#### **Syracuse Makes ACC Debut**

#2/2 Syracuse (13-0) will begin leagueplay in the Atlantic Coast Conference for the first time in school history when Miami comes to the Carrier Dome on January 4.

The Orange navigated through the nonconference portion of its schedule without a blemish, finishing undefeated for the fourth time in the last five seasons.

SU leads the all-time series 14-5 with 18 of the meetings coming when both squads were in the BIG EAST. Syracuse won the last two contests, both in Miami, by scores of 54-49 and 91-74 in 2003 and 2004, respectively.

Miami head coach Jim Larrañaga is coming off a spectacular 2012-13 season in which he led the Hurricanes to a No. 2 national ranking and No. 2 seed in the NCAA Tournament, earning him Associated Press, Naismith, USBWA and ACC Coach of the Year honors. In his third year at Miami, Larrañaga is 57-25, including a 29-7 mark last year.

The Hurricanes are on a three-game win streak after starting off the season 5-5. The team has already played four overtime contests, including the ACC opener which resulted in a one-point loss to Virginia Tech.

Senior Rion Brown tops the team with 13.8 points and 3.0 assists per game. Graduate student Donnavan Kirk is another solid contributor with 9.6 points per outing and team-best averages of 7.3 rebounds and 2.2 blocks.

- ✓ Dec. 28: In a battle of unbeaten teams, SU defeated Villanova, 78-62, in front of the season's largest on-campus crowd at the Dome (28,135).
- ✓ The Orange rebounded from a 25-7 deficit by tallying 20 unanswered points.





#### **Boeheim Second All-Time In Wins**

Jim Boeheim earned the 933nd win of his coaching career when Syracuse defeated Eastern Michigan on December 31, 70-48.

Boeheim, Mike Krzyzewski and Bob Knight are the only three Division I coaches who have accumulated 900 triumphs. Boeheim is the only one of the three to reach the milestone at one school. He is second on the all-time Division I list, having moved past Bob Knight during the 2012-13 season.

On December 17, 2012 he picked up the 900th triumph in a 72-68 victory against Detroit. He moved past Knight and into second when SU defeated Rutgers, 78-53, on January 2, 2013.

#### The Book On Boeheim

Boeheim owns a career record of 933-314 (.748). He is second among active Division I coaches in wins, trailing only Mike Krzyzewski (Duke). Boeheim is second on the all-time Division I victory list and is 10th among active Division I coaches in winning percentage.

Only Jim Phelan (Mt. St. Mary's, 1,354 games) has logged more than Boeheim's 1,247 games for coaches who have served at only one institution.

The 2013 NCAA berth gave SU 36 post-season appearances under Boeheim, including 30 NCAA Tournaments. His SU teams have claimed 21-or-more games in 32 seasons and 30-or-more six times. He has guided his alma mater to the NCAA title game three times, winning it for the first time in 2003.

#### **Boeheim And Montgomery Set NCAA Tournament Standard**

An NCAA Tournament standard was set when long-time colleagues Jim Boeheim and Mike Montgomery matched coaching moves on March 23 in the third round of the event. The duo combined for the most wins by two mentors in an NCAA Tournament game. At tip-off Boeheim had 917 career wins and Montgomery 656 for 1,573 total.

SU held St. Francis Brooklyn scoreless for the final 4:10 after the Terriers matched its largest lead at 50-46. Following Gbinije's game-winning layup, senior C.J. Fair and sophomore Jerami Grant sealed the win with a pair of free throws each in the final 30 seconds.

Sophomore DaJuan Coleman matched a career high with 14 points and added six rebounds, including five on the offensive end. Grant contributed 13 points off the bench with a game-best eight rebounds.

Coleman scored Syracuse's first eight points and sparked a 10-0 run that gave the Orange a 12-5 start. SU grabbed its largest lead of the night at 22-14 with 6:27 left in the first half and took a took a 30-26 edge into the locker room.

The Terriers scored nine of the first 11 points of the second half to go back in front at 35-32, and didn't trail until SU's final run. St. Francis Brooklyn was never able to grow its lead by more than four points and SU tied the score on four occasions throughout the rest of the game.

After converting only 6-of-its-first-13 free throws in the contest, the Orange hit 12-of-its-last-14, all in the game's final 6:52.

Senior C.J. Fair notched his first double-double of the season with game highs of 16 points and 10 rebounds. Redshirt sophomore Trevor Cooney contributed 15 points produced by five 3-pointers.

Holding onto a slim, 58-57 margin with 11:07 to go, the Orange went on a 13-2 run to extend the lead to 71-59 and put the game away. Syracuse's margin bounced between seven and 13 for the remainder of the contest.

Ennis, one of four players in double-figures, scored 17 of his game-high 28 in the second half. The 28 points is tied for the third most by an Orange freshman in a single-game.

As a team, the Orange shot 23-of-24 (.958) from the charity stripe, the fifth-highest percentage in program history.

