of the game, the Bears stormed back to tie the game twice in the second half, including a dunk by **Gaiqe Prim** (Jr., Aurora, Colo.) that knotted the score, 56-56, with 1:29 to go. After a steal by **Keandre Cook** on the ensuing XU possession, Cook's triple from the corner missed, as he was knocked to the floor by two defenders. Instead of a three-shot foul, Cook was called for a controversial "flop," sending Xavier to the line for a technical and the ball in the final minute which the Musketeers turned into the game-winning, three-point possession.

## VALLEY FAVORITES

Missouri State is the overwhelming preseason favorite to win the Missouri Valley Conference, according to the league's preseason men's basketball poll of head coaches, media and communications personnel announced Oct. 17.

Coach Dana Ford's Bears earned 29 of a possible 44 first-place votes and 410 points in the poll overall to earn the top spot. With five first-place votes and 368 points, Bradley was picked second, just ahead of Northern Iowa (343), Loyola (340) and Drake (243) to round out the top five spots. UNI's vote total included three No. 1 votes, while Loyola snagged six top tallies. Rounding out the poll were Indiana State (210) in the six spot, followed by Illinois State (193), Evansville (132), Valparaiso (98) and Southern Illinois (83). Illinois State earned one first-place vote.

Over the last 25 years, the MVC's preseason favorite has gone on to play in the NCAA Tournament 16 times and the NIT five times. In that span, the team sitting atop the preseason poll has won the league regular-season title 13 times.

It is just the second time the Bears have been picked to win the MVC (2017-18) since Missouri State joined the league in 1990.

## PRESEASON HONORS

In addition to being the top team pick, the Bears also earned four Preseason All-MVC individual honors.

Topping the list is senior forward **Tulio Da Silva** who earned All-MVC Preseason first-team distinction. The 2019 MVC Newcomer of the Year and All-MVC first-teamer averaged a team-best 14.3 points and 7.4 rebounds per game while converting 55.4 percent of his field goal attempts last season.

Classmate **Keandre Cook** earned All-MVC Preseason second-team honors. He averaged 12.8 points and 4.3 rebounds while dropping in 48 3-pointers as a junior while being named to the All-MVC third team.

Also earning preseason honors for MSU are newcomers **Lamont West** and **Gaige Prim** who were named to the All-MVC Preseason third team.

West led West Virginia in scoring last season (11.1 ppg, 4.1 rpg, 64-3-pointers) before coming to Springfield this fall as a graduate transfer. He has played in eight NCAA Tournament games with Bob Huggins' Mountaineers and brings 109 career games, 945 points, 352 rebounds, 154 3-pointers from WVU.

Prim, a 6-foot-8 transfer from South Plains (Texas) College earned NJCAA First-Team All-American (Division I) last season after averaging 20.7 points, 11.5 rebounds and a .648 FG percentage. He finished second in the nation in total rebounds and 10th in the nation in scoring as a sophomore for a 28-6 that made the NJCAA national semifinals.

## AS OTHERS SEE US

Jon Rothstein of CBS Sports listed Missouri State as the No. 4 team in his preseason "Ten Must Watch Mid-Majors" for his "College Hoops Today" podcast, just behind Colgate, Harvard and Liberty and ahead of New Mexico State, St. Mary's, South Alabama, Utah State, Vermont and Western Kentucky in his top 10.

## LAMONT HEADS WEST

Graduate transfer **Lamont West** (Sr., Cincinnati, Ohio) joined the Bears this summer as a transfer from West Virginia. ESPN's Myron Medcalf named West as the No. 7 graduate transfer in all of Division I this season. West, who led WVU in scoring last season with 400 points (11.1 ppg), is also a Preseason All-MVC third-team selection this year, as named by MVC coaches, media and communications professionals.

## COOK WHIPS UP SOMETHING SPECIAL VS. ASU

Bears senior **Keandre Cook** (Baltimore, Md.) turned in a career-best, 31-point effort in Missouri State's win over Alabama State on Nov. 10. Cook was 9-for-13 from the field, including an amazing 6-of-7 from 3-point range. He was also 7-for-7 at the foul line with 4 rebounds and an assist.

He is the second Bear in as many seasons to score 31 points, joining former Bear Jarred Dixon's 31-point outburst at Oregon State on Dec. 1, 2018. He is also the 66th MSU player to eclipse 31 points in a game.

## DIXON DISHES IT OUT

**Tyrik Dixon** (Jr., Bentonville, Ark.) dished out 6 assists in Missouri State's win over Alabama State on Nov. 10, marking the 16th time in his 70 Division I games he has distributed at least 5 scoring passes in a game.

## SOPHOMORE SPECIAL

**Jared Ridder's** (So., Springfield, Mo.) first-half free throw against Little Rock in the season opener Nov. 5 made him the first MSU sophomore to score a point for Bears since Ross Owens scored 3 points at UNI on Feb. 24, 2018. MSU did not have any sophomores on its roster last season.

## OPENING NIGHT ACT FALLS SHORT

Despite leading for more than 36 minutes, Missouri State dropped a 67-66 decision to visiting Little Rock on Nov. 5 to hand the Bears their first-ever loss in a home opener at JQH Arena. It was also just their second loss in a home opener in the Division I era (1982-83 to present), now 36-2 all-time in that span.

MSU never trailed in the second half until a 20-footer by Little Rock's Ruot Monyyong from the right corner with 2.3 seconds to go gave the visitors a one-point win. MSU went without a FG in the final four-and-a-half minutes.

## MSU TELEVISION NETWORK

The Bears will appear on flagship station KOZL-TV and the MSU Television Network eight times during the 2019-20 season. The network also includes occasional carriage from NBC Sports Channel Chicago, and KPLR-TV (St. Louis).