A tightly contested first half featured 10 lead changes and eight ties. Neither team led by more than five points in the game's opening 20 minutes. After Cal went in front 33-32, SU got a pair of free throws from Ennis and a three-point play from Jerami Grant for its largest lead of the first at 37-33. A free throw by Cal with six seconds to go tied the contest 41-41 at the half.

SU enjoyed a 10-2 run in the opening three minutes of the second half to build a 51-45 lead, capped by back-to-back three's from Ennis and Trevor Cooney. California answered the Orange's stretch with a 9-3 spurt of its own to even the score at 54-54, the 10th tie of the night. Grant hit a jumper on SU's next possession to put Syracuse ahead for good.

**MAUI, HAWAII** – Syracuse defeated Baylor 74-67 to claim the school's third EA Sports Maui Invitational title.

The Orange improved to 10-0 all-time in the Maui Invitational, last winning the tournament in 1990 and 1998. Senior C.J. Fair scored 24 and was named the Most Valuable Player while sophomore Jerami Grant earned all-tournament honors following a 19-point effort.

SU started the game with 10 of the first 12 points, including consecutive threes by Ennis and Fair. Baylor hit its next four trifectas to give the Bears a 16-14 cushion. It would be Baylor's last lead as the Orange responded with a 19-4 run over the next six minutes for a 33-20 lead.

A 10-3 spurt from Baylor closed the gap to 36-30 and SU took a 38-30 edge into the break.

SU's lead bounced between four and 14 for the entire second half. Leading 56-50 with 8:34 remaining in the game, Grant converted a pair of three-point plays to help Syracuse match its largest margin at 66-52.

The Bears followed that up with eight unanswered points to get back within 66-60 with 3:07 to go, but never got closer than five down the stretch.

Free throw shooting proved to be crucial for the Orange in the third straight contest. Syracuse went 10-of-11 from the charity stripe and made all four of its free throws in the final 30 seconds.

Redshirt sophomore Trevor Cooney scored a game-high 21 points, including 12 during the Orange's decisive run. Freshman Tyler Ennis contributed 17 points and game highs of eight assists, seven rebounds and four steals.

SU's big run started on a layup by sophomore DaJuan Coleman, 2:31 into the second half, and was capped by a Cooney dunk with 7:26 to go – a span of 10:03 – to give SU its largest lead at 58-37. The Orange advantage never dipped below 17 points for the remainder of the game.

Syracuse came out of the gate by scoring the contest's first 10 points behind two three's from Cooney. With SU ahead 23-14, Indiana stormed back with 13 of the next 16 points to take its only lead of the night at 27-26 with 3:28 left in the half. The Orange answered with the next four points and a Cooney three-ball with 38 seconds left had SU ahead at the half, 33-29.

Indiana tied the score at 33-33 just over two minutes into the second, but Syracuse opened the game up with 12 unanswered points to spark the 25-4 spurt. During the stretch, SU held the Hoosiers without a basket for 12:43.

The victory extended SU's home, non-conference winning streak to 48 games while the 93 points was a season-high. Syracuse held a commanding 28-13 advantage in second-chance points and 34-4 edge in points off turnovers.

Senior C.J. Fair led all SU players with 19 points and tied with redshirt sophomore Trevor Cooney for a game-high four steals. Cooney was right behind Fair with 17 points while going 5-of-9 from behind the arc. DaJuan Coleman had 13 points and 10 rebounds.

After Binghamton recorded 11 straight points to go up 11-3, the Orange turned on the full-court press and responded with 18 unanswered to regain the lead for good at 21-11. During the spurt, Cooney scored 11 and SU tallied 12 points off of five Bearcat turnovers.

Syracuse extended its margin to 31-15 with 8:23 remaining in the half, finishing off a 28-4 run. SU took a 54-30 advantage into the break.

SU continued its dominance in the second half with the lead bouncing between 24 and 37 the rest of the contest. Ahead at 76-48, SU used a 14-5 run to take its largest margin of the night at 90-53 with just over four minutes to go.

**SYRACUSE, N.Y.** - In Syracuse's final tune-up before conference play begins, the Orange defeated Eastern Michigan 70-48.

Four Orange men reached double figures with junior Rakeem Christmas and sophomore Jerami Grant leading the way with 15 points apiece. That total matched a career-high for Christmas, while Grant corralled a game-best eight rebounds in his first start of the season.

SU raced out to an 18-6 advantage 6:30 into the contest with Grant scoring nine of the team's first 11. The Orange took its largest lead of the half at 30-10 with 7:33 remaining following 10 unanswered points, including a pair of monstrous dunks by Christmas.

Over the next three minutes, the Eagles responded with an 11-2 run to pull within 32-21. Following a Glenn Bryant layup and two free throws by Mike Talley in the final minute, SU took a 36-27 lead into halftime.

EMU closed to within 37-32, two minutes into the second half, when Syracuse countered with a seven-point spurt to set the score at 44-32. After five straight from the Eagles, SU pulled away, outscoring the Eagles 14-2 to extend the margin to 58-39 with under eight minutes to go.

An 8-0 stretch which ended on a three by freshman B.J. Johnson had SU with its largest advantage of the contest at 68-45 with less than three minutes left.