Don West, Tom Ackerman and Kelby Stuckey provide play-by-play and color analysis for the Bears on television.

## BEARS BASKETBALL HISTORY

The Bears have an all-time record of **1674-995 (.627)** in their 108th season and are **690-478 (.591)** in their 38th Division I season.

Now in their 12th season at JQH Arena, the Bears are **124-57 (.685)** all-time at the 11,000-seat facility.

During the Division I era, MSU has made NCAA Tournament appearances in 1987, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1992, and 1999. With NCAA Tournament wins over Wisconsin and Tennessee, the 1999 Bears advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the first time in program history. The Bears have appeared in the National Invitation Tournament nine times -- 1986, 1991, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2011. The 1986, 1993 and 2006 squads all reached the NIT quarterfinals. In 2010, MSU earned the ColleagueInsider.com Postseason Tournament championship and in 2014 made their second CIT appearance in five years.

The Bears hold the distinction of having four of the 25 best RPI ratings ever to be left out on NCAA Tournament as at-large selections. The 2005-06 squad had the 21st-best RPI on Selection Sunday, while the 2006-07 team was No. 36 the following year, both of which resulted in Tournament snubs. MSU's 1999-2000 squad was ranked No. 34 a year after its Sweet 16 run and was left out of the big dance.

MSU won NAIA national championship titles in 1952 and 1953 under the late coach Bob Vanatta, while making six NAIA national tournament trips from 1939-1954. MSU also appeared in the NCAA Division II Tournament 10 times, finishing as national runners-up four times -- 1959, 1967, 1969 and 1974.

MSU has won 24 regular-season conference titles, including the 2010-11 MVC championship. The Bears have also recorded 28 seasons of 20 or more victories, including 15 in the Division I era.

## MISSOURI STATE UNIVERSITY

Missouri State University is a public, comprehensive university system with a mission in public affairs, whose purpose is to develop educated persons while achieving five goals: democratizing society, incubating new ideas, imagining Missouri's future, making Missouri's future, and modeling ethical and effective behavior.

Hammons (businessman, hotel developer), Bob Holden (43rd governor of Missouri), Bill Mueller (2003 American League batting champ), and Jackie Stiles (WBB Hall of Famer).

## MISSOURI VALLEY CONFERENCE

The nation's second-oldest NCAA Division I conference continues to be a leader in college athletics and is one of the nation's most progressive conferences. League members have worked together to put a high value on league harmony and invest in athletic programs to compete at the highest level.

In 2018, Loyola University of Chicago advanced to the Final Four, giving the MVC a representative on the biggest stage in college basketball for the second time in six seasons (Wichita State, 2013). Recent opportunities for MVC teams to participate in ESPN's early-season multi-team events and in other elite tournaments, have added strong opponents and more national television exposure to non-conference scheduling.

Men's basketball also boasts tradition from the likes of Hall of Famers Larry Bird and Oscar Robertson as former players, which includes a list of more than 260 drafted to the NBA.

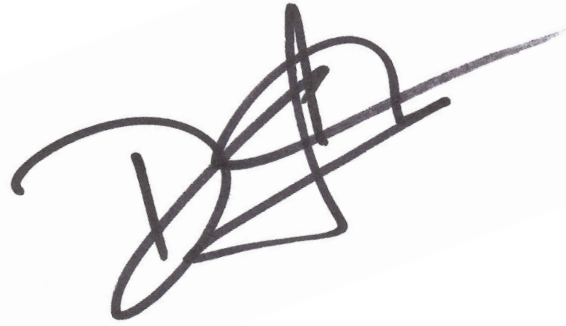

# Dana Ford

A new era for Missouri State men's basketball officially began on March 22, 2018 with the introduction of Dana Ford as the program's 18th head coach.

The 35-year-old was the fifth-youngest coach in the nation at the Division I level this past season and helped guide the Bears to a third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference in his first season. Two MSU players earned all-MVC honors, including the 2019 MVC Newcomer of the Year, and three players who landed spots on the Valley's All-Newcomer team.

Ford orchestrated one of the best turnarounds in NCAA history when he accepted the TSU job in 2014-15 as the nation's youngest Division I head coach at the time. The Tigers went from a 5-26 record his first season to a 20-11 ledger in 2015-16. He earned Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors and NABC District 19 Coach of the Year laurels that season.

Over his last three years in Nashville, Ford has led the Tigers to a combined 52-39 record and coached five All-OVC players in addition to two players recognized on the OVC All-Newcomer Team. Under his leadership, Tennessee State also doubled its home attendance average and twice earned votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll during the 2016-17 season.

A native of Tamms, Ill., Ford is a 2006 graduate of Illinois State University where he was a four-year letterman for the Redbirds under coaches Tom Richardson and Porter Moser from 2002-06. He was a regular starter and led ISU in steals as a senior.

He went on to successful assistant coaching stints at Winthrop and Wichita State under coach Gregg Marshall and later as associate head coach at Illinois State under coach Dan Muller. His coaching resume also includes assistant coaching stops at Chipola (Fla.) College and Tennessee State. He was an assistant for two NCAA Tournament teams at Winthrop (2006-07) and Wichita State (2011-12) as well as a NJCAA national final four run at Chipola College (2008-09). and was responsible for recruiting future NBA talents such as Robert Covington (Timberwolves) and Fred Van Vleet (Raptors).

Dana and his wife Christina have a daughter, Charlie Rose, and three sons, Carson, Cameron and newest addition Crain, born in July 2018. The Fords are also the parents of another daughter, Promise, who passed in infancy in 2017.

The Fords are also the founders of the Rebound Foundation which raises funds and awareness to help renew and restore women who have experienced a life of domestic abuse. The foundation provides a stable home and fresh start to abuse victims and their children.
